



This third annual report compiled by the Criminal Justice Data Center contains two law enforcement actively indicators: a summation of arrests made in 1973; and, the first annual report of the "Offenses Known to Police" data system which was instituted in 1973.

This data indicates the amount of crime in Montana and the relative volume of law enforcement activity in apprehending criminals. Although this information is useful in planning a more effective approach to the crime problem, in no way can - or should it - be used as a measure of police effectiveness or over-all activity.

OFFENSES KNOWN TO THE POLICE

Statewide reporting of offenses known to the police began January 1, 1973. The system is similar to the FBI Uniform Crime Report but more complete in the number of agencies reporting (124 compared to an estimated 80 which report to the FBI). This is 93.5 percent of all law enforcement agencies as compared to the FBI base of approximately 78 percent. The state system also includes other felonies and high misdemeanors as well as the seven major crimes included in the FBI report.

The tables on the following pages show the totals for the seven major crimes (Illustration 1) and for other felonies and high misdemeanors (Illustration 2).

A total of 25,713 major crimes were reported in 1973. As this was the first year of reporting, valid comparisons to previous years are difficult to make. The 1972 Uniform Crime Report shows a total of 13,853 crimes. However, the apparent large increase is attributable to a variance in the method of larceny reporting. The 1972 FBI Uniform Crime Report total of 5,906 larcenies includes only those involving \$50 or more. The 1973 state total of 15,754 includes all larcenies regardless of amount.

PROPERTY CRIMES

The incidence of property crimes, other than larceny, remained relatively stable according to the 1972 FBI and 1973 state report. Burglary increased from a reported 5,092 in 1972 to 5,501 in 1973. Similarly, auto theft decreased from 1,776 reported in 1972 to 1,687 in 1973. As mentioned previously, the variance in the type of larceny reported makes meaningful comparisons impossible.



VIOLENT CRIMES

Substantial increases in each type of violent crimes are apparent from a comparison of 1972 and 1973 totals. Reported murders and non-negligent manslaughter increased from 18 in 1972 to 48 in 1973 - an increase of 166 percent. Rape, robbery and assault demonstrated similar increases as shown in Illustration 3.

CRIMES OF VIOLENCE

CRIME INDEX FACTORS

To evaluate the extent of Montana's crime problem in comparison to more and less populated areas, a crime index is used. The index table summarized in Illustration 4 on the following page lists the actual number of offenses calculated with the current total population to reach an approximate occurrence rate per 100,000.

The crime index for the seven major offenses is 3,409.3 per 100,000. For all serious crime including arson, non-aggravated assaults, vice and drug crimes the index rises to 4,522.7. Larceny and burglary are the most frequent crimes with an index of 2,185 and 763 respectively followed by vandalism at 432.9.

With the exception of larceny the index for each crime is well below 1,000. This means that each Montanan has less than 1 in 100 chances of being the victim of a serious crime.

CRIME CLOCKS

Illustration 5 on page 8 shows the frequency with which crimes occur in Montana. A serious crime occurs every 16 minutes and one of the seven major crimes every 21 minutes.

However, property crimes are more frequent (occurring every 23 minutes) than violent crimes which occur once every 5 hours.

A graphic illustration of the extent of frequency of each of the seven major offenses is contained in Illustration 6 and 7 on pages 10 and 11.

CLEARANCE RATE

The clearance number in the broadest sense shows the number of offenses for which law enforcement activity is completed. It does not necessarily mean that an arrest has been made and prosecution instituted. Provision also is made for reporting those offenses cleared in which either sufficient evidence is not available to charge an offender or prosecution for some reason - such as lack of victim cooperation - has been declined. Generally, the clearance figure indicates that number of crimes for which the offender is known to police.

As the graph in Illustration 8 shows, the clearance rate for violent crime is much higher than that for crimes against property. Nearly three quarters of all murders, manslaughters, and assaults are cleared by arrest while less than one-fifth of burglaries and larcenies are solved.






