CHARACTERISTICS OF INMATES UNDER CUSTODY

DECEMBER 31: 1985-1992

This report describes the population of inmates under custody in facilities of the Department of Correctional Services on December 31, 1992. These tables present information on legal history characteristics of the offender population (e.g. crime, sentence, prior criminal record) and demographic characteristics (e.g. sex, ethnic status, county of commitment). In addition, data are also presented for the end of year population for the 1985-1992 period.

CHARACTERISTICS OF INMATES UNDER CUSTODY

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SUMMARY

1. SIZE OF INMATE POPULATION

The number of inmates under custody of the Department of Correctional Services stood at 61,376 at the close of 1992. This represents an increase of 79% or 27,229 additional inmates during the 1985-1992 seven-year period (see Table 1.1, p.1).

2. SECURITY LEVEL

Over one-half (51% or 17,664 inmates) of the offender population were confined in maximum security prisons at the close of 1985. This proportion had dropped to 33% (20,362 inmates (by the close of 1992) (see Table 2.1, p.3).

3. COMMITMENT OFFENSE

The proportion of drug felons under custody has grown rapidly over the past seven years. Drug offenders accounted for only 13% of the inmate population in 1985 while by the close of 1992 they comprised 35%. At the end of 1992, violent felony offenders made up 52% of the population; drug offenders 35%; property and other offenders 9%; other coercive 9%; and Youthful Offenders 1% (see Table 3.0, p.4).

4. SECOND FELONY OFFENDERS

By the close of 1992, there were 35,273 second or persistent felony offenders under custody, a rise of 110% over the 16,820 predicate felons incarcerated on December 31, 1985 (see Table 4.0, p.8).

5. GENDER

The number of women grew at a rate of 230% over the seven year period from 1,061 in 1985 to 3,500 in 1992. Males increased at a rate of 74% from 33,543 inmates to 58,235 by the close of 1992 (see Table 5.0, p.12).

6. FELONY CLASS

Class B felons accounted for 27% or 16,875 of the inmates under custody at the close of 1992. Class D felons at 26% or 16,031 was the next largest followed by Class C at 22% (13,580 inmates); Class A at 13% (8,285 inmates); Class E at 11% (6,536 inmates); and Youthful Offenders at 1% or 413 inmates (see Table 6.0, p.16).

7. MINIMUM SENTENCE

At the close of 1992, the largest portion of the population, 39% or 24,063 inmates, were serving minimum terms that fell in the 24 through 47 month category (see Table 7.0, p.18).

MAXIMUM SENTENCE

The number of inmates serving life maximum terms had risen to 9,556 by the close of 1992, an increase of 87% or 4,441 more "lifers" than on December 31, 1985 (see Table 7.3, p.22).

8. TIME SERVED

The most rapidly increasing time served category consisted of inmates who had served 72 months or more, up by 163% to 6,202 inmates in 1992 compared to 2,509 inmates in 1985. The next most rapid increase was seen among inmates who had served less than one year, up 102% to 26,182 inmates in 1992 compared to 12,955 in 1985 (see Table 8.0, p.26).

9. DRUG FELONS

The number of drug felons under custody increased by 361% from 1985 to 1992 compared to the overall increase of 78% in the total inmate population. The number of predicate drug felons increased by 563% compared to a 172% increase in first felony drug offenders (see Table 9.0, p.28).

10. ETHNIC STATUS

At the close of 1992 the largest ethnic group consisted of Black inmates who made up 55% (31,199) of the total population. Hispanic inmates at 32% (20,006) were the next largest group followed by White inmates at 16% (9,783) and others at 1% (747) (see Table 10.0, p.32).

11. AGE

While all age categories increased over the seven-year period, the rate of increase was more pronounced for inmates 30 years of age or older (see Table 11.0, p.34).

12. COUNTY OF COMMITMENT

The largest (70% or 42,888 inmates) portion of the 1992 inmate population had been committed from New York City. Suburban New York City counties accounted for an additional 12% (7,339 inmates) with the remaining portion coming from Upstate areas (see Table 12.0, p.36).

13. PRIOR EDUCATION

The number of inmates with some high school or college education grew at a faster rate than the number who had completed 8th grade or less (see Table 13.0, p.40).

14. MARITAL STATUS

At the close of 1992, the inmate population consisted primarily of unmarried persons. Never married accounted for 61% or 37,462 inmates followed by married at 20% (12,058 inmates); common-law at 10% (6,029) and divorced/separated at 10% (5,875 inmates) (see Table 14.0, p.42).

CHARACTERISTICS OF INMATES UNDER CUSTODY

DECEMBER 31: 1985-1992

INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a series designed to make data available on the inmate population of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. The report presents basic descriptive information on selected characteristics of the inmates under custody of the Department on December 31. Information on criminal justice system variables is presented (e.g. commitment offense, sentence, time served) as well as information on demographic variables (e.g. age, sex, ethnic status). Material is provided for each year included in the 1985-1992 period to indicate not only the increase in the size of the inmate population but also how its character has changed over these seven years.

Tables 1.1 and 2.1 present figures on the under custody population on December 31 for 1985 through 1992. These are the most accurate figures available. In subsequent tables presented in this report, the end of year population figures may differ slightly from the values found in Table 1.1 and 2.1. This results from the computerized data files being prepared a short time after the precise end of the year and the fact that some cases may be missing certain data elements. We believe, however, that the data in the sections that follow constitute an accurate and useful representation of the under custody population.

Section 1

INCREASE IN THE SIZE OF THE UNDER CUSTODY POPULATION


The inmate population of the New York State Department of Correctional Services (DOCS) increased by over three-fourths (78.9% or 27,229) from 34,507 inmates on December 31, 1985 to 61,736 on December 31, 1992 (see Table 1.1). The average increase over this seven-year period was 3,890 inmates per year or 11.3% annually. The largest increase occurred in 1989 when the inmate population jumped by 6,672 (15.0%) while the smallest rise occurred in 1987 with an increase of 2,393 inmates or 6.2%.

The single factor most closely associated with the growth in the inmate population during this period was the rapid rise in drug felony commitments to DOCS. While annual commitments for other felonies rose from 10,202 in 1985 to 13,944 in 1991 (+36.7%), drug commitments increased by 405.4% from 2,218 in 1985 to 11,209 in 1992.

Section 2

SECURITY LEVEL OF CONFINEMENT

As noted above, the population of offenders under DOCS custody rose by 27,229 inmates or 78.9% over the 1985-1992 period. This change, however, was not distributed evenly over the three general levels of facility security which include maximum, medium and minimum. At the close of 1985 over one-half (51.2% or 17,664) of the inmate population was housed in maximum security prisons with 41.6% (14,364) in medium security facilities and the remaining 7.2% (2,479) under minimum security confinement. By the end of 1992, only 33.0% (20,362) of the inmates were held in maximum security facilities with 52.6% (30,928) held in medium confinement and 14.4% (8,886) held in minimum security facilities. The largest numeric growth, 18,124 (130.7%), occurred among inmates held in medium security while the largest percentage gain was an increase of 232.2% (6,407) among inmates held in minimum security. Over this eight-year period, DOCS added 17 additional correctional facilities bringing the number of separate prisons up to 65 by December 31, 1992. Two new maximum security facilities were added during this time along with 14 medium security facilities and 1 minimum security facility.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 3

COMMITMENT OFFENSE

Tables 3.0 through 3.2 present information on offenders under custody according to commitment offense. The commitment offenses have been grouped into several larger categories. The first category is labeled Violent Felony Offenses. In 1978, the New York State legislature enacted laws designed to provide more severe penalties for certain violent crimes (see N.Y.S. Penal Law Section 70.02). The Legislature designated these crimes as "violent felony offenses" (e.g., Attempted Murder 2nd, Manslaughter 1st, Rape 1st, Robbery 1st, Assault 1st). The Legislature did not include Murder 1st (which has since been declared unconstitutional), Murder 2nd, Kidnapping 1st, Conspiracy 1st and Arson 1st in the designated violent felony statute because these crimes as Class A-I felony offenses already carry the most severe sentences ranging from 15 years to Life imprisonment. These crimes, due to their violent nature, are included in the violent felony category. The "other coercive" category includes other crimes against person which are not designated in the law as "violent felony offenses." The "drugs" category includes controlled substance felonies while the fourth general category is termed "property and other" and contains non-violent offenses such as Burglary 3rd, Grand Larceny, Forgery, Stolen Property, and other felonies. The last general category is Youthful Offenders. Youthful Offenders are persons aged 16 to 19 at the date of the offense who were convicted of a felony but were subsequently granted Youthful Offender status by the court. (See New York State Criminal Procedure Law Section 720.10).

Violent felony offenders accounted for over one-half, 51.6% or 31,875, of the inmate population at the close of 1992. Drug felons comprised the next largest portion at 34.6% or 21,335 inmates. The property/other offenses category made up 8.7% or 5,342 inmates followed by the other coercive category at 4.5% or 2,770 and Youthful Offenders at 0.7% or 413.

The number of drug felons increased at a much more rapid rate than did the other crime categories. By the close of 1992 there were 16,704 more drug felons than on December 31, 1985, an increase of 360.7%. In contrast, the number of violent felony offenders increased by only 31.2%, an increase of 7,586 inmates. The property category rose by 37.4% or 1,455 inmates, while the other coercive category increased 92.4% or 1,330 inmates. Youthful Offenders rose by 15.4% or 55 inmates.

Crimes with a higher than average (78.4%) rate of increase included: Sodomy 1st; Sexual Abuse 1st; Kidnapping; Other Homicide; Rape 2nd and 3rd; Other Sex Offenses; Robbery 3rd; Other Coercive; Drugs; and Driving While Intoxicated. Crimes with a lower than average growth rate included: Murder; Manslaughter 1st and 2nd; Rape 1st; Robbery 1st and 2nd; all Burglary; all Assault; Arson; Dangerous Weapons; Larceny; Forgery; Stolen Property; and Youthful Offenders.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 4

PREDICATE FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

The New York State Penal Law provides for more severe sentences for second felony offenders and for persistent felony offenders. This includes any person who has been convicted of a felony and who has prior (i.e. predicate) felony conviction having occurred within ten years of the present conviction. These laws generally require a mandatory prison term for persons convicted of a second or persistent felony.

Over one-half of the 1992 end of year inmate population (57.1% or 35,280) had been committed as predicate felons. Violent felony offenders had the lowest, 46.6% or 14,840, proportion of predicate felons. The next lowest at 59.7% or 1,653 was the other coercive felony group; followed by drug felons at 69.4% (12,578) and the property/other felony group at 74.4%. Specific crime categories where over 70 percent of those under custody had been sentenced as predicate offenders included: Attempted Assault 2nd at 83.4%; Burglary 3rd at 83.2%; Grand Larceny-automobile at 81.8%; Robbery 3rd at 80.1%; Grand Larceny-not automobile at 77.7%; Forgery at 76.1%; Drug Sales at 74.3%; and Dangerous Weapons at 71.1%. (See Section 9 for predicate felony status of drug felons by felony class.)

The number of inmates serving predicate felony sentences increased at a more rapid rate than did the number serving first felony sentences over the 1985-1992 period. By the close of 1992 there were 8,672 more first felony offenders than on December 31, 1985, an increase of 49.6%. The number of predicate felons, however, rose by 18,458 or 109.7% during this same period. The largest rise was recorded by drug felons with an increase of 12,578 predicate felons, up 563.3%. Among other coercive felons the rise in predicate offenders was 107.4% (+856) followed by violent felony offenders, up 37.0% (+4,011); and property/other up 34.2% (+1,013).



Section 5

GENDER

The inmate population consists predominantly of male offenders. At the close of 1992, males accounted for 94.3% or 58,235 of the inmates under DOCS custody compared to 5.7% or 3,500 females. While the increase in the total population from 1985 through 1992 was 78.4% (+27,130), the male segment grew at a slower pace, up 73.6% (+24,691). The increase in the number of female inmates was more rapid, up 229.9% (+2,439).

