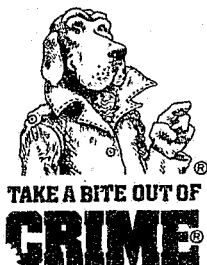


Dear Coalition Members:
