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INTRODUCTION

Homicide in California, 1987 is an annual publication which provides an overview of the crime of homicide and its victims, information on persons arrested for murder, and the criminal justice system's response. Information on such topics as the death penalty, the number of peace officers killed in the line of duty and the events which led to their deaths, and justifiable homicides is also included.

The major sections of the report are:

- Willful Homicide Crimes
- Arrests for Murder
- Dispositions of Adults Arrested for Murder

Most data presented were obtained from three different Bureau of Criminal Statistics (BCS) data bases: the Homicide File for data pertaining to both willful and justifiable homicide crimes; the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register for data pertaining to the characteristics of persons arrested for murder; and the Offender-Based Transaction Statistics file for information on types of dispositions, sentences, and death penalty cases. Because of the differences in the types of data collected and the methods used to collect these data, the reader is cautioned against comparing these different data bases.

Willful homicides decreased in number and rate per 100,000 population from 1986 to 1987 (down 3.3 and 5.4 percent, respectively).

The number of drug-related and gang-related homicides has nearly tripled since 1978.

Seven out of ten homicide victims knew the offender (70.8 percent).

Female victims were ten times more likely than male victims to be a spouse of the offender (23.0 versus 2.2 percent).

More victims were killed by firearms than by all other types of weapons combined (59.5 percent).

The black homicide victim rate per 100,000 population was almost nine times that of whites (not Hispanic) (46.9 versus 5.3).

Since 1978, 74 peace officers have been killed in the line of duty. Four were killed in 1987.

Of the persons arrested for murder for which dispositions were received in 1987, over two-thirds (70.5 percent) were convicted of murder or some other offense.

By the end of 1987, 203 persons were under sentence of death in California. Of these, 25 were sentenced in 1987.

WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES

The crime of willful homicide is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) as the "willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another." Attempted murder, justifiable homicide, manslaughter by negligence, and suicide are excluded. The data presented in this section of the report coincide with that definition, and were obtained almost exclusively from the Homicide File. Other data sources are identified in the footnotes of the appropriate charts and tables.

From 1986 to 1987:

- The willful homicide rate per 100,000 population decreased 5.4 percent (11.2 to 10.6).
- The number of willful homicides decreased from 3,030 to 2,929.

From 1978 to 1987:

- The willful homicide rate per 100,000 population decreased 7.0 percent (11.4 to 10.6).
- The number of willful homicides increased from 2,601 to 2,929.

Of the four offenses classified as violent crimes by the FBI, willful homicide has maintained the lowest rate per 100,000 population for the years shown. For comparison, changes in the rates of the violent crimes from 1978 to 1987 were as follows:

- Willful homicide down 7.0 percent.
- Forcible rape down 11.2 percent.
- Robbery up 1.3 percent.
- Aggravated assault up 54.9 percent.



Chart 1 VIOLENT CRIMES, 1978-1987 Rate per 100,000 Population



Sex of Victims


Analysis of the sex of willful homicide victims revealed that:

- In 1987, 75.9 percent were male and 24.1 percent were female.
- For each year, 1978-1987, the largest proportion of homicide victims was male. The proportions ranged from 75.9 to 79.6 percent.





Known Race/Ethnic Group of Victims



Analysis of the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims revealed that:

- In 1987, 30.8 percent were white (not Hispanic), 30.6 percent were Hispanic, 34.2 percent were black, and 4.4 percent fell into the "all other" race/ethnic group category.
- For each year, 1978-1987, the proportion of white (not Hispanic) homicide victims has tended to decrease while the proportions of Hispanics, blacks, and "all other" race/ethnic groups have tended to increase or remain fairly stable.

Known Race/Ethnic Group of Victims by Year



Chart 6 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987 Known Age of Victims


Analysis of the age of willful homicide victims revealed that:

- years, 37.6 percent were 20-29 years, 22.9 percent were 30-39 years, and 24.2 percent were 40 years of age or older.
- For each year, 1978-1987, the smallest proportion of homicide victims was under 20 years of age.
- For each year, 1978-1987, the largest proportion of homicide victims was 20-29 years of age.





Chart 7 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1978-1987 Known Age of Victims by Year





When the sex of willful homicide victims in 1987 was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) were male than were either Hispanics or blacks (63.2 versus 86.7 and 78.7 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were female than were either Hispanics or blacks (36.8 versus 13.3 and 21.3 percent, respectively).

