FEMALE ADMISSIONS BY RACE Fiscal Year 1987-88



AVERAGE MAXIMUM SENTENCE GIVEN FY 1981-82 Through FY 1987-88






FEMALE RELEASES BY RACE Fiscal Year 1987-88






INMATE POPULATION BY CUSTODY LEVEL As Of June 30, 1988




INMATE POPULATION BY AGE As Of June 30, 1988



OFFENDERS BY STATE OF BIRTH As Of June 30, 1988








ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Month (FY 1987-88)


ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Institution (FY 1987-88)









ADULT PROBATION CASELOAD – BY REGION As Of June 30














JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY RACE Fiscal Year 1987-88





AVERAGE DAILY IN-HOUSE POPULATION PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION Fiscal Year 1987-88










TOTAL POPULATION BY AGE As of June 30, 1988





JUVENILE POPULATION BY RACE As of June 30, 1988




TOTAL JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX As of June 30, 1988







YEAR END POPULATION VS. CAPACITY As of June 30, 1988







PROBATION EXITS DISTRIBUTION BY TYPE Fiscal Year 1987-88








MALE ADMISSIONS BY RACE 1988








FEMALE RELEASES BY RACE Calendar Year 1988








INMATE POPULATION BY RACE As Of December 31, 1988




INMATE POPULATION BY SEX As Of December 31, 1988








INMATE POPULATION BY AGE As Of December 31, 1988



OFFENDERS BY STATE OF BIRTH As Of December 31, 1988











ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Month (1988)

ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Institution (1988)






YEAR END POPULATION VS. CAPACITY As of December 31, 1988




JUVENILE POPULATION BY RACE As of December 31, 1988




TOTAL JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX As of December 31, 1988






JUVENILE SECURITY POSITIONS As of December 31, 1988
