## Offenders Released From Wisconsin Adult Correctional Institutions Calendar Year 1986

During calendar year 1986 a total of 2,558 persons, 1,951 first and 607 rereleases, left Wisconsin's correctional facilities for adult offenders. These figures represent an increase of 17.3 percent over calendar year 1985 levels when 1,678 first and 503 rereleases were reported. Offenders classified as first releases are those leaving institution supervision for the first time following incarceration with a new sentence not associated with the revocation of parole, mandatory release, or special action early supervision. Those categorized as rereleases are offenders released from institution supervision following reinstitutionalization with or without new sentences after revocation of community supervision. Table 1, Type of Release by Institution, includes an additional 84 persons who also left the institutions during 1986 but were excluded from further mention in this publication. This group is made up of 14 males and one female released following the completion of probation, parole, or mandatory release revocation hearings, two males released after erroneous admissions, one male released after being supervised for a jurisdiction other than Wisconsin, and 66 males who left institution supervision after the completion of alternative to revocation contracts.

Information about the facilities from which offenders were released as well as the various types of release; i. e., parole, mandatory release, direct discharge, etc. can be found in Table 1. The column labeled "North WCCS" includes the Drug Abuse Center as well as the Gordon, Flambeau, McNaughton, Black River, Winnebago, Sanger B. Powers, and St. Croix Centers while "South WCCS" includes the Oregon, Thompson, Marshall E. Sherrer, Abode, St. John's, and Women's Correctional Centers. columns labeled "Contr Fac" include those facilities in which offenders were serving Wisconsin sentences under contractual agreements; i. e., the Milwaukee County House of Corrections, Dane County's Ferris Center, and correctional institutions operated by the state of Minnesota and by the federal Bureau of Prisons. The Wisconsin Resource Center (WRC) is operated by the Division of Care and Treatment Facilities, another unit of the Department of Health and Social Services. Tables 2 through 22 contain a variety of data including offense, race and ethnicity, intended residence, etc while trend data for males first and rereleased and females first released during the period 1982-1986 can be found in Appendix Tables A, B, and C. Trend data for rereleased females has been excluded since the smallness of numbers makes such information meaningless.

#### First- Released Males

The number of first-released males rose to 1,820 during calendar year 1986; an increase of 16.0 percent over the 1,569 recorded during 1985. Nine out of ten (97.3 percent) were released to reside in the community under the conditions of parole, mandatory release, or special action early release supervision. The remainder of the first releases included 7 males who were discharged upon completion of sentence, 35 who were discharged by order of the court, and 7 who died while institutionalized. Just under three-fifths

(56.8 percent) of the males first-released in 1986 were not considered to be assaultive, sex, or drug offenders. Almost one-tenth (8.6 percent) were classified solely as drug offenders. Males categorized as assaultive offenders made up slightly less than one-fourth (22.7 percent) of the 1986 first releases while one-tenth (10.5 percent) were regarded as both assaultive and sexual offenders. The offenses for which first-released males had most often been incarcerated were unarmed burglary (31.0 percent), theft (8.4 percent), and armed robbery (6.3 percent). Males first-released during 1986 had been incarcerated for an average (mean) of 23.8 months while the median length of stay was found to be 19.7 months. Males released after incarceration for burglary, theft, and armed robbery were found to have spent an average (mean) of 21.5, 15.3, and 41.2 months respectively in the institution.

During institutionalization offenders have the opportunity to take part in a variety of educational and vocational programs which are designed to assist them in developing skills and strengths and/or to overcome weaknesses so that they will have a successful transition to life in the community. Some what less than one-fifth (16.9 percent) took part in adult basic education programs designed to develop reading, arithmetic, and writing skills. Participation in classes designed to lead to the obtaining of a GED or HED certificate was noted for one-fourth (26.5 percent) of the first releases with 57.3 percent of the enrollees gaining such certificates. Diplomas were earned by 22 of the 110 males who took part in high school programs. One-fourth (25.4 percent) of the males first-released in 1986 took part in some type of vocational or apprenticeship training while in the institution. Participation in off-grounds work release was noted for less than one-fifth (16.5 percent) of the males while 55 males (3.1 percent) took part in study release programs. Almost one-third (32.8 percent) took part in programs designed to assist them in dealing with problems relating to the use of alcohol and/or other drugs.

A location within the state of Wisconsin was the intended residence for 9 out of 10 (88.4 percent) of the males first-released during 1986. Milwaukee County was reported to be the destination for approximately one-third (30.6 percent) of the males while just under one-fifth (18.8 percent) planned to live in Racine (6.8 percent), Dane (6.1 percent), and Kenosha (5.9 percent) counties. Slightly more than one-tenth (11.5 percent) of the males first-released in 1986 intended to live elsewhere within the United States.

#### Rereleased Males

Wisconsin's correctional facilities for adult offenders reported the rerelease of 594 males during 1986; an increase of 23.2 percent over 1985
levels when the rerelease of 482 males was reported. Two-thirds (66.3
percent) received mandatory releases and less than one-fifth (15.0 percent)
left the institutions on parole or special action early release status.
Slightly less than one-fifth (17.3 percent) of the rereleases were discharged directly from the institutions upon completion of their sentences
while seven males were discharged by order of the court and one died while
incarcerated.

Approximately one-third (31.3 percent) of the males rereleased during 1986 were considered to be assaultive offenders while somewhat over one-tenth (11.2 percent) were classified as assaultive as well as sex and/or drug offenders. Males not considered to be assaultive, sex, or drug offenders made up one-half (50.5 percent) of the 1986 rereleases. The offenses for which rereleases had most often been sentenced were unarmed burglary (33.5 percent), theft (7.2 percent), and forgery (5.9 percent). Rereleased males were institutionalized for an average (mean) of 17.1 months and a median of 10.6 months prior to being rereleased. Males rereleased in 1986 had, since last entry as new admissions, spent an average (mean) of 54.7 months and a median of 42.5 months in the institution.

Participation in adult basic education programs was noted for about one-tenth (10.4 percent) of the males rereleased in 1986 while slightly over one-tenth (12.2 percent) were enrolled in GED or HED classes while incarcerated. Six males earned high school diplomas prior to being rereleased and three completed a study release educational placement. Over one-tenth (13.8 percent) took part in some type of vocational or apprenticeship program prior to leaving the institution while work release experience was noted for 12.3 percent of the group. Enrollment in alcohol and/or drug treatment programs was recorded for less than one-fifth (14.8 percent) of the males who were rereleased during 1986.

Nine out of 10 (93.1 percent) of the males rereleased during 1986 intended to take up residence somewhere in the state of Wisconsin, less than one-tenth (6.5 percent) planned to live elsewhere in the United States, one male intended to live in a foreign country, and information about residence after release was unavailable for one individual. Two-fifths (40.0 percent) of the males who intended to reside in the state planned to locate in Milwaukee County.

#### First and Rereleased Females

During calendar year 1986 a total of 131 females classified as first releases left Wisconsin's correctional facilities for adult female offenders. These figures represent an increase of 20.2 percent over 1985 when 109 first releases were noted. Just over one-half (51.9 percent) were released on special action early release with the remainder, with the exception of two discharged by order of the court, almost equally divided between releases to parole (30 cases) and releases on mandatory release (31 cases). Thirteen female were rereleased in 1986; a decrease from the 21 reported the previous year. Slightly over one-half (53.9 percent) received special action early releases, three left the institution on mandatory release status, and three were discharged at completion of sentence.

First-released females had most often been sentenced to imprisonment for forgery (20.6 percent), theft (16.8 percent), and other drug offenses (7.6 percent); rereleased females for forgery (46.1 percent), theft (23.1 percent), and fraud (15.4 percent). The average (mean) length of stay for first-released females was 14.5 months; the median, 11.3 months. Rereleased females spent an average (mean) of 13.8 months and a median of 13.5 months in the institution just prior to this rerelease. The average (mean) length of time spent in the institution by rereleased females since

initial entry as new admissions was found to be 37.7 months; the median, 29.0 months. Nine out of ten (90.2 percent) of the first releases and all of the rereleases planned to reside somewhere in Wisconsin. The remainder (9.8 percent) of the first releases intended to live elsewhere within the United States.

Just under three-tenths (29.8 percent) of the females first-released in 1986 had attended adult basic education classes while in the institution. The same was true for 5 (38.5 percent) of the rereleased females. Over one-third (35.9 percent) of the first releases and slightly less than half (46.2 percent) of the rereleased took part in GED or HED programs while incarcerated. Eighteen females, including two rereleases, earned GED or HED certificates while institutionalized. One female first release earned her high school diploma prior to leaving the institution. Participation in work release programs was noted for about three-tenths (29.0 percent) of the first and just under two-fifths (38.5 percent) of the rereleases. Over two-fifths (44.3 percent) of the first and just under one-fourth (23.1 percent) of the rereleases took part in programs designed to help them deal with problems relating to alcohol and/or other drug usage.