There are marked differences between the crime distribution of the male and female inmate populations. At the close of 1992, over one-half of the male population, 53.4%, had been committed for a violent felony offense (VFO). In the male VFO group, Robbery 1st and 2nd accounted for 19.3% followed by crimes of Homicide at 14.8%; Burglary 1st and 2nd at 6.5%; Sex crimes at 5.6%; Dangerous Weapons at 4.2%; Assault at 2.9%; Kidnapping at 0.5% and Arson at 0.3%. Drug offenders accounted for about one-third (32.7%) of the male population at the close of 1992. The remainder of the males included 8.7% committed for property and other offenses; 4.5% for other violent or coercive offenses; and 0.7% as Youthful Offenders. Over the eight year period there was a pronounced growth in the proportion of male felons, rising from 13.1% in 1985 to 32.7% in 1992. The VFO group declined from 70.8% of the male population in 1985 to 53.4% in 1992. There was more modest change in the proportions of the other three segments of the male population during this period with other coercive or violent offenses rising only slightly from 4.1% to 4.5% while property/other crimes declined from 11.0% to 8.7% and Youthful Offenders dropping from 1.0% to 0.7%.

Less than one out of four (22.5%) of the 1992 female inmate population had been committed for a violent felony offense. In this VFO group, crimes of homicide accounted for 8.9% followed by Robbery 1st and 2nd at 6.9%, Assault at 2.5% and Burglary at 2.2% with all other crimes under 1.0%. Two out of three (66.1%) of the female inmate population had been committed for a drug felony. The remainder of the females included 7.1% committed for property and other offenses; 3.6% for other violent or coercive offenses; and 0.6% as Youthful Offenders. Over the eight-year period, the proportion of drug felons grew from 22.0% to 66.1% while the proportion of all other segments declined: VFO's dropped from 51.5% to 22.5%; other violent/coercive crimes from 6.1% to 3.6%; property and other crimes from 19.7% to 7.1% and Youthful Offenders from 0.8% to 0.6%.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 6

FELONY CLASS OF COMMITMENT OFFENSE

In New York State felony offenses are classified into one of the following categories: Class A (including Class A-I and Class A-II), Class B, Class C, Class D, Class E and Youthful Offender. Class A includes the most serious felonies while Class E represent the least serious felonies. Less serious crimes are designated as misdemeanors or violations. Only those convicted of a felony may be sentenced to state prison. Conviction for an "attempt" of a particular felony generally drops the conviction into the next lower felony class category. For instance, Robbery 1st is a Class B felony, but "Attempted" Robbery 1st is a Class C felony as is Robbery 2nd. The felony class category of the conviction offense is relevant because the sentencing laws are based on felony class category. That is, the range of minimum and maximum sentences that apply to conviction for a particular offense are governed, in part, by the felony class of the offense. Appendix A contains a brief summary of the range of minimum and maximum sentences for each felony class category.

At the close of 1992, the Class B category had the largest number, 16,876 or 27.3%, followed closely by Class D at 16,035 (26.0%) and then Class C at 13,582 (22.0%). There were 5,789 (9.4%) Class A-I felons and 2,497 (4.0%) Class A-II felons in custody plus 6,543 (10.6%) Class E felons and 413 (0.7%) Youthful Offenders. While the entire population increased by 78.4% over the eight-year period, three of the felony classes grew at a much more rapid rate, over doubling in size due to the influx of drug felons. The Class A-II group (which contains only drug felons) increased by 150.7% or 1,501 additional inmates by the close of 1992. The Class D group rose by 111.2% (8,441 inmates) and the Class E group rose by 109.3% (3,417) inmates. Both the Class A-I and the Class C group increased at lower than average rates gaining 64.4% (2,268 inmates) and 74.6% (5,803 inmates) respectively while Youthful Offenders increased at the lower rate of 15.4% (55 inmates).

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 7

SENTENCE

Person committed to prison in New York State receive an indeterminate sentence which is composed of a minimum period of imprisonment and a maximum period of imprisonment. The minimum sentence reflects the shortest period of time that a person must serve in prison before being considered for release on parole. The maximum sentence reflects the longest possible period that the defendant can be held in custody on the instant offense. Individuals serving an indeterminate sentence are eligible for release to parole after having served the minimum sentence (given favorable action by the Board of Parole) and they must by law be released once the conditional release date is reached (the conditional release date is the point at which two-thirds of the maximum sentence has been served). Persons in custody may serve past the conditional release date if for disciplinary reasons they have lost "good time" during service of the sentence.

