I'M HAPPY TO HAVE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLAIN WHAT MY

AGENCY-- THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE--IS AND WHAT IT DOES.

THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE IS A RESEARCH BRANCH OF
THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE. IT IS THE PRIMARY
FEDERAL SPONSOR OF RESEARCH IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE IN THE U.S.

OUR MISSION IS TO DEVELOP KNOWLEDGE ABOUT CRIME, ITS CAUSES,
AND HOW TO CONTROL IT. THROUGH THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE, MY
GOVERNMENT HAS DEDICATED RESOURCES TO DISCOVERING, TESTING AND
COMMUNICATING CRITICAL INFORMATION ABOUT BETTER WAYS TO RESPOND
TO CRIME IN AMERICA.

WE AT THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE ACT AS BRIDGE-BUILDERS IN THIS EFFORT. WE TALK DIRECTLY TO PRACTITIONERS AND POLICYMAKERS IN OUR STATES AND COUNTIES, CITIES AND TOWNS--TO POLICE EXECUTIVES, JUDGES, PROSECUTORS AND LEGISLATORS. THEY TELL US WHAT PROBLEMS THEY FACE IN THE DAY-TO-DAY WORLD OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE.

THEN WE SEEK THE ADVICE OF RESEARCHERS--IN PRIVATE

ORGANIZATIONS, IN UNIVERSITIES, IN LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES--IN

DESIGNING PRACTICAL RESEARCH TO HELP LOCAL OFFICIALS SOLVE THEIR

REAL-LIFE PROBLEMS, AND TO ENSURE THAT THEY KNOW ABOUT NEW CRIME
FIGHTING TOOLS AT THEIR COMMAND.

SUCH A TOOL MIGHT BE A LIGHTWEIGHT BULLET-PROOF VEST, OR A LABORATORY TECHNIQUE FOR NARROWING THE RANGE OF SUSPECTS IN A RAPE CASE.

IT MIGHT BE A BETTER WAY OF ORGANIZING COURT PROCEDURES TO REDUCE THE PARALYZING EFFECTS OF JUDICIAL BACKLOG.

IT MIGHT BE A BETTER WAY OF DESIGNING AND POLICING
NEIGHBORHOODS TO MAKE THEM SAFER PLACES FOR THE CITIZENS WHO LIVE
OR WORK IN THEM.

ALL OF THESE HAVE BEEN PRODUCTS OF RESEARCH SPONSORED BY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE, AND WE STRIVE DAILY TO IMPROVE ON WHAT WE ALREADY HAVE LEARNED.

OUR OVER-RIDING GOAL IS TO GUIDE A PRUDENT INVESTMENT IN
RESEARCH TOWARD POLICY-RELEVANT KNOWLEDGE. THE VALUE OF POLICY-

RELEVANT RESEARCH CAN BE SEEN IN THE EMERGING POLICIES THAT ARE MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN OUR ABILITY TO SAFEGUARD THE PUBLIC--AND CONCENTRATE SCARCE CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESOURCES WHERE THEY WILL DO THE MOST GOOD.

RESEARCH IN THE 1970S, FOR EXAMPLE, CONFIRMED THE EXISTENCE
OF THE CAREER CRIMINAL. FOLLOWING-UP ON THIS IMPORTANT INSIGHT,
THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE SUPPORTED SURVEYS TO GAUGE THE IMPACT OF
THE HIGH-RATE OFFENDER ON CRIME AND ON CRIMINAL JUSTICE
OPERATIONS. FROM THIS BASIC KNOWLEDGE CAME THE IDEA OF FOCUSING
CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESOURCES SELECTIVELY ON THE CAREER CRIMINAL.

TODAY, THE CONCEPT OF THE CAREER CRIMINAL IS ENTRENCHED IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE. IT HAS BEEN A DRAMATIC RETHINKING OF POLICY AND PRACTICE. NOW, RESEARCH IS EXAMINING WAYS TO IDENTIFY THESE OFFENDERS MORE ACCURATELY.

ANOTHER EXAMPLE--DRUG ABUSE. THE LINK BETWEEN DRUG ABUSE

AND CRIME IS UNDENIABLE AND ALARMING. WE HAVE KNOWN FOR SEVERAL

YEARS THAT DRUGS ACCELERATE AN INDIVIDUAL'S CRIME RATE FROM FOUR

TO SIX TIMES WHAT IT IS WHEN THE OFFENDER IS RELATIVELY DRUG-

FREE.

NOW, USING THAT KNOWLEDGE, WE NO LONGER NEED TO WATCH
HELPLESSLY AS CRIME SPAWNED BY DRUGS DEVASTATES ENTIRE
NEIGHBORHOODS. WE CAN DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT.

MANDATORY, COURT-SUPERVISED DRUG TESTING REPRESENTS ONE

OBJECTIVE TEST FOR IDENTIFYING HIGH-RISK OFFENDERS. WITH THIS

SCIENTIFICALLY-ACCURATE, IMPARTIAL DATA, JUDGES CAN ESTABLISH

APPROPRIATE CONDITIONS FOR PRE-TRIAL RELEASE, INCLUDING PERIODIC

DRUG TESTING. OUR RESEARCH SHOWS THAT THIS LOWERS THE DEMAND FOR

DRUGS--AND REDUCES THE CRIME RATE, TOO.

IN POLICING, WE HAVE MOVED BEYOND THE ABILITY TO IDENTIFY
ONLY WHAT DOESN'T WORK. WE NOW KNOW ABOUT SOME PRACTICES THAT DO
WORK. WE CAN DEMONSTRATE VARIOUS OPTIONS FOR MANAGING POLICE
RESOURCES WITH GREATER EFFECTIVENESS AND EFFICIENCY. THE
PROBLEM-SOLVING APPROACH, FOR EXAMPLE, HAS SHOWN ITS
EFFECTIVENESS IN REDUCING CRIME AND DISORDER.

THESE AND OTHER CONTRIBUTIONS ARE THE PRODUCT OF THE INCREASINGLY FRUITFUL COLLABORATION BETWEEN CRIMINAL JUSTICE

PRACTITIONERS AND RESEARCHERS. DURING THE SIX YEARS I HAVE HAD

THE HONOR TO SERVE AS THE DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF

JUSTICE, MERGING RESEARCH AND PRACTICE HAS BEEN ONE OF MY CHIEF

PRIORITIES. THE GAINS MADE IN RECENT YEARS ARE REFLECTED IN THE

NATIONAL INSTITUTE'S POSITION AS A LEADER IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE

FIELD.

THE GROWING CONSENSUS ABOUT THE VALUE OF RESEARCH IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE STEMS, I BELIEVE, FROM SEVERAL IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENTS.

FIRST, THE COSTS OF CRIME AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE TO OUR

SOCIETY HAVE BECOME SO GREAT THAT WE CAN NO LONGER AFFORD NOT TO

MEASURE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF OUR PRACTICES AND ASSESS

CONSEQUENCES. THIS HAS CREATED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR POLICY—

ORIENTED RESEARCH TO HELP CRIMINAL JUSTICE AGENCIES WORK SMARTER,

NOT HARDER.

SECOND, AS I HAVE INDICATED, WE HAVE MOVED FAR IN CREATING A FAVORABLE CLIMATE FOR COLLABORATION BETWEEN THOSE WHO DESIGN AND CONDUCT RESEARCH AND THOSE WHO MAKE AND CARRY OUT CRIME CONTROL

POLICIES. THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE MAINTAINS A CONTINUING DIALOGUE WITH CRIMINAL JUSTICE PRACTITIONERS AND POLICYMAKERS TO ENSURE THAT OUR RESEARCH IS ATTUNED TO THE CHALLENGES THEY FACE, AND THAT THE NEW INFORMATION WE DEVELOP IS DELIVERED TO THEM.

THIRD, WE HAVE REORGANIZED THE WAY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE

ALLOCATES ITS RESOURCES. WE HAVE ADOPTED A HOLISTIC APPROACH

THAT ADDRESSES OVERARCHING PROBLEMS FACING CRIMINAL JUSTICE AS A

WHOLE, AND NOT JUST ITS SEPARATE PARTS--POLICE, COURTS,

CORRECTIONS, AND THE LIKE.

IN THIS WAY, WE CAN AVOID COMPARTMENTALIZING OUR THINKING.

INSTEAD, WE CAN ASSESS HOW THE POLICIES OF EACH CRIMINAL JUSTICE

INSTITUTION CAN CONTRIBUTE TO REDUCING CRIME AS PART OF A WHOLE

SYSTEM.

AND FOURTH, WE HAVE MADE STRIKING ADVANCES IN THE METHODS OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH. THROUGH SOPHISTICATED EXPERIMENTS AND TECHNOLOGIES, WE CAN ENHANCE THE RELIABILITY OF OUR RESEARCH FINDINGS AND THE STRENGTH OF OUR POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS.

