## HOMICIDE IN CALIFORNIA, 1988

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Homicide in California, 1988 is an annual publication which provides an overview of the crime of homicide and its victims, information on persons arrested for murder, and the criminal justice system's response. Information on such topics as the death penalty, the number of peace officers killed in the line of duty and the events which led to their deaths, and justifiable homicides is also included.

The major sections of the report are:

- Willful Homicide Crimes
- Arrests for Murder
- Dispositions of Adults Arrested for Murder

Most data presented were obtained from three different data bases maintained by the Bureau of Criminal Statistics (BCS): the Homicide File for data pertaining to both willful and justifiable homicide crimes; the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register for data pertaining to the characteristics of persons arrested for murder; and the Offender-Based Transaction Statistics file for information on types of dispositions, sentences, and death penalty cases. Because of the differences in the types of data collected and the methods used to collect these data, the reader is cautioned against comparing these different data bases.

Although willful homicides increased in number from 1987 to 1988, the rate per 100,000 population decreased 1.9 percent.

The number of drug-related and gang-related homicides has more than doubled since 1979.

Over seven out of ten homicide victims knew the offender (72.7 percent).

Female victims were ten times more likely than male victims to be the spouse of the offender (23.6 versus 2.3 percent).

More victims were killed by firearms than by all other types of weapons combined (61.4 percent).

The black homicide victim rate per 100,000 population (42.1) was higher than that of whites (not Hispanic) or Hispanics (5.6 and 14.5, respectively).

Since 1979, 71 peace officers have been killed in the line of duty. Nine were killed in 1988.

Of the persons arrested for murder for which dispositions were received in 1988, nearly three-fourths (72.6 percent) were convicted of murder or some other offense.

By the end of 1988, 223 persons were under sentence of death in California. Of these, 34 were sentenced in 1988.



#### WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES

The crime of willful homicide is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) as the "willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another." Attempted murder, justifiable homicide, manslaughter by negligence, and suicide are excluded. The data presented in this section of the report coincide with that definition, and were obtained almost exclusively from the Homicide File. Other data sources are identified in the footnotes of the appropriate charts and tables.

#### From 1987 to 1988:

- The willful homicide rate per 100,000 population decreased 1.9 percent (10.6 to 10.4).
- The number of willful homicides increased from 2,929 to 2,947.

#### From 1979 to 1988:

- The willful homicide rate per 100,000 population decreased 17.5 percent (12.6 to 10.4).
- The number of willful homicides increased from 2,941 to 2,947.

Of the four offenses classified as violent crimes by the FBI, willful homicide maintained the lowest rate per 100,000 population for the years shown. For comparison, changes in the rates of the violent crimes from 1979 to 1988 follow:

- Willful homicide down 17.5 percent.
- Forcible rape down 20.8 percent.
- Robbery down 6.4 percent.
- Aggravated assault up 42.4 percent.




Chart 1 VIOLENT CRIMES, 1979-1988 Rate per 100,000 Population



Sex of Victims


Analysis of the sex of willful homicide victims revealed that:

- In 1988, 76.6 percent were male and 23.4 percent were female.
- For each year, 1979-1988, the largest proportion of homicide victims was male. The proportions ranged from a low of 75.9 in 1987 to a high of 79.6 in 1979 and 1980.





# Chart 4 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1988 Known Race/Ethnic Group of Victims



Analysis of the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims revealed that:

- In 1988, 32.3 percent were white (not Hispanic), 31.3 percent were Hispanic, 31.3 percent were black, and 5.1 percent fell into the "all other" race/ethnic group category.
- From 1979 to 1988, the proportion of white (not Hispanic) homicide victims decreased. The proportions of Hispanics, blacks, and "all other" race/ethnic groups have tended to increase or remain fairly stable.

Known Race/Ethnic Group of Victims by Year





Known Age of Victims


Analysis of the age of willful homicide victims revealed that:

- In 1988, 16.5 percent were under 20 years, 36.7 percent were 20-29 years, 22.8 percent were 30-39 years, and 24.0 percent were 40 years of age or older.
- For each year, 1979-1988, the smallest proportion of homicide victims was under 20 years of age.
- For each year, 1979-1988, the largest proportion of homicide victims was 20-29 years of age.



When the sex of willful homicide victims in 1988 was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, more Hispanics and blacks were male than were whites (not Hispanic) (87.4 and 79.6 versus 65.2 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were female than were either Hispanics or blacks (34.8 versus 12.6 and 20.4 percent, respectively).

