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## OFFENDER EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAMS

### **CORRECTIONS CLEARINGHOUSE**

Corrections Clearinghouse specializes in the development of employability opportunities for transitioning juvenile and adult offenders. It functions as a vital link between the employment and training system and the criminal justice system. Projects operated by the Clearinghouse have focused on pre-release/work orientation activities in correctional institutions, career awareness planning and job placement activities in the community, and statewide coordination of offender programs and resources.

Below is a overview of the programs offered in the community specifically for ex-offenders:

### Career Awareness Program

Career Awareness Program (CAP) offers reintegrating offenders the opportunity to become gainfully employed. Program participants are seen as partners in a process enabling them to secure and maintain employment. The program provides opportunities for direct job placement, employment counseling/troubleshooting, employment upgrades and supportive services to help facilitate the offenders successful transition. (See CAP Directory on the next page)

### **Ex-Offender Work Orientation Program**

Ex-Offender Work Orientation Program assists offenders who are essentially "job-ready"; that is, they have some job skills and experience to enable them to re-enter the labor market. Services are provided through contracts awarded to community-based agencies. Referrals to the contractors come from Community Corrections Officers, institution staff, work release facilities, Corrections Clearinghouse offices, Job Service Centers and through self-referral by the offender. Contractors are required to give priority to offenders in work release facilities and to those who have recently been released from institutions. Services include individual assessment, counseling, job development, supportive services, and follow-up/upgrade activities after job placement. (See Program Directory on the next page)

### EMPLOYMENT SECURITY DEPARTMENT

**NOTE:** Please refer to Section I, listed by County, to contact the nearest Job Service Center or Satellite Office for additional information on specific programs. These will be listed under Employment and Training/Education.

This Department operates as part of a national employment and training system that helps people prepare for and find jobs. The Department also helps employers find workers and in some cases provides workers with temporary income while they look for work.

### **Employment Services**

Employment Services are provided by the Department to place people in jobs. These job placement services are provided through a network of 29 Job Service Centers (JSC) and 34 satellite, outstation and itinerant offices. Job seekers are screened, offered employment counseling, job search assistance, testing and referral to training, jobs and other services.

### Corrections Clearinghouse

Corrections Clearinghouse specializes in offender services. It functions as a vital link between the employment and training system and the criminal justice system. Projects operated by the Clearinghouse have focused on pre-release/ work orientation activities in correctional institutions, career awareness planning and job placement activities in the community and statewide coordination of offender programs and resources. Please reference Section II, Offender Employment and Training Programs, for further information.

### **Unemployment Insurance**

Unemployment Insurance partially compensates eligible unemployed workers for loss of wage/salary. In order to qualify, participants must be unemployed through no fault of their own, be physically able to work and have worked at least 680 hours in a base year (first four of the last five completed quarters) for employers covered by the applicable law. Applicants must be immediately available to accept any suitable work. In addition, applicants must actively seek work by making personal contacts with prospective employers.

### Federal Bonding Program

Federal Bonding Program provides individual fidelity bonds for applicants denied coverage by commercial carriers because of a record of arrest, conviction or imprisonment; history of alcohol or drug abuse; poor credit history; lack

of employment history (e.g. youth or displaced homemaker); Dishonorable Discharge; and/or special situations requiring a fidelity bond. To qualify, job offer must be full-time steady work providing adequate working conditions and wages.

### Targeted Jobs Tax Credit Program

Targeted Jobs Tax Credit Program allows employers to receive a tax break for hiring employees from certain disadvantaged groups. Employers can claim a credit of 40 percent of the first year wages up to \$6,000.00 (maximum credit of \$2,400.00) per employee. Targeted groups available for the credit are disadvantaged youth (18-22); Vietnamera veterans; ex-felons; summer youth (16-17 and hired between May 1 and September 15); youth 16-19 in a cooperative education program; Vocational Rehabilitation referrals; Social Security recipients; General Assistance recipients; recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children; and participants in the Family Independence or OPPORTUNITIES Programs.

### Veterans Programs

Veterans are provided specialized employment and training services through Local Veterans' Employment Representatives and Disabled Veterans' Outreach Program Specialists. These specialists develop networks of employers and community-based organizations, in order to maximize and coordinate the efforts of all local agencies to put veterans to work. Job Service Centers throughout the state have the responsibility of providing services to veterans. Veterans are offered, on a priority basis, the full range of employment-related services and benefits, including counseling, testing and job training referral services. In addition to regular services, Job Service Centers offer a variety of special programs designed to address specific problem areas as they arise in the veteran community.

