

CHARACTERISTICS OF INMATES DISCHARGED

1991

This report presents information on the characteristics of inmates released from the facilities of the New York State Department of Correctional Services during calendar year 1991. Length of time in custody is presented according to various legal history criteria such as commitment offense, felony class category of commitment offense, minimum sentence length and maximum sentence length. In addition, several tables show trends in length of stay across the years 1987 through 1991. The report is preceded by a summary of the main findings.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Number of Releases

There were 26,905 total releases from the facilities of the Department of Correctional Services during 1991. Of these, 18,403 were inmates released to parole supervision for the first time on the current sentence (see Table 1.1, p. 2, and Table 2.1, p. 5).

Commitment Crime

Of the 18,403 first releases to parole supervision in 1991, 31% (N=5,749) were committed for legislatively designated violent felony offenses, 5% (N=986) for other violent/coercive offenses, 45% (N=8,287) for drug offenses, 16% (N=2,969) for property and other types of offenses, and 2% (N=412) as Youthful Offenders (see Table 2.1, p. 5).

Time Served in State Correctional Facility

The average time served in New York State correctional facilities for the 18,403 first releases to parole supervision was 23.9 months. The median state time served was 18.1 months (see Table 2.2,p. 6).

Total Time in Custody (State Time Plus Jail Time)

The average total time served in custody (i.e. state prison time plus jail time in local facilities) for the 18,403 first releases to parole supervision in 1991 was 29.4 months. The median total time served was 23.9 months (see Table 2.2, p. 6).

Time Served for 1st and 2nd Felony Offenders

The average total time served in custody for a first felony offender was 25.6 months (median 18.0 months). The average total time served in custody for persons sentenced as a second felony offender was 33.2 months (median 24.5 months) (see Table 2.3, p. 9).

Time Served Trend 1987 to 1991

The average total time served in custody (state time + jail time) for first releases to parole supervision dropped from 33.4 months among first releases in 1987 to 27.9 months among first releases in 1990 but increased to 29.4 months among first releases in 1991 (see Table 2.9, p. 17, Table 7.1 p. 49). The average time served in state prison only (i.e., jail time is not included) dropped from 27.7 months in 1987 to 22.7 months in 1990 but increased to 23.9 months in 1991 (see Table 7.2, p. 51).

CHARACTERISTICS OF INMATES DISCHARGED

1991

This report is one of a series of reports designed to provide relevant information about persons committed to the custody of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. This report presents information on the characteristics of inmates discharged from the custody of the Department of Correctional Services during calendar year 1991. Our principle objective is to examine the length of time served in custody according to various legal history criteria such as commitment offense, felony class category of commitment offense, minimum sentence length and maximum sentence length. For comparative purposes, we have also included data on time served for persons released in earlier years.

The information in this report is based on data files that are developed and maintained by the Division of Management Information Services and by the Division of Program Planning, Research and Evaluation.

Section 1

TYPE OF RELEASE

During any calendar year a large number of persons are released from the custody of the Department of Correctional Services. These releases occur for several reasons. Table 1.1, below, presents the release type distribution for male and female offenders released from the Department of Correctional Services during 1991. In all, there were 26,905 persons released from custody during calendar year 1991.

The largest group of releases in 1991 were persons released to parole supervision by action of the Board of Parole. Inmates who have served their minimum period of imprisonment and have not yet reached their conditional release date are eligible for release consideration by the Board of Parole. Releases to parole supervision made up 72% (N=19,395) of 1991 releases.

Approximately 13% (N=3,365) of 1991 releases consist of persons released to parole supervision by Conditional Release. If an inmate has served two-thirds of his maximum sentence he is required by law to be released to parole supervision as a conditional release. Approximately 3% (N=777) of persons released during 1991 were discharged via expiration of maximum sentence. Each year DOCS received a number of persons who are returned to prison for violation of parole. The large majority of those who are released by expiration of maximum sentence are persons who have been returned to prison for violation of parole and who subsequently serve time until the maximum expiration date is reached.

Each year a number of persons are transferred to the custody of the Department of Mental Hygiene in order to receive mental health care services. Three percent of 1991 releases (N=889) were persons who were transferred to the Department of Mental Hygiene. There were 171 persons discharged from DOCS custody by court order. These are cases where the individual is discharged from custody while further court proceedings take place (i.e. an appeal, new trial), or is discharged as a result of court proceedings in which the individual is found guilty of a lesser charge for which he may already have served the length of time legally required, or discharged because the original charge is dismissed. During 1991, 11 persons escaped from Department custody. There were 1,715 people (6% of all releases) who absconded from the Temporary Release Program. Absconders are participants in the Department's work release program who fail to return to a correctional facility by a specified date and time. There were 226 inmates (1% of total releases) discharged as absent without leave (AWOL) from the Temporary Release Program and these are people who were arrested for an offense while out in the community on work release. Three hundred and eighteen inmates (1% of total releases) died while in custody during 1991. Thirty-eight inmates were discharged for other reasons.

The release type distribution for males and females is also presented in Table 1.1.

