

THE PEDDLER HANDBOOK

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LIEUTENANT ROBERT J. LOUTTIT COMMANDING OFFICER, P.B.M.S. PEDDLER TASK FORCE This booklet has been designed to help the uniformed Police Officer on patrol who is not a member of a Peddler Enforcement Unit.

It is every Police Officer's responsibility to enforce the law regarding street peddling. Illegal street peddler activity should not be tolerated by members on patrol.

Most peddler violations require the issuance of an E.C.B. Notice of Violation (NOV). Whenever these violations are observed members should take **PROMPT** action. Some violations require the removal of the peddler's goods and display materials. In these cases "member should ascertain the availability of property removal

cles before initiating any encounter with the vendor. If an appropriate vehicle is not available an E.C.B. (NOV) should be issued.

WHENEVER AN APPROPRIATE VEHICLE IS AVAILABLE THE VENDOR'S GOODS AND DISPLAY MATERIAL WILL BE REMOVED TO THE STATION HOUSE AND VOUCHERED AS PER PATROL GUIDE PROCEDURES (P.G. 113-33,34,41).

GENERAL VENDORS

General Vendor Defined: A person who peddles, sells, leases or offers for sale or lease at retail, goods or services, other than food in a public area.

All general vendors must possess a photo license issued by the Department of Consumer Affairs with the exception of vendors of written matter.

The license color changes every year.

Whenever a uniformed member of the service observes a coneral vendor who is unlicensed or operating in violation of the using laws and regulations he/she will take action as indicated:



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

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TNULE: whenever removal of a general vendor's property is deemed appropriate, the M.O.S. involved will bag, seal and label all such property in accordance with P.G. 113-33. This action will take place on the street, in front of the peddler whenever possible.



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FOOD VENDORS

Whenever a uniformed member of the service observes a food vendor who is unlicensed or operating in violation of the following laws and regulations he/she will take action as indicated.



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SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES

Any situation which may endanger public safety or obstruct the free flow of traffic, either pedestrian or vehicular.

- Action:-1) Notify vendor to stop all selling at the location and within one minute begin to move from the area.
 - 2) Inform the vendor of the extent of the prohibited area and the time frame that the vendor will not be able to sell. The vendor must move a sufficient distafrom the critical location to alleviate the existing condition.
 - A vendor who refuses to move or who returns within the prohibited time will be issued an E.C.B. N.O.V. and his goods, cart or vehicle will be seized. (P.G. 113-33)
 - P.G. 113-34 provides for the return of a licensed vendor's property at the station house. Food vendors will pay a fee, general vendors will nct.

Vendors of Written Matter

Persons who sell books or other written matter are exempt from the licensing provisions of the Administrative Code. Only certain sections of the law may be enforced against vendors of written matter, they are as follows:

NOTE: The 12' path rule under this section does not apply to vendors of written matter so long as a clear pedestrian path is maintained.

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ART VENDORS

Art vendors are afforded no special protection under the law. They are free to create art unfettered by governmental regulation or control. The sale of what they create is a different matter.

RELIGIOUS VENDORS

There is no special protection for religious peddlers under the laws of New York. However, because of the volatile nature of forcement in this area and because of the minimal interference when pedestrian traffic by these types of vendors within the Patrol Borough, it has been the policy to address religious peddler conditions with warnings to move or requests to reduce the size of their displays. These methods have proven effective in most instances. It is recommended that no action of a more severe nature be taken without first conferring with a supervisor in the command concerned.

STOOP LINE STANDS AND OTHER STORE FRONT DISPLAYS

Under Local Laws 13 and 15 of 1984 (commonly referred to as the SIDEWALK OBSTRUCTION LAW) goods of the same type as those sold within a store may be displayed on the sidewalk directly in front of the store up to 3 feet out from the building line of the store with certain exceptions. Those exceptions are clearly explained in Operations Order 66, series 1984.

Anyone in violation of this law is treated as an unlicensed general vendor or food vendor. An E.C.B. N.O.V. is issued to the person operating the sidewalk stand and in some cases to the storekeeper. All goods and display material from the building line out, are seized as a forfeiture and invoiced under P.G. 113-33, P.G. 113-34 and P.G. 113-41.

Certain areas of the city were exempted from this law a. a hearing was held by the Commissioner of Consumer Affairs. The flower market on Broadway between 25th Street and 30th Street and part of Delancey Street are the only two areas within Patrol Borough Manhattan South which are exempt. In all cases whenever an unlicensed vendor is arrested for Administrative Code 20-453, the arresting officer will:

- Check the most recent Department of Consumer Affairs General Vendor License Print-out to determine that the violator is in fact unlicensed.
- prepare an inquiry fingerprint card instead of the usual set of prints.
- notify P.B.M.S. Peddler Task Force of the facts of the arrest via telephone for entry in Peddler Arrest Log.

DISABLED VETERAN PEDDLERS

Under a recent Court decision interpreting section 32 and 35 of the General Business Law, licensed General Vendors who are veterans of the Armed Forces with service connected disabilities are exempt from the placement regulations imposed on peddlers by the city. These regulations include the restircted street and prohibited area rules.

The above information is merely an outline of relevant laws and regulations governing street vendor activity, Patrol Guide Sections and others pertaining to peddler enforcement. All members of P.B.M.S. assigned to peddler enforcement duty should be thoroughly familiar with the information contained in the following department directives and orders:
