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Population Movements in the Massachusetts Department of Correction, 1988

Abstract

This report summarizes the movement of offenders in the custody of the DOC during 1988. While the focus of the analysis is on calendar year 1988, trends in population movement over the period 1983 to 1988 are also discussed, particularly in relation to population growth during the period.

Some of the highlights of the information presented in this report include:

- There were 17,733 admissions and 17,309 releases of all types to DOC facilities during 1988.
- The continued pattern of admissions surpassing releases led to population growth in the agency.
- In 1988 admissions to the DOC included commitments/from and afters (N=2,975), parole/probation violators (N=1,229), and county transfers (N=590).
- In 1988 releases from the DOC included paroles to street (N=1,863), discharges to street (N=1,297), transfers to county facilities (N=644) and expirations of sentence to street (N=315).

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Introduction

The population movement report is one of the annual statistical reports prepared by the Research Division of the Massachusetts Department of Correction. Each correctional facility of the Department of Correction submits weekly admission and release reports describing each offender's move into or out of that facility. This annual movement report is a compilation of these admissions and releases during 1988. It presents information by type of admission and release including new court commitments, paroles, returns on parole violation, discharges, escapes, deaths, transfers to other correctional facilities both within the state and outside of the state, and trips to hospitals and courts. The report presents information on some of the recent changes in the patterns of admissions and releases in the Department as well as a detailed description of inmate movement occurring in 1988.

Offenders can be received into the Department in a number of ways. Offenders can be committed by the courts to Cedar Junction, Concord or Framingham. Offenders can also arrive from another institution to begin serving a new sentence, having finished one sentence and starting another sentence. These are "from and after", "B", and "forthwith" sentences. Generally, an offender would be paroled or discharged from the initial sentence and then committed on a new sentence.

Offenders can be admitted in ways that are not directly related to beginning a sentence. Offenders who have violated some condition of their parole can be returned as parole violators to continue serving the sentence on which they were released. Offenders can also be returned from outside releases of short duration such as trips to courts or hospitals, or be returned from escape. Additionally, offenders can be transferred from other correctional authorities including houses of correction, federal prison authorities, or prison authorities of other states.

Likewise, offenders can be released from the DOC in a variety of ways. Offenders can be released by the authority of the Parole Board, by receiving a good conduct discharge, by serving the maximum term of their sentence, or by obtaining a court-revised sentence. Such parolees and releasees can be sent to the community, to another prison authority, or to another sentence. Offenders also can be released on a short term basis to hospitals or courts. Moreover, the death of an offender or an escape from confinement is classified as a release.

The most common type of movement is a transfer from one facility within the Department to another. Because the Department maintains facilities of different security levels, an offender is initially placed in one of three commitment institutions (Cedar Junction, Concord or Framingham), or is transferred from a county facility to the Longwood Treatment Center, and then moved to lower security facilities in the process of serving his/her sentence. Such interinstitutional transfers are generally from a higher security setting to a lower security setting, but occasionally transfers are made from lower to higher security. Each time a movement of this type occurs, the institution of destination records an admission and the institution of origin records a release.

When considering numbers of admissions and releases, this report does more than tabulate the number of offenders admitted from the courts and released by parole or the termination of their sentence. This report includes information on all types of admissions to and releases from each of the institutions in the Department and, as such, is a valuable statistical description of the flow of offenders through the Massachusetts Department of Correction during a given year.

Methodology

In this section, some of the technical aspects of the preparation of this report are discussed, including the sample, institutions, and table interpretation.

Sample. This report includes the movement of criminally sentenced individuals in the custody of the Department of Correction. Excluded from the analysis are the moves of individuals who were civilly committed or on a detention status when admitted to or released from the Department. Thus, the movements of women admitted to the Awaiting Trial Unit at Framingham, men admitted from the Charles Street Jail, and individuals admitted on 15-day Parole Board detainers are not included in this report.

