INTRODUCTION

History

In the 1930s, the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) developed the Uniform Crime Reporting Program to provide a uniform method of aggregating crime in the United States. Due to the great variation in definitions of criminal offenses, standardized definitions were adopted for all offenses to provide nation wide uniformity. Since the development of the UCR program, law enforcements information needs have changed and data processing capabilities have greatly increased while the UCR program remained virtually unchanged.

The Michigan UCR Program was instituted in 1959 when the State Police requested all Law Enforcement agencies to voluntarily submit crime data for the purpose of compiling a uniform crime report. The enactment of Michigan Public Act 319 in 1968, spurred the growth of the UCR program by making submission of crime data mandatory. The UCR program collected aggregate (summary) counts of offense and arrest information on all reported crimes.

In 1976, the Michigan UCR program introduced an incident reporting system known as the Law Enforcement Management System (LEMS). It was the intent of LEMS to provide agencies with valid crime data to assist them in the management of their respective departments, but this never became a reality due to state budgetary problems.

In 1979 and 1980, a committee of representatives of the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police (MACP) and the Michigan Sheriffs Association (MSA) requested that much of the management information collected under LEMS be reduced and only a minimum amount of criminal data (required by the FBI UCR program) be collected. Therefore, the incident system was redesigned, implemented in 1982, and became known as the Incident Reporting System (IRS).

In 1986, the Michigan UCR Program developed an on-line batch program to allow agencies with Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) terminals to submit their incident reports. At that time, the UCR program was collecting IRS/UCR information via eight different methods of reporting (incident forms, four different tape formats, punch cards, on-line, summary forms). Accuracy and timeliness of the crime data became an issue. To improve the integrity of the UCR Program, a committee was formed representing the automated contributors of police and sheriffs departments. This committee proposed solutions to 10 problems they saw as contributing to the inaccuracy and untimeliness of the UCR data. These proposals included but were not limited to reduction in reporting methods, need for documentation, regular training sessions, monthly newsletters to the agencies, and edit checking by automated agencies.

Since the introduction of LEMS in 1976, the Michigan UCR program has operated dual systems. Ninety-three percent of the contributors participate in the incident system reporting seventy-one percent of the state's crime statistics. The remaining twenty-nine percent is reported by agencies on the summary system. Currently, reporting IRS/UCR data has been reduced to six different methods. Many of the problems identified by the Automated Committee still exist today due to inadequate staffing to handle the manual processes in the UCR program.

National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS)

Following an extensive study requested by the IACP and NSA (National Sheriffs Association), <u>Blueprint for the Future of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program</u> published in 1985, provided the guidelines and specifications used to develop NIBRS. In 1988, this national incident-based system was unanimously endorsed by the Nation's law enforcement community, the FBI Director, and the Attorney General. Implementation of NIBRS began in 1989.

The goals of the National Incident-Based Reporting System have been defined as:

- 1. To enhance the quantity, quality, and timeliness of crime statistical data collected by the law enforcement community.
- To improve the methodology used for compiling, analyzing, auditing, and publishing the collected crime data.

NIBRS provides additional information to be collected in the following areas:

- Detailed collection of victim and offender data.
- Collection of drug information.
- Increase in offenses from 8 index crimes to 46 offenses.
- Alcohol/drug involvement in all offenses.
- Crime locations.
- Correlation between reported incidents and arrests.
- Reporting of all offenses occurring in the incident.

NIBRS Group A and Group B Offense Definitions

NIBRS has grouped the 46 offenses into Group A and Group B. The two groupings are based on the amount of reporting required for each by the state program. Both incidents and arrests are reported for Group A offenses and only arrests are reported for Group B offenses. (See Section V for Group A and B offenses.)

The difference in reporting treatment recognizes the inherent qualities of offenses which dictate that some are appropriate indicators of the dimensions and trends in crime on a national scale (Group A) while others are not (Group B).

The following criteria were used in deciding whether a crime was to be designated as a Group A Offense: (1) The seriousness or significance of the offense; (2) the frequency or volume of its occurrence; (3) how widespread the offense occurs in the United States; (4) whether the offense will come to the attention of law enforcement; (5) whether law enforcement is the best channel for collecting data regarding the offense; (6) the burden placed on law enforcement in collecting data on the offense; (7) the national statistical validity and usefulness of the collected data; and (8) the National UCR Program's responsibility to make crime data available not only to law enforcement but to others having a legitimate interest in it.

Michigan UCR Program Redesign

In 1989, the UCR Program with the endorsement of the MACP and MSA, applied for a Federal grant from the Bureau of Justice Statistics to redesign the UCR program in Michigan.

It was determined that the UCR Program was in need of a redesign for the following reasons:

- The UCR program can no longer support a dual reporting system. The Auditor General has recommended to eliminate the collection of summary data.
- The current incident reporting programs have been modified to correct reporting problems which has resulted in inconsistent data collection.
- The need to reassess the training program.
- The need to resolve the problems/solutions identified by the Automated Committee.
- Pressure from local departments currently looking at inhouse computer systems and UCR software.
- The need to further automate the UCR process.
- The need to develop an audit process for the reporting of UCR statistics.

Overview of MICR

The redesign goal of the UCR program is to automate the UCR process as much as possible. The MICR system will be an on-line update system (although we are designing for some batch processing, i.e. tapes and paper submission). As data is submitted and edited, an acceptance or error message is immediately returned to the submitting agency. The data base is immediately updated with the incidents/information which passed all editing.

MICR is being developed to allow an on-line computer-to-computer interface for those agencies with their own computer systems and direct line access instead of submitting data via 9-track tape.

The screens/record formats are being designed so the majority of the incidents (approximately 95% of all incidents will have one offense, one victim and one offender/arrest) can be entered on one screen/record format. Additional screens/record formats are provided to report additional victims, offenders, arrests, and property.

The screens/record formats for the MICR system will apply to all types of submission of incident data; regardless if data is submitted via on-line, computer-to-computer interface, 9-track tape, or paper. This will decrease the confusion and training of agencies switching from one mode of submission to another.

Eventually, all agencies will be on one incident system. At the time the MICR system is implemented, the summary collection of data will cease. Those agencies currently submitting summary data will be required to change to the MICR system. Those agencies which are currently on-line or submit paper will be the first agencies to implement MICR. Current automated (tape) agencies will implement as their automated systems are rewritten and tested.

MICR will retain two calendar years of data on the on-line MICR data base. This will provide less chance of error and duplication in reporting of incident information. The agencies will have access to current year and the most previous year data. Output reports are being designed to provide comparison data to contributing agencies.

Changes in Incident Reporting

The state program has applied the NIBRS Data Collection Guidelines and Data Submission Specifications to develop the MICR system. Keeping in mind the state programs experience with LEMS, all NIBRS data elements will be collected but not to the extent of the Federal program. The MICR system reflects changes in the current incident system as follows:

1. Offense File Classes

In order to accurately categorize offenses for NIBRS, the current file classes have been expanded. The UCR state program has provided enhanced crime definitions and requirements for each offense. The fields indicating the types of larceny, arson, and motor vehicle theft have been eliminated as this information will be gathered through other elements. The state program will collect four offenses per incident.

2. Domestic Assault

Michigan is required by law to collect domestic assault information. The UCR program has had difficulty providing a meaningful domestic assault report in part due to inconsistent domestic assault definitions, interpretations of the definitions by special interest groups, law enforcement training, etc. Therefore, the MICR system will not contain a domestic assault flag/indicator. Reports will be generated using the offense file class and victim to offender relationships based on the definition/requirements of the interest group requesting the report.

3. Homicides

All homicide information will be collected through the incident system. A supplementary homicide report will no longer be submitted. The circumstance information previously collected only on supplementary homicide reports has been expanded to aggravated assault offenses also.

4. Victim Information

Victim records will be required for all incidents defined by the FBI as Group A offenses along with Negligent Homicide Vehicle/Boat and Nonviolent Family Offenses. Types of victims have been expanded to include society, government, religious organizations, and financial institutions.

5. Property Information

Property information has been expanded to include seized, counterfeited, burned, and damaged. Property recovered for another jurisdiction will no longer be collected. Arson and motor vehicle theft information will be collected as part of the property record. Collection of drug information will provide some insight on the types and amounts of drugs being seized on a regional and state-wide basis.

- 6. Offender Information Offender data will be required for all incidents defined by the FBI as Group A offenses including Negligent Homicide Vehicle/Boat and Nonviolent Family Offenses. Offender information replaces the current suspect information.
- 7. Arrest Information
 A clearance field on all arrest records will indicate if the arrest clears more than one incident. In the event of an arrest clearing more than one incident, the current incident system allows the arrest to be submitted on one incident and nothing to be submitted on the other incidents that the one arrest clears. (Inflation of arrest data results if the arrest is submitted on more than one incident). More accurate clearance rates should be obtained from the MICR system.
- 8. Alcohol/Drug/Computer Related
 Offense records will indicate if the offender used alcohol, drugs, and/or
 computer equipment to perpetrate the offense.
- 9. Bias Motivation
 Federal legislation passed in 1990 and state legislation passed in
 December, 1991, has added the collection of bias motivation information
 to NIBRS and MICR.
- 10. Data Modification

 The current incident system allows agencies to change information on the data base by submitting a supplement with the new information. This will not occur in the MICR system. Very little information can be modified. If the information on the MICR data base is incorrect, a "replacement" incident can be submitted which will delete the incident on the data base and replace it with the new incident data submitted.
- 11. Incident Status
 The MICR system will not collect information on the status of an incident. The only information required by NIBRS is exceptional clearance and the exceptional clearance date. Unfounded incidents will not be collected in the MICR system. Incidents must be deleted if unfounded after the original was submitted.

Conclusion

The redesign of the incident reporting and uniform crime reporting systems will provide a uniform method of reporting crime information throughout the state. This will result in the ability to share statistical information across the state and provide more detailed information in relation to incidents, victims, offenders, and property. The redesigned system will provide the descriptive characteristics and tools necessary for managing resources, policy analysis, program development, and research.

GUIDELINES

OVERVIEW OF DATA SUBMITTED FOR AN INCIDENT

An incident report may consist of many possible combinations of circumstances ranging from a simple situation involving only one offense, one victim, and one offender, to a complex set of several offenses, victims, offenders, property losses, and arrests. In addition, each of the victims may not be involved in every offense. Nor will all offenders have victimized the same victims.

Definition of Terms

Base Date is January 1st of the first year of two years of data retained on the on-line MICR data base.

Date Range is measured from the current date back to January 1st of the previous year. For example, if today's date is August 13, 1994, the date range for MICR data base will be between January 1, 1993, and August 13, 1994.

Start Date is the date an agency begins submitting MICR data. Agencies will be required to begin submitting MICR data on the 1st of the month, not in the middle.

Window Updates are updates of exceptional clearance, arrests, and/or recovered property for incidents that occurred prior to the agency submitting MICR data or prior to the base date of the on-line MICR data base. The Exceptional Clearance Date, Date of Arrest, and Date Recovered must occur in the date range for the MICR data base.

Incident is defined as one or more offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time and place.

Concept of Time and Place provides: If more than one crime was committed by the same person or group of persons and the time and space intervals separating them were insignificant, all of the crimes make up a single incident. The Concept of Time and Place is applied to determine whether a group of crimes constitute a single incident. This is of crucial importance since the application of the concept will determine whether the crimes are to be reported as individual incidents or as a single incident comprised of multiple offenses.

Acting in Concert requires the offenders actually commit or assist in the commission of the crime(s). The offenders must be aware of, and consent to, the commission of the crime(s); or, even if nonconsenting, their actions assist in the commission of the offense(s). This is important because all of the offenders in an incident are considered to have committed all of the offenses in the incident. If one or more of the offenders did not act in concert, then there is more than one incident involved.

Same Time and Place refers to the time interval between the offenses and the distance between the locations where they occurred were insignificant. Normally, the offenses must have occurred during an unbroken time duration and at the same or adjoining location(s). However, incidents can also be comprised of offenses which by their nature involve continuing criminal

activity by the same offender(s) at different times and places, as long as the activity is deemed to constitute a single criminal transaction. Because it is not possible to provide instructions which will cover all of the possible fact situations which might occur, in some cases the reporting agency will have to use its best judgment in determining how many incidents were involved.

Special Offense Circumstances

Justifiable Homicide (Offense File Class 0900-4) - Due to circumstances involved in this offense, the justifiable homicide and the offense which gave rise to it are reported as separate incidents. For the justifiable homicide, code the police officer or civilian who killed the criminal as the "offender" and the criminal who was killed as the "victim". These instructions are based on the definition of an "incident" which requires that all of the offenders "act in concert". If the "justified" killer committed another offense in connection with the justifiable homicide (e.g., illegal possession of the gun he/she used), that offense would constitute a third incident (the second being the offense committed by the criminal who was killed).

Offenses Where Participants are Both Victims and Offenders - There are cases such as domestic disputes and bar fights which the participants are both victims and offenders. Technically, these types of cases involve multiple incidents because, although the offenders assaulted each other, it cannot be said that they were "acting in concert", especially in the assault on themselves. To alleviate any burden on police officers to report multiple incidents and most law enforcement will report these cases as a single incident, the Victim to Offender Relationship data element includes the code "VICTIM WAS OFFENDER" to provide a means for reporting these cases as a single incident. However, the agency must decide whether to report these types of cases as a single incident with multiple victims and offenders or as multiple incidents.

Data Retention for MICR

The state program will retain two calendar years data on the on-line MICR data base (current plus one previous year). January 1st of the previous year will be the "base date" for determining on-line MICR data base incidents.

For example, if the state program begins accepting MICR data on January 1, 1993, this will be the base date for two years. On December 31, 1994, the on-line MICR data base will contain two years of data. In January 1995, a master back-up tape will be created with the 1993 incident data. The 1993 incident data will be removed from the MICR data base except for exceptional clearances, arrests, and recovered property records that relate to reports that have clearance, arrest, and/or recovered dates occurring in 1994.

Record Types

An incident is comprised of six record types involving 61 data elements which describe the circumstances of the incident. Not all record types will be used for each incident but the circumstances of the incident will dictate what record types are used. These six record types include:

1. Administrative - provides administrative information regarding the overall incident. This information is only submitted one time per incident.

- 2. Offense provides information about each offense involved in the incident. Up to four offenses can be submitted per incident.
- 3. Offender provides information about the offender(s) involved in the incident. Up to 99 offenders can be submitted per incident.
- 4. Victim provides information about the victim(s) involved in the incident. Up to 99 victims can be submitted per incident.
- 5. Arrest provides information about the arrest(s) involved in the incident. Up to 99 arrests can be submitted per incident.
- 6. Property provides information about the various types of property involved in the incident. Up to 99 property items can be submitted per incident.

Screens/Formats

Incident data is submitted to the state program using one to five screens/formats. These five screens/formats include:

- Incident (MICR.1) used to submit original incidents which includes the administrative, four offenses, one offender, one victim, one arrest and four property items. This screen/format is used for the submission of administrative, offense, one arrest, and four recovered property items for window update records. It can also be used for delete, replace and inquiry transactions. This is the only screen/format which uses the modify action code.
- 2. Offender (MICR.3) used to submit additional offender records for an incident. An original incident must be resident on the data base. This screen/format is used to delete individual offender records and to inquiry all offender records for an incident.
- 3. <u>Victim (MICR.5)</u> used to submit additional victim records for an incident. An original incident must be resident on the data base. This screen/format is used to delete individual victim records and to inquiry all victim records for an incident.
- 4. Arrest (MICR.7) used to submit additional arrest records for an incident. An original incident must be resident on the data base unless the arrest is a window update record. This screen/format is used to delete individual arrest records and to inquiry all arrest records for an incident.
- 5. Property (MICR.9) used to submit additional property records for an incident. An original incident must be resident on the data base unless the property is a window update record. This screen/format is used to delete individual property records and to inquiry all property records for an incident.

Determining What Data to Submit to MICR

This section explains how to determine what data to send to MICR. For instance, incidents will require different records depending on the start date of the local agency and the base date of the MICR system.

The on-line MICR data base will consist of complete incidents with an original date of report occurring in the date range. It will also consist of window update records for those incidents which occurred prior to the base date or prior to the agency start date.

If the original date of report is after the base date and after the date the agency begins submitting MICR data, follow the procedures for Complete Incident Submission. For window update incidents, follow the procedures under Window Update Submissions.

COMPLETE INCIDENT SUBMISSION

Original Incident Submission

Original incident submission is used for initial submission of the incident or resubmission if the incident was deleted by the agency or rejected by the state program due to errors.

Original incident data is submitted using the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record with an Action of "O" (ORIGINAL). Administrative and Offense information is required for all original incidents. Victim and Offender information is required for all original incidents with an offense that is defined by the FBI as a Group A offense. If entering a "Crime against Property", Kidnapping, or Gambling; a Property record is also required.

Following are the minimum mandatory data elements which must be entered for each original incident. Completion of other data elements may be required depending on the codes entered in these required data elements.

EXCEPTION: No criminal data to report, see page I-18.

Adding Incident Information

To add supplemental offenders, victims, arrests, and property using the Offender (MICR.3), Victim (MICR.5), Arrest (MICR.7), or Property (MICR.9) transaction record with an Action of "A" (ADD). An original incident must be present on the data base before data can be added.

Following are the minimum mandatory data elements required for each type of transaction record. Other data elements are required depending on the supplemental information being added.

Modifying Incident Information

The only information on the incident which can be modified is Exceptional Clearance and Exceptional Clearance Date. Use the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record with an Action of "M" (MODIFY).

Following are the mandatory data elements required to modify the Exceptional Clearance and Exceptional Clearance Date.

If an incident was initially entered as exceptionally cleared and needs to be changed so an arrest can be added, the incident may be modified and leave the Exceptional Clearance and Exceptional Clearance Date (data elements 11 and 12) blank. All other information cannot be modified. To change data in the administrative (excluding exceptional clearance and exceptional clearance date) and offense records, the entire incident must be deleted and re-entered. Individual offender, victim, arrest, or property records can be changed by first deleting that individual record and re-entering only that individual record with the correct information.

Replacing Incident Information

To replace incident information, the required data elements must be completed as if entering an original incident. All edits will apply as if entering an original incident. This action will first delete the entire incident on the data base and replace it with the information contained in the screen/format after all edit checks have been applied on the replace incident. If there are more than one victim, one offender, one arrest, and/or four property items to be replaced, the additional records must be added after the initial replacement record.

Following are the minimum mandatory data elements which must be entered for each replacement incident. Completion of other data elements may be required depending on the codes entered in these data elements.

WINDOW UPDATE SUBMISSIONS

Supplemental data for incidents reported prior to the 2 year retention data or for incidents prior to the agency start date will be limited to reporting of additional arrests, recovery of stolen property, and exceptional clearance. Certain information is required so the state program can forward this data on to NIBRS and accurately report this information in the annual report.

All three types of updates must include administrative information and the offense file class(es). An <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record must be submitted with data elements:

If only one arrest is being added to the incident, submit the administrative, offense, and arrest on the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record. If multiple arrests are being added to the incident, first submit the administrative, offense, and one arrest record on the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record. The remaining arrests can be submitted on the supplemental <u>Arrest (MICR.7)</u> transaction record or the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record. Action "W" (WINDOW UPDATE) is used for either transaction records. An <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record must be on the data base prior to submission of a supplemental <u>Arrest (MICR.7)</u> transaction record.

Recovered Property

These data elements must be completed if property is recovered which was originally reported stolen by your agency:

If four or less property items are being updated to recovered, submit the administrative, offense, and property information on the Incident (MICR.1) transaction record. If more than four property items are being updated, first submit the administrative, offense, and four property items on the Incident (MICR.1) transaction record. The remaining property items can be submitted on the supplemental Property (MICR.9) transaction record or the Incident (MICR.1) transaction record must be on the data base prior to submission of a supplemental Property (MICR.9) transaction record.

DELETE PROCEDURES

Use the following procedures to delete entire incidents or individual records in the incident. The information must have been submitted prior to deletion or an error will occur.

Administrative

To delete the administrative, offense, offender, victim, arrest, and property records connected to the incident, use the Incident (MICR.1) transaction record. Use this action to delete unfounded incidents which were previously submitted as originals. [NOTE: Special care should be taken when using this delete function and the Incident (MICR.1) screen/format as all information will be deleted. Make certain all required data can be resubmitted if the incident is being deleted for resubmission.]

INQUIRY PROCEDURES

Use the following procedures to inquire the data base for incident information. This procedure is available to agencies who submit data via a LEIN terminal or agencies who have access to a LEIN terminal. It can be used on all transaction screens/formats.

Complete Incident Inquiry

Inquiry using the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction screen will query the data base for all information for the incident. All administrative and offense information, one victim, one offender, one arrest and four property items can be completed on the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> screen. If additional victims, offenders, arrests, and/or property are on the data base for the incident, they can be queried using the supplemental screens.

Offender Inquiry

Inquiry using the <u>Offender (MICR.3)</u> transaction screen will query the data base for all offenders for the incident. If no number is entered in the first Offender Number field, the record will display up to twenty offenders beginning with Offender Number 01. If a number is entered in the first Offender Number field, the record will display up to twenty offenders beginning with the requested Offender Number.

Victim Inquiry

Inquiry using the <u>Victim (MICR.5)</u> transaction screen will query the data base for all victims for the incident. If no number is entered in the first Victim Number field, the record will display up to five victims beginning with Victim Number 01. If a number is entered in the first Victim Number field, the record will display up to five victims beginning with the requested Victim Number.

Arrest Inquiry

Inquiry using the <u>Arrest (MICR.7)</u> transaction screen will query the data base for all arrests for the incident. If no number is entered in the first Arrest Number field, the record will display up to seven arrests beginning with Arrest Number 01. If a number is entered in the first Arrest Number field, the record will display up to seven arrests beginning with the requested Arrest Number.

Property Inquiry

Inquiry using the <u>Property (MICR.9)</u> transaction screen will query the data base for all property items in the incident. If no number is entered in the first Item Number field, the record will display up to ten items beginning with Item Number 001. If a number is entered in the first Item Number field, the record will display up to ten items beginning with the requested Item Number.

Mandatory data elements for each transaction screen:

NO CRIMINAL DATA TO REPORT

Agencies which have no criminal activity in a given month must submit a record to notify the UCR Section of no criminal activity. This will prevent notification of delinquent reporting. This record must be submitted for each month that the agency has no criminal activity to report.

