

Dear Colleague:

I am pleased to present for your review and use, Sexual Assaults in Wisconsin 1991. This is the eighth annual report on sexual assaults in the State issued by the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance's Statistical Analysis Center.

Beginning in 1991, the period covered by this report, OJA began collecting sexual assault data in a format consistent with the Incident-Based Crime Reporting (IBR) system being gradually established in the State. As agencies begin electronically reporting crime and arrest data under this new system, the manual reporting of incident-based sexual assault data will no longer be necessary. To facilitate this transition, however, our manual forms were redesigned to parallel the IBR system.

As a result of this transition, some of the types of information presented on sexual assaults in this report are different than those presented in past reports. In particular, the report focuses on the six categories of assaults which are defined by both the national and the Wisconsin IBR systems: forcible rape, forcible sodomy, assault with an object, forcible fondling, incest, and statutory rape. In addition, since many of the characteristics of these assaults are very similar from year to year, we have tried to reduce the "discussion" portions of the report (which are similar each year), and make the report more of a reference document.

I hope this report will be a valuable resource for you. We are interested in hearing about any ways in which this report could be improved, from your point of view, and would appreciate any comments you may have on this report.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY WISCONSIN SEXUAL ASSAULTS: 1991

NUMBER AND NATURE OF SEXUAL ASSAULTS

- In 1991, an estimated 6,852 sexual assaults were reported to law enforcement agencies, representing a 7.6 percent increase over the 1990 estimated total of 6,366.
- Over 74 percent of all sexual assault victims were juveniles. Over 64 percent of all victims were 15 years old or younger.
- The most common type of sexual assault was forcible fondling, which accounted for 55 percent of all reported cases.
- Of all sexual assaults, 29 percent were the most serious types of offenses (forcible rape, forcible sodomy, or assault with an object).
- Eighty-nine percent of all sexual assaults were perpetrated by someone known to the victim, while 11 percent were committed by strangers.
- An offender was arrested in 53 percent of all cases.
- Fifty-five percent of all arrested sexual assault offenders were referred to criminal court.
- Sexual assaults occurred more frequently in the summer months: August, July, and June.
- Fifty-seven percent of assaults took place in either the victim's or offender's home.
- Ninety-six percent of assaults were committed by single offenders.

VICTIM CHARACTERISTICS

- The average age of sexual assault victims was 16, the median, or middle, age was 14.
- Seventy-four percent of all victims were juveniles.
- Sexual assault victims were primarily women (88 percent) and primarily white (83 percent).
- Five percent of victims had serious injuries, another five percent received minor injuries.

OFFENDER CHARACTERISTICS

- The average age of a sexual assault offender was 22, six years older than the victim; the median, or middle, age was 19.
- Ninety-six percent of all offenders were male.
- Offender race was White in 71 percent of assaults; 27 percent involved Black offenders.
- A dangerous weapon was used in five percent of the reported cases, 10 percent used personal weapons, and 82 percent used no weapon.

MULTIPLE OFFENDERS

- Four percent of sexual assaults involved multiple offenders.
- The typical number of multiple offenders in a sexual assault was two. The highest number of offenders was seven, in a forcible rape case.
- The majority of multiple offender cases were forcible fondling offenses (51 percent).
- Five percent of multiple offender victims sustained a major injury.
- Seven percent of offenders used a dangerous weapon.

FORCIBLE RAPE

- Twenty-two percent of all offenses were forcible rapes.
- The average victim age was 21, with the median 19. This is considerably higher than the average age of 16 for all sexual assaults, and the median of 14.
- The average offender age was 26, with a median of 24. This is also much higher than the average offender age of 22 for all assaults, and the median of 19.
- Victims sustained major injuries in 12 percent of the cases reported to law enforcement.
- Offenders were referred to criminal court in 74 percent of the cases.

FORCIBLE SODOMY

- Five percent of all offenses were reported as forcible sodomy.
- The average victim age was 13, with the median being 11.
- The average offender age was 26, with a median of 20.
- Fifty percent of forcible sodomy offenders were referred to criminal court.

ASSAULT WITH AN OBJECT

- Two percent of the cases reported were assaults with an object.
- The average victim age was 13, with the median being 9. This is considerably lower than the average age of 16 for all sexual assaults, and the median of 14.
- The average offender age was 27, with a median of 23. This is also much higher than the overall average of 22, and median of 19.
- Fifty-eight percent of offenders were referred to criminal court.

STATUTORY RAPE

- Fifteen percent of all sexual assault offenses were statutory rape.
- The average victim age as well as the median was 14; and the average offender age was 20, with a median of 18.
- Statutory rape offenders were arrested in 62 percent of the cases.
- Fifty-five percent of arrested offenders were referred to criminal court.

INCEST

- Nearly two percent of reported sexual assaults were incest.
- The average and median victim age was 10.
- The average offender age was 29; the median was 30.
- In 40 percent of the cases, the victim was the child of the offender.
- In forty percent of cases reported, the offender was arrested.

FORCIBLE FONDLING

- Fifty-five percent of sexual assaults were cases of forcible fondling.
- The average victim age was 15, with the median being 13. These numbers are close to the sexual assault average of 16 and median of 14.
- The average offender age was 26, with a median of 21.
- An adult committed fifty-one percent of forcible fondlings in cases in which the victim's age was under 12.
- Forty-eight percent of forcible fondlings were referred to criminal court.

INTRODUCTION

This report presents data on sexual assaults reported to law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin during 1991. Data were collected by the Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), a program of the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA), as a part of the state Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program.

Data on sexual assaults have been collected by SAC as part of the UCR program since January 1, 1984. Unlike most other UCR data, which are collected as aggregate statistics (monthly totals), sexual assault data are collected on a case-by-case basis. These data are collected to provide information about sexual assaults as defined by Wisconsin Statutes. For many years, the UCR program has collected data on "forcible rape," defined by the UCR program as "the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will." Sexual assault in Wisconsin is defined in sections 940.225 and 948.02 of the State Statutes. The statutes define four degrees of assaultive "sexual contact or sexual intercourse" between persons of either sex. This definition is considerably broader than the UCR definition of forcible rape. A copy of the sexual assault statutory language is found in **Appendix A** of this report.

This report will focus on six sexual assault offense types defined by both the national and Wisconsin Incident-Based Reporting Systems (IBRS). These are: Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, Assault With an Object, Forcible Fondling, Incest, and Statutory Rape. A copy of this data collection form is found in **Appendix B** of this report. The 1991 sexual assault statistics presented in this report are usually grouped into the offense categories listed above. They are occasionally grouped on the basis of Wisconsin sexual assault degrees; however, the statutory degree of an assault can be based on factors other than the type of assault. In particular, the age of the victim is a determining factor. For example, if the victim is 12 years old or younger, regardless whether there was sexual contact or intercourse, the assault would be a first degree sexual assault based on the victim's age.

DATA COLLECTION AND INTERPRETATION

The assaults described and analyzed in this report are those reported to law enforcement agencies during 1991. The data are submitted to SAC as part of the monthly UCR report of law enforcement agencies. Data are collected on the Wisconsin Sexual Assault Form, which is reproduced in **Appendix B.** As with any sensitive crime, actual reports of offenses to law enforcement agencies may not be totally representative of all assaults committed. Assaults not reported to law enforcement agencies cannot be addressed in this report, even though they may be reported to other agencies such as social services or medical agencies.

The unit of analysis in this report is the assault or offense, which is usually defined as involving one victim; that is, for any given incident, one assault is counted for each victim. The one instance in which several assault incidents are counted as one assault is the case of serial assault. For this report, a series of assaults on one person which constitute one "clear and distinct criminal operation" is counted as one offense. One example of a serial sexual assault is an intrafamilial assault situation in which incidents take place over a long period of time. This is counted as one (serial) assault.

