



#### ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS

#### Operations of the Administrative Office

This is the nineteenth annual report issued by the Administrative Office of the Courts and for the first time includes statistics compiled on a fiscal year basis with the present report covering the period of July 1, 1973 through June 30, 1974. Information as to the members of the judiciary and clerks of court is current to time of publication. Some changes in the format of the Report have also been made. For example, the names of members of the judiciary and clerks of court will be found in the sections of the report pertaining to the courts which they serve. Brief biographies of the newest members of the judiciary as well as information in regard to the Commission on Judicial Disabilities and Judicial Selection Commissions will be found in the appendix.

Effective January 2, 1975, the collection and compilation of statistical data as to the circuit courts has been automated, the first step toward the goal of establishment of a judicial information system for the State of Maryland. The electronic process should enable future statistical reports to be rendered in a more timely manner than in past years. It should also make possible ready access to a greater body of statistical data than has been available in the past.

On July 1, 1974 the title of the Director of the Administrative Office was changed to "State Court Administrator" by Chapter 359 of the Laws of 1974 as the result of a recommendation by the Commission on Judicial Reform.

The present incumbent, William H. Adkins, II, has served since October 1, 1973. In addition to fulfilling the duties of his office as enumerated by Section 13-101(d) of the Article on Courts and Judicial Proceedings he has also served as Executive Secretary of the Maryland Judicial Conference as required by the Maryland Rules of Practice and Procedure.

The State Court Administrator is assisted in the performance of his duties by a professional staff of five persons. They are Frederick A. Farris, Assistant Administrator for Education and Training; Robert C. Franke, Assistant Administrator for Reports and Statistics; J. Allen Hines, Assistant Administrator for Budget and Personnel; James F. Lynch, Assistant Administrator for Planning and Special Projects and Michael W. Nieberding, Assistant Administrator for Information Systems. The professional staff is supported by a clerical staff consisting of Mrs. Luetta Smith, Mrs. Karen Schmidt, Mrs. Carolyn McCabe, Mrs. Joanne Dowgwillo, Mrs. Georgeanna Lambert, Miss Roxanne Pettebone, Miss Sharon Witter, and Mr. Atlee Huffer.

Four circuit administrators, funded by the judiciary budget, commenced their duties in October of 1974. Their function is to assist the Circuit Administrative Judge in the performance of his duties. These new administrators are Richard H. Outten (First Judicial Circuit), Roger P. Mooney (Second Judicial Circuit), John A. Davies, Jr. (Fourth Judicial Circuit), and John G. Byers (Fifth Judicial Circuit). With their appointment, all political jurisdictions now have the services of a local administrator except Frederick and Harford Counties.

Increases in the Administrative Office Staff are making possible the development of a comprehensive judicial education program. Eventually this

program will be extended to cover many non-judicial personnel of the judiciary as well. Indeed, the Administrative Office Staff is already working with the State Court Clerks' Association in connection with excellent training courses developed by that Association in conjunction with the Adult Education Center at the University of Maryland.

Provision of the four circuit administrators demonstrates a commitment to increased administrative support at the circuit court level. As the functions of these new positions continue to be developed the Administrative Office is receiving valuable assistance from the locally-provided court administrators -- Albert H. Szal of the Seventh Circuit, Robert W. McKeever of the Eighth Circuit, Eugene Creed in Baltimore County, and Roger Carlquist in Montgomery County.

The Judiciary Budget, which is administered by the State Court Administrator, exceeded 4-3/4 million dollars for the Fiscal Year July 1, 1973 - June 30, 1974 exclusive of the District Court Budget. It is noteworthy that for Fiscal 1974, the combined Judiciary and District Court Budgets represented only 0.65% of the total State appropriations. The figure for Fiscal 1975 is only 0.61%.

It should also be observed that the budget requests of the District Court and the remainder of the judiciary are combined in a single Judiciary Budget for Fiscal 1976. This, and other changes in budget format, will mean that the Judiciary Budget will present a more meaningful picture of the financial status of the judicial system, and will constitute a more useful planning tool.

The Administrative Office throughout the past year has continued to serve as Secretariat for the Conference of Circuit Administrative Judges through Assistant Administrator Lynch. Confidential records of disciplinary proceedings

pertaining to members of the Maryland Bar are also maintained by the Office.

In the area of training, all the Assistant Administrators have attended one or more regional seminars in judicial administration sponsored by the Institute for Court Management of Denver, Colorado.

During October and November, 1974, Chief Judge Murphy and the State

Court Administrator visited every county courthouse as well as the Baltimore

City Courthouse. Meetings were held with every circuit court and Supreme

Bench court clerk and with almost every circuit court and Supreme Bench judge.

These meetings afforded an invaluable opportunity to meet with the clerks and judges on an informal basis and to learn at first hand about administrative and physical facility problems in the field. During 1975, a similar visit to the District Court is contemplated.

The State Court Administrator visited the State Court Administrator of Colorado, Harry O. Lawson, on August 8 and 9, 1974 to observe the operations of that office. He also attended the twentieth annual meeting of the Conference of State Court Administrators held on August 12 - 15, 1974 at Honolulu, Hawaii. In December, 1974, he attended the annual meeting of the Council of State Court Representatives of the National Center for State Courts in Denver, Colorado.

#### The State Board of Law Examiners

Included in the 4-3/4 million dollar figure and located physically within the Administrative Office are the operations of the State Board of Law Examiners and Court of Appeals Standing Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure.

The members of the State Board of Law Examiners are Vincent L. Gingerich, Esquire of Montgomery County, Chairman, Charles H. Dorsey, Jr., Esquire of

Baltimore City and Dorothy H. Thompson, Esquire of Talbot County. The full-time staff of the Board includes Secretary John E. Boerner, Clerk Mildred H. Pullen and secretaries Mrs. Dorothy Pugh and Mrs. Constance Taylor. Revenues from filing fees of candidates for the Bar are sufficient to fully fund the expenses of operation of the Board.

