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DEFINITIONS

Apprehension occurs when an individual under the age of 18 is taken into custody by a law enforcement officer on the basis that the individual has committed a crime.

Arrest occurs when an individual age 18 and over is taken into custody by a law enforcement officer on the basis that the individual has committed a crime.

Apprehension/Arrest Rate is the number of juvenile apprehensions and adult arrests made for an offense or group of offenses per 100,000 population.

Serious Crime includes the offenses of murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, auto theft and arson.

Serious Crime Rate is the number of serious crimes known or reported to law enforcement agencies per 100,000 population.

Property Crime includes the serious offenses of burglary, larceny, auto theft and arson.


Property Crime Rate is the number of property crimes known or reported to law enforcement agencies per 100,000 population.

Violent Crime includes the serious offenses of murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault.

Violent Crime Rate is the number of violent crimes known or reported to law enforcement agencies per 100,000 population.

Note: These definitions are similar to the official FBI definitions.

Minnesota Population Juvenile Females 10 to 17 Year Olds





Percent Female Apprehensions of Juvenile Apprehensions


Part I Crimes





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Juvenile Female Apprehensions Part I Crimes




Juvenile Female Apprehension Rates Part I Crimes (per 100,000 population)




Part I - Property Crime (per 100,000 population)





Juvenile Female Apprehension Rates Part II Crimes (per 100,000 population)



During the spring of 1992, the Minnesota Student Survey was conducted. Approximately 131,000 students in grades 6th, 9th and 12th from all but one of Minnesota's public school districts participated. The survey was an anonymous, selfadministered, paper-and-pencil questionnaire completed in classrooms in the presence of school personnel.

NOTE:

Of the approximate 131,000 responses to the 1992 student survey, approximately

22,900 represented females in 6th grade, 22,400 represented females in 9th grade and

16,600 represented females in 12th grade.