This record must only be submitted if the agency has no criminal incidents to report and no arrests, recovered property or exceptional clearances with dates occurring within the given month.

HATE/BIAS MOTIVATION GUIDELINES

Bias Motivation

The object of the collection of Hate/Bias Crime statistics is to indicate whether the offender was motivated to commit the offense because of his/her bias against a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group. Because of the difficulty of ascertaining the offender's subjective motivation, bias is to be reported only if the investigation reveals sufficient objective facts to lead a reasonable and prudent person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias. The specific types of bias to be reported are:

Racial Bias:

Other Bias

Objective Evidence the Crime was Motivated by Bias

An important distinction must be made. The mere fact that the offender is biased against the victim's racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, and/or sexual orientation group does not mean that a hate crime was involved. Rather, the offender's <u>criminal act</u> must have been motivated, in whole or in part, by his/her bias.

Because motivation is subjective, it is difficult to know with certainty whether a crime was the result of the offender's bias. Therefore, before an incident can be reported as a hate crime, sufficient objective facts must be present to lead a reasonable and prudent person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias. While no single fact may be conclusive facts such as the following, particularly when combined, are supportive of a finding of bias:

(a) The offender and the victim were of different racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation or gender groups. For example, the victim was black and the offenders were white.

- (b) Bias related oral comments, written statements, or gestures were made by the offender which indicate his/her bias. For example, the offender shouted a racial epithet at the victim.
 - (c) Bias related drawings, markings, symbols, or graffiti were left at the crime scene. For example, a swastika was painted on the door of a synagogue.
 - (d) Certain objects, items, or things which indicate bias were used (e.g., the offenders wore white sheets with hoods covering their faces) or left behind by the offender(s) (e.g., a burning cross was left in front of the victim's residence).
 - (e) The victim is a member of a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group which is overwhelmingly outnumbered by members of another group in the neighborhood where the victim lives and the incident took place. This factor loses significance with the passage of time, i.e., it is most significant when the victim first moved into the neighborhood and becomes less and less significant as time passes without incident.
 - (f) The victim was visiting a neighborhood where previous hate crimes had been committed against other members of his/her racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group and where tensions remain high against his/her group.
 - (g) Several incidents have occurred in the same locality, at or about the same time, and the victims are all of the same racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group.
 - (h) A substantial portion of the community where the crime occurred perceives that the incident was motivated by bias.
 - (i) The victim was engaged in activities promoting his/her racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group. For example, the victim is a member of the NAACP, participated in gay rights demonstrations, etc.
 - (j) The incident coincided with a holiday relating to, or a date of particular significance to, a racial, religious, or ethnic/national origin group (e.g., Martin Luther King Day, Rosh Hashanah, etc.).
 - (k) The offender was previously involved in a similar hate crime or is a member of a hate group.
 - (1) There were indications that a hate group was involved. For example, a hate group claimed responsibility for the crime or was active in the neighborhood.
 - (m) A historically established animosity exists between the victim's group and the offender's group.
 - (n) The victim, although not a member of the targeted racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group, is a member of an advocacy group supporting the precepts of the victim group.

Cautions

1. Need for Case-by-Case Assessment of the Facts

The aforementioned factors are not all-inclusive of the types of objective facts which evidence biased motivation. Therefore, reporting agencies must examine each case for facts which clearly evidence that the offender's bias motivated him/her to commit the crime.

Misleading Facts

Agencies must be alert to misleading facts. For example, the offender used an epithet to refer to the victim's race, but the offender and victim were of the same race.

3. Feigned Facts

Agencies must be alert to evidence left by the offenders which is meant to give the false impression that the incident was motivated by bias. For example, students of a religious school vandalize their own school, leaving anti-religious statements and symbols on its walls, in the hope that they will be excused from attending class.

4. Offender's Mistaken Perception

Even if the offender was mistaken in his/her belief that the victim was a member of a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group; the offense is still a hate crime as long as the offender was motivated by bias against that group. For example, a middle-aged, non-gay man walking by a bar frequented by gays was attacked by six teenagers who mistakenly believed the victim had left the bar and was gay. Although the offenders were wrong of both counts, the offense is a hate crime because it was motivated by the offenders' anti-gay bias.

5. Changes in Findings of Bias

If, after an original incident report was submitted, a contrary finding regarding bias occurs, the state program must be updated with the new finding. For example, if an initial finding of no bias was later changed to racial bias or a finding of racial bias was later changed to religious bias, the change should be reported to the UCR state program.

Hate/Bias Definitions

To ensure uniformity in reporting nationwide, the following definitions have been adopted for us in hate crime reporting:

Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their race, religion, ethnicity/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender.

Bias Crime - A criminal offense committed against a person or property which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, ethnic/national origin group, sexual orientation, or gender group. Also known as "Hate Crime".

Bisexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, both males and females; [noun] a bisexual person.

Ethnicity/National Origin Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same race or national origin who share common or similar traits, languages, customs, and traditions (e.g., Arabs, Hispanics, etc.).

Gay - [adjective] Of or relating to males who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other males; [noun] a homosexual male.

Gender Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same biological category.

Hate Crime - See Bias Crime.

Hate Group - An organization whose primary purpose is to promote animosity, hostility, and malice against persons belonging to a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group which suffers from that of the members of the organization (e.g., the Ku Klux Klan, American Nazi Party, etc.).

Heterosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of the opposite sex; [noun] a heterosexual person.

Homosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex; [noun] a homosexual person.

Lesbian - [adjective] Of or relating to females who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other females; [noun] a homosexual female.

Racial Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of person who possess common physical characteristics (e.g., color of skin, eyes and/or hair, facial features, etc.) genetically transmitted by descent and heredity which distinguish them as a distinct division of humankind (e.g. Asians, blacks, whites, etc.).

Religious Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who share the same religious beliefs regarding the origin and purpose of the universe and the existence or nonexistence of a supreme being (e.g., Catholics, Jews, Protestants, atheists, etc.).

Sexual Orientation Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex or members of the opposite sex (e.g., gays, lesbians, heterosexuals, etc.).

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED (LEOKA)

The Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted information will continue to be submitted on the paper form (RI-126). (The FBI is planning to enhance the collection of LEOKA data so a change in the data submitted is probable in the future.)

When an officer is killed or assaulted, the information must be reported on an incident report and also on the monthly LEOKA report. To determine if the assault should be reported as an additional offense to the original incident or a separate incident, the agency utilizes the "Concept of Time and Place". This is defined as "if more than one crime was committed by the same person or group of persons and the time and space intervals separating them were insignificant, then all of the crimes make up a single incident". Therefore, if the original offense/arrest and assault offense occurred during an unbroken time duration and at the same or adjoining locations(s), then the reporting agency should report these offenses as a single incident.

DATA TRANSACTION GUIDELINES

On-line LEIN Terminal Agencies

Agencies submitting MICR data through the LEIN terminal will "callup" the form(s) as it is done on the current incident system. The required information must be completed and the screen information transmitted from the designated field. An acceptance or error message is immediately returned to the agency. All editing of the incident information is completed when the incident is flagged as "complete" (see data element #61). All erroneous incidents should be corrected and resent as soon as possible. No "fatal letters" will be sent to these agencies. Agencies will not submit the Supplementary Homicide Report (SHR) as this data is included in the MICR system. However, the Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA) form must still be submitted when applicable.

Automated Submission by Agency Computer

Agencies can submit MICR data from their own computerized information system via three methods: computer-to-computer interactive, bulletin board, 9 track tape, or cartridge tape.

All submission types will use the record formats on pages VI-8 - VI-21. Agencies will be required to complete a testing phase prior to authorization from the state program to participate in MICR. The purpose of this testing phase is to ensure the quality and integrity of data collected and submitted to MICR. The agency must contact the UCR section to schedule testing activities. The specifications in this document must be followed to minimize transaction errors. During the testing phase, the local agency must continue to submit all incident data under the Incident Reporting System via their current method of reporting.

After the agency has successfully tested their MICR software with the state program, formal authorization to participate in MICR will be granted. The agency will no longer need to submit the Supplementary Homicide Report (SHR) nor incident data under the Incident Reporting System. The Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA) form will still need to be submitted when applicable.

Transactions and Errors

- 1. Computer-to-Computer Interactive
 Transactions are submitted via direct interactive LEIN lines. The agency
 must develop software to receive acceptance and error messages. The
 agency must be able to correct erroneous incidents and resubmit the
 corrected incident data. Agencies who have not established direct line
 communication with the Criminal Justice Data Center will need to contact
 that division to obtain information on the communication protocol.
- 2. Bulletin Board System

 The state program will develop a bulletin board system allowing agencies to upload an ASCII file. The MICR bulletin board system will be the same type as currently being used by the State Fire Marshal Division for the Michigan Fire Incident Reporting System (MFIRS). Errors will be printed and mailed to the agency. The agency must correct and resubmit the corrected records with the next upload. (Eventually, the errors will be put into a file on the bulletin board for the agency to download.) More information will be available as the system is developed.
- 3. Magnetic Media

 The state program will accept unlabeled IEM 3480 style cartridge and unlabeled 9 track reel tapes from automated agencies which are unable to report via computer-to-computer interactive or bulletin board. The 9 track reel tapes must be created at 1600 or 6250 BPI. It is preferred the reel tapes be 1/2" x 10 1/2" in a Autoloader II tape strap; although other sizes will be accepted.

 The records must be fixed length of 420 characters, EBCDIC, block 10. They must be sorted by ORI number (if multiple agencies are submitted on one tape), in incident number and record type order. Errors will be returned via a paper report. The agency must correct and resubmit the corrected records on the next tape submission.

Error Messages

There are two types of error messages which will be returned to the agency; field and final edit errors. Final edit errors are stipulated as such.

Field edits occur as each screen/record format is processed. If there is missing or invalid data in the field, a field edit error is printed on an error listing for that agency. The data for that screen/format is not entered on the data base.

Final edits are processed when the Incident Complete Indicator is "Y".

Because additional offenders, victims, arrests and property can be submitted on the supplemental MICR screens/formats, some crossfield edits cannot occur until all information has been submitted. When an agency submits the last screen/format which has "Y" in the Incident Complete Indicator (data element

#61), all final crossfield edits will be completed. If errors occur in final edits, the data is maintained on the data base but the Incident Complete Indicator is set to "N" in the data base record. Error messages indicate "final edit error". The error could be the result of data entered on the last screen/format or from a previous screen/format. The agency must determine what has caused the error. If additional offenders, victims, or property is required to correct the incident, the information can be added using a supplemental screen/format. Sometimes it will be necessary and easier to delete the entire incident and reenter the correct incident information.

Forms

Those agencies which have no access to a LEIN on-line system and do not have a computer system to collect this information will be provided forms to submit their MICR data.

Force or coercion can be used or threatened. Use of authority can be a form of coercion.

NOTE: The offense could possibly be 3600-1 Sexual Penetration Nonforcible Blood/Affinity if the following circumstances exist:

ASSAULT

An unlawful attack by one person upon another.

NOTE: Careful consideration of the following factors should assist in classifying assaults:

- 1. The type of weapon employed or the use of an object as a weapon;
- The seriousness of the injury;
- 3. The intent and capability of the assailant to cause serious injury.

Usually, the weapon used or the extent of the injury sustained will be the deciding factors in distinguishing aggravated from nonaggravated assaults. In only a limited number of instances should it be necessary to examine the intent and capability of the assailant. (UCR Handbook, NIBRS Edition)

1300-1 NONAGGRAVATED ASSAULT

If no number is entered in the first Arrest Number field, the record will display up to seven arrests beginning with Arrest Number 01. If a number is entered in the first Arrest Number field, the record will display up to seven arrests beginning with the requested Arrest Number.

Inquiry using the <u>Property (MICR.9)</u> transaction screen will query the data base for all property items in the incident. If no number is entered in the first Item Number field, the record will display up to ten items beginning with Item Number 001. If a number is entered in the first Item Number field. the record will display up to ten items beginning with the requested Item Number.

Mandatory data elements for each transaction screen:

Element Number 01 - Action (must be "I")

02 - Originating Agency Identifier Number

03 - Original Year

04 - Incident Number

DATA ELEMENT # 2. Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) Number

DATA BASE NAME: ORI

DATA FORMAT: 9 characters Alpha/Numeric ("MI" plus 7 numeric)

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the nine (9) character ORI number which has been

assigned to your agency.

NOTE: The ORI number is mandatory for all transaction screens/formats and all

actions.

EDITS: Must be a valid 9-character NCIC number.

First two digits must be "MI".

Required for all transactions records.

DATA ELEMENT # 3. Original Year

DATA BASE NAME: ORIG-YEAR

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the year when the incident occurred or was first

reported to the agency.

NOTE: The original year is mandatory for all transaction screens/formats and

all actions.

EDITS: Must be valid year.

Year cannot be future year.

Required for all transaction screens/formats.

DATA ELEMENT # 4. Incident Number

DATA BASE MAME: INCIDENT-NO

DATA FORMAT: 10 character Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter up to 10 characters which uniquely identifies each

reporting incident.

NOTE: The incident number is mandatory for all transaction screens/formats and

all actions.

State Police cannot enter an incident number larger than 7 digits.

EDITS: Must be a unique number for each originating agency for each original

year unless number is "0000000000".

Required for all transaction screens/formats.

Cannot have embedded "blanks" between first and last non-blank

character.

If ORI is MSP ORI, this data element cannot be more than 7 digits.

DATA ELEMENT # 5. County

DATA BASE NAME: COUNTY

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the two (2) digit county code where the incident

occurred.

NOTE: The county code is mandatory for all Action "O" (ORIGINAL), "R" (REPLACE), or "W" (WINDOW UPDATE) incidents.

For most incidents reported by sheriff and local agencies, this code will be the same as the County code within the ORI. However, if your jurisdiction crosses county lines, report the county in which the incident occurred.

Sanilac, Schoolcraft, Shiawassee, St. Clair, and St. Joseph county numbers have been changed to match the county number in the ORI.

EDITS: Must be "01-83".

Must be valid county for reporting ORI.

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL), "R" (REPLACE), or "W" (WINDOW UPDATE).

EXAMPLES:

The incident occurred in Washtenaw County, the entry should be "81".

The incident occurred in St. Joseph County, the entry should be "75".

DATA ELEMENT # 6. City/Township

DATA BASE NAME: CITY-TWP

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the two (2) digit code for the City/Township where the

incident occurred.

NOTE: The City/Township code is mandatory for all Action "O" (ORIGINAL), "R"

(REPLACE), or "W" (WINDOW UPDATE) incidents.

Refer to Section VII for valid city/township codes.

EDITS: Must be valid city/township code within the county.

Must be valid city/township code for reporting ORI.

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL), "R" (REPLACE), or "W" (WINDOW

UPDATE).

If city/township code is a prison, then Location Site, data element #15,

must be "15" (JAIL, PRISON).

If city/township code is a college, then Location Site, data element

#15, must be "32" (COLLEGE).

EXAMPLES:

If the incident occurred in the city of Ann Arbor in Washtenaw county, the entry should be "89".

If the incident occurred in the city of Detroit in Wayne county, the entry should be "99".

DATA ELEMENT # 7. Geocode

DATA BASE NAME:

GEO-CODE

DATA FORMAT:

4 characters Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

This data element is for use by the entering agency. Possible uses include the entry of Geocode location to identify station, division, post, team, precinct, etc.

NOTE: Optional

EDITS: None

EXAMPLE:

The incident occurred in the 12th Precinct of the Detroit Police Department, "12" can be entered in this element.

DATA ELEMENT # 8. Date of Occurrence/Report

DATA BASE NAME: INC-DATE

DATA FORMAT: 6 characters Numeric Month-Day-Year (MMDDYY)

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the Month, Day and Year when the incident

occurred or began. If the date of occurrence is unknown, enter the date the incident was reported to the agency.

NOTE: The Date of Occurrence/Report is mandatory for all Action "O"

(ORIGINAL), "R" (REPLACE), or "W" (WINDOW UPDATE) incidents.

EDITS: Must be valid date.

Month must be "01-12".

Day cannot exceed the number of days for the month occurred/reported.

Date cannot be future date from date of entry.

Day must be "00" if Incident Number is "0000000000".

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL), "R" (REPLACE), or "W" (WINDOW UPDATE).

If Action is "O" (ORIGINAL) or "R" (REPLACE), Date of Occurrence/Report cannot be prior to the base date or agency start date.

If Action is "W" (WINDOW UPDATE), Date of Occurrence/Report must be prior to the base date or agency start date but cannot be earlier than January 1, 1950.

EXAMPLES:

If a robbery occurred at 9:00 p.m. on September 26, 1991, the entry should be "092691".

If a kidnapping started at 11:30 p.m. on October 4, 1991, and ended at 1:00 p.m. on October 7, 1991, the entry should be "100491".

If a breaking and entering occurred at a cabin sometime between October 1991 and April 1992, but wasn't reported to the police until April 30, 1992, the entry should be "043092".

DATA ELEMENT # 9. Occurrence/Report Date Indicator

DATA BASE NAME: DATE-IND

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code to indicate whether the

Date of Occurrence/Report is the date of occurrence (E) or

date of report (R).

E = Date of Occurrence (event)

R = Date of Report

NOTE: The Report Date Indicator is mandatory for all Action "O" (ORIGINAL) or

"R" (REPLACE) incidents.

EDITS: Must be blank or valid code "E" or "R".

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL) or "R" (REPLACE).

Must be "R" if Incident Number is "0000000000".

EXAMPLES:

If a robbery occurred at 9:00 p.m. on September 26, 1991, the entry should be "E"

If a kidnapping started at 11:30 p.m. on October 4, 1991, and ended at 1:00 p.m. on October 7, 1991, the entry should be "E".

If a breaking and entering occurred at a cabin sometime between October 1991 and April 1992, but wasn't reported to the police until April 30, 1992, the entry should be "R".

DATA ELEMENT #10. Hour Occurred

DATA BASE NAME: HOUR-OCCUR

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Alpha/Numeric Military/24-hour

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the hour of day that the incident occurred or the

beginning of the time period in which it occurred. If the

time occurred is unknown, enter "99".

If the incident occurred:

On or between midnight and 0059, enter "00".

On or between 0100 and 0159, enter "01". On or between 2300 and 2359, enter "23".

Unknown, enter "99".

EDITS: Must be blank, valid number "00" through "23", or "99".

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL) unless Incident Number is

"000000000".

Required when Action is "R" (REPLACE).

EXAMPLES:

If a robbery occurred at 9:00 p.m. on September 26, 1991, the entry should be "21".

If a kidnapping started at 11:30 p.m. on October 4, 1991, and ended at 1:00 p.m. on October 7, 1991, the entry should be "23".

If the hour the incident occurred is unknown, the entry should be "99".

DATA ELEMENT #11. Exceptional Clearance

DATA BASE NAME: EXCEPT-CLE

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the two (2) character code to indicate the reason for

exceptional clearance and complete Exceptional Clearance
Date. Leave blank if incident is not exceptionally cleared.

10 = Death of offender

11 = Prosecution declined (by the prosecutor for other than

lack of probable cause)

12 = Extradition denied
13 = Victim refused to cooperate (in the prosecution)

14 = Juvenile/no custody (the handling of a juvenile without

taking him/her into custody, but rather by oral or written notice given to the parents or legal guardian

in a case involving a minor offense)

NOTE: The following four conditions must be met to exceptionally clear an offense:

- a) the investigation must have clearly and definitely established the identity of at least one offender
- b) sufficient probable cause must have been developed to support the arrest, charging, and prosecution of the offender
- c) the exact location of the offender must be known so that an arrest could be made
- d) there must be a reason outside the control of law enforcement which prevents the arrest

In a multiple offense incident, an exceptional clearance of one offense clears all offenses in the incident.

Instances may occur when an offender already in custody or serving a sentence confesses to an uncleared crime. This situation is actually a variation of true clearance by arrest and should not be exceptionally cleared. Arrest data should be reported on the offender who, although not "apprehended", will in most instances be prosecuted on the new charge.

EDITS: If completed:

- must be valid code.
- must complete Exceptional Clearance Date.
- an arrest record cannot be submitted for the entire incident.
- Offender Number cannot be "00" (offender age, race, and sex must be known).

Must be blank if Offense File Class is 0900-4 Justifiable Homicide.

EXAMPLES:

During a bank robbery the offender is fatally shot by police officers, enter "10" (DEATH OF OFFENDER) and complete Exceptional Clearance Date.

An incident involved two offenders - one of whom could not be extradited and the second was still at large. An incident record was sent to the state program with this data element coded as "12" (EXTRADITION DENIED). The second offender is arrested six months later. Since an arrest is superior to an exceptional clearance and an arrest cannot be submitted with an exceptional clearance, the Exceptional Clearance and Exceptional Clearance Date must be modified and the arrest information added to the incident.

An arrested person confesses to multiple incidents but the prosecutor refuses to prosecute on all incidents. The arrest should be reported for all incidents and not cleared as an exceptional clearance. [One incident will have an arrest record with "C" (COUNT ARREST) and the other incidents will have arrest records with "M" (MULTIPLE) in data element #49, Multiple Arrest Indicator.]

DATA ELEMENT #12. Exceptional Clearance Date

DATA BASE NAME: CLEAR-DATE

DATA FORMAT: 6 characters Numeric Month-Day-Year (MMDDYY)

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the Month, Day and Year when the incident

has been exceptionally cleared.

EDITS: Must be completed if Exceptional Clearance is completed.

Month must be "01-12".

Day cannot exceed the number of days for the month of clearance.

Date cannot be future date from date of entry.

Arrest record cannot be submitted.

Must be blank if Exceptional Clearance is blank.

Exceptional Clearance Date cannot be prior to Date of Occurrence/Report.

If completed, Exceptional Clearance must be completed.

If Action is "W" (WINDOW UPDATE), Exceptional Clearance Date cannot be prior to the base date or agency start date.

EXAMPLE:

During a bank robbery on October 4, 1991, the offender was fatally shot by police officers, "10" (DEATH OF OFFENDER) should be entered in Exceptional Clearance and "100491" should be entered in this data element.

DATA ELEMENT #13. Assist Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) Number

DATA BASE NAME: ASSIST-ORI

DATA FORMAT: 9 characters Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the nine (9) character ORI Number assigned to the

agency that was assisted.