Violent Crimes (Murder, Rape, Robbery, Assault) One every 5 hours.

Serious Crimes (Burglary, Larceny, Vehicle Theft) One every 23 minutes.




All Felony & Misdemeanors One every 16 minutes.

JUVENILE ARRESTS

The final column of Illustration 1 and 2 pages 3 and 4 shows the number of offenses cleared by arrest of a juvenile under 18. One-half of the burglary and auto thefts cleared were by arrest of a juvenile under 18. Twelve of 23 arson offenses and more than one-half of the vandalism cases also were attributed to juveniles. However, less than half of narcotic clearances concerned the arrest of a juvenile.

This clearance rate may show that juveniles engage in theft and destruction more frequently than adults. However, an alternate conclusion, that juvenile offenders are less able to conceal their crimes and, consequently, are more easily apprehended also is possible.

VICE

It is interesting to note that all prostitution and commercialized vice offenses were cleared by arrests. This probably indicates that these crimes are not reported to police as complaints but that charges are made and offenses discovered during routine vice investigations.

CONCLUSIONS

The offenses known reporting system provides basic data on the type and extent of serious crime in Montana. In interpreting this data, however, the results of national surveys on victimization should be considered. Such studies indicate that less than one-half of all crimes are reported to police. Consequently no accurate measure of the incidence of crime is available.

Variances in the number of agencies reporting and the method of reporting make comparison with the FBI Uniform Crime Report difficult,

When statewide data for a 5 year base period is available crime trends will emerge. From the single year 1973 the following conclusions may be drawn.

- The crime index for Montana shows a relatively low rate of crime. For each citizen, the odds are less than 1 in 100 of being the victim of non-violent theft (except larceny) and less than 1 in a 1,000 of being a victim of violent crime (the odds of being robbed are approximately (1.6 in a 1,000).
- Property crime has shown only a slight increase in the past year. Violent crimes, however, have increased dramatically. Murder has increased 166 percent.

- The clearance rate of 64.9 percent of violent crimes and 19.6 percent of property crimes while higher than the national average, means nearly one-half of all violent crimes and four-fifths of all property crimes are not solved.
- Nearly one-half of the theft and destruction of property cases cleared are attributed to juveniles. Although this fact may mean that juveniles are more easily apprehended than adult offenders, it also may indicate a need for prevention programs aimed at juveniles.

1973 SUMMARY OF ARRESTS

This portion of the report summarizes arrest activity reported through the Monthly Arrest Register. Data on amount and time of arrest and characteristics of the offender has been compiled from the reports of 55 county sheriff departments, 70 police departments and 6 tribal agencies. These agencies form a reporting base of 99.2 percent of all law enforcement agencies within the state.

This arrest information focuses on the offender and should not be confused with "the offenses cleared by arrest" portion of the previous section. As any number of offenses may be cleared by one arrest (for example 59 burglaries committed by one individual), the arrest data is in no way comparable.

Data on arrests has been compiled for three years. However, 1971 figures may be slightly inaccurate because of a smaller reporting base in the first year. Data comparisons for 1972 and 1973 reflect the same reporting base and may be considered valid.

The following table shows the comparative totals of felony and misdemeanor arrests for the three year period.





The percent increase in arrests from 1971 to 1972 is considerably greater than the period from 1972 to 1973. The fluctuation, as mentioned previously, may be caused by incomplete reporting in 1971.

Illustrations 9 and 10 on the following pages show the trend in felony (Illustration 9) and misdemeanor (Illustration 10) arrests. Juvenile arrests continued to account for 23 percent of the total arrests in 1973. However, as persons under 17 accounted for 36.4 percent of the total state population in the 1970 census, the arrest rate does not indicate an unduly high percentage of deviant behavior for the group.

The lowering of the legal age of adulthood from 21 to 18 in 1973 did not cause any apparent changes in the number of young people arrested for alcohol related offenses or other misdemeanors.