When the known age of willful homicide victims in 1988 was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) were under 20 years of age than were either Hispanics or blacks (12.8 versus 16.7 and 19.4 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were 40 years of age or older than were either Hispanics or blacks (37.9 versus 16.2 and 16.4 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more Hispanics and blacks were 20-29 years of age than were whites (not Hispanic) (45.8 and 39.8 versus 27.6 percent, respectively).

The willful homicide rate in 1988 was 10.4 per 100,000 population. Charts 10, 11, and 12 show willful homicide rates per 100,000 population for victims classified by sex, race/ethnic group, and age.

Throughout the period 1979 to 1988:

- Males were more than three times as likely as females to be homicide victims.
- Blacks were more than twice as likely as Hispanics and about six times as likely as whites (not Hispanic) to be homicide victims.
- Persons 20-29 years of age had the highest homicide rate. They were more than three times as likely to be homicide victims as persons under the age of twenty and more than twice as likely to be homicide victims as persons 40 years of age or older.

Rate per 100,000 Population by Sex of Victim







Known Relationship of Victim to Offender







When 1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by known relationship of the victim to the offender, it was found that:

- 56.0 percent of victims were friends or acquaintances of offenders.
- 27.3 percent of victims were strangers to offenders.
- 7.7 percent of victims were spouses of offenders.
- 5.4 percent of victims were parents or children of offenders.
- 3.7 percent of the relationships of victim to offender fell into the "other relative" category.

Known Relationship of Victim to Offender by Sex of Victim







When known relationship of the victim to the offender was compared with the sex of victims, it was found that:

- Male victims were more likely than female victims to be friends or acquaintances of offenders (59.6 versus 45.1 percent).
- Male victims were more likely than female victims to be strangers to offenders (31.4 versus 15.2 percent).
- Female victims were much more likely than male victims to be spouses of offenders (23.6 versus 2.3 percent).
- Female victims were more likely than male victims to be parents or children of offenders (10.6 versus 3.6 percent).

Known Relationship of Victim to Offender by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim





When known relationship of the victim to the offender was compared with the race/ethnic group of victims, it was found that:

- Black victims were more likely to be friends or acquaintances of offenders than white (not Hispanic) or Hispanic victims (61.2 versus 53.2 and 56.7 percent, respectively).
- White (not Hispanic) victims were much more likely to be spouses, parents, or children of offenders than either Hispanic or black victims (21.0 versus 7.4 and 8.4 percent, respectively).
- Hispanic and black victims were more likely to be strangers to offenders than white (not Hispanic) victims (32.3 and 27.6 versus 21.9 percent, respectively).

Average Homicide Rate per 100,000 Population by Size of County





# Chart 17 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1988 Known Month of Incident


When 1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by known month of incident, it was found that:

- The incident which ultimately led to death occurred more often in the last six months than in the first six months (53.6 versus 46.4 percent).
- With the exception of 1987, this relationship has been found to exist each year since 1974 (Homicide in California, 1983). This suggests a seasonal pattern in willful homicide crimes in which more persons are killed in the last six months than in the first six months of the year.

First Half of Year vs Second Half of Year



When 1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by known day of incident, it was found that:

Most willful homicides occurred on Saturday and Sunday (16.5 and 17.3 percent, respectively).

When the known day of incident was compared with the race/ethnic group of victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, more Hispanics than whites (not Hispanic) or blacks were killed on Saturday and Sunday (42.6 versus 29.3 and 29.0 percent, respectively).
- Whites (not Hispanic) and blacks were killed most often on Friday (16.7 and 16.1 percent, respectively), while Sunday was the peak day for Hispanics (23.8 percent).

When the known day of incident was compared with the sex of victims, it was found that:

For both males and females, over onefourth were killed on weekends (36.0 and 26.3 percent, respectively).


## Chart 21 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1988 Known Location of Homicide

When 1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by known location of incident, it was found that:

- 30.5 percent of victims were killed at their places of residence.
- 33.3 percent of homicides occurred on streets or sidewalks.


When the known location of incident was compared with the sex of victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, many more females than males were killed at their places of residence (55.4 versus 23.0 percent).
- Proportionately, many more males than females were killed on streets or sidewalks (39.2 versus 13.6 percent).





# Chart 23 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1988 Known Location of Homicide by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim



When the known location of incident was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were killed at their places of residence (46.1 versus 19.6 and 24.7 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were killed on streets or sidewalks (17.1 versus 40.6 and 44.7 percent, respectively).


When 1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by known type of weapon, it was found that:

- 61.4 percent resulted from the use of firearms.
  - 45.5 percent resulted from the use of handguns.
  - 15.9 percent resulted from the use of other and unknown types of firearms.