NOTE: Optional

The incident investigation/arrest is being handled by another police jurisdiction.

Assist incidents will not be forwarded to the FBI.

EDITS: Must be valid ORI Number.

Assist ORI cannot be same as data element #2, Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) Number.

If Assist ORI is entered, the only data elements which can be entered are: Action, ORI, Original Year, Incident Number, County, City/Township, Date of Occurrence/Report, Report Date Indicator, Hour, and Offense File Class. All other data elements must be blank.

If Assist ORI is entered, Offender, Victim, Arrest and Property information cannot be entered.

DATA ELEMENT #14. Offense File Class

DATA BASE NAME: OFFE

OFFENSE-CO

DATA FORMAT:

5 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the MICR offense code for each offense involved in an incident. Four (4) offenses may be entered per incident. The reporting agency must determine the four most serious offenses if more than four occur in the incident.

NOTE: A separate offense record must be completed for each offense involved in the incident.

Offense File Class, Location Site, Offense Attempted/Completed, and Offender Suspected of Using must be completed for each offense entered.

Weapon Type, Suspected Bias Motivation, Activity Type, and Premises Entered are required for certain Offense File Classes.

Refer to Offense File Class Definitions and Arrest Charges, Section II, for valid MICR Offense File Classes.

EDITS: Must be a valid MICR Offense File Class.

Required for all offense records.

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL) unless Incident number is "00000000000".

Required when Action is "R" (REPLACE) or "W" (WINDOW UPDATE).

Offense File Class cannot be repeated as another offense record in the incident.

Only one Offense File Class can be submitted in an incident when the incident involves the offense of:

0900-4 Justifiable Homicide

7500-0 Solicitation

7700-0 Conspiracy

Justifiable Homicide, 0900-4, cannot be reported as an offense when Action is "W" (WINDOW UPDATE).

A minimum of one (1) victim record is required for each ORIGINAL or REPLACE incident (Action "O" or "R") where the Offense File Class is:

If the Offense File Class is 2400-1 Motor Vehicle Theft, at least one property record must have a Property Class of "03" (AUTOMOBILES), "05" (BUSES), "24" (OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES), "28" (RECREATIONAL VEHICLES), or "37" (TRUCKS).

5100-0 Bribery

If the Offense File Class is 2300-1 through 2300-7 and this is the only offense entered in the incident, Property Class cannot be "03" (AUTOMOBILES), "05" (BUSES), "24" (OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES), "28" (RECREATIONAL VEHICLES), or "37" (TRUCKS).

EXAMPLES:

If an incident involved robbery and motor vehicle theft, two offense records would be submitted; one with Offense File Class "12000" and the other with Offense File Class "24001".

If two people were victims of aggravated assault, only one offense record would be submitted with Offense File Class "13002", and two victim records would be submitted.

If an incident involved a motor vehicle theft and the vehicle contained property which also should be reported stolen (such as tools, camera equipment, golf clubs, etc.), one offense record would be submitted with Offense File Class "2400-1".

If an incident involved the theft of a tractor trailer containing a shipment of televisions which was the real object of the theft, it will be up to the reporting agency whether to report two offenses, i.e., Motor Vehicle Theft (truck) and Larceny Theft (televisions).

During a robbery the offender was killed by a police officer. Two incidents would be submitted. One would be the Robbery (12000) with the criminal as the offender and the person or place being robbed as the victim. The other incident would be a Justifiable Homicide (0900-4) with the criminal as the victim and the police officer as the offender.

Six people were involved in a bar room fight. Technically, this case involves multiple incidents because, although the offenders assaulted each other, it cannot be said that they were "acting in concert", especially in the assault on themselves. Therefore, cases in which the participants are both victims and offenders can be reported two ways. As multiple incidents or as a single incident with multiple victims and offenders using the Victim to Offender Relationship code of "31" (VICTIM WAS OFFENDER). The reporting agency is to determine how these types of cases are reported to the state program.

The investigating agency arrested a person for conspiracy to murder before the arrestee was able to enact his plan. Since no murder or assault had occurred, the incident would be reported with the Offense File Class of 77000 Conspiracy.

An investigation of a bank robbery determined that a bank teller had provided information to the offenders who had performed the bank robbery. The bank teller was charged with conspiracy. Because the robbery did occur, the Offense File Class would be reported as 12000 Robbery. A Conspiracy offense cannot be reported with another offense in an incident; however, the conspiracy charge (7771) could be reported for the bank teller.

EDITS:

- Must be valid code "01" through "21", "23", "24", "31" through "34", "88", or "99".
- Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL) unless Incident Number is "0000000000".
- Required when Action is "R" (REPLACE).
- If Offense File Class is 2200-1 Burglary Forced Entry or 2200-2 Burglary Entry Without Force and Premises Entered is completed, then Location Type must be "14" (HOTEL/MOTEL/ETC.) or "19" (RENTAL STORAGE).
- All college/university police departments must indicate "32" in this data element for all incidents that occur on college/university property.

EXAMPLE:

An assault started in a bar ("03"), continued into an adjoining parking lot ("18"), and ended in the street ("13"). As the bar was the location where the offense was initiated and best describes the circumstances of the crime, "03" (BAR/NIGHT CLUB) should be entered.

DATA ELEMENT #16. Offense Attempted/Completed

CODING STRUCTURE: . Enter the one (1) character code to indicate if the

offense was attempted or completed.

A = Attempted C = Completed

NOTE: If there was more than one occurrence of the same MICR offense within an incident and one was completed, then "C" (COMPLETED) must be entered (See Example #1).

Attempted murder is to be classified as aggravated assault.

EDITS: Must be "A" or "C".

Required when Action is "O" (ORIGINAL) unless Incident Number is "00000000000".

Required when Action is "R" (REPLACE).

Must be "C" (COMPLETED) if Offense File Class is:

During the same incident, the offender had forcible sexual intercourse with one victim and attempted forcible sexual intercourse with a second victim but left the scene prior to completion of the act. Since one act was completed and only one file class is reported, "C" (COMPLETED) should be entered in this data element.

During a robbery, the offender murdered one victim and attempted to murder another victim before leaving the scene. Three offenses would be coded "C" (COMPLETED) as 1200 for the robbery, 0900-1 for the murder, and 1300-2 for the attempted murder.

Witnesses to an assault reported that the victim and offender were in a bar drinking when an argument broke out and the offender attacked the victim with a knife. Enter "A" (ALCOHOL) in this data element.

A victim of sexual assault advised that her attacker bragged that he had been "freebasing" cocaine just prior to the incident. "D" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) should be entered.

A medical supply warehouse was burglarized and large quantities of Methadone, Morphine, Benzedrine, and Valium were stolen. "D" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) should not be entered because, while the drugs were the object of the crime, there was no indication that the offenders used drugs or narcotics before or during the incident.

A victim of an aggravated assault reported that the attacker was smoking marijuana and drinking prior to the attack. Enter "A" (ALCOHOL) and "D" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS).

NOTE: Because of the difficulty of ascertaining the offender's subjective motivation, bias is to be reported only if investigation reveals sufficient objective facts to lead a reasonable and prudent person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias. (See Hate/Bias Motivation Guidelines, pages I-18 - I-21.)

Incidents which do not involve any facts indicating biased motivation by the offender are to be coded as "00" (NONE), while incidents involving ambiguous facts (i.e., where some facts are present but are not conclusive) are to be coded "99" (UNKNOWN).

EXAMPLES:

Overnight, unknown subjects broke into a synagogue and destroyed several religious objects. The perpetrators left a large swastika drawn on the door and wrote "Death to Jews" on a wall. Although valuable items were present, none were stolen. Enter "21" (ANTI-JEWISH) because the offenders destroyed religious objects, left anti-Semitic words and graffiti behind, and theft did not appear to be the motive for the burglary.

A small neighborhood bar frequented by gays burned down after being closed for the night. Investigation revealed that the fire was deliberately set, but there were no witnesses or suspects. Although the fire was deliberately set, the fact that the bar was frequented by gays may have been coincidental. Therefore, "99" (UNKNOWN) should be entered. Two weeks later, three white adult males were arrested on a tip from an informant. They admitted burning down the bar, saying they did it to keep gays out of the neighborhood. The previously submitted incident report should be updated with "41" (ANTI-GAY).

While driving through a predominantly Mexican-American neighborhood, a black male stopped his car to repair a flat tire. A group of Mexican-Americans leaving a bar across the street accosted the driver and then attacked him with bottles and clubs. During the attack, the offenders called the victim by a well known and recognized epithet used against blacks and told him that blacks were not welcome in the neighborhood. Enter code "12" (ANTI-BLACK) because the victim and offenders are of different races, the offenders used a racial epithet, and the facts reveal no other reason for the attack than the stated one, i.e., to keep blacks out of the neighborhood.

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EXAMPLES: (cont.)

An adult white male was approached by four white teenagers who requested money for the bus. When he refused, one of the youths said to the others, "Let's teach this [epithet for a gay person] a lesson". The victim was punched in the face, knocked to the ground, kicked several times, and robbed of his wristwatch, ring, and wallet. When he reported the crime, the victim advised he did not know the offenders and that he was not gay. The facts are ambiguous. Although an epithet for a gay person was used by one of the offenders, the victim was not gay. Such epithets are sometimes used as general insults regardless of the target person's sexual orientation, and in this case the offenders' motivation appeared to be limited to obtaining money from the victim. Therefore, "99" (UNKNOWN) should be entered.

Toy or play weapons are to be coded as "88" (OTHER).

Additional offenders are to be entered on the supplemental <u>Offender</u> (MICR.3) transaction screen/format. Offender number 00 cannot be entered on the supplemental <u>Offender (MICR.3)</u> transaction screen/format.

A corpse with five bullet holes in it was found in an abandoned warehouse. There were no witnesses to the crime or suspects. A single Offender record should be submitted with "00" entered in this data element and no entries in offender age, sex and race.

Two offenders were seen fleeing the scene of a burglary, but because they were wearing ski masks, their age, sex and race could not be determined. Two offender segments should be submitted -- one with Offender Number "01" and the other with Offender Number "02". Applicable "unknown" codes should be entered into offender age, sex and race fields.

In resisting arrest, a fugitive pulled a gun and fired two times in the direction of two police of sicers who were attempting to take him into custody. Neither officer was hit but both drew their weapons and returned the fire, killing the fugitive. As this was a Justifiable Homicide, "21" (CRIMINAL KILLED BY POLICE OFFICER) should be entered and Justifiable Homicide Circumstance should be completed.

Two rival juvenile street gangs rumble over "turf" rights to sell drugs and one of the gang members is killed. Possible entries are "01" (ARGUMENT), "03" (DRUG DEALING), and "05" (JUVENILE GANG). While all three would apply, there is a limit of one entry. Therefore, the most descriptive code (as determined by the reporting agency) should be used. In this case, the reporting agency could enter "03" (DRUG DEALING).

DATA ELEMENT #36. Justifiable Homicide Circumstance

DATA BASE NAME: JUSTIFY

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code describing additional

justifiable homicide circumstance.

1 = Criminal Attacked Police Officer and that Officer Killed the Criminal

2 = Criminal Attacked Police Officer and Criminal Killed by Another Police Officer.

3 = Criminal Attacked a Civilian

4 = Criminal Attempted Flight from a Crime

5 = Criminal Killed in Commission of a Crime

6 = Criminal Resisted Arrest

9 = Unable to Determine/Not Enough Information

NOTE: See Justifiable Homicide guidelines on page I-8.

EDITS: Must be blank or valid code.

Required and can only be entered for Victim Connected Offense File Class 0900-4, Justifiable Homicide.

Required if Victim Circumstance is:

"20" CRIMINAL KILLED BY PRIVATE CITIZEN or

"21" CRIMINAL KILLED BY POLICE OFFICER

'If completed, then Victim Circumstance must be "20" or "21" and Victim Connected Offense File Class must be 0900-4 Justifiable Homicide.

If Victim Circumstance is "20" (CRIMINAL KILLED BY PRIVATE CITIZEN),
Justifiable Homicide Circumstance cannot be "1" (CRIMINAL ATTACKED
POLICE OFFICER AND THAT OFFICER KILLED THE CRIMINAL) or "2" (CRIMINAL
ATTACKED POLICE OFFICER AND CRIMINAL KILLED BY ANOTHER POLICE
OFFICER).

EXAMPLE:

In resisting arrest, a fugitive pulled a gun and fired two times in the direction of two police officers who were attempting to take him into custody. Neither officer was hit but both drew their weapons and returned the fire, killing the fugitive. The possible entries are: "1" (CRIMINAL ATTACKED POLICE OFFICER AND THAT OFFICER KILLED THE CRIMINAL); "2" (CRIMINAL ATTACKED POLICE OFFICER AND CRIMINAL KILLED BY ANOTHER POLICE OFFICER); and "6" (CRIMINAL RESISTED ARREST). As only one code can be entered, the most descriptive code (as determined by the reporting agency) should be used. In this case, the reporting agency could enter "1" (CRIMINAL ATTACKED POLICE OFFICER AND THAT OFFICER KILLED THE CRIMINAL).

DATA ELEMENT #37. Offender Related Number

DATA BASE NAME:

OFFENDERNO

DATA FORMAT:

MICR

2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the two (2) character offender number for whom a victim-to-offender relationship is to be reported. This data element is to be used along with Victim to Offender Relationship, to report the relationships of the victim to offenders who have perpetrated a "crime against person" or a robbery against a person victim. Up to 5 Offender Related Number entries can be made per victim.

EDITS: Must be "01" through "99".

If completed, then Victim to Offender Relationship is required. Victim Type must be "I" (INDIVIDUAL) or "P" (POLICE OFFICER). If more than one (1) number is entered for a victim, the Offender

Related Number cannot be duplicated.

Must have corresponding Offender record.

Required and can only be entered when Offender Number is any code but "00" and Victim Connected Offense File Class is one or more of the following:

0900-1 Murder/Nonnegligent Manslaughter

0900-2 Negligent Homicide/Manslaughter

0900-3 Negligent Homicide - Vehicle/Boat

0900-4 Justifiable Homicide

1000-1 Kidnapping/Abduction

1000-2 Parental Kidnapping

1100-1 Sexual Penetration Penis/Vagina - CSC 1st Degree

1100-2 Sexual Penetration Penis/Vagina - CSC 3rd Degree

1100-3 Sexual Penetration Oral/Anal - CSC 1st Degree

If Victim 01's relationship to Offender 01 is to be reported, enter "01".

If Victim 01's relationship to Offender 01 and Offender 02 is to be reported, enter "01" and "02".

Enter the two (2) character code indicating the victim to offender relationship associated with the offender number. This data element is to be used along with Offender Related Number to report the relationships of the victim to offenders who have perpetrated a "crime against person" or a robbery against a person victim. Up to 5 Victim to Offender Relationship entries can be made per victim.

Within Family:

01 = Victim was Spouse

02 = Common-Law Spouse

03 = Parent

04 = Sibling (brother or sister)

O5 = Child

06 = Grandparent 07 = Grandchild

08 = In-law 09 = Stepparent 10 = Stepchild

11 = Stepsibling (stepbrother or stepsister)

12 = Other Family Member

Outside Family but Known to Victim:

20 = Victim was Acquaintance

21 = Friend 22 = Neighbor

23 = Babysittee (the baby) 24 = Boyfriend/Girlfriend

25 = Child of Boyfriend or Girlfriend

26 = Homosexual Relationship

27 = Ex-Spouse 28 = Employee

Not Known by Victim:

98 = Victim was Stranger 99 = Unknown

NOTE: ***The Domestic Violence Task Force is in the process of defining domestic violence. Additional codes may be necessary to further define some victim to offender relationships depending on the definition and legislation proposed by the Task Force.

Code "31" (VICTIM WAS OFFENDER) is to be used in incidents where the participants are both victims and offenders (ex: bar room fights).

NOTE: (cont.)

Step-Grandparents and Ex-Common-Law Spouse should be reported as "12" (VICTIM WAS OTHER FAMILY MEMBER).

EDITS: Must be blank or valid code.

When completed, then Offender Related Number is required. Victim Type must be "I" (INDIVIDUAL) or "P" (POLICE OFFICER).

- If code is "01" (VICTIM WAS SPOUSE), "02" (VICTIM WAS COMMON-LAW SPOUSE), "24" (VICTIM WAS BOYFRIEND/GIRLFRIEND), or "27" (VICTIM WAS EX-SPOUSE), victim and offender must be opposite sex.
- If code is "26" (VICTIM WAS HOMOSEXUAL), victim and offender must be same sex.
- If code is "03" (VICTIM WAS PARENT) or "06" (VICTIM WAS GRANDPARENT), the victim's age must be greater than the offender's age.
- If code is "05" (VICTIM WAS CHILD), "07" (VICTIM WAS GRANDCHILD), or "23" (VICTIM WAS BABYSITTEE), the victim's age must be less than the offender's age.
- Only one Victim to Offender Relationship code of "01" (VICTIM WAS SPOUSE) is valid per victim.

Age of spouses or ex-spouses cannot be less than 10 years old. If code is "31" (VICTIM WAS OFFENDER):

- must be 2 or more victims and
- must be 2 or more offenders (cannot have 00 in Offender Number) and
- victim can have only one "31" relationship code.

Required and can only be entered when Offender Number is any code but "00" and Victim Connected Offense File Class is one or more of the following:

EDITS: (cont.)

Required and can only be entered when Offender Number is any code but "00" and Victim Type is "I" (INDIVIDUAL) or "P" (POLICE OFFICER) and Victim Connected Offense File Class is:

1200-0 Robbery

2000-0 Arson

2200-1 Burglary - Forced Entry

2200-2 Burglary - Entry Without Force

2900-0 Damage to Property

3800-1 Family - Abuse/Neglect Nonviolent

If the related offender has "UNKNOWN" values entered for age, sex, and race, the relationship must be "99" (UNKNOWN).

EXAMPLES:

An employee assaulted his employer (a person) with his fists. "28" (VICTIM WAS EMPLOYER) should be entered.

Two unknown subjects rob a male and female couple. "98" (VICTIM WAS STRANGER) should be entered to indicate the relationship of each victim to each offender.

DATA ELEMENT #39. Arrest Number

DATA BASE NAME: ARRESTNO

DATA FORMAT: 2 character Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the two (2) character assigned unique number from "01"

through "99" for each person arrested for this incident.

NOTE: Arrest Number 01 is to be entered on the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction

screen/format.

Additional arrests are to be entered on the supplemental Arrest (MICR.7) transaction screen/format.

Arrest Ethnicity and Arrest Residence are optional fields.

It is required to update offender records of arrested persons not previously reported as offenders. This is accomplished by deleting and resubmitting the entire incident or "replacing" the incident. For example, when the incident was initially submitted only one offender was reported. However, now two persons have been arrested. The offender record should be submitted for the person (offender) not originally reported. Victim records should be updated to indicate the victim to offender relationships.

EDITS: Must be valid number 01 through 99.

Two subjects cannot be assigned the same arrest number.

Required for all arrest records.

Arrest Number, Arrest Type, Arrest Age, Arrest Race, Arrest Sex, Arrest Charge, Arrest Armed, Date of Arrest, and Multiple Arrest Indicator must be completed for each arrest.

Disposition of Arrest under 18 is required only if the person arrested is less than 18 years old.

Arrest records cannot be submitted for Offense File Class 0900-4

Justifiable Homicide or when an incident is exceptionally cleared.

The number of arrests cannot exceed the number of offenders in an incident.

EXAMPLE:

If two persons were arrested in connection with a previously reported incident, two Arrest records should be submitted - one with Arrest Number "01" and the other with Arrest Number "02".

DATA ELEMENT #40. Arrest Type

DATA BASE NAME: ARREST-TYP

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code to indicate the type of

apprehension.

O = On-View Arrest (taken into custody without a warrant or previous incident report)

S = Summoned/Cited (not taken into custody)

T = Taken Into Custody (based on warrant and/or previously

submitted incident report)

EDITS: Must be valid code "O", "S", or "T".

Required for all arrest records.

EXAMPLES:

The subject was arrested without a warrant while in the act of soliciting for prostitution on a street corner. The entry should be "O" (ON-VIEW ARREST).

The subject was served with a subpoena summoning him to appear in court. The entry should be "S" (SUMMONED/CITED).

The subject was taken into custody as the result of a complaint being filed, an investigation being conducted, and a warrant being issued. The entry should be "T" (TAKEN INTO CUSTODY).

DATA ELEMENT #41. Arrest Age

DATA BASE NAME: AGE

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the two (2) character code to indicate the age of the

person apprehended.

07 - 98 = years old

99 = over 98 years old

NOTE: Enter an approximate age if the exact age of the arrest is unknown.

EDITS: Age less than 7 years old is invalid.

Must be valid number 07 through 99. Required for all arrest records.

If Age is less than "18" then Disposition of Arrest under 18 must be

completed.

If Offense File Class is 70000 Juvenile Runaway or the Arrest Charge is

7070, age of arrestee must be 17 or less.

EXAMPLE:

The person arrested is 36 years old, enter "36" in this data element.

DATA ELEMENT #42. Arrest Race

DATA BASE NAME: RACE

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code to indicate the race of the

person arrested.

W = White B = Black

I = American Indian/Alaskan Native

A = Asian/Pacific Islander .

U = Unknown

EDITS: Must be valid code.

Required for all arrest records.

EXAMPLE:

If the subject arrested was a white person, enter "W" (WHITE).

DATA ELEMENT #43. Arrest Sex

DATA BASE NAME: SEX

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code to indicate the sex of the

person arrested.

M = Male
F = Female

EDITS: Must be valid code "M" or "F".

Required for all arrest records.

EXAMPLE:

If the subject arrested was female, enter "F" (FEMALE).

DATA ELEMENT #44. Arrest Ethnicity

DATA BASE NAME: ETHNIC

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code indicating the ethnic

origin of the person arrested.

A = Arab H = Hispanic

O = Other Ethnicity/National Origin

U = Unknown

NOTE: Optional

The National Incident Based Reporting System defines Hispanic as "a person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race".

EDITS: Must be valid code or blank.

EXAMPLE:

If the subject arrested is of Hispanic origin, enter "H" (HISPANIC).

