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
INTRODUCTION

This report is a statistical summary of cases reported to the Sex Crimes Analysis Unit during the 1985 calendar year.

During this period of time, 419 cases were sent to the Unit involving 435 offenders. The information contained in each case involving a sex offense or sex related offense was compared by computer against cases already in file in an effort to provide investigative leads for police officers in Connecticut and neighboring states. Such information was referred to submitting officers upon request.

Uniform Crime Report statistics reported to the federal government in 1985 by Connecticut police agencies indicate that forcible rape and criminal attempts to commit forcible rape numbered 760. Of those cases reported to the Unit in 1985, 188 were in the same category, which indicates that the Unit is receiving only 24.7% of these serious crimes which have been reported to the federal government. This poor rate of compliance is in spite of a statutory reporting mandate by Title 21, Section 7a of the Connecticut General Statutes. Clearly this report is of value primarily for its indication of the number of characteristic components of the reported crimes, than for any absolute numbers generated.

In the 419 cases reported, the youngest victim was 3 months old and the oldest was 82 years old. The youngest offender was 8 years old and the oldest offender was 78.

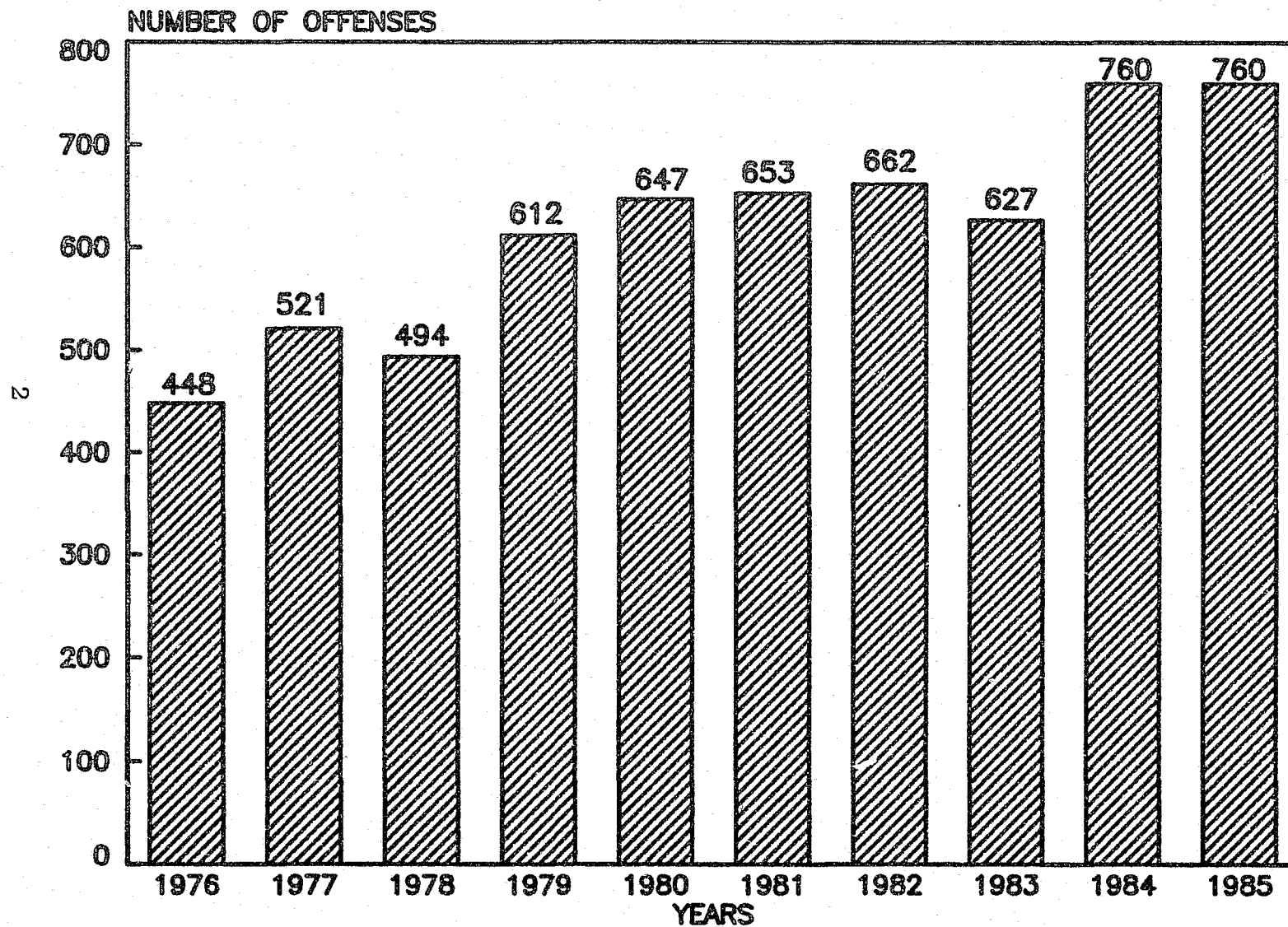