Generally the admissions and releases included in this report are associated with the physical movement of inmates from one institution to another or from the community to a correctional facility. In some cases, however, the admissions and releases represent "paper" transactions. For example, an inmate may be discharged from one facility to a "from & after" sentence at a second facility, committed on the "from & after" sentence, and transferred back to the first institution without any accompanying physical movement. Such paper transactions appear as admissions and releases in this report.

The report includes the movement of offenders to and from courts and community hospitals when such moves result in the inmate being out of the custody

of a DOC facility for at least one night. The movement of inmates for court appearances or to receive medical services not requiring over-night change of custody are not included in this report. Similarly, the movement of inmates to temporary release programs in the community such as furloughs, work-release or education release are not included in the statistics on population movement.

Institutions. The admissions and releases included in this report represent the movement of population into and out of the custody of DOC facilities, including Longwood Treatment Center and contract facilities. The report excludes any population movements at Bridgewater State Hospital, Treatment Center and Addiction Center, except as reported by other DOC facilities.

The movement of an inmate in any other non-DOC correctional facility is not included in this report, even if that inmate was originally sentenced to the Department. Thus, if an inmate were transferred to a county facility and subsequently paroled, the transfer from the DOC to the county facility is included as a release from a DOC facility but the subsequent parole from the county facility is not included. Conversely, the movement of inmates not originally sentenced to the DOC but who are admitted to or released from a DOC facility are included in this report.

The intra-institutional movement of inmates is not included in this report with the exception of Hodder Cottage at Framingham. Women transferred from Framingham to Hodder Cottage are included as inter-institutional transfers in this report. Massachusetts Halfway Houses, Incorporated (MHHI) includes four separate facilities. Transfers from one MHHI facility to another are presented as inter-institutional transfers.

Lemuel Shattuck is a secure medical facility that serves many correctional facilities, including county facilities. Sentenced county inmates transferred to

Lemuel Shattuck are not included in this report, unless they were already serving their sentence in a DOC facility such as the Longwood Treatment Center. Consistent with other institutions, pre-sentenced or civilly committed individuals are also not included in the reports of population movement.

Table Interpretation. In reading the tables in this report, the reader should note that: (I) the top number in each cell in the body of a table represents the number of moves which are characterized by the corresponding row and column categories of that table; and (2) the bottom number in parentheses in each cell represents the percentage of total moves in that column (column percent) corresponding to the row category. The percentages sum down the column to total 100 percent. For example, Table 3 indicates that court commitments comprise 1,332 admissions or 57 percent of the total admissions to Cedar Junction during 1988. All tables in the text should be read as reporting the admissions, releases, transfers and returns to or from the institutions identified across the top of the tables. Reading the numbers and percentages in this way is consistent with the document's discussion of the movement information.

Population Movements 1983 to 1988: Trends and Population Growth

The period 1983 to 1988 was one of large increases in the correctional population, from 4,334 at the beginning of 1983 to 6,763 at the beginning of 1989. This represents an increase of 2,429 inmates or 56 percent over this period. As shown in Table 1, in each year during this period the number of admissions to the Department was greater than the number of releases, resulting in continued population increases.

As shown in Table 1, there are three categories of admissions that increased substantially over the period: court commitments, parole/probation violators, and county inmates transferring to the DOC. New court commitments and from and afters increased from 2,035 in 1983 to 2,975 in 1988, an increase of 46 percent (N=940) over the period. Parole/probation violators increased from 404 in 1983 to 1,229 in 1988, an increase of 204 percent (N=825) over the period. The number of county inmates transferring to DOC facilities was relatively low in 1983 (N=15), and increased substantially during the next four years to a level of 590 in 1988. In 1984 most of these cases were men transferred to Concord to serve their county sentences at a DOC facility. Since 1985, many of these cases represent county inmates transferring to Longwood Treatment Center to receive specialized alcohol treatment services. While the number of inmates transferring to other DOC facilities increased, these admissions do not impact the growth of population; rather they reflect increases in the number of offenders served by the Department annually.

