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INTRODUCTION

The Statistical Review of Crime gives details of offences reported to the Victoria Police during the calendar year, and of the people proceeded against for those offences. In interpreting information in the Review, the reader should bear in mind that it is based on official police reports, and thus covers only offences and offenders known to the police. Many offences are not reported to the police, and this unreported crime may not have the same characteristics as reported crime; similarly, criminals who are apprehended may not be typical of offenders in general. A survey conducted in 1983 by the Australian Bureau of Statistics ("Crime Victims Survey, Australia 1983, Preliminary", A.B.S. Canberra 1985) found reporting rates of 26% for sexual assault, 34% for assault; 38% for theft; 43% for robbery; 69% for burglary and 96% for motor vehicle theft. rates for Victorian victims (available for fewer offence types because of sampling constraints) were slightly higher than the Australian averages quoted above : 40% for assault; 44% for theft and 73% for burglary. These rates refer to personal and household crimes only, and are based on an Australia-wide sample survey, so they are not necessarily applicable directly to the crimes reported in the Statistical Review. However, they give some indication of the need for care in using In addition, when these statistics statistics of reported crime. are compared with other published figures, the definitions and explanations in this Introduction should be studied carefully.

INFORMATION IN THE STATISTICAL REVIEW

The basic information presented in the Statistical Review is a detailed set of statistics of reported offences, covering pages 46 to 59 in this edition. In this section, the left hand pages show the number of offences reported and cleared for the current year and the preceeding year, the increase or decrease for the year, and the number cleared as "no offence". The right hand pages show the number of offenders classified by sex, age, previous record and birth place.

Many of the other sections of the Statistical Review are based on these detailed statistics; they are included to illustrate and focus attention on specific topics, such as clearance rates and characteristics of offenders, rather than to add new information. However, three sections draw on other data, and require some explanation:-

(i) A set of graphs is included to show the changes in the rates of selected offences reported to police over the years since 1945. These graphs are based on Statistical Review crime figures where they are available (1958 - 1965 and 1968 onwards), and on Annual Report figures for other years. The detailed crime statistics for the earlier years have been grouped into categories reflecting, as far as possible, the present Statistical Review classifications. However, many changes have been made in counting methods, classification rules and internal recording procedures over the period covered by the graphs, and it should not be assumed that the rates for earlier years are precisely comparable with those of recent times.

- (ii) A table has been compiled showing the estimated rates of Major Crime Index and selected other offences in each Police District. This table is based largely on the monthly returns submitted by Criminal Investigation Branch Divisions of the crime reports filed in each Division: information from Statistics Section and Computer Systems Division files has also As this internal data is not directly been used. based on the reports received at the Statistics Section. it has been used only to establish the relative offence rates in the different Districts. The overall offence rates are based on the Statistical Review totals. Maps of the Metropolitan and Country Police Districts are included.
- (iii) A section is included on the value of property stolen or damaged in offences of several types. Although the available resources of the Statistics Section do not permit this information to be extracted routinely from all crime reports, samples have been taken of reports for the more common offences, and these have been used to obtain most of the distributions and estimates in this section. The charts and estimates for motor vehicle theft and for arson are based on records held by the Stolen Motor Vehicle Squad and the Arson Squad.

MAJOR CRIME INDEX

Eight groups of offences recorded in the Review have been selected for inclusion in a Major Crime Index. They are:-

- Homicide murder, attempted murder and manslaughter (excluding manslaughter arising out of a traffic accident).
- 2. <u>Serious Assaults</u> all wounding except attempted murder and all assaults in which injuries amounting to "actual bodily harm", at the least, are inflicted.
- 3. Robbery offences, committed or attempted, in which force or threat of force is used against a person with the intention of stealing.
- 4. Rape rape and attempted rape.
- 5. Burglary offences, committed or attempted, where premises are entered unlawfully with the intention of stealing therein.
- 6. Theft
 offences, committed or attempted, against persons or property with intent to steal but without force or threat of force being used. Does NOT include motor vehicles or stealing as a bailee, servant or agent, by a trick or embezzlement.

- 7. Motor Vehicle Theft
- stealing or attempting to steal a motor vehicle.
- 8. Fraud, etc.
- offences, committed or attempted, involving deception, misappropriation, forgery, uttering and counterfeiting.

COUNTING OF OFFENCES

The figures given in the Review are based on offences disclosed or which appear to be disclosed, by the initial investigation into an offence reported or discovered and for which crime reports are circulated. The details and results of court proceedings are not considered (they are often not available when the Review is compiled) and so no allowance can be made for alterations for legal reasons in the charges on which an alleged offender is presented, or for acquittals or dismissals.

Lesser offences directly related to a major offence, and representing supplementary charges arising out of the same incident, are not recorded. For instance, if, as a result of a single attack on one person, a man is charged with three offences - assault occasioning actual bodily harm, assault by kicking and common assault, then only the first offence will be recorded. However, if the three assaults are committed at different places or times, or on different people. all three offences will be recorded.

