SUMMARY: This dataset is part of a larger data collection effort conducted by the principal investigator to study crime, justice, and penal reform in Massachusetts and South Carolina from 1760 to 1880. Data are presented in this file on over 600 slave trials in two counties of ante-bellum South Carolina from 1818 to 1861. The data were obtained from the Anderson and Spartanburg counties surviving public records of the Courts of Magistrates and Freeholders. Included are variables documenting the accused crime, verdict, punishment, and item stolen (if applicable), as well as the defendant's name, sex, status, owner, and date of the trial. CLASS IV

UNIVERSE: Male and female slaves tried for accused crimes in Spartanburg and Anderson counties, South Carolina.

NOTE: The data contain blanks and undefined codes, which are explained in the codebook.