Minimum Sentence On December 31, 1992, the largest portion of the population, 39.0% or 24,063 inmates, were in the 24-47 month minimum sentence category. The next largest portion was made up of those serving minimum terms of 48-119 months, 28.1% or 17,328. The remainder of the population were distributed in the 12-23 month category at 17.4% or 10,765 followed by the 120-239 month category at 8.6% or 5,318 and the 240 months and over category at 6.9% or 4,261.

Over the seven-year 1985-1992 period, the 24-47 month group registered the greatest change, increasing by 101.7% or 12,130 inmates. All other minimum sentence categories increased at less than the 78.4% average. Those with minimums of 240 or more months increased by 76.9% or 1,852 inmates; the 12-23 month category grew by 71.9% or 4,503 inmates; the 120-239 month category increased by 64.7% or 2,089 inmates while the 48-119 month category rose by 60.9% or 6,556 inmates. Both the average and the median minimum term declined over this period with the average dropping 1.1% and the median showing a decline of 14.3% since the end of 1985.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



SENTENCE

Maximum Sentence The largest number of inmates were found in the 54-85 month grouping of maximum sentences at 26.5% or 16,364 inmates. The next largest number appeared in the 36-53 month category at 25.2% or 15,561 inmates. Inmates with Life maximum terms comprised the next largest group at 15.5% or 9,556 inmates. The remaining portion of the population were distributed in the 144-239 month category at 12.5 or 7,618 inmates closely followed by the 96-143 month category at 12.2% or 7,510 inmates; and the 240 months and over category at 8.3% or 5,126 inmates.

The category with the shortest maximum terms showed the greatest change over the 1985-1992 period as the 36-53 month category increased by 109.3% or 8,126 more inmates in 1992 than at the close of 1985. The next largest increase was recorded by the 54-95 month category, up by 94.3% or 7,944 inmates. The longest maximum category, Life maximum, recorded an increase of 86.8%, up 4,441 since 1985. The remaining categories increased at a lower than average rate with the 240 and over category up by 68.7% or 2,088 inmates; the 96-143 month category up 54.8%; and the 144-239 month category up by 32.6% or 1,871 inmates.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 8

TIME SERVED

This section looks at the amount of time served by offenders in Department facilities from date of admission to December 31 of each year from 1985 through 1992. At the close of 1992 the largest portion, 42.4% or 26,182, of the inmate population had been under custody for less than one year. The next largest group consisted of those under custody from 12 through 23 months at 22.7% or 14,002 followed by: the 36 through 71 month group at 13.1% or 8,088; the 24 through 35 month group at 11.1% or 6,861; and the six year or more group at 10.7% or 10.2%.

The most rapid rate of change over the 1985-1992 period occurred among inmates who had served six or more years in prison. The 72 month and over category increased by 163.1% or 4,093 more inmates at the close of 1992 than on December 31, 1985. The largest numeric change, however, occurred among inmates who had served the least amount of time. The 0-11 month time served category increased by 13,207 inmates, up 101.8%. Inmates serving 12-23 months increased by 58.1% or 5,145 inmates followed by the 36-71 month category, up by 55.3% or 2,881 inmates and the 24-35 month category, up by 35.7% or 1,804 more inmates than at the close of 1985.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 9

DRUG OFFENDERS

Of the 21,335 drug felons under Department custody on December 31, 1992, the Class D category had the largest proportion of inmates, 31.0% or 6,614, followed by Class C at 23.0% or 4,915 and Class B at 21.0% or 4,486. Class A felons accounted for 15.1% or 3,231. Of these, 734 were Class A-I and 2,497 were Class A-II felons. The remaining 9.8% or 2,089 had been committed as Class E felons. Seven out of ten (69.4% or 14,813) had been convicted of a drug sale felony while 30.6% had been convicted of a drug possession felony. A similar proportion, 69.4% or 14,811 had been sentenced as predicate felons ("second felony offenders") while 30.6% had been sentenced as non-predicate or "first felony offenders."

There was considerable variation in the proportion of each felony class sentenced as predicate felons. The highest level of predicate sentences was found among Class E felons at 97.2% or 2,030 of the total 2,089 Class E drug felons under custody at the close of 1992. Of the Class D felons, 94.9% or 6,274 had been sentenced as predicate felons. Lower rates of predicate sentences were found among the Class C drug felons at 73.1% or 3,592; Class B at 57.4% or 2,574; and Class A at 10.6% or 219.