DATA ELEMENT #45. Arrest Residence

DATA BASE NAME: RESIDENCE

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code to indicate whether the

residency of the person arrested.

R = <u>Resident</u> of the community, city, or town where the offense occurred.

C = Resides in the <u>County</u> but not the community where the offense occurred.

S = Resides in the <u>State</u> but not the county or community where the offense occurred.

O = Out of state

U = Unknown

NOTE: Optional

Black's Law Dictionary defines legal residence as "the permanent fixed place of abode which a person intends to be his residence and to which he intends to return despite temporary residences elsewhere or despite temporary absences".

EDITS: Must be valid code or blank.

EXAMPLES:

The crime occurred in Pontiac and the person arrested maintained his legal residence in that city. The entry should be "R" (RESIDENT).

The crime occurred in Lansing but the person arrested maintained his legal residence in Detroit. The entry should be "S" (STATE).

The crime occurred in Ionia County, Portland Twp., but the person arrested maintained his legal residence in Lake Odessa. The entry should be "C" (COUNTY).

DATA ELEMENT #46. Arrest Charge

DATA BASE NAME: CHARGE

DATA FORMAT: 4 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the MICR arrest code for which the person arrested was

apprehended. Only one arrest charge will be entered. If the person arrested is being charged with more than one arrest charge, the reporting agency must determine which is

the most serious and enter it as the arrest charge.

NOTE: See Section II for valid arrest charges.

In multiple count arrests, the lower arrest charge does not necessarily determine the seriousness of the crime.

EDITS: Must be valid code.

Required for all arrest records.

EXAMPLES:

A person was arrested for 0903 - Willful Killing/Nonfamily/Gun and 2202 - Forced Entry/Nonresidence. As only one arrest charge can be entered, the reporting agency entered "0903" (WILLFUL KILLING/NONFAMILY/GUN).

A person was arrested for 3510 - Heroin/Sell/Manufacture, 3560 - Marijuana /Sell, and 3550 - Narcotic Equipment/Possess. As only one arrest charge can be entered, the reporting agency entered "3510" (HEROIN/SELL/MANUFACTURE).

A person was arrested for 4104 - Possession of Alcoholic Liquor in a Motor Vehicle and 8041 - Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol. As only one arrest charge can be entered, the reporting agency entered "8041" (OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL).

DATE ELEMENT #47. Arrest Armed

DATA BASE NAME:

ARREST-ARM

DATA FORMAT:

3 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the two (2) or three (3) character code to indicate the type of weapon the person arrested was armed with at the time of apprehension. The last character is used to indicate if the weapon was an automatic firearm by adding an "A" as a suffix to the code. Up to 2 codes can be entered per person arrested.

01 = Unarmed

11 = Firearm (type of firearm is not known)

12 = Handgun 13 = Rifle

14 = Shotgun

15 = Other Firearm (cane, belt buckle, etc.)

20 = Lethal Cutting Instrument (switchblade knife, martial

arts "stars", etc.)

30 = Club/Blackjack/Brass Knuckles

A = Automatic Firearm (used as suffix to above codes)

NOTE:

An automatic weapon is defined as any firearm which shoots, or is designed to shoot, more than one shot at a time by a single pull of the trigger without manual reloading.

An arrest in possession of a toy or play weapon should be coded as "01" (UNARMED).

EDITS: Must be valid code.

Suffix code "A" valid for codes 11-15 only.

Required for all arrest records.

If more than one code is entered, cannot be duplicate.

Code "01" (UNARMED) is mutually exclusive with any other code (must

only be used if no other code applies).

EXAMPLES:

When the subject was arrested, he had in his possession a .357 magnum handgun and a penknife. The entry should be "12" (HANDGUN). Because a small pocket knife is not generally considered to be a "weapon", it does not qualify for reporting.

The subject resisted arrest using a liquor bottle and a chair as weapons before being subdued. The entry should be "01" (UNARMED). Although the subject used items as weapons, they were not commonly known weapons.

DATA ELEMENT #48. Date of Arrest

DATA BASE NAME: DATE

DATA FORMAT: 6 characters Numeric Month-Day-Year (MMDDYY)

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the Month, Day and Year when the person was arrested.

NOTE: The date of arrest is mandatory for all arrest records.

EDITS: Must be valid date.

Month must be "01-12".

Day cannot exceed the number of days for the month of arrest.

Date cannot be future date from the entry date.

Required for all arrest records.

Date of Arrest cannot be prior to Date of Occurrence/Report.

If Action is "W" (WINDOW UPDATE), Date of Arrest cannot be prior to the base date or agency start date.

EXAMPLE:

The subject was arrested on November 20, 1991. The entry should be "112091".

DATA ELEMENT #49. Multiple Arrest Indicator

DATA BASE NAME: MUI

MULTI-ARR

DATA FORMAT:

1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the one (1) character code to indicate whether or not the apprehension of the subject resulted in the clearance of more than one previously reported incident within the jurisdiction served by the reporting agency.

- M = Multiple This person was arrested for more than 1 incident and this arrest should not be counted for this incident but a clearance for this incident will be counted.
- C = Count Arrest This person was arrested for more than 1 incident, this arrest should be counted for this incident, and a clearance will be counted for this incident.
- N = Not Applicable This person was arrested only for this incident.

NOTE: This data element pertains to one person being arrested for multiple incidents.

If the apprehension of the person arrested causes the agency to enter an arrest report for each incident the person was arrested for, it is important to indicate that only one arrested person was responsible clearing multiple incidents. This is done by entering "M" (MULTIPLE) into all but one of the arrest records for the cleared incidents, and by entering "C" (COUNT ARREST) in the remaining arrest record for the cleared incident. If the arrest did not result in multiple incident clearances, enter "N" (NOT APPLICABLE).

EDITS: Must be valid code.

Required for all arrest records.

EXAMPLES:

After the subject's apprehension for robbery, it was learned that the subject was also responsible for five additional robberies within the jurisdiction. One arrest record was keyed into the local computer for each of the six incidents. Five of the arrest records had "M" (MULTIPLE) and one had "C" (COUNT ARREST) entered into this data element.

Two suspects were arrested for burglary. During processing, Arrest #1 admitted to burglarizing two other residences which were reported to this reporting agency. The reporting agency then cleared those two burglaries based on the suspect's confession. However, Arrest #2 denies involvement in any additional burglaries. The arrest record for Arrest #1 would have a "C" (COUNT ARREST) for the current incident and a "M" (MULTIPLE) for this data element in the arrest records of the two other incidents which were cleared. The arrest record for Arrest #2 would have an "N" (NOT APPLICABLE) in this data element as this subject's arrest did not clear any additional incidents.

A suspect was arrested for a motor vehicle theft which occurred on October 14, 1991. This person was also responsible for two motor vehicle theft incidents which occurred in 1988. An arrest record would be submitted for the current 1991 incident indicating "C" (COUNT ARREST) to count the arrest. Arrest records would be submitted for both 1988 incidents with "M" (MULTIPLE) in this data element to indicate the person arrested was counted in another incident.

DATA ELEMENT #50. Disposition of Arrest under 18

DATA BASE NAME: DISPOSITIO

DATA FORMAT: 1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the one (1) character code to indicate the disposition

of arrests 17 years of age or younger at the time of arrest.

H = Handled within the Department (e.g., released to parents, released with warning, etc.)

R = Referred to Other Authorities (e.g., turned over to juvenile count, probation department, welfare agency, other police agency, criminal or adult count, etc.)

NOTE: Even though 17 year old persons are considered adults under Michigan

Law, it is necessary to submit a disposition for these subjects to be

forwarded to the FBI.

EDITS: Required when person arrested is 17 years old or younger.

Must be blank or valid code "H" or "R".
Must be blank if arrest age is 18 or older.

EXAMPLES:

The 13 year old person, who was arrested for vandalizing a school, was released to his parents with a warning. The entry should be "H" (HANDLED WITHIN DEPARTMENT).

The 17 year old person was arrested for murder. Even though he is an adult under Michigan Law, it is required that a disposition be submitted. In this case, the entry should be "R" (REFERRED TO OTHER AUTHORITIES) as he will be tried in adult court.

DATA ELEMENT #51. Clearance Indicator

DATA BASE NAME:

CLEARANCE

DATA FORMAT:

1 character Alpha/Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the one (1) character code to indicate YES if this arrest clears the incident or NO if the incident was already cleared by a previous arrest.

Y = Arrest clears the incident

N = Incident already cleared by previous arrest

NOTE: This data element pertains to multiple persons being arrested per incident. It is used to indicate whether or not the arrest record produces a clearance for incidents not maintained on the MICR data base.

The question which must be answered is: Has an arrest been previously reported to the state UCR program for this incident? If the answer to this question is yes, then this data element will be "N" (INCIDENT ALREADY CLEARED BY PREVIOUS ARREST). If the answer to this question is no, then this data element will be "Y" (ARREST CLEARS THE INCIDENT).

EDITS: Must be blank or valid gode "Y" or "N".

If more than one arrest record is entered for an incident, only the first arrest record can have "Y" (YES) in this data element and all succeeding arrest records must have "N" in this data element.

Required only for Action "W" (WINDOW UPDATE) records.

EXAMPLES:

A suspect was arrested for an incident that occurred on October 31, 1991, and the arrest was reported on the original incident report. On February 4, 1993, a second suspect was arrested for the same incident. When entering the arrest record, "N" would be entered in this data element as the incident was already cleared by a previous arrest.

A rape incident was reported on June 5, 1991, with no arrests being reported. On April 1, 1993, a person was arrested for the incident. When entering the arrest record, "Y" would be entered in this data element as the no previous arrest was reported and this arrest clears the incident.

A burglary incident was reported on December 7, 1991, with no arrests being reported. On October 31, 1994, two persons were arrested for the incident. When entering the arrest records, "Y" would be entered in this data element for on one of the arrests and "N" would be entered in this data element for the other arrest.

DATA ELEMENT #52. Item Number

DATA BASE NAME: ITEM

DATA FORMAT: 3 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter a three (3) character assigned number from "000"

through "999" for each property item involved in the

incident.

NOTE: Property items may be grouped together by Property Loss Type and

Property Class. The examples will indicate how to enter property

information when grouping items.

EDITS: Must be valid number "000" through "999".

Item Number must be "000" if Property Loss Type is "0" (NONE) or "9"

(UNKNOWN).

Item Number "000" cannot be repeated in the incident.

Item Number "000" cannot be entered on the supplemental Property

(MICR.9) transaction screen/format.

Property Records can only be submitted with Offense File Classes of "Crimes Against Property", Kidnapping, Gambling, or Drug/Narcotics.

DATA ELEMENT #53. Property Loss Type

DATA BASE NAME: LC

LOSS-TYPE

DATA FORMAT:

1 character Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the one (1) character code to describe the type(s) of property loss, recovery, seizure, etc., which occurred in an incident.

- 0 = None
- 1 = Stolen and Recovered (At the time the original incident is entered, all property stolen is recovered and the value of the recovered property is the same as prior to being stolen. This eliminates entering two separate records, one for stolen and one for recovered.)
- 2 = Burned (includes damage caused in fighting the fire)
- 3 = Counterfeited/Forged
- 4 = Destroyed/Damaged/Vandalized
- 5 = Recovered (to impound property which was previously stolen)
- 6 = Seized (to impound property which was not previously stolen)
- 7 = Stolen (includes bribed, defrauded, embezzled, extorted, ransomed, robbed, etc.)
- 9 = Unknown

NOTE: Only one property record can be entered for Loss Type of "0" (NONE) or "9" (UNKNOWN) and entered as Item #000.

The first 4 property records are to be entered on the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction screen/format. Additional property records can entered on the supplemental <u>Property (MICR.9)</u> transaction screen/format or the <u>Incident (MICR.1)</u> transaction record using an Action code of "A" (ADD).

EDITS: Must be a valid code.

Must be "5" (RECOVERED) if Action is "W" (WINDOW UPDATE).

- If "0" (NONE) or "9" (UNKNOWN), Property Class, Property Value, Date Recovered, Number of Stolen/Recovered Vehicles, Suspected Drug Type, Estimated Drug Quantity, and Type Drug Measurement must be blank. [This edit does not apply if Offense File Class is 3500-1 Violation of Controlled Substance when Property Loss Type is "0" (NONE); Suspected Drug Type must be entered.]
- If "5" (RECOVERED), every Property Class item must also be (or have been) reported as "7" (STOLEN). (This edit does not apply to Offense File Classes 2400-2 Motor Vehicle as Stolen Property, 2500-0 Forgery/Counterfeiting, or 2800-0 Stolen Property.)

EDITS: (cont.)

Item Number and Property Class must match for stolen and recovered records. (EXCEPTION: If a motor vehicle was reported stolen and parts of the vehicle are recovered, the recovered record can indicate a Property Class of "38" (VEHICLE PARTS/ACCESSORIES).

If Property Loss Type is "6" (SEIZED) and the incident involves a single offense of:

Property Class must be "11" (DRUG/NARCOTIC EQUIPMENT). (However, in multiple "Crimes Against Property" offenses, this edit will be bypassed because the Drugs/Narcotics or Drug Equipment could be involved in the other offense.)

EXAMPLES:

For an arson offense, the entries might be "0" NONE (an attempt with no property burned) or "2" BURNED (property was burned).

For a burglary offense, the entries might be "0" NONE (an attempted burglary or the structure was entered but no property was taken), "7" STOLEN (property was taken), "5" RECOVERED (stolen property was later recovered or value was decreased), "1" STOLEN AND RECOVERED (property was both stolen and recovered with no change in dollar value when the incident report was entered), "9" UNKNOWN (not known if property was taken).

If the same incident involved both arson and burglary, the choices of property loss type codes shown in the above two examples would be applicable, depending on the circumstances.

Two teenagers stole a neighbor's car for joyriding. The car was recovered in a parking lot two hours after the reported theft. No damage had been done to the vehicle. When the original incident is entered, only one property record is needed indicating "1" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED) in this data element as the property was stolen and recovered and the recovered property value did not decrease from prior to being stolen. If the vehicle has been damaged, then two property records should be entered. The first record indicating "7" (STOLEN) and the value of the vehicle in Property Value. The second record indicating "5" (RECOVERED) and the value of the damaged vehicle in Property Value.

In a drug investigation, the offenders destroyed the drugs before the officers were able to seize the drugs. As no property was actually seized, a property record is submitted with "O" (NONE) in the Property Loss Type and the type of drug entered in Suspected Drug Type (only 1 drug type can be submitted).

DATA ELEMENT #54. Property Class

DATA BASE NAME:

CLASS

DATA FORMAT:

2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE:

Enter the two (2) character code indicating the description of the property stolen, burned, counterfeited, destroyed/damaged/vandalized etc., which occurred in the incident.

- 01 = Aircraft (airplanes, dirigibles, gliders, etc.)

- 05 = Buses (motor vehicles which are specifically designed, but not necessarily used, to transport groups of people on a commercial basis)
- 07 = Computer Hardware/Software (computers, computer
 peripherals [e.g., tape and disk drives, printers,
 etc.] and storage media [e.g., magnetic tapes, magnetic
 and optical disks, etc.])
- 08 = Consumable Goods (expendable items used by humans for nutrition, enjoyment or hygiene, e.g., food, beverages, grooming products, cigarettes, gasoline, firewood, etc.)
- 10 = Drugs/Narcotics
- 11 = Drug/Narcotic Equipment
- 12 = Farm Equipment (tractors, combines, etc.)
- 13 = Firearms (weapons that fire a shot by force of an explosion, i.e., handguns, rifles, shotguns., etc., but not "BB", pellet, or gas-powered guns)
- 14 = Gambling Equipment (gambling paraphernalia)
- 15 = Heavy Construction/Industrial Equipment (cranes, bulldozers, steamrollers, oil-drilling rigs, etc.)

CODES: (cont.)

- 19 = Merchandise (items held for sale)
- 20 = Money (legal tender, i.e., coins and paper currency)

- 24 = Other Motor Vehicles (any other motor vehicles, e.g.,
 motorcycles, motor scooters, trail bikes, mopeds,
 snowmobiles, golf carts, etc.)
- 25 = Purses/Handbags/Wallets
- 26 = Radios/TVs/VCRs (includes radios, televisions, videotape recorders, high fidelity and stereo equipment, compact disk players, etc.)

- 39 = Watercraft (motor boats, sailboats, houseboats, etc.)
- 88 = Other (all other property not fitting the above specific descriptions, including intangibles)
- 77 = Pending Inventory (property class unknown until an inventory is conducted)
- 99 = Special Category (to be used by the National UCR program to compile statistics on certain designated types of property, e.g., "CB" radios, which are the object of theft fads)

NOTE: Property may be grouped together by Property Loss Type and Property Class.

Intangible is anything which cannot be perceived by the sense of touch. It can be a benefit, e.g., a right or privilege, a promotion, enhanced reputation, etc.; or a detriment, e.g., a loss of reputation, injured feelings, etc.

EDITS: Must be a valid code.

- If "77" (PENDING INVENTORY) is entered, then Property Value must be "1" (UNKNOWN \$1.00).
- If Property Class is completed, then Property Loss Type is required.
- If "09" (CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS) or "22" (NONNEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS), Property Value must be "0".
- If Property Class is "10" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) and Property Value is blank, there must be an Offense File Class of 3500-1 VCSA.
- Only one property record with code "77" (PENDING INVENTORY) can be entered per incident. This record can only be entered on the Incident (MICR.1) screen/format.

EXAMPLES:

The following property was stolen as the result of a burglary: (1) a \$10,000 stamp collection; (2) jewelry worth \$5,000; (3) a \$1,800 personal computer; (4) clothes worth \$1,500; (5) silverware worth \$800; (6) a \$650 TV; (7) a \$450 VCR; (8) a \$400 microwave oven; (9) \$350 in cash; (10) a \$25 typewriter; (11) a \$150 shotgun; (12) a \$100 bicycle; (13) two credit cards (no value); and (14) ten blank personal checks (no value).

Item #1, the stamp collection does not fit into any of the specifically coded property classes, it should be entered as "88" (OTHER). Item #2, jewelry, should be entered as "17" (JEWELRY/PRECIOUS METALS); item #3, personal computer, as "07" (COMPUTER HARDWARE/SOFTWARE); item #4, clothes, as "06" (CLOTHES/FURS); item #5, silverware, as "17" (JEWELRY/PRECIOUS METALS); items #6 and #7, TV and VCR, as "26" (RADIOS/TVS/VCRS); item #8, microwave oven, as "16" (HOUSEHOLD

EXAMPLES: (cont.)

GOODS); item #9, cash, as "20" (MONEY); item #10, typewriter, as "23" (OFFICE-TYPE EQUIPMENT); item #11, shotgun, as "13" (FIREARMS); item #12, bicycle, as "04" (BICYCLES); items #13, the two credit cards, as "09" (CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS); and item 14, ten blank checks, as "22" (NONNEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS).

[If property were grouped together by Property Loss Type and Property Class, this example would be entered as follows: Item (1), the stamp collection, does not fit into any of the specifically coded property classes, it should be included in "88" (OTHER). The jewelry and silverware should be entered as code "17" (JEWELRY/PRECIOUS METALS); the personal computer as "07" (COMPUTER HARDWARE/SOFTWARE); the clothes as "06" (CLOTHES/FURS); the TV and VCR as "26" (RADIOS/TVS/VCRS); the microwave oven as "16" (HOUSEHOLD GOODS); the cash as "20" (MONEY); the typewriter as "23" (OFFICE-TYPE EQUIPMENT); the shotgun as "13" (FIREARMS); the bicycle as "04" (BICYCLES); the two credit cards as "09" (CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS); and ten blank checks as "22" (NONNEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS).]

If a house was destroyed by arson and the homeowners are away on an overseas trip making it impossible to determine the property loss until they return, enter "77" (PENDING INVENTORY). [NOTE: An updated Property record, with entries describing the type(s) of burned property, should be submitted when the results of the inventory are subsequently learned.]

MICR DATA ELEMENTS

DATA ELEMENT #55. Property Value

DATA BASE NAME: VALUE

DATA FORMAT: 9 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter up to nine (9) characters indicating the total dollar

value (in whole dollars) for all victims in the incident by Property Class. If value is unknown, enter \$1.00. If item

has no value, enter all zeroes.

NOTE: The following procedures are suggested to determine valuation of stolen property:

- a. Use fair market value for articles which are subject to depreciation because of wear and tear, age, or other factors which cause the value to decrease with use.
- b. Use cost to the merchant (wholesale cost) of goods stolen from retail establishments, warehouses, etc. In other words, use the dollar value representing the actual cash loss to the victim without any markup or profit added.
- c. Use victim's evaluation of items such as jewelry, watches, and other similar goods which decrease in value slightly or not at all with use or age.
- d. Use replacement cost or actual cash cost to victim for new or almost new clothes, auto accessories, bicycles, etc.
- e. When the victim obviously exaggurates the value of stolen property for insurance or other purposes, common sense and good judgement will dictate a fair market value to be placed on the stolen items by law enforcement.

Black's Law Dictionary defines fair market value as the price in cash, or its equivalent, for which the property can be sold on the market.

If drugs or narcotics are seized in a drug case, no value is to be entered into this data element, but the Suspected Drug Type, Estimated Drug Quantity, and Type Drug Massurement are to be reported. However, when drugs or narcotics are involved in other types of crime (e.g., stolen through burglary, robbery, theft, etc., or destroyed by arson), their value is to be entered into this data element and Suspected Drug Type, Estimated Drug Quantity, and Type Drug Measurement are to be left blank.

EDITS: Must be all numeric digits with zero left-fill if entered.

If value is UNKNOWN, must have value of "1" (\$1.00).

Must be "0" if Property Class is "09" (CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS) or "22" (NONNEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS).

If a value is entered, then Property Loss Type and Property Class must be entered.

Can be "0" if Property Class is "88" (OTHER) or "99" (SPECIAL CATEGORY). All property that is recovered must also be reported as stolen.

(This edit does not apply to Offense File Classes 2400-2 Motor Vehicle as Stolen Property, 2500-0 Forgery/Counterfeiting, or 2800-0 Stolen Property.)

EDITS: (cont.)

When Property Loss Type entries are made for both "7" (STOLEN) and "5" (RECOVERED), the recovered property cannot have property values greater than corresponding property values reported stolen.