### Washington State Service Corps

Washington State Service Corps provides unemployed residents between 18-25 with the opportunity to learn new skills and receive work and training experience to better compete in today's job market. The Service Corps also offers its participants the opportunity to continue their education, both during and after their tenure with the program. The program pays participants \$525 a month and provides health insurance. If eligible, tenure may last between 6-12 months.

### Family Independence Program

Family Independence Program is an alternative to the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program. The Employment Security Department offers employment and training services to participants. Applicants must meet the eligibility requirements of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children to participate. Services offered through the program include job search skill development, vocational testing and counseling, labor market information, and

referral to jobs. There are a full spectrum of educational opportunities available through the program from high school completion to vocational training to a college degree. In addition, there are training opportunities available on the work site itself, for example, on-the-job-training and work experience.

### Job Opportunities and Basic Skills Training (JOBS)

This program is available to all recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children who are not receiving FIP. The employment and training services available are essentially the same as those offered by FIP. Generally, FIP is able to offer a more comprehensive set of support services to assist the recipient complete the training or education.

### Shared Work Program

Shared Work Program allows an employer to reduce an eligible employees' hours and wages by a mutually agreed percentage, while that employee receives a corresponding percentage of unemployment insurance benefits.

### Job Training Partnership Act

Job Training Partnership Act provides job training and placement services to economically disadvantaged youth and adults. Services available may include job search assistance, on-the-job training, GED completion, work experience, remedial education and basic skills training, institutional skill training and supportive services.

### Job Corps

Job Corps is for disadvantaged youth between the ages of 16-21. It provides institutional training for future entry into the job market. Applicants are paid, housed and provided medical benefits while attending training. Services offered by the Employment Security Department are: outreach and screening applicants, application completion and processing, maintaining contact and support of Job Corps students while in the center and job placement assistance upon completion of training.

### First Source Hiring Program

First Source Hiring Program is an incentive for employers to hire unemployed individuals, especially those currently on welfare or drawing unemployment compensation. The employer and the prospective employee agree to a 30-day training period. During this period the employer pays no wages and the potential employee continues to receive their public assistance or unemployment insurance benefits.

### Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Program

Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Program provides placement services in rural agricultural areas directly or refers workers to other appropriate agencies. Bilingual staff are available to assist Spanish-speaking applicants.

### Alien Employment Certification

Alien Employment Certification makes it possible for an employer to hire a foreign national if it can be proved there are no qualified, available United States workers for the specific employment in question.

## DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND HEALTH SERVICES

**NOTE:** The Department's offices and facilities are located throughout the state. Grants, medical assistance, and foodstamps can be obtained at 57 Community Services Offices (CSOs) located state-wide. Please refer to Section I, listed by county, to find the nearest office. The offices will be listed under Multiple Service Centers.

The Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS), helps people who are unable to protect themselves or to fully provide for their basic needs. The Department also protects the general public from hazards such as contagious diseases, radiation and polluted water. In addition, through public education efforts, DSHS promotes activities that contribute to a healthy social and physical environment. DSHS also contracts with county and city governments, as well as community organizations and private firms, to provide needed services.

Below is an overview of the Department's programs:

### **Public Health**

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Public Health

Public Health divisions work to prevent and control the causes of disease, injury, disability and premature death. The emphasis is on prevention through education and early detection.

### Health Planning

Health Planning has a goal to ensure that all citizens of Washington have access to high quality health care at a reasonable cost.

### **Health and Rehabilitative Services**

### Alcohol and Substance Abuse

The Division of Alcohol and Substance Abuse helps people recover from alcoholism and drug addiction. The division contracts with county governments and private providers for various types of treatment. Equally important are efforts to prevent alcoholism and substance abuse among all segments of the population.

### Vocational Rehabilitation

This division assists people with disabilities to prepare for, achieve and maintain employment. Vocational rehabilitation services are designed to remove barriers to employment and enhance the productive potential of individuals. Services are customized to fit the unique needs of each client.

### **Developmental Disabilities**

This division assist people with developmental disabilities and their families. the goal of services is to meet individual needs and promote activities, routines and relationships common to most citizens. Services are based on individual preferences, abilities and needs. Services can include medical care, family support, job placement and training, or whatever clients need for full living and learning. This division also operates residential centers for people with disabilities.

### Services

The Office of Deaf Services provides information and referral services related to deafness. The office assists, trains and coordinates interpreter services for other DSHS divisions, as well as state education and employment agencies, to promote accessible services for deaf clients.