- 20.1 percent resulted from the use of knives.
- 6.5 percent resulted from the use of blunt objects (bludgeons, clubs, etc.).
- 6.3 percent resulted from the use of personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.).
- 2.7 percent resulted from the use of ropes.
- 3.1 percent resulted from the use of weapons grouped in the "all other" category.




# Chart 25 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1988 Known Type of Weapon by Sex of Victim

When the known type of weapon used was compared with the sex and/or race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Regardless of sex or race/ethnic group, the victim was most likely to have been killed by a firearm.
- The proportion of males killed by firearms was greater than that of females (65.8 versus 46.6 percent).
- The proportion of females killed by personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.) was greater than that of males (11.2 versus 4.8 percent).


- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were killed by personal weapons than were Hispanics or blacks (9.2 versus 4.4 and 5.8 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) were killed by knives than were Hispanics or blacks (24.3 versus 21.1 and 15.5 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more Hispanics and blacks were killed by firearms than were whites (not Hispanic) (64.4 and 71.3 versus 49.1 percent, respectively).

When 1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by known contributing circumstance, it was found that:

- 47.4 percent were associated with arguments.
- 16.4 percent were associated with rape, robbery, or burglary.
- 12.2 percent were gang-related.
- 10.7 percent were drug-related.
- 13.3 percent were associated with "all other" contributing circumstances.



When 1979-1988 willful homicide crimes were examined by selected contributing circumstances, it was found that:

- The proportion of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gang-related increased from 6.9 percent in 1979 to 12.2 percent in 1988.
- The proportion of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was drugrelated increased from 5.1 percent in 1979 to 10.7 percent in 1988.





When the known contributing circumstance was compared with the sex of willful homicide victims in 1988, it was found that:

Males were much more likely than females to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gang-related or drug-related (14.8 and 12.2 versus 3.3 and 5.3 percent, respectively).

Known Contributing Circumstance by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim





When the known contributing circumstance was compared with the race/ethnic group of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- For each race/ethnic group shown, the circumstance which most often contributed to homicides was an argument.
- Whites (not Hispanic) were more likely than either Hispanics or blacks to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was rape, robbery, or burglary (21.0 versus 14.2 and 12.5 percent, respectively).
- Whites (not Hispanic) were less likely than either Hispanics or blacks to have been victims of gang-related homicides (1.1 versus 16.6 and 19.8 percent, respectively).
- Blacks were much more likely than either whites (not Hispanic) or Hispanics to have been victims of drug-related homicides (18.8 versus 6.2 and 8.3 percent, respectively).

When the known contributing circumstance was compared with the known age of willful homicide victims, it was found that:

- Of the 136 victims 0-14 years old, 47.8 percent of the homicides were the result of child abuse. This finding was even more pronounced for 0-4 year olds in which 65.9 percent of deaths resulted from child abuse (Table 43).
- Of the 307 victims 15-19 years old, 41.7 percent of the homicides resulted from gang-related circumstances.
- Of the 1,866 victims 20-59 years old, 54.6 percent of the homicides resulted from arguments.
- Of the 212 victims 60 years of age and older, the contributing circumstance was rape, robbery, or burglary in 42.9 percent of the homicides (.9, 35.4, and 6.6 percent, respectively).



#### ARRESTS FOR MURDER

Murder is defined as the unlawful killing, with malice aforethought, of a human being. Information about arrests for murder was obtained from the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register (MACR) which contains information on all arrests made in 1988, as reported to BCS by California law enforcement agencies. This section of the report describes the personal characteristics (sex, race/ethnic group, and age) of persons arrested for murder in 1988.



Analysis of the personal characteristics of 2,925 arrestees for murder in 1988 revealed that:

- 10.2 percent were female.
- 89.8 percent were male.

#### And,

- 26.4 percent were white (not Hispanic).
- 30.1 percent were Hispanic.
- 37.8 percent were black.
- 5.7 percent were of "all other" race/ethnic groups.



And.

- 12.6 percent were juvenile.
- 87.4 percent were adult.

And,

- 25.7 percent were under 20 years of age.
- 41.1 percent were 20-29 years of age.
- 20.0 percent were 30-39 years of age.
- 13.2 percent were 40 years of age or older.

When the sex of arrestees for murder in 1988 was compared with the race/ethnic group of arrestees for murder, it was found that:

■ The ratio of male to female was much greater for Hispanics than for either whites (not Hispanic) or blacks (17 to 1 versus 5 to 1 and 9 to 1, respectively).

