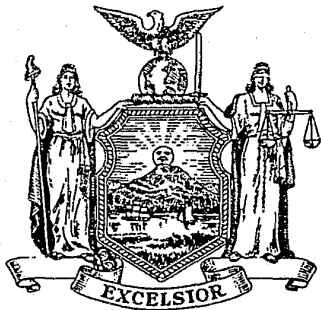

**SUMMARY OF
CHARACTERISTICS OF NEW COMMITMENTS
1991**

This document describes the population of new court commitments to the New York State Correctional Services during calendar year 1991. This report is an abridged version of the 140 page report produced earlier this year. The tables contained in the report present information on legal history characteristics of new commitments (e.g. crime, minimum sentence, prior criminal record) and demographic characteristics (e.g. age, sex, ethnic status, county of commitment). In addition, several tables show trends in new court commitments across the years 1988 and 1991.

SECTION 1

Total Admissions in 1991

There were 29,860 total admissions to the New York State Department of Correctional Services in calendar year 1991. Of these 24,116 (81%) were new court commitments, 3,401 (11%) were returned parole violators and 2,343 (8%) were other admissions.

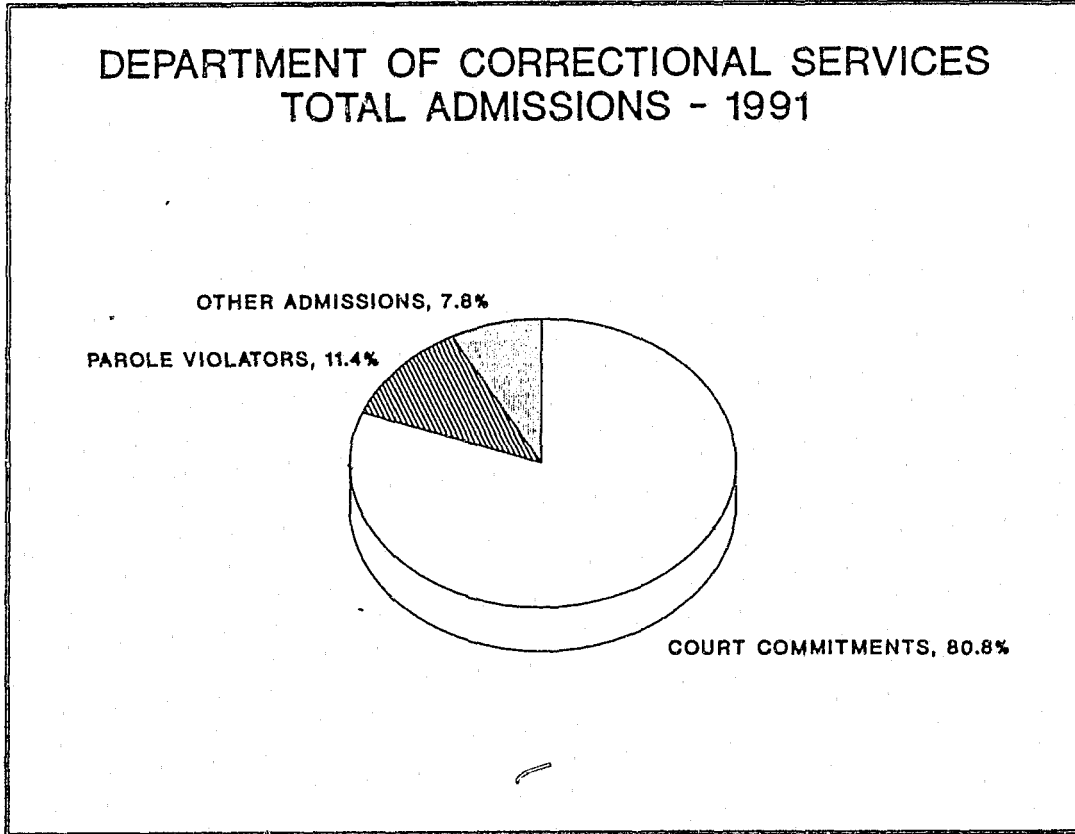

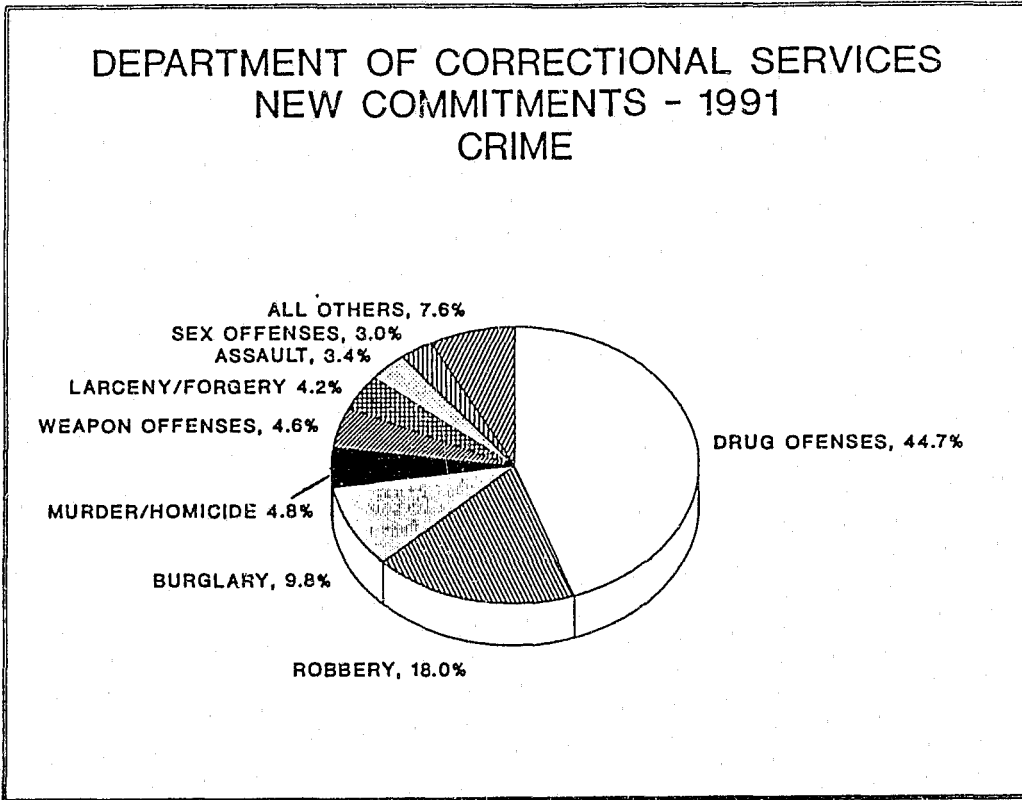

SECTION 2

Commitment Crime

The proportion of court commitments made up by drug offenders has grown dramatically in recent years. Drug offenders made up 37% (N=6,432) of court commitments in 1988, but they made up 45% (N=10,778) of new commitments in 1991. In general, 34% of 1991 new commitments were violent felony offenders, 45% drug offenders, 14% were committed for property crimes, 5% for other coercive crimes, and 2% were Youthful Offenders.

