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DOC FORECAST MONITORING REPORT 1st Quarter, 1992

This report monitors the DOC forecast from December 31, 1990, to March 31, 1992. It describes the total population and the detained (pre-trial), jail (sentences one year and less), and prison (sentences greater than one year) subpopulations.

The tables contain the actual and forecasted admissions and population, the difference, and the difference expressed as a percent of the actual. (Read, "The actual figure was X percent higher (lower) than the forecast figure.")

- 1. TOTAL POPULATION AND ADMISSIONS: Admissions for the first quarter, 1992, were 3,521, or 233 (7.1 %) above the forecasted 3,288. The population at the end of the quarter was 3,969, or 139 (3.6 %) above the forecasted 3,830. There were two crimes in which the combination of admissions and population were outside the normal variation for the "total" forecast. Drug admissions were 139 (34.4%) above forecast, population was 78 (10.5%) above forecast. Violation of probation admissions were 99 (46.9%) above forecast, population was 175 (65.3%) above forecast.
- 2. DETENTION: Admissions for the quarter were 2,218, or 6 (0.3%) higher than the forecasted 2,212. The population at the end of the quarter was 660, or 70 (9.6%) lower than the forecasted 730. The average length of stay (LOS) for the quarter was 29.1 days, or 1.0 percent shorter than the 29.4 day average for the 24 month period 1989 through 1990. There was one crime in which the combination of admissions and population was outside the normal variation for the detained forecast. Capias/contempt admissions were 106 (15.8) above forecast, population was 26 (27.1%) above forecast. Drug admissions were 93 (34.1%) above forecast, the population was 7 (5.1%) below forecast. This indicates that the LOS for drug offenders has gotten shorter.
- 3. JAIL: Admissions for the quarter were 1011, or 160 (18.8%) higher than the forecasted 851. The population at the end of the quarter was 812, or 59 (7.8%) above the forecasted 753. The average sentence length was 120.6 days, down 3.8 percent from the 125.4 day average for

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1989—90. The LOS was 87.2 days, up 8.7 percent from 80.2 days. There was one crime in which the combination of admissions and population was outside the normal variation for the jail forecast. Violation of probation admissions were 81 (66.4%) above forecast, population was 92 (76.7) above forecast.

4. PRISON: Admissions for the quarter were 292, or 67 (29.8%) higher than the forecasted 225. The population at the end of the quarter was 2,497 persons or 150 (6.4%) above the forecasted 2,347. The new sentence length for crimes other than LIFE was 48.0 months, down 11.3 percent from the historic 54.1 months. A reduction of sentences under Truth In Sentencing was expected. The LOS of persons released (again, not considering Lifers) was 27.4 months, down 1.4 percent%, from 27.8 months. This consistency coupled with the average time served indicates pre Truth In Sentencing cases. There were two crimes in which the combination of admissions and population were outside the normal variation for the prison forecast. Violation of probation admissions were 39 (205.3%) above forecast, population was 95 (85.6%) above forecast. Drug admissions were 20 (27.0%) above forecast, population was 81 (15.6%) above forecast.

5. CRIME AND ADMISSIONS: Figure 5 compares reported crime with total DOC admissions. The purpose of this figure is to compare <u>rates of change</u> so a "log scale" is used. The Uniform Crime Report (UCR) definition of <u>violent crime</u> is the total of homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault known to the police. Part 1 crime consists of violent crime plus <u>property crimes</u> (burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson).

It is logical that DOC admissions have a strong correlation with violent crime. But the relationship is not that simple. The admissions are not limited to violent crime; they include large numbers of capias/contempt, DUI, violation of probation, and other non-violent crimes. The relationship with violent crime is that of an indicator of social problems and attitudes that result in admissions to DOC.

Fig 1: Total Population & Admissions Actual and Forecast



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Fig 2: Detained Population & Admissions Actual and Forecast



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Fig 3: Jail Population and Admissions Actual and Forecast



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Fig 4: Prison Population and Admissions Actual and Forecast