Several types of releases increased over the period: paroles, discharges, and transfers to houses of correction. The increase in paroles and discharges is related to similar growth in admissions to the Department. Paroles to the street increased from 1,406 in 1983 to 1,863 in 1988, an increase of 32 percent (N=457). Discharges to the street increased from 352 in 1983 to 1,297 in 1988, an increase of 268 percent (N=945). Transfers to houses of correction increased from 84 in 1983 to 644 in 1988, following a similar pattern as admissions from those facilities.

Population Movements in 1988: A Statistical Decription

This section presents a more detailed analysis of the 35,042 admissions and releases that occurred during 1988. These admissions and releases involved 9,279 individuals. In some cases movement patterns are discussed in terms of the number of individual offenders involved in the particular movement pattern as well as the total number of admissions and releases. More complete information can be found by consulting the statistical tables that follow this section.

Admissions. There were a total of 17,733 admissions of all types into DOC institutions during 1988. Table 2 shows admission categories and the number of individuals associated with each category.

There were 2,975 admissions of inmates beginning new sentences, including 2,908 new court commitments and 67 from & after sentences. Additionally, in 2 cases inmates were released from an A sentence to a B sentence.

There were 1,229 cases where inmates were re-admitted on a sentence as a result of violating their parole or probation. There were 1,209 admissions on parole violations and 20 admissions on probation violations during 1988.

There were 590 admissions of county inmates into DOC facilities, 42 admissions of out-of-state inmates into DOC facilities, and 53 admissions from federal facilities during the year. There were 205 admissions of DOC inmates returning from county facilities, and 91 admissions of DOC inmates returning from out-of-state facilities.

A number of admissions resulted from temporary releases from custody including returns from court (N=60), returns from community hospitals (N=147), and returns from escape (N=168).

Releases. There were 17,309 releases of all types from DOC facilities during 1988.

There were 1,957 paroles of all types during 1988 including 1,863 paroles to the street, 17 paroles to the custody of another state, 11 paroles to federal authorities, 18 paroles to immigration authorities, 20 paroles to from and after sentences at county facilities in Massachusetts, 9 paroles to outstanding warrants, and 19 paroles to from and after sentences in DOC facilities.

There were 1,486 discharges of all types during 1988 including 1,297 discharges to the street, 7 discharges to the custody of another state, 22 discharges to a federal authority, 17 discharges to immigration authorities, 2 discharges from an A sentence to a B sentence, 48 discharges to a from and after sentence at a county facility, 45 discharges to an outstanding warrant, and 48 discharges to a from and after sentence at a DOC facility.

There were 315 releases due to expiration of sentence during 1988. Expiration of sentence differs only slightly from a discharge in that good conduct days are not deducted from the sentence length in determining the length of incarceration. The 315 expirations of sentence included 303 expirations to the community and 12 expirations to from and after sentences in the DOC or other correctional facilities.

There were 81 court ordered releases of inmates due to sentences being revoked or vacated, or inmates released to await a new trial. There were also 9 releases by federal authority. There were 126 cases of releases by court of a more temporary nature including 55 releases due to the offender being remanded to court for an appearance, 68 cases where the offender was removed to the court and received a change in sentence, often to a forthwith sentence, and 3 cases in which the offender was removed to the custody of a sheriff or the U.S. Marshall.

There were 782 transfers to other correctional authorities. This includes 644

transfers to county facilities in Massachusetts, 127 transfers to correctional facilities in other states (including 97 DOC inmates and 30 non-DOC inmates), 19 transfers to federal correctional authorities, and 1 transfer to another correctional authority.

There were 22 releases due to the death of an inmate during 1988. There were 21 deaths due to natural causes and one suicide, during the year. There were 161 escapes from DOC facilities and 169 releases to community hospitals during 1988.

Court Commitments. There were 2,908 new court commitments during 1988, and 67 admissions due to an individual beginning a from and after sentence, for a total of 2,975 court commitments during the year. Table 5 shows the court of commitment for the 2,908 new court commitments that occurred during 1988.

