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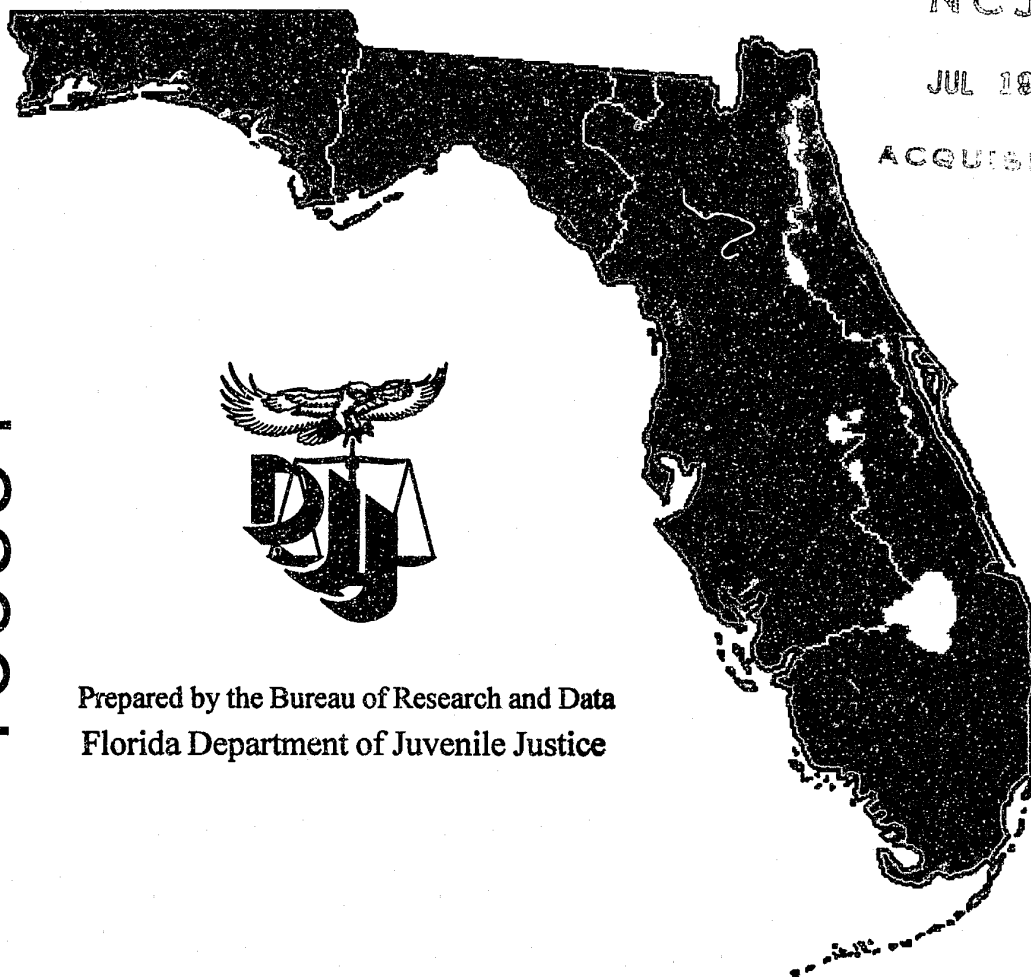

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FOREWORD

This report is the latest in a series of *Profiles of Delinquency Cases*, and contains several format changes that will hopefully offer an accurate and useful analysis of delinquency trends in Florida during the last five fiscal years. Except where otherwise noted, all data used here is taken from the Client Information System (CIS), a database managed by the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services and used by the Department of Juvenile Justice to track delinquency offenses/referrals from law enforcement. Each section of the report begins with a description of what parameters were used to determine how the data portrayed in that section was selected, and includes a "bullet list" of some of the more important findings of the study.

In past editions of the *Profile*, the unit of analysis was defined as a case, determined by selecting the most serious offense for any individual youth on a specific date. If the same youth were charged with additional offenses, these would still be counted as a single case. If the youth was referred on another date for one or more charges, that would be counted as another case, always selecting the most serious offense for tracking purposes. This method was designed primarily to measure the flow of offenders through the various stages of the juvenile justice system, and was found to be an effective means of tracking the work assigned to and completed by delinquency staff.

This year, the *Profile* includes another measure, *youths*, developed to measure the number of delinquents in Florida rather than the number of times they get in trouble with the law. The number of youths is determined by selecting the most serious offense for any specific offender logged on CIS during each fiscal year. Regardless of how many times the youth is referred during the year, only his or her most serious offense of the year is reflected in the tables and charts of this report. To assist in the comparison of the two measures, tables and charts of cases and youths appear opposite each other in the report.

Notes on the Data

The data presented in this section are based upon referrals reported to the Client Information System (CIS) by delinquency workers throughout the state. The number of cases received is determined by counting only the most serious offense for which a youth is charged on any specific date, as recorded on CIS. If the same youth is referred for several offenses on the same date, these would be counted together as one case. If that juvenile is referred for one or more offenses on another date it would be counted as another case. The number of *youths* referred is determined by counting only the most serious offense for which a youth is charged during any fiscal year. If the same youth is referred for several offenses during that year, these would not be counted, using only the most serious offense charged during that period. If that juvenile is referred for one or more offenses during another fiscal year it would be counted as another referral.

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

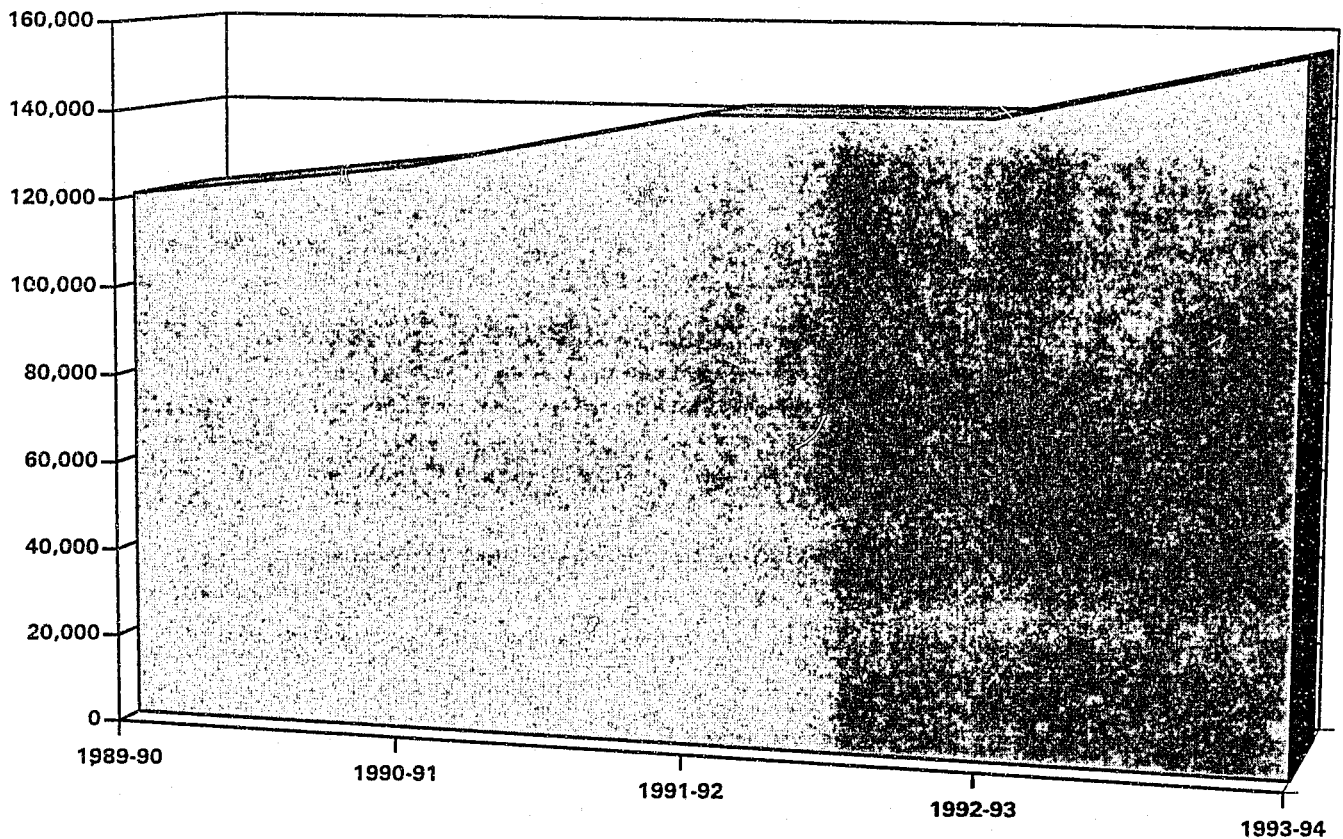
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- The estimated Florida population aged 10 to 17 increased by 7% over the five year period, from 1,201,805 to 1,281,913. Meanwhile, the number of youths referred for delinquency rose 23%. This equaled 7.3% of the total 10-17 population in 1993-94, compared to 6.3% of the total in 1989-90. The number of delinquency cases received during 1993-94 was 29% greater than the number received in 1989-90.
- The percent increase was larger for less serious offenses, with a combined increase of 34% in misdemeanor and "other offense" cases compared to a 22% increase in the number of felony cases, reversing the trend of the previous decade, in which the growth of felonies outpaced that of lesser offenses.
- Burglary remains by far the most common felony reason for referral, still accounting for a third of the total number of felony cases received and increasing by 15% since 1989-90, though the increase since 1991-92 has been only 1%. In 1993-94 burglary was the most serious referral offense of 10,538 youths, an increase of 4% since 1989-90.
- Shoplifting continues as the most common misdemeanor reason for referral, accounting for 29% of the total number of misdemeanor cases received and increasing by 36% since 1989-90. In 1993-94 shoplifting was the most serious referral offense of 16,408 youths, an increase of 30% since 1989-90.
- The largest percentage increase among misdemeanors over the five-year period was for marijuana offenses, which grew from 1,700 cases to 3,240, an increase of 91%. Other misdemeanor drug offenses were up by 85%, from 615 to 1,136, resulting in an 89% total increase in misdemeanor drug offenses. Meanwhile, alcohol cases declined 34%.

- The number of felony drug cases (excluding marijuana) fell by 10%. Felony marijuana cases, however, jumped 116% from 430 cases in 1989-90 to 927 in 1993-94, departing from a rather flat trend during the previous decade, during which the number of felony marijuana cases never exceeded 500. Despite the increase, marijuana felony cases constitute less than 2% of the felony cases, and less than 1% of the total number of cases received.
- The number of auto theft cases increased by 12%, as did the number of concealed firearm cases.
- The number of armed robbery cases grew by 11%. Other robbery cases increased by 40%.
- Sexual battery cases decreased by 1%, though "other felony sex offense" cases increased by 49%. Though the number of youths referred for sexual battery declined 3% from 709 to 686, the number charged with other felony sex offenses grew 47%, from 332 to 489.
- Aggravated assault cases increased by 48% to a total of 8,083 cases (13% of the felony cases). These cases were split among 4,921 youths, a 45% increase since 1989-90 in the number of youths whose most serious referral offense was aggravated assault. Misdemeanor assault cases increased by 58% to 15,709 (21% of the misdemeanor cases), among 9,952 youths.
- The total number of delinquency cases received increased by 20% for white males, 28% for black males, 40% for white females and 66% for black females.
- The number of youths referred for delinquency increased by 13% for white males, 26% for black males, 32% for white females and 56% for black females.

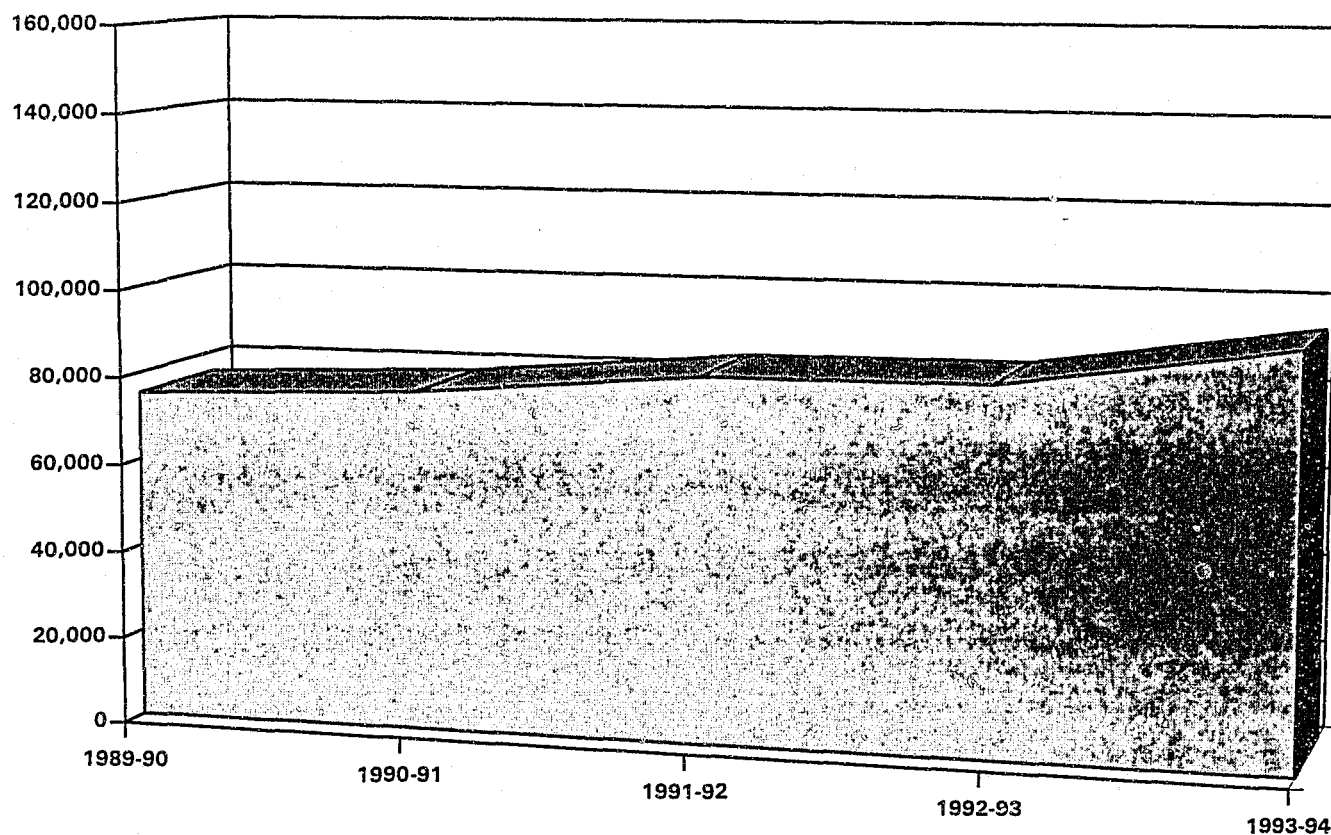

YOUTHS REFERRED FOR DELINQUENCY

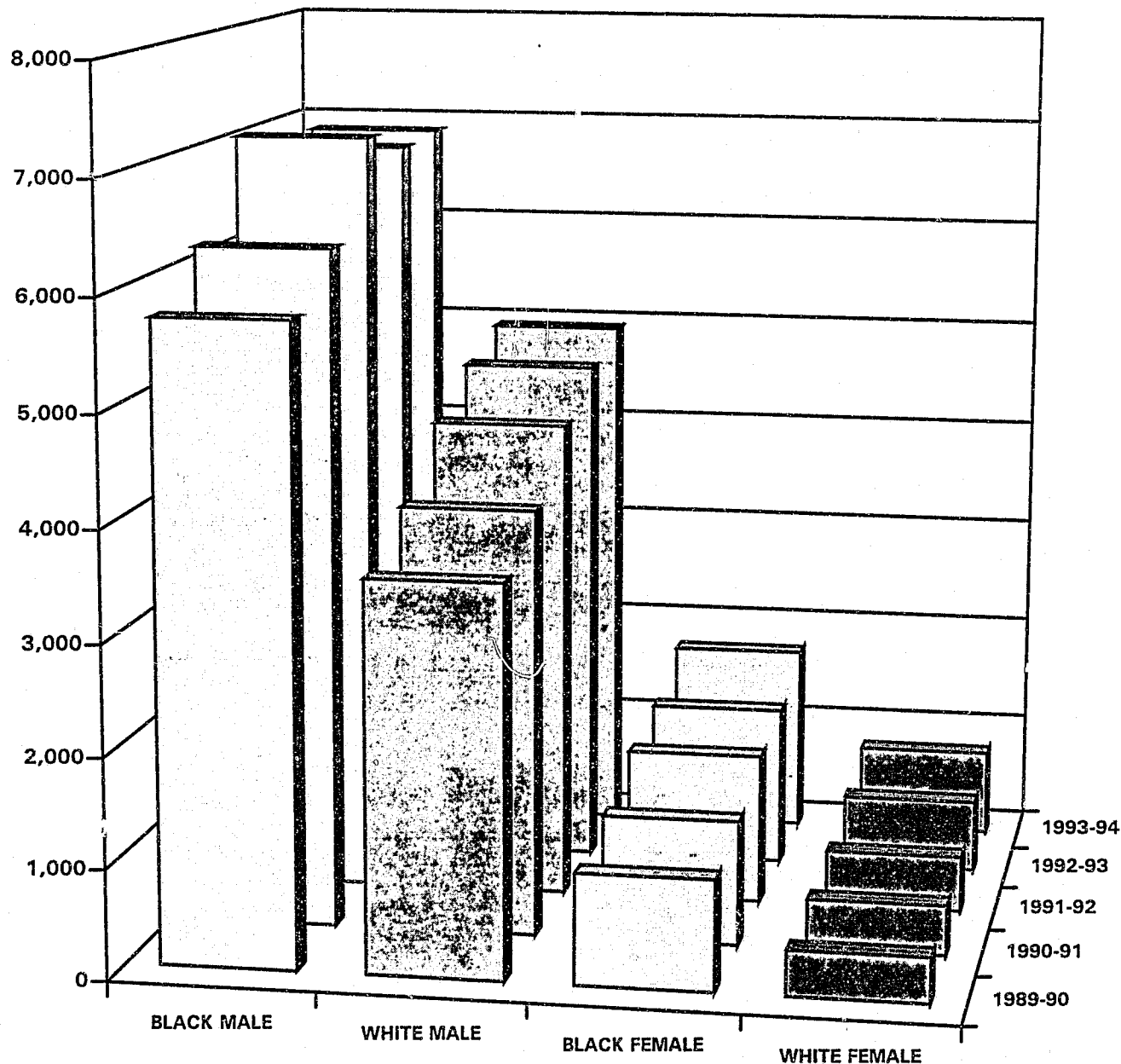

VIOLENT FELONY CASES RECEIVED STATEWIDE

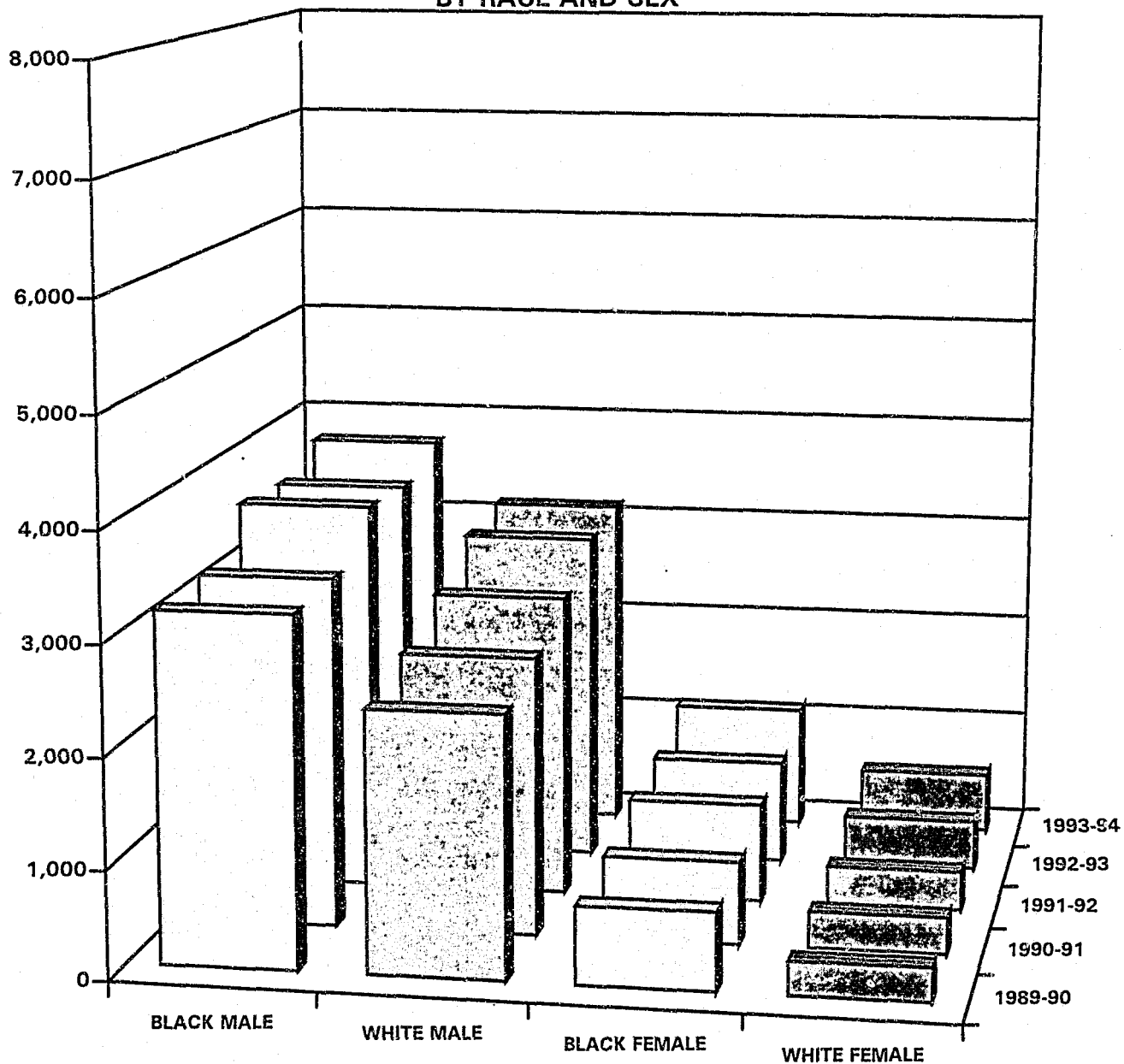

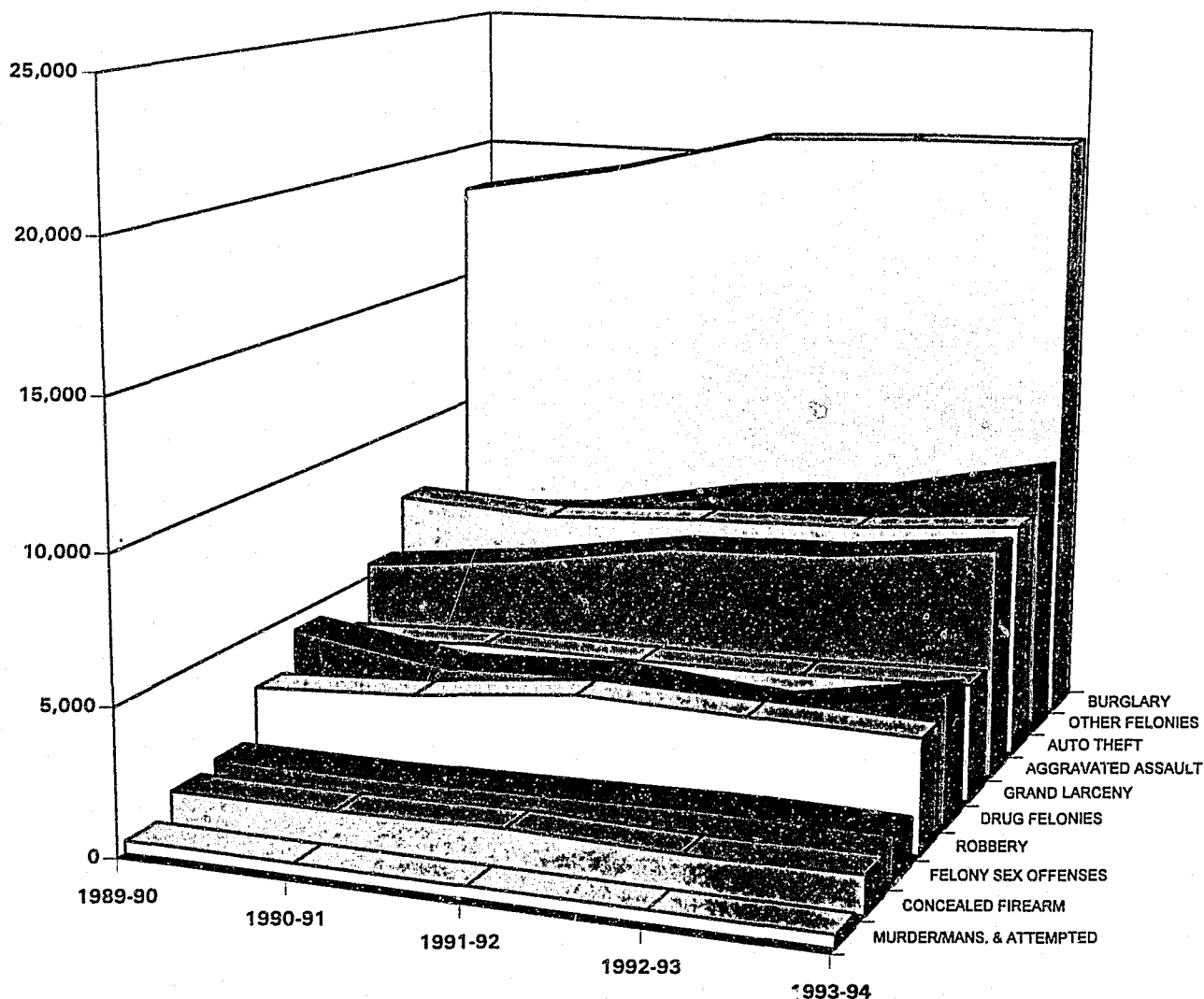
YOUTHS REFERRED FOR VIOLENT FELONIES STATEWIDE