When the known age of willful homicide victims in 1987 was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) were under 20 years of age than were either Hispanics or blacks (9.9 versus 16.7 and 18.7 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were 40 years of age or older than were either Hispanics or blacks (37.9 versus 15.2 and 19.2 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more Hispanics and blacks were 20-29 years of age than were whites (not Hispanic) (46.1 and 42.0 versus 26.0 percent, respectively).


CRIMES MANAGEMENT

The willful homicide rate in 1987 was 10.6 per 100,000 population. Charts 10, 11, and 12 show willful homicide rates per 100,000 population for victims classified by sex, race/ethnic group, and age.

Throughout the period 1978 to 1987:

- Males were more than three times as likely as females to be homicide victims.
- Blacks were more than twice as likely as Hispanics and about six times as likely as whites (not Hispanic) to be homicide victims.
- Persons 20-29 years of age had the highest homicide rate. They were more than three times as likely to be homicide victims as persons under the age of twenty and more than twice as likely to be homicide victims as persons 40 years of age or older.





Rate per 100,000 Population by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim





Chart 13 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987 Known Relationship of Victim to Offender





When 1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by known relationship of the victim to the offender, it was found that:


- 55.7 percent of victims were friends or acquaintances of offenders.
- 29.2 percent of victims were strangers to offenders.
- 7.1 percent of victims were spouses of offenders.
- 5.1 percent of victims were parents or children of offenders.
- 2.9 percent of the relationships of victim to offender fell into the "all other" category.

When known relationship of the victim to the offender was compared with the sex of victims, it was found that:


- Male victims were much more likely than female victims to be friends or acquaintances of offenders (60.0 versus 41.9 percent).
- Male victims were more likely than female victims to be strangers to offenders (31.1 versus 22.8 percent).
- Female victims were much more likely than male victims to be spouses of offenders (23.0 versus 2.2 percent).
- Female victims were more likely than male victims to be parents or children of offenders (8.8 versus 4.0 percent).

Known Relationship of Victim to Offender by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim





When known relationship of the victim to the offender was compared with the race/ethnic group of victims, it was found that:

- Black victims were more likely to be friends or acquaintances of offenders than white (not Hispanic) or Hispanic victims (59.1 versus 51.3 and 57.7 percent, respectively).
- White (not Hispanic) victims were more likely to be spouses, parents, or children of offenders than either Hispanic or black victims (20.8 versus 7.1 and 8.4 percent, respectively).
- Hispanic and black victims were more likely to be strangers to offenders than white (not Hispanic) victims (32.9 and 28.7 versus 25.7 percent, respectively).

Average Homicide Rate per 100,000 Population by Size of County





When 1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by known month of incident, it was found that:

The incident which ultimately led to death occurred more often in the first six months than in the last six months (50.2 versus 49.8 percent).


1987 is the first year since 1974 in which the incident which led to death occurred more often in the first six months of the year than in the second six months of the year.

Chart 17 **WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987** Known Month of Incident





When 1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by known day of incident, it was found that:

Most willful homicides occurred on Saturday and Sunday (17.0 and 18.8 percent, respectively).


When the known day of incident was compared with the race/ethnic group of victims, it was found that:


- Proportionately, more Hispanics than whites (not Hispanic) or blacks were killed on Saturday and Sunday (39.5 versus 35.8 and 32.0 percent, respectively).
- Whites (not Hispanic) were killed most often on Saturday (18.3 percent), while Sunday was the peak day for Hispanics and blacks (21.8 and 16.8 percent, respectively).

When the known day of incident was compared with the sex of victims, it was found that:

For both males and females, over onethird were killed on weekends (36.5 and 33.3 percent, respectively).


When 1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by known location of incident, it was found that:

- 30.8 percent of victims were killed at their places of residence.
- 32.8 percent of homicides occurred on streets or sidewalks.

When the known location of incident was compared with the sex of victims, it was found that:


- Proportionately, many more females than males were killed at their places of residence (53.1 versus 23.8 percent).
- Proportionately, many more males than females were killed on streets or sidewalks (38.6 versus 14.3 percent).


Chart 22 **WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987** Known Location of Homicide by Sex of Victim

Chart 23 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987 Known Location of Homicide by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim





When the known location of incident was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were killed at their places of residence (44.8 versus 20.3 and 26.8 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were killed on streets or sidewalks (15.5 versus 41.4 and 43.2 percent, respectively).

Known Type of Weapon





When 1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by known type of weapon, it was found that:

- 59.4 percent resulted from the use of firearms.
 - 45.9 percent resulted from the use of handguns.
 - 13.5 percent resulted from the use of other and unknown types of firearms.