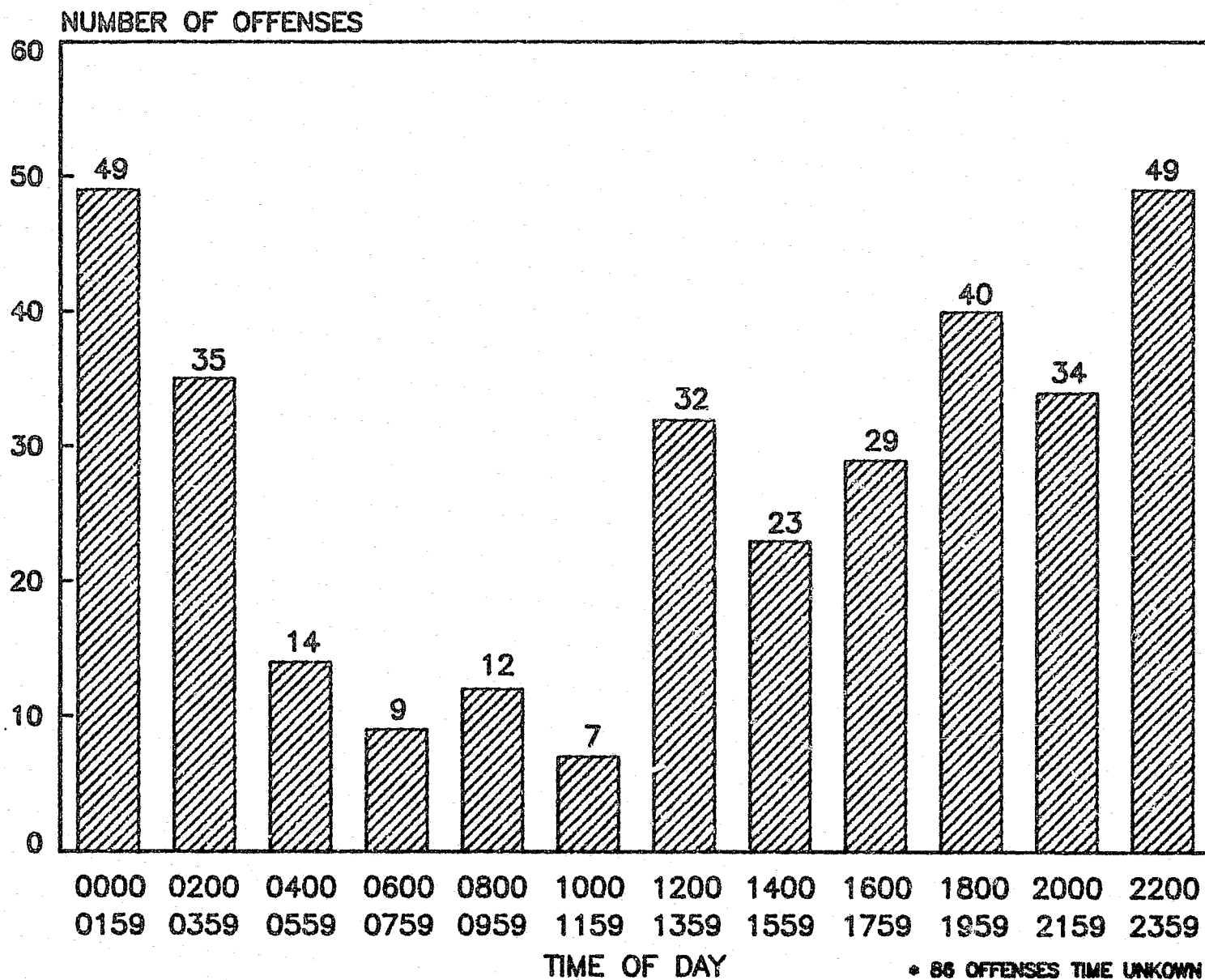

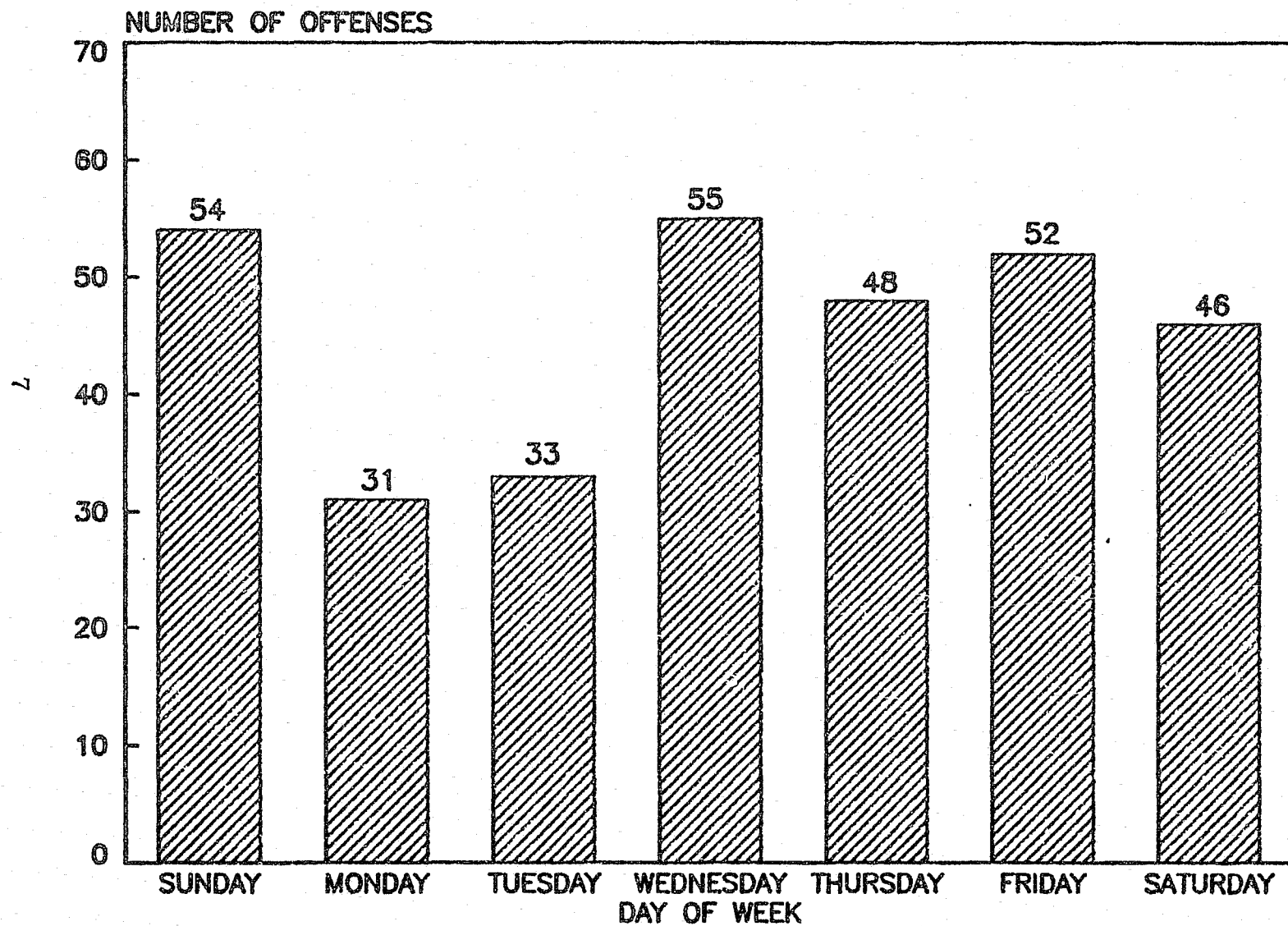

SEXUAL ASSAULT BY TIME OF DAY 1985

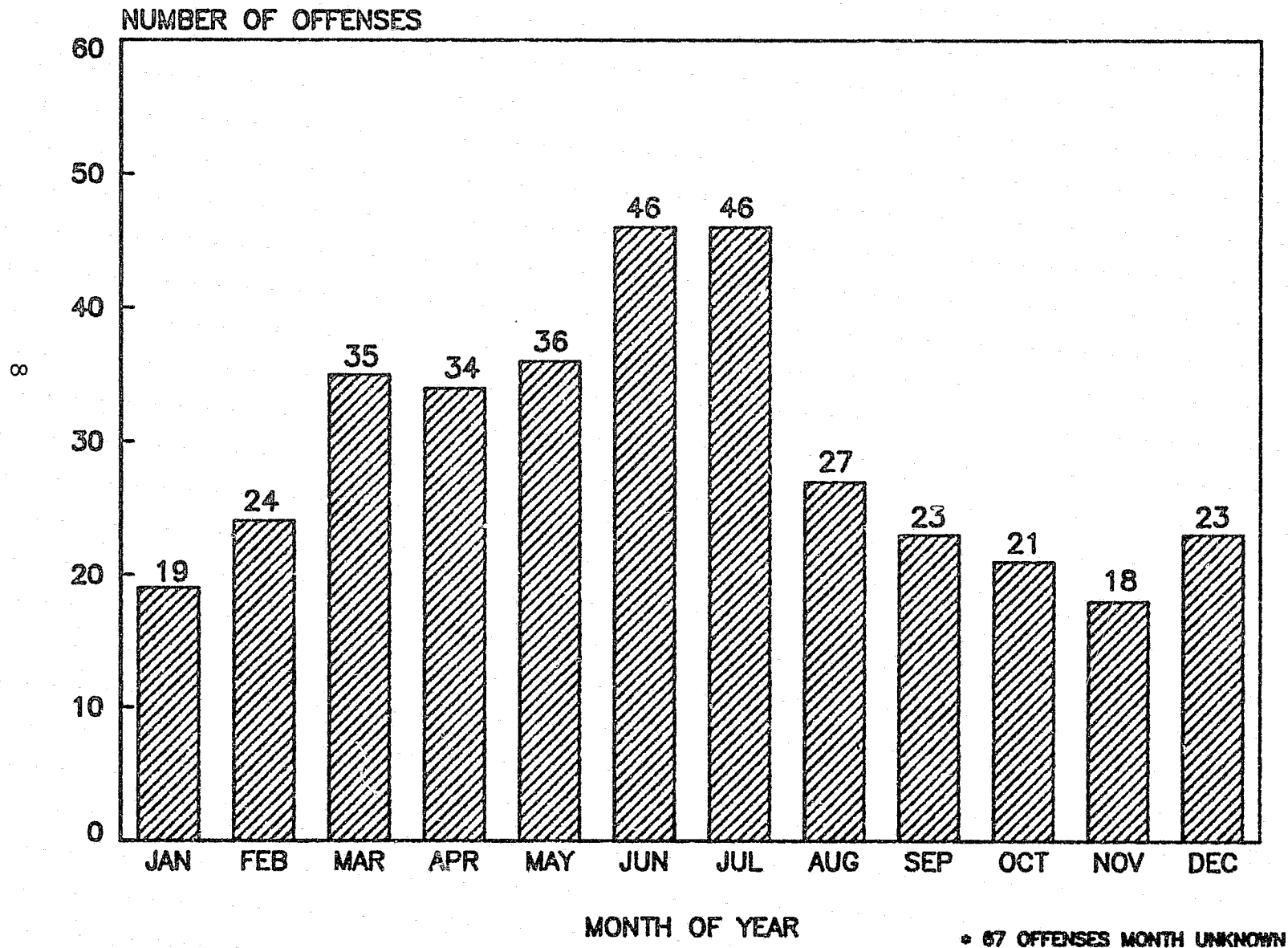


SEXUAL ASSAULT BY DAY OF WEEK 1985

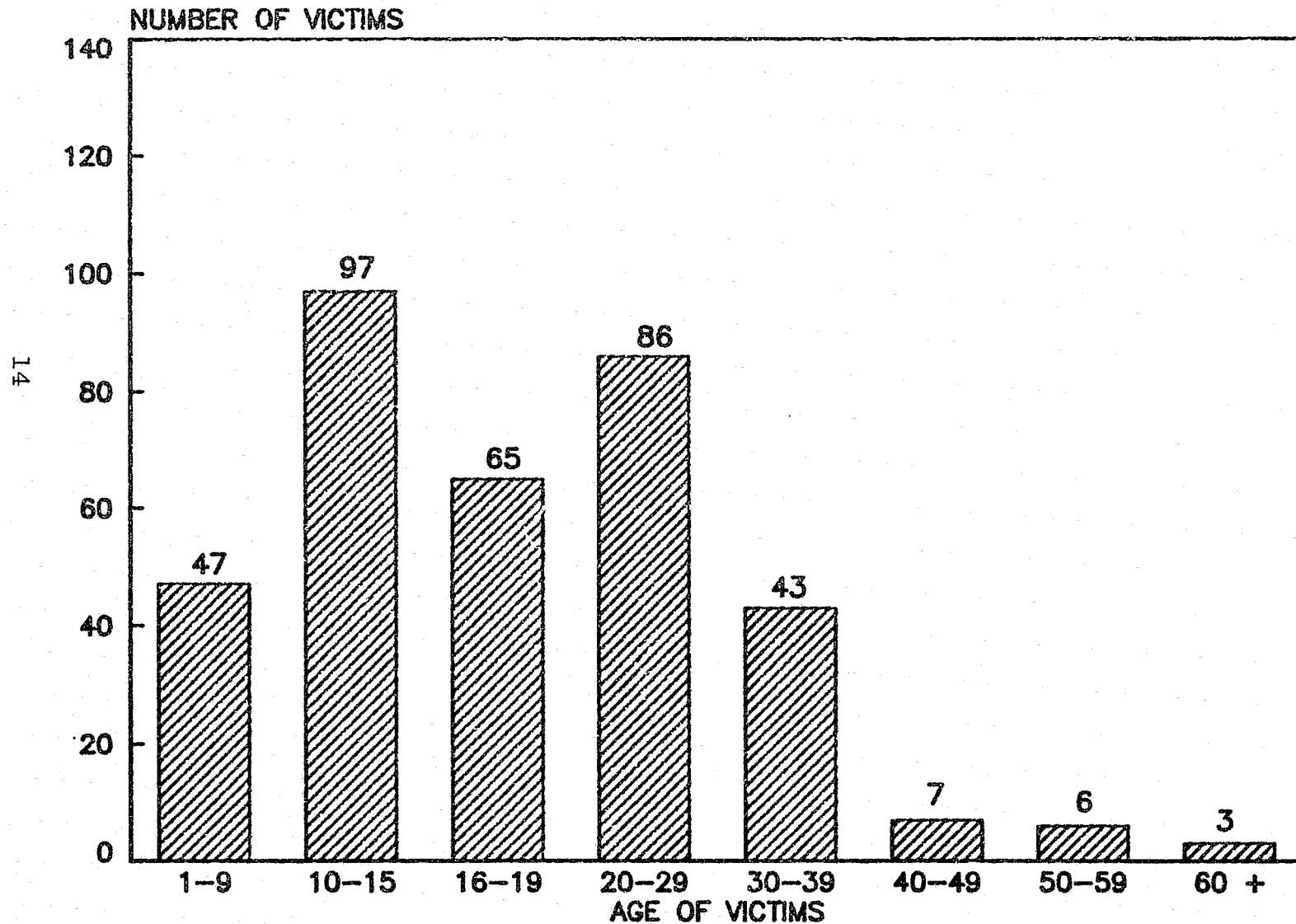

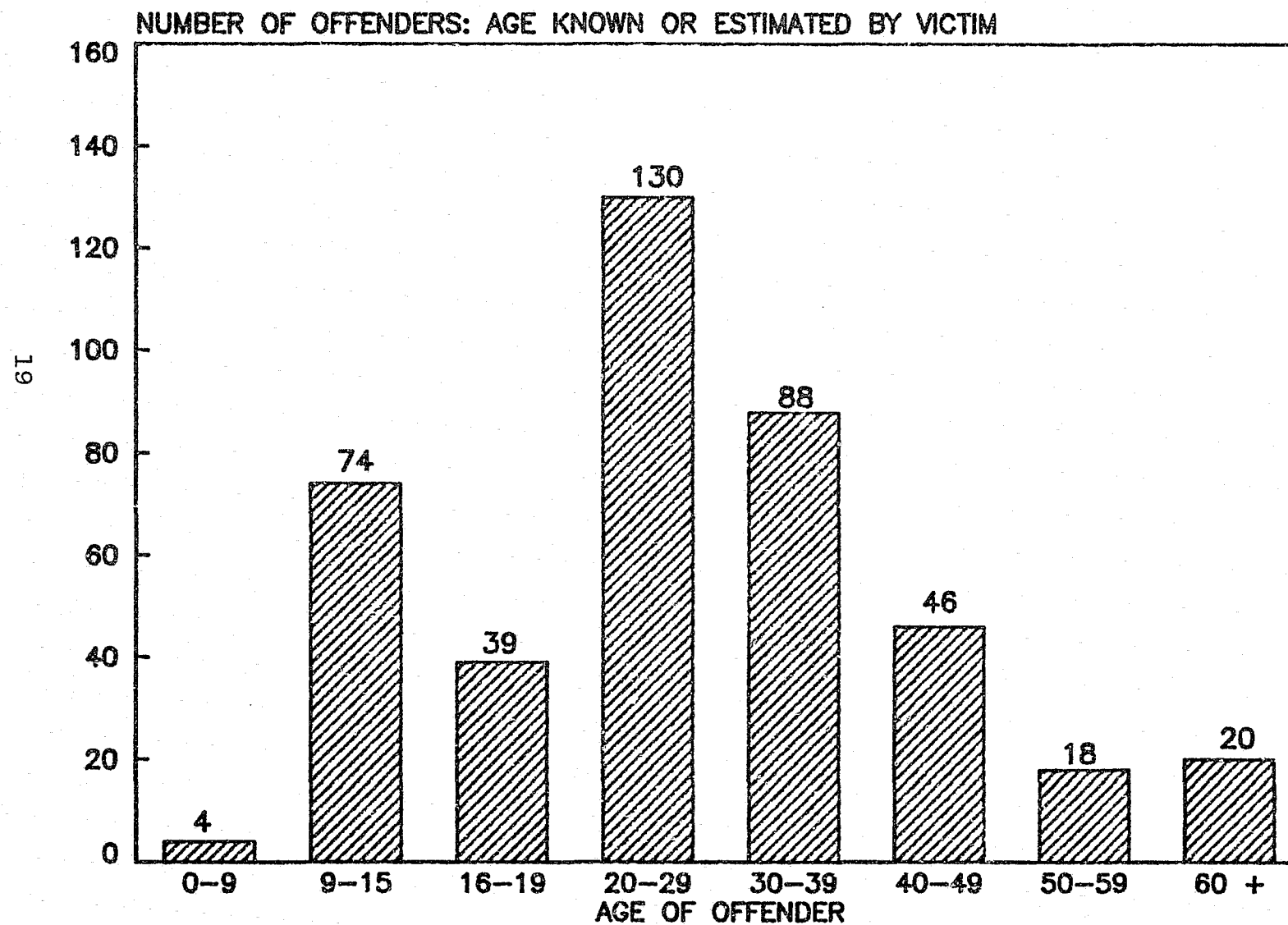