The data in this report focus on all reported cases, in most cases regardless of the eventual disposition of the cases by the law enforcement agency or the court. Although this report does separate cases which law enforcement agencies report to be unfounded, the factual accuracy of these reported assaults and the circumstances surrounding them have, in a legal sense, not been substantiated. Unfounded cases are examined as a group in this report, assessing characteristics similar to those examined for founded cases.

TYPES OF SEXUAL ASSAULTS

Sexual assault, as defined by Wisconsin Statutes, encompasses a wide range of seriousness, from violent rapes to less injurious sexual contacts. The seriousness of an assault is, of course, related to a number of factors such as the extent of the victim's trauma, injuries, and so forth; but these are not always easily measured. Fortunately, the seriousness of the assaults are also defined, to some degree, by the six offense categories utilized in the Uniform Crime Reporting - Incident-Based system, as defined below:

Forcible Rape: Vaginal intercourse with a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will, or where the victim was incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Forcible Sodomy: Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly nor against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.

Sexual Assault With An Object: To use an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, forcibly and/or against the person's will; or, not forcibly nor against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. Note: An "object" or "instrument" is anything used by the offender other than the offender's genitalia. Examples include a finger, bottle, handgun, stick, etc.

Forcible Fondling: The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification or victim humiliation, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or, not forcibly nor against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental/physical incapacity.

Note: Forcible Fondling includes "Indecent Liberties" and "Child Molesting." Although "force" may not have been used, offenses may fall into this category because the victim was incapable of giving consent, or did not give consent.

Incest: Unlawful, nonforcible, sexual relationship between parties related too close to marry.

Statutory rape: Nonforcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent; under age 16 in Wisconsin.

NUMBER AND NATURE OF SEXUAL ASSAULTS

Table 1 and Graph 1, and other data in this section provide basic information on <u>all 1991 sexual</u> <u>assaults</u>. Table 1 shows assaults by category of assault and statutory sexual assault degree. Graph 1 shows the relative volume of cases of each of the types of sexual assaults. Note that these data displays, and all those that follow, except Tables 6 and 7, present <u>actual</u> reported data, excluding the small number of estimated missing cases that have been added to the state total and relevant county totals in order to estimate the universe of cases.


The six UCR-IBR categories of sexual assault defined in the previous section provide a measurable and somewhat objective means of categorizing sexual assaults by seriousness. The best objective measure of the seriousness of a sexual assault may be whether or not it involved penetration, of a body orifice, with either genitalia or an object, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against that persons will when the victim is incapable of giving consent. The most physically injurious offenses (forcible rape, forcible sodomy, and assault with an object) all encompass these characteristics and will be examined as one group later in this report. The other, less serious offenses will be examined as a separate group.

Sexual Assault Victim Characteristics

- The average age of a sexual assault victim was 16, the median, or middle age was 14.
- Seventy-four percent of all victims were juveniles.
- Eighty-eight percent of victims were women.
- Sexual assault victims were primarily White, in 83 percent of cases, victims were Black in 16 percent of cases.
- Five percent of victims sustained some type of major injury, another five percent received minor injuries.

Sexual Assault Offender Characteristics

- The average offender age was typically six to eight years older than the victim. The average offender average was 22, the median was 19.
- Ninety-six percent of all sexual assault offenders were male.
- Offender race was primarily White, in 71 percent of cases.
- Ninety-six percent of all assaults were perpetrated by a single offender.
- A dangerous weapon was used in five percent of the reported cases, personal weapons were used in 10 percent of cases, and 82 percent used no weapon.

Relationship and Arrest Outcome

- Eighty-nine percent of all sexual assaults were committed by someone known to the victim.
- Sexual assault offenders were arrested in 53 percent of the cases reported to the law enforcement.
- Of those offenders arrested, 55 percent were referred to criminal court proceedings, and 27 percent were referred to juvenile court.





Graph 3 depicts the number of sexual assaults by month. While sexual assaults occur frequently in all months, there was an increase in volume during the summer months.

Multiple Offenders

- Four percent of all sexual assaults involved multiple offenders.
- The typical number of multiple offenders was two. The highest number of offenders was seven.
- Five percent of multiple offender assault victims sustained a major injury.
- Seven percent of multiple offender assaults involved a dangerous weapon.
- Fifty-one percent of multiple offender assaults involved forcible fondlings.

As explained in Data Collection and Interpretation, an assault is usually defined as involving one victim. When multiple victims are involved, one assault is recorded for each victim, however a single assault may involve multiple offenders. The numbers of sexual assaults with single and multiple offenders are shown below. (Multiple offender sexual assaults do not necessarily involve the same assault activity by all offenders.) The table shows that 96 percent of sexual assaults involved single offenders and four percent involved multiple offenders.

MOST SERIOUS SEXUAL ASSAULTS

Forcible Rape

• Twenty-two percent of all offenses were forcible rapes.

• The average victim age was 21, with the median 19. This is considerably higher than the average age of 16 for all sexual assaults, and the median of 14.

• The average offender age was 26, with a median of 24. This is also much higher than the average offender age of 22 for all assaults, and the median of 19.

• Victims sustained major injuries in 12 percent of the cases reported to law enforcement.

Offenders were referred to criminal court in 74 percent of the cases.

Forcible Sodomy

- Five percent of all offenses were reported as forcible sodomy.
- The average victim age was 13, with the median being 11.

• The average offender age was 26, with a median of 20.

· Fifty percent of forcible sodomy offenders were referred to criminal court.

Assault with an Object

• Two percent of the cases reported were assaults with an object.

• The average victim age was 13, with the median being 9. This is considerably lower than the average age of 16 for all sexual assaults, and the median of 14.

• The average offender age was 27, with a median of 23. This is also much higher than the overall average of 22, and median of 19.

• Fifty-eight percent of offenders were referred to criminal court.

Graph 4 and the charts on the following three pages present basic information on the three most serious sexual assaults: forcible rape, forcible sodomy, and assault with an object.

Relationship of Assailant to Victim Serious Offenses



LESS SERIOUS SEXUAL ASSAULTS

Statutory Rape

- Fifteen percent of all offenses were statutory rapes ("consensual" intercourse with an underage victim).
- The average victim age as well as the median was 14. The average offender age was 20, with the a median of 18.
- Ninety percent of victims were women.
- Statutory rape offenders were arrested in 62 percent of the cases; .
- Fifty-five percent of all arrested statutory rape offenders were referred to criminal court.

Incest

- Incest was the least frequently reported of all sexual assault offenses, totalling 1.8 percent of all assaults.
- The average incest victim age, and the median, was 10; this age was drastically less than the average victim age of 16 and the median of 14 for all sexual assaults.
- The average offender age was 29, and the median 30; both of these were significantly higher than average of 22 for all sexual assaults, and median 19.
- In 40 percent of the cases the victim was the child of the offender.
- Five percent of all sexual assaults reported showed the victim/offender relationship as being family. These offenses were not coded as incest due to their violent nature, and the victim's unwillingness to participate. Instead, they were coded as forcible rape, sodomy, or assault with an object.


Forcible Fondling

- Forcible fondlings comprised the greatest number of reported sexual assault offenses, 55 percent.
- The average victim age in forcible fondling assaults was 15, the median was 13.
- Juveniles comprised 78 percent of the forcible fondling victims.
- The average offender age of 26 was considerably older than the average victim age. The offender median age was 21.
- In eighty-six percent of fondling cases, the victim was female.
- Victim race was White in 83 percent of the cases.
- Offender race was White in 74 percent of the cases, Blacks were the reported offender in 24 percent of cases.
- Forcible fondling victims rarely sustained physical injury. An injury was reported in 5 percent of the cases.
- In eighty-nine percent of the cases the victim knew the offender.
- Fifty-two percent of all forcible fondling offenders were arrested.
- Of those offenders arrested, 48 percent were referred to criminal court proceedings and 31 percent were referred to juvenile court.


