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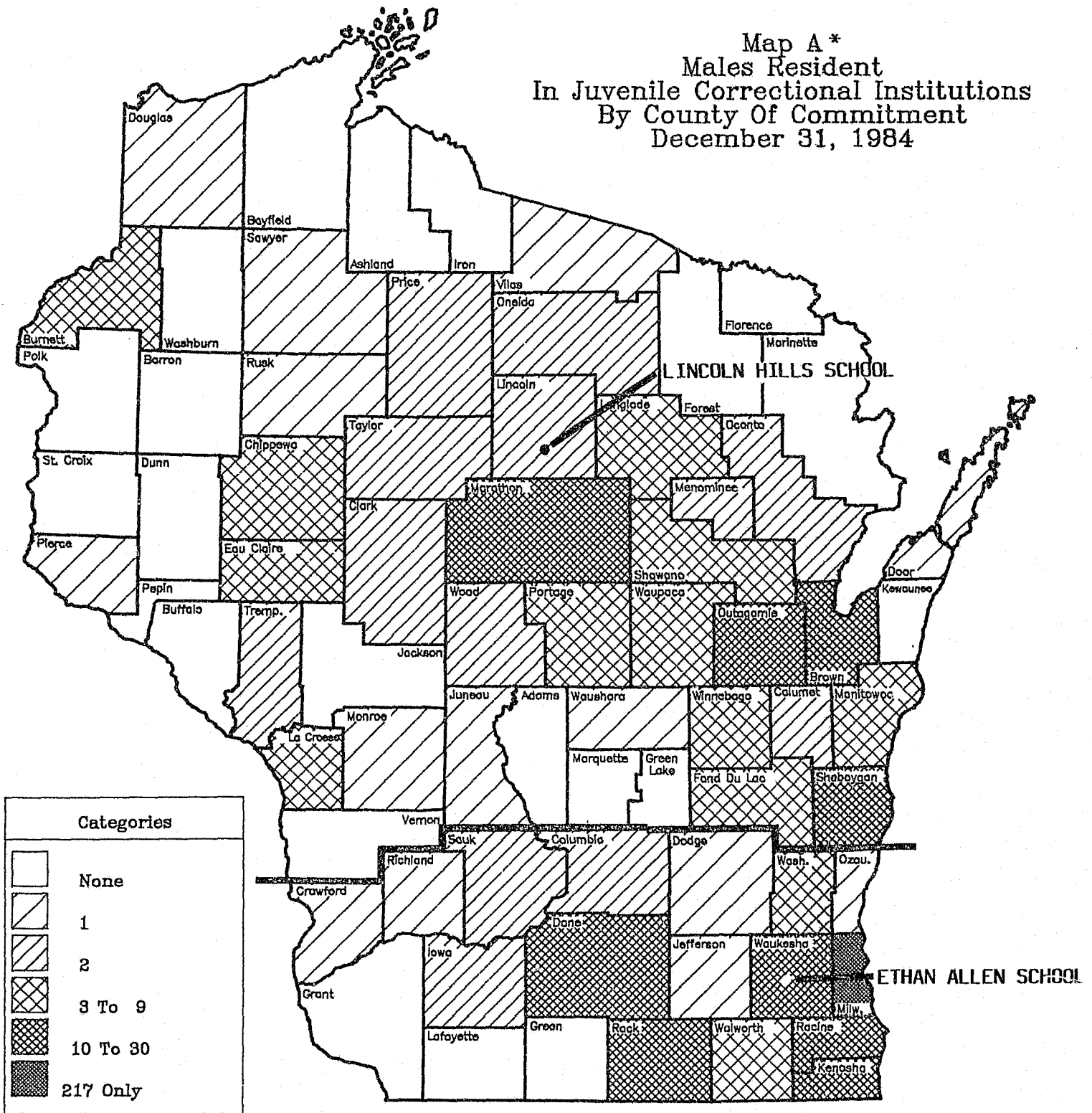

on December 31, 1984
With Five-Year Trends for 1980-1984

Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools, Wisconsin's correctional facilities for juvenile offenders, housed a total of 518 youths, 473 boys and 45 girls, on December 31, 1984. This represents an increase of 14.1 percent over December 31, 1983, when 413 boys and 41 girls were in residence. A variety of information about those in residence on December 31, 1984, including current age, race and ethnicity, county of commitment, etc. can be found in Tables 1 through 11. Trend data for the years 1980-1984 can be found in Appendix Tables A and B.