When the age of arrestees for murder was compared with the race/ethnic group of arrestees for murder, it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer whites (not Hispanic) were under 20 years of age than were Hispanics or blacks (9.6 versus 31.1 and 31.9 percent, respectively).
- However, proportionately more whites (not Hispanic) were 30-39 years of age than were Hispanics or blacks (27.3 versus 17.4 and 17.2 percent, respectively).



Proportionately more whites (not Hispanic) were 40 years of age or older than were Hispanics or blacks (24.8 versus 7.8 and 9.8 percent, respectively).

When data pertaining to juvenile and adult arrestees for murder were compared with the race/ethnic group of arrestees for murder, it was found that:


- The proportion of white (not Hispanic) juveniles was less than the proportion of white (not Hispanic) adults (7.0 versus 29.2 percent).
- However, the proportion of Hispanics and blacks was greater for juveniles than for adults (39.8 and 48.8 versus 28.6 and 36.2 percent, respectively).


# Chart 34 ARRESTS FOR MURDER, 1988 Age of Arrestee by Race/Ethnic Group

#### DISPOSITIONS OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER


This section of the report describes dispositions made during 1988 of adults arrested for murder, regardless of the year of arrest. Data were obtained from the Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system. OBTS system data are compiled from information collected on the arrest fingerprint card (FD 249) and the "Disposition of Arrest and Court Action" form (JUS 8715). Despite underreporting of JUS 8715 forms, it is believed that these dispositions are generally descriptive of those adult felony arrestees processed through the criminal justice system. Disposition data presented are based on arrests for murder only.

In 1988 there were 34 persons sentenced to death. All 34 were arrested for murder (in 1988 or prior years), subsequently convicted, and sentenced to death in 1988. In this section these death sentences are included in the "prison" category when type of sentence is compared with convicted offense. Additional information about persons who received the death penalty in 1988 is presented in the Death Penalty Cases Section on page 41.

#### OBTS data were analyzed by:

- Comparing the type of disposition (release, dismissal or acquittal, and conviction) with personal characteristics of the arrestee.
- Comparing convicted offense (murder and other offenses such as manslaughter, assault, and robbery) with personal characteristics of the convicted arrestee.
- Comparing the type of sentence received with the convicted offense of the arrestee.

Examination of 1988 dispositions of adults arrested for murder revealed that:


- 15.1 percent were released at the law enforcement level or had a complaint denied at the prosecutor level.
- 12.3 percent were either dismissed or acquitted by the courts.
- 72.6 percent were convicted of murder or some other offense.

Type of Disposition by Sex, Race/Ethnic Group, and Age of Arrestee





When 1988 dispositions of adults arrested for murder were examined by sex, race/ethnic group, and age, it was found that:

- Females were more likely to be released, dismissed, or acquitted than males (25.2 and 18.1 versus 14.2 and 11.6 percent, respectively).
- Males were more likely to be convicted by the courts than females (74.2 versus 56.7 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were convicted (78.9 versus 69.7 and 70.1 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, arrestees under 20 years of age were more likely to be released than other age groups shown (28.6 versus 13.1, 14.9, and 12.6 percent, respectively).
- Arrestees 20-29 years of age were more likely to be convicted by the courts than other age groups shown (76.2 versus 59.1, 71.3, and 73.0 percent, respectively).


Of those adults arrested for murder who were convicted in 1988, it was found that:

- 56.9 percent were convicted of lesser crimes, such as manslaughter, assault, or robbery.


### Chart 39 DISPOSITIONS IN 1988 OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER AND CONVICTED

Convicted Offense by Sex, Race/Ethnic Group, and Age of Arrestee





When dispositions in 1988 of adults arrested for murder and convicted were examined by sex, race/ethnic group, and age, it was found that:

- More males than females were convicted of murder (43.5 versus 37.5 percent).
- Proportionately, fewer blacks were convicted of murder than either whites (not Hispanic) or Hispanics (38.4 versus 49.9 and 40.8 percent, respectively).
- More persons in the 20-29 age group were convicted of murder (45.3 percent) than in any other age group.

When dispositions in 1988 of adults arrested for murder and convicted were examined by type of sentence, it was found that:

Proportionately, more of those convicted of murder were sentenced to prison or to the Youth Authority than were those convicted of lesser offenses (99.1 versus 79.5 percent).1

#### **DEATH SENTENCES**

This section presents information on those persons sentenced to death in California superior courts in 1988. Death penalty cases were extracted from the 1988 Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system.

The death penalty in California was ruled unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court in February 1972. This was followed by a public vote and the reinstatement of the death penalty in January 1974. The resultant statute was subsequently declared unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court in December 1976. By virtue of a veto override in August 1977, new legislation was adopted that reinstated the death penalty in California.