First Releases to Parole Supervision

Information in the sections that follow is confined to the 18,403 inmates who were released to parole supervision (by action of the Board of Parole or by Conditional Release) for the <u>first</u> time on the current sentence. Persons who were returned as parole violators and subsequently re-released to parole supervision during 1991, or, parole violators who served out the maximum sentence and were released in 1991, are excluded. Persons who were transferred to other agencies, released by court order, escaped or absconded, or died while in custody are also excluded. The analysis is restricted to first releases to parole supervision in order to more clearly present the relationship between time served in state prison and such legal criteria as crime type, sentence length and first or second felony offender status.

Section 2

TIME SERVED BY COMMITMENT OFFENSE

Offense Distribution of 1991 Releases

The commitment offense distribution of first releases to parole supervision in 1991 is presented in Table 2.1. Offenses are grouped into larger categories in this and several other tables. The full range of releases by commitment offense is presented in Table 2.11 beginning on page 20.

The first category in Table 2.1 is made up of legislatively designated violent felony offenses. In 1978 the New York State Legislature identified certain offenses as violent felonies. The Legislature provided for more severe sentences and additional regulation on plea negotiation for persons indicted or convicted of these crimes (see NYS Penal Law Section 70.02). Briefly, 31% (N=5,749) of 1991 first releases were persons convicted of violent felony offenses. Another 5% (N=986) were offenders who had committed crimes involving violence or coercion but which were not offenses designated by the legislature as violent felonies. Approximately 45% (N=8,287) of first releases were drug offenders. Sixteen percent (N=2,969) were convicted of property offenses or other types of offenses. Two percent of 1991 first releases were Youthful Offenders.

There are differences in commitment offense according to gender. Thirty-three percent of males released in 1991 were convicted of violent felony offenses and 43% for drug offenses. In sharp contrast, fully 70% of females released in 1991 had been convicted of drug offenses and only 15% for violent felony offenses.

Time Served by Offense Type

The average "state time served" by first releases to parole supervision in 1991 was 23.9 months (see Table 2.2). The median state time served was 18.1 months.

¹State time is defined as the period between date of admission to the Department of Correctional Services and date of release.

²The median is a measure of central tendency which represents the value of the middle case (i.e. the case or cases at the 50th percentile) in the distribution of cases. The median is less subject to the influence of extreme values than is the arithmetic average and is preferred by some users for this reason. Both statistics are presented for the crime categories in Table 2.2.

"Total time served" refers to the total period of time incarcerated and it is composed of time served in a state correctional facility <u>plus</u> time served in a local jail³ prior to commitment to state prison. The average total time served in custody for persons released to parole supervision in 1991 was 29.4 months (see Table 2.2). The median is 23.9 months. Average jail time for 1991 releases was 5.5 months which accounts for the differences between average state time served (23.9 months) and average total time served (29.4 months).

The median total time served for the total group of first releases (23.9 months) is considerably lower than the average total time served (29.4 months). This occurs because annual release cohorts, like an annual admission cohort, are made up largely of persons with relatively short minimum sentences. The average time served, in comparison with the median, is pulled upward by that segment of the total release cohort which is made up of persons convicted of more serious offenses that have comparatively long minimum sentences and who consequently serve a longer period in custody.

There are differences in average time served according to type of offense. For the group of persons convicted of violent felony offenses the average total time served was 42.4 months (see Table 2.2). Persons committed for other coercive offenses served an average of 26.7 months and drug offenders served an average of 24.2 months. The total time served for persons committed for property offenses or other types of felonies was 21.5 months. As might be expected, persons committed for violent felony crimes served longer periods of time on average than did persons committed for property, drug, and other types of offenses.

³In general, persons receive credit toward the service of the state prison sentence for any time spent in jail prior to commitment to state prison. Persons may be confined in jail prior to and during court proceedings if bail is not awarded. Or, a person may accumulate jail time between conviction date and commitment to state prison. Jail time of this type results from the time interval required for probation authorities to complete a pre-sentence investigation.

Time Served by Offense Type and by First or Second Felony Offender Status

People previously convicted of a felony offense generally face more severe penalties than persons convicted for the first time on a felony charge (see Article 70, Sentences of Imprisonment, New York State Penal Law). The average and median total time served for persons sentenced as a first felony offender and the average and median time served for people sentenced ⁴ as a second felony offender is reflected in Table 2.3.

Among first felony offenders released in 1991 the average total time served was 25.6 months (see Table 2.3). Among second felony offenders the average was 33.2 months.

Persons sentenced as a second felony offender and who had been convicted of a violent felony offense served on average 52.1 months in state prison compared with 35.0 months among first felony offenders convicted of a violent felony offense (see Table 2.3). Among people convicted of property offenses, those sentenced as a second felony offender served an average of 23.8 months in state prison compared with first felony offenders who served 17.4 months in state prison. Second felony drug offenders served 27.0 months on average; those sentenced as a first felony offender served 21.2 months on average.

Average and median state time served (i.e. state time only) according to offense type and first or second felony offender status is presented in Table 2.4.5

⁴To be sentenced as a second felony offender the instant offense had to have been committed within 10 years of the date of the prior conviction (excluding any time the defendant was incarcerated as a result of the prior conviction). The prior conviction must be an offense for which the person could have received a sentence to state prison. The instant offense is listed in Table 2.3, the prior offense may or may not be the same as the instant offense. Those releases identified as second felony offenders are persons who were <u>sentenced</u> by the court as a second (or predicate) felony offender. A small percentage (less than 1%) of commitments to state prison are sentenced as persistent (third time) felony offenders and these cases are included in the second felony group. Also, a portion of those inmates placed in the first felony category have previous convictions for felony crimes and some have previous sentences to state prison. This occurs because the statutes for certain A-Felony crimes (e.g. several types of drug offenses) do not (or previously did not) contain provisions for sentencing as a second felony offender. Also, certain defendants may have served a prior state prison term as a Youthful Offender; this status does not require that the defendant be sentenced under second felony offender statutes.

⁵Data in Table 2.4 are presented in the same format as Table 2.3. The trends in time served observed in Table 2.4 are similar to those observed in Table 2.3 with the exception that figures on average time served are four to six months shorter due to the exclusion of jail time in calculating the time served data. For those users interested in the total period for which a person is incarcerated for a particular offense the figures on total time served in Table 2.3 will be most useful. Those users interested in state time only have that data available in Table 2.4.

Time Served by Violent Felony Offender Status

In September of 1978 the New York State Legislature designated certain crimes as violent felony offenses. On the whole, persons committed for these designated violent felony offenses serve more time than do persons committed for other felony offenses. Looking, for example, at burglary offenses, the information in Table 2.3 indicates that the average total time served for Burglary 1st (60.2 months) and Burglary 2nd (36.3 months), both designated violent felony offenses, is longer than the average total time served for those committed for Burglary 3rd (22.5 months). Similarly, persons convicted of Manslaughter 1st (a designated violent felony offense) and released during 1991 served an average of 80.9 months, persons convicted of Manslaughter 2nd served an average of 49.5 months. Of course, much of the difference in time served for these offenses is accounted for by differences in felony class category of offense (e.g. Burglary 1st is a Class B violent felony, Burglary 3rd is a Class D non-violent felony). However, Table 3.3 (p. 27) in the next section shows that even where the felony class category of conviction offense is the same and 1st or 2nd felony offender status is controlled, persons convicted of designated violent felonies serve longer periods of incarceration than do persons convicted of non-violent offenses, consistent with legislative intent.

Time Served by Specific Crime

While the time served figures in Tables 2.3 and 2.4 provide a general idea of how long persons serve in custody for various types of offenses they do not reflect time served figures that are based on unique sentencing categories. In these tables the offense categories group attempts of each crime along with completed crimes and attempts of any offense generally fall into the next lower felony class category (where the penalties would be less severe). Also, several categories in these tables aggregate a large range of crimes regardless of degree or felony class (e.g. all drug offenses are grouped, all weapons offenses are grouped). Accordingly, Table 2.11 below presents time served data on specific commitment offenses (i.e. attempts of each crime are shown separately). In addition, Tables 3.3, 3.4 and 3.5 below present time served data by felony class category, violent or non-violent felony offender status, and felony class category which, when taken together, more closely conform to legally distinct sentencing categories.

Number and Percent Distribution According to Time Served

The numerical distribution of 1991 releases across a range of total time served categories is presented in Table 2.5. The percent distribution across time served categories is presented in Table 2.6.

The distribution of 1991 first releases to parole supervision across categories of state time served only is presented in Table 2.7 and the percent distribution in Table 2.8.

In Table 2.5 that there are three cases where individuals had been committed for murder and served less than the minimum time served (180 months). These are Juvenile Offenders who receive a minimum term that is less than that for adults (e.g. five years). Further, Juvenile Offenders often serve a portion of the sentence in the custody of the Division For Youth prior to transfer (at age 21) to the Department of Correctional Services. Hence, the relatively short period of time served in New York State adult correctional facilities.

Trends in Time Served by Offense Over the Period 1987-1991

The average time served for the total group of first releases to parole supervision declines dramatically from 33.4 months in 1987 to 27.9 months in 1990 but increases to 29.4 months in 1991. As discussed more fully below, the dramatic declines were due to (1) changes in the composition of the release population according to crime type, and (2) declines in average time served in certain offense categories which are, in part, the result of new programs initiated by the Department such as the Earned Eligibility Program and the Shock Incarceration Program⁶.

The average time served for violent felony offenders is relatively scable over the five year period at approximately 42 months. Average time served for violent felons dipped slightly among 1990 releases (average 40.4 months) but returns to the 42 month level among 1991 releases (average 42.4 months) (see Table 2.9).

Average time served for other coercive offenders over the five year period is 26.5 months (see total column in Table 2.9) and figures for each year fluctuate somewhat around this 26.5 average. Average time served for drug offenders, property offenders and Youthful Offenders declines over the years 1987 to 1990 and for drug offenders and Youthful Offenders there is an increase in average time served between 1990 and 1991.

Part of the overall decline in average time served between those released in 1987 (average time served 33.4 months) and these released in 1991 (average time served 29.4 months) is due to a higher concentration of non-violent felony offenders among 1991 releases compared with 1987 releases. In 1987 52% of releases were committed for violent felony offenses but

⁶The Earned Eligibility Program provides for the release of inmates at their parole eligibility date if they satisfactorily complete certain prescribed programs (see "Earned Eligibility Program Summary 1991 Calendar Year", New York State Department of Correctional Services, 1992). The Shock Incarceration Program permits early release to parole supervision for inmates successfully completing a six month program of intensive physical training, counseling and drug treatment (see "The Fourth Annual Report to the Legislature: Shock Incarceration in New York State", New York State Department of Correctional Services, January 1992).

only 31% of releases in 1991 were violent felons. The largest increase has been among drug offenders who made up 20% of releases in 1987 but made up 45% of releases in 1991. Since non-violent felons generally have shorter sentences than do violent felons the greater concentration of drug offenders tends to pull the average time served for the total release cohort downward.