Over the 1985-1992 period, one of the most striking changes was an increase in the number of predicate drug felons. In 1985 less than one-half, 2,233 of the 4,631 incarcerated drug felons had predicate sentences. By the close of 1992, there were 14,811 predicate drug felons, a rise of 12,578 or 563.3%. The rate of increase was most pronounced among Class E felons with a rise of 1027.8% followed by a Class C predicate sentence increase of 920.5%; a Class D increase of 486.9%; a Class B increase of 404.7%; and a Class A-II increase of 179.5%. The increase in non-drug felons with predicate sentences over this seven-year period was only 40.3%. The number of drug felons with non-predicate sentences has remained relatively constant over the past four years after reaching highs of 6,810 in 1989 and 6,871 in 1990 and then dropping down to 6,572 by 1992.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 10

ETHNIC GROUP

The inmate population at the close of 1992 consisted largely of urban minority offenders. The largest ethnic group were Black inmates who made up 50.5% (31,199 inmates) of the total population. The next largest group included Hispanics at 32.4% or 20,006 inmates. White inmates comprised 15.8% or 9,783 inmates followed by Asians at 0.3% (201 inmates) and Native Americans at 0.2% (127 inmates). There were 419 inmates in the unspecified category who had declined to indicate an ethnic identity.

Over the seven-year 1985-1992 period, all ethnic groups registered numeric increases. There were notable differences in the rate of increase between different ethnic groups. The lowest rate of increase was found among White inmates at 21.0% over the seven-year period. By the close of 1992 there were 1,697 more White offenders under custody than at the close of 1985. The proportion of White inmates in the population, however, had dropped from 23.4% of all inmates in 1985 to 15.8% in 1992. The Black category rose by 76.2% over this seven-year period with the number of Black inmates increasing by 13,489 which was the largest numeric gain by any of the ethnic groups. The proportion of Black inmates in the population varied little over the period accounting for 51.2% of the 1985 population and 50.5% of the 1992 population. The Native American and the Asian groups had the next highest rates of increase, 119.0% and 123.3% respectively. While both these groups doubled in size, the actual number of inmates remained rather small and the proportion that these groups to the total population did not change. The largest rate of increase was registered by Hispanics, up by 131.8% or an additional 11,375 inmates. By the close of 1992, Hispanic inmates accounted for 32.4% of the population compared to 24.9% at the close of 1985.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 11

AGE

At the close of 1992, the largest age category at 40.0% or 24,669 inmates consisted of offenders 21 through 29 years of age. The next largest category included 30 through 39 year old offenders at 37.3% or 23,014 inmates. Offenders in the 40 through 49 year category made up 12.3% of the inmate population with 7,598 inmates followed by the 16 through 20 year category at 6.5% or 3,993 inmates and the 50 years and over category at 4.0% or 2,461 inmates.

All age categories registered numeric increases over the 1985-1992 period. The age group showing the greatest rate of change over this seven-year period was the 40 through 49 year category which increased at a rate of 122.1% or 4,177 inmates. At the close of 1992 this age category made up 12.3% of the inmate population compared to 9.9% in 1985. The next greatest rate of change was found among 30 through 39 year old inmates at 113.4%. This group had the largest numeric increase, up 12,229 inmates from the close of 1985. The proportion of inmates in this age category had increased to 37.3% compared to 31.2% in 1985. The 50 years and over group had the next highest rate of increase at 108.2%, up 1,279 inmates. The proportion of inmates aged 50 years and over increased slightly from 3.4% in 1985 to 4.0% in 1992. All three age categories which included inmates 30 years of age or older more than doubled in size during the seven-year period 1985-1992. The younger age categories increased at lesser rates. The 21-29 year category increased at a rate of 53.1%. This group, however, had the second largest numeric increase, up 8,560. The proportion of 21-29 year old inmates dropped from 46.6% of the total population in 1985 to 40.0% in 1992. The 16 through 20 year group rose by 28.5% or 886 inmates. At the close of 1992 this youngest age category accounted for 6.5% of the population compared to 9.0% in 1985.

