Section 29-7m of the Connecticut General Statutes mandates the Department of Public Safety to monitor, record and classify all crimes committed in the state which are motivated by bigotry and bias. Beginning July 1, 1988, the Division of State Police, with the cooperation of local law enforcement agencies throughout the state, began the collection of information on such crimes.

For an incident to be considered a **BIAS CRIME** (that is, a crime motivated by bias against another's race, religion, ethnicity, or sexual orientation), two criteria must be satisfied:

1. A crime, as defined in Section 53a-24 of the Connecticut General Statutes, must have been committed;
2. There must be probable cause to believe the crime was motivated by bias and bigotry with reference to the race, religion, ethnicity or sexual orientation of the intended victim.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- There were 137 crimes reported during 1993 which were motivated by bias against another's race, religion, ethnicity or sexual orientation. This represents an increase of 52.2% in the number of bias crimes reported during 1993 as compared to the previous year.

- Two training sessions were held in 1993 to help police officers determine whether a crime was motivated by bigotry and bias. This may have had an effect on the increase in the number of police departments submitting reports in 1993.

- Crime motivated by racial bigotry accounted for 56.2% of bias crimes, while 2.9% appeared to target both racial and religious groups.

- Crimes motivated by religious bigotry accounted for 25.5% of bias crimes; Anti-Semitism motivated 29 of the 35 religious bias crimes.

- Physical force or a dangerous weapon was used in 24.1% of the bias motivated crimes.

Please note that percents may add to slightly greater than or less than 100.0 due to rounding.

Pertinent Legislation

Pertinent Legislation

C.G.S. Sec. 29-7m. Record and classification of crimes motivated by bigotry and bias. On and after July 1, 1988, the division of state police within the department of public safety shall monitor, record and classify all crimes committed in the state which are motivated by bigotry and bias.

C.G.S. Sec. 53a-24. Offense defined. Application of sentencing provisions to motor vehicle and drug selling violators. (a) The term "offense" means any crime or violation which constitutes a breach of any law of this state or of any other state or of federal law or local law or ordinance of a political subdivision of this state, for which a sentence to a term of imprisonment or to a fine, or both, may be imposed, except one that defines a motor vehicle violation or is deemed to be an infraction. The term "crime" comprises felonies and misdemeanors. Every offense which is not a "crime" is a "violation." Conviction of a violation shall not give rise to any disability or legal disadvantage based on conviction of a criminal offense.

C.G.S. Sec. 53a-25. Felony: Definition, classification, designation. (a) Any offense for which a person may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment in excess of one year is a felony.

(b) Felonies are classified for the purposes of sentence as follows: (1) Class A, (2) class B, (3) class C, (4) class D, (5) unclassified and (6) capital felonies for which the sentence of death may be imposed as provided in sections 53a-46a and 53a-46b.

(c) The particular classification of each felony defined in this chapter is expressly designated in the section defining it. Any offense defined in any other section of the general statutes which, by virtue of any expressly specified sentence, is within the definition set forth in subsection (a) shall be deemed an unclassified felony.

C.G.S. Sec. 53a-26. Misdemeanor: Definition, classification, designation. (a) An offense for which a person may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of not more than one year is a misdemeanor.

(b) Misdemeanors are classified for the purpose of sentence as follows: (1) Class A, (2) class B, (3) class C and (4) unclassified.

(c) The particular classification of each misdemeanor defined in this chapter is expressly designated in the section defining it. Any offense defined in any other section of the general statutes which, by virtue of an expressly specified sentence, is within the definition set forth in subsection (a) shall be deemed an unclassified misdemeanor.

C.G.S. Sec. 46a-58 (Formerly Sec 53-34). Deprivation of rights. Desecration of property. Cross burning. Penalty. (a) It shall be a discriminatory practice in violation of this section for any person to subject, or cause to be subjected, any other person to the deprivation of any rights privileges or immunities, secured or protected by the constitution or laws of this state or of the United States, on account of religion, national origin, alienage, color, race, sex, blindness or physical disability.

(b) Any person who intentionally desecrates any public property, monument or structure, or any religious object, symbol or house of religious worship or any cemetery, or any private structure not owned by such person, shall be in violation of subsection (a). For purposes of this subsection, "desecrate" means to mar, deface or damage as a demonstration of irreverence or contempt.

(c) Any person who places a burning cross or a simulation thereof on any public property, or on any private property without the written consent of the owner, shall be in violation of subsection (a).

(d) Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor, except that if property is damaged as a consequence of such violation in an amount in excess of one thousand dollars, such person shall be guilty of a class D felony.

C.G.S. Sec. 53-37. Ridicule on account of race, creed or color. Any person who, by his advertisement, ridicules or holds up to contempt any person or class of persons, on account of the creed, religion, color, denomination, nationality or race of such person or class of persons, shall be fined not more than fifty dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty days or both.

C.G.S. Sec. 53-37a. Deprivation of a person's civil rights by person wearing mask or hood: Class D felony. Any person who, with the intent to subject, or cause to be subjected, any other person to the deprivation of any rights, privileges or immunities, secured or protected by the constitution or laws of this state or of the United States, on account of religion, national origin, alienage, color, race, sex, blindness or physical disability, violates the provisions of section 46a-58 while wearing a mask, hood or other device designed to conceal the identity of such person shall be guilty of a class D felony.

C.G.S. Sec. 53a-181b. Intimidation based on bigotry or bias: Class D felony. (a) A person is guilty of intimidation based on bigotry or bias if such person maliciously, and with specific intent to intimidate or harrass another person because of such other person's race, religion, ethnicity or sexual orientation, does any of the following: (1) Causes physical contact with such other person; (2) damages, destroys or defaces any real or personal property of such other person; or (3) threatens, by word or act, to do an act described in subdivision (1) or (2), if there is reasonable cause to believe that an act described in subdivision (1) or (2) will occur. For the purposes of this section, "sexual orientation" means having a preference for heterosexuality, homosexuality or bisexuality, having a history of such preference or being identified with such preference, but excludes any behavior which constitutes a violation of part IV of this chapter.

(b) The provisions of this section and section 53a-40a shall not be deemed to expand the civil rights of any person against whom an act described in subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection (a) of this section occurs or is threatened beyond those which existed prior to October 1, 1990.

(c) Intimidation based on bigotry or bias is a class D felony.

C.G.S. Sec. 53a-40a. Persistent offenders of crimes involving bigotry or bias. Authorized sentences. (a) A persistent offender of crimes involving bigotry or bias is a person who (1) stands convicted of a violation of section 46a-58 or 53-37a or subsection (a) or (c) of section 53a-181b and (2) has been, prior to commission of the present crime, convicted of a violation of section 46a-58 or 53-37a or subsection (a) or (c) of section 53a-181b.

(b) When any person has been found to be a persistent offender of crimes involving bigotry or bias, and the court is of the opinion that his history and character and the nature and circumstances of his criminal conduct indicate that an increased penalty will best serve the public interest, the court shall: (1) In lieu of imposing the sentence authorized for the crime under section 53a-35a if the crime is a felony, impose the sentence of imprisonment authorized by said section for the next more serious degree of felony, or (2) in lieu of imposing the sentence authorized for the crime under section 53a-36, if the crime is a misdemeanor, impose the sentence of imprisonment authorized by said section for the next more serious degree of misdemeanor, except that if the crime is a class A misdemeanor the court shall impose the sentence of imprisonment for a class D felony as authorized by section 53a-35a.