Trends in Time Served by Specific Offense Over the Period 1987-1991

The Department receives requests in regard to time served of persons who commit certain types of offenses. There is also interest in changes over time in the length of time served for certain types of offenses.

Information on total time served (that is, the length of service in state prison plus any jail time accumulated prior to commitment to state prison) according to specific commitment offenses is presented in Table 2.11 (the Penal Law Section number for the crimes listed in Table 2.11 can be found in Appendix E). For each specific offense category time served is presented for persons released in each year 1987 through 1991. The "total" columns at the right hand side of the table contain the total number of persons released from DOCS over the period 1987 through 1991 in each offense category as well as the average total time served. The number of cases released in any one year for a particular offense may be quite small. By grouping all releases over a five year period a larger number of cases is obtained and a more reliable figure for average time served is possible.⁷

Not only does Table 2.11 present information on each specific offense category, it also presents time served information for persons who have been committed for "attempts" of each crime type. As noted earlier, attempts of any particular offense fall into the next lower felony class category and persons would ordinarily receive a less severe sentence. Since attempts fall into a lower felony class category we would expect that they would serve less time in prison than is the case for persons convicted of the specific offense (e.g. those convicted of Robbery 1st as opposed to Attempted Robbery 1st). The commitment offense categories in Table 2.11 still do not contain persons in legally distinct sentencing categories. That is, those convicted of each offense and who are second felony offenders are mixed with first felony offenders. Persons sentenced as a second felony offender generally receive a sentence that is more severe than that for a first felony offender. Accordingly, Appendix B presents time served data according to specific offense type for persons sentenced to prison as a first felony offender (or, more accurately, for persons who were not sentenced to state prison as a second or Persistent Felony Offender.

Section 3

FELONY CLASS CATEGORY OF 1991 RELEASES

Distribution of 1991 First Releases by Felony Class Category

Felony crimes are classified into one of several felony class categories: Class A-I, A-II, B, C, D, and E. In general, more serious offenses are categorized as Class A, Class B, or Class C felonies and the less serious offenses are categorized as Class D or Class E felonies. There are, of course, still less serious offenses that are treated as misdemeanors or violations, but only those convicted of a felony can be committed to state prison.

Most of those released in 1991 had been committed for Class B (19%), Class C (21%), Class D (34%) or Class E (19%) felony offenses (see Table 3.1).

Those sentenced as a first felony offender are concentrated in three felony class categories: Class B, Class C, and Class D felony offenses (see Table 3.2). However, those sentenced as Second or Persistent felony offenders are largely concentrated in the Class C, Class D and Class E felony offense categories.

Time Served by Felony Class of Commitment Offense

The 1991 release cohort has been broken into subgroups in order to examine time served information within groups of commitments that are similar in the sentencing laws that apply to them (see Table 3.3). The cohort is divided into first felony commitments and second felony commitments. These two groups were again divided into violent and other felony offenses. Within each of these four subgroups, persons are grouped according to the felony class category of the conviction offense.⁸

⁸In New York State the range of sentences available to the court depends upon the felony class category of the conviction offense. The range of sentences available to the court also depends upon whether the defendant is a first felony offender, a second (or predicate) felony offender or a persistent (third time) felony offender. The sentence structure (i.e. the range of minimum and maximum sentences) is, for most crimes, more severe for second and persistent felony offenders than for first felony offenders. The range of minimum and maximum sentences that applies to each felony class category is also affected by whether the offense is a legislatively designated violent felony offense. The range of minimum and maximum sentences is more severe for Class B and Class C legislatively designated violent felony offenses than is the range of minimum-maximum terms for all other Class B and Class C felony offenses. In addition, second felony offenders for whom both the immediate and the prior felony convictions were for violent felony crimes (i.e. are "Second Violent" Felony Offenders) are eligible for more severe minimum and maximum sentences than are other second felony offenders. Appendix A presents a brief summary of the minimum and maximum sentence structure for offenses in each felony class category that includes changes in sentence severity that apply to second and persistent felony offenders and to violent felony offenders.

In general, as the felony class category declines from Class A to Class E, median and average time served also decline. Looking, for instance, at first felony offenders committed for violent felony offenses, the total time served declines in a regular manner from 201.3 months for a Class A felony to 19.0 months for a Class E violent felony (see Table 3.3). Similarly, among first felony offenders convicted of other felony offenses the average state time served declined from 110.9 months for a Class A-I felony offense to 17.0 months for a Class E felony offense.

Differences in Time Served by First or Second Felony Offender Status

Overall, second felony offenders receive longer sentences and serve more time in state prison than do first felony offenders. For example, the average total time served for a second felony offender committed for a Class B violent felony offense (N=432) is 94.7 months; the average total time served in custody for a first felony offender committed for a Class B violent felony offense (N=938) is 52.3 months (see Table 3.3). For those second felony offenders convicted of other (non-violent) Class B felony offenses (N=278) the average time served is 50.3 months; for first felony offenders convicted of other Class B felony offenses (N=1,893) the average time served is 17.5 months.

Differences in Time Served by Violent Felony Offender Status

Within the first felony offender group, Class B violent felony offenders serve considerably more time in custody (average total time served 52.3 months) than do other Class B felony offenders (average 17.5 months) (see Table 3.3). First felony offenders convicted of a Class C violent felony served 28.7 months in custody compared with 18.2 months for first felony offenders convicted of other Class C felony offenses. Among first felony offenders the average state time served for Class D and Class E violent felony offenses is only slightly higher than that for other Class D and Class E felony offenses. As reflected in Appendix A, the minimum sentence range for Class D and Class E violent felonies is the same as that for other Class D and Class E non-violent felony offenses (where the person is sentenced as a first felony offender) so it is not surprising that there is not a large difference in time served depending on violent felony status for persons convicted of Class D and Class E felonies.

It can also be seen that for first felony offenders convicted of non-violent offenses there is not a decline in average total time served as one moves from Class B (average 17.5 months), to Class C (18.2 months), to Class D (18.3 months) to Class E felony offenders (17.0) months) (see Table 3.3). Appendix A indicates that the lowest minimum sentence length for persons in all of these categories is one year. Moreover, a large proportion of the cases in these

categories are drug offenders. Some jurisdictions are more likely to convict drug offenders at the Class B and C level, others at the Class D and E level, though there may be relatively little difference in length of minimum sentence for first felony offenders convicted of drug offenses that fall into these felony class categories.⁹

Among second felony offenders there is a clear difference in time served by violent or non-violent felony status. Among second felony offenders committed for a Class B violent felony offense (N=432), the average total time served is 94.7 months, for Class B other felony offenses (N=278) it is 50.3 months (see Table 3.3). In contrast to first felony offenders, however, second felony offenders convicted of violent felony offenses serve a noticeably longer period of time in custody than do second felony offenders convicted of other (non-violent) felony offenses. This can be seen by comparing the Class C, Class D and Class E felony offenders in the violent offense category with their Class C, D, and E counterparts in the non-violent category.

Correlation Between Minimum Sentence and Time Served

The overall correlation between minimum sentence length and total time served is high (Pearson's R=.90). Average (and median) total time served correspond fairly closely with average (and median) minimum sentence for persons in each specific felony class category, although violent felony offenders tend to serve a longer period in custody in relation to average minimum sentence than do non-violent offenders. For example, the average minimum sentence for people in the Class B offense category who were sentenced as a first felony offender for a violent felony offense (N=938) was 43.4 months and the average total time served was 52.3 months (see Table 3.3). The average minimum sentence for people in Class B non-violent offense category who were sentenced as a first felony offender (N=1,893) was 17.3 months and the average total time served was 17.5 months.

⁹In a separate report on drug offenders ("Drug Offenders Committed to State Prison" (1991), New York State Department of Correctional Services), we find a modest range in average minimum sentence between first felony Class B drug offenders (average minimum in 1990 is 18.5 months) and first felony Class D drug offenders (16.1 months). But the length of time served in custody is about the same for first felony Class B drug offenders (average total time served 17.3 months among 1991 releases), Class C drug offenders (16.6 months), and Class D drug offenders (17.5 months) (see Table 5.1 below).

Crosstabulation of Felony Class by Total Time Served

A crosstabulation of felony class category by total time served is presented in Table 3.4. Felony class category is presented for separate groups of the release population according to first or second felony offender status and violent or other felony offense. These data offer another view of the distribution of time served according to felony class and other relevant criteria. ¹⁰

Among first felony offenders convicted of other (or non-violent) felony crimes 12% (N=692) served a period of time in custody that was less than 12 months (one year is the lowest legally permissible minimum sentence for a felony offender committed to state prison). In all, 6% (N=1,070) of first releases in 1991 served less than 12 months in custody (including both state time and jail time). These individuals are a portion of those people who have successfully completed the Department's Shock Incarceration Program. The Shock Incarceration Program is a six month program of intensive physical training, counseling and drug treatment. Persons who successfully complete the program are (with few exceptions) approved by the Board of Parole for release to parole supervision. An inmate with a minimum sentence of 12 months and who successfully completes the Shock Incarceration Program might, for example, serve a total of eight months in custody (e.g., one month of jail time, one month in reception/classification, and six months in Shock Incarceration).

Table 3.5 presents a crosstabulation of felony class category by state time served.

Trends in Time Served 1987-1991 by Felony Class Category and First or Second Felony Offender Status

Average total time served in state prison for first releases to parole supervision in each year 1987 through 1991 and for the composite group of releases from 1987 to 1991 is presented in Table 3.6. These time served figures are broken out by felony class category and by first or second felony offender status (persistent felony offenders have been grouped with second felony offenders).

¹⁰It can be seen in Table 3.4 that certain offenders appear to serve a period of time that is less than the required legal minimum sentence for offenses that fall into a particular felony class category. For instance, there were 43 cases released in 1991 who had been convicted of the Class A-I felony crimes of Murder 2nd, Arson 1st, or Kidnapping 1st. The minimum term for offenses in the category is 15 years (or 180 months). Three of the 43 cases served less than the fifteen year minimum term. These cases were Juvenile Offenders who (due to this legal status) received a minimum term that is less than the 15 year minimum that applied to adult offenders. In the Class A-I non-violent category (N=26) there were 9 cases that received a minimum term of 3 years and 4 cases that received a minimum term of 5 years.

As noted earlier the average total time served has declined from 33.4 months among 1987 releases to 29.4 months among 1991 releases. This occurrence is due to shifts in the proportion of cases in each felony class category and to declines in time served within particular felony class categories. These conclusions are more fully explained in the next section.

Trends in Time Served 1987-1991 According to Felony Class Category, Violent Felony Status and First or Second Felony Offender Status

Average total time served for first releases to parole supervision declines from 33.4 months in 1987 to 28.0 months in 1990. This results from a shift in the percent of releases found in each specific felony class category (as further defined by violent or non-violent status, and first or predicate felony status)¹¹ and by a decline in average time served for persons within certain specific felony class categories. This can be seen by examining the average time served data across the years 1987 to 1990 as reflected in Table 3.7 along with the figures on number and percent of cases in each category as shown in Table 3.8. Average time served increases somewhat between 1990 (28.0 months) and 1991 (29.4 months) (see Table 3.7). This is due to an increase in the percent of releases who were committed for a non-violent offense and sentenced as a second felony offender between 1990 (32.7%) and 1991 (36.6%, see Table 3.8). Since average time served for second felony offenders convicted of non-violent offenses is higher than that for first felony offenders convicted of non-violent offenses (a group which also declines as a percent of releases between 1990 35.2% and 1991 32.2%) the average time served for the total release cohort is pushed upward.

A. Time Served for Violent Felony Offenders

Average time served for violent felony offenders is relatively stable across the period 1987 through 1991. For example, first felony offenders committed for a Class B violent felony offense served on average 51.5 months among 1987 releases (N=1,389) and they served on average 52.3 months among 1991 releases (N=938; see Table 3.7).

Among second felony offenders convicted of violent felony offenses there is a slight increase in average time served among 1991 releases when compared with releases in earlier years. For example, the average time served for a second felony offender convicted of a Class B violent felony offense was 84.3 months among 1987 releases but was 94.7 months among 1991 releases. The increase in average time served in this particular category appears to reflect a slight increase in average minimum sentence for offenders in the second felony class B violent offense category (see Appendix D).

¹¹See footnote 8 infra and Appendix A for a brief review of legal factors that affect sentence length (and time served) for people in various felony class categories.

While the length of stay for violent felons is relatively unchanged over the last four years the proportion of first releases made up of violent felons has declined substantially due to the influx (and subsequent release) of drug felons committed in recent years. First felony offenders convicted of a violent crime made up 33.0% of releases in 1987, but they fall to 17.7% of releases in 1991 (see Table 3.8). Similarly, second felony offenders committed for a violent crime decline from 19.1% of releases in 1987 to 13.6% in 1991.

B. Time Served for Non-Violent Felony Offenders

Non-violent offenders show dramatic growth as a percent of first releases over the period 1987 to 1991 and this occurs because this category includes drug offenders. For example, second felony offenders convicted of non-violent offenses increase from 23.0% of releases in 1987 to 36.6% in 1991 (see Table 3.8). In addition to the growth in the size of the non-violent felony group, for many of the specific felony class categories there is a notable decline in average time served. For example, first felony offenders committed for a Class C non-violent crime served 24.3 months among 1987 releases but these same offenders served 18.2 months among 1991 releases, a decline of 6.1 months (see Table 3.7). Similarly, among second felony offenders committed for a Class C non-violent felony offense the average time served declines from 41.7 months among 1987 releases to 33.8 months among 1991 releases (a decline of 7.9 months).

The increase in average total time served for releases in 1991 (29.4 months) compared with 1990 (28.0 months) appears to be due to a greater concentration in the release cohort of second felony offenders convicted of a Class B, C, and D non-violent felony offenses. In the second felony non-violent group, Class B offenders increase from 0.8% in 1990 to 1.5% in 1991, class C from 2.8% in 1990 to 3.6% in 1991, and Class D from 15.0% in 1990 to 17.1% in 1991 (see Table 3.8). There is also a slight decline in proportion of first felony offenders convicted of non-violent crimes among 1991 releases (32.2%) when compared with 1990 releases (35.2%). Since average time served for second felony non-violent offenders is longer than that for first felony non-violent offenders (e.g. for Class B second felony the average time served is 50.3 months, for Class B first felony it is 17.5 months) the greater concentration of releases in the second felony non-violent category pushes up average time served in 1991 over that seen in 1990.

C. Summary

In summary, non-violent offenders make up a larger proportion of releases in 1991 than they did among 1987 releases. Since non-violent offenders generally receive shorter minimum sentences than do violent felony offenders a higher concentration of non-violent offenders would drive down average time served when the total group of first releases is examined. But in addition to a shift in the percent of cases in favor of non-violent offenders, many of the specific felony class categories in the non-violent group have shown a decline in average time served. It was suggested earlier that one reason for the decline in average time

served for non-violent offenders is new programs initiated by the Department of Correctional Services. One of these programs is the Earned Eligibility Program which has increased the rate of release once the minimum period of imprisonment has been served and the inmate makes satisfactory progress in educational programs and work assignments.¹² The Shock Incarceration Program permits early release to parole supervision for inmates who successfully complete a six month program of intensive physical training, counseling and drug treatment.¹³ Both of these programs draw heavily on non-violent offenders committed to state prison and each has served to reduce the average length of stay.