BY RACE AND SEX



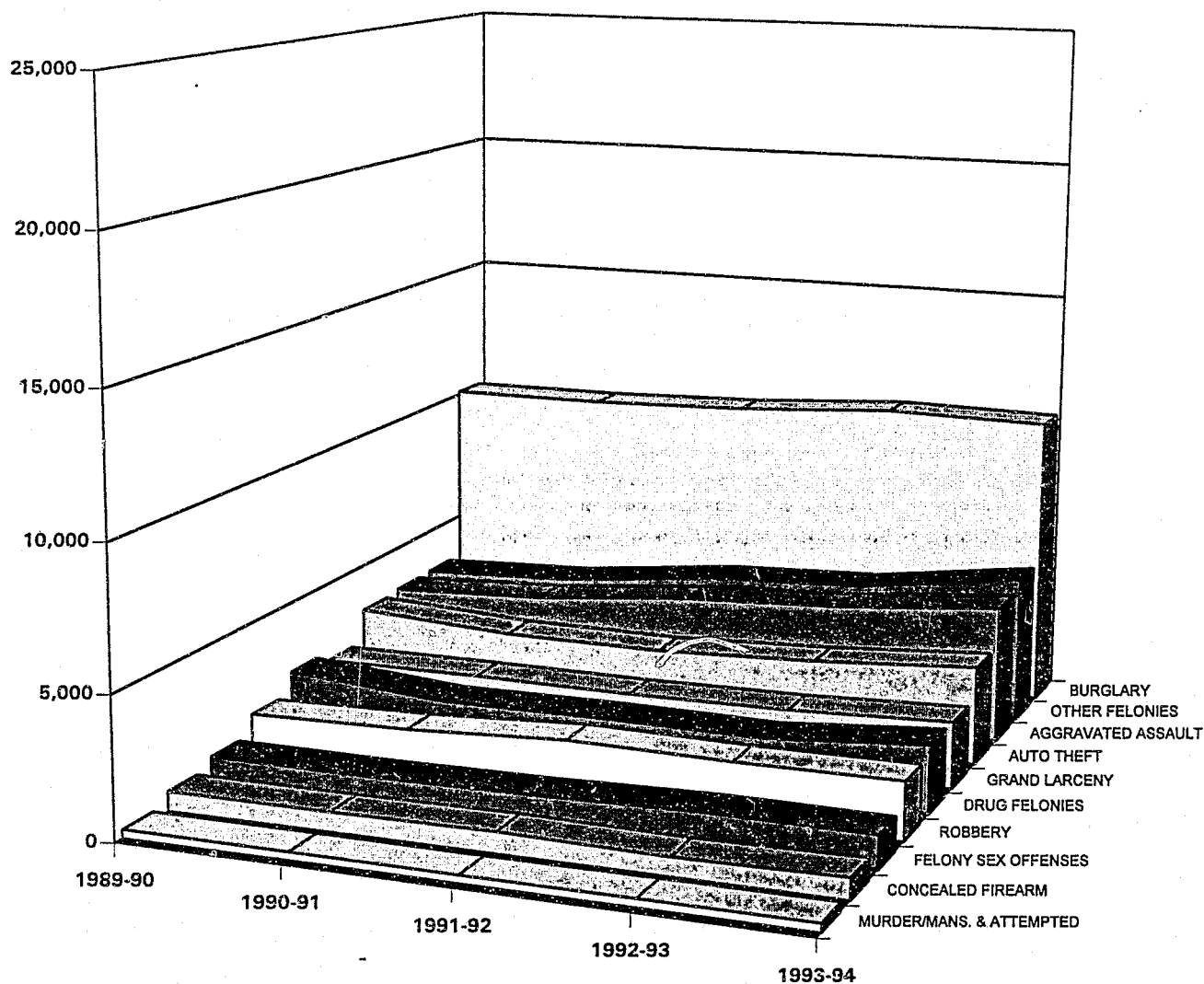

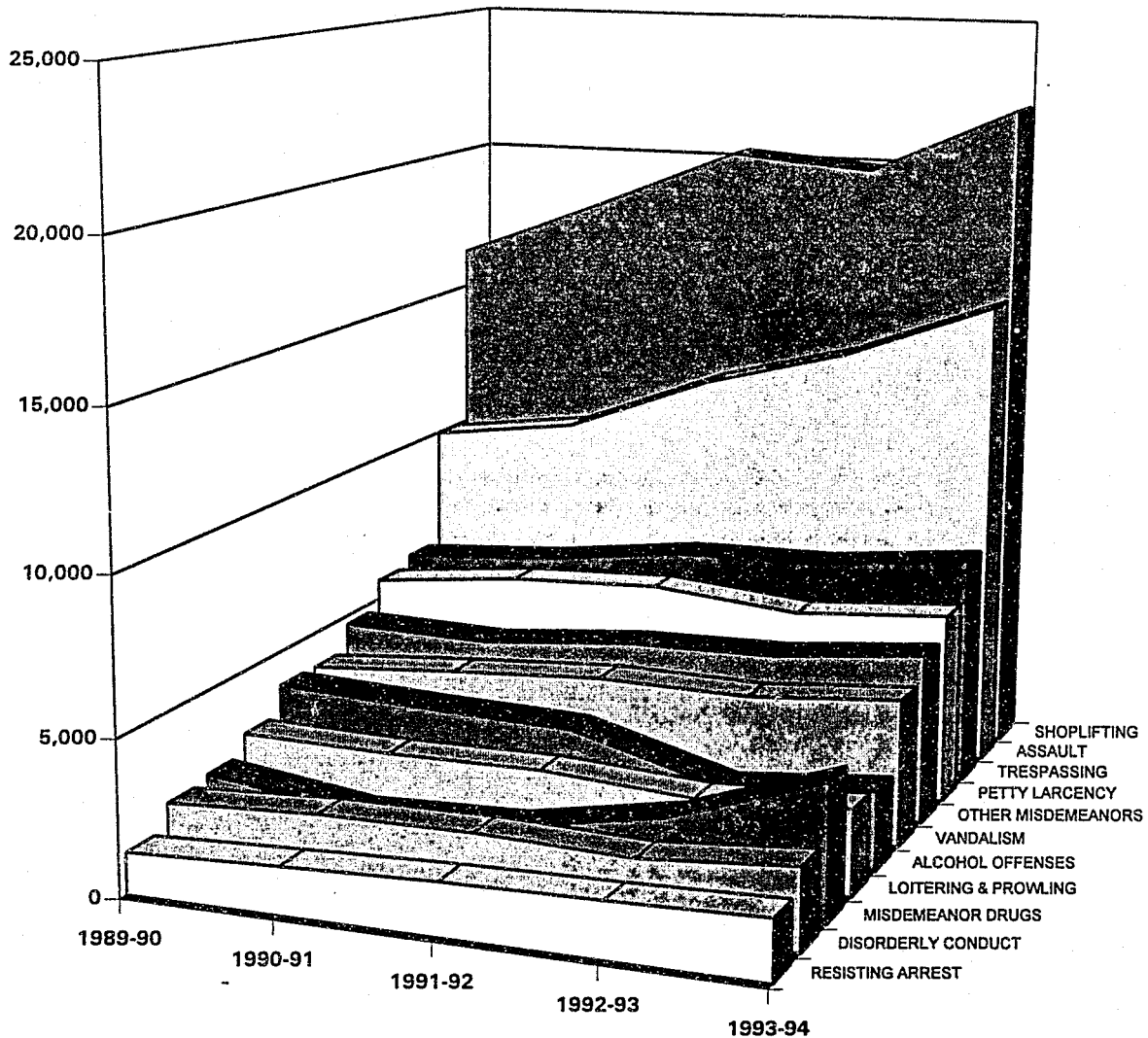

YOUTHS REFERRED FOR DELINQUENCY BY MOST SERIOUS OFFENSE: FELONIES STATEWIDE



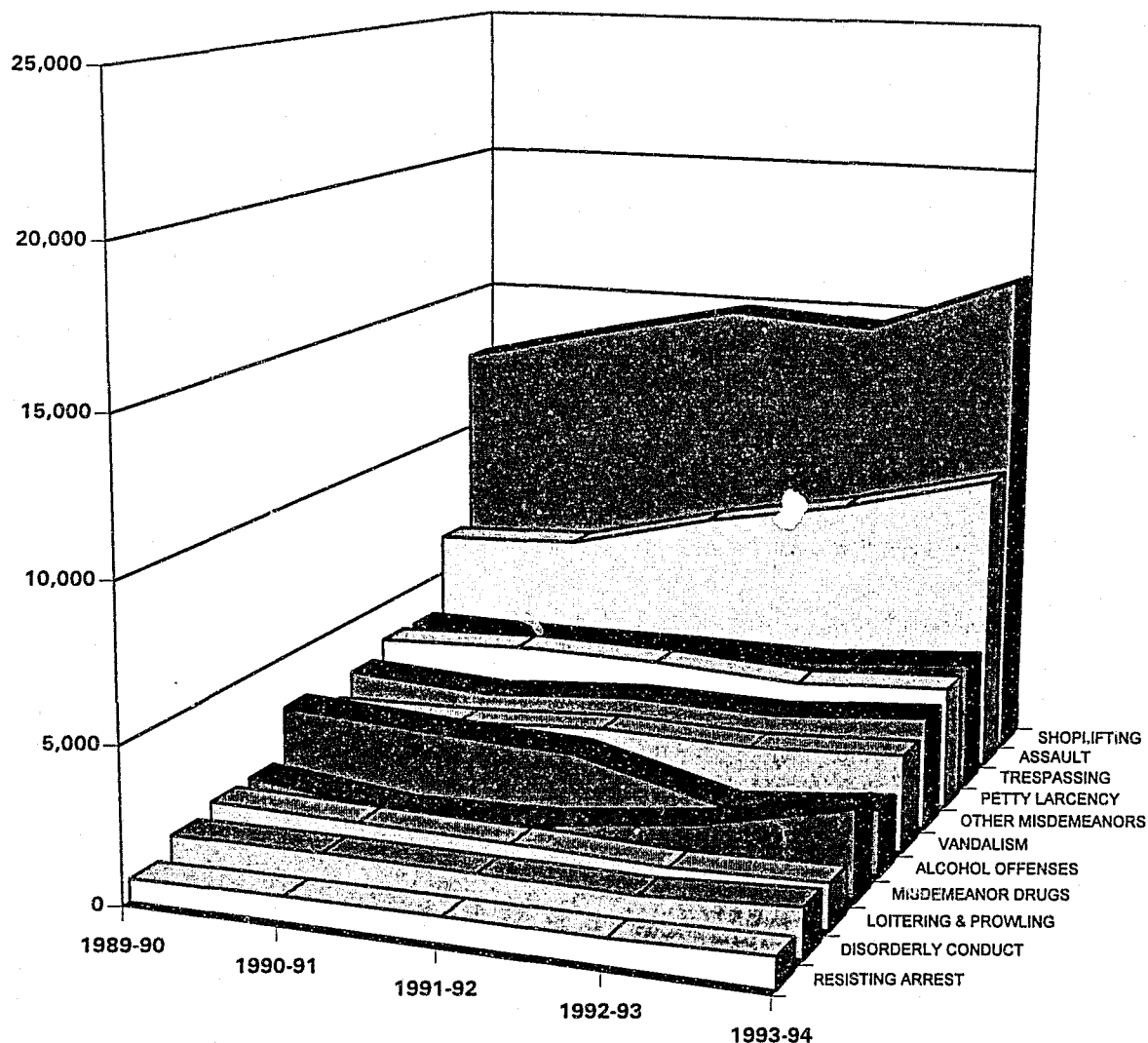

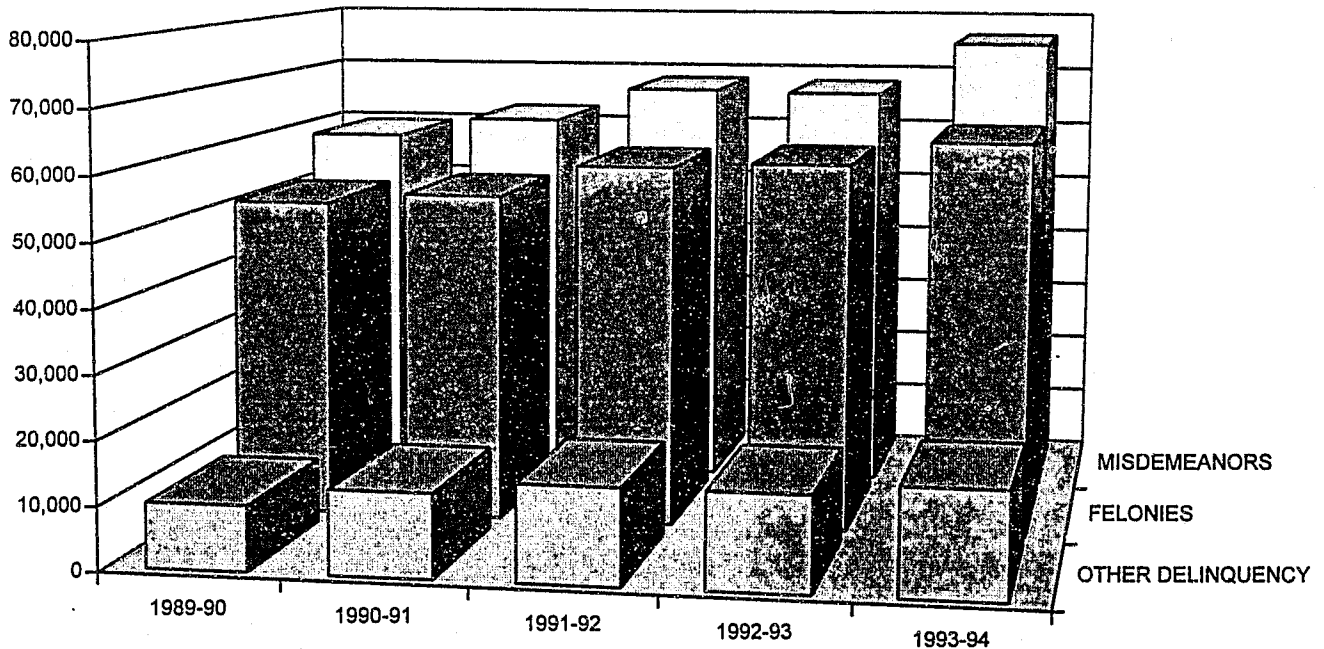

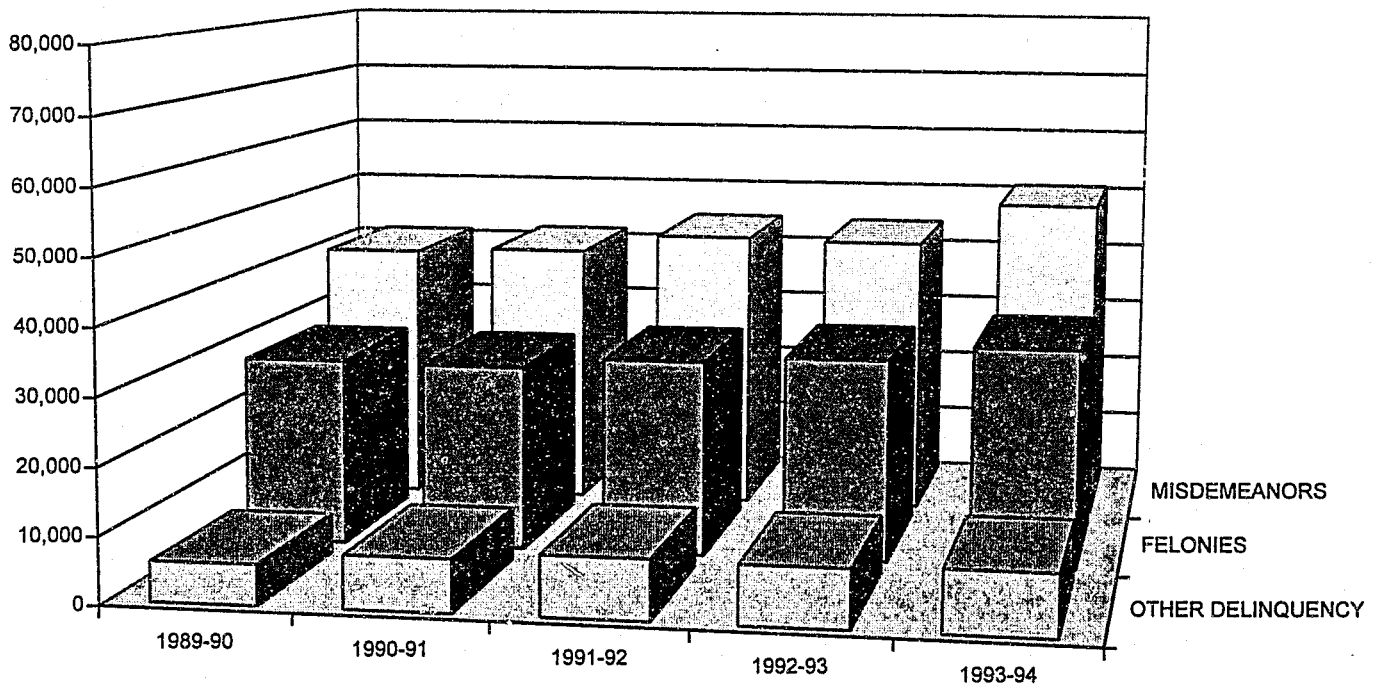

BY CATEGORY OF MOST SERIOUS CHARGE



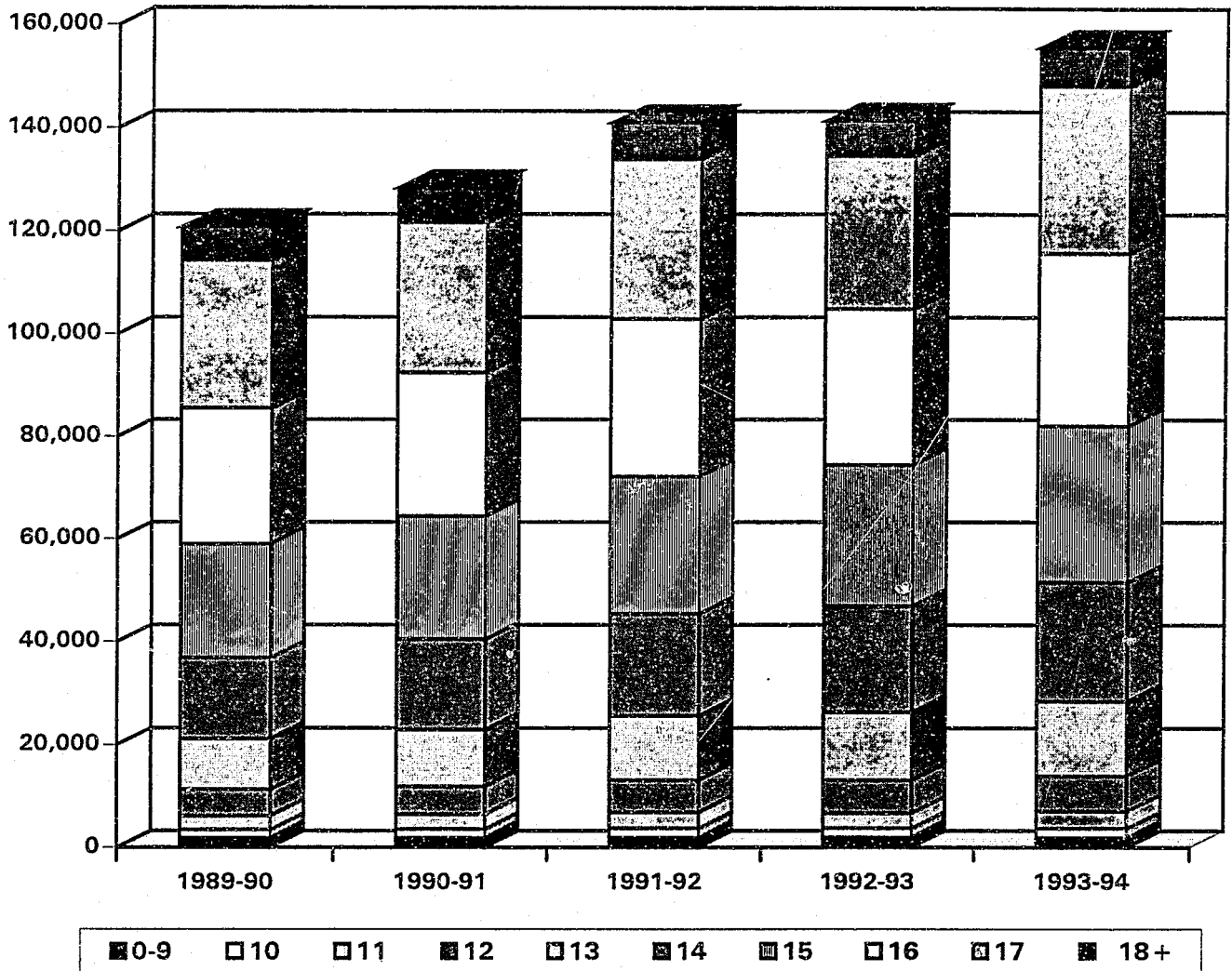

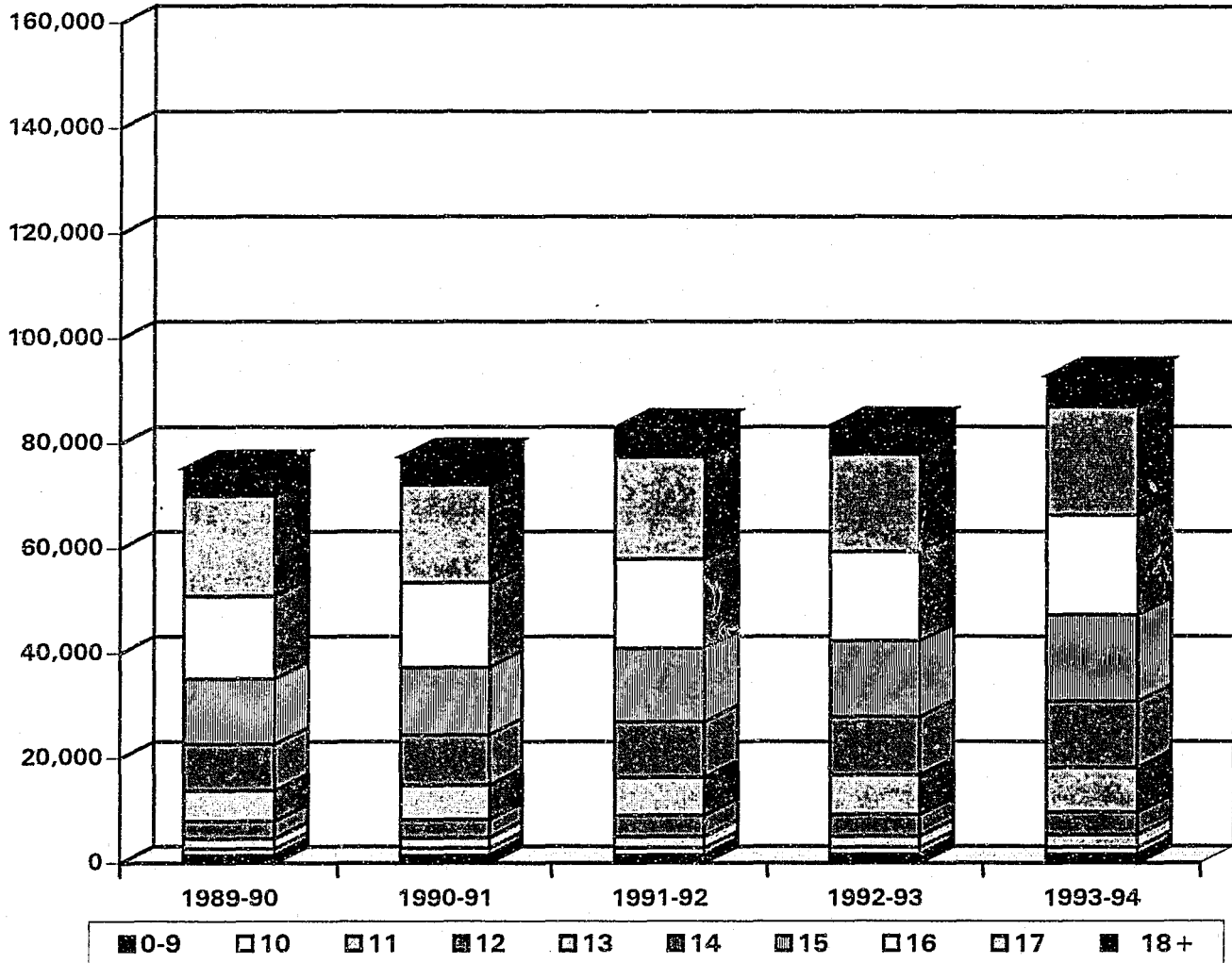
DELINQUENCY CASES RECEIVED STATEWIDE BY AGE

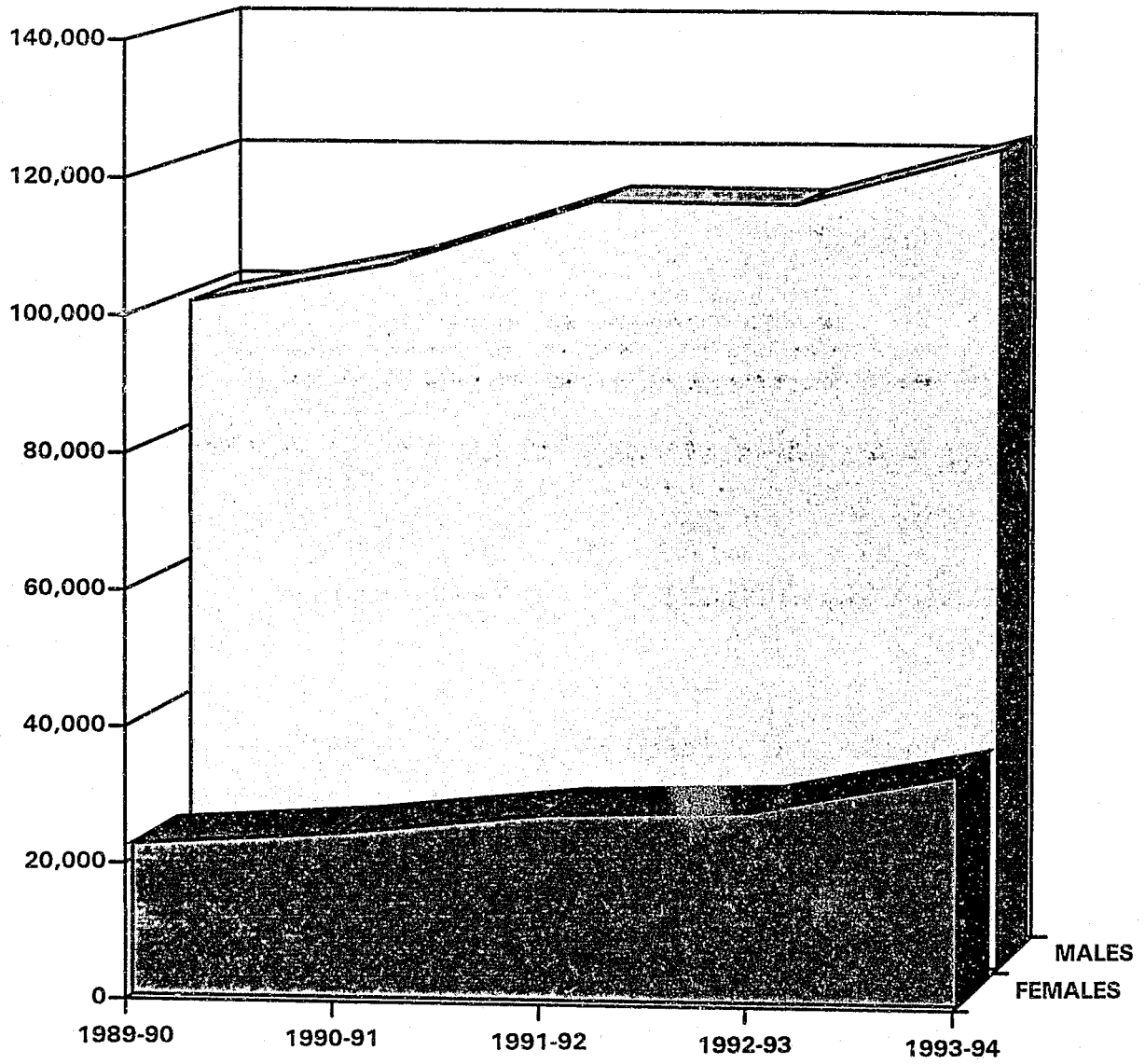

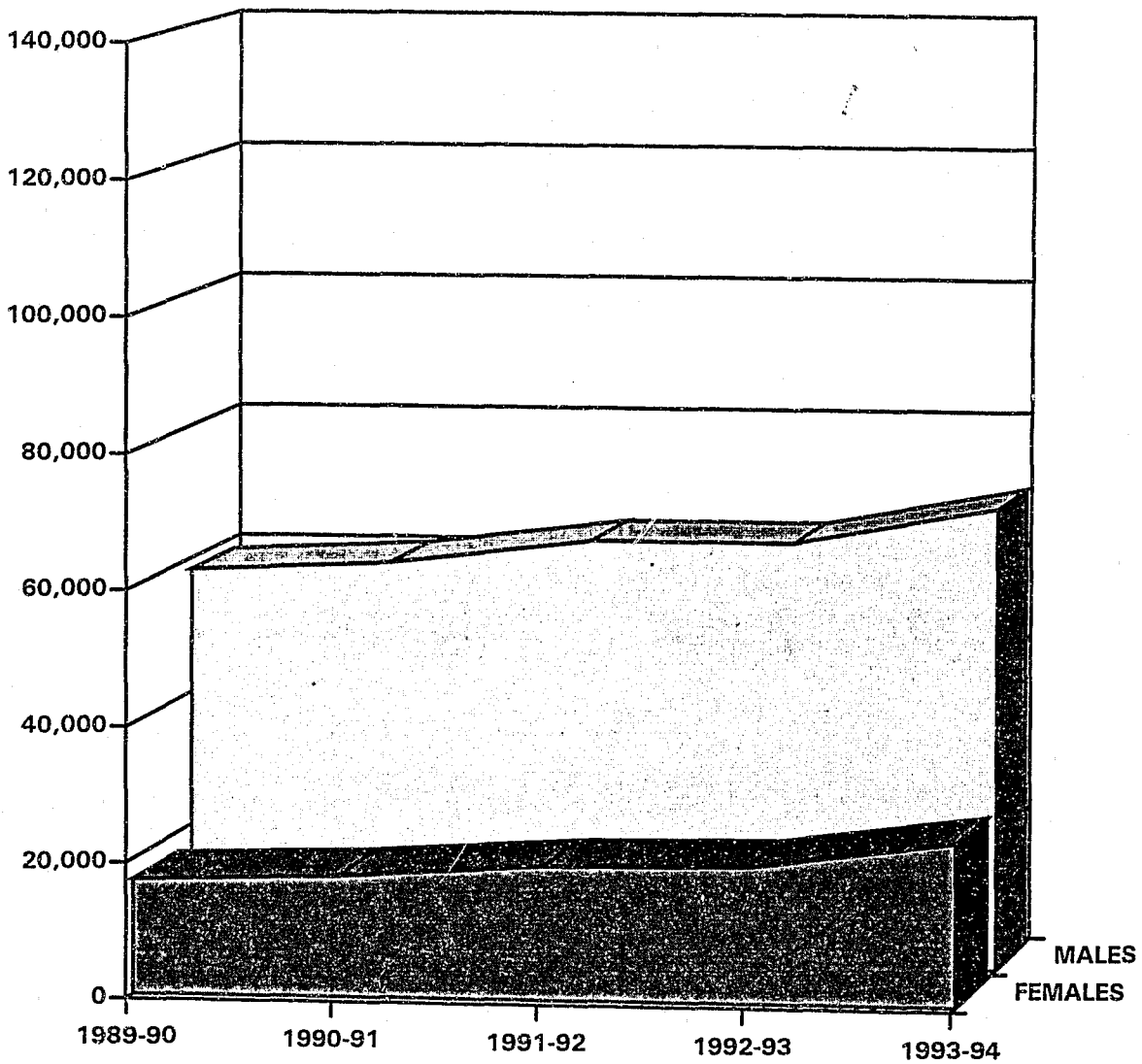
DELINQUENCY CASES RECEIVED STATEWIDE BY SEX

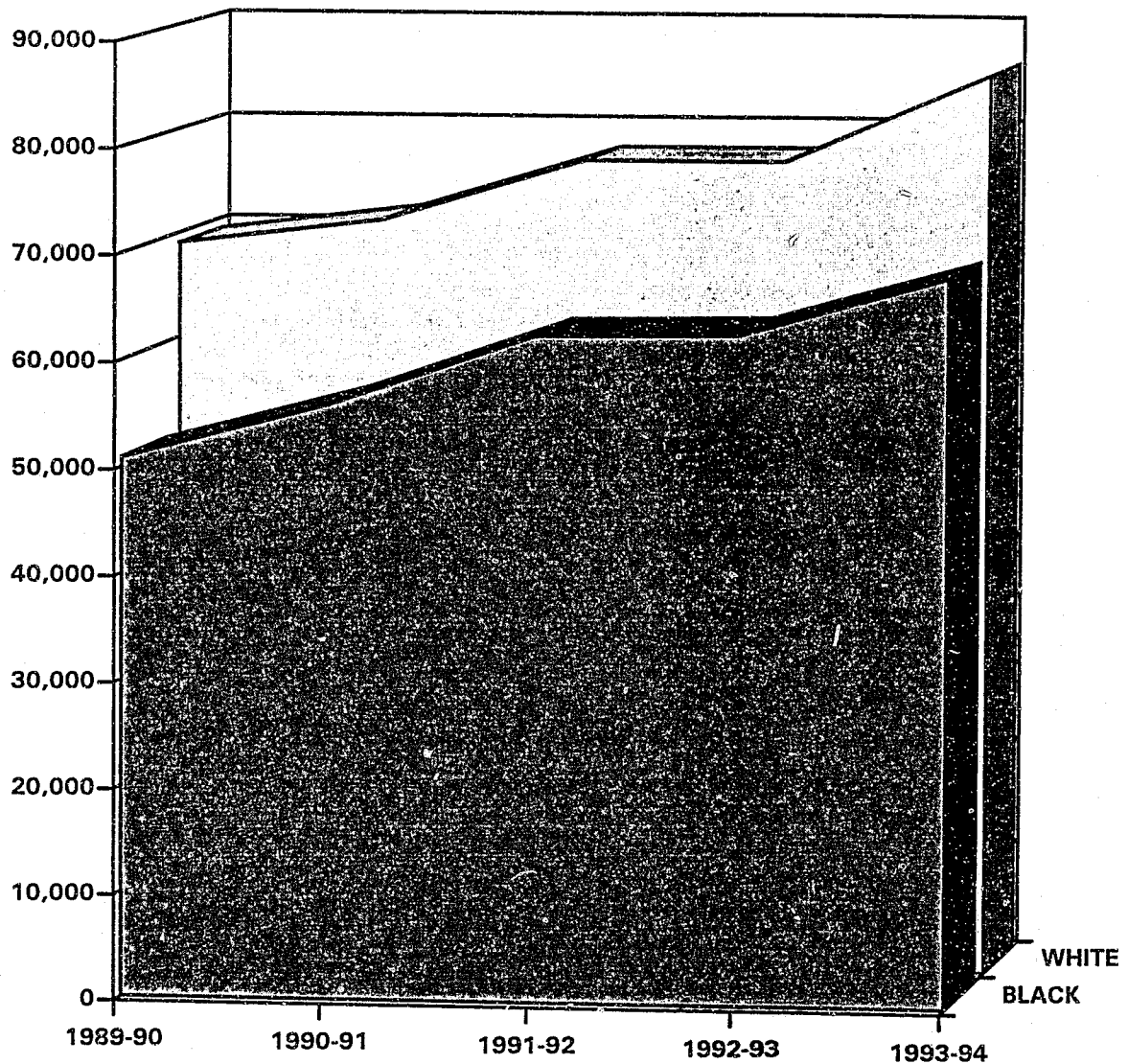

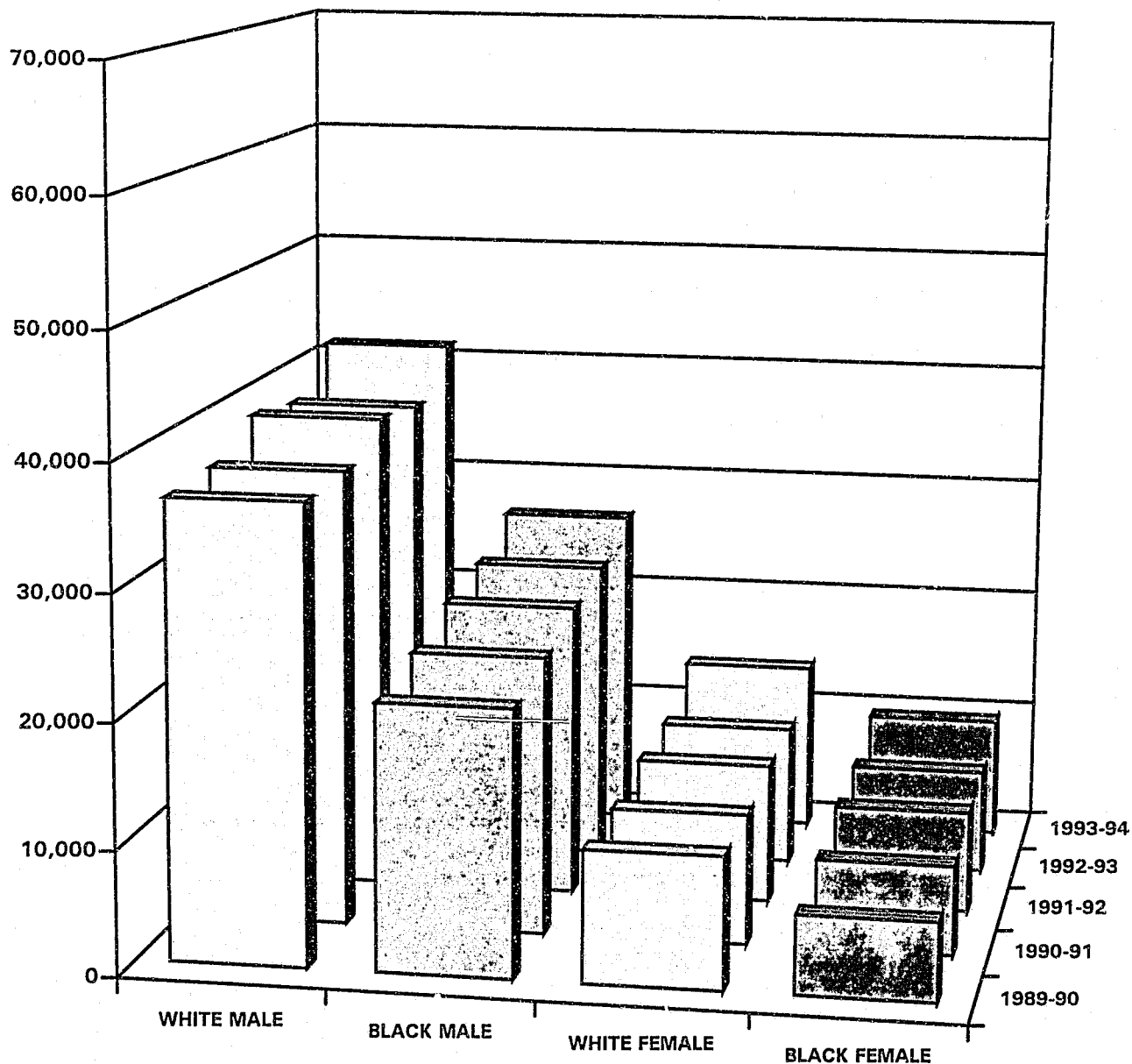

Notes on the Data

Data for the first two charts, *Detention Admissions* and *Average Daily Populations in Detention*, come from the Detention Population Reports submitted each month by the detention centers and compiled in the Department of Juvenile Justice Bureau of Research and Data.

Figures for all other charts and tables come from the Client Information System (CIS) reports of cases and youths with a placement in detention during the interim between arrest and case disposition. The counts of CIS reports (referrals by client identifier and date) are consistently lower than admissions reported on Detention Population Reports. CIS reports of detention consistently represent just over 75% of admissions reported on the manual data collection system. There seems to be little reason to believe that data not reported on CIS are significantly different than those which are reported. If this is assumed, then CIS data represent a very substantial sample for purposes of identifying trends and examining relationships.

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

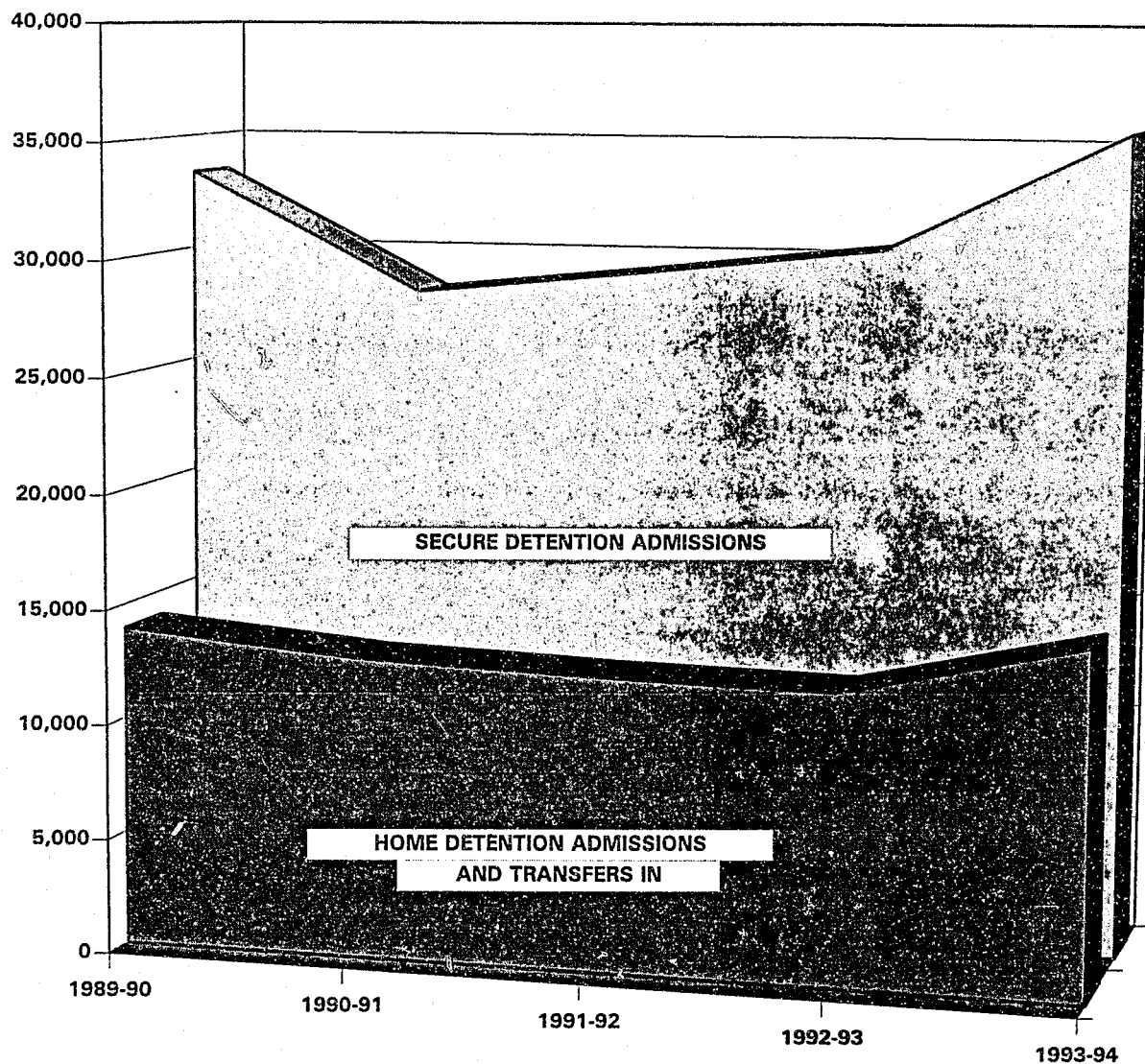
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- Based upon monthly detention population reports, there were 35,499 admissions to secure detention during 1993-94, 6% higher than the 1989-90 total of 33,395. Admissions declined from 1989-90 to 28,237 in 1990-91; since then the annual number of admissions has risen each year, and was 26% higher in 1993-94 than during 1990-91, the lowest point during the period of study. The largest one-year change was during the last fiscal year, when the total rose from 30,400 in 1992-93 to 35,499, an increase of 17%.
- Statewide there was an average daily population (ADP) of 1458 youths in secure detention, up 14% from the 1992-93 ADP of 1274. This was, however, the first annual increase in ADP since 1989-90, when there was an ADP of 1630; between 1989-90 and 1992-93, statewide ADP had fallen to 1274.
- Based upon monthly detention population reports, there were 5,466 placements to non-secure or "home" detention during 1993-94, 70% higher than the 1989-90 total of 3,217. The rate of change has been irregular; between 1991-92 and 1992-93 admissions increased by only 1%, while between 1992-93 and 1993-94 there was a 48% increase, from 3,685 to 5,466.
- At 1,092, the average daily population in home detention was 1% higher in 1993-94 than the 1,076 in 1989-90, though the ADP had fallen to as low as 964 in 1992-93, 13% below last year's average.
- In 1989-90 the implementation of an improved detention screening process raised the proportion of cases resulting in an interim placement in detention that were felonies to 71%; in years prior it had been between 67% and 69%, according to CIS data. In 1993-94 the proportion of cases detained that were felonies was 72%, down from 74% in 1993-93.

- CIS data indicates that the offense of burglary continues to be the charge most likely to result in detention. Burglary cases made up 20% of the total during 1989-90 and 1993-94, though it rose to as high as 22% during 1992-93.
- The proportion of cases reported as detained on auto theft charges has fallen from 13% to 9%; armed robbery remains at 4% and concealed firearms at 2%. Felony drug charges (excluding marijuana) fell from 8% to 5%.
- According to CIS, the total number of cases resulting in detention decreased by 8% in the 5 year period. The number of white male cases reported detained decreased by 3% while black male cases decreased by 15%. During this same period, the number of white female cases reported detained decreased by 10% and black female cases increased by 30%.

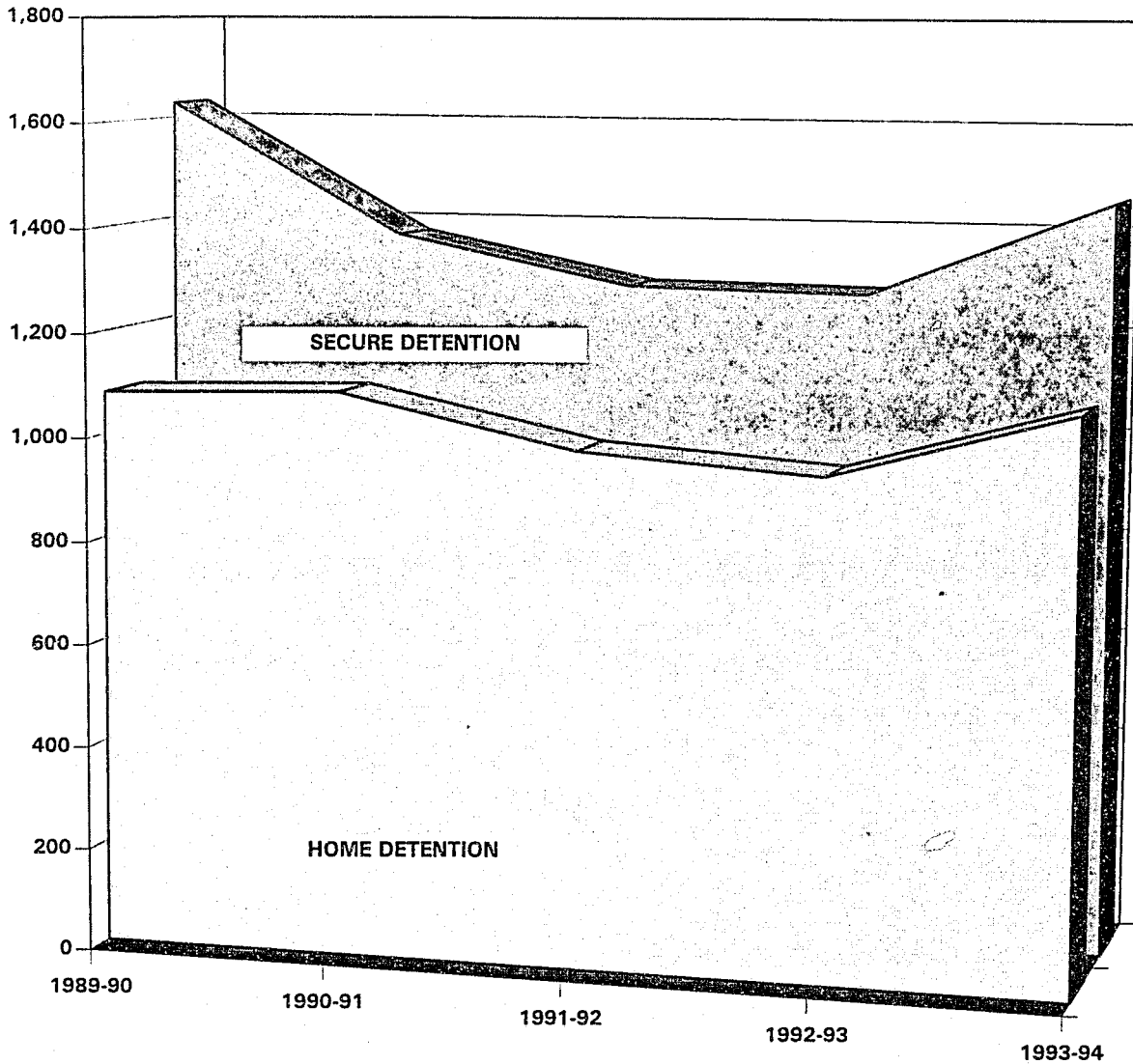

AVERAGE DAILY POPULATIONS IN DETENTION

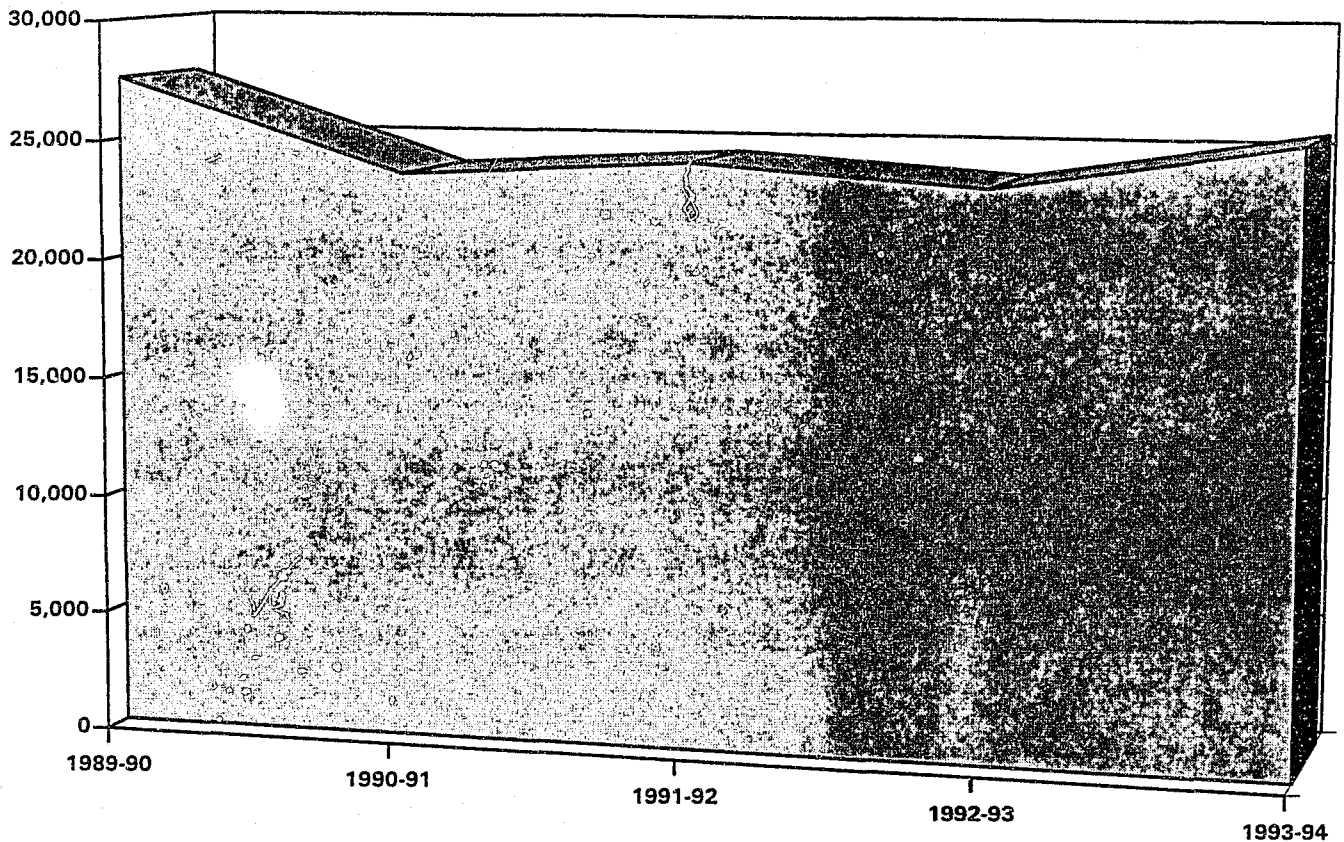

Notes on the Data

The data presented in this section are based upon case dispositions reported to the Client Information System (CIS) by delinquency workers throughout the state. In this context, "disposed" means that the referral is no longer pending action by the court or state attorney, whether or not the disposition requires follow-up by DJJ personnel (commitment, community supervision, etc.). It should be noted that some cases reported "received" in one year are not disposed until the following year and that some reported "disposed" here are from the previous years' arrests.

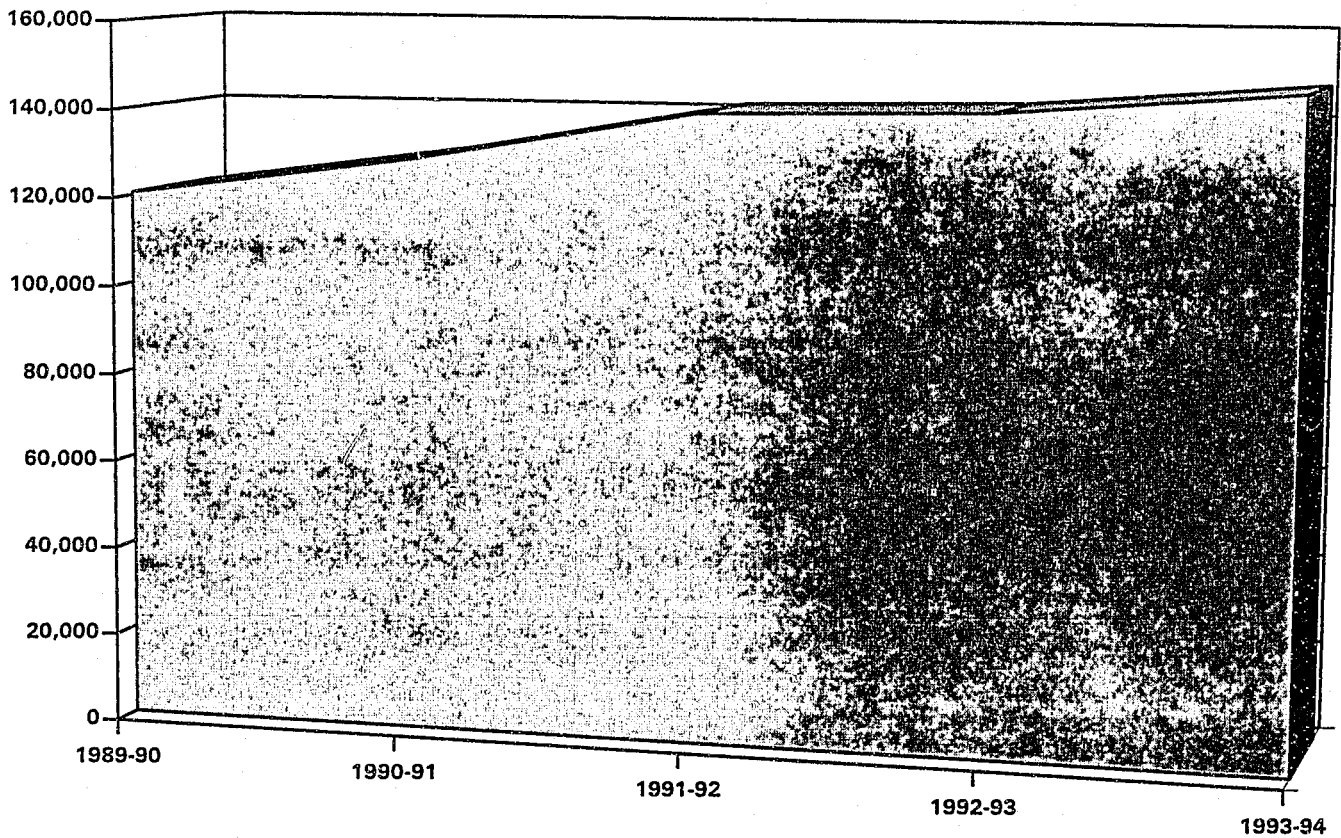

- At 147,491 the total number of delinquency cases disposed during 1993-94 was 22% greater than the number disposed in 1989-90 (120,634). The number of youths disposed for delinquency referrals rose 17%, from 78,228 to 91,917.
- In terms of relative growth, the 59% jump in the "other offenses" category far outpaced felonies and misdemeanors, which grew 16% and 21%, respectively. Within the "other offenses" category, cases previously deferred or reopened stood out with a combined growth of 111% from 3,582 to 7,545 cases, along with a 49% growth of non-law violations of community control, which moved from 3,721 to 5558 cases.
- Burglary remains by far the most common felony referral reason among cases disposed (20,273), and accounts for a third of the total number of felony cases disposed, increasing by 12% since 1989-90. In 1993-94 burglary was the most serious offense of 10,667 youths disposed, an increase of 3% since 1989-90.
- With a 29% increase since 1989-90, shoplifting continues as the most common misdemeanor reason for referrals that were disposed, the 20,730 cases accounting for 29% of the misdemeanor cases disposed. In 1993-94 shoplifting was the most serious offense of 15,737 of the youths with delinquency cases disposed, compared to 12,717 in 1989-90.
- The number of felony drug cases disposed (excluding marijuana) was 22% below the 1989-90 total, at 3,340 compared to 4,280, though the number of non-marijuana felony drug cases disposed had dropped as far as 2,878 during 1992-93. The number of felony marijuana cases disposed, however, jumped 84% from 446 cases in 1989-90 to 819 in 1993-94, departing from a rather flat trend during the previous decade.

- The number of auto theft cases disposed increased by 5%; number of aggravated assault cases increased 42%.
- The number of armed robbery cases disposed grew by 6%. Other robbery cases increased by 30%.
- The number of misdemeanor assault cases disposed was 51% higher, while trespassing cases disposed were up 19% and vandalism 18%.
- With 976 cases disposed, the number of non-marijuana misdemeanor drug offense cases disposed during 1993-94 was 56% higher than during 1989-90. The number of cases disposed had fallen as low as 398 in 1991-92, only 41% of the 1993-94 total. Misdemeanor marijuana offenses followed a similar trend, though the number of disposed cases in 1993-94 was more than double the 1990-91 and 1991-92 totals. During 1993-94, a misdemeanor non-marijuana offense was the most serious offense during that year for 682 youths, and 2,054 youths disposed had dispositions for no offense more serious than a marijuana misdemeanor.
- Over the five year period the total number of delinquency cases disposed increased by 14% for white males, 21% for black males, 31% for white females and 61% for black females.
- The number of youths disposed for delinquency increased by 8% for white males, 20% for black males, 23% for white females and 51% for black females.

BY CATEGORY OF MOST SERIOUS CHARGE



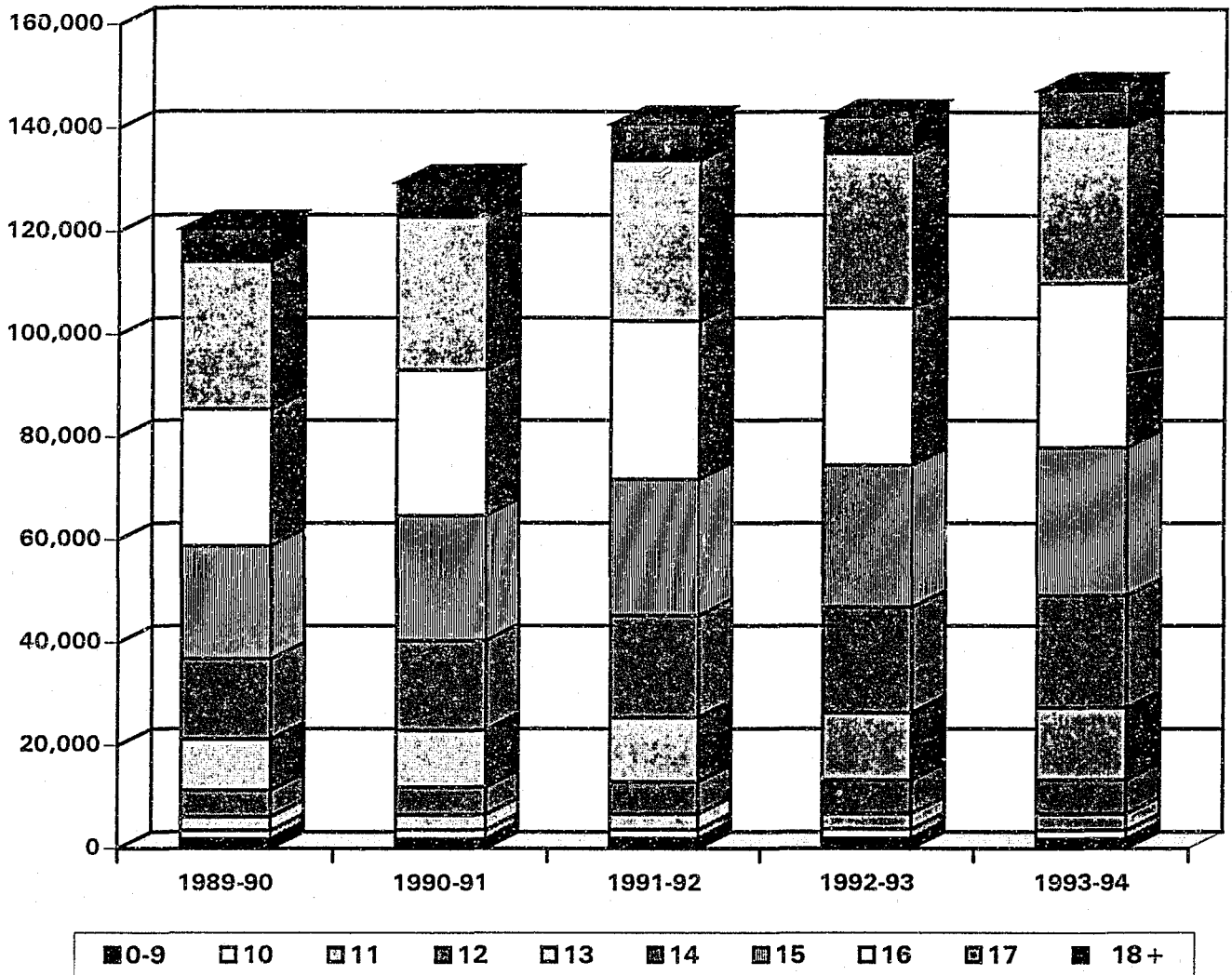

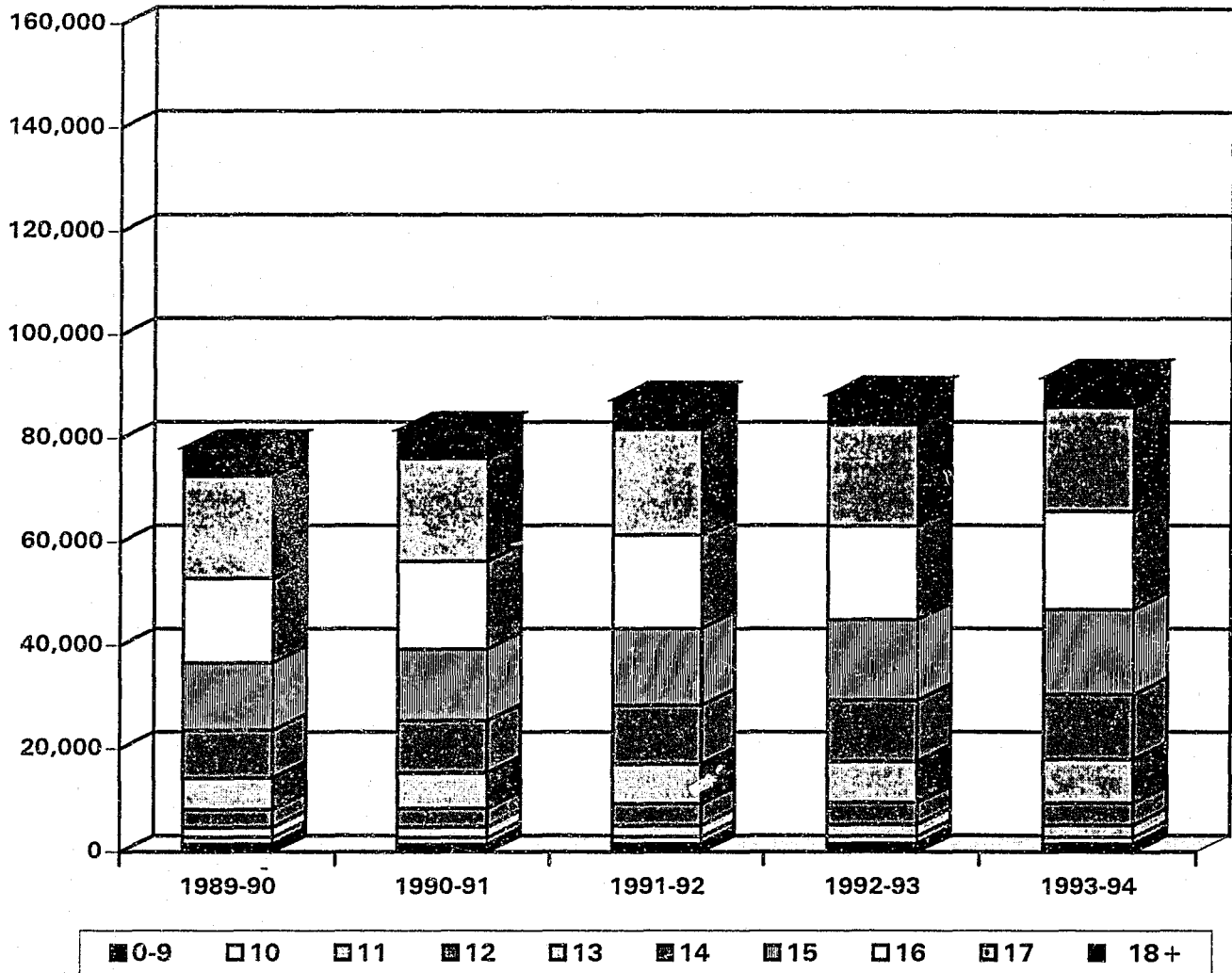

YOUTHS DISPOSED FOR DELINQUENCY STATEWIDE BY SEX



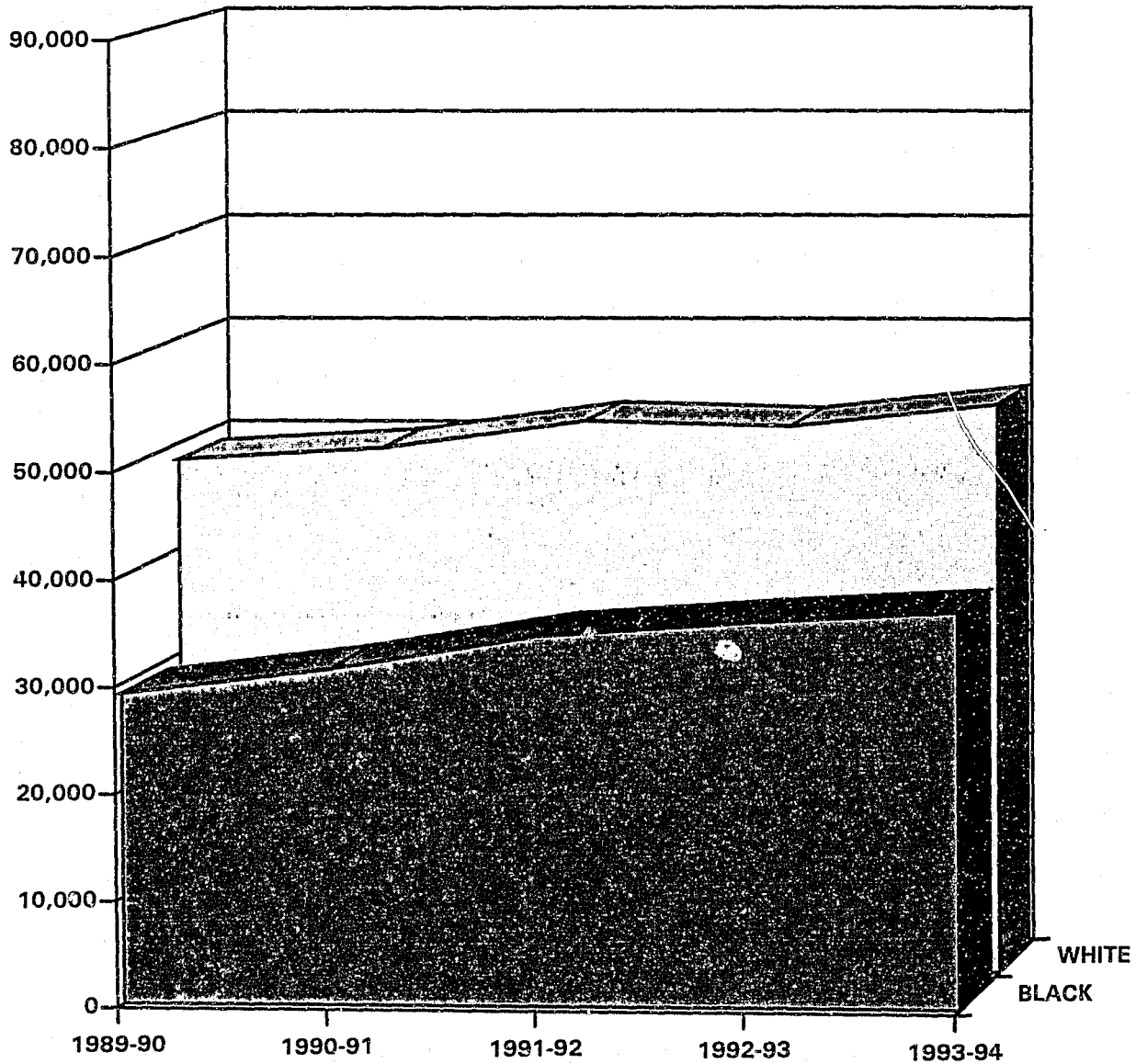

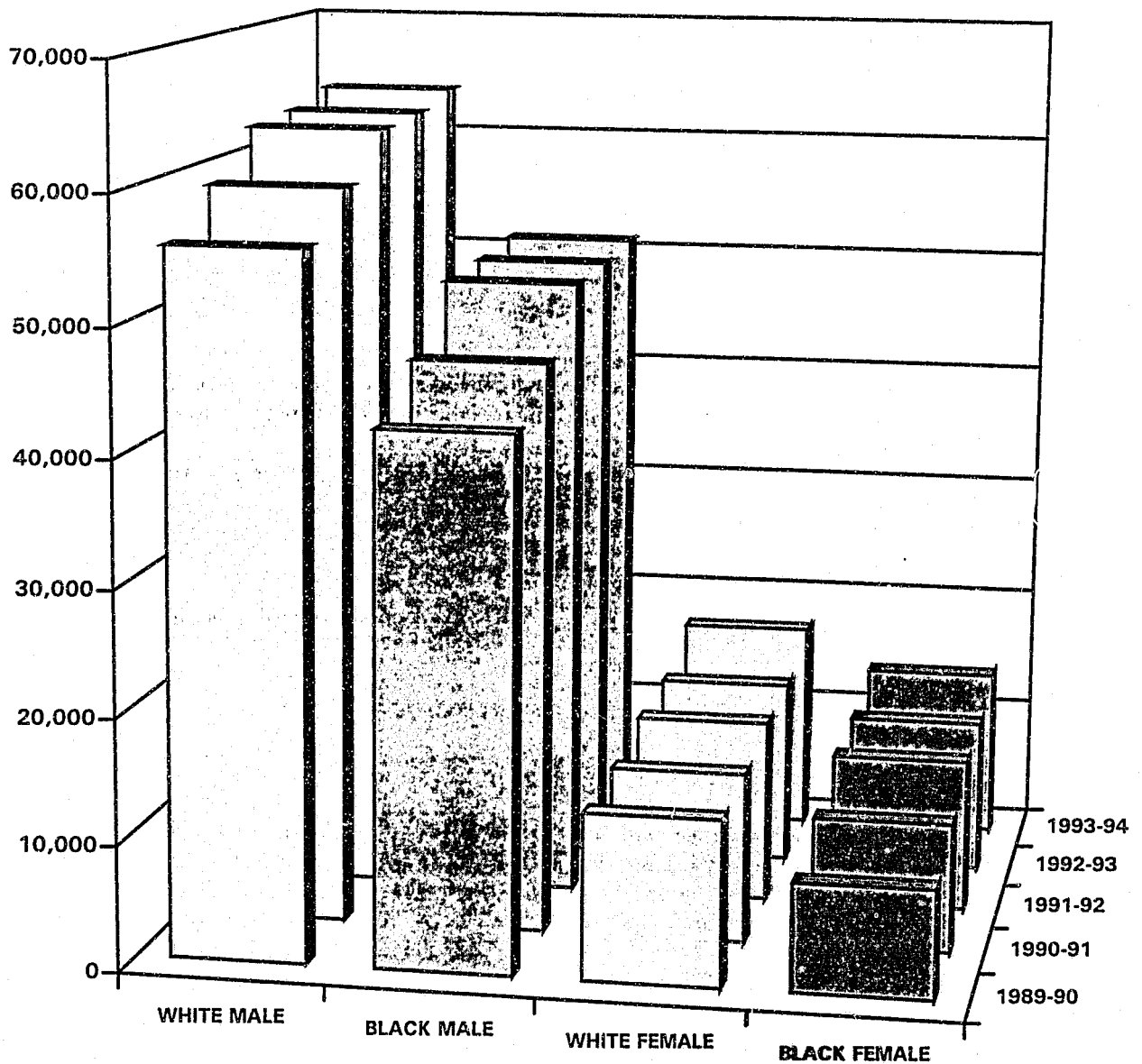

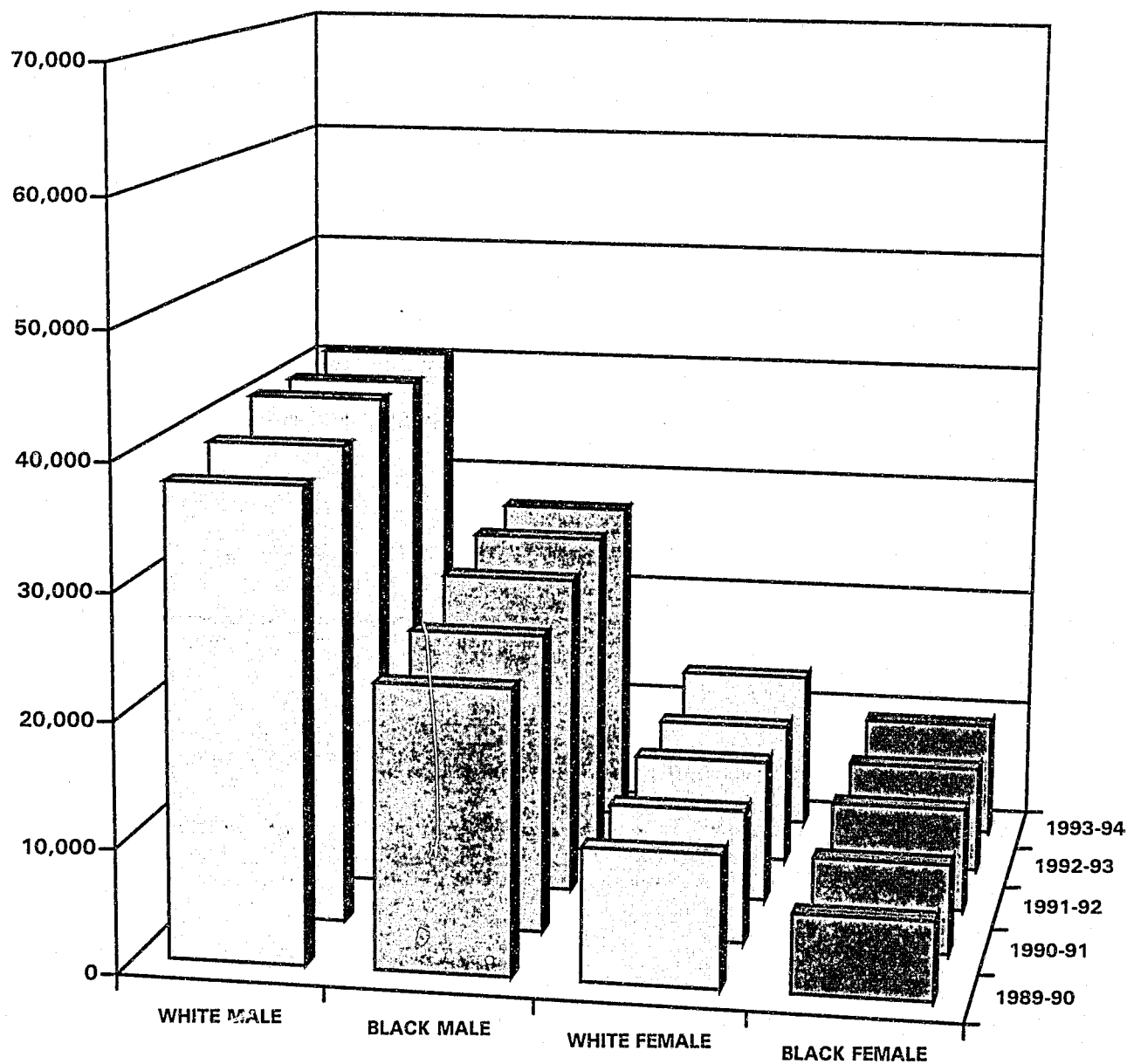

Notes on the Data

The data presented in this section are based upon case dispositions reported to the Client Information System (CIS) by delinquency workers throughout the state. "Non-judicial" disposition as presented here includes cases received and youths referred that for which the disposition of offenses did not require a judicial ruling on the status of the child as a delinquent. This may include those cases or youth which were "diverted" from the court with referrals to programs such as JASP (the Juvenile Alternative Services Program), as well as those referrals for which the plaintiff elected to drop the charges or for which the prosecution was unable to proceed due to insufficient evidence. It should be noted that many youths had both judicial and non-judicial dispositions during the years studied, and these youths are counted in both this section of the document and the next, which examines judicial dispositions. Some cases are counted in both sections also, since not all charges in each case are always disposed in the same way.

DELINQUENCY CASES AND YOUTHS HANDLED NON-JUDICIALLY

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

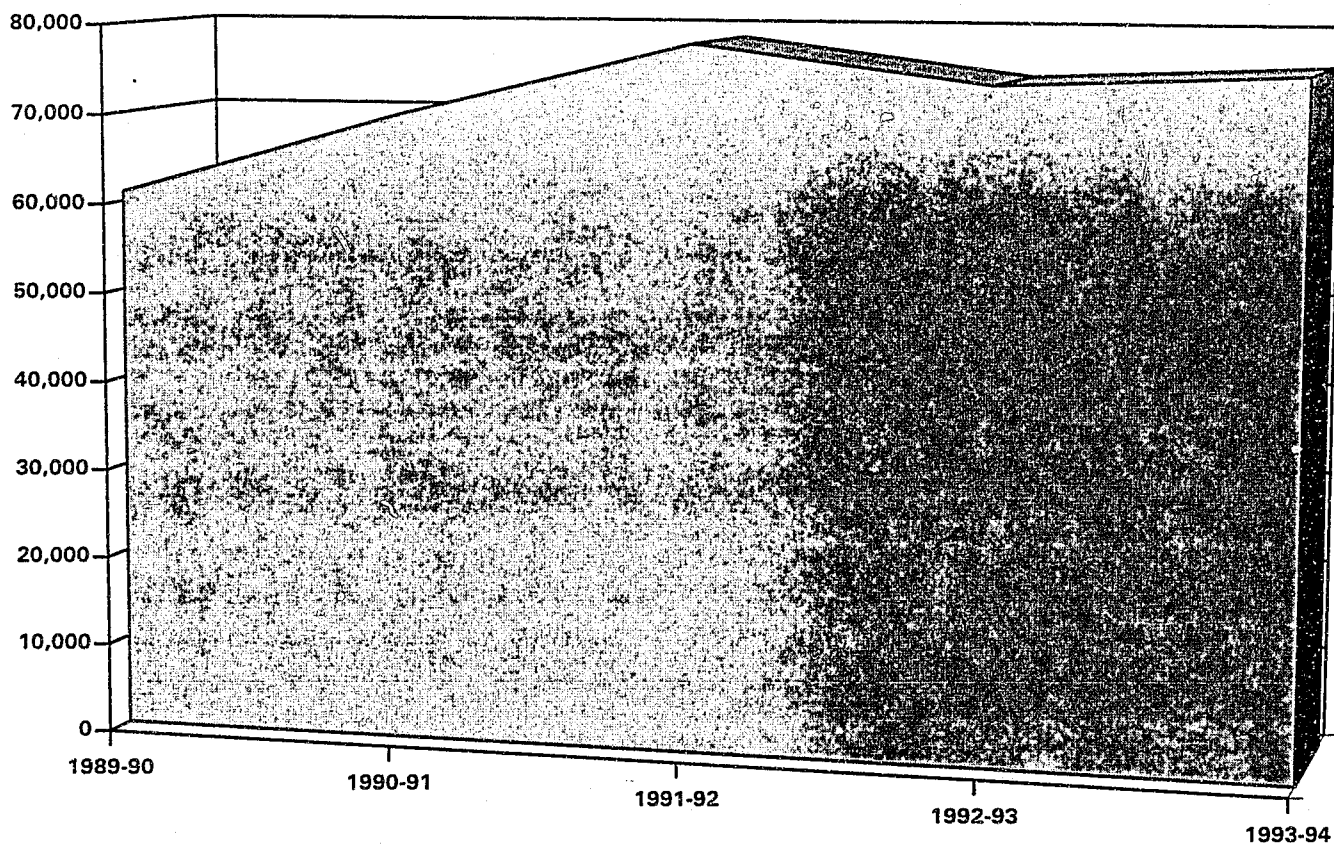
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- In 1993-94 total of 75,624 cases with non-judicial disposition was 24% higher than the 1989-90 count of 61,093. Since 1989-90 the total had risen as high as 78,354 in 1991-92; the 1993-94 tally was 2% higher than in 1992-93.
- The total number of youths with non-judicial dispositions increased by 21% over 1989-90 figures. Some of the youths may have had non-judicial handling during one year and judicial handling in other years.
- Of the cases with non-judicial dispositions, 33% were felonies in 1993-94, compared to 32% in 1989-90, with lesser offenses making up the balance of non-judicial dispositions.
- Burglary, auto theft and aggravated assault continue to be the most common felony charges for non-judicially disposed cases, accounting for 58% of the felony cases disposed non-judicially, and 56% of the youths that had non-judicial dispositions during 1993-94.
- The number of violent felonies disposed non-judicially in 1993-94 was 45% higher than in 1989-90, but the rate of year-to-year increase slowed from 29% between 1989-90 and 1990-91 to a 3% growth between 1991-92 and 1992-93, and actually declined 2% between 1992-93 and 1993-94.
- Shoplifting remains the most common misdemeanor charge for cases with non-judicial dispositions making up 29% of the total, up slightly from 28% in 1989-90. Shoplifting was the most serious offense of 31% of the youths with non-judicially disposed misdemeanors in 1993-94, up from 30% in 1989-90.

