This is the fourth volume in an annual series describing in detail the characteristics of persons admitted to and released from the prison and parole systems in the United States. The report presents data gathered from the 1988 National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP). The NCRP, begun in 1983, evolved from the need to improve and consolidate corrections reporting at the national level as well as to reduce the States' reporting burden. Before the NCRP, the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) sponsored the National Prisoner Statistics Admissions and Releases Program and the Uniform Parole Reports to collect data.

Thirty-five States, the District of Columbia, and the Federal Bureau of Prisons contributed the offender-specific data that made this report possible. As we look forward to the inclusion of all States in this national series, we at BJS gratefully acknowledge the generous contribution of the State and Federal respondents who have enabled us to produce this volume.

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Reporting criteria

The NCRP collects data on all prison admissions and releases and on all parole entries and discharges for calendar year 1988 in participating jurisdictions. Multiple admissions or releases per person during the year are recorded as separate events. The NCRP data cover prisoners admitted to or released from custody regardless of the jurisdiction where the prisoner was sentenced. Persons sentenced to a State prison but admitted to or released from the custody of a local jail are included in the NCRP.

Beginning in 1983 all sentenced inmates, including those with a total sentence of a year or less, were counted. To assure greater comparability across jurisdictions, the 1988 report includes only inmates with a sentence of more than a year except where noted. Information on all inmates, including those with a sentence of a year or less, is contained in the public-use data tape that may be obtained from the National Archive of Criminal Justice Data at the University of Michigan.

Offenses

Each State's offenses are recoded to a common set of offense codes. In this report, attempts and conspiracies are included with completed offenses, except for attempted murders and conspiracies to commit murder, which are classified as assaults.

Offense types appearing in this report include the following offenses:

Homicide - murder, felony murder, non-negligent manslaughter, voluntary manslaughter, negligent manslaughter, involuntary manslaughter, and unspecified homicide.

Murder/nonnegligent manslaughter murder, felony murder, nonnegligent manslaughter, and voluntary manslaughter.

Murder — murder and felony murder.

Nonnegligent manslaughter --- voluntary manslaughter, nonnegligent manslaughter, and aggravated manslaughter.

Manslaughter -- negligent manslaughter, vehicular manslaughter, involuntary manslaughter, and negligent homicide.

Unspecified homicide - homicide and homicide type not specified.

Kidnaping - abduction, kidnaping, and felonious restraint.

Rape — forcible rape, aggravated rape, and sexual intercourse without consent.

Other sexual assault — statutory rape, carnal abuse, gross sexual imposition by force, fondling, child molestation, and lewd acts with children.

Robbery — unarmed robbery, armed robbery, aggravated robbery, and forcible purse snatching.

Assault - attempted murder, simple assault, aggravated assault, aggravated battery, vehicular assault, and criminal injury to persons.

Other violent - extortion, intimidation, hit-and-run driving with bodily injury, child abuse, and criminal endangerment against a person.

Burglary - breaking and entering, burglary, and safecracking.

Larceny - theft, petty larceny, and grand larceny.

Motor vehicle theft - auto theft. conversion of an automobile, receiving and transferring a stolen vehicle, and unauthorized use of a vehicle.

Arson — arson and burning a thing of value.

Fraud — worthless checks, uttering, obtaining money by false pretenses, credit card fraud, fraud, forgery, counterfeiting, and embezzlement.

Stolen property - possession, transportation, receiving, or selling of stolen property.

Other property — destruction of property, vandalism, criminal tampering. trespassing, entering without breaking, and possession of burglary tools.

Drug possession -- possession or use of controlled substances.

Drug trafficking — importation, manufacture, sale, or delivery of controlled substances; possession with intent to deliver.

Other drug - forging or uttering a false prescription for a controlled substance; possession of drug paraphernalia, unknown drug offenses, and violations of controlled substance acts where the type of violation was unspecified.

Weapons — unlawful sale, distribution, manufacture, transportation, or possession of a deadly or dangerous weapon.

Other public-order — escape from custody, court offenses, obstruction, driving while intoxicated, other traffic offenses, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, morals and decency violations, commercialized vice, and liquor law violations.

