RESEARCH PROGRAM ON JUVENILES TAKEN INTO CUSTODY

Final Progress Report: May 15, 1989 - June 30, 1993

Accomplishments

During this grant period, NCCD moved the collection of state data on Juveniles Taken Into Custody (JTIC) from six original test states (CA, TX, IL, OH, NY, NJ) to a total of 35 states (see attached charts). Under the guidance of the JTIC Advisory Committee and officials at OJJDP, NCCD completed annual reports detailing and analyzing the data collected. NCCD also convened a State Juvenile Corrections Systems Reporting Program (SJCSRP) data providers' conference, which has become an annual event.

Project activities completed included:

- recruitment of new automated and manual state data providers;
- recruitment of states to provide aggregated admissions and release data;
- gathering and recoding of data submissions from the automated states;
- drafting and editing of annual data reports;
- conducting on-site technical assistance visits to orient new data providers;
 and
- communication and progress reports to OJJDP.

In addition to these project activities, NCCD also participated in the dissemination of information gathered. Examples of this include an information exchange with the National Center on Juvenile Justice and publication of an NCCD Focus on the State Juvenile Corrections Systems Reporting Program and the results of its prevalence research.

NCCD has submitted an application for continuation of the Research Program to OJJDP and has received requesed clarifications and modifications from OJJDP. At the close of this third quarter NCCD was awaiting verbal notification of the start date for the continuation.