- Misdemeanor assault cases have gone from making up 14% of the non-judicially disposed misdemeanor cases in 1989-90 to 19% in 1993-94. Likewise, of those youths referred who had non-judicial dispositions in 1993-94, 19% were referred for misdemeanor assault as opposed to 14% in 1989-90.
- Since 1989-90 the number of delinquency cases with non-judicial dispositions for white males increased by 15%, while the number of white male youths increased 10%. The number of black male cases has increased by 27% and black male youths by 25%. The number of white female cases handled non-judicially went up 26%, the number of youths 24%. The number of black female cases increased 55%, while the number of black female youths increased 51%.

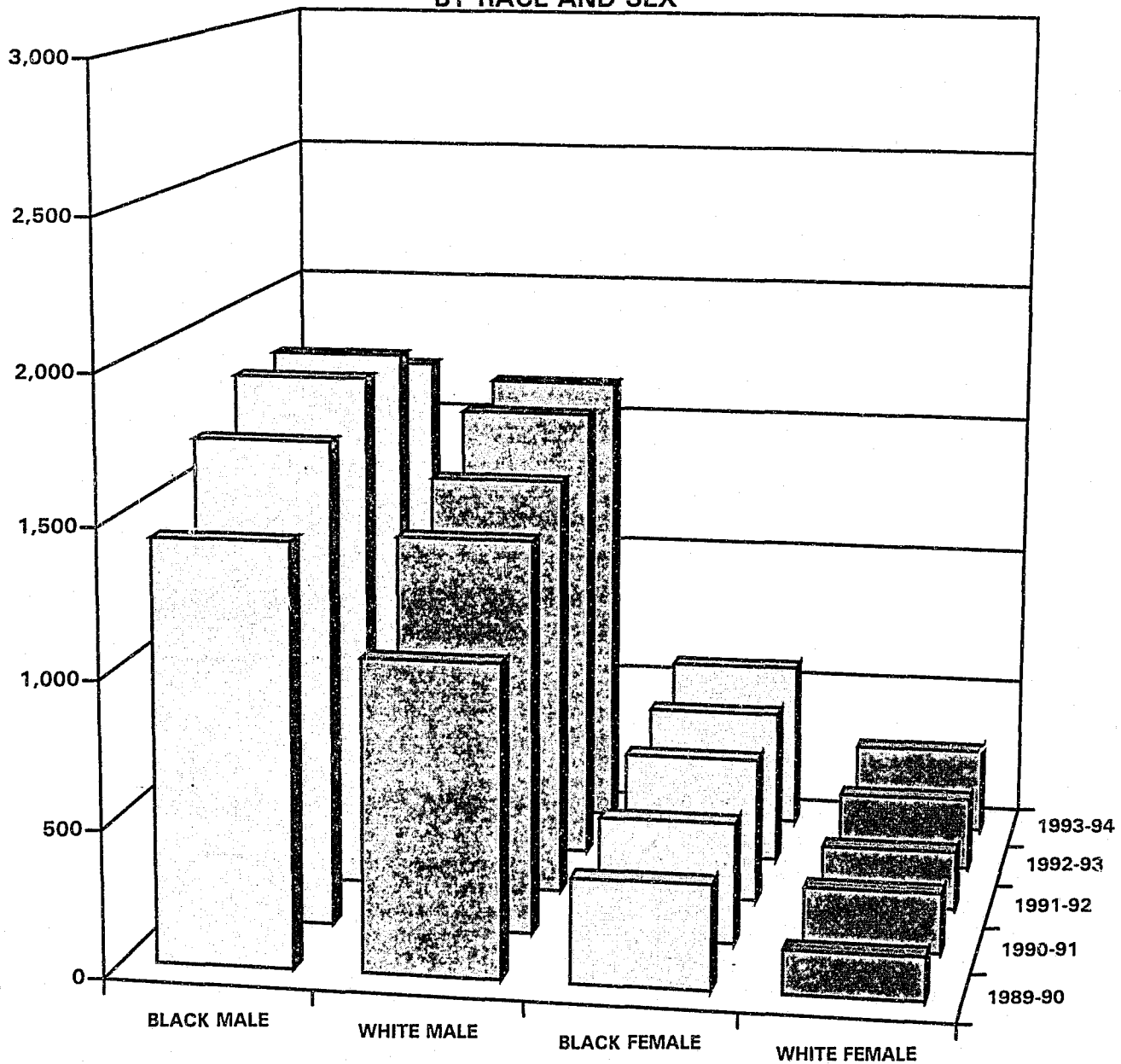

Notes on the Data

The data presented in this section are based upon case dispositions reported to the Client Information System (CIS) by delinquency workers throughout the state. "Judicial" disposition as presented here includes all charges that necessitated a judicial ruling on the status of the youth, as a delinquent, subsequent to a petition to the court by the state attorney. This includes those cases or youth which were not found delinquent by the judge in question, as well as those referrals which it was necessary for follow up by DJJ personnel (commitment to residential programs, community supervision, etc.). It should be noted that many youths had both judicial and non-judicial dispositions during the years studied, and these youths are counted in both this and the previous section of the document, which examines non-judicial dispositions. Some cases are counted in both sections also, since not all charges in each case are always disposed in the same way.

DELINQUENCY CASES AND YOUTHS WITH JUDICIAL DISPOSITIONS

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

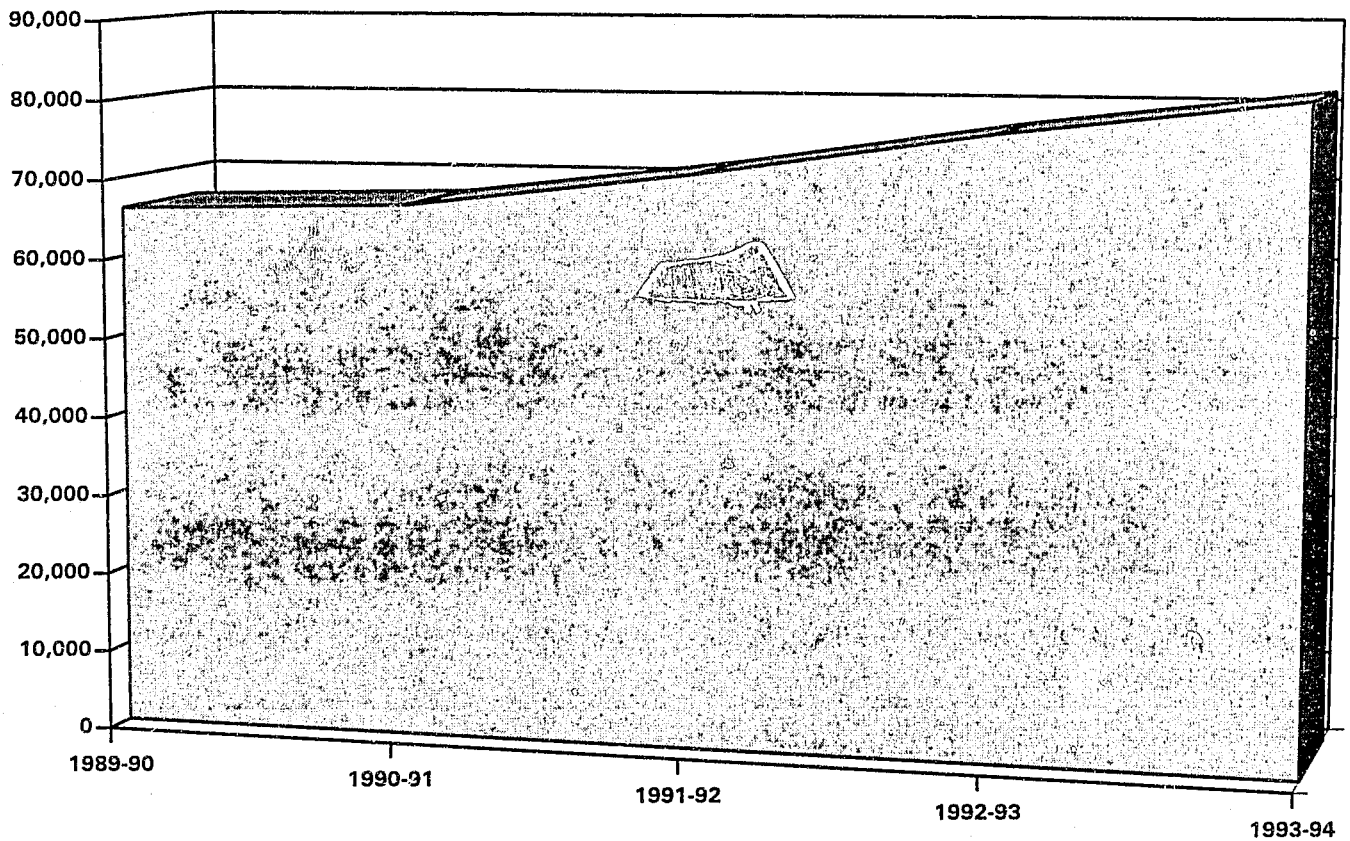
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- The total number of cases with judicial dispositions increased 23% between 1989-90 and 1993-94, from 66,155 to 81,361. The number of youths with judicial dispositions rose from 39,460 to 46,444, an 18% increase.
- In 1989-90, 53% of the cases with judicial dispositions were felonies, but by 1993-94 the proportion had fallen to 48%, and the majority of judicially handled cases were either misdemeanors or lesser offenses. Most of this change was in the "other offenses" category, which moved from 13% to 17% of the total. The bulk of this was due to the increase (from 5% to 8% of the total) of the number of cases that had been previously diverted from judicial handling, through programs such as JASP or community arbitration.
- The change in the proportion of youths with judicial dispositions during the 1993-94 year for felony referrals was slightly greater than the change in the number of cases, changing from 52% of the total in 1989-90 to only 46% of the total in 1993-94. Again, much of the change could be found in the number of youths whose cases were essentially being "reprocessed"; the number of youths whose cases had been previously diverted from the courtroom went from 6% to 9% of the total number of youths with judicial dispositions.
- As with the previous chapter on non-judicial handling, burglary, auto theft and aggravated assault have continued to be the most common felony charges for judicially disposed cases, accounting for the majority of the felony cases disposed judicially. However, in 1993-94 these offenses comprised only 58% of the total number of felony cases, down from 60% in 1989-90. Of the youths that had judicial dispositions during 1993-94, 54% had at least one judicially handled charge of burglary, auto theft or aggravated assault, down from 57% in 1989-90.

- Notably, the number of felony drug cases and youths appearing before the court for disposition has declined in recent years, from 10% of the cases and 11% of the youths in 1989-90 to 7% of the cases and 9% of the youths in 1993-94.
- Shoplifting remains the most common misdemeanor charge for cases with judicial dispositions with 25% of the total, up from 22% in 1989-90. This was followed by misdemeanor assault (21%) and trespassing (12%), both almost unchanged since 1989-90.
- Since 1989-90 the number of delinquency cases reported handled judicially for white males increased by 17%, while the number of white male youths increased 10%. The number of black male cases increased by 18% and black male youths by 16%. The number of white female cases with judicial dispositions went up 40%, the number of youths 29%. The number of black female cases increased 70%, while the number of black female youths increased 58%.
- In 1989-90, 47% of the youths with judicial dispositions were white males, 35% were black males, 9% were white females, and 7% were black females. In 1993-94, 44% were white males, 35% were black males, 10% were white females, and 10% were black females.

Notes on the Data

The data in this section consist of all cases and youths reported on the Client Information System (CIS) as being disposed with a referral to the JASP program, a network of private providers contracted with DJJ to provide community supervision of youths referred for delinquency. Most of the referrals to JASP are the result of non-judicial dispositions, but in some circumstances members of the judiciary order the referral of a youth to the program; both types of referral are reflected here. Counselors employed by the JASP contractor provide community supervision of the youths, who must ordinarily perform sanctions agreed upon by the youth, the provider and the state attorney at the time of case disposition.

DELINQUENCY CASES AND YOUTHS REFERRED TO JASP

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

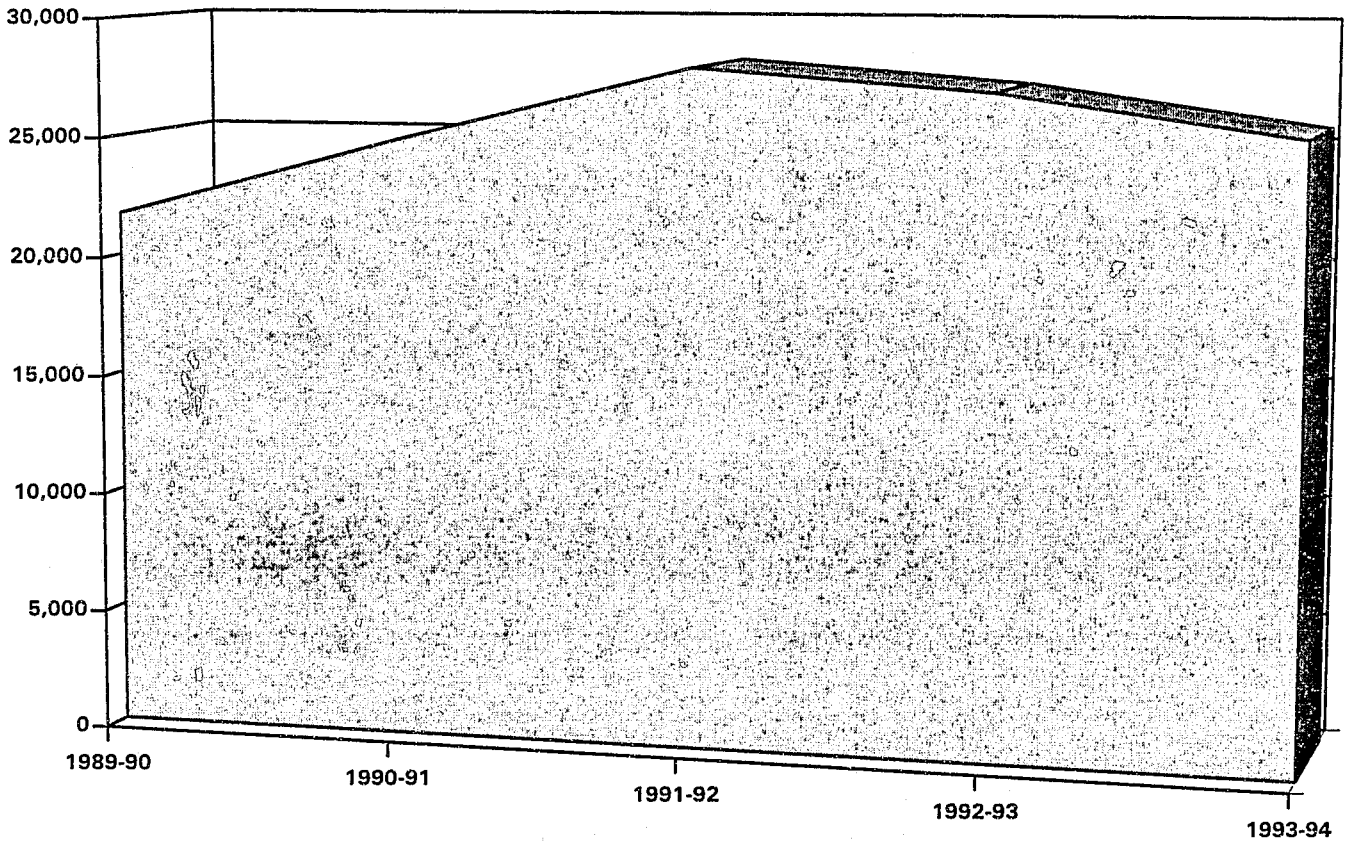
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- The number of cases referred to the Juvenile Alternative Services Program during 1993-94 was 18% higher than during 1989-90, but down 9% from 1991-92. The number of individual youths referred to JASP is 17% higher, but the 1993-94 total of 23,921 was down 8% from the peak year of 26,010 youths referred during 1991-92.
- The largest proportion of youths referred to JASP during the period of study have been misdemeanants, though about one third of the youths referred in 1993-94 were charged with felonies, compared to one fourth of the total during 1989-90.
- Shoplifting continues to be the most common specific offense for which cases are referred to JASP, accounting 26% of the cases referred in each of the last five fiscal years.
- Burglary continues to be the most common felony offense for which cases are referred to JASP, comprising 13% of the total and 41% of the felony cases referred. The number of youths referred for burglary (3,052) was 28% higher than in 1989-90, but down 15% from the peak year of 1992-93. More than 40% of the youths referred to JASP during the last five years for felonies are charged with burglary, though this has fallen from 46% to 41% of the category.
- The misdemeanor offenses with the most notable level of growth since 1989-90 in referrals to JASP are assault/battery and misdemeanor marijuana violations. There was a 35% increase in assault cases (down slightly since 1991-92) and a 52% expansion of misdemeanor marijuana cases. Combined, the two offenses accounted for 20% of the cases and youths referred to JASP for misdemeanors.

- Of note among the felony cases referred to JASP is the increase in auto theft referrals, which have increased 89% to 967 cases, or 873 youths statewide. The 1,101 youths that were referred to JASP for violent felonies was 51% higher in 1993-94 than in 1989-90, but down 17% from the 1992-93 peak of 1,331.
- The number of white male cases referred to JASP was 7% higher than 1989-90, while the number of black male cases was 23% higher. During this same period, the number of white female cases increased by 24% and black female cases increased by 42%. While the number of female cases referred has leveled off, the number of male cases has declined 13% over the last two years, and the total number of cases referred in 1993-94 was 13% below 1991-92.
- In 1989-90, 50% of the youths referred to JASP were white males, 23% were black males, 17% were white females, and 9% were black females. In 1993-94, 45% were white males, 25% were black males, 17% were white females, and 12% were black females.