DRUG ARRESTS

Drug arrests including all types of drug related arrests increased from 688 in 1972 to 907 in 1973 - a 32 percent increase. Drug arrests over the last three years have increased 91.8 percent. This trend is likely to be caused by a corresponding concentration of law enforcement activity in the drug investigation area.

Age groups 16-17, 18-19, and 20-25 continue to account for a large portion of all felony arrests - 50 percent in fact. Illustration 11 profiles the drug arrest trend.

RACE AND SEX CHARACTERISTICS

Arrest categorized by race and sex show that 77 percent of all felony arrests were white, 19 percent Indians and 2 percent other races. Males account for 90 percent of the felony arrests. These percentages show a disproportionately high arrest level for Indian and male offenders as Indians account for only 3.9 percent of the state population, according to the 1970 census. Males account for 50 percent of the total population.

TIME

Felony arrests by month, day and time period show July and August and October as high arrest activity months. Tuesday and Friday are high arrest days for felonies and the time period 8 to 12 midnight and 0-4 a.m. are the peak arrest times.


Illustration 12 profiling felony arrests shows such arrests have fluctuated only slightly. Variations do, however, appear to be decreasing in the areas of assaults, burglary, checks and increasing in drugs and other felonies. The category of other felonies consists of parole and probation violations, receiving stolen property and malicious destruction of property over \$50.

MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS


Misdemeanor arrests as shown in Illustration 13 page 20 increased from 32, 430 in 1972 to 38,434 in 1973 - up 13.5 percent. The incidence of misdemeanor arrests appears however, to be leveling out because the rate of increase has dropped by 22.1 percent from 1971 to 1972.



THREE YEAR FELONY ARREST PROFILE






The profile of misdemeanor arrests indicates that arrests have remaine fairly constant from 1971 through 1973. Increases are noted in areas of public conduct and alcohol related arrests while decreases occur in the other misdemeanor category such as trespassing, minor traffic, contributing and malicious destruction of property under \$50.

Comparing all the age groups, the age group with the greatest number of misdemeanor arrests is the 20-25. This group accounts for 19.7 percent of all misdemeanor arrests. The juvenile age span of 11 thru 17 accounts for 23 percent of all misdemeanor arrests. The adults, ages from 18 thru 60 account for 74 percent with the highest concentration in the 20-25 category.

Misdemeanor arrests by race and sex show that 58 percent of all felony arrests were white, 41 percent Indians, and 1 percent other races. Males account for 82 percent of the misdemeanor arrests with females making up the other 18 percent. Again Indians and males show a disproportionately high percentage of arrests for their number in population make-up.

CONCLUSIONS

The arrest data for the three-year period reflects a shifting data base for the years 1971-1972 and a more stable base for 1972-1973. The data for 1972 and 1973 is derived from a nearly total (99.2%) reporting base.

Although some categories of misdemeanors are not clearly defined the following conclusions can be drawn:

- The number of felony and misdemeanor arrests appear to be leveling off. Felony arrests showed a 14.8 percent increase from 1971 to 1972 and a 5.4 percent increase over the past two years. In the same period the increase in misdemeanor arrests slowed by 22.1 percent.
- Drug related felony arrests are showing a considerable increase from 473 reported in 1971 to 902 in 1973. The increase is probably due to concentration of law enforcement activity in investigation of such crimes.
- Alcohol related, traffic and other misdemeanor arrests increased significantly in 1973 while juvenile delinquency and minor theft arrest rates were fairly constant.
- Offenders arrested are fairly representative of the overall demography. Only males and Indians show a disproportionately high percentage of arrests. Males who compose 50 percent of the total state population accounted for 90 percent of all felony arrests and 82 percent of all misdemeanor arrests. The 3.9 percent of the population of Indian descent had 19 percent of all felony arrests and 41 percent of the misdemeanors.