Four Hundred and seventy-three boys, 294 at Ethan Allen and 179 at Lincoln Hills, were in residence on December 31, 1984; an increase of 14.5 percent over the previous year when 413 boys were reported in residence. Placement at Ethan Allen or Lincoln Hills Schools is dependent, in most cases, upon the location of the county from which the boy is committed. Boys committed from the 53 counties north of the heavy line (see Map A) are generally sent to Lincoln Hills; those from the 19 counties south of the line to Ethan Allen. Following the reception process, boys may be transferred from one facility to another as dictated by individual needs and circumstances. Seven out of ten residents (70.2 percent) were committed to the institutions from counties in the Southern Section of the state; i.e., the Southern, Southeastern, and Milwaukee Regions. Commitments from Milwaukee (217), Racine (30), Kenosha (19), Dane (16), and Outagamie (15) counties made up slightly more than three-fifths (62.8 percent) of the resident population. Twenty-two out of the state's 72 counties (30.6 percent) had no representation in the resident population. (See Map A and Table 3) Boys received at the institutions as new commitments made up the greater part (84.3 percent) of the December 31, 1984 resident population. Somewhat less than one-sixth (13.6 percent) of the boys in residence had been returned to institution supervision following revocation of some type of aftercare supervision while the remaining residents were being held pending completion of aftercare supervision revocation hearings. Boys in residence at Ethan Allen were slightly older (16.4 years) than those at Lincoln Hills (16.0 years) with the average (mean) age for all boys being 16.2 years. About one-half (53.3 percent) of the residents were

