FISCAL YEAR SUMMARY REPORT OF POPULATION MOVEMENT - 1990

This publication is designed to provide the reader with summary information about the volume and movements of offenders under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections during fiscal year 1990 and is a compilation of data originally published in the monthly Statistical Bulletin C-59, Report of Wisconsin Corrections Population. The Department of Corrections, with responsibility for the operation of correctional institutions for adult offenders and for the supervision of offenders on probation and parole in the community, was organized on January 1, 1990. At that time the Division of Youth Services, a unit of the Department of Health and Social Services, assumed responsibilities for the operation of state correctional institutions for juvenile offenders. Information about juveniles confined in these facilities during the fiscal year has been excluded from this publication.

HIGHLIGHTS - ADULT INSTITUTION POPULATION

On June 30, 1990 a total of 6,717 offenders were confined in correctional facilities for adult offenders; an increase of 7.8 percent over the 6,232 offenders reported on July 1, 1989.

- The adult male correctional institution population increased 7.4 percent from 5,965 at the start to 6,408 at the end of fiscal year 1990. During the same time period, adult female population rose from 267 to 309, an increase of 15.7 percent. (See Table 1)
- The average daily population of institutionalized offenders rose steadily from 5,089 in fiscal year 1986 to 6,425 in fiscal year 1990; an increase of 26.3 percent during the five-year period. These figures exclude the Wisconsin Resource Center, a facility operated by the Division of Care and Treatment Facilities, Department of Health and Social Services.

HIGHLIGHTS - COMMUNITY SUPERVISION POPULATIONS

The number of community supervision cases; i.e., those supervised in the community under the conditions of probation and parole, increased 16.1 percent from 28,388 at the beginning to 32,964 at the end of fiscal year 1990.

Ouring fiscal year 1990 the number of community services cases on absconder status dropped from 4,414 to 4,004, a decrease of 9.3 percent.

- Ouring fiscal year 1986 an average daily population of 24,096 offenders was under community supervision. This average, which has risen steadily, reached 30,124 in fiscal year 1990; an increase of 25.0 percent during the five-year period.

- The average daily population of offenders under probation supervision rose from 20,530 in fiscal year 1986 to 25,907 in fiscal year 1990; an increase of 26.2 percent. (See Table A)
- Parole supervision average daily population increased 18.3 percent from 3,566 in fiscal year 1986 to 4,217 in fiscal year 1990.

Adult parole supervision average daily population rose 18.1 percent from 3,199 in 1986 to 3,779 in 1990.

° The largest increase in adult parole supervision during the five-year period (9.3 percent) occurred between fiscal years 1989 and 1990 when the average daily population rose from 3,457 to 3,779.

^o Juvenile aftercare average daily population rose 8.0 percent from 163 in fiscal year 1989 to 176 in fiscal year 1990.

The absence of juvenile probation and youthful offender cases after fiscal year 1989 can be attributed to a Department of Health and Social Services policy decision to discontinue provision of juvenile probation services on a state level and to the repeal of the Youthful Offender Statute, effective July 1, 1978.