Graphs 5 and 6 show additional information regarding forcible fondling offenses. Graph 5 shows the victim-offender relationship for these cases and Graph 6 shows the general relationship to victim age. While forcible fondling incidences clearly decrease with increasing victim age, it should be noted that the age categories portrayed in the Graph are not of equal range.

TRENDS IN REPORTED SEXUAL ASSAULTS

There was a 23.6 percent increase in the estimated number of sexual assaults in Wisconsin between 1986 and 1991. During the past six years the State experienced first a marginal decline and then a notable increase in reported sexual assaults. Since the drastic increase in 1989, reported sexual assaults have been increasing, but they have been doing so at a decreasing rate.

Yearly Sexual Assault Trends



UNFOUNDED SEXUAL ASSAULTS

Data that have been collected on unfounded sexual assaults appear to be similar to other assaults that are reported to law enforcement agencies. Since we are not certain that all law enforcement agencies are reporting these offenses correctly to OJA, it remains unclear whether the data reported are representative of all unfounded cases reported to law enforcement.

An <u>unfounded</u> case as defined by UCR is "a complaint which is determined through investigation to be false or baseless." The refusal of a victim to cooperate with prosecution, or the failure to make an arrest does not unfound a legitimate offense. The data provided to OJA show the following characteristics:

- In 1991, there were 701 sexual assaults reported to law enforcement agencies which the agencies determined to be unfounded. Unfounded cases accounted for 9.3 percent of the total cases reported to law enforcement agencies.
- Thirteen percent of forcible rapes were unfounded.
- Six percent of forcible sodomies were unfounded.
- Eight percent of assaults with an object were unfounded.
- Eight percent of forcible fondlings were unfounded.
- Seventeen percent of incest cases were unfounded.
- Five percent of statutory rapes were unfounded.
- Nearly 71 percent of victims were juveniles in unfounded cases. Sixty percent of the victims were 15 years old or younger in unfounded cases.
- Women reported 86 percent of unfounded sexual assaults.
- Seventy-seven percent of victims were White, 22 percent were Black.
- Victims claimed a major injury in four percent of the unfounded cases.
- In 76 percent of the cases the offender was an adult.
- Ninety-four percent of unfounded cases were reported to involve male offenders.
- Offender race was identified as White in 87 percent, and Black in 11 percent of unfounded cases.
- Seven percent of these offenders were reported to have used a dangerous weapon.
- As with founded sexual assaults the overwhelming majority of unfounded cases were alleged to be single offender attacks.
- The victim claimed to know the offender in 80 percent of the unfounded cases.
- The locations of the unfounded assaults were similar to founded assaults, predominantly victim's residence, offender's residence, other residence, and offender's vehicle.

SEXUAL ASSAULTS BY JURISDICTION

Sexual assault data are submitted monthly by law enforcement agencies, along with other Uniform Crime Reports for that month. If there are no assaults to report, a zero report is indicated on the cover sheet. This procedure allows missing data to be estimated for specific jurisdictions, and hence for county and state totals.

Table 7 on the following pages shows the total number of sexual assaults reported by or estimated for each reporting jurisdiction for 1991, and for comparison, 1990. County and state totals are summed from these figures. Jurisdictions which reported zero sexual assaults or were estimated to have zero sexual assaults are not shown in the table.