Inter-Institutional Transfers. Tables 6 through 9 display information on inter-institutional transfers. Tables 6 and 7 display each move by the origination/destination facility and the specific institution to or from which the inmate transferred. Tables 8 and 9 display each inter-institutional transfer by the security level of the origination/destination facility and the specific facility to or from which the inmate transferred.

Transfers From. Tables 6 and 8 show inter-institutional transfers by the institution from which the inmate was released. Concord, which acts as the departmental reception and diagnostic center, had the largest number of releases to other DOC facilities and accounted for 33 percent of all such moves (N=4,047). Other DOC facilities that transferred large numbers of inmates to other facilities include Cedar Junction (N=2,102), Norfolk (N=1,190), SECC (N=731), NCCI (N=690),

OCCC (N=669) and Shirley (N=514).

Seventeen percent of all inter-institutional transfers were from the maximum security facility, Cedar Junction. Of these, 92 percent were transferred to medium security facilities and 7 percent were transferred to secure hospitals. There were nine transfers from Cedar Junction to a lower security facility.

Sixty-three percent of all inter-institutional transfers were from medium security facilities. Nine percent of these were to higher security (Cedar Junction), 54 percent were lateral transfers to other medium security facilities, 31 percent were transfers to lower security facilities, and 6 percent were transfers to secure hospitals.

Fifteen percent of all inter-institutional transfers were from lower security facilities. There were two transfers from a lower security facility to a maximum security facility, 51 percent of these transfers were to medium security facilities, 43 percent were transfers to other lower security facilities, and 6 percent were transfers to secure hospitals.

Four percent of all transfers were from the secure hospital, Lemuel Shattuck. Eleven percent of the transfers from Lemuel Shattuck were to maximum security, 69 percent were to medium security, 19 percent were from lower security facilities and one percent were to other secure hospitals.

Transfers To. Tables 7 and 9 show inter-institutional transfers by the institution to which the inmate was admitted. Concord had the highest number of admissions from other DOC facilities (N=2,292) and accounted for 19 percent of all such admissions. Other facilities with large numbers of admissions from other DOC facilities include Norfolk (N=1,589), OCCC (N=1,228), NCCI (N=1,089), SECC (N=1,148), Cedar Junction (N=854), Shirley (N=827).

Seven percent of all inter-institutional transfers were to the maximum

security facility, Cedar Junction. Of these transfers, 86 percent were from medium security facilities, 14 percent were from secure hospitals, and two admissions (less than one percent) were from lower security facilities.

Sixty-two percent of all inter-institutional transfers were to medium security facilities. Of these transfers, 26 percent were from maximum security, 55 percent were lateral transfers from other medium security facilities, 13 percent were returns from lower security facilities, and 6 percent were transfers from secure hospitals.

Twenty-seven percent of all inter-institutional transfers were to lower security facilities. Of these transfers, nine (less than one percent) were from maximum security, 72 percent were from medium security facilities, 25 percent were from other lower security facilities, and 3 percent were from secure hospitals.

Four percent of all inter-institutional transfers were to Lemuel Shattuck hospital. Of these transfers, 11 percent were from maximum security, 67 percent were from medium security, 20 percent were from lower security facilities, and two percent were from other secure hospitals.

Hospital Transfers. Offenders needing hospital care can be treated at various community hospitals or Lemuel Shattuck Hospital, a hospital at which the Department of Correction maintains a secure ward for offenders in custody. During 1988 there were 526 transfers to Lemuel Shattuck Hospital from Department of Correction facilities and 511 transfers from Lemuel Shattuck to state correctional institutions (including transfers to Bridgewater State Hospital). See Tables 6 and 7.

There were 169 releases to and 147 returns from community hospitals (Tables 10 and 11) during 1988. Framingham Union had the greatest number of admissions

and releases, followed by New England Medical Center, Emerson, Brigham & Women's, Boston City, Mass Eye & Ear, Beth Israel, and Massachusetts General. Together, these hospitals account for over two-thirds of the admissions and releases to community hospitals. Framingham had the largest number of moves to and admissions from community hospitals.