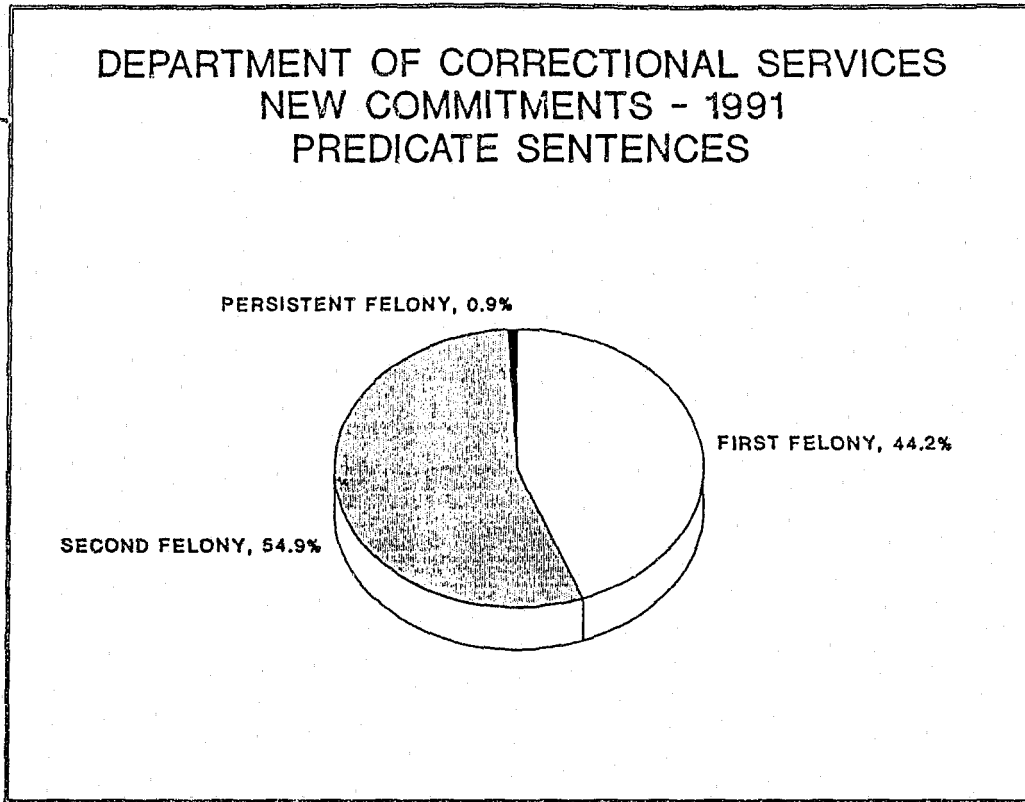

SECTION 3

Second Felony Offender Status

Forty-four percent of 1991 new court commitments were sentenced as first felony offenders (N = 10,653), 55% (N = 13,238) as second felony offenders and 1% (N = 225) as persistent felony offenders.

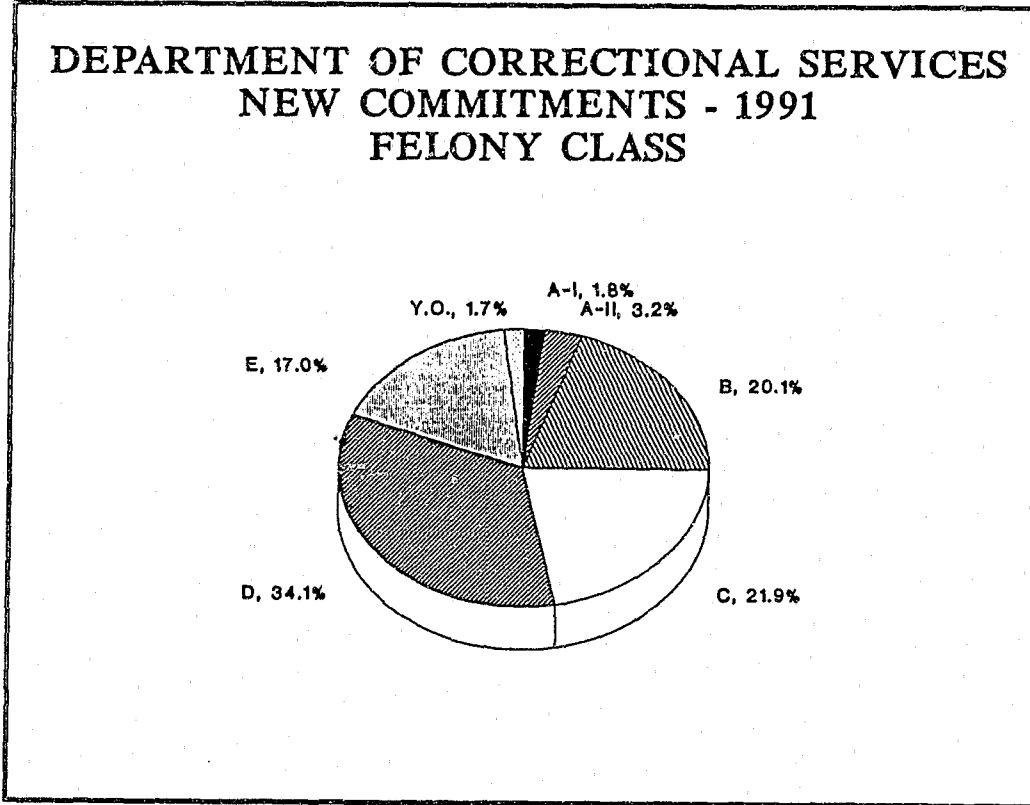

SECTION 4

Felony Class of Commitment Crime

Approximately 2% of 1991 new court commitments were Class A-I crimes. Class A-II offenses made up 3% of commitments; Class B felonies made up 20% of commitments; and Class C felony offenders made up 22% of commitments. Class D felony category was the largest at 34% of commitments. Class E felony offenders comprise 17%.

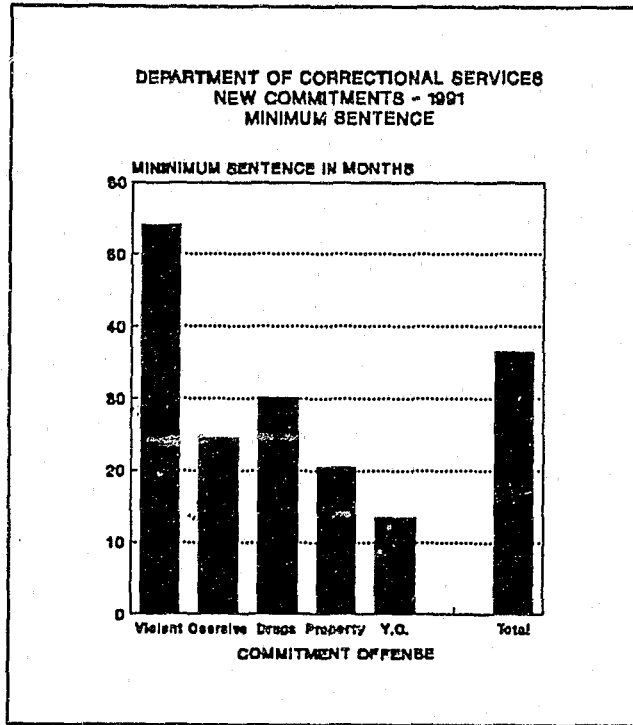

SECTION 5

Minimum Sentence

The minimum sentence reflects the shortest period of time that a person must serve before being considered for release on parole. The average minimum sentence for 1991 new court commitments was 36.5 months (the median was 24.0 months).

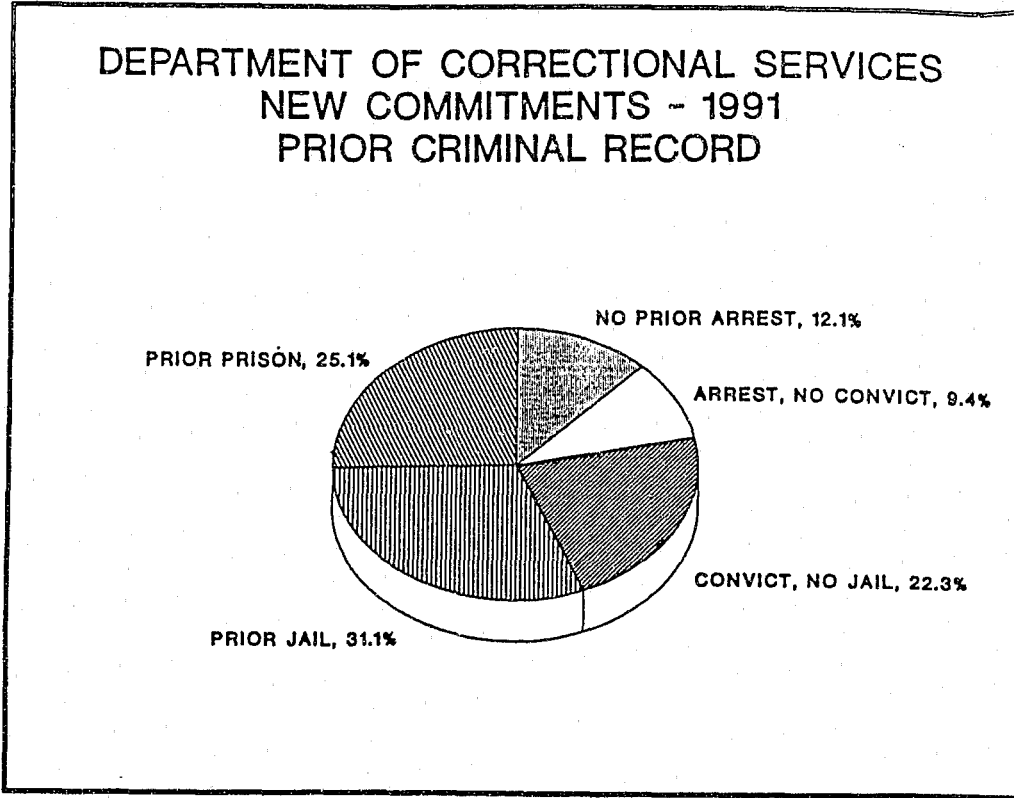

SECTION 6

Prior Adult Criminal Record

Examining the prior adult criminal record of 1991 new court commitments, 12% had no prior adult arrest, 9% had a prior adult arrest but no conviction, 22% had a prior conviction but received a sentence other than jail or prison, 31% had served a prior local jail sentence, and 25% had previously served a state or federal term.

