

HIGHLIGHTS



The rate of parole returns was 55.7 for females, and 71.2 for males.

significantly from 77.1 in 1990 to 69.7 in 1991.

The rate of parolees returned to custody (PV-RTCs) (PV-RTC and pending revocation) decreased

The rate of parolees returned with a new term (PV-WNTs) decreased slightly from 19.9 in 1990 to 19.5 in 1991.