- 20.4 percent resulted from the use of knives.
- 6.7 percent resulted from the use of blunt objects (bludgeons, clubs, etc.).
- 6.8 percent resulted from the use of personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.).
- 2.9 percent resulted from the use of ropes.
- 3.8 percent resulted from the use of weapons grouped in the "all other" category.

Chart 25 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987 Known Type of Weapon by Sex of Victim



When the known type of weapon used was compared with the sex and/or race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:


- Regardless of sex or race/ethnic group, the victim was most likely to have been killed by a firearm.
- The proportion of males killed by firearms was greater than that of females (64.1 versus 44.8 percent).
- The proportion of females killed by personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.) was greater than that of males (12.6 versus 4.9 percent).

- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were killed by personal weapons than were Hispanics or blacks (10.1 versus 3.9 and 6.1 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more Hispanics and blacks were killed by firearms than were whites (not Hispanic) (64.2 and 66.3 versus 48.2 percent, respectively).

When 1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by known contributing circumstance, it was found that:

- 49.8 percent were associated with arguments.
- 18.4 percent were associated with rape, robbery, or burglary.
- 11.4 percent were gang-related.
- 8.7 percent were drug-related.
- 11.7 percent were associated with "all other" contributing circumstances.

Chart 27 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1987 Known Contributing Circumstance



When 1978-1987 willful homicide crimes were examined by selected contributing circumstances, it was found that:

- The proportion of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gang-related increased from 6.0 percent in 1978 to 11.4 percent in 1987.
- The proportion of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was drugrelated increased from 4.3 percent in 1978 to 8.7 percent in 1987.





When the known contributing circumstance was compared with the sex of willful homicide victims in 1987, it was found that:

Males were much more likely than females to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gang-related or drug-related (14.0 and 10.5 versus 3.2 and 2.9 percent, respectively).

Known Contributing Circumstance by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim





When the known contributing circumstance was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- For each race/ethnic group shown, the circumstance which most contributed to homicides was an argument.
- Whites (not Hispanic) were much more likely than either Hispanics or blacks to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was either a rape, robbery, or burglary (24.8 versus 13.9 and 15.9 percent, respectively).
- Whites (not Hispanic) were less likely than either Hispanics or blacks to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gangrelated (.1 versus 14.5 and 19.7 percent, respectively).
- Blacks were much more likely than either whites (not Hispanic) or Hispanics to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was drugrelated (14.2 versus 5.4 and 6.9 percent, respectively).

When the known contributing circumstance was compared with the known age of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Of the 133 victims 0-14 years old, 39.1 percent of the homicides were the result of child abuse. This finding was even more pronounced for 0-4 year olds in which 64.2 percent of deaths resulted from child abuse (Table 43).
- Of the 293 victims 15-19 years old, 41.3 percent of the homicides resulted from gang-related circumstances.
- Of the 2,053 victims 20-59 years old, 55.4 percent of the homicides resulted from arguments.
- Of the 222 victims 60 years of age and older, the contributing circumstance was rape, robbery, or burglary in 45.5 percent of the homicides (5.4, 31.5, and 8.6 percent, respectively).


ARRESTS FOR MURDER

Murder is defined as the unlawful killing, with malice aforethought, of a human being. Information about arrests for murder was obtained from the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register (MACR) which contains information on all arrests made in 1987, as reported to BCS by California law enforcement agencies. Data in this section of the report is devoted to the personal characteristics (sex, race/ethnic group, and age) of those persons arrested for murder in 1987 and to the manner in which these characteristics relate to one another.

ARRESTS

Sex, Race/Ethnic Group, Juvenile-Adult, and Age of Arrestee





Analysis of the personal characteristics of 2,816 arrestees for murder in 1987 revealed that:

- 9.8 percent were female.
- 90.2 percent were male.

And,

- 25.6 percent were white (not Hispanic).
- 32.5 percent were Hispanic.
- 37.9 percent were black.
- **4.0** percent were of "all other" race/ethnic groups.



And,

- 12.5 percent were juvenile.
- 87.5 percent were adult.

And,

- 24.9 percent were under 20 years of age.
- 43.3 percent were 20-29 years of age.
- 20.3 percent were 30-39 years of age.
- 11.5 percent were 40 years of age or older.

ARRESTS

When the sex of arrestees for murder in 1987 was compared with the race/ethnic group of arrestees for murder, it was found that:

The ratio of male to female was much greater for Hispanics than for either whites (not Hispanic) or blacks (20 to 1 versus 6 to 1 and 8 to 1, respectively).