If Property Class is coded as "10" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) and the only offense submitted is 3500-1 Violation of Controlled Substance Act, the property value must be blank. However, if there are multiple property offenses submitted, do not include the value of any "10" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) pertaining to offense 3500-1 in this data element, but do include the value of these drugs that apply to non-3500-1 offenses. If any offense other than 3500-1 has a "10" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) entry, the value for this property must be entered in this data element.

EXAMPLES:

A house was destroyed by arson and the homeowners are away on an overseas trip making it impossible to determine the property loss until they return. Enter "1" UNKNOWN (\$1.00) into this data element. [NOTE: An updated Property record, with appropriate property loss values, should be submitted after the results of the inventory are learned.]

Two victims had their bicycles stolen at the same time and place; one was worth \$300 and the other \$150. "04" (BICYCLES) should be entered into Property Class and "300" and "150" entered in this data element by item number.

The following property was stolen as the result of a burglary: (1) a \$10,000 stamp collection; (2) jewelry worth \$5,000; (3) a \$1,800 personal computer; (4) clothes worth \$1,500; (5) silverware worth \$800; (6) a \$650 TV; (7) a \$450 VCR; (8) a \$400 microwave oven; (9) \$350 in cash; (10) a \$25 typewriter; (11) a \$150 shotgun; (12) a \$100 bicycle; (13) two credit cards (no value); and (14) ten blank personal checks (no value). The values for each specifically coded property should be entered as follows: item #1, stamp collection (code 88), as "10000"; item #2, jewelry (code 17), as "5000"; item #3, personal computer (code 07), as "1800"; item #4, clothes (code 06), as "1500"; item #5, silverware (code 17), as "800"; item #6, TV (code 26), as "650"; item #7, VCR (code 26), as "450"; item #8, microwave oven (code 16), as "400"; item #9, cash (code 20), as "350"; item #10, typewriter (code 23), as "25"; item #11, shotgun (code 13), as "150"; item #12, bicycle (code 04), as "100"; item #13, two credit cards (code 09), as "0"; and item #14, ten blank checks (code 22), as "0".

[If property were grouped together by Property Loss Type and Property Class, the last two examples would be entered as follows:
Two victims had their bicycles stolen at the same time and place; one was worth \$300 and the other \$150. "04" (BICYCLES) should be entered into Property Class and their total value "450" (\$300 + \$150 = \$450) into this data element.

"5800" for the jewelry and silverware (code 17), "1800" for the personal computer (code 07), "1500" for the clothes (code 06), "1100" for the TV and VCR (code 26), "400" for the microwave oven (code 16), "350" for the cash (code 20), "25" for the typewriter (code 23), "150" for the shotgun (code 13), "100" for the bicycle (code 04), "10000" for the stamp collection (code 88), "0" for the two credit cards (code 09), and "0" for the ten blank checks (code 22).]

DATA ELEMENT #56. Date Recovered

DATA BASE NAME: DATE-RECOV

DATA FORMAT: 6 characters Numeric Month-Day-Year (MMDDYY)

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the Month, Day and Year when the property

was recovered.

NOTE: This data element is to be used only if Property Type Loss is "1" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED) or "5" (RECOVERED).

If property is grouped together by Property Loss Type and Property Class and there is more than one date of recovery for the same Property Class, enter the earliest date.

If the recovery date is unknown, enter the date of the report.

EDITS: Must be valid date.

Month must be "01-12".

Day cannot exceed the number of days for the month recovered.

Date cannot be future date from the entry date.

Required when Property Type Loss is "1" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED) or "5" (RECOVERED).

Date Recovered cannot be prior to original Date of Occurrence/Report.

If completed, then Property Type, Property Class and Property Value must be entered.

If Action is "W" (WINDOW UPDATE), Date Recovered cannot be prior to the base date or agency start date.

Must be blank if Property Loss Type is not "1" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED) or "5" (RECOVERED).

EXAMPLES:

On October 10, 1991, 2 bicycles were stolen from a public school parking lot. The first bicycle was recovered on October 15, 1991. The other bicycle was recovered on October 31, 1991. The date entered into this data element for the first bicycle, item #1, should be "101591" and the second bicycle, item #2, should be "103191".

[If property were grouped together by Property Loss Type and Property Class, the example would be entered as follows: The date entered into this data element for the property class "04" (BICYCLES) should be "101591" since that is the earliest date of recovery for this property class.]

DATA ELEMENT #57. Number of Stolen/Recovered Vehicles

DATA BASE NAME: ST-RC-VEHI

DATA FORMAT: 2 characters Numeric

CODING STRUCTURE: Enter the number of stolen and recovered vehicles in the

incident.

NOTE: The code in the Property Type Loss will indicate if the vehicles are "1" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED), "5" (RECOVERED) or "7" (STOLEN).

If property is entered by single item and not grouped together, the value in this data element will always be 1 for stolen and recovered motor vehicles.

EDITS: Must be blank or valid number "01" through "99".

Must be blank if Offense File Class is not "2400-1" or "2400-2".

If the Offense File Class is 2400-1 Motor Vehicle Theft and the Property Type is "5" (RECOVERED) then all vehicles must have been reported stolen and the value and number of vehicles recovered cannot be greater than the value and number of vehicles stolen.

Must be blank if Property Class is not "03", "05", "24", "28", or "37". The total number of recovered vehicles must be equal to or less than the total number of stolen vehicles per incident.

Required when offense code is:

2400-1 Motor Vehicle Theft

and Property Loss Type is:

"1" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED)

Three of these vehicles were recovered on November 1, 1991. "01" would be entered in this data element and "5" (RECOVERED) in Property Loss Type. If the automobiles are grouped together, to report the stolen, "05" would be entered in this data element and "7" (STOLEN) in Property Loss Type. The recovery would be reported as "03" in this data element and "5" (RECOVERED) in Property Loss Type.

A motor home was stolen from a residence and recovered 3 hours later. No damage had been done to the motor home so the value did not decrease. "01" would be entered in this data element and "01" (STOLEN AND RECOVERED) could be entered in Property Loss Type.

NOTE: This data element is used only if one of the offenses in the incident is 3500-1 Violation of Control Substance Act, "6" (SEIZED) or "0" (NONE) is entered in Property Type Loss, and "10" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) is entered in Property Class.

This data element is <u>not</u> used when drugs or narcotics were stolen, burned, etc., in connection with other offenses, such as Arson, Burglary, and Larceny.

Drug property should be grouped together as much as possible by Suspected Drug Type and Type Drug Measurement.

MICR DATA ELEMENTS

The state program will accept more than 3 drug property items. However, only three drug records will be forwarded to the FBI grouped by Suspected Drug Type and Type Drug Measurement. If more than 3 records are a result of this grouping, the 3rd FBI record will be coded as "77" (OVER 3 DRUG TYPES) in the Suspected Drug Type. Agencies have the option of grouping their drug information in this way prior to submitting the data to the state program. Agencies opting to group the drug information should enter the two most important drugs first (taking into account the quantity, value, and deadliness of the drugs/narcotics) and combining any remaining drugs (if any) as "77" (OVER 3 DRUG TYPES).

EDITS: Must be blank or valid code.

Required when Offense File Class is 3500-1 (VCSA)

[If an agency grouped their drug information, this example is: The 1.5 kilogram of crack would be entered as item #1, code "01"; the 2.0 liquid ounces of Morphine as item #2, code "06"; and the Marijuana and Valium combined as item 03, code "77".]

NOTE: This data element is used only if one of the offenses in the incident is 3500-1 Violation of Control Substance Act, "6" (SEIZED) is entered in Property Type Loss and "10" (DRUGS/NARCOTICS) is entered in Property Class.

This data element is divided into two separate fields. The first nine digits indicate the whole number of estimated drug quantity and is right-justified. The last three digits indicate the fraction of estimated drug quantity represented in thousandths and is left-justified (Ex: 1/2 ounce = 500, 1/4 gram = 250).

This data element is <u>not</u> used when drugs or narcotics were stolen, burned, etc., in connection with other offenses, such as Arson, Burglary, and Larceny.

EDITS: Must be blank or valid number.

Drug information should be grouped together as much as possible by Suspected Drug Type and Type Drug Measurement.

"KG" (KILOGRAM) should be entered for the item #1, crack; "LB" (POUND) for item #2, Marijuana; "OZ" (OUNCE) for item #3, Morphine; and "DU" (DOSAGE UNITS/ITEMS) for item #4, Valium.

In a drug case, a large quantity of crack, cocaine, and marijuana was seized. The officer being unsure of the quantity of each drug entered "XX" (NOT REPORTED) in this field and waited until the reports were received from the forensic laboratory. At that time, the officer submitted a report to delete the NOT REPORTED item and enter the correct information.

GLOSSARY

Michigan Department of State Police CENTRAL RECORDS DIVISION Uniform Crime Reporting Section January 01, 1994 Acting in Concert - The offenders must actually commit or assist in the commission of the crime(s). All of the offenders must be aware of and consent to the commission of the crime(s); or, even if nonconsenting, their actions assist in the commission of the offense(s).

Automatic Weapon - Any firearm which shoots, or is designed to shoot, more than one shot at a time by a single pull of the trigger without manual reloading.

Base Date - January 1 of the first year of the two years of data retained on the on-line MICR data base.

Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their race, religion, ethnicity/national origin, or sexual orientation.

Bias Crime - A criminal offense committed against a person or property which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, ethnic/national origin group, or sexual orientation group. Also known as "Hate Crime".

Bisexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, both males and females; [noun] a bisexual person.

Clearance - An arrest has been made or the incident has been cleared by exceptional means. The clearance of one offense in multiple offense incidents will clear the entire incident.

Concept of Time and Place - If more than one crime was committed by the same person or group of persons and the time and space intervals separating them were insignificant, all of the crimes make up a single incident.

Conditional Mandatory Data Element - Data elements which apply only to specific types of offenses, situations, or circumstances.

Continuing Criminal Activity - Incidents comprised of offenses committed by the same offender(s) at different times and places, as long as the activity is deemed to constitute a single criminal transaction.

Data Element - A unique piece of information that can be entered into the MICR report. Data Elements are grouped by like information within the 6 MICR Record Types.

Date Range - Measured from the current date back to January 1st of the previous year. For example, if todays' date is August 13, 1994, the date range for MICR data base will be between January 1, 1993, and August 13, 1994.

Ethnicity/National Origin Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same race or national origin who share common or similar traits, languages, customs, and traditions (e.g., Arabs, Hispanics, etc.).

Fair Market Value - The price in cash, or its equivalent, for which the property can be sold on the market.

Field Edits - Edits which verify the accuracy of the codes submitted for a single data element.

Gay - [adjective] Of or relating to males who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other males; [noun] a homosexual male.

Gender Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same biological category.

Clobal Edits - Edits which verify the accuracy of the incident as a whole and checks data element relationships between records in the incident.

Gross Negligence - The intentional failure to perform a manifest duty in reckless disregard of the consequences as affecting the life or property of another.

Group A Offenses - Offenses identified by the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) which will be used as the indicators of the dimensions and trends in crime on a national scale.

Group B Offenses - Offenses which will not be used to measure crime on a natinal scale.

Hate Crime - See Bias Crime.

Nate Group - An organization whose primary purpose is to promote animosity, hostility, and malice against persons belonging to a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group which suffers from that of the members of the organization (e.g., the Ku Klux Klan, American Nazi Party, etc.).

Heterosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of the opposite sex; [noun] a heterosexual person.

Hispanic - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Homosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex; [noun] a homosexual person.

Hotel Rule - If a number of dwelling units or rental storage facilities under a single manager are burglarized and the offenses are most likely to be reported to the police by the manager rather than individual tenants, the burglary should be scored as one offense.

IACP - International Association of Chiefs of Police

Implied Edits - Edits which are logically inferred between dependent data elements.

Incident - One or more offenses committed by the same person or group of persons acting in concert, at the same time and place. An incident is comprised of different records; administrative, offense, offender, victim, arrest, and/or property.

Intangible - Anything which cannot be perceived by the sense of touch. It can be a benefit, e.g., a right or privilege, a promotion, enhanced reputation, etc.; or a detriment, e.g., a loss of reputation, injured feelings, etc.

IRS - Incident Reporting System

Juvenile - An individual person whose age is less than seventeen.

LEMS - Law Enforcement Management System

Lesbian - [adjective] Of or relating to females who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other females; [noun] a homosexual female.

Legal Residence - The permanent fixed place of abode which a person intends to be his residence and to which he intends to return despite temporary residences elsewhere or despite temporary absences.

LEIN - Law Enforcement Information Network

Loss of Consciousness - An injury which must be the direct result of force inflicted on the victim by the offender.

MACP - Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police

Malice - The intentional doing of a wrongful act without just cause or excuse, with an intent to inflict injury or under circumstances that the law will imply an evil intent.

Mandatory Data Element - Data element must have a substantively valid code present. For example, ORI, Incident Number, and Original Year are elements which must be present to link incidents and supplemental information together.

MICR - Michigan Incident Crime Reporting

MSA - Michigan Sheriffs Association

National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) - The new unit-record reporting system which is being implemented to replace the traditional UCR Summary Reporting System (SRS). NIBRS provides for expanded collection and reporting of offenses, arrests, and their circumstances.

Negligence - The omission to do something which a reasonable man, guided by those ordinary considerations which ordinarily regulate human affairs, would do, or the doing of something which a reasonable and prudent man would not do.

NIBRS - National Incident-Based Reporting System

NSA - National Sheriffs Association

Racial Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who possess common physical characteristics (e.g., color of skin, eyes and/or hair, facial features, etc.) genetically transmitted by descent and heredity which distinguish them as a distinct division of humankind (e.g. Asians, blacks, whites, etc.).

Record Type - A grouping of like Data Elements. The 6 MICR Record Types include Administrative, Offense, Offender, Victim, Arrest and Property Records.

Religious Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who share the same religious beliefs regarding the origin and purpose of the universe and the existence or nonexistence of a supreme being (e.g., Catholics, Jews, Protestants, atheists, etc.).

Resident - A person who maintains his/her permanent home for legal purposes in the locality where the crime took place.

Same Time and Place - The time interval between the offenses and the distance between the locations where they occurred were insignificant. Normally, the offenses must have occurred during an unbroken time duration and at the same or adjoining location(s).

Serious Criminal Offense - A felony or high misdemeanor.

Severe Laceration - Injury which should receive medical attention.

Sexual Orientation Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex or members of the opposite sex (e.g., gays, lesbians, heterosexuals, etc.).

Start Date - The date an agency begins submitting MICR data. Agencies will be required to begin submitting MICR data on the 1st of the month, not in the middle.

Summary Reporting System (SRS) - The traditional aggregate system which has been used nationally since 1930 to collect UCR data.


Transaction Screen/Format - The screens/formats used to submit MICR data.

UCR - Uniform Crime Reporting

Vehicular Manslaughter - Any death resulting from the negligent operation of a motor vehicle except where the motor vehicle was utilized as a weapon.

Window Updates - Updates of exceptional clearance, arrests, and/or recovered property for incidents that occurred prior to the agency submitting MICR data or prior to the base date of the on-line MICR data base.

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Section 1: Introduction to MICR

MICR was developed to provide a single method for the collection of accurate, detailed information.

The MICR Handbook

This handbook was prepared with you in mind! Every effort has been taken to make this resource tool as accurate and easy-to-use as possible. This handbook provides a "road map" to help you make your way around the MICR system simple and efficient. Wherever possible, information is graphically displayed to assist you in your reporting tasks.

A brief review of the table of contents will provide an orientation to this resource manual and indicate where you will locate specific information about the MICR system. Please take a moment now to review the sections of this handbook.

The information covered in Sections 1-3 provides a solid introduction to using the MICR reporting system.

Since the vast majority (95%) of all incident reports currently deal with a single offense, a single victim, and a single offender, the focus of this handbook is on information required to complete the standard MICR-1 report.

Section 4: Incident Reporting provides easy-to-use, graphic worksheets, covering all the data elements necessary to complete the MICR-1 report. You only need to identify the offense (Section 5), then enter the Data Elements (Section 3) displayed on the worksheet.

The remaining sections of the handbook provide helpful reference information, including:

- ► Property Record Overview
- Instructions for entering Exceptional Clearance and Hate/Bias Motivation
- Instructions for coding Multiple Offenses/Offenders

We believe that this handbook will remain a valuable tool for streamlining Uniform Crime Reporting procedures in Michigan.

MICR Goals

Here are three specific goals of the MICR system:

► Goal #1:

To have all agencies report MICR data.

► Goal #2:

To have all agencies report to the MSP UCR Section via on-line transaction (paperless).

► Goal #3:

To replace the current dual reporting systems (Incident Reporting System and UCR summary system) with a single reporting method.

MICR Objectives


To achieve the stated goals, UCR will implement the following objectives:

- Redesign the current on-line batch system to an on-line update system.
- Encourage LEIN servicing agencies to allow entry of incident data through LEIN terminals for non-LEIN agencies.
- ► Develop a computer-to-computer interactive on-line update system.
- Require summary reporting agencies to submit incident reports.

MICR History

The following chart, MICR at a Glance, provides a brief history of the development of the MICR system.

MICR at a Glance



Since 1976 (LEMS), Michigan has operated dual systems:

- 93% of reporting agencies participate in IRS, reporting 71% of Michigan crime
- 7% of reporting agencies participate in the summary reporting system, reporting 29% of Michigan crime

Section 2: The MICR Report

This section defines the elements that make up the MICR report and provides information for submitting the report.

What Is a MICR Report?

A MICR report consists of 6 Record Types containing a total of 61 Data Elements. Figure 3-1 shows this relationship:





Figure 2-1. The MICR Report

What Is a Record Type?

A record type is a grouping of like Data Elements. The six MICR record types are:



Provides agency information, dates, times, location, and exceptional clearance, along with other administrative information required for all MICR incident reports

Figure 2-2. MICR Record Types

What Is a Data Element?

A Data Element is a unique piece of information within a Record Type. Data Elements allow you to enter specific details for an incident, as well as administrative information that tags the incident within the MICR system.

Some Data Elements perform other functions, such as:

- Informing the system which action is to be performed
- Linking Data Elements to each other within the system
- Providing Arrest and Clearance statistical information
- Indicating the end of a record

Whether you enter an incident report on a paper form, or directly into a computer, it is important to furnish the correct information for each of the required Data Elements to properly complete the report.

How Many Data Elements To Enter

Not every Data Element is used for each incident. The type of offense and the circumstances surrounding the incident dictate the Data Elements used in each case.

Section 4: Incident Reporting, provides an easy-to-use method for entering the Data Elements required for each offense. This section covers the MICR1 report which is used for 95% of all entries.

How to Complete a MICR Report

Whether you enter an incident report on a paper form, or directly into a computer, the process and the information required are exactly the same. Figure 2-3 shows the three steps necessary to complete a MICR report.



To Complete the MICR Report

To complete the MICR report, simply determine the offense file class code, find the corresponding worksheet in section 4, and enter the required Data Elements.

How to Enter a Data Element

To enter a Data Element, simply write or input the proper character code (letter or number) in the required space.

Job Aids

For your assistance in completing a MICR report, this handbook contains the following job aids:

- A quick reference identification card for Data Elements
- Alphabetic and Numeric listings of Offense File Class Codes (Section 5)
- Alphabetic and Numeric listings of Data Elements (Section 3)
- Data Element tables, listing the function of each Data Element and its appropriate edits (Section 3)
- Data Element Details with helpful coding information and examples (Section 3)

Once you are familiar with Data Element definitions and edits, the quick reference card will be all you need to complete a MICR report.

Screen Entry Format




Figure 2-5. MICR1 Paper Form

Ways to Submit a MICR Report

There are two ways to submit the completed MICR report:

Automated Submission:

- ► LEIN
 - Online Entry
 - Computer-to-Computer Interactive
- ► Bulletin Board System
- ► Magnetic Media

Paper Forms

Automated Submission

Agencies can submit MICR data from their own computerized information system via the following methods:

- ► LEIN
 - Online Entry
 - Computer-to-Computer Interactive
- ► Bulletin Board
- ► Magnetic Media

Agencies other than those using LEIN online entry will be required to complete a testing phase prior to authorization from the state program to participate in MICR. The purpose of this testing phase is to ensure the quality and integrity of data collected and submitted to MICR.

Agencies must contact the UCR section to schedule testing. Proper specifications must be followed to minimize transaction errors. During the testing phase, local agencies must continue to submit all incident data via their current method of reporting.

After the agency has successfully tested their MICR software with the state program, formal authorization to participate in MICR will be granted. Authorized agencies may then discontinue their current method of submission, along with the Supplementary Homicide Report (SHR). The Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA) form will still need to be submitted when applicable.

Transactions and Errors

1. Computer-to-Computer Interactive
Transactions are submitted via direct
interactive LEIN lines. The agency must
develop software to receive acceptance and
error messages. The agency must be able to
correct erroneous incidents and resubmit
the corrected incident data.

Agencies who have not established direct line communication with the Criminal Justice Data Center will need to contact that division to obtain information on the communication protocol.

2. Bulletin Board System

The state program will develop a bulletin board system allowing agencies to upload an ASCII file.

The MICR bulletin board system will be the same type as currently being used by the State Fire Marshal Division for the Michigan Fire Incident Reporting System (MFIRS). Any errors encountered during the data base update will be put into a file on the bulletin board for the agency to download, review their errors, and resubmit the corrected records.

More information will be available as the system is developed.

3. Magnetic Media

The state program will accept unlabeled IBM 3480 style cartridge and 9 track reel tapes from automated agencies which are unable to report via computer-to-computer interactive or bulletin board.

The 9 track reel tapes must be created at 1600 or 6250 BPI. It is preferred the reel tapes be 1/2" x 10 1/2" in an Autoloader II tape strap, although other sizes will be accepted.

Each record must be a fixed length of 420 characters, block 10. They must be sorted by ORI number (if multiple agencies are submitted on one tape) and numeric order by incident number. Errors will be returned via a paper report which the agency must use to correct and resubmit the corrected records.

Paper Forms

Those agencies which have no access to a LEIN on-line system and do not have a computer system to collect this information will be provided paper forms to complete and submit their MICR data.

No Criminal Data To Report

Agencies which have no criminal activity in a given month must submit a record to notify the UCR Section of no criminal activity. This will prevent notification of delinquent reporting. This record must be submitted for each month that the agency has no criminal activity to report.

