#### INTRODUCTION

The violence within the American domicile has been recognized for decades by elements of government and society with little cone to correct the problem. Only recently has this phenomenon begun to receive the attention it deserves. In an effort to understand, identify and treat the incidents of abuse occurring within the home, the State of New Jersey, through its legislature, has provided the means to gain a meaningful insight into the issue.

In 1982, the Domestic Violence Act was instituted to protect battered victims and study the complex problems that spark such aggressive behavior. This legislation also provided the opportunity to identify the causes of violence in the home and put forth a more comprehensive effort to combat the crime of Domestic Violence.

Improvements since the implementation of the Domestic Violence Act are continuing; serious concern has been displayed within many municipal and county agencies whereby various committees and working groups have been formed to help battle this important problem. Revised investigation and reporting procedures by the police; improved processing of domestic complaints by the courts; mandatory in-service training for police and court personnel have all enabled the victim to come forward and implement the constitutional rights granted to all Americans.

The following pages of narrative and graphics in this chapter are the result of gathered data displaying the complexities of domestic violence found within the State of New Jersey. As stated in the following pages, reported domestic violence acts decreased two percent over 1989. It is through analysis of this data that hopefully, the keys to preventing future violence can be found.

#### DOMESTIC VIOLENCE STATISTICAL SUMMARY

Highlights of the 1990 domestic violence statistics are listed below:

- There were 50,823 domestic violence offenses reported by the police in 1990, a 2% decrease compared to the 51,785 reported in 1989.
- Murders increased 16% in 1990 (57) when compared to 1989 (49).
- Assaults occurred in 63% (32,268) of the reported offenses in 1990.
- The total arrests for 1990 (17,035) increased 2% over 1989 (16,664).
- Arrests were made in 34% of the offenses reported for 1990.
- The most frequent day of domestic violence occurrences was Sunday (9,570).
- For the eighth consecutive year, the most frequent hours of domestic violence incidents were between 8:00 p.m. and midnight, when 31% (15,862) of the offenses were reported.
- Children were involved or present during 53% of all domestic violence offenses occurring in 1990. Specifically, 10% (4,934) were involved and 44% (22,203) were present.
- Wives were the victims in 39% (19,569), and female friends were the victims in 39% (19,680) of the reported domestic violence offenses in 1990. Overall, females were victims in 85% (43,245) of all domestic violence offenses.
- The number of domestic violence complaints that had prior court orders issued against the offender increased from 10,508 in 1989 to 10,695 in 1990. This is a 2% increase.
- Alcohol and/or drugs were involved in 46% (23,538) of the reported offenses occurring in 1990. Alcohol involvement alone accounted for 41% (20,919) of the total domestic violence offenses reported.
- Persons age 60 or over were victims in 3% (1,393) of all reported domestic violence offenses that occurred in 1990.
- Domestic Violence does not occur at a regular frequency, but when viewed as a ratio of it's occurrence to a fixed time interval, one act of domestic violence would occur every ten (10) minutes and twenty-one (21) seconds.

- False imprisonment, sexual assault, criminal sexual contact and burglary reported the highest number of offenses since the inception of the Domestic Violence Program.
- For the second consecutive year, domestic violence offenses decreased (-2%), while at the same time arrests increased (+2%).
- The violent crimes of homicide (57), aggravated assault (5,876) and sexual assault (84) accounted for twelve (12) percent of reported domestic violence offenses (50,823).

- For the eighth consecutive year, assault was the most prominent of the eleven types of domestic violence offenses (32,268). Females were victims in 85% (27,576) and males in 15% (4,692) of the domestic violence offenses involving assaults.
- Wives were the victims in 39% (19,569), and female friends were the victims in 39% (19,680) of the reported domestic violence offenses in 1990. Overall, females were victims in 85% (43,245) of all domestic violence offenses.
- Harassment was the second highest reported domestic violence offense in 1990 (15,489).
- In addition to the fifty-seven (57) domestic violence homicide victims in 1990, there were nine (9) associated deaths.
- Thirty-three percent of the domestic violence homicide victims were male (19), while sixty-seven percent were females (38).

- Forty-six percent (23,538) of the reported acts of domestic violence (50,823) involved the use of drugs or alcohol.



- Females, 60 years of age or over, were the victims in 67% (940) of the 1,393 elderly abuse offenses.
- Persons age 60 or over, were the victims in 3% (1,393) of all the reported domestic violence offenses during this period.



## DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OFFENSES BY TIME OF DAY 1989/1990




• During 1990 forty-five percent of the reported Domestic Violence offenses occurred between 6:00 p.m. and 12 Midnight.