This office also runs the Telecommunication Devices for the Deaf (TDD and TDD Related programs. These programs allow deaf persons to communicate by using advanced telephone technology.

### Mental Health

The state's mental health system endures that those who experience mental disorder receive the treatment and services needed to function at their highest level.

Counties are primarily responsible for local mental health programs. Local systems respond to crisis situations, and provide residential programs, outreach and support.

DSHS is primarily responsible for providing long-term care for people with intensive needs. Such care is provided at four mental health institutions, including Western and Eastern State hospitals.

### **Aging and Adult Services**

### Nursing Home Services

Staff in this area are responsible for inspecting Washington's nursing homes to determine is they are meeting their residents needs, as well as state and federal requirements.

Each nursing home receives and unannounced inspection at least once a year. DSHS investigators are also available to perform on-site evaluations of complaints made against specific homes.

### Long-term Care Field Services

Social workers and community nurses assess and promote access to long-term care for persons age 18 and above in 45 locations around Washington.

Long-term care field service operations in each of the six DSHS regions is headed by a field manager. They direct programs which protect elderly and vulnerable adults, regulate adult family group homes, provide inhome services allowing people with special needs to live at home and assist those who need to enter a nursing home or other care facility.

### Management Services

This division is responsible for managing all services administered by the Aging and Adult Services cluster. These duties include budget development, fiscal accounting, contracting, personnel, information services and setting nursing home payment rates.

### Planning and Program Development Services

Staff in this area develops policies and procedures for all aging and long-term care programs that serve elderly and disabled adult clients. In addition, this area oversees and provides technical help to the 13 Area Agencies on Aging that offer community services in Washington.

### **Economic and Medical Services**

### Income Assistance

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This division provides financial assistance and/or food stamps to needy families and individuals, such as parents with young children, unemployed adults and those who are disabled and unemployed.

#### Medical Assistance

This program helps people with little or no income to receive necessary medical care. Clients include people whose income is too high to qualify for financial assistance but too low to meet their medical needs. The department reimburses local doctors, clinics, pharmacies an hospitals for necessary health care provided to eligible clients.

### Refugee Assistance

DSHS assists refugees to become economically self-sufficient as quickly as possible after they settle in Washington State.

Services provided to refugees include cash and medical assistance, English-language training, counseling, help in finding employment and foster care for minors.

### Family Independence Program

Enrollees in the Family Independence Program, or FIP, receive special benefits, such as child care and transportation allowances, when they participate in education, job training or work experience programs designed to lead to employment and self-sufficiency.

FIP is offered at selected sites around the state Employment Security Department.

### Community Services Offices

Staff in Community Services Offices (CSOs) and branch offices throughout the state make sure that eligible clients receive financial and medical assistance, and food stamps.

Caseworkers arrange day care and other support services to assist clients in obtaining and training.

### Children, Youth and Family Services

### Children and Family Services

This division protects children, stabilizes their lives, and preserves and strengthens families.

Child Protective Services (CPS) staff investigates reports of child abuse and neglect, and arranges for temporary out-of-home care if a child's safety is threatened. Families in crisis are linked to necessary services, such as counseling or parent training, to help prevent abuse or family break-up.

Child Welfare staff serves children in out-of-home care and develop permanent plans for those who cannot return to their natural family.

This division provides child care services and licenses child care facilities to ensure high standards. Family foster care, adoption services as well as programs for victims of sexual assault and domestic violence are also managed by Children and Family Services.

### Juvenile Rehabilitation

This division provides confinement and rehabilitation for young offenders found guilty of criminal offenses by juvenile courts. It operates three institutions and two forestry camps. These facilities provide education, vocational training, recreation and specific treatment for rehabilitation.

Community-based programs, such as group homes, learning centers and counseling services, provide less-costly alternatives for juvenile offenders who don't require institutionalization.

### Management Services

Staff in this area provides financial, research and information services for all Children, Youth and Family Services division. Management Services assists the rest of the divisions to develop and manage budgets, meet requirements for federal funds, evaluate programs, and develop and maintain computer information systems.

### **Productivity and Administration**

### Administrative Services

Support Services necessary for the smooth operation of the department as a whole are managed by this division. These services include mail and copier services, purchase or lease of equipment and supplies, telephone systems, contracts, facility leasing and management, forms and records management, appeals, special investigations, and audits.

### Comptroller

The Comptroller Division is responsible for the department's budgeting, accounting and operations improvement efforts. This includes forecasting financial developments, providing necessary management information, accounting for departmental funds and making vendor payment.

