#### 1994 COMMUNITY SERVICE ANNUAL REPORT

#### GENERAL SUMMARY

The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction has achieved another record year of 622,154 inmate community service hours. This represents an increase of 112,019 hours over 1993 totals. The Voinovich Administration continues to endorse this worthwhile initiative that provides our inmates the opportunity to give something back to the community in a very positive way.

In using the federal minimum wage as a general guide, DRC inmates provided approximately 2.6 million dollars of in-kind services in 1994 to charitable, non-profit and governmental entities.

Since 1991 when statistical tracking of inmate community service was developed, 1,636,693 hours of service have been volunteered through the end of 1994. If federal minimum wage standards were again applied, DRC inmates have contributed 6.9 million dollars of inkind services over these years. Range of services and recipients can be categorized follows:

COMMUNITY:

Inmates in this category are involved in performing various work for charitable and non-profit organizations. Activities include: Building maintenance and renovation of housing and other types of building structures; Ribbon cutting for M.A.D.D. and other organizations; Toys for Tots program; Brailling text books, instructions, games - Recording Talking Books for public schools and Ohio Vision Services; Growing gardens to help feed hungry people; Expanded art work from several prisons supported worthy community programs including needs of homeless people and foster children; Juvenile offender programs.

GOVERNMENT: Inmates in this category perform many kinds of maintenance/clean-up/painting/repair of public buildings and grounds. This category includes also projects performed in partnership with other state agencies such as litter crews for ODOT and animal/vegetation shelters for ODNR.

SCHOOLS/ EDUCATION:

Inmates have performed many services including painting of classrooms, refinishing of school desks, making a variety of hands-on student learning aids such as geo boards and attribute blocks, and maintenance/repair of school athletic facilities. This category includes the Adopt-A-School program. Every prison, except the newest ones, has adopted one or more schools.

The 11,374 cumulative inmates for 1994 represents a slight drop from 1993. The institutions seem to be developing on-going community service projects that increase the hours for approximately the same number of available inmates in the labor pool. If institutional goals for 1995 are met, a significant increase in both numbers of inmates and hours will result.

The Pilot Dog training program started at the Ohio Reformatory for Women in 1993 developed into an on-going program at ORW as well as at the Franklin Pre-Release Center during 1994. This program has provided Pilot Dogs, Inc. with stable and dependable inmate volunteers to provide important initial puppy training inside the institution. ORW's inmates Spratz and Hutchinson have led the "Top 100" list of inmates for the second year largely because of their volunteer assignment to pilot dog training. This is an outstanding newer program that has the potential of being replicated at other institutions.

Another inside the institution program that continues at almost every Ohio prison is the juvenile offender program. Program names vary such as DeTour, C.A.P.S., CheckMate, R.A.Y. and Project F.U.T.U.R.E. However, all of them have one purpose: to turn errant young people away from a likely future life of crime and adult incarceration. These programs have been praised by juvenile judges, community and school leaders. Every institution should continue and, if possible, expand this effort.

Institutions with correctional camps maintained a strong focus in 1994 on maintenance, repair and clean-up kinds of projects for schools, local government, community non-profits, and other community entities. Correctional camp inmates and their supervisors have been DRC's "visible good neighbor ambassadors" as they have traveled daily into the communities to give something very positive back to Ohio taxpayers.

With the service initiative of the Camp Reams program, Southeastern Correctional led DRC for the third consecutive year in numbers of inmates and hours. SCI is recognized for its utilization of the boot camp intensive labor program that has provided continuing cost saving cleaning and maintenance projects for the Lancaster city/Fairfield/Perry/Hocking county areas

With the attention given to contributions by inmates, it must be remembered that many institutional staff have been responsible daily to organize and supervise the wide range of community activities inside and outside the institutions. The Deputy-Wardens of TIE, Job Coordinators, and TIE Secretaries have played a key role in coordination, monitoring and data collection.