ALL OF THIS HAS HAPPENED IN THE LAST TWENTY YEARS. IN THE

1960S, THERE WAS LITTLE OR NO SYSTEMATIC, OBJECTIVE INFORMATION

AVAILABLE ON CRIME AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE POLICIES. FIELD

EXPERIMENTS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE WERE RARE. THEY INCREASED

SOMEWHAT IN THE 1970S, BUT IT WASN'T UNTIL THIS DECADE THAT EVERY

AREA OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE POLICYMAKING SAW SCORES OF EXPERIMENTS

COMPLETED AND MORE IN PROGRESS.

THE RECORD OF ACCOMPLISHMENT SHOWS THAT THE FIELD OF

CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT HAS ADVANCED TOWARD THE

CRITICAL MASS CAPABLE OF SUSTAINING AND EXPANDING PROGRESS. WE

ARE NOT YET AT THE LEVEL OF THE MEDICAL PROFESSION, WHERE NEW

TREATMENTS ALWAYS ARE TESTED BEFORE THEY ARE INTRODUCED FOR WIDE
SCALE USE. BUT SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE IN HARNESSING

THE POWER OF THE EXPERIMENT FOR CRIMINAL JUSTICE POLICYMAKING.

PERHAPS THE BEST DEMONSTRATION OF HOW FAR THE NATIONAL
INSTITUTE HAS COME IN TWENTY YEARS IS THE FACT THAT AT LEAST ONE
RESPECTABLE PUBLICATION IN WASHINGTON NO LONGER CONSIDERS US JUST
ANOTHER RESEARCH AGENCY. IT CALLS US A "THINK TANK." IN
WASHINGTON, THAT MEANS SOMETHING!

SO, WE'RE NO LONGER AN INFANT ENTERPRISE, AND WE HAVE

COMPILED A NOTABLE TRACK RECORD. THE PRACTITIONERS AND

RESEARCHERS WHO HAVE JOINED WITH US CAN POINT TO SIGNIFICANT

ACHIEVEMENTS.

NOT SO INCIDENTALLY, ONE OF THE CHIEF AIMS OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE HAS BEEN THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CORPS OF TALENTED RESEARCH SCIENTISTS. THE SHEER BRAIN POWER NOW MOBILIZED FOR RESEARCH AGAINST CRIME IS IMMENSELY ENCOURAGING, AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO NURTURE THIS VITAL SOURCE OF OUR PROGRESS.

FINALLY, LET ME POINT OUT THAT WE DO ALL THIS ON A MODEST
BUDGET. INVESTMENT IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH TO DATE HAS BEEN
LIMITED. IN FACT, THE PER CAPITAL INVESTMENT IN PUBLIC SAFETY
RESEARCH IN THE UNITED STATES IS EIGHT CENTS, COMPARED TO THIRTYSIX DOLLARS ALLOCATED FOR HEALTH RESEARCH.

THIS IS NOT SURPRISING, GIVEN THE STILL EARLY STAGE OF DEVELOPMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH AS A RECOGNIZED FIELD OF SCIENTIFIC ENDEAVOR.

I BELIEVE WE HAVE DEMONSTRATED OUR ABILITY TO INVEST THE

FUNDS ENTRUSTED TO US WISELY AND EFFECTIVELY. BUT IF WE ARE TO REALIZE THE ADDED DIMENSION OF USEFULNESS THAT EXPERIMENTS CAN GIVE US, WE WILL NEED A SUSTAINED AND EXPANDED COMMITMENT OF RESOURCES.

I AM HOPEFUL THAT WE WILL GET THAT COMMITMENT AND THEREBY SUPPORT THE MOMENTUM WE HAVE DEVELOPED AS WE MOVE TOWARDS THE 21ST CENTURY.

THEN, CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH CAN CROSS THE THRESHOLD TO MAJOR ADVANCES THAT WILL ENABLE US TO FASHION NEW AND EVEN MORE EFFECTIVE CRIME CONTROL POLICIES.

- Over-riding goal policy-relevant knowledge; value seen in emerging policies:
  - o career criminal
  - o drug abuse link to crime; pre-trial testing
  - o policing problem solving approach
- o My six years as Director merging research and practice has been one of chief priorities.

- Value of criminal justice research enhanced by several factors:
  - o high costs of crime and criminal justice; have to help agencies work smarter, not harder
  - o collaboration between practitioners/policymakers, and researchers
  - o reorganized way NIJ allocates resources holistic approach
  - o advances in methods of criminal justice research;
    sophisticated experiments]
- o progress in last 20 years; NIJ now "think tank"
- o corps of talented research specialists
- o modest budget 8 cents per capita; 36 dollars for health research
- o will need greater commitment to maintain momentum for future