### **Employee Services**

All employees of the department are recruited, hired and paid through this division. It also manages the department's nondiscrimination and affirmative action policies, safety, industrial insurance and risk management programs, labor relations and staff training.

### Information System Services

This division serves the whole department's information processing and reporting needs. The staff's responsibilities include planning and policy for information systems; design of new computer programs; maintenance of existing computer systems; and coordinating communications technology.

#### Revenue

The Revenue Division is the collection arm of the department. It consists of two offices.

The Office of Support Enforcement makes sure that children receive the support payments and medical insurance to which they are entitled. The office also helps obtain child support orders and establishes paternity. The Office of Financial Recovery manages accounts receivable for the entire department. major collections come from client and vendor over payments, and from mental health and developmental disabilities clients who contribute to their cost of care.

### Secretary's Office

### Legislative and Community Relations

This division monitors state and federal legislation that affects DSHS. Writing and graphic design staff communicates with the public, the news media, employees, clients and constituent groups. Promoting relationships with the business community, local governments and tribes, and coordinating volunteer activities are also responsibilities of this division.

### Planning Evaluation and Professional Development

This area develops and conducts research projects and evaluates the effectiveness of DSHS services. It provides information to the secretary and department managers that guides long-range planning, policy development and innovative changes.

## DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIES

**NOTE:** The Department's offices and facilities are located throughout the state. Please refer to Section I, listed by County, to contact the nearest office for additional information.

The Department of Labor and Industries (L&I) primary goal is to contribute to the economic well-being of Washington State by providing high-quality, cost-effective service to all of its clients. L&I collects premiums from employers and workers, administers claims, receives income from investments of its reserves and oversees benefits to victims of industrial accidents and illnesses. It also regulates the performance of self-insured employers.

Below is an overview of the Department's Programs:

### **Building and Construction Safety Inspection Services**

Electrical licensing, certification and inspection

This department licenses electrical contractors and certifies electrical administrators, journeymen and trainees. The staff inspects nearly 130,000 electrical installations each year and certifies electrical product testing laboratories. This department also issues amusement ride operating permits.

### **Boiler Inspection**

This department inspects thousands of boilers and other pressure vessels, water heaters and storage tanks annually to ensure they meet specific safety standards in facilities ranging from schools to nuclear power plants.

### Elevator inspection

Thousands of elevators, escalators and other conveyances are inspected each year to ensure they are safe for public use.

### Construction compliance inspection

This section includes four specific programs: contractor registration; factory-built housing and commercial structures; plumber certification; and mobile homes, recreational vehicles and commercial coaches. The staff inspects all types of units under its jurisdiction to ensure they meet specified building codes and safety standards. Contractor registration

is another of the division's important consumer-protection functions. The office maintains a toll-free telephone hotline (1-800-647-0982) so the public can learn whether contractors are registered with the state, have insurance coverage and have posted bonds against faulty work.

### **Employment Standards, Apprenticeship and Crime Victims Compensation**

### Employment standards

This section enforces state laws governing minimum wages and the payment of wages to workers, prevailing wages on public works projects, work permits for minors, farm labor contractors and child labor laws. Among other activities, ESAC agents collect overtime payments on behalf of workers, protect young people who enter the workforce, and enforce laws to ensure payment of prevailing wages on public works projects.

### Apprenticeship

The division has six apprenticeship offices around the state to help citizens participate in job-training programs operated in conjunction with the state's workers and employers. More than 300 programs are available for apprentices, including a variety of trades from carpentry to law enforcement. Statewide, more than 5,000 apprentices are registered to receive training.

### Crime victims compensation

This program provides financial help to the innocent victims of violent crime who do not have other forms of insurance coverage. Those who qualify for assistance may receive replacement of lost wages, medical coverage and pensions. In homicide cases, their survivors may qualify for death benefits. The program is funded by fines paid to counties by criminal offenders. The fines also help support assistance programs for victims and witnesses at the county government level.

# WASHINGTON DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS (DVA)

The Washington Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) is a full-service state agency created to assist veterans, service members, their dependents and survivors. The Department is an advocate for our state's veterans. Upon request, the Department will try to obtain for such persons any benefit to which they are entitled under the laws of the United States, the state of Washington, or any other state or government agency. In addition the Department has Tribal Veterans Representatives who connect tribal indian veterans with appropriate veteran service providers. Likewise only county, state, or federal agencies that want to disseminate program information that could be of benefit to indian veterans or their family can channel through the designated Tribal Veterans Representatives. The Department has two residential facilities designed to provide a high level of medical and supportive care to eligible persons who cannot provide for themselves.