This record must only be submitted if the agency has no criminal incidents to report and no arrests, recovered property or exceptional clearances with dates occurring within the given month. Submit the record as follows:

To prevent notification of delinquent reporting, agencies which have no criminal activity in a given month must submit a record of no criminal activity.

Assist Incident Report

Submit an assist incident report if the incident investigation/arrest is being handled by another police jurisdiction. Assist incident reports are not mandatory for UCR reporting and will not be forwarded to the FBI.

An assist incident report may not include Offender, Victim, Arrest and/or Property information. Submit an assist record as follows:

Unfounded Incident

Unfounded incidents should not be entered in MICR. If an incident is determined to be unfounded, do not submit an incident report to UCR.

If an incident is determined to be unfounded after an incident report has already been submitted, the entire record for that incident must be deleted from the MICR data base. See Section 12: Updates for details on deleting an incident.



Entering Additional Records

The MICR system has been designed so the majority of the incidents (approximately 95% offender/victim/arrest) can be entered using one Incident (MICR1) format. The MICR1 format includes the following number of records:

- ► Administrative 1
- ► Offenses Up to 4
- ▶ Offender 1
- ► Victim 1
- ► Arrest 1
- ► Property Items Up to 4

Additional formats are available to report additional records for:

- ► Offenders (MICR3) Up to 20
- ► Victims (MICR5) Up to 5
- ► Arrests (MICR7) Up to 7
- ► Property (MICR9) Up to 10




Figure 2-6. The MICR Data Base

For most incidents reported by sheriff and local agencies, this code will be the same as the County code within the ORI. However, if your jurisdiction crosses county lines, report the county in which the incident occurred.

Sanilac, Schoolcraft, Shiawassee, St. Clair, and St. Joseph county numbers have been changed to match the county number in the ORI.

Examples:

- ► The incident occurred in Washtenaw County, the entry should be "81".
- The incident occurred in St. Joseph County, the entry should be "75".

06 City/Township

Examples:

- ► If the incident occurred in the city of Ann Arbor in Washtenaw county, the entry should be "89".
- If the incident occurred in the city of Detroit in Wayne county, the entry should be "99".

08 Date of Occurrence/Report

- ► If a robbery occurred at 9:00 p.m. on September 26, 1993, the entry should be "092693".
- ▶ If a kidnapping started at 11:30 p.m. on October 4, 1993, and ended at 1:00 p.m. on October 7, 1993, the entry should be "100493".

10 Hour Occurred

15 Location Site

Enter the code that BEST describes the circumstances of the offense.

An assault started in a bar (03), continued into an adjoining parking lot (18), and ended in the street (13). As the bar was the location where the offense was initiated and best describes the circumstances of the crime, "03" (Bar/Night Club) should be entered.

16 Offense Attempted/Completed

If there was more than one occurrence of the same MICR offense within an incident and one was completed, then "C" (Completed) must be entered.

- During the same incident, the offender had forcible sexual intercourse with one victim and attempted forcible sexual intercourse with a second victim but left the scene prior to completion of the act. Since one act was completed and only one file ass is reported, "C" (Completed) should be entered in this data element.
- During a robbery, the offender murdered one victim and attempted to murder another victim before leaving the scene. Three offenses would be coded "C" (Completed) as 12000 for the robbery, 09001 for the murder, and 13002 (Aggravated Assault) for the attempted murder.

17 Offender Suspected of Using

Enter the one (1) character code to indicate if any of the offenders were suspected of consuming alcohol or using drugs/narcotics during or shortly before the incident; or of using computer equipment to perpetrate the crime; or a combination of alcohol, drugs/narcotics and computer equipment.

Up to three (3) codes can be entered. If more than one code is entered, it may not be a duplicate. Code "N" (Not Applicable) may not be used with any other code.

Examples:

- Witnesses to an assault reported that the victim and offender were in a bar drinking when an argument broke out and the offender attacked the victim with a knife. Enter "A" (Alcohol) in this data element.
- A victim of sexual assault advised that her attacker bragged that he had been "freebasing" cocaine just prior to the incident. "D" (Drugs/Narcotics) should be entered.
- A medical supply warehouse was burglarized and large quantities of Methadone, Morphine, Benzedrine, and Valium were stolen. "D" (Drugs/Narcotics) should not be entered because, while the drugs were the object of the crime, there was no indication that the offenders used drugs or narcotics before or during the incident.
- A victim of an aggravated assault reported that the attacker was smoking marijuana and drinking prior to the attack. Enter "A" (Alcohol) and "D" (Drugs/Narcotics).

20 Activity Type

Example:

The offenders published and sold pornographic photographs of children. Because up to three types of activity can be entered, "C" (Cultivating/ Manufacturing/Publishing), "D" (Distributing/ Selling), and "E" (Exploiting Children) should be entered.

22 Offender Number

Enter a two (2) character assigned unique number from "01" through "99" for each offender involved in the incident. If nothing is known about the offender(s), enter "00" into this data element and leave the remaining offender data elements blank.

This variable is used to link victim and offenders in Offender Related Number (Data Element 37) in order to establish Victim to Offender Relationship (See Section 9).

Offender number 01 or 00 is entered on the Incident (MICR.1) transaction format.

If 00 is entered on an original and a known offender is later added to the incident, the 00 (unknown) offender will automatically be deleted from the state program.

Examples:

- A corpse with five bullet holes in it was found in an abandoned warehouse. There were no witnesses to the crime or suspects. A single Offender record should be submitted with "00" entered in this data element and no entries in offender age, sex and race.
- Two offenders were seen fleeing the scene of a burglary, but because they were wearing ski masks, their age, sex and race could not be determined. Two offender segments should be submitted one with Offender Number "01" and the other with Offender Number "02". Applicable "unknown" codes should be entered into offender age, sex and race fields.

24 Offender Race

Example:

 If the offender was oriental, the entry should be "A" (Asian/Pacific Islander).

Victim Connected Offense File Class

Example:

Two victims, Victim 01 and Victim 02, were robbed and Victim 01 was sexually assaulted. In the Victim record for Victim 01, both "12000" and "11001" should be entered. In the Victim record for Victim 02, only "12000" should be entered.

28 Victim Type

- During a bank robbery, the offender pointed a gun at a teller demanded and received money. The robber also pistol whipped a customer who stood in his way as he made his getaway from the bank. There were three (3) victims, i.e., the bank ("F" Financial Institution), the teller ("I" Individual), and the pistol whipped customer ("I" Individual). Therefore, three Victim records should be completed with the proper Victim Type code entered into their respective Victim records.
- An offender is arrested for operating his vehicle under the influence of liquor. If a victim record is completed, the Victim Type must be "S" (Society/Public).

34 Victim Injury

Examples:

- The offender assaulted the victim with a tire iron, breaking the victim's arm and opening up a cut about three inches long and one inch deep on his back. In this case, the reporting agency could enter "B" (Apparent Broken Bones).
- The victim, a respected religious figure, is blackmailed regarding his sexual activities. As he suffered no physical injury, the entry should be "N" (None).
- If the victim type is "B" (Business), this data element would be left blank.

35 Victim Circumstance

Examples:

- In resisting arrest, a fugitive pulled a gun and fired two times in the direction of two police officers who were attempting to take him into custody. Neither officer was hit but both drew their weapons and returned the fire, killing the fugitive. As this was a Justifiable Homicide, "21" (Criminal Killed by Police Officer) should be entered and Justifiable Homicide Circumstance (Data Element 36) should be completed.
- Two rival juvenile street gangs rumble over "turf" rights to sell drugs and one of the gang members is killed. Possible entries are "01" (Argument), "03" (Drug Dealing), and "05" (Juvenile Gang). While all three would apply, there is a limit of one entry. Therefore, the most descriptive code (as determined by the reporting agency) should be used. In this case, the reporting agency could enter "03" (Drug Dealing).

36 Justifiable Homicide Circumstance

Example:

 In resisting arrest, a fugitive pulled a gun and fired two times in the direction of two police officers who were attempting to take him into custody. Neither officer was hit but both drew their weapons and returned the fire, killing the fugitive. The possible entries are: "1" (Criminal Attacked Police Officer and that Officer Killed the Criminal); "2" (Criminal Attacked Police Officer and Criminal Killed by Another Police Officer); and "6" (Criminal Resisted Arrest). As only one code can be entered, the most descriptive code (as determined by the reporting agency) should be used. In this case, the reporting agency could enter "1" (Criminal Attacked Police Officer and that Officer Killed the Criminal).

37 Offender Related Number

- ▶ If Victim 01's relationship to Offender 01 is to be reported, enter "01".
- If Victim 01's relationship to Offender 01 and Offender 02 is to be reported, enter "01" and "02".

38 Victim to Offender Relationship

Examples:

- An employee assaulted his employer (a person) with his fists. "28" (Victim was Employer) should be entered.
- Two unknown subjects rob a male and female couple. "98" (Victim was Stranger) should be entered to indicate the relationship of each victim to each offender.

40 Arrest Type

Examples:

- ► The subject was arrested without a warrant while in the act of soliciting for prostitution on a street corner. The entry should be "O" (On-View Arrest).
- ► The subject was served with a subpoena summoning him to appear in court. The entry should be "S" (Summoned/Cited).
- The subject was taken into custody as the result of a complaint being filed, an investigation being conducted, and a warrant being issued. The entry should be "T" (Taken Into Custody).

46 Arrest Charge

- A person was arrested for 0903 Willful Killing/Nonfamily/Gun and 2202 -Forced Entry/Nonresidence. As only one arrest charge can be entered, the reporting agency entered "0903" (Willful Killing/Nonfamily/Gun).
- A person was arrested for 3510 Heroin/Sell/Manufacture, 3560 Marijuana/Sell, and
 3550 Narcotic Equipment/Possess. As
 only one arrest charge can be entered,
 the reporting agency entered "3510"
 (Heroin/Sell/Manufacture).
- A person was arrested for 4104 -Possession of Alcoholic Liquor in a Motor Vehicle and 8041 - Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol. As only one arrest charge can be entered, the reporting agency entered "8041" (Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol).

47

Arrest Armed

Examples:

- When the subject was arrested, he had in his possession a .357 magnum handgun and a penknife. The entry should be "12" (Handgun). Because a small pocket knife is not generally considered to be a "weapon", it does not qualify for reporting.
- The subject resisted arrest using a liquor bottle and a chair as weapons before being subdued. The entry should be "01" (Unarmed). Although the subject used items as weapons, they were not commonly known weapons.

50

Disposition of Arrest Under 18

Examples:

- The 13 year old person, who was arrested for vandalizing a school, was released to his parents with a warning. The entry should be "H" (Handled Within Department).
- The 17 year old person was arrested for murder. Even though he is an adult under Michigan Law, it is required that a disposition be submitted. In this case, the entry should be "R" (Referred to Other Authorities) as he will be tried in adult court.

59 Estimated Drug Quantity

Must be "1000" (None) if Type Drug Measurement (Data Element 60) is "XX" (Not Reported)

Example:

In a drug case, the following drugs were seized: (1) 1.5 kilograms of crack; (2) 2.125 pounds of Marijuana; (3) 2.0 liquid ounces of Morphine; and (4) 500 Valium capsules. "1500" should be entered for the item #1, crack; "2125" for item #2, Marijuana; "2000" for item #3, Morphine; and "500000" for item #4, Valium.

60 Type Drug Measurement

Example:

In a drug case, the following drugs were seized: (1) 1.5 kilograms of crack; (2) 2.125 pounds of Marijuana; (3) 2.0 liquid ounces of Morphine; and (4) 500 Valium capsules. "KG" (Kilogram) should be entered for the item #1, crack; "LB" (Pound) for item #2, Marijuana; "OZ" (Ounce) for item #3, Morphine; and "DU" (Dosage Units/Items) for item #4, Valium.

61 Incident Complete Indicator

The incident must be flagged as completed before final crossfield edits are performed and the incident is forwarded to the FBI. By entering "Y" (Yes) in this data element, you are indicating that the information for the incident is complete, no supplemental transaction formats will be transmitted immediately for this incident, and final crossfield edits can be performed.

By entering "N" (No) in this data element, you are indicating that the information for the incident in not complete and supplemental transaction formats will be transmitted immediately for this incident prior to final crossfield edits being completed.

The incident must indicate complete before record is sent to FBI and statistics are utilized in annual report/releases.

- ► The incident to be entered only contained one offense, one victim, and one offender. Since all information could be entered on the original incident using Incident (MICR1) transaction format, this data element should indicate "Y" (Yes) as the incident information is complete.
- ► The incident to be entered contained one offense, two victims, two offenders, and ten property items. The original incident is required to be entered first. This data element should be "N" (No) on the original and all supplemental transaction formats (except the final record) to indicate more information will be entered for this incident. The final supplemental transaction format will have "Y" (Yes) in this data element to indicate the incident is complete and all cross-field edits can be applied.

Section 4: Incident Reporting

The Offense worksheets in this section make it easy to determine exactly what information is required for any MICR report.

Introduction

The Offense worksheets in this section make it simple to know which information is required for a particular offense.

The Offense worksheets tell you:

- Data Elements that must be entered
- Data Elements not to enter
- Data Elements that are optional
- Data Element Codes that are required in certain circumstances
- Data Element Codes that must not be used in certain circumstances

How to Use the Worksheets




Figure 4-1. Sample MICR1 Report

The Legend at the top of each page tells you how to read the worksheet. Figure 4-1 on the following page shows how to use a sample Offense File Class Worksheet.


Refer to the Quick Reference card included with this handbook, or see **Section 3** for detailed information on entering a Data Element.

The car was recovered two hours later; no damage had been done to the vehicle.

Robbery

The taking or attempting to take anything of value under confrontational circumstances from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

Note: Because some type of assault is an element of the crime of Robbery, an assault should not be reported as a separate offense as long as it was performed in furtherance of the robbery. However, if the injury results in death, a Homicide offense must also be reported.

12000 Robbery

Assault

An unlawful attack by one person upon another.

Note: Careful consideration of the following factors should assist in classifying assaults:

- 1. The type of weapon employed or the use of an object as a weapon;
- 2. The seriousness of the injury;
- The intent and capability of the assailant to cause serious injury.

Usually, the weapon used or the extent of the injury sustained will be the deciding factors in distinguishing aggravated from nonaggravated assaults. In only a limited number of instances should it be necessary to examine the intent and capability of the assailant (UCR Handbook, NIBRS Edition).

An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.

Section 6: Property Record Overview

When to enter a property record, stolen and/or recovered property and drug property information.

When to Enter A Property Record

A Property Record (*Data Elements 52* through 60) is submitted to record the loss and/or recovery of property involved in the following types of offenses:

- Crimes Against Property:
 - Forgery/Counterfeiting
 - Robbery
 - Burglary
 - Larceny
 - Arson
 - Extortion
 - Bribery
 - Fraud
 - Embezzlement
 - Damage to Property
 - Motor Vehicle Theft
 - Stolen Property
- Kidnapping
- Gambling
- Drug/Narcotics Offenses

Not all Property Data Elements are required for every offense. For individual Property Data Element numbers required for a specific offense, refer to the worksheet for that offense in Section 4.

Additional Property Records

Up to 4 property records can be entered using the Incident (MICR1) format. Additional property records may be entered using the Property (MICR9) format (See Section 2).

Offense Attempted

If a Property Offense has been attempted (Data Element 16 = A), there cannot be a known loss of property, as loss of property would imply that the offense was completed. In this case:

- ► Item Number (Data Element 52) = 000 (No items to record)
- Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) =
 0 (None) or 9 (Unknown)

Do **NOT** use any of the other Property Data Elements (54 through 60).*

Example:

- ► In an attempted arson offense, with no property actually burned, Item Number (Data Element 52) = 000 and Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) = 0 (None).
- ▶ In a drug investigation, the offenders destroyed the drugs before the officers were able to seize the drugs. As no property was actually seized, a property record is submitted with "0" (None) as the Property Loss Type (Data Element 53), and the type of drug entered in Suspected Drug Type (Data Element 58). Note that in this case, only 1 drug type can be submitted.

^{*} This edit does not apply to offense 35001 Violation of Controlled Substance Act when Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) = 0 (None). Suspected Drug Type (Data Element 58) must be entered in this case.

Grouping Property Items

Items with the same Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) and Property Class (Data Element 54) may be grouped together for reporting purposes. Property Value (Data Element 55) must then reflect the total value of the grouped items.

Example:

► Two victims had their bicycles stolen at the same time and place; one was worth \$300 and the other \$150. For both items, Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) = 7 (Stolen) and Property Class (Data Element 54) = 04 (Bicycles).

To group the two items, assign both bicycles one Item Number (*Data Element 52*) and enter the total value of the bicycles, "450" (\$300 + \$150 = \$450), in the corresponding Property Value (*Data Element 55*).

Items with the same Property Loss Type and Property Class may be grouped together for reporting purposes.

➤ The following property was stolen as the result of a burglary: (1) a \$10,000 stamp collection; (2) jewelry worth \$5,000; (3) a \$1,800 personal computer; (4) clothes worth \$1,500; (5) silverware worth \$800; (6) a \$650 TV; (7) a \$450 VCR; (8) a \$400 microwave oven; (9) \$350 in cash; (10) a \$25 typewriter; (11) a \$150 shotgun; (12) a \$100 bicycle; (13) two credit cards (no value); and (14) ten blank personal checks (no value).

If property were grouped together by Property Loss Type and Property Class, the last example would be entered as follows:

"5800" for the jewelry and silverware (code 17), "1800" for the personal computer (code 07), "1500" for the clothes (code 06), "1100" for the TV and VCR (code 26), "400" for the microwave oven (code 16), "350" for the cash (code 20), "25" for the typewriter (code 23), "150" for the shotgun (code 13), "100" for the bicycle (code 04), "10000" for the stamp collection (code 88), "0" for the two credit cards (code 09), and "0" for the ten blank checks (code 22).

Stolen and/or Recovered Property

Property cannot be coded as recovered if it has not first been entered into the system as stolen. If Property Loss Type (*Data Element 53*) = 5 (Recovered) is used, the item must have been first reported using Property Loss Type (*Data Element 53*) = 7 (Stolen).

This edit does not apply to the following Offense File Classes, as the nature of the offense already infers stolen property:

- ► 24002 Motor Vehicle as Stolen Property
- ► 25000 Forgery/Counterfeiting
- ► 28000 Stolen Property

Item Number (*Data Element 52*) and Property Class (*Data Element 54*) must match for stolen and recovered records. Exception: If a motor vehicle was reported stolen and parts of the vehicle are recovered, the recovered record can indicate Property Class (*Data Element 54*) = 38 (Vehicle Parts/Accessories).

Property cannot be coded as recovered if it has not first been entered into the system as stolen.

Stolen and Recovered Property

If, at the time the original incident is entered, all property stolen is recovered, and the value of the recovered property is the same as prior to being stolen, enter Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) = 1 (Stolen and Recovered). This eliminates entering two separate records, one for stolen and one for recovered property.

Example:

➤ Two teenagers stole a neighbor's car for joyriding. The car was recovered in a parking lot two hours after the reported theft. No damage had been done to the vehicle. When the original incident is entered, only one property record is needed indicating "1" (Stolen and Recovered) in Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) as the property was stolen and recovered and the recovered property value did not decrease from prior to being stolen.

If the vehicle was damaged, then two property records need to be entered. In the first record, enter Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) = "7" (Stolen) and enter the value of the vehicle in Property Value (Data Element 55). In the second record, enter Property Loss Type = "5" (Recovered) and the enter the value of the damaged vehicle in Property Value.

Stolen and/or Recovered Vehicles

If a number of vehicles are involved in an incident, enter Number of Stolen/Recovered Vehicles (*Data Element 57*) to reflect the number of vehicles reported per Item Number (*Data Element 52*). If vehicle information is entered by single item and not grouped together, the value in this data element will always be "1".

Example:

▶ Five automobiles were stolen from a car dealer on October 31, 1993. To report the vehicles singly by item number, enter "01" in Stolen/Recovered Vehicles (Data Element 57) and "7" (Stolen) in Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) once for each vehicle. Three of these vehicles were recovered on November 1, 1993. "01" would be entered for Stolen/Recovered Vehicles (Data Element 57) and "5" (Recovered) in Property Loss Type (Data Element 53).

If the automobiles are grouped together, to report stolen, "05" would be entered for Stolen/Recovered Vehicles (*Data Element 57*) and "7" (Stolen) in Property Loss Type (*Data Element 53*). The recovery would be reported as "03" in Stolen/Recovered Vehicles (*Data Element 57*) and "5" (Recovered) in Property Loss Type (*Data Element 53*).

Property Recovered After the Original Incident has been Filed

Property originally reported stolen, then recovered after the original incident has been filed, requires an update to the original record.

More than One Recovery Date

If property is grouped together by Property Loss Type (*Data Element 53*) and Property Class (*Data Element 54*) and there is more than one date of recovery for the same Property Class, enter the earliest date.

Example:

On October 10, 1993, 2 bicycles were stolen from a public school parking lot. The first bicycle was recovered on October 15, 1993. The other bicycle was recovered on October 31, 1993. The date entered for Date Recovered (*Data Element 56*) for Property Class "04" (Bicycles) should be "101593" since that is the earliest date of recovery for this property class.

Determining Property Value

The following procedures are suggested to determine valuation of stolen property:

- ► Use fair market value for articles which are subject to depreciation because of wear and tear, age, or other factors which cause the value to decrease with use.
- Use cost to the merchant (wholesale cost) of goods stolen from retail establishments, warehouses, etc. In other words, use the dollar value representing the actual cash loss to the victim without any markup or profit added.
- Use victim's evaluation of items such as jewelry, watches, and other similar goods which decrease in value slightly or not at all with use or age.
- Use replacement cost or actual cash cost to victim for new or almost new clothes, auto accessories, bicycles, etc.
- When the victim obviously exaggerates the value of stolen property for insurance or other purposes, common sense and good judgement will dictate a fair market value to be placed on the stolen items by law enforcement.

Black's Law Dictionary defines fair market value as the price in cash, or its equivalent, for which the property can be sold on the market.

When an Inventory is Required

If the Property Class (*Data Element 54*) is unknown until an inventory can be performed, enter code "77" (Pending Inventory). Enter Property Value (*Data Element 55*) = "\$1.00" (Unknown).