December 31, 1984



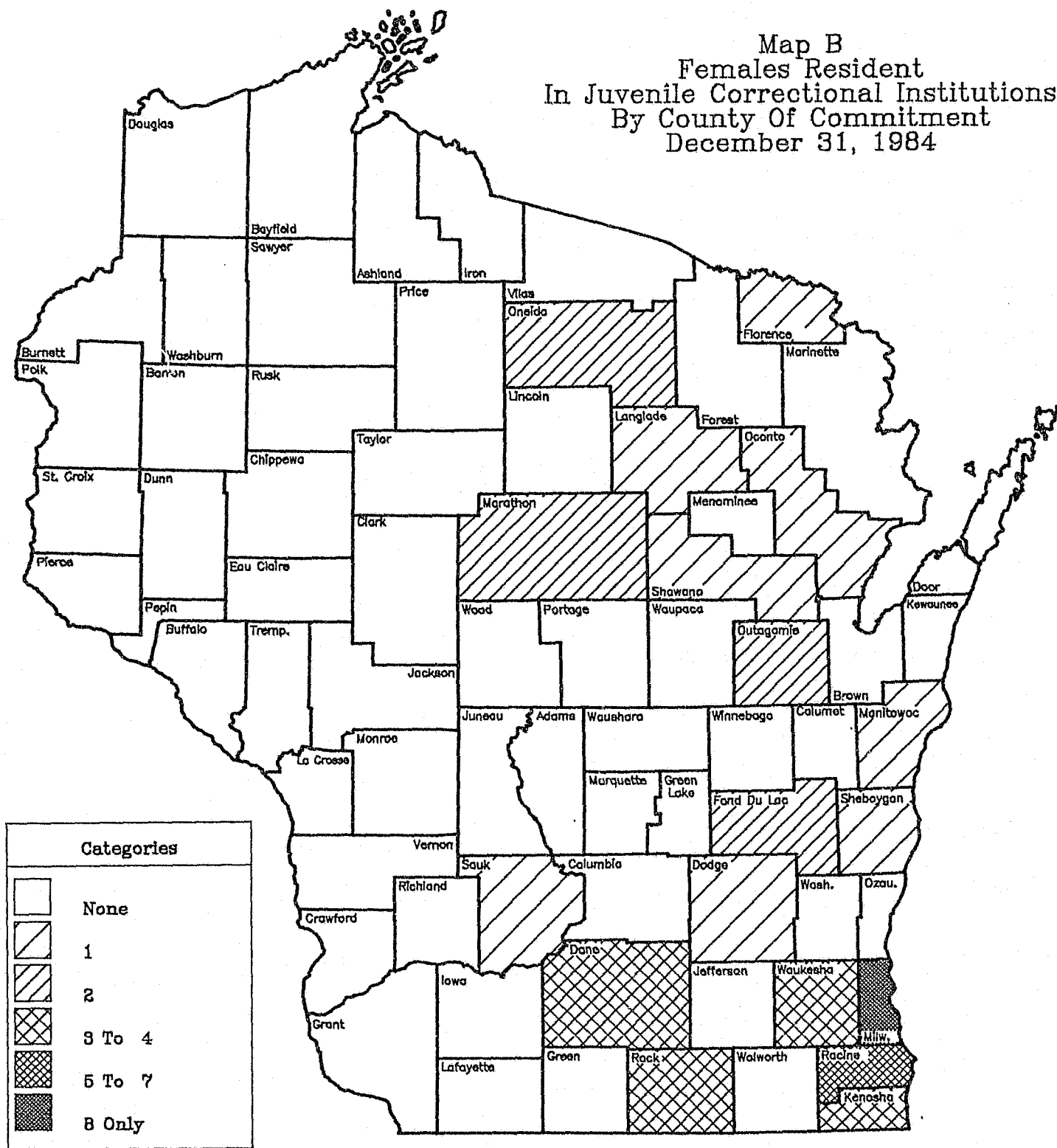

from White or White-Hispanic families while two-fifths (39.5 percent) were from Black family backgrounds. Native Americans, the majority of whom were in residence at Lincoln Hills, made up less than one-tenth (5.9 percent) of the resident population. The major delinquent acts most frequently committed by boys just prior to admission to Ethan Allen School were theft (22.2 percent), battery (18.4 percent), and armed robbery (17.0 percent). Boys in residence at Lincoln Hills School had most often committed unarmed burglary (29.5 percent), auto theft (15.1 percent), and theft (13.3 percent) just prior to admission.

Children are sent to Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools because they have been found to be delinquent and in need of care and treatment in a secure custodial setting. The treatment programs operated at these facilities begin with an evaluation designed to discover the child's strengths and abilities as well as his weaknesses and problems. Following this evaluative process a program is designed that will give the child an opportunity to not only work on coping with or overcoming his problems but also provide a chance to further develop his strengths. A minority (13.8 percent) of the boys in residence on December 31, 1984, were found to be without problems relating to drug and/or alcohol usage, sexual conduct, and assaultive behavior. Slightly less than one-third (31.3 percent) of the boys were reported to have problems relating to the use of drugs and/or alcohol while just under one-tenth (9.8 percent) were reported as having problems related to sexual behavior. Assaultiveness, either alone or in conjunction with drug and/or alcohol and sex-related problems was found to be a major problem area for somewhat over three-fifths (63.6 percent) of the boys.

Wisconsin's only coeducational facility, Lincoln Hills School, reported 45 girls in residence on December 31, 1984; a slight increase over the previous year when 41 girls were in residence. Nine out of ten (89.0 percent) of the girls had entered the institution as new commitments, three were returned because of revocation of aftercare supervision, and two were being supervised for jurisdictions other than the state of Wisconsin. Slightly less than one-half (46.7 percent) of the girls were committed from four counties all located in the southern part of the state; i.e., Milwaukee (8), Racine (5), Dane (4), and Rock (4). Fifty-four out of the state's 72 counties (75.0 percent) had no representation in the resident population. Three-fifths (60.0 percent) of the

girls were from White backgrounds, somewhat over one-fourth (26.7 percent) from Black families, and the remainder from families with a Native American heritage. The average (mean) age was reported to be 16.1 years. Battery (17.7 percent), theft (15.6 percent), and unarmed burglary (13.3 percent) were the delinquent acts most often committed just prior to institutionalization.

Approximately three-fifths (62.2 percent) of the girls in residence on December 31, 1984, were reported to have problems that related to drug and/or alcohol usage. Assaultiveness, either toward oneself or others, was reported to be a problem area for somewhat over one-fourth (26.7 percent) of the residents while difficulties related to sexual behavior were reported for one-fifth (20.0 percent) of the population. Somewhat less than one-fifth (15.6 percent) of the girls did not have problems in the three areas mentioned above.