When the age of arrestees for murder was compared with the race/ethnic group of arrestees for murder, it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) were under 20 years of age than were Hispanics or blacks (11.7 versus 29.1 and 30.4 percent, respectively).
- However, proportionately more whites (not Hispanic) were 30-39 years of age than were Hispanics or blacks (26.1 versus 17.9 and 17.4 percent, respectively).


Proportionately more whites (not Hispanic) were 40 years of age or older than were Hispanics or blacks (18.3 versus 8.2 and 9.8 percent, respectively).

When data pertaining to juvenile and adult arrestees for murder were compared with the race/ethnic group of arrestees for murder, it was found that:

- The proportion of white (not Hispanic) juveniles was less than the proportion of white (not Hispanic) adults (10.5 versus 27.7 percent).
- However, the proportion of Hispanics and blacks was greater for juveniles than for adults (40.3 and 44.9 versus 31.4 and 36.9 percent, respectively).

Sex of Arrestee by Race/Ethnic Group





DISPOSITIONS

DISPOSITIONS OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER

This section of the report describes dispositions made during 1987 of adults arrested for murder, regardless of the year of arrest. Data were obtained from the Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system. OBTS system data are compiled from information collected on the "Disposition of Arrest and Court Action" form (JUS 8715). Despite underreporting of JUS 8715 forms, it is believed that these dispositions are generally descriptive of those adult felony arrestees processed through the criminal justice system. Disposition data presented are based on arrests for murder only.


In 1987 there were 25 persons sentenced to death. All 25 were arrested for murder (in 1987 or prior years) and subsequently convicted and sentenced to death in 1987. In this section these death sentences are included in the "prison" category when type of sentence is compared with convicted offense. Additional information about persons who received the death penalty in 1987 is presented in the Death Penalty Cases Section on page 41.

OBTS data were analyzed by:

- Comparing the type of disposition (release, dismissal or acquittal, and conviction) with personal characteristics of the arrestee.
- Comparing convicted offense (murder and other offenses such as manslaughter, assault, and robbery) with personal characteristics of the convicted arrestee.
- Comparing the type of sentence received with the convicted offense of the arrestee.

Examination of 1987 dispositions of adults arrested for murder revealed that:

- 17.7 percent were released at the law enforcement level or had a complaint denied at the prosecutor level.
- 11.8 percent were either dismissed or acquitted by the courts.
- 70.5 percent were convicted of murder or some other offense.




DISPOSITIONS IN 1987 OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER

Type of Disposition by Sex, Race/Ethnic Group, and Age of Arrestee




When 1987 dispositions of adults arrested for murder were examined by sex, race/ethnic group, and age, it was found that:

- Females were more likely to be released at the law enforcement level or have complaints denied at the prosecutor level than males (21.4 versus 17.3 percent, respectively).
- However, males were more likely to be dismissed or acquitted by the courts than females (12.2 versus 7.8 percent, respectively).

CONVICTED

- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were convicted (81.9 versus 64.4 and 65.7 percent, respectively).
- Releases decreased with age while convictions generally increased with age (25.2 to 12.1 percent and 63.3 to 77.9 percent, respectively).

Of those adults arrested for murder who were convicted in 1987, it was found that:

- **40.7** percent were convicted of murder.
- 59.3 percent were convicted of lesser crimes, such as manslaughter, assault, or robbery.


DISPOSITIONS IN 1987 OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER AND CONVICTED

Convicted Offense by Sex, Race/Ethnic Group, and Age of Arrestee




When dispositions in 1987 of adults arrested for murder and convicted were examined by sex, race/ethnic group, and age, it was found that:

Considerably more males than females were convicted of murder (42.6 versus 23.9 percent).

- MURDER . ALL OTHER
 - Fewer Hispanics were convicted of murder than either whites (not Hispanic) or blacks (39.8 versus 43.6 and 40.0 percent, respectively).
 - More persons in the 20-29 age group were convicted of murder (42.6 percent), than in any other age group.

When dispositions in 1987 of adults arrested for murder and convicted were examined by type of sentence, it was found that:

Proportionately, more of those convicted of murder were sentenced to prison or to the Youth Authority than were those convicted of lesser offenses (99.1 versus 77.2 percent).1

DEATH PENALTY CASES

DEATH SENTENCES

This section presents information on those persons sentenced to death in California superior courts in 1987. Death penalty cases were extracted from the 1987 Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system.

The death penalty in California was ruled unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court in February 1972. This was followed by a public vote and the reinstatement of the death penalty in January 1974. The resultant statute was subsequently declared unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court in December 1976. By virtue of a veto override in August 1977, new legislation was adopted that reinstated the death penalty in California.