CASES REFERRED TO JASP

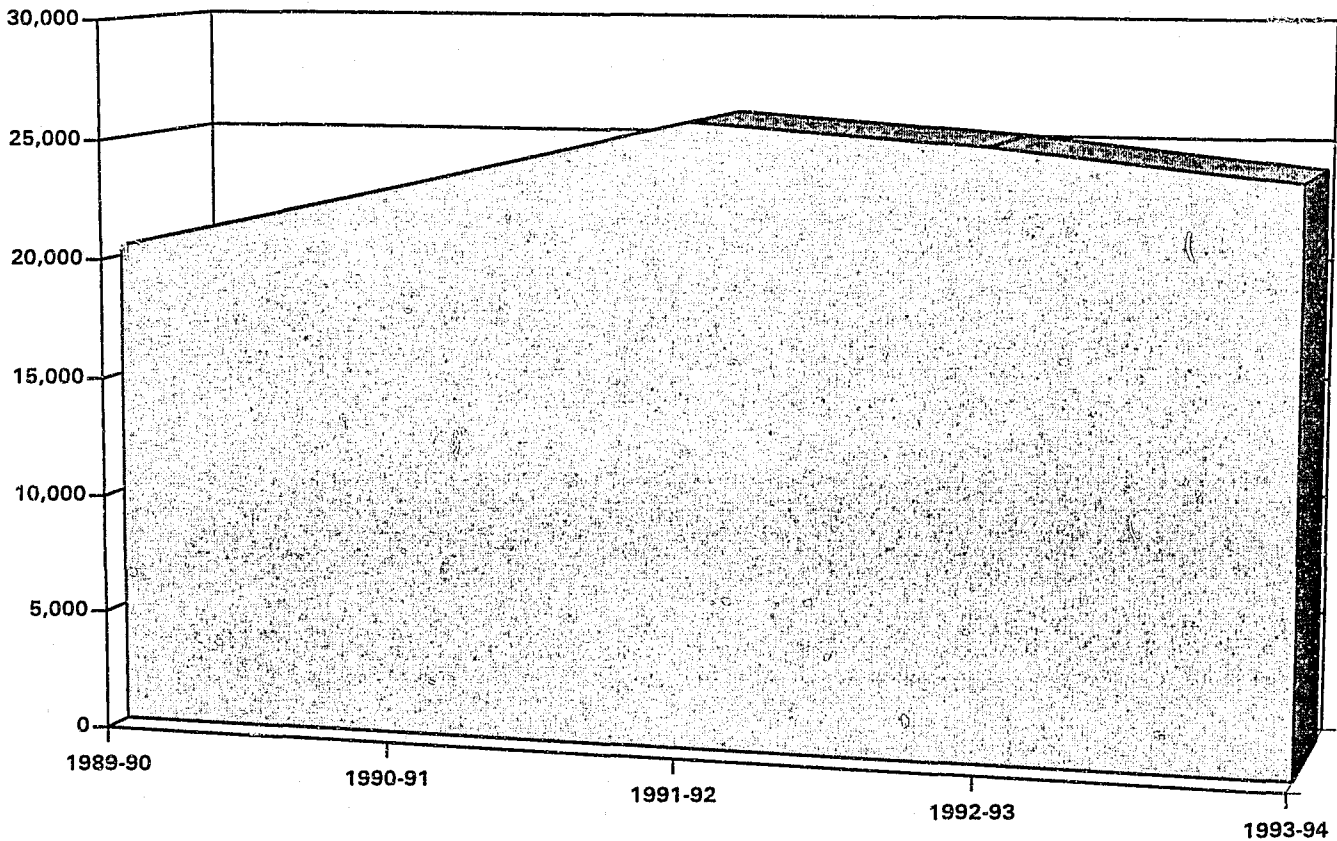

BY CATEGORY OF MOST SERIOUS CHARGE



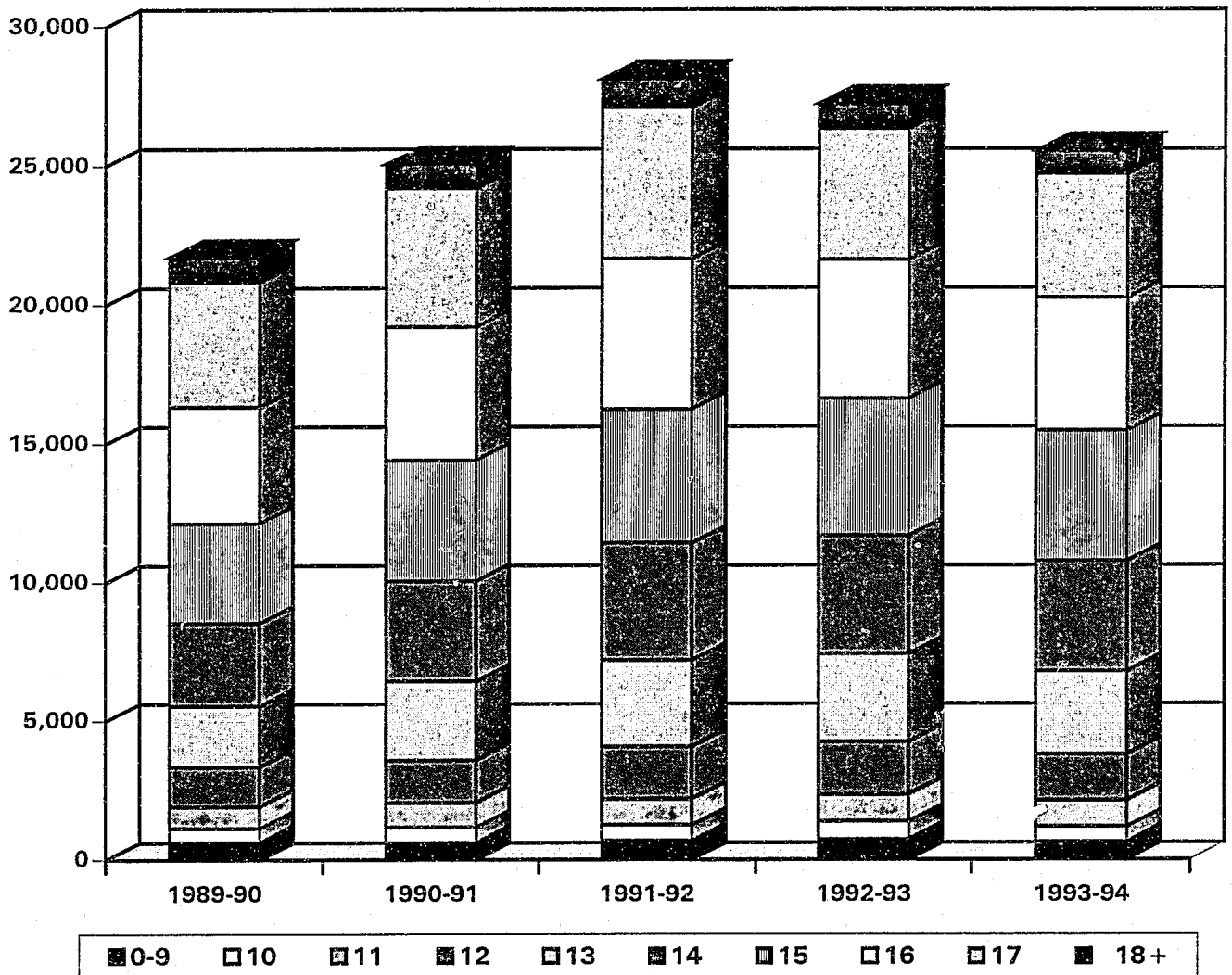

Notes on the Data

The data in this section consist of all cases and youths reported on the Client Information System (CIS) as being disposed with placement on Community Control, DJJ's primary method of community supervision. Youths are placed on Community Control by order of a judge, and DJJ case managers supervise the youth's performance of sanctions ordered at the time of placement. Community Control sanctions typically include but are not limited to community service work, curfew, school attendance, and victim restitution. When these sanctions are complete, the youth is released from supervision.

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

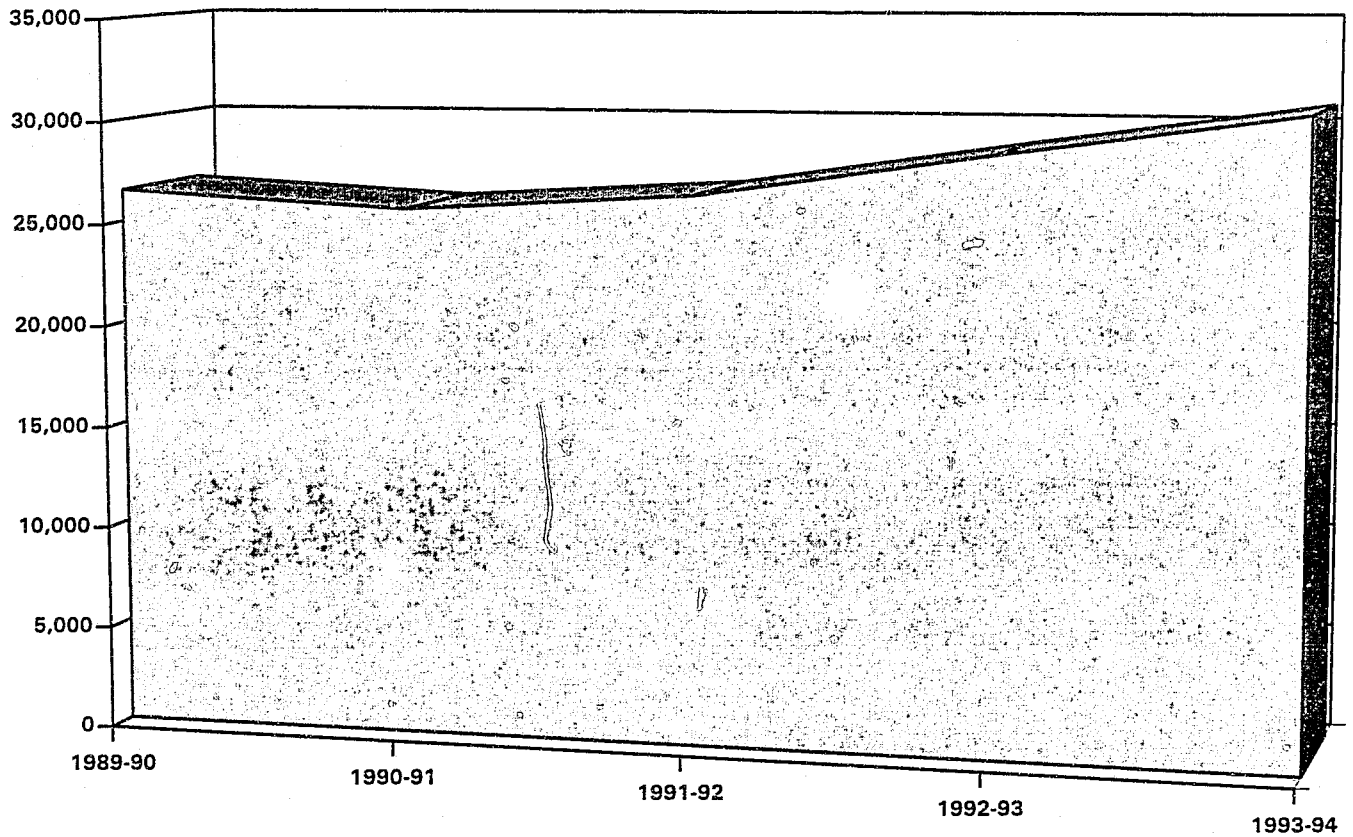

- Both the number of cases (30,795) disposed to and youths placed on (21,220) Community Control during 1993-94 were 16% higher than during 1989-90. Of note is the trend away from felony placements toward misdemeanors and lesser offenses; in 1989-90 50% of both youths and cases were for felony charges; by 1993-94 that had declined to 42% and 43%, respectively.
- Despite this trend, burglary continues to be the most common felony offense for which cases are disposed with placements to community control, comprising 16% of the total and 38% of the felony cases referred. The number of youths referred (3,174) for burglary, however, was 6% lower than in 1989-90. 36% of the youths placed on community control for felonies are charged with burglary, down only slightly from 1989-90.
- With 10% of the total and 24% of the misdemeanor cases, shoplifting continues to be the most common misdemeanor offense for which cases are disposed with placements to community control. Over the period of study, the number of shoplifting cases disposed to community control has increased 43% (from 2,046 to 2,932). The number of youths referred for shoplifting also increased 43%, from 1,410 to 2,021.
- Of note among the felony cases placed on community control is the decrease in auto theft cases, which have declined 15% despite a 2% increase in the number of auto theft cases disposed. The number of youths placed on community control for auto theft fell by 18%, from 1,197 to 977. Conversely, the number of youths placed on community control for violent felonies grew by 15% (from 1,680 to 1,939) though these youths comprised 9% of the total number of placements on community control during both years.

- Also of note among felony cases disposed to community control was the 33% decline in the number of non-marijuana felony drug cases, from 1,119 to 750. Meanwhile, the number of marijuana felonies increased 56%, from 124 to 194 cases.
- The number of white male cases placed on community control was 11% higher than 1989-90, while the number of black male cases was 13% higher. During this same period, the number of white female cases increased by 33% and black female cases increased by 53%. While the number of male cases increased 11% during the five-year period, the number of female cases jumped by 42%, from 3,855 to 5,485.
- In 1989-90, 49% of the youths placed on community control were white males, 34% were black males, 9% were white females, and 7% were black females. In 1993-94, 47% were white males, 33% were black males, 10% were white females, and 9% were black females.

CASES PLACED ON COMMUNITY CONTROL

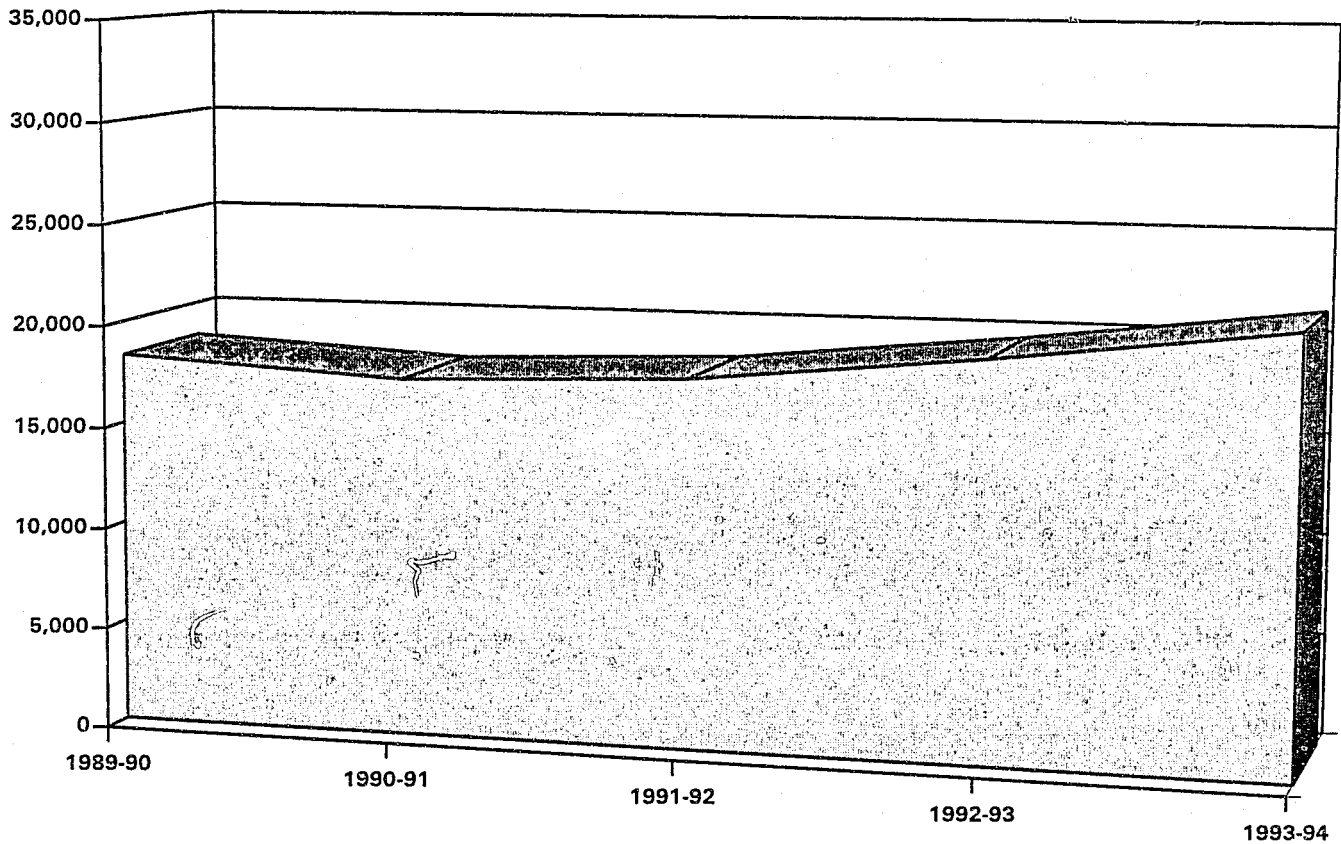

BY CATEGORY OF MOST SERIOUS CHARGE



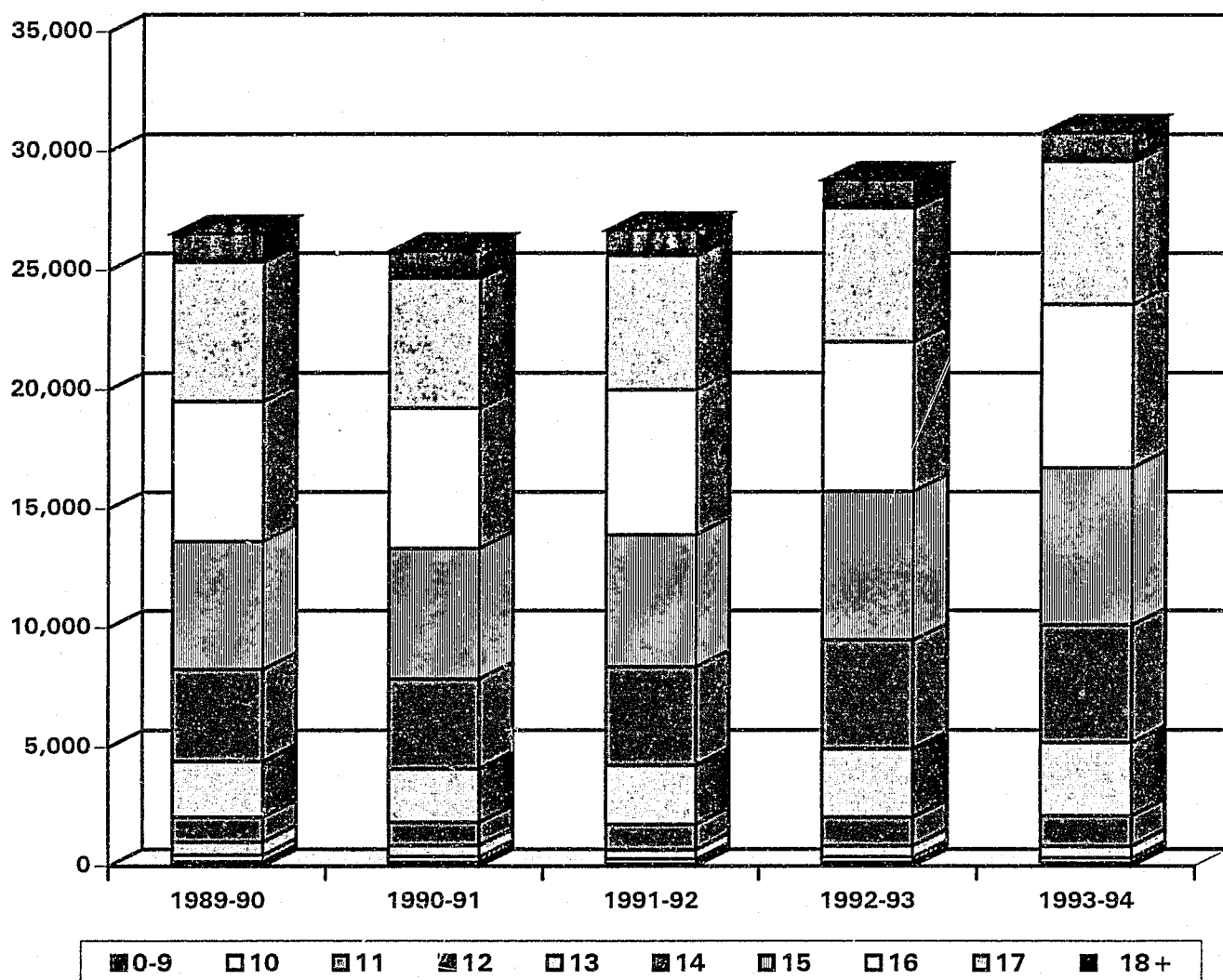

Notes on the Data

The data in this section consist of all placements of youths reported on the Florida Assessment, Classification and Tracking System (FACTS) in commitment programs either contracted with or managed by the Department of Juvenile Justice. These programs range from day-treatment programs such as local Marine Institutes for less serious offenders to secure training schools and boot camps for more severe juvenile offenders.

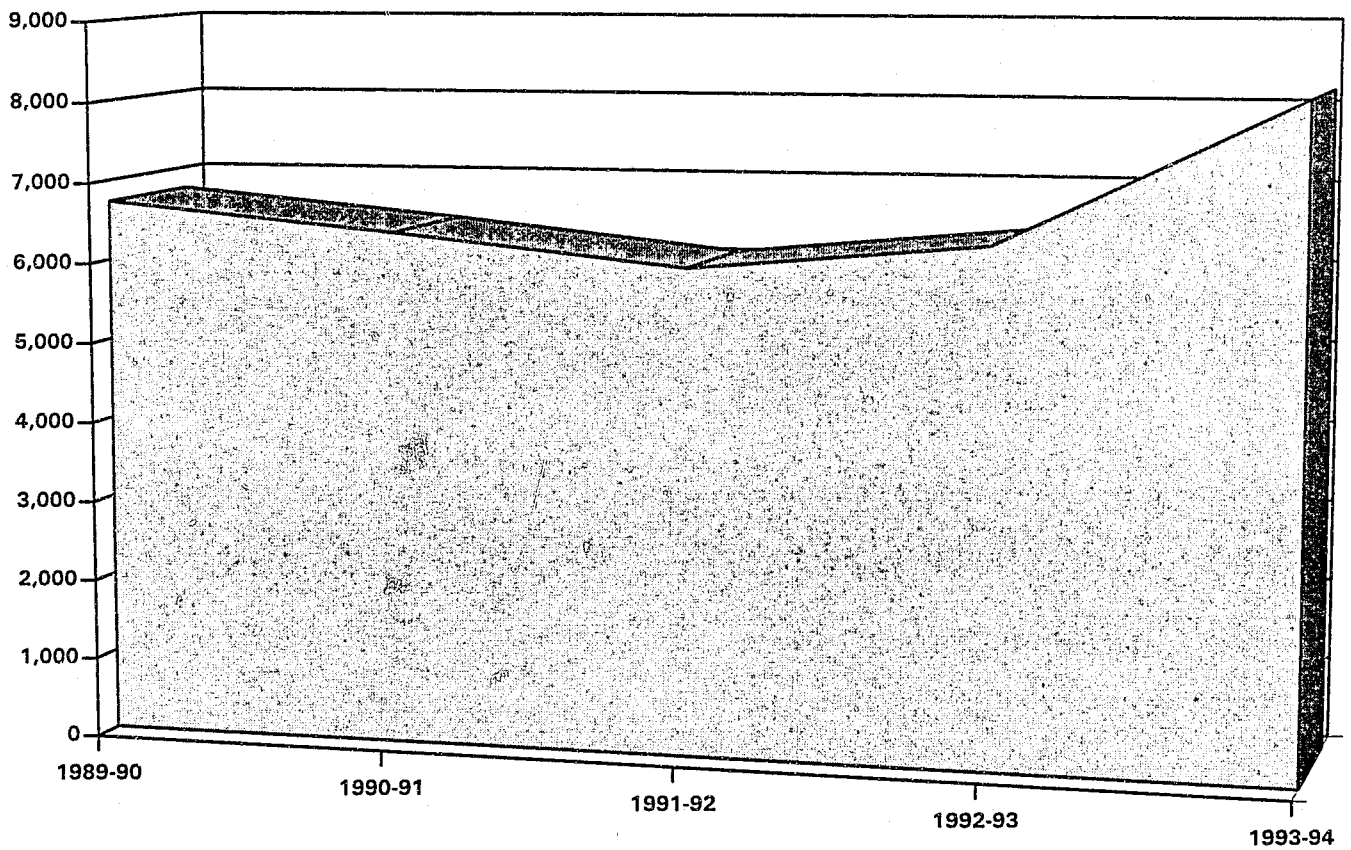
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- The number of commitments to delinquency programs during 1993-94 was 21% higher than the number during 1989-90, rising from 6,735 to 8,168. Most of this increase came during the last year, a 28% jump from 1992-93.
- The number of youths committed changed from 5,980 to 7,330, an increase of 23%. Many youths were committed more than once during the year, and the 8,168 commitments in 1993-94 were distributed among a these 7,330 youths. Despite the strong growth, committed youths were less than one half of one percent of the estimated 1,281,913 total Florida population aged 10-17.
- The proportion of commitments for felony offenses was 67% during 1993-94, almost unchanged from the 68% ratio of 1989-90. The number of misdemeanor commitments increased by 33% over the period, but the proportion of the total commitments that were for misdemeanors only rose from 19% to 21% of the total.
- Burglary continues to be the most common commitment offense, constituting about 24% of the total and well over a third of felony commitments. The only other offense with more than ten percent of the total commitments in 1993-94 was "non-law violation of community control," at 12% of the total.