Another possible explanation for a decline in average time served for persons in specific felony class categories (again, defined further by violent or non-violent crime and by first or predicate felony status) is a change in sentencing patterns by the courts. However, a separate Department report on drug offenders committed to state prison in recent years shows that the average minimum sentence within specific felony class categories is unchanged over the years 1987 through 1990. Along this line, Appendix D presents average minimum sentence length for subgroups of the release population defined by felony class category, first or second felony offender status, and violent or non-violent felony status. When average minimum sentence length is examined across releases from 1987 to 1991 within these legally distinct subgroups, the data show that for most subgroups the average minimum sentence has not changed across this five year period (see Appendix D). So, changes in length of stay within the same felony class category would appear to be due more to the initiation of new programs than to a shift in sentencing patterns by the courts.

TIME SERVED BY MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM SENTENCE LENGTH

A substantial number of persons committed to state prison serve a period of time in custody that closely approximates the length of the minimum sentence. A cross-tabulation of minimum sentence by total time served is presented in Table 4.1. There are, however, cases in each minimum sentence category who serve a period of time in custody that is lower than the minimum sentence. Participation in the Shock Incarceration Program explains the large majority of cases where the individual serves a period less than the minimum sentence. The Shock Incarceration Program is a six month program of intensive physical training, counseling and drug treatment. Persons who successfully complete the program are (with few exceptions) approved by the Board of Parole for release to parole supervision. An inmate with a minimum sentence of 12 months and who successfully completes the Shock Incarceration Program might, for example, serve a total of eight months in custody (e.g., one month of jail time, one month in reception/classification, and six months in Shock Incarceration). One of the important incentives for successful completion of the Shock program is the possibility of early release. Other reasons that explain why an individual did not serve the full minimum term include: additional court proceedings that result in a charge reduction (and possibly a subsequent sentence reduction), dismissal of charges at a new trial, transfer to a federal institution to serve a concurrent term, and commutation of sentence resulting from executive clemency.

Table 4.2 crosstabulates state time served by minimum sentence. Some portion of the cases in Table 4.2 appear to serve a period of time in state prison that is less than the length of the minimum sentence. This occurs in part for the reasons described in the paragraph above and because persons have accumulated jail time prior to commitment to state prison. Jail time is credited toward service of the minimum sentence, so, some persons may serve a period in a state correctional facility (e.g. 10 months) that is shorter than the length of the minimum sentence (e.g. 12 months) due to accumulated jail time (e.g. 2 months) prior to admission to state prison.

Time Served by Length of Maximum Sentence

A crosstabulation of maximum sentence by total time served in state prison is presented in Table 4.3. It can be seen in Table 4.3 that a few cases appear to serve a period of time longer than the maximum term. These are individuals who may have received an additional sentence after admission to state prison (i.e. they received an additional sentence due to court proceedings on separate charges following confinement or for an offense that may have been committed while confined).

A crosstabulation aggregate maximum sentence by state time only is presented in Table 4.4.

TIME SERVED FOR DRUG OFFENDERS

There has been a substantial increase in recent years in the number of persons committed to the Department for a drug offense. In 1984 the Department received 1,875 drug commitments, in 1988 there were 6,432, and in 1991 the Department received 10,778 commitments for a drug offense. Given the attention directed toward the arrest, conviction and incarceration of drug offenders, a brief section which specifically examines time served of persons committed for drug offenses has been included.

Average and median state time served and average and median total time served for drug offenders released to parole supervision in 1991 is presented in Table 5.1. In this table drug offenders are categorized by felony class category of conviction offense and by first or second felony offender status. Overall, the average total time served for all drug offenders released in 1991 was 24.2 months. For drug offenders sentenced as a first felony offender the average total time served was 21.2 months. For drug offenders sentenced as a second felony offender the average total time served was 27.0 months.

Average total time served for a Class A-I drug felony offender was approximately 111 months. Offenders convicted of a Class A-II drug felony served, on average, 41 months in custody. Among inmates sentenced as a first felony offender, there was relatively little difference in the average total time served (approximately 17 months) for persons convicted of Class B, C, or D felony drug offenses (see Table 5.1).

People sentenced as a second felony offender tend to serve a longer period in confinement than do first felony offenders (where the felony class category of conviction offense is the same). For instance, persons convicted of a Class B drug felony offense and sentenced as a second felony offender served, on average, 51 months (see Table 5.1). This compares with persons convicted of a Class B drug felony offense and sentenced as a first felony offender who served an average of 17 months in custody.

Table 5.2 presents time served data according to specific drug offense within categories of persons sentenced as first or second felony offenders. (CSCS refers to Criminal Sale of Controlled Substance, CPCS to Criminal Possession of Controlled Substance, see Appendix E for New York State Penal Law Section number of these offenses).

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS OF RELEASES

Among 1991 releases 92% (N=16,880) were men and 8% (N=1,523) were women (see Table 6.2). Sixteen percent were white, 49% black and 34% Hispanic.

Among men released to parole supervision in 1991 16% were white, 49% black and 34% Hispanic. Among women 13% were white, 48% black and 39% Hispanic (see Table 6.1).

Average age at release to parole supervision was 29.8 years (see Table 6.2). The average age at release among blacks is slightly lower (28.9 years) than that for Hispanics (30.6 years) or whites (30.9 years) (see Table 6.3).