By public vote on November 7, 1978, additional criteria were added to the special circumstances under which a person could be sentenced to death. A summary of the criteria specified by Penal Code Section 190.2 follows:

- Intentional murder for financial gain.
- Previously convicted of murder in the first or second degree.
- Multiple convictions for first or second degree murder.
- Murder perpetrated by means of destructive device, bomb, or explosive.
- Murder to prevent arrest or to effect escape from custody.
- Murder of a peace officer or fireman engaged in the performance of his/her duties.
- Murder of a witness to prevent testimony or in retaliation for testimony given.
- Murder of an elected or appointed official, judge, or prosecutor in retaliation for performance of his/her official duties.
- Murder by ambush.
- Murder because of the victim's race, color, religion, nationality, or country of origin.
- Murder involving torture.
- Murder by poison.
- Murder during the commission of: a) robbery, b) kidnapping, c) rape, d) lewd or lascivious act upon a child under the age of 14, e) sodomy or oral copulation in violation of Penal Code Sections 286 and 288a, f) burglary, g) arson, and h) train wrecking.

In 1972, and again in 1976, the California Supreme Court ruled the death penalty statute unconstitutional. This resulted in a large decrease in the number of persons on death row. Existing death penalty cases were returned to court for resentencing to the next most severe punishment.

With the reinstatement of the death penalty in August 1977, the number of persons under sentence of death began to grow. By the end of 1988, 223 persons were under sentence of death in California.


### ||||||||||DEATH PENALTY CASES

During 1988, 34 persons were convicted of first degree murder and sentenced to death. These were initial death sentences only and do not include persons who were resentenced to death after their death sentences were reversed on appeal. The sex, race/ethnic group, age, and sentencing county of those sentenced to death are presented in Table 2.

Of the 34 defendants newly sentenced to death in 1988:

- M All were male.
- 18 were white (not Hispanic).
- 4 were Hispanic.
- 11 were black.
- 1 fell into the "all other" race/ethnic group category.
- The mean (average) age was 33.
- Los Angeles County sentenced the largest number (9).

Information about peace officers killed in the line of duty was obtained from the Homicide File. Only sworn officers are included. Non-sworn officers, such as security guards, are excluded.

Examination of the data in Table 3 revealed that:

- From 1979-1988, 71 peace officers were killed in the line of duty.
- On the average, 7 peace officers were killed annually. In 1988, the number was 9.
- The number of peace officers killed in the past five years (1984-1988) was 31.0 percent less than that of the previous five years (29 versus 42).

### Examination of the data in Tables 4 and 5 revealed that:

- In 1988, all 9 peace officers killed in the line of duty were male; 6 were white (not Hispanic), 2 were Hispanic, and 1 fell into the "all other" category.
- In 1988, 9 peace officers were killed by firearms 8 by handguns, and 1 by a firearm of unknown type.

#### JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES

A justifiable homicide is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program as the killing of a felon by a private citizen or a peace officer during the commission of a felony. Justifiable homicides are sometimes referred to as excusable or noncriminal homicides. The California Penal Code defines killing in self-defense as justifiable homicide, whereas the national UCR Program does not. Therefore, self-defense cases are treated as willful rather than justifiable homicides and are excluded from these data.


When justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and private citizens in 1988 were examined by sex, race/ethnic group, and known age, it was found that:

- Most felons killed by peace officers and private citizens were male (99.0 and 98.7 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more felons killed by peace officers were white (not Hispanic) than were felons killed by private citizens (32.7 versus 25.0 percent).
- Proportionately, fewer felons killed by peace officers were black than were felons killed by private citizens (25.7 versus 44.7 percent).
- Most felons killed by peace officers and private citizens were 20-29 years of age (37.4 and 41.1 percent, respectively).







Known Location of Homicide



When justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and private citizens in 1988 were examined by known location, it was found that:

- Felons were most frequently killed by peace officers on a street or sidewalk (55.4 percent).
- Felons were most frequently killed by private citizens in the citizen's residence (47.4 percent).

When justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and private citizens in 1988 were examined by contributing circumstance, it was found that:

- For peace officers, the circumstances most frequently contributing to justifiable homicides were those of a felon being killed when attacking the peace officer (56.1 percent) and a felon being killed in the commission of a crime (22.4 percent).
- For private citizens, the circumstances most frequently contributing to justifiable homicides were those of a felon being killed in the commission of a crime (63.2 percent) and a felon being killed when attacking the private citizen (35.5 percent).