An updated Property record with appropriate loss values should be submitted when the results of the inventory are subsequently learned.

Example:

A house was destroyed by arson while the homeowners were away on an overseas trip, making it impossible to determine the property loss until they return. Property Class (Data Element 54) = "77" (Pending Inventory) and Property Value (Data Element 55) = "\$1.00" (Unknown) were entered into the original report.

When the owners returned and completed an inventory of the burned/damaged property, the report was updated to reflect the new information.

Drug Property

When to Enter Drug Property Information

If drugs or narcotics are seized in a drug case, no value is to be entered into Property Value (Data Element 55). Use Suspected Drug Type, Estimated Drug Quantity, and Drug Type Measurement (Data Elements 58 through 60) ONLY if all three of the following conditions are met:

- ► One of the offenses in the incident is 35001 Violation of Control Substance Act
- ► Property Loss Type (Data Element 53) = 6 (Seized) or 0 (None)
- ► Property Class (Data Element 54) = 10 (Drugs/Narcotics)

These Data Elements are **NOT** used when drugs or narcotics were stolen, burned, or otherwise destroyed in connection with other offenses, such as Arson, Burglary, or Larceny.

Drug property should be grouped together as much as possible by Suspected Drug Type and Type Drug Measurement.

Grouping Drug Property Information

Drug property should be grouped together as much as possible by Suspected Drug Type (*Data Element 58*) and Type Drug Measurement (*Data Element 60*).

Note: The state program will accept more than 3 drug property items. However, only three drug records will be forwarded to the FBI grouped by Suspected Drug Type and Type Drug Measurement. If more than 3 records are a result of this grouping, the 3rd FBI record will be coded Suspected Drug Type (Data Element 58) = "77" (Over 3 Drug Types).

Agencies have the option of grouping their drug information in this way prior to submitting the data to the state program. Agencies opting to group the drug information should enter the two most important drugs first (taking into account the quantity, value, and deadliness of the drugs/narcotics) and combining any remaining drugs (if any) as Suspected Drug Type (*Data Element 58*) = "77" (Over 3 Drug Types).

When Drug Measurements Are Not Available

Code "XX" (Not Reported) is an interim code which can be entered for Type Drug Measurement (*Data Element 60*) until agencies receive quantity and measurement from a forensic laboratory. This code must be replaced later with a specific measurement code.

When this code is used, Estimated Drug Quantity (Data Element 59) must be "1" (None).

Example:

In a drug case, a large quantity of crack, cocaine, and marijuana was seized. The officer being unsure of the quantity of each drug entered "XX" (Not Reported) in this field and waited until the reports were received from the forensic laboratory. At that time, the officer submitted a report to delete the NOT REPORTED item and enter the correct information.

Property Class Descriptions

The following table provides examples for valid Property Class codes (*Data Element 54*) described in **Section 3** of this handbook.

^{*} Intangible is anything which cannot be perceived by the sense of touch. It can be a benefit, e.g., a right or privilege, a promotion, enhanced reputation, etc.; or a detriment, e.g., a loss of reputation, injured feelings, etc.

Section 7: Exceptional Clearance

This section covers information on when and how to enter Exceptional Clearance.

When to Enter Exceptional Clearance

Exceptional Clearance (*Data Elements 11 and 12*) clears an offense for reasons other than an arrest. Exceptional Clearance may be used with any offense **EXCEPT** Offense File Class 0900-4 Justifiable Homicide.

The following four conditions must be met to exceptionally clear an offense:

- ► The investigation must have clearly and definitely established the identity of at least one offender
- Sufficient probable cause must have been developed to support the arrest, charging, and prosecution of the offender
- The exact location of the offender must be known so that an arrest could be made
- There must be a reason outside the control of law enforcement which prevents the arrest

Note: Instances may occur when an offender already in custody or serving a sentence confesses to an uncleared crime. This situation is actually a variation of true clearance by arrest and should not be exceptionally cleared. Arrest data should be reported on the offender who, although not "apprehended", will in most instances be prosecuted on the new charge.

Exceptional Clearance may NOT be used with Offense File Class 0900-4 Justifiable Homicide

How to Enter Exceptional Clearance

To exceptionally clear an incident, complete Exceptional Clearance Date (Data Element 12), and enter one of the following 2 digit codes in Exceptional Clearance (Data Element 11):

Exceptional Clearance Codes:

- 10 = Death of offender
- 11 = Prosecution declined (by the prosecutor for other than lack of probable cause)
- 12 = Extradition denied
- 13 = Victim refused to cooperate (in the prosecution)
- 14 = Juvenile/no custody (the handling of a juvenile without taking him/her into custody, but rather by oral or written notice given to the parents or legal guardian in a case involving a minor offense)

Exceptional Clearance (Data Element 11)
must always be entered with
Exceptional Clearance Date
(Data Element 12)

Edits:

- ► Must complete Exceptional Clearance Date (*Data Element 12*).
- ▶ Do not use Data Elements 39 through 51 (an arrest record cannot be entered).
- ► Offender Number (Data Element 22) cannot be "00"; Use Data Elements 23, 24, 25 (Offender Age, Race, and Sex).

Examples:

- ▶ During a bank robbery the offender is fatally shot by police officers. Enter "10" (Death of Offender) for Exceptional Clearance (Data Element 11), and complete Exceptional Clearance Date (Data Element 12).
- An incident involved two offenders one of whom could not be extradited
 and the second was still at large. An
 incident record was sent to the state
 program with Exceptional Clearance
 (Data Element 11) = "12" (Extradition
 Denied). The second offender is arrested
 six months later. Since an arrest is
 superior to an exceptional clearance and
 an arrest cannot be submitted with an
 exceptional clearance, the Exceptional
 Clearance and Exceptional Clearance
 Date must be modified and the arrest
 information added to the incident.
- An arrested person confesses to multiple incidents but the prosecutor refuses to prosecute on all incidents. The arrest should be reported for all incidents and not cleared as an exceptional clearance. [One incident will have an arrest record with "C" (Count Arrest) and the other incidents will have arrest records with "M" (Multiple) for Multiple Arrest Indicator (Data Element 49).]

Multiple Offense Incidents

In a multiple offense incident, an exceptional clearance of one offense clears all offenses in the incident. An arrest record may not be entered for any incident that is exceptionally cleared without first modifying the incident to remove exceptional clearance. An incident cannot be both exceptionally cleared and cleared by an arrest.

Section 8:

Hate/Bias Motivation Guidelines

Guidelines and considerations for determining whether hate and/or bias was the motivation to commit an offense.

When to Report Hate/Bias Motivation

The object of the collection of Hate/Bias Crime statistics is to indicate whether the offender was motivated to commit the offense because of his/her bias against a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group. Use the graphic worksheets in Section 4 to determine whether Suspected Bias Motivation (Data Element 18) is required for a specific offense.

Because of the difficulty of ascertaining the offender's subjective motivation, Suspected Bias Motivation (*Data Element 18*) is to be reported **ONLY IF** the investigation reveals sufficient objective facts to lead a reasonable and prudent person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias. The specific types of bias to be reported are:

Racial Bias:

- ► Anti-White
- ► Anti-Black
- ▶ Anti-American Indian/Alaskan Native
- ► Anti-Asian/Pacific Islander
- Anti-Multi-Racial Group

Religious Bias:

- Anti-Jewish
- ► Anti-Catholic
- ► Anti-Protestant
- ► Anti-Islamic (Moslem)
- Anti-Other Religion (Buddhism, Hinduism, Shintoism, etc.)
- ► Anti-Multi-Religious Group
- Anti-Atheist/Agnostic

Ethnicity/National Origin Bias:

- ▶ Anti-Arab
- Anti-Hispanic
- Anti-Other Ethnicity/National Origin

Sexual Orientation Bias:

- Anti-Male Homosexual (Gay)
- Anti-Female Homosexual (Lesbian)
- Anti-Homosexual (Gays and Lesbians)
- Anti-Heterosexual
- Anti-Bisexual

Gender Bias:

- Anti-Female
- ► Anti-Male

Other Bias

Any not listed above

None or Unknown Bias

Incidents which do not involve any facts indicating biased motivation by the offender are to be coded as Suspected Bias Motivation (*Data Element 18*) = "00" (None), while incidents involving ambiguous facts (i.e., where some facts are present but are not conclusive) are to be coded "99" (Unknown).

Objective Evidence of Bias Motivation

An important distinction must be made. The mere fact that the offender is biased against the victim's racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, and/or sexual orientation group does not mean that a hate crime was involved. Rather, the offender's **criminal act** must have been motivated, in whole or in part, by his/her bias.

Because motivation is subjective, it is difficult to know with certainty whether a crime was the result of the offender's bias. Therefore, before an incident can be reported as a hate crime, sufficient objective facts must be present to lead a reasonable and prudent person to conclude that the offender's actions were motivated, in whole or in part, by bias.

The offender's criminal act must have been motivated, in whole or in part, by his/her bias.

Circumstances Supporting Hate/Bias

While no single fact may be conclusive, facts such as the following, particularly when combined, are supportive of a finding of bias:

- The offender and the victim were of different racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation or gender groups. For example, the victim was black and the offenders were white.
- Bias related oral comments, written statements, or gestures were made by the offender which indicate his/her bias. For example, the offender shouted a racial epithet at the victim.
- Bias related drawings, markings, symbols, or graffiti were left at the crime scene. For example, a swastika was painted on the door of a synagogue.
- Certain objects, items, or things which indicate bias were used, (e.g., the offenders wore white sheets with hoods covering their faces) or left behind by the offender(s) (e.g., a burning cross was left in front of the victim's residence).
- The victim is a member of a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group which is overwhelmingly outnumbered by members of another group in the neighborhood where the victim lives and the incident took place. This factor loses significance with the passage of time, i.e., it is most significant when the victim first moved into the neighborhood and becomes less and less significant as time passes without incident.

Circumstances Supporting Hate/Bias, Continued

- The victim was visiting a neighborhood where previous hate crimes had been committed against other members of his/her racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group and where tensions remain high against his/her group.
- Several incidents have occurred in the same locality, at or about the same time, and the victims are all of the same racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group.
- A substantial portion of the community where the crime occurred perceives that the incident was motivated by bias.
- The victim was engaged in activities promoting his/her racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group. For example, the victim is a member of the NAACP, participated in gay rights demonstrations, etc.

- The incident coincided with a holiday relating to, or a date of particular significance to, a racial, religious, or ethnic/national origin group (e.g., Martin Luther King Day, Rosh Hashanah, etc.).
- The offender was previously involved in a similar hate crime or is a member of a hate group.
- There were indications that a hate group was involved. For example, a hate group claimed responsibility for the crime or was active in the neighborhood.
- A historically established animosity exists between the victim's group and the offender's group.
- The victim, although not a member of the targeted racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group, is a member of an advocacy group supporting the precepts of the victim group.

Additional Considerations

Along with the above circumstances supporting Hate/Bias Motivation for an offense, the following factors must also be considered:

1. Need for Case-by-Case Assessment of the Facts

The aforementioned factors are not all-inclusive of the types of objective facts which evidence biased motivation. Therefore, reporting agencies must examine each case for facts which clearly evidence that the offender's bias motivated him/her to commit the crime.

2. Misleading Facts

Agencies must be alert to misleading facts. For example, the offender used an epithet to refer to the victim's race, but the offender and victim were of the same race.

3. Feigned Facts

Agencies must be alert to evidence left by the offenders which is meant to give the false impression that the incident was motivated by bias. For example, students of a religious school vandalize their own school, leaving anti-religious statements and symbols on its walls, in the hope that they will be excused from attending class.

4. Offender's Mistaken Perception

Even if the offender was mistaken in his/her belief that the victim was a member of a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender group; the offense is still a hate crime as long as the offender was motivated by bias against that group. For example, a middle-aged, non-gay man walking by a bar frequented by gays was attacked by six teenagers who mistakenly believed the victim had left the bar and was gay. Although the offenders were wrong of both counts, the offense is a hate crime because it was motivated by the offenders' anti-gay bias.

5. Changes in Findings of Bias

If, after an original incident report was submitted, a contrary finding regarding bias occurs, the state program must be updated with the new finding. For example, if an initial finding of no bias was later changed to racial bias or a finding of racial bias was later changed to religious bias, the change should be reported to the UCR state program.

Hate/Bias Motivation Examples

The following examples highlight some of the considerations in determining whether an offense was motivated by hate or bias:

- While driving through a predominantly Mexican-American neighborhood, a black male stopped his car to repair a flat tire. A group of Mexican-Americans leaving a bar across the street accosted the driver and then attacked him with bottles and clubs. During the attack, the offenders called the victim by a well known and recognized epithet used against blacks and told him that blacks were not welcome in the neighborhood. Enter code "12" (Anti-Black) because the victim and offenders are of different races, the offenders used a racial epithet, and the facts reveal no other reason for the attack than the stated one, i.e., to keep blacks out of the neighborhood.
- A small neighborhood bar frequented by gays burned down after being closed for the night. Investigation revealed that the fire was deliberately set, but there were no witnesses or suspects. Although the fire was deliberately set, the fact that the bar was frequented by gays may have been coincidental. Therefore, "99" (Unknown) should be entered. Two weeks later, three white adult males were arrested on a tip from an informant. They admitted burning down the bar, saying they did it to keep gays out of the neighborhood. The previously submitted incident report should be updated with "41" (Anti-Gay).

- Overnight, unknown subjects broke into a synagogue and destroyed several religious objects. The perpetrators left a large swastika drawn on the door and wrote "Death to Jews" on a wall. Although valuable items were present, none were stolen. Enter "21" (Anti-Jewish) because the offenders destroyed religious objects, left anti-Semitic words and graffiti behind, and theft did not appear to be the motive for the burglary.
- An adult white male was approached by four white teenagers who requested money for the bus. When he refused, one of the youths said to the others, "Let's teach this [epithet for a gay person] a lesson". The victim was punched in the face, knocked to the ground, kicked several times, and robbed of his wristwatch, ring, and wallet. When he reported the crime, the victim advised he did not know the offenders and that he was not gay. The facts are ambiguous. Although an epithet for a gay person was used by one of the offenders, the victim was not gay. Such epithets are sometimes used as general insults regardless of the target person's sexual orientation, and in this case the offenders' motivation appeared to be limited to obtaining money from the victim. Therefore, "99" (Unknown) should be entered.

Hate/Bias Definitions

To ensure uniformity in reporting nationwide, the following definitions have been adopted for us in hate crime reporting:

Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their race, religion, ethnicity/national origin, sexual orientation, or gender.

Bias Crime - A criminal offense committed against a person or property which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, ethnic/national origin group, sexual orientation, or gender group. Also known as "Hate Crime".

Bisexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, both males and females; [noun] a bisexual person.

Ethnicity/National Origin Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same race or national origin who share common or similar traits, languages, customs, and traditions, (Arabs, Hispanics, etc.).

Gay - [adjective] Of or relating to males who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other males; [noun] a homosexual male.

Gender Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same biological category.

Hate Crime - See Bias Crime.

Hate Group - An organization whose primary purpose is to promote animosity, hostility, and malice against persons belonging to a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group which suffers from that of the members of the organization (e.g., the Ku Klux Klan, American Nazi Party, etc.).

Heterosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of the opposite sex; [noun] a heterosexual person.

Homosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex; [noun] a homosexual person.

Lesbian - [adjective] Of or relating to females who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other females; [noun] a homosexual female.

Racial Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of person who possess common physical characteristics (e.g., color of skin, eyes and/or hair, facial features, etc.) genetically transmitted by descent and heredity which distinguish them as a distinct division of humankind (e.g. Asians, blacks, whites, etc.).

Religious Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who share the same religious beliefs regarding the origin and purpose of the universe and the existence or nonexistence of a supreme being (e.g., Catholics, Jews, Protestants, atheists, etc.).

Sexual Orientation Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex or members of the opposite sex (e.g., gays, lesbians, heterosexuals, etc.).

Section 9: Age/Relationship Edits

Edits based on age or interpersonal relationships that may pertain to any incident.

Introduction

The circumstances surrounding an incident may require a number of edits regarding the age and/or relationship between the person(s) involved.

Victim to Offender Relationship

Victim to Offender Relationship (Data Element 38) is used with Offender Related Number (Data Element 37) to report the relationships of the victim to the offender(s) who have perpetrated a "crime against person" or a robbery against a person victim. (See the graphic worksheets in Section 4 for Data Elements required for a specific offense.)

The following edits apply to victim/offender relationships:

Spouse, Boyfriend/Girlfriend

If Victim to Offender Relationship (*Data Element 38*) = either:

- ► "01" (Victim was Spouse)
- ▶ "02" (Victim was Common-law Spouse)
- "24" (Victim was Boyfriend/girlfriend)
- ▶ "27" (Victim was Ex-spouse)

Victim Sex (Data Element 31) and Offender Sex (Data Element 25) must be opposite.

Homosexual Relationship

If Victim to Offender Relationship (*Data Element 38*) = "26" (Homosexual Relationship):

 Victim Sex (Data Element 31) and Offender Sex (Data Element 25) must be the same.

Parent/Grandparent

If Victim to Offender Relationship (Data Element 38) = either:

- ► "03" (Victim was Parent)
- "06" (Victim was Grandparent)

Victim Age (Data Element 29) must be greater than Offender Age (Data Element 23).

Child, Grandchild, Babysittee

If Victim to Offender Relationship (*Data Element 38*) = either:

- ▶ "05" (Victim was Child)
- ▶ "07" (Victim was Grandchild)
- ▶ "23" (Victim was Babysittee)

Victim Age (Data Element 29) must be less than Offender Age (Data Element 23).

Spouse/Ex-Spouse

- Only one Victim to Offender Relationship code of "01" (Victim Was Spouse) is valid per victim.
- Age of spouses or ex-spouses cannot be less than 10 years old.

Arrest Age

For all offenses, if Arrest Age (*Data Element 41*) = less than 18, enter Disposition of Arrest Under 18 (*Data Element 50*).

Section 10:

Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA)

Submitting LEOKA Information

At the time of this printing, Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA) information will continue to be submitted on the paper form (RI-126). This is the same form that was used prior to MICR.¹

When an officer is killed or assaulted, the information must be reported on an incident report and also on the monthly LEOKA report. To determine if the assault should be reported as an additional offense to the original incident or a separate incident, the agency utilizes the "Concept of Time and Place".

When an officer is killed or assaulted, the information must be reported on an incident report and also on the monthly LEOKA report.

Concept of Time and Place is defined as follows:

"If more than one crime was committed by the same person or group of persons and the time and space intervals separating them were insignificant, then all of the crimes make up a single incident".

Therefore, if the original offense/arrest and assault offense occurred during an unbroken time duration and at the same or adjoining locations(s), the reporting agency should report these offenses as a single incident.

The FBI is planning to enhance the collection of LEOKA data so a change in the data submitted is probable in the future. Your agency will be notified directly of any future changes.

Section 11: Multiple Offenses/Incidents/Arrests

Guidelines for reporting more than one offense, incident, and/or arrest.

Multiple Offenses vs. Multiple Incidents

The following guidelines are used to determine whether to report multiple incidents or a single incident comprised of multiple offenses.

Defining an Incident

A single incident is defined as one or more offenses committed by the same offender, or a group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time and place.

Acting in Concert requires the offenders actually commit or assist in the commission of the crime(s). The offenders must be aware of, and consent to, the commission of the crime(s); or, even if nonconsenting, their actions assist in the commission of the offense(s). This is important because all of the offenders in an incident are considered to have committed all of the offenses in the incident. If one or more of the offenders did not act in concert, then there is more than one incident involved.

Concept of Time and Place is defined as follows: If more than one crime was committed by the same person or group of persons and the time and space intervals separating them were insignificant, then all of the crimes make up a single incident.

Therefore, a group of crimes may be reported as one incident if:

- A number of offenses/arrests occur during an unbroken time duration
- ► The offenses/arrests occurred at the same or adjoining location(s)
- The offenses/arrests involve only one offender OR a number of offenders acting in concert

A single incident is defined as one or more offenses committed by the same offender, or a group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time and place.

Examples of Multiple Offenses/Incidents:

- ▶ If an incident involved robbery and motor vehicle theft, two offense records would be submitted; one with Offense File Class 12000 and the other with Offense File Class 24001.
- ► If two people were victims of aggravated assault, only one offense record would be submitted with Offense File Class 13002, and two victim records would be submitted.
- ► If an incident involved a motor vehicle theft and the vehicle contained property which also should be reported stolen (such as tools, camera equipment, golf clubs, etc.), one offense record would be submitted with Offense File Class 24001.
- ► If an incident involved the theft of a tractor trailer containing a shipment of televisions which was the real object of the theft, it will be up to the reporting agency whether to report two offenses, i.e., Motor Vehicle Theft (truck) and Larceny Theft (televisions).
- During a robbery the offender was killed by a police officer. Two incidents would be submitted. One would be the Robbery (12000) with the criminal as the offender and the person or place being robbed as the victim. The other incident would be a Justifiable Homicide (09004) with the criminal as the victim and the police officer as the offender.

- For Six people were involved in a bar room fight. Technically, this case involves multiple incidents because, although the offenders assaulted each other, it cannot be said that they were "acting in concert", especially in the assault on themselves. Therefore, cases in which the participants are both victims and offenders can be reported two ways. As multiple incidents or as a single incident with multiple victims and offenders using the Victim to Offender Relationship code of "31" (Victim was Offender). The reporting agency is to determine how these types of cases are reported to the state program.
- ➤ The investigating agency arrested a person for conspiracy to murder before the arrestee was able to enact his plan. Since no murder or assault had occurred, the incident would be reported with the Offense File Class of 77000 Conspiracy.
- An investigation of a bank robbery determined that a bank teller had provided information to the offenders who had performed the bank robbery. The bank teller was charged with conspiracy. Because the robbery did occur, the Offense File Class would be reported as 12000 Robbery. A conspiracy offense cannot be reported with another offense in an incident, however, the conspiracy arrest charge (7771) could be reported for the bank teller.

Hotel Rule

The Hotel Rule may apply to either offense 22001 Burglary - Forced Entry OR 22002 Burglary - Entry Without Force.

The Hotel Rule states: If a number of dwelling units under a single manager are burglarized and the offenses are most likely to be reported to the police by the manager rather than the individual tenants, the burglary should be *scored* as one offense. The "Hotel Rule" includes rental storage facilities, i.e., "Mini-Storage" and "Self-Storage" buildings.

