#### AWARDED CLAIMS FOR NONECONOMIC LOSS (1994 CLAIMS BILL)

#### CV-91-286 <u>Auvil</u>

The 21-year-old claimant was shot in the arm, stomach, and side by an assailant in Marion County. An award of \$9,121.08 was granted for medical expenses, plus \$2,500.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-114a <u>Barnes</u>

The 31-year-old victim was shot and killed by her exhusband in Preston County. An award was granted for funeral expenses, plus \$5,000.00 each on behalf of the victim's two minor children for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-91-280 <u>Bennett</u>

The 79-year-old claimant was knocked to the ground during a purse-snatching incident in Cabell County, resulting in continuous pain in the left shoulder, and blurred vision. An award of \$327.68 was granted for her medical expenses, plus \$5,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-91-189 <u>Braqq</u>

Claimant's 44-year-old mother was shot and killed in Fayette County. An award of \$5,000.00 was granted for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-267 <u>Burton</u>

The 24-year-old claimant was intentionally struck by a motor vehicle in Cabell County, causing permanent injury to her left foot. Medical expenses were paid by a collateral source. An award of \$1,000.00 was granted for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-28 <u>Bush</u>

Claimant's 41-year-old husband was shot and killed in Kanawha County. Awards of \$5,000.00 each were granted on behalf of the victim's two minor children for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-93-8 Clark

The 35-year-old claimant was shot in the legs by an assailant in Kanawha County. His medical bills were covered by the Department of Health and Human Services. An award of \$5,000.00 was granted for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-125 <u>Dakon</u>

The 30-year-old claimant was struck in the back of the head with a club in Preston County. An award of \$35,000.00 was granted for his medical expenses, plus \$15,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-59 Davis

Claimant's 33-year-old wife was shot and killed in Mercer County. An award was granted for funeral expenses, plus \$1,000.00 each to the claimant and three minor children for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-294 <u>Dunkin</u>

The 53-year-old claimant was hit head-on by a drunk driver in Berkeley County. An award of \$35,000.00 was granted for medical expenses and work loss, plus \$15,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-36 Foster

The claimant's 54-year-old husband was killed in the line of duty as a firefighter in Ohio County. He became trapped in a burning building resulting from arson. Awards of \$10,000.00 each were granted to the victim's spouse and minor child for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-163 Fugate

The 30-year-old victim was shot and killed in Raleigh County. An award of \$1,000.00 was granted on behalf of the victim's minor child for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-92 Gentry

The 39-year-old claimant was shot in the hand and arm while on duty as a deputy sheriff in Raleigh County. His medical bills and primary work loss were covered by Workers' Compensation. He did incur work loss for his secondary income, and suffered permanent injuries. An award of \$35,000.00 was granted for future loss of income, plus \$15,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-91-292 <u>Green</u>

The 30-year-old claimant was shot in the abdomen by a neighbor in Cabell County. An award of \$2,000.00 was granted for pain and suffering.

#### CV-90-12a&b Hall

Claimants' 23-year-old daughter was shot and killed by her ex-boyfriend in Kanawha County. An award of \$35,000.00 was granted for medical and funeral expenses, and loss of support for the victim's minor child. An additional \$5,000.00 was granted for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-83 <u>Heilig</u>

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The 44-year-old claimant was the victim of an assault and battery in McDowell County. The unprovoked attack resulted in post traumatic stress disorder. An award of \$426.94 was granted for his medical expenses, plus \$2,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-265 Lemley

The 38-year-old claimant was severely beaten by two assailants in Wood County. He suffered permanent injury to the right arm and elbow. An award of \$1,459.56 was granted for claimant's medical expenses and work loss, plus \$5,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-308 Martin

The 24-year-old claimant was stabbed by an intruder at her residence in Kanawha County. She suffered permanent injury to her right hand. An award of \$21,350.20 was granted for medical expenses and work loss, plus \$10,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-91-121a Rucker

The claimant's 37-year-old husband was beaten to death in Kanawha County. Awards of \$2,000.00 each were granted on behalf of the victim's two minor children for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-345 <u>Shane</u>

The claimant's 15-year-old daughter was killed after being struck in the head with a baseball bat in Marshall County. An award of \$2,501.07 was granted for unreimbursed funeral expenses, plus \$10,000.00 for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-91-191 <u>Smith, S.</u>

Claimant's 16-year-old son was assaulted with a baseball bat in Fayette County. He suffered permanent hearing loss. An award of \$1,000.00 was granted for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-195 <u>Vanhoose</u>

The 49-year-old claimant was attacked and beaten at his residence in Cabell County. He suffered permanent disability of the left hand and forearm. An award of \$11,348.63 was granted for medical expenses and work loss, plus \$5,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-105 <u>Ward, M.</u>

The 21-year-old claimant was stabbed in the neck by a juvenile in Raleigh County. An award of \$1,080.20 was granted for medical expenses, plus \$2,500.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-335 <u>Ward, T.</u>

The 43-year-old claimant was severely beaten by an assailant in Wood County. He suffered a fractured skull, broken nose, and permanent damage to his left arm. An award of \$342.17 was granted for unreimbursed medical expenses, plus \$10,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-147 <u>Wayt</u>

The 31-year-old claimant was struck in the head by an assailant in Marshall County, resulting in the loss of an eye. An award of \$26,310.38 was granted for medical expenses, plus \$15,000.00 for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-253 <u>Wellman</u>

The 23-year-old claimant was parked in her vehicle in Cabell County when an assailant attacked her and repeatedly slammed the car door on her foot. Her medical expenses were paid by a collateral source, but an award of \$15,000.00 was granted for pain and suffering.

#### CV-92-84 <u>Wells</u> (Santer)

Claimant's 35-year-old sister was killed in an automobile accident involving a drunk driver in Wood County. An award was granted for funeral expenses, plus \$2,500.00 each on behalf of the victim's four minor children for sorrow and mental anguish.

#### CV-92-337 <u>Wisenbaler</u>

Claimant's 13-year-old son was the victim of a sexual assault in Marion County. His medical bills were paid by the Department of Health and Human Services. An award of \$2,000.00 was granted for pain and suffering.

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

## Federal Grants


Under the Federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984, federal monies became available to state compensation programs and victims assistance programs.

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, has allocated these funds to state compensation programs based on a formula of 35%-40% of the previous fiscal year claims awarded by each program.

West Virginia has received a total of \$2,171,000.00 in federal funds for its compensation program.



## W.Va. Crime Victims Compensation Fund Period Covers October 1 through September 30


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


Period Covered October 1 though September 30




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
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




## W.Va. Crime Victims Compensation Fund Crimes


Covers Period October 1 through September 30


