VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS: ESCAPE TRENDS

Project Scope

The Research & Evaluation Unit routinely compiles monthly and annual statistics on inmates who escape. This report is a summary of those data, provided as management information to the Planning and Evaluation Director.

Although escapes from Virginia prisons are at an all-time low, the continued reduction of escape opportunities remains a priority initiative for the Department of Corrections.

Background

This is a statistical summary of inmate escapes in the Virginia correctional system for the sixteen years since the Department became a separate state agency. Data reported are for fiscal years 1974 through 1989.

The report compares on an annual basis:

- o Number of inmate escapes;
- o Annual escape rate (number per 1,000 inmates);
- o Type of escape (facility, non-facility, etc.);
- o Inmate's institutional location at time of escape.

Over the last sixteen years the level of detail varies, with only aggregated data on escapes available for the early years. Beginning in FY79, greater detail is available, with specific monthly figures collected from FY83 to the present.

This annual report contains two special features: (a) a graph (Figure 1) showing the FY74-89 escape rate trend, and (b) the returns to custody of escapees at large in the beginning of FY89, and returns from escapes during FY89 and earlier (p.4).

Findings

The data exhibited in Figure 1 and in tables for the 16-year period show a precipitous 96% drop in escapes, from 513 in FY74 to 18 in FY89. The annual escape rate (number of escapes per 1,000 inmate population) for FY74 was 87.2, decreasing to a record 1.3 in FY89.

According to the latest national survey* of escapes from 50 states and the Federal system, Virginia's escape rate is only a fraction of the national figure, 17.5 per 1,000 prisoners. The Virginia

figure published in that survey, 3.0, was for 1988; this year's statistic is even further improvement.

During this 16-year period, escapes from secure facilities have been reduced from an average of 139 per year during FY74-76 to an average of seven (7) per year in FY87-89, a substantial 95% drop.

Non-facility escapes* include two categories: Under Gun and Trusty Walkaway. Under Gun escapes have diminished during the recent fiscal years 1987-89, with 9, 7, and 2 escapes, as compared to 24, 15, and 11 escapes in the previous three-year period, fiscal years 1984-86. Similarly, Trusty Walkaway escapes dropped from an average of 28 for the period FY84-86 to 17 for the fiscal years 1987-89.

Overall, from FY74 to FY89 there is a clearly noticeable trend toward fewer, but varying, numbers of secure facility escapes. Averaging about seven (7) in each of the last five years, these constituted 19.7% of the total escapes for FY85-89. This may be compared to an average of 43 each year for the previous five-year period (FY80-84), when secure facility escapes were twice as high, or 41% of the total for those years.

With respect to non-facility escapes, their average for FY85-89 was 29, or 80.3% of total escapes for these years. Figures for the previous five years, FY80-84, are an average of 62 per year, when non-facility escapes were 59% of all escapes for those years.

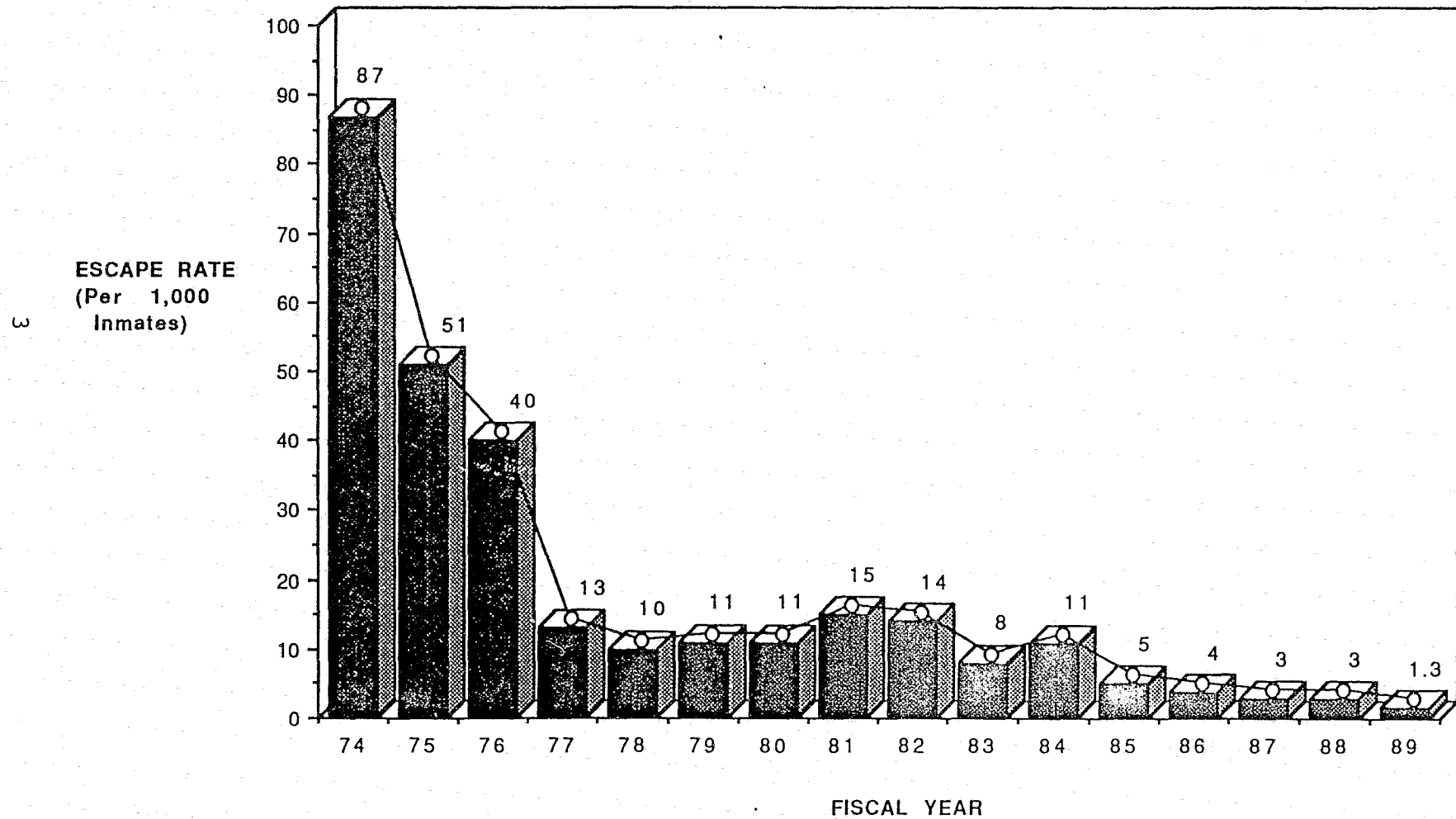
The data on page 4 show that on July 1, 1988, there were 93 escapees at large. With the additional 18 escapes in FY89 and 29 recaptures, on June 30, 1989, there remained 82 escapees at large.

Conclusions

As evidence of its commitment to public safety, the Virginia Department of Corrections is distinguished by a sixteen-year trend toward reduced numbers of escapes, a significantly diminished escape rate, and equally compelling, a 96% decline in secure facility escapes.

* The following operational changes during fiscal 1989 may have affected the escape figures for that year compared to FY88: (1) in September, 1988, assignment of highway trustys was terminated indefinitely, violent offenders were made ineligible for furloughs, gun gangs were suspended pending DOC training of VDOT foremen and restructuring of security, and state work release placements were curtailed; (2) in November, 1988, all furloughs were terminated, with a gradual resumption later in the year of extended furloughs for non-violent offenders only; and (3) in March, 1989, gun gangs were resumed with supervision by a VDOT foreman and two correctional officers.