Enter one offense including the number of structures (premises) entered (*Data Element 21*) whenever the Hotel Rule applies.

Example:

A "Self-Storage" building was burglarized and 11 rented storage compartments were forcibly entered. One incident report should be filed, including the number Premises Entered (Data Element 21) = "11".

Due to circumstances involved in this offense, the justifiable homicide (Offense File Class 09004) and the offense which gave rise to it are reported as separate incidents.

Justifiable Homicide

Due to circumstances involved in this offense, the justifiable homicide (Offense File Class 09004) and the offense which gave rise to it are reported as separate incidents.

For the justifiable homicide, code the police officer or civilian who killed the criminal as the "offender" and the criminal who was killed as the "victim". These instructions are based on the definition of an "incident" which requires that all of the offenders "act in concert".

If the "justified" killer committed another offense in connection with the justifiable homicide (e.g., illegal possession of the gun he/she used), that offense would constitute a third incident (the second incident being the offense committed by the criminal who was killed).

When Victims are Offenders

There are cases such as bar fights which the participants are both victims and offenders. Technically, these types of cases involve multiple incidents because, although the offenders assaulted each other, it cannot be said that they were "acting in concert", especially in the assault on themselves.

To alleviate any burden on police officers to report multiple incidents, Victim to Offender Relationship (*Data Element 38*) includes code "31" (Victim was Offender) to provide a means for reporting these cases as a single incident. However, the agency must decide in each case whether to report these types of cases as a single incident with multiple victims and offenders or as multiple incidents.

Entering Multiple Offenses for a Single Incident

Up to 4 offenses (Data Element 14) may be entered using the MICR1 format. Enter the most severe offense (as determined by the reporting agency) first, using the worksheet in Section 4 to determine the Data Elements required for that offense.

Enter the next offense in the same manner; use the worksheet for the second offense to determine any necessary Data Elements required along with those already entered.

Exceptional Clearance

In a multiple offense incident, an exceptional clearance of one offense clears all offenses in the incident. An arrest record may not be entered for any incident that is exceptionally cleared without first modifying the incident to remove exceptional clearance. An incident cannot be both exceptionally cleared and cleared by an arrest.

Multiple Arrest Indicator: One Offender, Multiple Incidents

In order to provide accurate arrest and clearance rates, use Multiple Arrest Indicator (*Data Element 49*) to indicate whether the arrest of one offender clears more than one incident.

If a person is apprehended for more than one incident, an arrest record must be filed/updated for each incident the person was arrested for. Enter Multiple Arrest Indicator (*Data Element 49*) = "C" (Count Arrest) for only one incident. Enter "M" (Multiple) for any remaining incidents cleared by this arrest.

This informs the system to count each of the affected incidents as cleared, but add only one "count" to the total number of arrests.

In order to provide accurate arrest and clearance rates, use Multiple Arrest Indicator (Data Element 49) to indicate whether the arrest of one offender clears more than one incident.

Examples, Multiple Arrest Indicator:

- ► After the subject's apprehension for robbery, it was learned that the subject was also responsible for five additional robberies within the jurisdiction. One arrest record was keyed into the local computer for each of the six incidents. Five of the arrest records had "M" (Multiple) and one had "C" (Count Arrest) entered for Multiple Arrest Indicator (Data Element 49).
- ► Two suspects were arrested for burglary. During processing, Arrest #1 admitted to burglarizing two other residences which were reported to this reporting agency. The reporting agency then cleared those two burglaries based on the suspect's confession. However, Arrest #2 denies involvement in any additional burglaries. The arrest record for Arrest #1 would have a "C" (Count Arrest) for the current incident and a "M" (Multiple) for Multiple Arrest Indicator (Data Element 49) in the arrest records of the two other incidents which were cleared. The arrest record for Arrest #2 would have an "N" (Not Applicable) in this data element as this subject's arrest did not clear any additional incidents.
- ▶ A suspect was arrested for a motor vehicle theft which occurred on October 14, 1993. This person was also responsible for two motor vehicle theft incidents which occurred in 1992. An arrest record would be submitted for the current 1993 incident indicating Multiple Arrest Indicator (Data Element 49) = "C" (Count Arrest) to count the arrest. Arrest records would be submitted for both 1992 incidents with "M" (Multiple) in this data element to indicate the person arrested was counted in another incident.

Clearance Indicator: Multiple Offenders, One Incident

Clearance Indicator (*Data Element 51*) pertains to multiple persons being arrested per incident. It is used to indicate whether or not the arrest record produces a clearance for incidents not maintained on the MICR data base.

The question which must be answered is: Has an arrest been previously reported to the state UCR program for this incident? If the answer to this question is yes, then this data element will be "N" (Incident Already Cleared by Previous Arrest). If the answer to this question is no, then this data element will be "Y" (Arrest Clears the Incident).

The Clearance Indicator is used to indicate whether or not the arrest record produces a clearance for incidents not maintained on the MICR data base.

Examples, Clearance Indicator:

- A suspect was arrested for an incident that occurred on October 31, 1991, and the arrest was reported on the original incident report. On February 4, 1993, a second suspect was arrested for the same incident. When entering the arrest record, Clearance Indicator (Data Element 51) = "N" as the incident was already cleared by a previous arrest.
- A rape incident was reported on June 5, 1991, with no arrests being reported. On April 1, 1993, a person was arrested for the incident. When entering the arrest record, "Y" would be entered in this data element as the no previous arrest was reported and this arrest clears the incident.
- ► A burglary incident was reported on December 7, 1991, with no arrests being reported. On October 31, 1994, two persons were arrested for the incident. When entering the arrest records, "Y" would be entered in this data element for one of the arrests and "N" would be entered in this data element for the other arrest.

Section 12: Updates

This section provides instructions for maintaining accurate records of changing information.

Introduction

When the circumstances of an original incident change, it is necessary to update the MICR report for that incident to represent current incident information. Some common updates include:

- Arrest
- Clearance
- Recovered property
- Property information gathered after inventory, evaluation or lab work

Whether you are entering information on a paper form or directly into the MICR data base, it is important that proper update information be recorded and submitted to MICR.

MICR Actions (Data Element 1)

The following actions can be used to update a MICR incident report:

Add Supplemental Records - Action "A"

Action "A" is used to add supplemental offenders, victims, arrests, and property using the MICR3 through MICR9 formats:

- ► Offenders (MICR3) Up to 20
- ► Victims (MICR5) Up to 5
- ► Arrests (MICR7) Up to 7
- Property (MICR9) Up to 10

An original incident must be present on the data base.

Following are the administrative data elements required for each type of format. Other data elements are required depending on the supplemental information being added.

- 03 Original Year
- 04 Incident Number
- 61 Incident Complete Indicator

Delete Information - Action "D"

Action "D" is used to delete information from the data base. The entire original incident (MICR1) or individual incident records may be deleted. The information must be present on the data base prior to deletion or an error will occur.

Incident (MICR1)

To delete the administrative, offense, offender, victim, arrest, and property records connected to the incident, use Action "D" with the Incident (MICR1) format.

When using Action "D" with the Incident (MICR1) format ALL data for the incident will be deleted.

If the incident is being deleted for resubmission, make certain that all incident information is available for re-entry before deleting the original record from the data base.

Use the following Administrative Data Elements to delete an incident record:

Inquiry the Data Base - Action "I"

Action "I" is used to inquire specific incident data from the data base. This action code is available to LEIN terminal agencies or agencies who have access to a LEIN terminal only (See Section 14: LEIN).

Modify Exceptional Clearance - Action "M"

Action "M" (Modify) is used with the MICR1 format to modify Exceptional Clearance information on the data base.

Following are the mandatory data elements required to modify the Exceptional Clearance and Exceptional Clearance Date:

All other information cannot be modified. To change data in the administrative (excluding exceptional clearance and exceptional clearance date) and offense records, the ENTIRE incident must be deleted and re-entered.

If an incident was originally entered as exceptionally cleared but later needs to be changed so that an arrest can be added, the incident may be modified to leave Exceptional Clearance and Exceptional Clearance Date (Data Elements 11 and 12) blank.

Individual offender, victim, arrest, or property records can be changed by first deleting that individual record and re-entering only that individual record with the correct information using the supplemental MICR3 through MICR9 formats.

Enter an Original Incident - Action "O"

Action "O" (Original) is used with the MICR1 format to submit an original incident report. For individual Data Elements required to enter an original record for a specific offense, see Section 4: Incident Reporting.

Replacing Incident Information - Action "R"

Action "R" is used to replace original incident data on the data base using the Incident (MICR1) format. This action will delete ALL data for the incident and replace it with the new information entered in the MICR1 format. Therefore, all edits apply as if entering an original incident (Action "O").

If more than one victim, one offender, one arrest and/or four property items need to be replaced, they must be added after the original incident is replaced.

Window Update Incident Information - Action "W"

Action "W" is used to update the exceptional clearance, arrests, or recovered property for incidents with an original date of report prior to the base date or agency start date — incident reports that are not currently in the MICR Data base. (The Base Date is defined as January 1 of the first year of the two years of data retained on the state on-line MICR data base. The Start Date is defined as the date the agency begins submitting MICR data.)

Administrative and offense information must be entered using the Incident (MICR1) format prior to submitting Arrest (MICR7) or Property (MICR9) information.

All three types of updates (exceptional clearance, arrests, or recovered property) must include administrative information and the offense file class(es). An Incident (MICR1) format must be submitted with data elements:

An Incident (MICR1) format must be on the data base prior to submission of a supplemental Arrest (MICR7) format.

If only one arrest is being added to the incident, submit the administrative, offense, and arrest on the Incident (MICR1) format. If multiple arrests are being added to the incident, first submit the administrative, offense, and one arrest record on the Incident (MICR1) format. The remaining arrests can be submitted on the supplemental Arrest (MICR7) format.

To Window Update Recovered Property

These data elements must be completed if property is recovered which was originally reported stolen by your agency:

An Incident (MICR1) format must be on the data base prior to submission of a supplemental Property (MICR9) format.

If four or less different property records are being updated to recovered, submit the administrative, offense, and property information on the Incident (MICR1) format. If more than four different property records are being updated, first submit the administrative, offense, and four property records on the Incident (MICR1) format and the remaining property records on the supplemental Property (MICR9) format.

Section 13: Glossary

This Section contains definitions of terms used in this handbook.

A

Acting in Concert - The offenders must actually commit or assist in the commission of the crime(s). All of the offenders must be aware of and consent to the commission of the crime(s); or, even if nonconsenting, their actions assist in the commission of the offense(s).

Automatic Weapon - Any firearm which shoots, or is designed to shoot, more than one shot at a time by a single pull of the trigger without manual reloading.

B

Base Date - January 1 of the first year of the two years of data retained on the on-line MICR data base.

Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their race, religion, ethnicity/national origin, or sexual orientation.

Bias Crime - A criminal offense committed against a person or property which is motivated, in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, ethnic/national origin group, or sexual orientation group. Also known as "Hate Crime".

Bisexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, both males and females; [noun] a bisexual person.

C

Clearance - An arrest has been made or the incident has been cleared by exceptional means. The clearance of one offense in multiple offense incidents will clear the entire incident.

Concept of Time and Place - If more than one crime was committed by the same person or group of persons and the time and space intervals separating them were insignificant, all of the crimes make up a single incident.

Conditional Mandatory Data Element - Data elements which apply only to specific types of offenses, situations, or circumstances.

Continuing Criminal Activity - Incidents comprised of offenses committed by the same offender(s) at different times and places, as long as the activity is deemed to constitute a single criminal transaction.

D

Data Element - A unique piece of information that can be entered into the MICR report. Data Elements are grouped by like information within the 6 MICR Record Types.

Date Range - Measured from the current date back to January 1st of the previous year. For example, if today's date is August 13, 1994, the date range for MICR data base will be between January 1, 1993, and August 13, 1994.

E

Ethnicity/National Origin Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same race or national origin who share common or similar traits, languages, customs, and traditions (e.g., Arabs, Hispanics, etc.).

F

Fair Market Value - The price in cash, or its equivalent, for which the property can be sold on the market.

Field Edits - Edits which verify the accuracy of the codes submitted for a single data element.

G

Gay - [adjective] Of or relating to males who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other males; [noun] a homosexual male.

Gender Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons of the same biological category.

Global Edits - Edits which verify the accuracy of the incident as a whole and checks data element relationships between records in the incident.

Gross Negligence - The intentional failure to perform a manifest duty in reckless disregard of the consequences as affecting the life or property of another.

Group A Offense - Offense identified by the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) which will be used as an indicator of the dimensions and trends in crime on a national scale.

Group B Offense - Offense which will not be used to measure crime statistics on a national scale.

H Hate Crime - See Bias Crime.

Hate Group - An organization whose primary purpose is to promote animosity, hostility, and malice against persons belonging to a racial, religious, ethnic/national origin, or sexual orientation group which suffers from that of the members of the organization (e.g., the Ku Klux Klan, American Nazi Party, etc.).

Heterosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of the opposite sex; [noun] a heterosexual person.

Hispanic - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Homosexual - [adjective] Of or relating to persons who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex; [noun] a homosexual person.

Hotel Rule - If a number of dwelling units or rental storage facilities under a single manager are burglarized and the offenses are most likely to be reported to the police by the manager rather than individual tenants, the burglary should be scored as one offense.

I IACP - International Association of Chiefs of Police

Implied Edits - Edits which are logically inferred between dependent data elements.

Incident - One or more offenses committed by the same person or group of persons acting in concert, at the same time and place. An incident is comprised of different records; administrative, offense, offender, victim, arrest, and/or property.

Intangible - Anything which cannot be perceived by the sense of touch. It can be a benefit, e.g., a right or privilege, a promotion, enhanced reputation, etc.; or a detriment, e.g., a loss of reputation, injured feelings, etc.

IRS - Incident Reporting System

Juvenile - The State of Michigan defines a juvenile as an individual whose is less than 17 years of age (FBI = less than 18).

L

LEMS - Law Enforcement Management System

Lesbian - [adjective] Of or relating to females who experience a sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, other females; [noun] a homosexual female.

Legal Residence - The permanent fixed place of abode which a person intends to be his residence and to which he intends to return despite temporary residences elsewhere or despite temporary absences.

LEIN - Law Enforcement Information Network

Loss of Consciousness - An injury which must be the direct result of force inflicted on the victim by the offender.

M

MACP - Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police

Malice - The intentional doing of a wrongful act without just cause or excuse, with an intent to inflict injury or under circumstances that the law will imply an evil intent.

Mandatory Data Element - Data element must have a substantively valid code present. For example, ORI, Incident Number, and Original Year are elements which must be present to link incidents and supplemental information together.

MICR - Michigan Incident Crime Reporting

MICR Format - The format, either paper form or terminal screen, used to submit MICR data. MICR formats include MICR1 through MICR9.

MSA - Michigan Sheriffs Association

N

National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) - The new unit-record reporting system which is being implemented to replace the traditional UCR Summary Reporting System (SRS). NIBRS provides for expanded collection and reporting of offenses, arrests, and their circumstances.

Negligence - The omission to do something which a reasonable man, guided by those ordinary considerations which ordinarily regulate human affairs, would do, or the doing of something which a reasonable and prudent man would not do.

NIBRS - National Incident-Based Reporting System

NSA - National Sheriffs Association

R

Racial Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who possess common physical characteristics (e.g., color of skin, eyes and/or hair, facial features, etc.) genetically transmitted by descent and heredity which distinguish them as a distinct division of humankind (e.g. Asians, blacks, whites, etc.).

Record Type - A grouping of like Data Elements. The 6 MICR Record Types include Administrative, Offense, Offender, Victim, Arrest and Property Records.

Religious Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons who share the same religious beliefs regarding the origin and purpose of the universe and the existence or nonexistence of a supreme being (e.g., Catholics, Jews, Protestants, atheists, etc.).

Resident - A person who maintains his/her permanent home for legal purposes in the locality where the crime took place.

S

Same Time and Place - The time interval between the offenses and the distance between the locations where they occurred were insignificant. Normally, the offenses must have occurred during an unbroken time duration and at the same or adjoining location(s).

Serious Criminal Offense - A felony or high misdemeanor.

Severe Laceration - Injury which should receive medical attention.

Sexual Orientation Bias - A preformed negative opinion or attitude toward a group of persons based on their sexual attraction toward, and responsiveness to, members of their own sex or members of the opposite sex (e.g., gays, lesbians, heterosexuals, etc.).

Start Date - The date an agency begins submitting MICR data. Agencies will be required to begin submitting MICR data on the 1st of the month, not in the middle.

Summary Reporting System (SRS) - The traditional aggregate system which has been used nationally since 1930 to collect UCR data.

U

UCR - Uniform Crime Reporting

V

Vehicular Manslaughter - Any death resulting from the negligent operation of a motor vehicle except where the motor vehicle was utilized as a weapon.

W

Window Updates - Updates of exceptional clearance, arrests, and/or recovered property for incidents that occurred prior to the agency submitting MICR data or prior to the base date of the on-line MICR data base.

Section 14: LEIN

This section provides information for accessing the MICR data base via LEIN.

Introduction

Agencies using the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) have direct access to the MICR data base. LEIN agencies may enter data via the five MICR screens or use the REPT (Report Request) screen to request a printed report on a LEIN printer.

The available MICR screens and screen actions are listed in the following table.

Entering the MICR Data Base

To enter the MICR data base, simply type in the required screen name (MIC1 through 9 or REPT) on the first line of a blank screen and transmit using the SHIFT/XMIT PAGE keys. The selected screen will display and print on the LEIN printer.

Selecting a MICR Screen

There are two ways to select another screen once you have logged onto the MICR data base and the first MICR screen has been displayed.

From a MICR Screen:

- 1. Enter the number of the required screen (1, 3, 5, 7, 9, P) in the Action field of a fresh MICR screen. (If you've entered your ORI number in the 2nd field, the ORI will transfer into the next screen.)
- 2. Transmit with the SHIFT/XMIT PAGE keys.

From a Blank Screen:

- 1. Take the terminal out of forms mode by pressing the FORMS key.
- 2. Press the HOME key to return the cursor to the screen home position.
- 3. Clear the screen.
- 4. Enter the name of the required screen (MIC1 through 9 or REPT)
- 5. Transmit with the SHIFT/XMIT PAGE keys.

Entering Data

The beginning field delimiter of "A" indicates the field is numeric. These fields fill in from right to left as data is typed into the field. The cursor does not automatically tab to the next field when these fields are completely filled in.

The beginning field delimiter of "▶" indicates the field is alpha/numeric. These fields fill in from left to right as data is typed into the field. The cursor will automatically tab to the next field when these fields are completely filled in.

To Complete a MICR Screen:

- 1. Enter all required Data Elements on the screen. (See page 4-2 for an example of a complete MICR1 screen.)
- 2. Enter "Y" in the Incident Complete field if no supplemental data is to be entered.
- 3. Transmit the screen from the transmit field (▶@◄) (See LEIN Terminal Procedures, which follows).
- 4. As the screen is transmitted, a printout of the data being transmitted (not the screen) will print.

LEIN Terminal Procedures

Transmit Keys and Terminal Setup Options

The MICR system was designed as a two page entry system. Terminal setup options (1 or multiple page) will dictate how the terminal will react to record transmissions.

XMIT PAGE - response is sent to printer only. Use when you are working with single page terminals and you do not want the response to overwrite the data entered on the screen.

If the LEIN terminal is setup for 1 page, you must use the "XMIT PAGE" key to enter data so response messages will be routed to the printer.

SHIFT/XMIT PAGE - response is sent to both screen and printer. Use when you are requesting screens, working with multiple page terminals, or inquiring an incident if you want the response on the screen.

If the LEIN terminal is setup for multiple pages, you can transmit using the "SHIFT/XMIT PAGE" keys and the response message will be routed to the 2nd page of terminal.

MIC1 - Incident

The MIC1 screen is used to submit original incidents including the following records:

- administrative
- ► offenses up to four
- ► offender one
- victim one
- arrest one
- property up to four

MIC1 is also used to window update information for incidents not originally entered into the MICR system. Window updates include the following records:

- ► arrest one
- recovered property items up to four

MIC1 is also used to delete, replace, and inquire records. This is the only screen in which the modify and replace action codes can be used.



Quitting MICR

To quit the MICR system, enter a "Q" in the Action field in the MIC1, MIC3, MIC5, MIC7, or MIC9 screens. If you are in the Report Request screen, you must return to one of the other screens before quitting.

Response: Incident Updated or Errors

The response to your MICR entry will be either an error message or a blank screen format followed by an accept message. The accept message will state either "ATTENTION Incident Updated" or "ATTENTION Incident Updated and Marked as Completed" depending on the information entered in the Incident Complete field.

Error Messages

There are two types of errors which will be returned to the agency, field edit and final edit errors.

Field edits are processed as each screen is transmitted. If there is missing or invalid data in the entry field, a field edit error is given back. The information needs to be corrected before the data will be entered into the data base.

Final edits are not processed until all field edits have been corrected and the Incident Complete Indicator is "Y". Because additional offenders, victims, arrests and property can be submitted on the supplemental MICR screens, some crossfield edits cannot occur until all information has been submitted.

When an agency submits the last screen which has "Y" in the Incident Complete Indicator (Data Element #61), all final crossfield edits will be completed. If errors occur in final edits, the data is maintained on the data base but the Incident Complete Indicator is set to "N" in the data base record. Error messages indicate "final edit error". The error could be the result of data entered on the last screen or from a previous screen. The agency must determine what has caused the error.

If additional offenders, victims, or property is required to correct the incident, the information needs to be added using a supplemental screen. In some cases it will be necessary to delete the entire incident and reenter the correct incident information.

2nd Page Screen

The 2nd page screen is used to display the error messages. The error messages will either be routed to the printer or to the screen depending on your terminal setup options.

This screen can also be used to select other screens by entering the screen name (MIC1, MIC3, MIC5, MIC7, MIC9, or REPT) in the first field. Transmit by using the SHIFT/XMIT PAGE keys so the new screen will be displayed on the terminal screen.

Summary report of incidents and clearances sorted by offense file class applying the hierarchy rule. This report does not include assist incidents or incidents where the Incident Complete Indicator flag is "N".