DECEMBER 31, 1985 - 1992



Section 12

COUNTY/REGION OF COMMITMENT

Of the inmate population under custody at the close of 1992, eight out of ten offenders had been committed from either New York City or one of the four suburban New York City counties. The largest proportion, 69.5% or 42,895, were from New York City. The next largest group at 11.9% or 7,339 came from the suburban New York City counties which include Nassau; Rockland; Suffolk and Westchester. Upstate counties with urban centers accounted for 10.9% or 6,723 of the inmate population followed by upstate rural counties at 7.6% or 4,719 inmates.

Over the 1985-1992 period, the number of inmates in all of the regions of the state registered increases. The rates of increase were quite similar except for a more rapid increase by the upstate rural counties. The largest numeric increase was registered by New York City, up 18,791 inmates for an increase of 78.0%. The proportion of New York City inmates showed virtually no change from the 69.7% in 1985 to the 69.5% in 1992. The number of inmates from suburban New York City counties increased by 3,083 or 72.4%. The proportion of suburban New York City inmates at the close of 1985 was 12.3%, only slightly higher than the 11.9% at the close of 1992. Inmates from upstate urban areas increased by 2,879 or 74.9% with little change in the proportion at the close of 1985 which stood at 11.1% compared to 10.9% in 1992. Inmates from upstate rural counties increased by 2,330, the smallest numeric growth. However, the rate of increase for upstate rural counties was the highest of any region at 97.5%.

DECEMBER 31: 1985 - 1992



Section 13

PRIOR EDUCATION

At the end of 1992, the largest prior education category was composed of inmates with a 9th or 10th grade education, 39.7% or 24,504 of the total inmate population. The 11th through 12th grade category was the next largest with 31.5% or 19,469 inmates. Inmates with 7th through 8th grade educations were next at 13.8% or 8,518 followed by the Some College group at 7.5% or 4,632 and the 6th grade or less group with 3,034 or 4.9%.

All prior education categories increased over the seven-year period. The greatest rate of increase was registered by the Some College category, up 204.9% or 3,113 inmates. The proportion of inmates in this category increased from 4.4% of the inmate population in 1985 to 7.5% by the close of 1992. The next most rapidly rising group was the 11th through 12th grade category, up 106.5% or 10,041 inmates. The proportion of 11th-12th graders increased from 27.2% in 1985 to 31.5% in 1992. The 9th through 10th grade group followed with an increase of 78.6%. This group, however, had the largest numeric increase, up 10,782 inmates. There was no change in the 39.7% proportion of the inmate population represented by this group over the seven years. Inmates with a 6th grade or less education rose by 49.5% or 1,005 inmates. The proportion of inmates with a 6th grade or lower education declined from 5.9% in 1985 to 4.9% in 1992. The lowest rate of increase was registered by the 7th through 8th grade category, up 43.9% or 2,599 inmates. This category declined from 17.1% of the inmate population in 1985 to 13.8% in 1992.

DECEMBER 31: 1985-1992



Section 14

MARITAL STATUS

The inmate population at the close of 1992 consisted primarily of unmarried persons. Those inmates who had never been married made up the largest group at 60.6% or 37,462 offenders. Married inmates at 19.5% or 12,058 was the next largest group. Common-law relationships was the next largest group at 6,029 (9.8%) followed by divorced/separated at 9.5% or 5,875 inmates.

The never married category registered the biggest increase over the 1985-1992 period at 19,338, an increase of 106.9%. The proportion of never married inmates rose from 52.3% in 1985 to 60.6% in 1992. The number of married inmates grew at a slower rate increasing by 88.8% or 5,671 inmates. The proportion of married inmates in the population changed little from 18.5% in 1985 to 19.5% in 1992. The category of divorced/separated inmates increased at a slightly lower rate, 86.1% or 2,718 inmates. The proportion of this category also showed little change over the seven years, 9.1% in 1985 and 9.5% in 1992. The number of inmates indicated as having a common-law relationship registered the only decline among the marital status variables. This category showed a decline of 9.5% or 634 inmates at the close of 1992 compared to 1985. The proportion of common-law inmates declined from 19.3% of the total population in 1985 to 9.8% in 1992.