Approximately 71% of 1991 releases were committed from New York City, another 11% were committed from countries close to New York City (Nassau, Suffolk, Rockland and Westchester). People committed from upstate counties that had a major population center of 50,000 or more people made up 9% of releases and those committed from the remaining upstate countries made up 8% of releases. Females released in 1991 were somewhat more likely to have been committed from New York City (76%) than was true for males (71%).

Time Served by Release Year

For first releases to parole supervision the average length of stay in custody (state prison time plus local jail time) declined from 33.4 months in 1987 to 27.9 months in 1990 but rose in 1991 to 29.4 months (see Table 7.1). The paragraphs below briefly summarize those factors that explain the decline in average time served from 1987 to 1990 and identify why average time served increases somewhat among 1991 releases.

Factors Contributing to Decline in Time Served For Overall Release Cohort 1987 - 1990

In general, the decline in average length of stay between 1987 and 1990 occurs for two reasons. First, when compared with 1987 releases, the 1990 release cohort has a higher proportion of non-violent felony offenders (68% in 1990, 48% in 1987, see Table 3.8). Non-violent offenders receive shorter minimum sentences than do violent felony offenders. This higher proportion of non-violent offenders in the release cohorts helps to drive down the average time served for the total first release group. The higher concentration of non-violent offenders in the release cohorts in 1990 and 1991 reflect the higher proportion of new commitments made up by drug offenders in recent years which is, at least in part, a reflection of the greater concentration of criminal justice resources on the apprehension and prosecution of drug offenders.

Second, when the release cohort is broken into subgroups by felony class category and violent or non-violent felony crime, the average total time served in custody for non-violent offenders has declined (see Table 3.7). These declines are in part due to new programs initiated by the Department including the Shock Incarceration Program and the Earned Eligibility Program.

The Shock Incarceration Program permits early release to parole supervision for inmates who successfully complete a six month program of intensive physical training, counseling, education and drug treatment. Successful completion of the Shock Incarceration Program offers the possibility of a substantial reduction in the minimum period that must be served in custody. For example, the average minimum sentence of male inmates in the Shock Incarceration Program in September of 1991 was 21.7 months. However the average total period in custody for Shock graduates released between September 1987 and September 1991

was approximately 11 months (approximately 7.4 months of state time plus approximately 4 months of jail time) a considerable reduction in the minimum period of imprisonment for those who successfully complete the program (i.e. approximately 10 and one half months per graduate¹⁸).

The Earned Eligibility Program has also contributed to a decline in length of time served. This program may be described as follows:

... the objective of the Earned Eligibility Program is to increase the rate of release for those inmates who have served their required minimum sentence and who have demonstrated an overall pattern of progress in appropriate programs. In evaluating program progress, attention is focused on the inmate's participation in programs which directly address his crime of commitment and other areas of identified needs or deficiencies (e.g. substance abuse programs, educational programs, specialized counseling). In addition to determining program appropriateness, consideration is given to the inmate's level of attendance, participation, and progress in the program and to his institutional behavior record.¹⁹

In 1986, the year before the Earned Eligibility Program began, the rate of release to parole supervision for inmates making their initial appearance before the Board of parole was 48%. During 1987 the release rate at initial appearance was 57% and during 1991 the release rate was approximately 67%. The Earned Eligibility program contributed to this increase in release rates. Of those inmates who had a parole hearing during calendar year 1991 and who were eligible to be evaluated for a Certificate of Earned Eligibility, 69% were issued a certificate, 20% were denied and 11% were placed in non-certifiable status. Further, 84% of those who obtained a certificate were paroled, compared with only 38% paroled for those who were denied a certificate. One would expect that an increase in release rate at initial appearance would contribute to a decline in average time served (at least for the initial appearance cases). At least for release years 1987 through 1990, as the rate of release has increased the average time served in custody has declined.

Increase in Average Time Served Among 1991 Releases

As noted earlier average total time served increases in 1991 (29.4 months) over the figure seen in 1990 (27.9 months). The proportion of releases who are non-violent offenders is essentially the same in 1991 (69%) as in 1990 (68%). However, the 1991 release cohort has a higher proportion of non-violent offenders who were sentenced as a second felony offender (36.6% see Table 3.8) than was true among 1990 releases (32.7%). There is a corresponding decline of non-violent offenders committed as a first felony offender between 1990 (35.2% of releases) and 1991 (32.2% of releases). Since average time served for a second felony offender convicted of a non-violent offense is higher than that for a first felony offender convicted of a non-violent offense (when cases in the same felony class category in each group are examined) the shift in the proportion of cases from the first felony group to the second felony group tends to push average time served up in 1991. In addition, for several of the specific felony class categories in the non-violent group (for both first and second felony offenders) there are slight increases in average time served between 1990 and 1991 (see Table 3.7). Both factors contribute to the increase in length of stay for the total release cohort in 1991 compared with 1990.

State Time Served

State time refers only to the period of custody in the State Department of Correctional Services, jail time is not included. Average state time served declines from 27.7 months among 1987 releases to 22.7 months in 1990 but rises to 23.9 months in 1991. As in other tables both the arithmetic average and the median (i.e. the length of time served for cases at the middle or 50th percentile of the time served distribution) are presented. Median state time served was 21.4 months in 1987 but stands at 18.1 months among 1991 releases.

Among first releases to parole supervision in 1987 39.7% served less than 18 months in state custody, but among 1991 releases 49.7% served less than 18 months.