When required, estimates were derived by the following method: For jurisdictions with at least six months of data present, an estimate total was derived by prorating from the existing data. That is, the existing data were multiplied by the quotient obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months of data present. For jurisdictions with less than six months of data present, the estimate was simply the number of sexual assaults reported or estimated for the previous year. Estimated data are indicated by the term "EST" after the jurisdiction name. Only the jurisdiction and county totals were affected by the estimation, and in all cases for 1991, only very slightly. The estimation process added eight cases to the statewide total. The subtotals of offense type categories are actual reported data and, for those jurisdictions with estimated totals, these totals are not the sum of the subtotals.

It should also be noted that the jurisdiction data of Table 7 do not include 102 cases which were missing the offense type information. This is noted in the State Totals at the bottom of the Table. There were an <u>estimated</u> 6,852 sexual assaults in 1991, a 7.6 percent increase over the 1990 estimated total of 6,366.

Appendix A

940.225 SEXUAL ASSAULT

- (1) First Degree Sexual Assault. Whoever does any of the following is guilty of a Class B felony:
 - (a) Has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person and causes pregnancy or great bodily harm to that person.
 - (b) Has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person by use or threat of use of a dangerous weapon or any article used of fashioned in a manner to lead the victim reasonably to believe it to be a dangerous weapon.

(c) Is aided or abetted by one or more other persons and has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person by use or

threat of force or violence.

- (2) Second Degree Sexual Assault. Whoever does any of the following is guilty of a Class C felony:
 - (a) Has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person by use or threat of force or violence.
 - (b) Has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person and causes injury, illness, disease or impairment of a sexual or reproductive organ, or mental anguish requiring psychiatric care for the victim.
 - (c) Has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with a person who suffers from a mental illness or deficiency which renders that person temporarily or permanently incapable or appraising the person's conduct, and the defendant knows of such condition.
 - (d) Has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with a person who the defendant knows is unconscious.
 - (f) Is aided or abetted by one or more other persons and has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without the consent of that person.
- (3) Third Degree Sexual Assault. Whoever has sexual intercourse with a person without the consent of that person is guilty of a Class D felony.
- (3m) Fourth Degree Sexual Assault. Whoever has sexual contact with a person without the consent of that person is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
- (4) Consent. "Consent," as used in this section, means words or overt actions by a person who is competent to give informed consent indicating a freely given agreement to have sexual intercourse or sexual contact. Consent is not an issue in alleged violations of sub (1)(d) and (2)(c), (d), and (e). The following persons are presumed incapable of consent but the presumption may be rebutted by competent evidence, subject to the provisions of s. 972.11(2).
 - (b) A person suffering from a mental illness or defect which impairs capacity to appraise personal conduct.
 - (c) A person who is unconscious or for any other reason is physically unable to communicate unwillingness to an act.

(5) Definitions. In this section:

- (a) "Sexual contact" means any intentional touching by the complainant or defendant, either directly or through clothing by the use of any body part or object, of the complainant's or defendant's intimate parts if that intentional touching is either for the purpose of sexually degrading; or for the purpose of sexual humiliating the complainant or sexually arousing or gratifying the defendant or if the touching contains the elements of actual or attempted battery under s. 940.10(1).
- (b) "Sexual intercourse" includes the meaning assigned under s.939.22(36) as well a cunnilingus, fellatio or anal intercourse between persons or any other intrusion, however slight, of any part of a person's body or of any object into the genital or any opening either by the defendant or upon the defendant's instruction. The emission of semen is not required.
- (6) Marriage Not a Bar to Prosecution. A defendant shall not be presumed to be incapable of violating this section because of marriage to the complainant.

948.02 SEXUAL ASSAULT OF A CHILD

- (1) First Degree Sexual Assault. Whoever has sexual contact or sexual intercoure with a person who has not attained the age of 13 years is guilty of a Class B felony.
- (2) Second Degree Sexual Assault. Whoever has sexual contact or sexual intercourse with a person who has not attained the age of 16 years is guilty of a Class C felony.