OFFENCES CLEARED

An offence is regarded as "cleared" if as a result of investigation:-

- (a) It is found that no offence was committed; or
- (b) A person is charged with committing the offence or officially warned by a Police Officer in lieu of being placed before the Court; or
- (c) It is found that a person charged with other offences was responsible for committing it; or
- (d) The offender is discovered but for legal reasons (e.g. child under the age of 8) is not charged.

If an offence is reported in one year and cleared in a later year, the offence and the clearance will be counted in different editions of the Review. Thus it occasionally happens that the number of offences or a particular category cleared in a given year exceeds the number reported in that year.

PROCEEDED AGAINST

The people "proceeded against" for a particular offence are those against whom proceedings are taken <u>initially</u> for that offence, whatever offences are eventually attributed to them. For example, suppose that a man is arrested for burglary and after breaking into a

house and stealing property and a search causes further charges of being unlawfully in possession of a pistol and being in possession of explosives to be laid. When questioned, the man admits to having broken into eight shops and three other houses and having stolen things from them, and a check shows that these admissions are correct. The Review would then show a total of 14 offences reported, 14 offences cleared and one person proceeded against for the offence of burglary with which he was first charged.

Since children under eight are legally presumed to be incapable of committing an offence, they do not appear in the statistics of people proceeded against, even if reported offences are found to be committed by them. Accordingly in the "Analysis by Age" and "Analysis by Sex" charts, we have compared the age and sex distributions of groups of people proceeded against with the corresponding distributions for the population aged eight and over, rather than the population as a whole. The population figures used elsewhere in the Review cover people of all ages.

PREVIOUSLY KNOWN

People proceeded against are classified as "Previously Known" if they are already recorded as offenders at the Information Bureau. The abbreviation "P.K." is used in the Review for "Previously Known".

FOREIGN MIGRANTS

"Foreign Migrants" (often abbreviated in the Review to "F.M.") are migrants from countries other than Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, and the United Kingdom.

POPULATION FIGURES

The population figures used in calculating crime rates are Australian Bureau of Statistics estimates for 30th of June in each year; prior to 1971 they are census totals and intercensal estimates, while from 1971 onwards they are from the Estimated Resident Population series.

STATISTICAL STUDIES

With the view to assist police operations in strategies to combat crime, the Statistics Section at the Information Bureau conducted a survey on reported house burglaries involving the theft of video recorders in co-operation with senior students at Swinburne Institute of Technology.

The period of study was between the 8th of June, 1984 and the 11th of July, 1984. During this period 4,948 house burglaries were reported to the Victoria Police with 1,011 involving the theft of a video recorder, representing 20.43%.

The primary objective of this research was to establish the possibility of a link between reported thefts of video recorders and the distribution points and/or the outlets where tapes were hired.

A summary of the findings of this study were:-

- 82% of the victims left their personal particulars when hiring tapes.
- 33% of the victims using carrier service for delivery of video had only video stolen from house,
- 42% of the thefts occurred during the day.
- 67% of the victims did not keep a record of the serial number.
- High frequency rate of stolen recorders within two months of victims leaving personal particulars at outlet.
- Districts with high frequency rates of stolen videos were "Q" District (179), "V" District (115) and "B" District (105).
- Both "Q" and "V" Districts recorded high frequency rates in burglaries and hiring of tapes for the recorder.
- Sub-Districts with high frequency rates were St. Albans (52), Sunshine (44), Heidelberg (33), Nunawading (32) and Prahran (32).

RELATED PUBLICATIONS

General information on the Victoria Police Force and its activities, including statistics of traffic offences and accidents, is available in the Annual Report of the Chief Commissioner of Police, published by the Victorian Government Printer.






1984 OFFENCE RATIOS ALL OFFENCES

1984 OFFENCE RATIOS MAJOR CRIME AGAINST PROPERTY





























VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND DAMAGED

As explained in the Introduction, samples of crime reports received at the Statistics Section have been used to estimate the distribution of the value of property stolen and damaged in some of the more common offences. For each offence, the approximate median and average values are given, together with an estimate of the total for the State, based on the number of offences recorded in the Statistical Review.

The values shown on crime reports are usually based only on an initial assessment of the property stolen or damaged, and later corrections to the values may not be reported. In addition, estimates based on samples may be affected by sampling errors, particularly in the higher value ranges where small numbers of cases can have a disproportionate effect on the total and average values.

BURGLARY

- Houses: Median \$450; Average \$926. State total about \$47 million.
- Other: Median \$130; Average \$681. State total about \$22 million.

THEFT


- Bicycles: Median \$150; Average \$184. State total about \$2.2 million.
- From Motor Vehicles: Median \$150, Average \$264. State total about \$8.7 million.
- Shoplifting: Median \$18, Average \$120. State total about \$1.5 million.
- Other: Median \$150; Average \$375. State total about \$13 million.


MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - Median \$1,500; Average \$3,330. State total about \$72 million.