By public vote on November 7, 1978, additional criteria were added to the special circumstances under which a person could be sentenced to death. A summary of the criteria specified by Penal Code Section 190.2 follows:

- Intentional murder for financial gain.
- Previously convicted of murder in the first or second degree.
- Multiple convictions for first or second degree murder.
- Murder perpetrated by means of destructive device, bomb, or explosive.
- Murder to prevent arrest or to effect escape from custody.
- Murder of a peace officer or fireman engaged in the performance of his/her duties.
- Murder of a witness to prevent testimony or in retaliation for testimony given.
- Murder of an elected or appointed official, judge, or prosecutor in retaliation for performance of his/her official duties.
- Murder by ambush.
- Murder because of the victim's race, color, religion, nationality, or country of origin.
- Murder involving torture.
- 题 Murder by poison.
- Murder during the commission of: a) robbery, b) kidnapping, c) rape, d) lewd or lascivious act upon a child under the age of 14, e) sodomy or oral copulation in violation of Penal Code Sections 286 and 288a, f) burglary, g) arson, and h) train wrecking.


DEATH PENALTY CASES

In 1972, and again in 1976, the California Supreme Court ruled the death penalty statute unconstitutional. This resulted in a large decrease in the number of persons on death row. Existing death penalty cases were returned to court for resentencing to the next most severe punishment.

With the reinstatement of the death penalty in August 1977, the number of persons under sentence of death began to grow. By the end of 1987, 203 persons were under sentence of death in California.

During 1987, 25 persons were convicted of first degree murder and sentenced to death. These were initial death sentences only and do not include persons who were resentenced to death after their death sentences were reversed on appeal. The sex, race/ethnic group, age, and sentencing county of those sentenced to death are presented in Table 2.

- M All were male.
- 11 were white (not Hispanic).
- 4 were Hispanic.
- 8 were black.
- 2 fell into the "all other" race/ethnic group category.
- The mean (average) age was 32.
- Los Angeles County sentenced the largest number (8).

Information about peace officers killed in the line of duty was obtained from the Homicide File. Only sworn officers are included. Non-sworn officers, such as security guards, are excluded.

Examination of the data in Table 3 revealed that:

- From 1978-1987, 74 peace officers were killed in the line of duty.
- On the average, 7 peace officers were killed annually. In 1987, the number was 4.
- The number of peace officers killed in the past five years (1983-1987) was 35.6 percent less than that of the previous five years (29 versus 45).

Examination of the data in Tables 4 and 5 revealed that:

- In 1987, all 4 peace officers killed in the line of duty were male; 3 were white (not Hispanic), 1 was black.
- In 1987, 3 peace officers were killed by firearms 1 by a handgun, and 2 by rifles. One peace officer was killed with a knife.

JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES

A justifiable homicide is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program as the killing of a felon by a private citizen or a peace officer during the commission of a felony. Justifiable homicides are sometimes referred to as excusable or noncriminal homicides. The California Penal Code defines killing in self-defense as justifiable homicide, whereas the national UCR Program does not. Therefore, self-defense cases are treated as willful rather than justifiable homicides.

When justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and private citizens in 1987 were examined by sex, race/ethnic group, and known age, it was found that:

- Most felons killed by peace officers and private citizens were male (96.7 and 98.8 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more felons killed by peace officers were white (not Hispanic) than were felons killed by private citizens (43.5 versus 23.5 percent).
- Proportionately, fewer felons killed by peace officers were black than were felons killed by private citizens (19.6 versus 43.5 percent).
- Most felons killed by peace officers and private citizens were 20-29 years of age (43.3 and 47.1 percent, respectively).



JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES BY PEACE OFFICERS AND PRIVATE CITIZENS, 1987


Sex, Race/Ethnic Group, and Known Age of Deceased








When justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and private citizens in 1987 were examined by known location, it was found that:

- Felons were most frequently killed by peace officers on a street or sidewalk (51.1 percent).
- Felons were most frequently killed by private citizens in the citizen's residence (30.1 percent).

When justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and private citizens in 1987 were examined by contributing circumstance, it was found that:

- For peace officers, the circumstances most frequently contributing to justifiable homicides were those of a felon being killed when attacking the peace officer (53.3 percent) and a felon being killed in the commission of a crime (25.0 percent).
- For private citizens, the circumstances most frequently contributing to justifiable homicides were those of a felon being killed when attacking the private citizen (50.6 percent) and a felon being killed in the commission of a crime (42.4 percent).