- The number of commitments of white males rose by 40% during the period, moving from 35% to 41% of the total. Though the total number of black male commitments increased 5%, the proportion of the total dropped from 55% to 47%. The number of white female commitments increased by 37% while the black female cases increased by 52%, though both were only 6% each of the total commitments, up from 5% each in 1989-90.
- Of the 7330 youths committed during 1993-94, 41% were white males, 46% were black males, 6% were white females and 6% were black females.

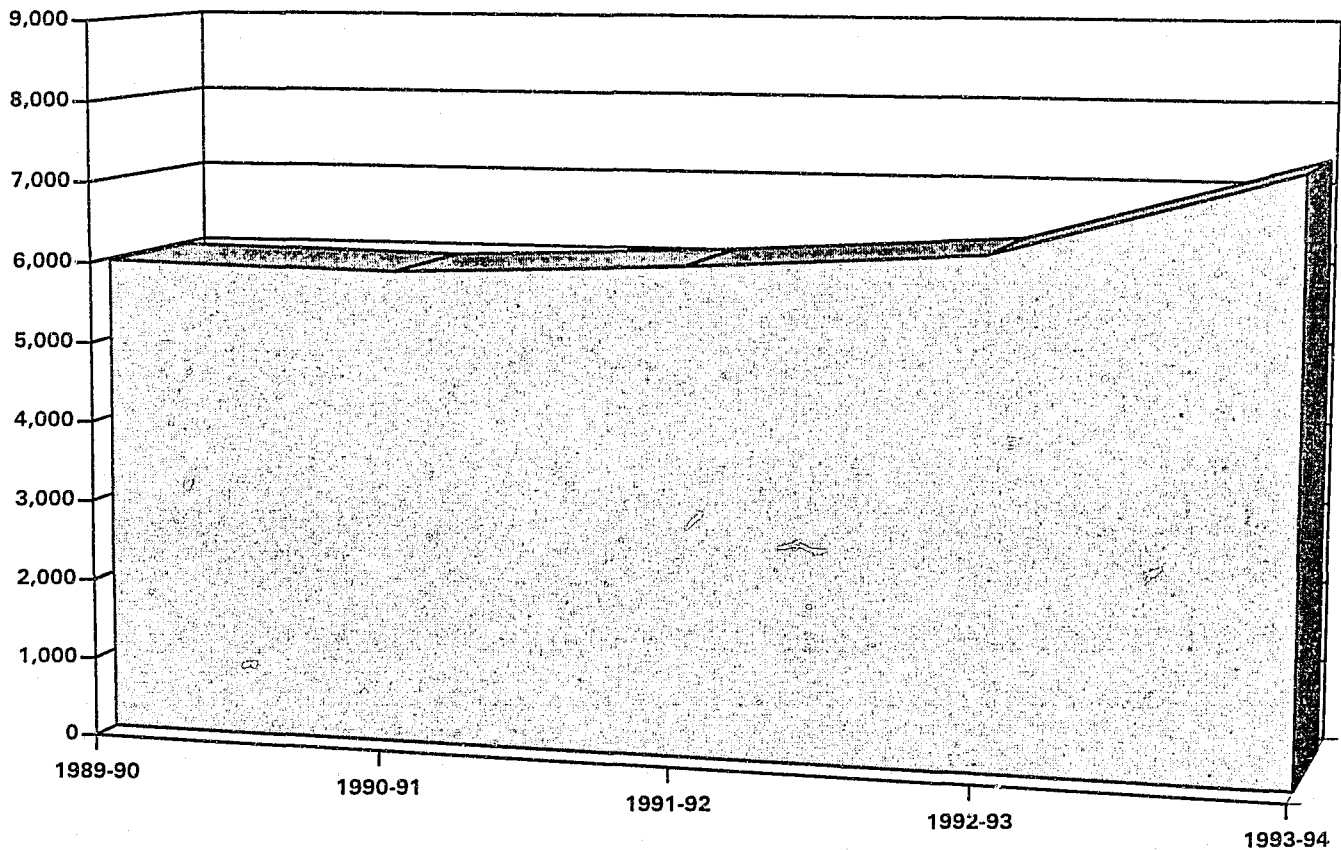

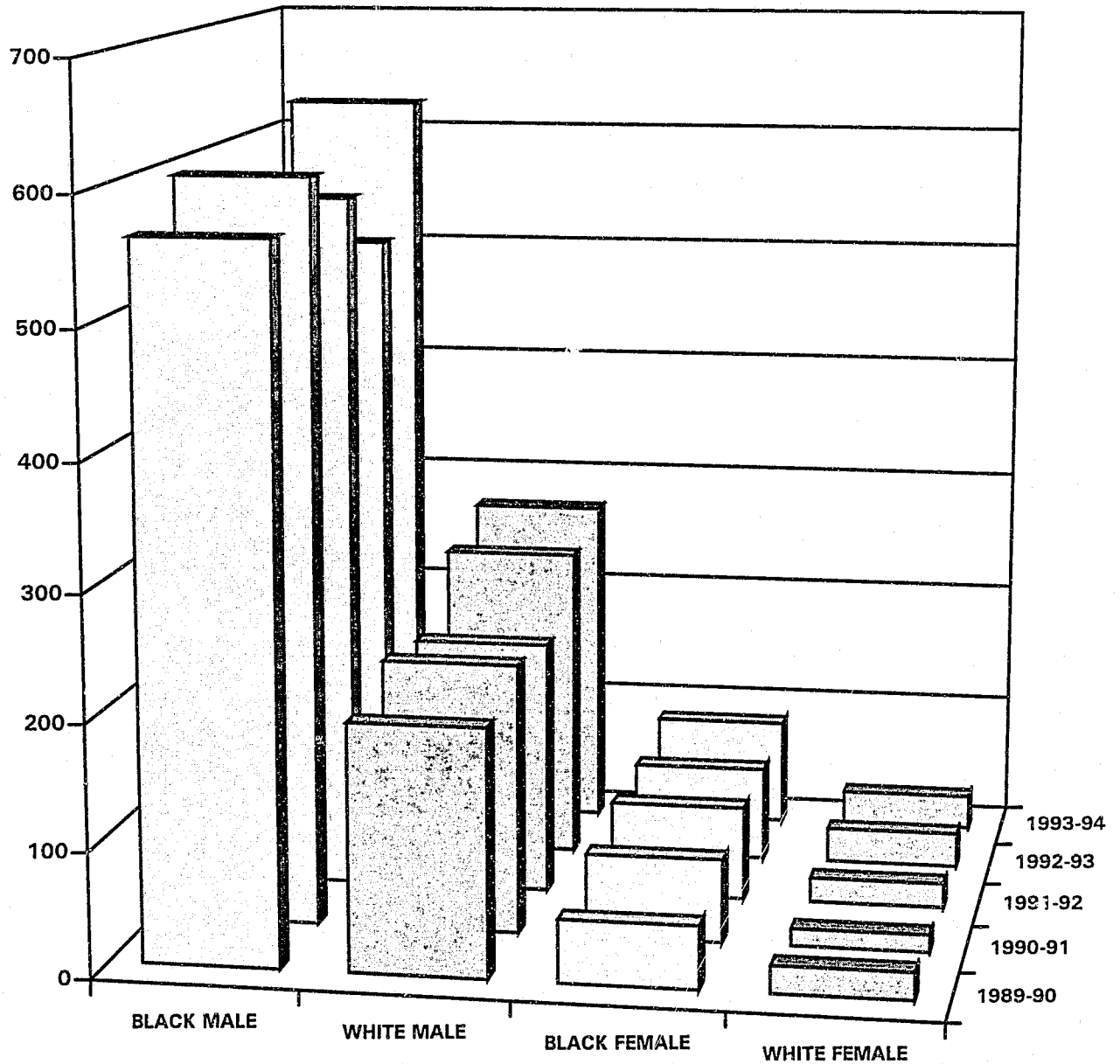

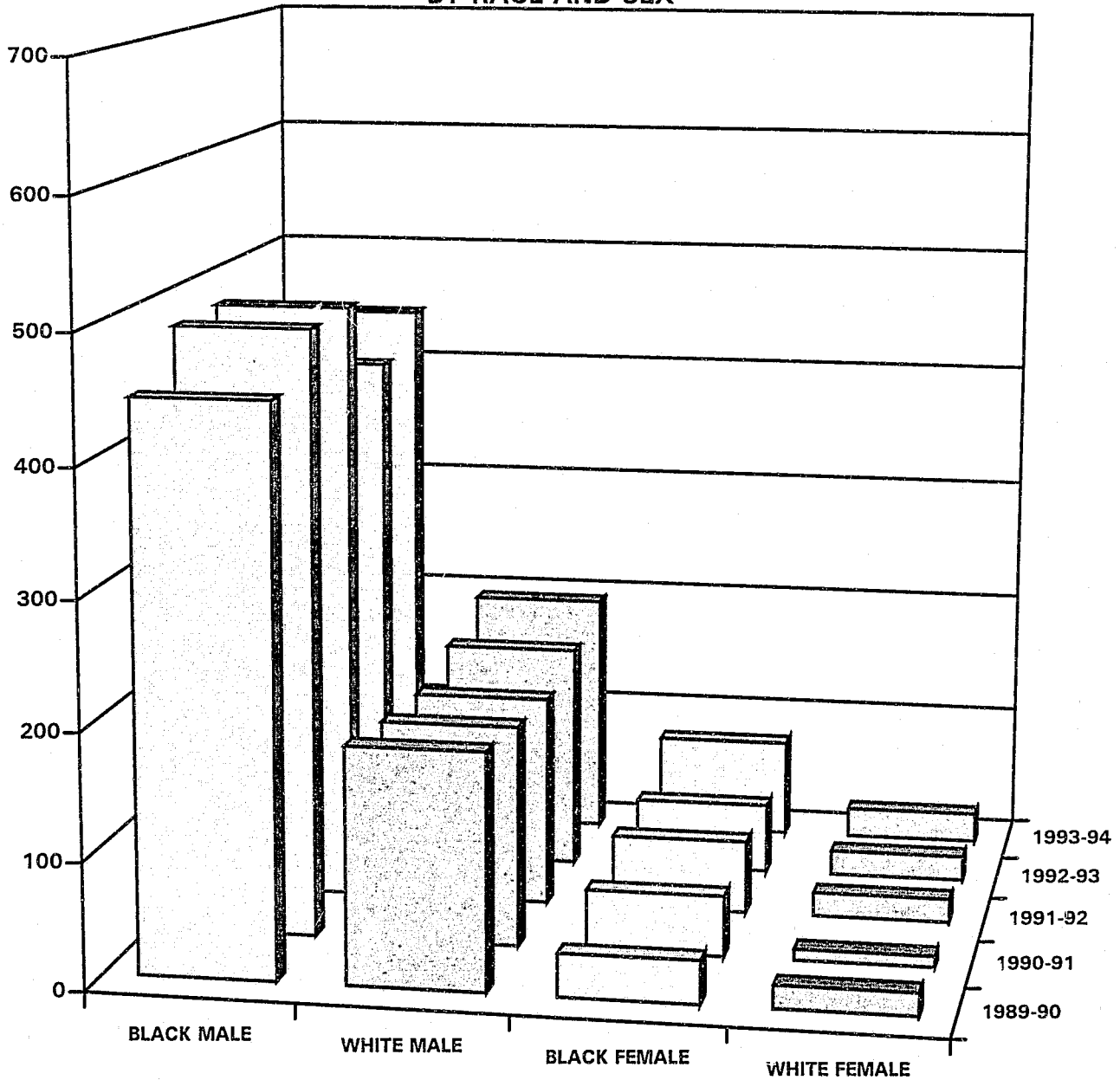
COMMITMENTS FOR VIOLENT FELONIES STATEWIDE BY RACE AND SEX

Notes on the Data

The data in this section consist of all cases and youths reported on the Client Information System (CIS) as having jurisdiction transferred for disposition in the state's adult courts. Juvenile offenders may be transferred for adult court processing in three ways: direct filing of a bill of information by the state attorney, waiver of jurisdiction by a juvenile court judge, or indictment by a grand jury. The total number of such transfers as recorded by CIS have been compared with counts compiled by the Office of the State Court Administrator, and comparisons of these figures with CIS data indicate 98 and 99 percent agreement. Transfer of jurisdiction does not necessarily indicate a finding of guilt by the adult court.

Comparisons between 1989-90 and 1993-94 Figures

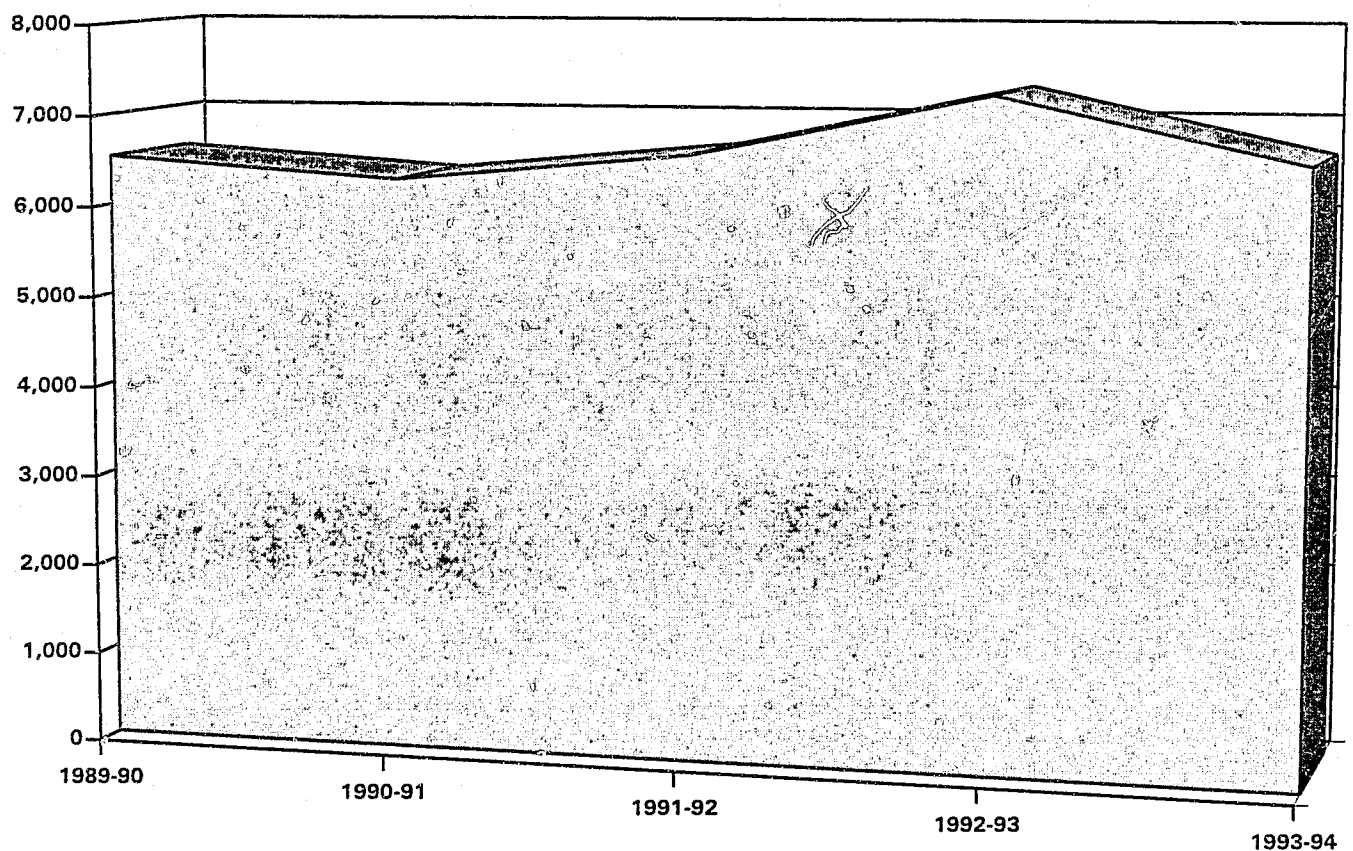
(Based upon the most serious offense)

- The number of cases and youths transferred from juvenile to adult courts for disposition was only 1% higher in 1993-94 (6,603) than in 1989-90 (6,537), though it should not be overlooked that the number of cases peaked in 1992-93 at 7,308, an 11% drop within the last year. The number of youths transferred was 4,642, a 6% decline from the 1992-93 total of 4,943.
- The proportion of cases transferred to adult court for felony charges remained relatively constant, between 82% and 84%.
- Burglary continued to be by far the most common charge for which cases were transferred to adult court, constituting 22% of all such cases in 1993-94.
- Four other types of felony offense comprised an additional 40% of the total number of cases transferred; robbery (14%), felony drug offenses (10%), auto theft and aggravated assault (8% each).
- Most of the balance of the transfers were distributed among other felony offenses, with misdemeanors and lesser offenses accounting for only 17% of the total. 26% of the misdemeanor cases transferred to adult court for disposition were for charges of assault.

- The number of white male cases transferred to adult court in 1993-94 was 5% higher than 1989-90, while the number of black male cases was 4% lower. The number of white female cases was down 2% and up by 30% for black females.
- In 1989-90, 41% of the youths transferred to adult court were white males, 52% were black males, 3% were white females, and 3% were black females. In 1993-94, 42% were white males, 50% were black males, 3% were white females, and 4% were black females.

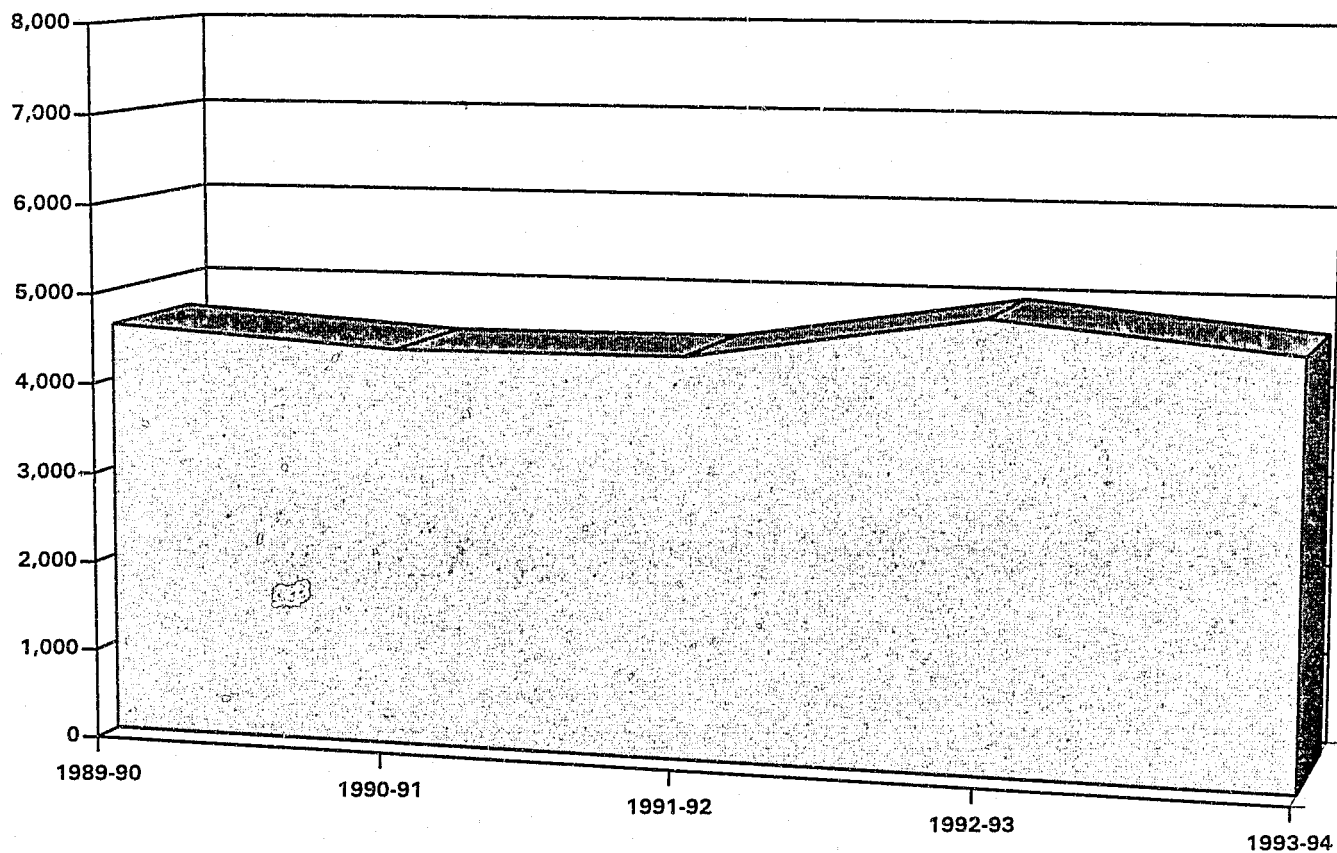