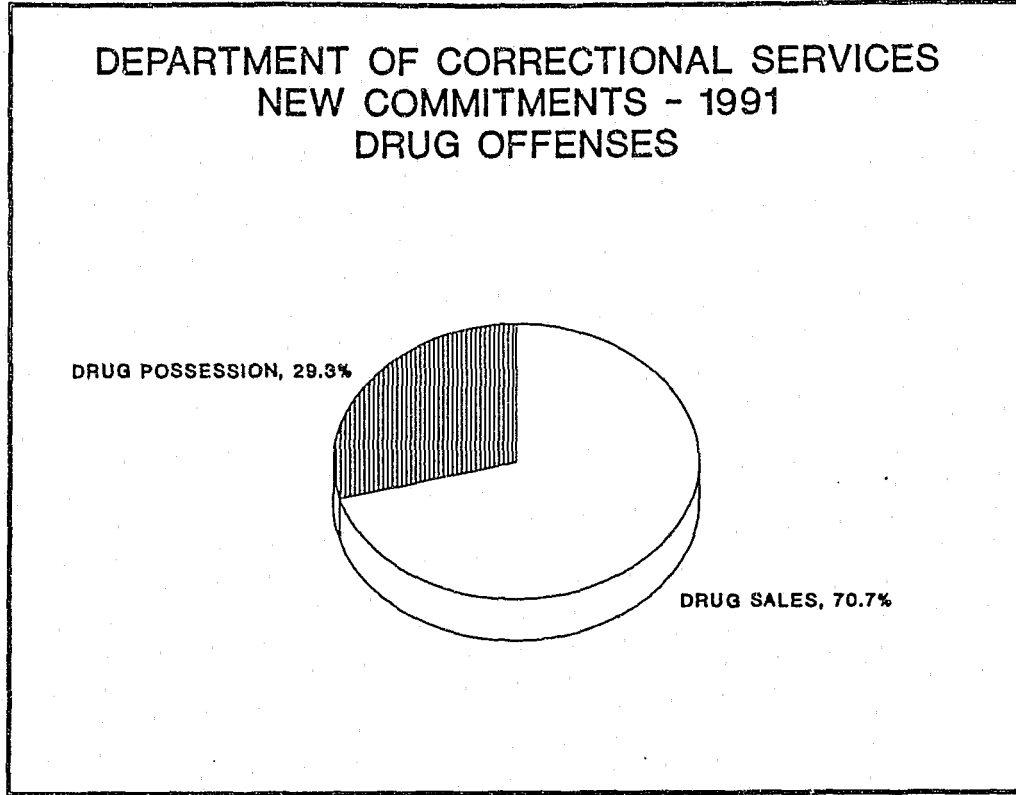

SECTION 7

Drug Offenses

The absolute number of drug offenders committed to state prison increased substantially between 1988 (N = 6,432) and 1991 (10,778). People committed for possession of controlled substances made up 22.6% of total drug commitments in 1988 (N = 1454) but they made up 29.3% of drug commitments in 1991 (N = 3153). This shift is due to more commitments for lower level class D and E drug possession offenses.

