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The data utilized in this publication were housed in and made available by the National Juvenile Court Data Archive which is maintained by the National Center for Juvenile Justice in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and supported by a grant from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, U.S. Department of Justice. The data were originally collected by the Maryland Juvenile Services Agency. Neither the Maryland Juvenile Services Agency nor the National Center for Juvenile Justice bear any responsibility for the analyses or interpretations presented herein.

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INTRODUCTION

History of Maryland's Automated Juvenile Information System

The Juvenile Services Administration within the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene began a case-level automated information reporting system in 1971. A major revision of the system was begun in July, 1981 and completed in 1983. At the beginning of the revision process, data were backloaded on juveniles who were processed by the Juvenile Services Administration after the conversion to the new system. The records of those not seen after July 1, 1981 were not entered into the new system. The Maryland Automated Juvenile Information System (MAJIS) is a batch and on-line system and is now maintained by the Juvenile Services Agency (the Agency), previously known as the Juvenile Services Administration, under the auspices of the Governor's Office. The authority for the Agency to collect data is currently stated in the Maryland Code Annotated, C.J.P., Section 8 of Article 52A. The data are used at the local level as working documents and files and at the state level for juvenile justice planning.

Data Collection Methods

The juvenile court within circuit courts in 23 counties and the district court in the remaining county have exclusive original jurisidiction over a child alleged to be delinquent, in need of supervision or assistance, who has received a citation for a violation, and a child involved in Interstate Compact cases. The juvenile court has concurrent jurisdiction with the district court in any criminal case coming under the compulsory public school attendance laws of the state.

Juvenile Service Agency field offices perform the intake and post-disposition functions. Agency workers complete a MAJIS form (see Appendix) for each referral to an Agency office. Information collected on the form includes social background, demographic, intake, offense, disposition, treatment and placement data. These forms are batched daily by a local or regional office having an on-line terminal. Information is updated as a case is processed through the system. Edit and relational checks are run by the state. Local offices are contacted concerning errors. A listing of unresolved cases are sent to the local offices every six months for completion.

Publications

Each year the Agency has published a report summarizing juvenile court processing for the previous fiscal year based on data collected by the Maryland Automated Juvenile Information System. [Juvenile Services Administration Annual Report, Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.]

Archived Data Files

Each year the National Juvenile Court Data Archive asks the Agency to create a data file containing selected MAJIS information from records for each case disposed during the previous fiscal year. The data files contain an individual record on each delinquency, status offense, abuse, neglect and traffic case disposed. Cases processed formally (with a petition) and those handled informally (without a petition) are included. Records contain a youth's sex, race, date of birth, date of offense, date of arrest, county of referral and offense, referral reason and

offense, date of referral, source of referral, date of intake decision, manner of handling, date of petition, disposition and date of disposition.

The National Juvenile Court Data Archive staff has merged two fiscal year data files to create calendar year data. The staff has also checked the data for invalid or inconsistent code values. When found, such codes were replaced with missing data code values.

Each case record is 69 characters in length and contains 26 variables. The data are stored in both single calendar and fiscal year files. The number of case records on each calendar year data files is as follows:

Summary tabulations on selected variables (manner of handling and sex breakdowns for delinquency/status offense cases and dependency/neglect cases for each county in Maryland) are publicly available beginning with 1982 data through the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research at the University of Michigan, P.O. Box 1248, Ann Arbor, Michigan. 48106.

USING THE CODEBOOK

The information that follows is based on a study of available documentation from the data supplier (e.g., Juvenile Services Administration's <u>Maryland Automated Juvenile Information System Abbreviated User's Manual</u>), interviews with the data supplier and court personnel and diagnostic analyses performed by the Archive staff. The example below is a reproduction of information appearing in the codebook for a typical variable. The numbers in brackets do not appear in the codebook, but are references to the descriptions which follow this example.