Methodology

Other offenses - juvenile offenses and unspecified felonies.

Federal offenses were recoded to many of the same categories defined above. Specific Federal categories include the following:

Embezziement -- postal, bank, and benefit plans.

Fraud - postal, passport, Veterans' and other benefits, government employment, banks, computer, and impersonation.

Counterfeiting - postal, money orders, securities, and altering or forging currency.

Regulatory - violation of banking and insurance laws, smuggling, violation of customs, election laws, food and drug laws, maritime and railroad laws. retirement act and unemployment insurance, communication law, and other regulatory provisions.

Immigration — illegal entry, harboring or smuggling illegal aliens, and other immigration violations.

Tax law - internal revenue violations, including tax fraud, tax evasion, and failure to pay excise, alcohol, inheritance, withholding, Social Security, or other taxes.

Racketeering and extortion — threats through the mail, over the phone, or in interstate commerce, labor racketeering, RICO, money laundering, and interference with commerce by threat or violence.

Sentences

Data on sentence length refer to the offense with the longest sentence. Whenever a sentence had both a minimum and a maximum term, the maximum was used to define the sentence length. A life sentence was defined as any prison sentence with a fixed or maximum term of life in prison, regardless of the possibility of parole.

Time served

Time served refers to the amount of time spent in prison between the date of admission and the date of release or to the amount of time spent on parole between the date of prison release and the date of parole discharge. Time served in prison underestimates the actual time served because data on time spent in jail that was credited to the prison sentence for the current offense are not available for most inmates. All tables in the report present data for time served in prison only.

Total time under supervision was calculated by adding time spent in prison and time spent on parole. Once again, jailtime credits are not included in the estimate of the total time under supervision.

Median and mean

The medians in this report were calculated from ungrouped data, since sentencing data do not conform to the standard assumptions permitting calculations from grouped data. Because nearly all sentences are multiples of 12month units, the assumption of an even distribution of values within groups is not met. Therefore, a shift of only a few cases may increase or decrease the median by 12 months.

In contrast to the calculation of medians, mean sentence lengths exclude prisoners with a sentence of life in prison or death. Medians are sensitive to the uneven distribution of cases; means are influenced by extreme

Because of the limitations of each measure, both medians and means were reported for sentence length.

Time served data do not group at 12month intervals. Both medians and means have been reported in most

tables to provide an accurate summary of the data.

Year-to-year comparisons

Care should be exercised when comparing 1988 data on sentence length and time served to data published for 1987 and previous years. Year-to-year comparisons should be restricted to those jurisdictions reporting data in all years of interest. The group of jurisdictions participating in 1988, however, differed from the group in the previous years. States reporting in the 1988 program were Alabama, California, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, and Wisconsin. The District of Columbia, the Federal Bureau of Prisons, and the Federal Parole Commission also reported data.

Subgroup comparisons

Care should be exercised when comparing groups of inmates on sentence length and time served. Differences may be the result of factors not described in the tables, including variations in the criminal histories of each group, variations in the offense composition of each group, and variations among participating jurisdictions in their sentencing and correctional practices.

Race

Ohio codes American Indian/Alaskan Natives, Asian/Pacific Islanders as "unknown."

South Carolina's parole release records code any persons other than white or black as "unknown."

Hispanic origin

Colorado, Illinois, and Minnesota code inmates of Hispanic origin as "unknown."

In Michigan and Oklahoma, Hispanics include Mexican Americans only.

In New York, Hispanics include only persons of Puerto Rican birth or parentage.

In Oklahoma, Hispanics include only those of Mexican origin.

Texas prison admission and release records code Hispanic as "unknown."

Federal data on the Hispanic origin of inmates were not available for persons released from prison before July 1983.

Education

Data on education in Maryland include credits for education received after entering prison for parole discharge records only.

Ohio has included an undetermined number of records of people who have a college degree in the category of "some college."

Admission date

Data on date of admission in New York and Texas refer to the original admission date, rather than the most recent date, if inmates had been released and then returned.

For Federal offenders the date of sentencing is provided instead of the date of admission. This date is accurate for only new court commitments.

Admission type

In Alabama, Colorado, and Ohio, "new court commitments" includes some parole violators returned with new sentences.

In Minnesota, "new court commitments" includes probation violators.

Delaware's data on admission type were reported inaccurately for an undetermined number of prison release records. Also, "transfers" includes inmates returned to Delaware after being tried in another State.

In Massachusetts, "transfers" includes returns to prison after court appearance, temporary interstate transfers, transfers from other States, Federal transfers, transfers from county to State custody. and transfers from other secure facilities.

In Hawaii and Maryland, "new court commitments" includes all types of admissions.

Nebraska reported the following types of admissions: regular, multiple-offender, evaluator, Federal safekeeper, county safekeeper, and other. Since these could not be translated into the NCRP categories, they were coded as "missing/invalid data entries".

In Nevada, "parole revocation, new sentence" and "parole revocation, no new sentence" may have been underreported.

In Ohio, type of admission includes an undetermined number of parole violators returned with new sentences.

In Tennessee, data on admission type were only available for a small number of cases.

In New York, admission type for parole revocations were reported for those with no new sentence only. There are no probation revocations because probation is considered a county function.

In North Carolina, "probation revocation" includes persons whose parole status was pending.

In Minnesota, "parole revocation with or without new sentence" includes mandatory parole violators returned and work release violators returned.

In Pennsylvania, "parole revocation, no sentence information" includes parole revocation with recommitment decisions pending.

In North Carolina, "parole revocation, no sentence information" includes all parole violators with or without new sentences as well as pending parole revocations.

In South Carolina, "parole revocation, no sentence information" includes revocation of "supervised furlough II releases" and Emergency Powers Act releases.

In Texas, "parole revocation, no sentence information" and "mandatory parole revocation, no sentence information" include all parole revocations, with or without new sentences.

In Wisconsin, "parole revocation, new sentence" and "parole revocation, no new sentence" include returns of inmates released early because of overcrowding.

In New York, "mandatory parole revocation with or without new sentence" includes the return of inmates who were granted early release for good time served.

On parole releases records in New York, data on admission type were reported only for parole violators with no new sentence.

Explanatory notes

In North Carolina, "mandatory parole revocation, no sentence information" includes all mandatory parole violators with or without new sentences as well as pending mandatory parole revocations.

In Pennsylvania, "escapees returned" are not considered escapes until returned from court.

In South Carolina, "escapees returned" are not counted as admissions.

In Texas, "not known" includes inmates returning from vocational or educational programs.

Offenses

Delaware, New Jersey, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Pennsylvania reported only one offense-the most serious.

Minnesota reports only most recent offense instead of the most serious.

In Virginia and Washington, the category "life" includes "life without parole."

For Federal prisoners, only two offenses per inmate are reported, usually the two most serious. If an inmate receives an additional offense after admission that is more serious than the original offenses. the inmate's record is updated to show that offense.

Maximum sentence and total maximum sentence

In Illinois and Maryland persons receiving indeterminate sentences were reported as "not known" on sentence length.

Minimum time to be served

Maryland did not report "minimum sentence" because there is no statute establishing minimum sentence.

Prison release date

In the Federal prison system and Maryland, the prison release date on parole exit records is the date parole supervision begins, not the actual release date.

Prison release method

In Massachusetts, "parole board decision" includes some inmates released by the Massachusetts parole board to another parole board.

In New York, "parole board decision" includes some inmates released by the Division of Prisons.

In Pennsylvania "parole board decision" and "mandatory parole releases" are not distinguished.

On prison release records in South Carolina, "parole board decision" includes inmates released from a Youthful Offenders Act sentence to a straight sentence and vice versa. Also "other unconditional release" includes those inmates who paid a fine after serving some prison time; those whose sentence was reduced; those who were retried; and those released for medical reasons. On parole release records, "parole board decision" includes inmates released to supervised furlough.

In Wisconsin, "parole board decision" includes early releases because of overcrowding.

in New York, "mandatory parole releases" includes early releases for good time served.

In Minnesota, "other conditional releases" includes work releases.

Mississippi's "other conditional releases" includes split sentences, work release, and supervised earned releases.

New York codes "releases to custody. detainer, or warrant" as either "parole board decision" or "mandatory parole release."

In Ohio, "other conditional releases" consists of releases for educational or vocational purposes, inmates paroled or shock paroled, on detainer, and under interstate compact.

In Oklahoma, "other conditional releases" consists of releases to a community treatment center. Also, "transfers to probation and probation from house arrest" are coded as "probation release."

In South Carolina, "other conditional releases" consists of persons released by the Emergency Powers Act.

For the California Youth Authority, "other unconditional releases" includes some discharges to prison.

"Other unconditional releases" in Delaware, Maryland, Ohio, Texas, and Wyoming consists of court-ordered releases.

"Other unconditional releases" in Minnesota consists of discharges of persons with indeterminate sentences by the releasing authority.

In Mississippi, "other unconditional releases" includes shock probation, court suspensions, and court-ordered releases.

In Nebraska, "other unconditional releases" consists of persons whose sentence was vacated.

In Tennessee, "other unconditional releases" consists of unconditional releases to probation.

In Ohio, "other releases" consists of inmates-at-large who did not belong to any other NCRP category.

In Texas, "other releases" includes inmates released to attend vocational or educational facilities.

Parole release method

In the Federal prison system, "discharged, completion of term" includes absconders and inmates whose convictions were reversed.

In New York, "other release" includes parole board decision (discretionary after 3 years) court-ordered releases; new revocations, not pursued; and cases in the revocation process in which statutory requirements were not fulfilled.

In Pennsylvania, "other releases" includes parole board case closures for persons who have reached their maximum expiration date and who are in one of the following categories: criminal charges pending, absconders, or returned to home State.

Maryland includes inmates who failed to comply with special conditions of their parole as "discharged, absconder."

In 1988, 35 States, the District of Columbia, and the California Youth Authority reported 307,562 admissions accounting for about four-fifths of all admissions to State prisons in that year. (See "Prisoners in State and Federal Institutions, 1988" in Correctional Populations in the United States, 1988, NCJ-124280.) The 1988 data on entering prisoners provide a profile which resembles that of past reports. Inmate subgroup differences for sentence length and time to be served may have resulted from factors not described in the tables. (See Methodology, page 2.)

- New court commitments offenders entering prison directly from a sentence by a court and not from an unsuccessful period of community supervision comprised almost two-thirds of all prison admissions (table 1-1). Parole violators accounted for more than a quarter of all admissions.
- As in previous years, males comprised 93% of all admissions to State prisons (table 1-2).
- Whites accounted for 48% of all reported State prison admissions: blacks, 51%; and other races, primarily American Indians and Asians, 1%. Hispanics of all races made up 18% of all prison admissions. The median age of all admissions was 28 years.
- Nearly a third of the persons entering prison had been convicted of a violent offense (table 1-5). Robbery was the most common violent crime, accounting for over a tenth of new court admissions.
- About 1 of every 3 women and 1 of every 4 men had been convicted of a drug offense. More than two-fifths of Hispanic prisoners had been convicted of a drug offense.

- The median maximum sentence length for persons admitted to prison in 1988 was 48 months (table 1-6).
- Violent offenses carried the longest median maximum sentence (72 months).
- The median sentence for property offenses was 42 months; drug and public-order offenses, 36 months.
- The median sentence for murder was 60 years in prison, longer than for any other individual offense.
- · Overall, black prisoners had the same median sentence as white prisoners (48 months) (table 1-7). For property offenses, however, the median sentence for blacks was 6 months longer than for whites (42 months compared to 36 months). Among blacks and whites median sentences were the same for violent offenses (72 months) and for drug and public-order offenses (36 months).
- State correctional officials were asked to estimate a minimum time that admitted prisoners would have to serve before becoming eligible for release

- (table 1-8). Factors used in this estimate includes minimum sentence length, good-time credits, earned-time credits, parole eligibility requirements, and early release requirements, and allowances. In those States reporting both maximum sentence length and minimum time to be served, the median sentence length was 60 months and entering prisoners were expected to serve slightly more than a third of that time, a median of 24 months.
- The minimum time to be served by violent offenders was 36 months: by property offenders, 18 months; by drug offenders, 23 months; and by publicorder offenders, 14 months.
- The average estimated minimum time to be served for men was 47% of their mean maximum sentence versus 44% for women (table 1-9).
- In 1988, sentences of life in prison or death were received by 2% of all offenders who entered prison; slightly less than half of the murderers and a tenth of the kidnapers received a sentence of life or death sentence (table 1-11).




Figure 1-1. Maximum sentence length for new court commitments, by offense

Release data for 1988 are based on information provided by 35 States, the District of Columbia, and the California Youth Authority. These States reported a total of 265,737 releases, which accounted for four-fifths of the releases from State prisons. (See "Prisoners in State and Federal Institutions, 1988" in Correctional Populations in the United States, 1988, NCJ-124280.) Of the total, 198,184 were first releases, those released from prison for the first time on their current sentence. Excluded from first releases were persons who had previously been conditionally released from prison for the same offense and then were returned to prison for violating the conditions of that release. All data on offense distribution and time served are limited to first releases. Inmate subgroup differences for time served may have resulted from factors not described in the tables. (See Methodology, page 2.)

- · About three-quarters of those released from prison were released conditionallycompleting their sentences under supervision in the community (table 2-1).
- Men made up the vast majority (93%) of all persons released from prison (table 2-2). Whites accounted for 50% of all releases; blacks, 49%; and persons of other races, 1%.
- Violent offenders accounted for 30% of the first time releases; property offenders, 42%; drug offenders, 20%; and public-order offenders, 7% (table 2-3).
- Fifty percent of the first releases had served a year or less in prison before their release in 1988; 7% had served more than 60 months (table 2-4).
- Men served longer than women for all offense types except for "other" publicorder offenses. Overall the median time served was 14 months by men, compared to 9 months by women (table 2-5).

- The median time served for blacks was 13 months, 1 month longer than that for whites (table 2-6). This difference reflects in part the higher percentage of violent offenders among black releases.
- The median time served for blacks was longer than that for whites for all violent offenses except for unspecified homicide and other sexual assault.
- Among Hispanic first releases the median time served on a violent offense was 24 months in prison; on a property or drug offense 12 months; and on a public-order offense, 11 months.
- The median time served for murder was 66 months; for nonnegligent manslaughter, 52 months; for rape, 36 months; for robbery, 27 months; and for assault, 15 months (table 2-7).
- Among property offenders the median time served was longest for arson (17 months) and burglary (13 months). The

- median time served for drug offenses was 10 months. Drug traffickers spent an average of 6 months longer than those convicted of drug possession (a median time of 12 months and 6 months, respectively).
- Among those releases with data reported on minimum time to be served, the median maximum sentence length was 60 months, the minimum time estimated to be served was 22 months. and the time actually served was 20 months (table 2-8). On average, offenders had served slightly over a third of their maximum sentence before release.
- Overall, offenders released through a parole board decision had served a median of 15 months (table 2-9). Mandatory parole releases, whose time had been set by statute, had served a median of 14 months. Unconditional releases had served a median of 8 months.




Figure 2-1. First releases from State prison: Maximum sentence length and time served in prison, by offense

A conditional release occurs if the released inmate, upon violating the conditions of the release, can be imprisoned again for any of the sentences for which the inmate had served time in prison.

^bDiscretionary release occurs when a parole board approves a conditional release to supervision.

^cMandatory release occurs when a statute requires that a prisoner be released conditionally. The prisoner has served time equal to the full sentence minus good time, if any. A mandatory release must meet the requirements of a conditional release until the sentence expires or until a period set by law has elapsed. ⁴An unconditional release occurs only if the released inmate cannot be reimprisoned for any sentence for which the inmate was in prison.

Most prisoners leaving State prisons in 1988 were released to supervision in the community. In these data covering 35 States, the District of Columbia, and the California Youth Authority, there were 138,256 first entries to parole supervision from State prisons. These prisoners were released to parole either by decision of a parole board (discretionary parole release) or by provision of the statute under which they were sentenced (mandatory parole release).

State statutes often determine what conditions prisoners must fulfill to enter parole. For example, some States specify the fraction of a sentence that offenders must serve — such as a third or a fourth — before entering parole. Other States have a mandatory minimum time to be served for certain crimes or for specified circumstances of a crime. Yet other States have parole guidelines that set ranges of time to be served for different types of crimes.

- As in previous years, males comprise
 93% of those entering parole (table 3-1).
- Whites made up 50% of the 1988 parole-entry population, blacks 49%, and other races 1%.
- The median age of persons entering parole was 28 years.
- About 30% of all offenders entering parole supervision had served time for a violent offense; 42% for a property offense; 19% for a drug offense; and about 7% for a public-order offense (table 3-2)
- A higher percentage of releases from State prison entered parole supervision from a parole board decision than from a mandatory parole release (68% versus 32%, respectively) (table 3-3).
- The median maximum sentence for all parole entries was 48 months while the

median time served for was 15 months (table 3-4).

- On average, persons paroled in 1988 had served about a third of their maximum sentence in prison prior to their release.
- On average, violent offenders served 39% of their mean maximum sentence in prison before their parole; public-order offenders served 31%; property offenders, 29%; and drug offenders, 26%.




Figure 3-1. First entries to parole from State prison: Method of release and offense

In 1988, 28 States and the California Youth Authority reported 123,228 discharges from parole supervision. These discharges accounted for 79% of all State parole discharges for 1988. (See "Prisoners in State and Federal Institutions, 1988" in Correctional Populations in the United States, 1988, NCJ-124280.)

Most parole terms end with a discharge from the supervising agency or a return to prison. Parole revocation rates reflect various factors, including parole policy as well as parolees' behavior. The release of high-risk offenders because of crowded facilities, strict surveillance of parolees, rigid enforcement of parole conditions, and longer parole terms may contribute either singly or in combination to failure rates.

- Among all persons discharged by State paroling agencies in 1988, 35% successfully completed parole (table 4-2).
- Among first discharges from parole, that is, persons released from parole for the first time for a particular offense, 56% completed parole successfully (table 4-3).
- Over two-thirds of the white and over half of the black State parolees discharged in 1988 had successfully completed parole supervision after their first release from prison on a sentence.
- Among those who were discharged from supervision, more blacks (44%) than whites (28%) were returned to prison or jail for violating the conditions of parole.
- Individuals convicted of property offenses were the least likely to

complete their parole term successfully (table 4-5).

- Among State parole discharges the highest percentage of returns to prison or jail were reported for offenders serving sentences for motor vehicle theft (54%), robbery (49%), and burglary
- On average, successful first State parole discharges served a total time in prison and on parole of 43 months; violent offenders, 58 months; drug and property offenders, 36 months; and public-order offenders, 33 months (table
- For the major offense categories of violence, property, drug, and publicorder, persons successfully completing parole had served about half of their average time in prison and half on parole. Parolees convicted of rape and homicide served on average more than 55% of their total time under correctional supervision in prison.

- · On average, men spent more time under correctional supervision than women for every type of offense except assault (table 4-7).
- Overall, whites had served a mean of 20 months in prison and 22 months on parole, while blacks served 22 months in prison and 24 months on parole (table 4-8).
- On average blacks spent more time under correctional supervision than whites for violent, drug, and public-order offenses, and the same time as whites for property offenses.
- The average total time served under correctional supervision was 43 months for successful first discharges from State parole compared to 48 months for unsuccessful first discharges (table 4-12). Compared to successful discharges, unsuccessful discharges served 7 months longer in prison but 3 months less on parole before their discharge.




Figure 4-1. Successful State parole discharges: Time served in prison and on parole

Admissions to Federal prison

- In 1988 Federal prisons reported admitting 25,084 persons - 14,354 with sentences of more than 12 months; 9,890 with sentences of 12 months or less; and 840 for whom sentence length data were not reported (table 5-1).
- Men comprised 89% of all Federal admissions.
- Whites made up 75% of all offenders admitted to Federal prison: blacks, 23%: and members of other races, primarily Asians and American Indians, 2%.
- Prisoners with sentences of more than 12 months were on average older than those with short sentences (a median age of 33 compared to 30).
- Nearly 10% of blacks admitted to Federal prison were violent offenders compared to 4% of whites. Over a third of both racial groups were entering prison for drug offenses (table 5-2).
- Among Hispanics admitted to Federal prison, half were immigration violators, and over a third were drug offenders.
- Over half of all persons admitted to Federal prison with a sentence of more than 12 months had been convicted of drug abuse violations, 34% for trafficking, and 22% for other or unspecified drug offenses (table 5-5).
- Among prisoners admitted with sentences of 12 months or less, 40% were convicted of immigration law violations and 18% were convicted of fraudulent offenses, such as embezzlement, fraud, or counterfeiting.

- Overall, only 6% of persons admitted to Federal prison in 1988 had been convicted of a violent offense.
- The median maximum sentence for all admissions was 24 months (table 5-7). The large number of short-sentenced immigration orienders, who comprised 18% of all admissions, heavily influenced this median.
- The median sentence of admissions for violent offenses was 60 months. while that for drug offenders was 53 months. The median sentence for property offense was 18 months and for public-order offenses, 5 months.
- For those entering prison with a sentence of more than 12 months, the median maximum sentence was 60 months: for violent offenses the median was 90 months; for property and publicorder offenses, 36 months; and for drug offenses, 60 months.

- · Men entering Federal prison had received a maximum sentence that on average was 9 months longer than that of women (median sentences of 24 months and 15 months, respectively) (table 5-8).
- The overall median sentence length for whites admitted to prison was 21 months, a median influenced by the large number of short sentences among immigration violators. The median sentence for blacks was 36 months.
- Blacks and whites received the same median maximum sentence for all offenses (60 months); property offenses (36 months); and drug offenses (60 months). Blacks were given longer sentences than whites for violent offenses (112 months versus 89 months) and public-order offenses (48 months versus 36 months) (table 5-9).




Figure 5-1. New court commitments to Federal Prison: Maximum sentence length, by offense

Releases from Federal prison

- In 1988, 46% of the 27,711 prisoners leaving Federal prison for the first time on a sentence were released conditionally to supervision in the community (table 6-1). Mandatory parole, a release established by statutory guidelines rather than a parole board decision. comprised 41% of all the conditional releases.
- For first releases with a sentence of 12 months or less, 98% of those 10.651 releases were for expiration of sentence. This is a result of the large number of immigration convictions with sentences of 12 months or less and thus ineligible for parole.
- · Among the first releases sentenced to more than 12 months, 14% left prison when their sentence expired, and 83% left before expiration, with conditions attached to the remainder of the sentence.
- Males constituted the majority (89%) of all releases from Federal prison (table 6-2). Whites accounted for 75% of the releases; blacks, 24%; and members of other races, 2%.
- Hispanics comprised 34% of the first releases from Federal prison. Half of those sentenced to 12 months or less were Hispanic.
- Fifty-seven percent of first releases from Federal prison in 1988 had served 12 months or less, 22% had served 13 to 24 months, and 21% had served more than 24 months (table 6-3).
- Among first releases with sentences of 12 months or less, 57% served less than 4 months before their release. The median time served was 3 months (table 6-4). This relatively low median is because immigration offenders served a median of 2 months. Immigration offenders accounted for 41% of first releases with sentences of 12 months or less.

- · Of all first releases sentenced to more than 12 months, half served 22 months or less before their release (table 6-6).
- First releases with sentences of more than 12 months served a median of 46 months in prison for violent offenses: 22 months for drug offenses; and 18 months for property and public-order offenses.
- Among individual offenses, the median time served for kidnaping was 72 months; for robbery and assault, 48 months: for rape, 37 months: for homicide, 48 months; for drug trafficking, 22 months: and for drug possession, 21 months.
- · Among first releases with sentences of more than 12 months, men served more time in prison than women for every type of offense, except for regulatory, immigration, and "other property" offenses (table 6-8).

- Overall, men served a median of 22 months: and women, 18 months. For male violent offenders the median time served was 22 months longer than that for women; for male property and drug offenders, 4 months longer; and for male public-order offenders, 2 month longer.
- For first releases sentenced to more than 12 months, little difference separated the median time served by white and black offenders except for violent offenses. Black violent offenders served a median of 55 months, and whites, 44 months (table 6-10). (See Methodology, page 2.)
- Mandatory releases with sentences of more than 12 months served 25 months in prison, 3 months longer than discretionary releases.
- Prisoners released at the expiration of their term served the least amount of time, a median of 13 months.




Figure 6-1. First releases from Federal prison: Maximum sentence length and time served in prison, by offense

- Men made up 91% of the 11,394 entries to parole from Federal prison in 1988 (table 7-1).
- White offenders comprised 72% of all parole entries; black offenders, 25%; and offenders of other races, 2%.
 Hispanic entries, who could be of any race, were 22% of the total.
- The median age for parolees at the time of their release from prison was 36 years.
- On average, parole entries had graduated from high school. About 16% had completed eight grades or less.
- Among first releases from Federal prison to parole, 59% had been released by a parole board, and 44% were mandatory releases (table 7-3).

- A higher percentage of public-order offenders than of other offenders were released from prison and entered parole as a result of a mandatory releases.
 Sixty-four percent of weapons violators were mandatory releases.
- Among parole entries for whom complete data exist on maximum sentence and time served in prison, half served 24 months or less in prison on a median maximum sentence of 48 months (table 7-4).
- Violent and drug offenders on average served a smaller proportion of their maximum sentence in prison than other types of offenders. The median time served in prison by violent offenders, 50 months, was 46% of the median maximum sentence; the median time

- served by drug offenders, 24 months, was 50% of the median maximum sentence. The median time served by property and public-order offenders was 21 months, 58% of the median sentence.
- Among first releases, the median time served in prison before a discretionary release was 22 months, and before a mandatory release, 25 months (table 7-5).
- Among violent offenders, discretionary releases had served 15 months longer on average than mandatory releases (a median 57 months compared to 42).
 Among other types of Federal offenders entering parole, mandatory releases had served less time in prison than had discretionary releases.




Figure 7-1. First entries to Federal parole supervision: Most serious offense and time served

Discharges from Federal parole

- Among the 10,173 individuals discharged from Federal parole, 77% were successful in leaving supervision, 21% were returned to prison, and 1% died (table 8-1).
- Almost the same percentage of men. and women successfully completed parole (77% and 83%, respectively). A higher percentage of white parole discharges (84%) than black parole discharges (63%) successfully completed parole.
- Among Federal parole discharges, violent offenders were the most likely to be returned to prison (table 8-3). Fortyfour percent of the violent offenders were returned to prison compared to 23% of the property offenders and 14% of the drug and public-order offenders.
- Drug offenders were the largest group discharged from Federal parole (41%) (table 8-4). Property offenders were the second largest at 28%, followed by violent and public-order offenders at 15%.
- Among those successfully discharged from parole, 45% were drug offenders; 28% were property offenders: 16% were public-order offenders; and 10% were violent offenders (table 8-4). Drug trafficking was the largest individual offense group (44%), followed by robbery (8%).
- For those persons unsuccessfully discharged from parole and returned to prison, 31% were violent offenders; 31%

- property offenders; 28% drug offenders; and 10% were public-order offenders. Drug trafficking was the largest individual offense group(27%), followed by robbery (26%) and larceny/theft (11%).
- The median time served on parole for all offenses was 14 months (table 8-5). The median time on parole for violent offenses was 23 months; for property offenses, 14 months; and for drug and public-order offenses, 12 months.
- Among those who successfully completed parole, black and white offenders had the same median time served on parole - 12 months (table 8-6). Among violent offenders the median time on parole was 4 months longer for blacks than for whites. However, among drug and public-order offenders, the medians were 1 month longer for whites.
- · Among parolees returning to prison, blacks and whites had the same median time served on parole - 18 months (table 8-7). Blacks returned to prison after a longer time on parole than whites for a violent offense (medians of 24 months and 17 months, respectively.)
- Successful parole discharges for whom data were reported on both time in prison and on parole served a median of 26 months in prison and 11 months on parole (table 8-8). Unsuccessful parole discharges served a median of 45 months in prison and 17 months on parole.
- Successful parole discharges on average served on total of 51 months under correctional supervision (a mean of 35 months in prison and 16 months on parole), while unsuccessful parole discharges served a total of 82 months.




Figure 8-1. Successful and unsuccessful Federal parole discharges: Maximum sentence length and time served in prison and on parole

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
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
