The data for this study were collected using self-administered questionnaires given to a non-probability sample of incarcerated felons in ten states. There are 1,874 cases (surveyed persons) included in this data collection with approximately 600 variables. Each case has 10 records of information. The codebook contains information about questionnaire wording, responses, coding of the data, column location and frequencies. More specifically, the original questionnaire wording is included as well as values for missing data.

These data are contained in one file, with SPSS control cards in a second file. Information in the data include socioeconomic status of the inmate, prior criminal record, drug use, weapon usage, family history, and demographic information on the inmate. The logical record length of the data file is 89 characters; the SPSS control card file has 80 characters.

This codebook documents the Armed Criminal in America survey data.

The survey data was gathered from a self-administered questionnaire given to a non-probability sample of incarcerated felons in 10 states. See SITE variable (page 1) for a list of the states.

The data file consists of 1874 completed surveys including approximately 600 variables. Each case includes 10 records of information. <u>Each</u> record contains the following fixed information:

These fields of information on each record are not further documented in this codebook. The SPSS control cards skip these fields of data (with the exception of the ID on the first record and SITE in positions 6-7 on the first record).

This codebook includes information about questionnaire wording, coding of the data, column location, and frequencies.

The documentation for each question contains:

- 1) The <u>original</u> questionnaire wording, responses, codes, frequencies, variable names, and record and column locations.
- 2) MISSING VALUES and NOT APPLICABLE frequencies are included in this codebook. They are omitted in all statistical computations shown here. Refer to LIST FILEINFO COMPLETE listing for actual MISSING VALUES declarations on the SPSS system file.
- 3) The codebook format for each variable is as follows:

For continuous variables, we have just noted the MEAN, SD and RANGE, and the frequencies and codes for the MISSING VALUES.

5) Information concerning the coding of SKIP questions.

The design of this questionnaire involved a skip logic directing respondents to certain questions based upon earlier responses. At the bottom NOTE, we have indicated the skip patterns.

If the "Filter" question was NO ANSWER (left blank by respondent) -- but the "Follow-up" question WAS answered, coders were instructed to code this (unanswered) question as a positive response. (i.e., a response which would lead to the skip section.)

Q.106 Have you ever personally sawed off a rifle or shotgun?

Using the above example, if Q.106 was blank but the respondent answered "JUST ONE" to Q.106a, Q.106 would be coded as "YES". However, if both the "Filter" and "Follow-up" questions were left blank, coders were instructed to code Q.106 NO ANSWER and 106a (and all subsequent questions involved in the skip) as NOT APPLICABLE.

For some filter questions, it was necessary to add a "YES, BUT MISSING" code to retain the subsequent skip information. These added codes were for questions containing a choice of positive responses. For example,

G.31 Have you ever stolen something worth more than \$50?

Yes, Just once 1
Yes, A Few Times 2
Yes, Dozens of Times 3
Yes, But Missing 4

6) On some questions where many "multiple" responses were given, responses were given "priority" IF there was a situation of multiple responses occurring. This is noted on each relevant question.

- 7) For all open-ended questions, explicit codes were developed based on frequency of response. All other responses, not explicitly noted, were assigned the designated code "ALL OTHERS". The full list of such responses for each question is shown in Appendix A.
- 8) In certain instances, additional response codes were added beyond those shown on the original questionnaire. These additional codes are noted in the codebook.

In addition, "special" codes were added to retain information that would otherwise become missing. For example:

Q.146 Before I was last arrested, I was spending \_\_\_\_ dollars a week on alcohol.

Some respondents entered a phrase ("a lot") rather than a numerical value. On such questions, these responses have been assigned "values" (documented for each variable where this occurs) to retain information.