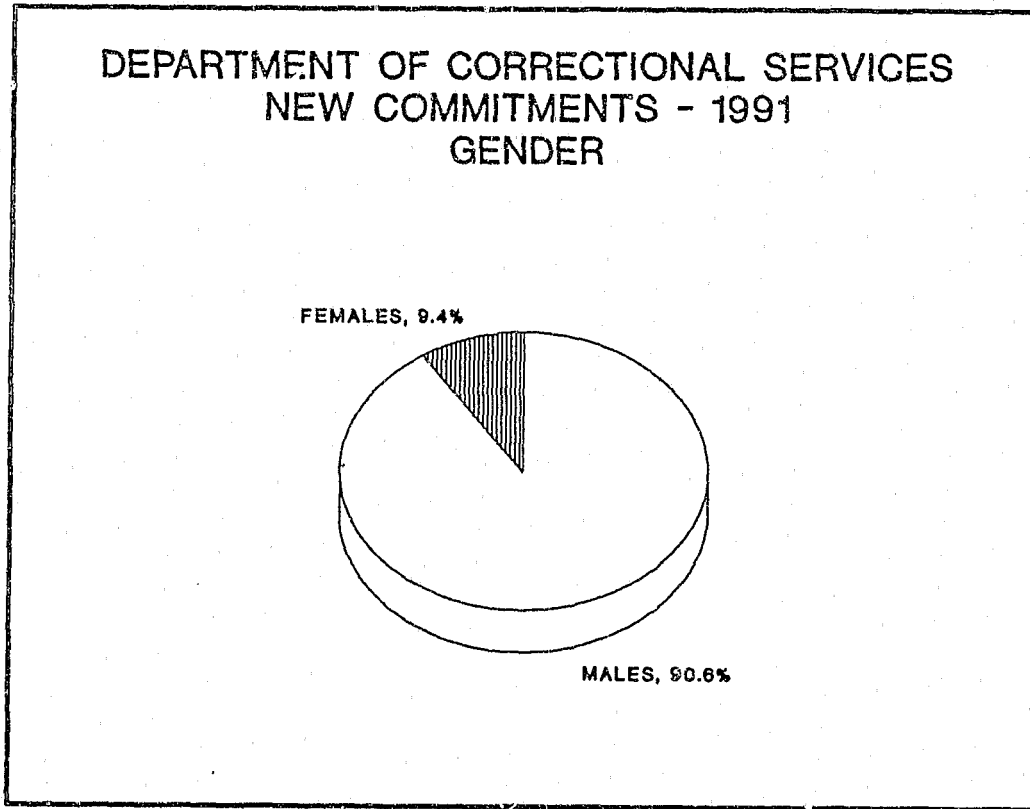

SECTION 8

Gender Status

Males made up 91% of 1991 new court commitments (N = 21,852), females 9% (N = 2,264). The number of female offenders committed to state prison has grown substantially in recent years from 495 (4%) in 1985, to 1,014 (6%) in 1988, to 2,264 (9%) in 1991.

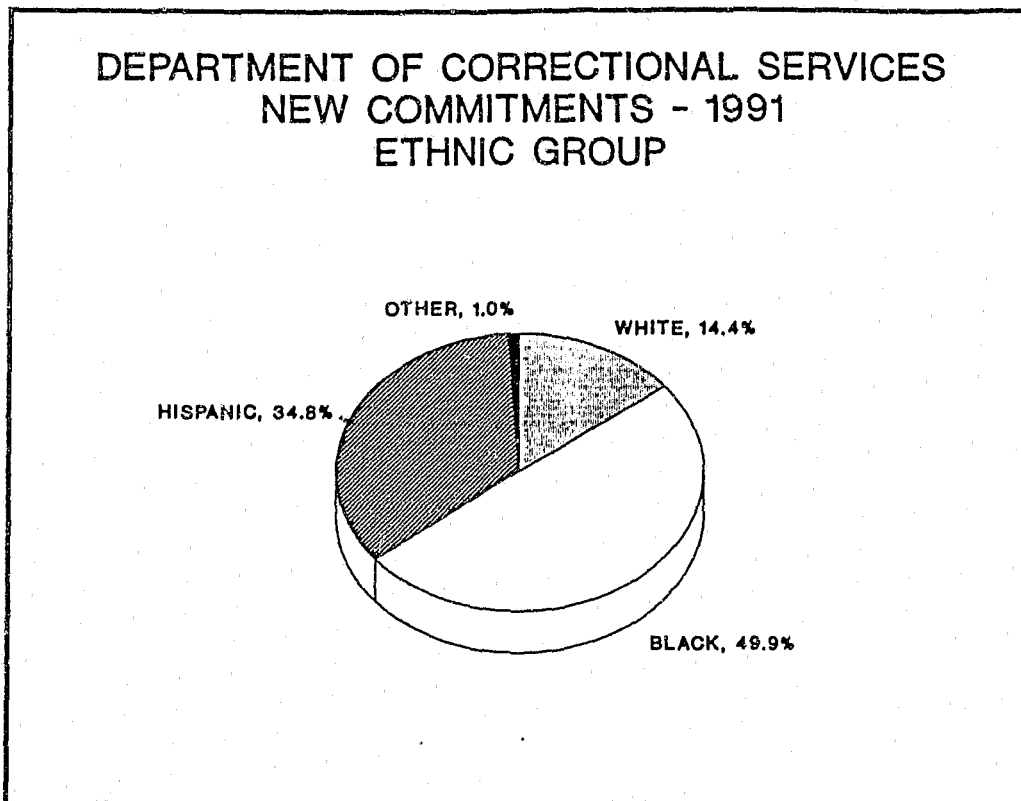

SECTION 9

Race/Ethnic Status

White offenders committed to state prison are made up of approximately one-third violent felony offenders, one-third property offenders and the remaining one-third other crimes. Black offenders are approximately one-third violent felony, one-half drug offenders and the remainder other crimes. Hispanic offenders committed to state prison in 1991 were approximately four-sevenths drug offenders, two-sevenths violent offenders and the remainder other crimes.