Transfers to Houses of Correction. Four types of movements between county houses of correction and state facilities are presented in Tables 12 through 15 of this report.

The first type of move involves a state or county inmate transferred from a DOC facility to a county house of correction to serve or finish a sentence. There were 644 such transfers in 1988. The Hampshire County House of Correction at Northampton (N=167) and Middlesex County facility at Billerica (N=166) received the largest number of transfers. Concord (N=157) and NCCI (N=142) transferred the most inmates during 1988.

The second type of move is the return of a Department of Correction inmate from a county facility. There were 205 such returns in 1988. Thirty-five percent of the returns were to Concord. The largest number of returns were from Northampton (N=75).

The third type of move is the transfer of a county inmate to a Department of Correction facility. There were 590 such transfers in 1988. Thirty-eight percent of these admissions came from the Billerica House of Correction, 14 percent from Lawrence and 13 percent from Salem (see Table 14). All of the admissions were to the Longwood Treatment Center (65 percent) or Concord (35 percent). The Longwood Treatment Center is a specialized facility for the treatment of individuals committed for Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol (O.U.I.) and receives individuals originally committed to county facilities for O.U.I.

The fourth type of move is the release of a Department of Correction inmate to a county facility on a "from and after" sentence. There were 68 such releases in 1988. Thirty-eight percent of these releases were from Norfolk.

Movements to Other States. Table 16 shows that there were 127 transfers from Department of Correction facilities to prisons in other states. This included 97 Department of Correction inmates and 30 inmates under the jurisdiction of other correctional authorities. Of the total number of offenders transferred, 20 percent were released from Norfolk, 18 percent from Cedar Junction, 16 percent from Concord and 16 percent from NCCI. Seventy-nine percent of the offenders were transferred to prisons in other New England states, including 39 percent to New Hampshire. There were 133 admissions from prisons in other states during 1988 (Table 17). Inmates admitted from out-of-state prisons included the return of 91 Department of Correction offenders and transfer of 42 offenders under the jurisdiction of other correctional authorities. Eighty-one percent of the offenders were sent from prisons in other New England states, including 43 percent from New Hampshire, and admitted most often to Concord (25 percent), Cedar Junction (20 percent), Norfolk (17 percent) or NCCI (17 percent).

Admission

B sentence

Sentence received for an offense committed on parole. An individual is committed on a B sentence after being discharged or re-paroled from the original A sentence.

Court Commitment

Includes individuals entering DOC directly from courts, on forthwith sentences, and on sentences to be served from and after a county sentence.

Probation Violator

Re-admission of an individual previously released on a "split" sentence. Court orders balance of sentence to go forward.

Institutions

Bridgewater

Includes the Bridgewater State Hospital, the Sexually Dangerous Treatment Center, and the Addiction Center.

Cedar Junction

Formerly known as Walpole.

Drug Rehab

Drug rehabilitation programs are specialized prerelease facilities for offenders with drug problems. Includes Meridian House and Spectrum House.

Hodder House

A minimum/pre-release facility for female offenders at Framingham.

МННІ

Massachusetts Halfway Houses, Incorporated is a private non-profit organization that provides facilities to the DOC on a contract basis which, includes the following facilities: Brooke House, Coolidge II, McGrath House, and the Temporary Housing Project.

NCC

Northeastern Correctional Center at Concord.

NCCI

North Central Correctional Institute at Gardner

occc

Old Colony Correctional Center at Bridgewater

SECC

Southeastern Correctional Center at Bridgewater. SECC has medium security and minimum security beds, but is considered a medium security facility for purposes of this report.

WSATP

Women's Substance Abuse Treatment Program. Includes Faith House and Griffin House.

Releases

Parole/Discharge to other authority

Includes paroles to county facilities, out of state facilities.

Parole/Discharge to Sentence

Includes paroles to B sentences, from & after sentence at DOC or non-DOC facilities.

Release to Warrant

Includes paroles and discharges to outstanding warrants, such as parole violation warrants.

Release by Court

Includes sentences that are vacated.
