DATA COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

The Uniform Crime Reports: Arrest Data for the 75 Most Populous Counties in the United States, 1986 reports counts of arrests known as UCR Index (Part I) offenses: rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, auto theft, and arson, as well as Part II offenses: forgery, fraud, embezzlement, weapon violations, drug abuse and liquor violations, gambling vagrancy, curfew and runaways and more. County populations are also reported. The data were originally collected by the Federal Bureau of Investigation from reports submitted by agencies participating in the UCR. Detailed discussions of reporting procedures are found in the UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING HANDBOOK (Washington, DC: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1980), and the codebooks for the ICPSR's agency level UCR data collections (see ICPSR 9028).

For this data collection, the original FBI agency level data have been aggregated to the county level. Data from agencies reporting between six and eleven months of information are weighted to produce twelve month equivalents. For example, data from an agency reporting 11 months of figures are multiplied by 1.09 (12/11). Agencies reporting less than six months of data were excluded from the aggregation. Some jurisdictions, such as state parks and some state police, provide data only on a statewide basis. In these cases, data are allocated to counties proportionate to their share of the state population. Cities designated by the Census Bureau as independent cities (such as Baltimore, Maryland) are reported separately, and have unique "county" codes (see the Appendix).

Previous collections of this sort contained data on Part I (index offense) arrests for every United States county (see ICPSR studies 8703, 8714 and 9119). Data for all ages were reported in one file. This dataset has data representing the 75 most populous counties in the United States, and has Part I and Part II offense arrests, with the data broken down to the adult and juvenile level.

There is one OSIRIS dictionary and two OSIRIS data files. The first data file (Part 1 of this dataset) has Adult arrests reported, and the second (Part 2) has Juvenile arrests. There are 75 cases on 49 variables.