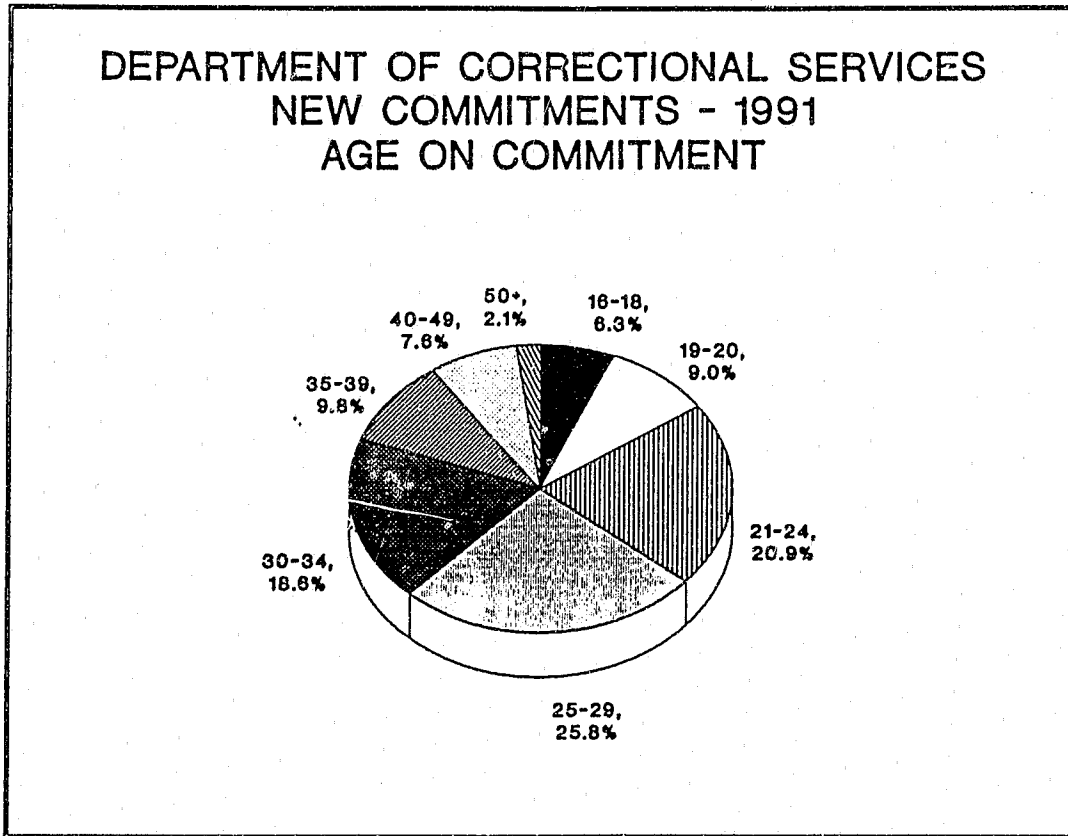

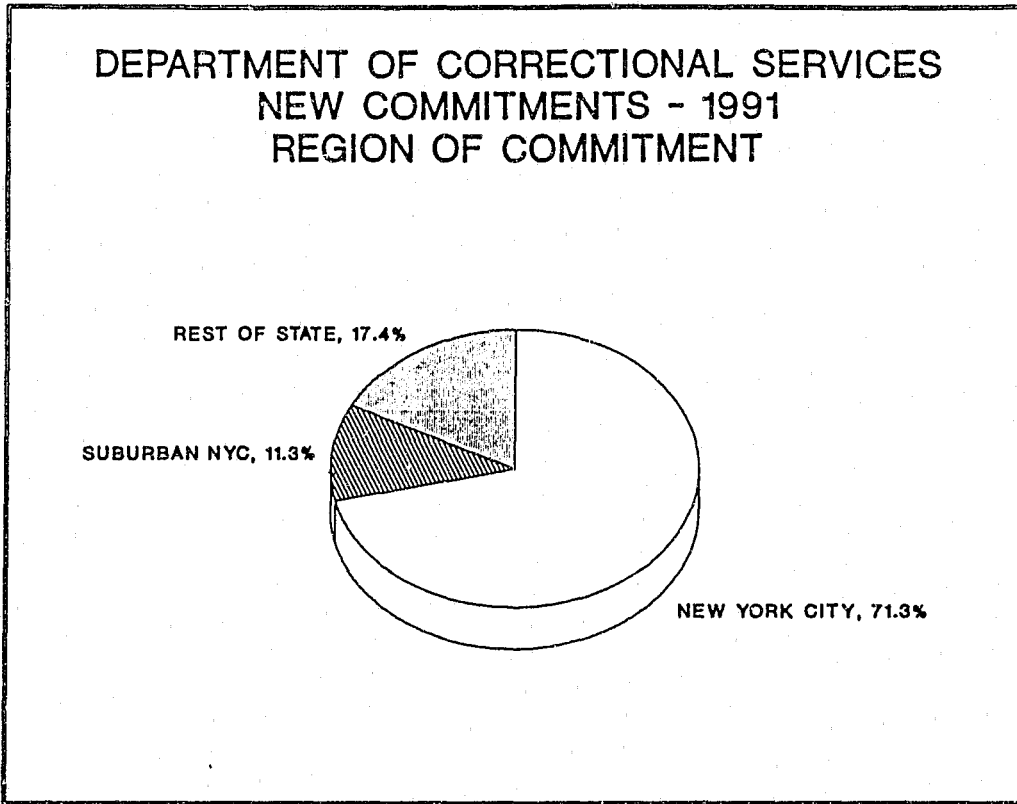

SECTION 11

Region of Commitment

In 1991, 71% of court commitments were from New York City, 11% were from suburban New York City counties, 10% were from upstate counties with a population center of 50,000 or more, and 8% were from the remaining upstate counties.

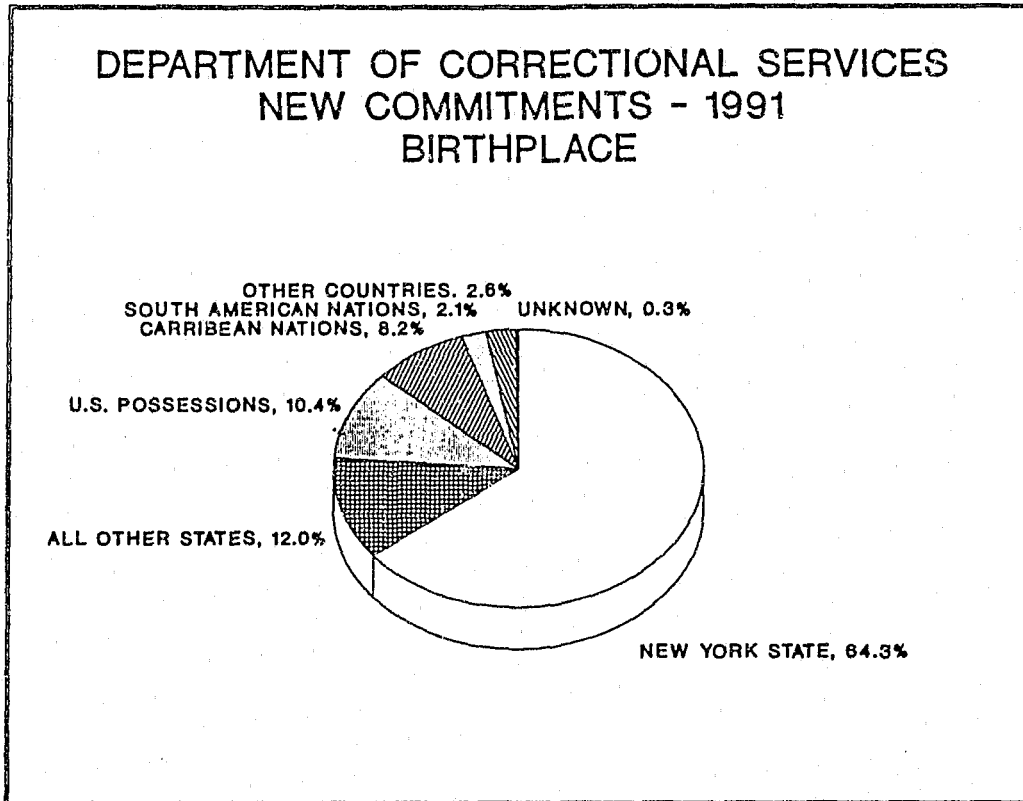

SECTION 12

Country of Birth

Among 1991 new court commitments 76% were born in the United States, 10% in United States Possessions, 8% in the island nations located in the Caribbean Sea, 2% from nations in South America, and 3% in other nations. As a percentage of total new court commitments foreign born inmates have increased from 11.5% in 1990 to 12.9% in 1991.

SECTION 13

Educational Level

The average educational level (based on last grade completed as reported by the inmate) among 1991 new court commitments is 10th grade. Based on tests administered at reception to the Department, the average reading level is 7th grade, the average mathematics level is 6th grade.

Marital Status

Seventy-four percent of 1991 new court commitments were not legally married, 17% were married, and 9% were divorced, widowed or separated.

SECTION 15

Jail Time

Time spent in a local jail prior to conviction or prior to commitment to state prison is credited toward service of the minimum term. On average, the length of time served in a local jail was approximately one month longer for new commitments in 1991 (average 6.4 months).