In addition to administering two examinations per year, the Board also processes applications for admission on motion under Rule 14. During the period of July 1, 1973 - June 30, 1974 the Board received 56 such applications. Fifty-eight persons were recommended for admission to the Bar under the same procedure during the period.



and equity proceedings accounted for the remaining 81 civil appeals. Sixty of the 304 appeals were dismissed prior to argument or submission to the Court (19.7 percent). This dismissal rate noted for the 1973 docket was the lowest recorded since the 1966 docket.

Of the 304 appeals on the 1973 docket, 83 (27.3 percent) originated in Baltimore City (Sixth Appellate Judicial Circuit) while the metropolitan counties (Anne Arundel,

Baltimore, Montgomery and Prince George's) accounted for 150. The Third Appellate Circuit noted 63 appeals, followed by the Fourth with 52, the Second with 48 and the Fifth with 35. The First Circuit accounted for the remaining 23 appeals.

At the close of the 1973-74 Fiscal Year the Court had disposed of 327 of the 348 appeals before it, leaving only 21 to be carried over to the next fiscal year. Forty-eight appeals were transferred to the Court of Special Appeals, 61 were dismissed prior to argument or submission and 17 were disposed of during the previous fiscal year. The remaining 201 appeals were considered by the Court of Appeals with the decision below being affirmed in 51.2 percent (103) and reversed in 24.9 percent (50). Of the remaining 23.9 percent, seven were modified and affirmed, four were affirmed in part and reversed in part, eleven, were remanded without affirmance or reversal, and twenty-six were dismissed after consideration by the Court.

In disposing of the 201 appeals the Court filed 194 opinions during Fiscal Year 1973-74, 28 of which were per curiam. Thirty-nine opinions were unreported. Three appeals were disposed of by order without an opinion being filed while one opinion disposed of three appeals and two opinions disposed of two appeals each. The average number of opinions by members of the Court was 20-21, excluding per curiam opinions, with an individual range of 11-32. Six dissenting opinions and one opinion dissenting in part and concurring in part were also filed.

During Fiscal 1973-74 the Court of Appeals also disposed of 505 petitions for the issuance of Writs of Certiorari to the Court of Special Appeals, 77 of which

were civil in nature and 428 criminal. Sixty petitions were granted, (28 civil and 32 criminal) while 445 were denied. It is anticipated that the certiorari workload of the Court will continue to expand at a substantial volume after the transfer of all initial appellate jurisdiction to the Court of Special Appeals.

In addition to its regular appellate work the Court was concerned during the year with admitting 795 persons to the practice of law, conducting 16 disciplinary actions involving attorneys and reviewing the bar examinations of 32 persons who received an adverse recommendation from the State Board of Law Examiners. It also reviewed the recommendation of the Board of Law Examiners of 58 attorneys from other states applying for admission on motion to the Maryland Bar.

Appeals on the 1973 docket averaged 15. 4 months from their original filing at the circuit court level until final judgment there with an average of 2.5 months being required from that time until the receipt of the record by the Court of Appeals. Appeals were disposed of in an average time of six months, with docketing to argument consuming 4.8 months and argument to decision requiring 1.2 months.

In estimating their anticipated argument time before the Court, appellants averaged 27 minutes and actually consumed 24 minutes. Appellees estimated their time at 25 minutes but only required 18 minutes.

During Fiscal Year 1973-74 the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals made much use of his authority to designate members of the judiciary to serve in courts or jurisdictions other than their own. Such efficient use of judicial manpower enables the caseload to continue moving where otherwise it might stall due to illness or unavailability of a judge. A tabulation of judicial designations follows.



judgeships were created by the General Assembly to enable the Court to cope with an expanding caseload with maximum efficiency.

The Court of Special Appeals was faced with a total of 1114 appeals for disposition during the Fiscal Year July 1, 1973 - June 30, 1974. This caseload, when added to that of the Court of Appeals (348), meant that the appellate dockets totalled 1462 for the fiscal year. The caseload of the Court of Special Appeals included 980 appeals from the 1973 Term docket, 133 carried over from the 1972 Term and one case from the 1974 Term docket. Appeals on the 1973



Term docket numbered 100 more than on the 1972 Term docket and represented an increase of 11.4 percent. Law cases accounted for 215 (21.9 percent) and 'equity proceedings accounted for 155 (15.8 percent) of the 980 appeals. Criminal appeals accounted for the remaining 610 (62.3 percent). With the assumption of virtually all original appellate jurisdiction by the Court, effective January 1, 1975, it is anticipated that its dockets will continue to grow at a substantial rate.

Of the 980 appeals recorded on the 1973 docket, 378 (38.6 percent) originated in Baltimore City (Sixth Appellate Judicial Circuit). Prince George's County noted the next highest number, 160, followed by Montgomery County with 96, Baltimore County with 88 and Anne Arundel with 56. This combined

metropolitan area accounted for 79. 4 percent of the total appeals. The remaining nineteen smaller counties recorded 202 appeals.

At the close of the 1973-74 Fiscal Year the Court of Special Appeals had disposed of 966 appeals of which it considered and decided 830. Twenty-five appeals were transferred to the Court of Appeals for consideration there while 111

were dismissed prior to argument or consideration. Of those 830 appeals considered, the decision below was affirmed in 693 (83.5 percent) and reversed in 79 (9.5 percent). Twenty of the remaining appeals were dismissed after consideration, eight were remanded without affirmance or reversal, 27 were affirmed in part and reversed in part, and three were modified and affirmed.

The Court filed a total of 827 opinions in disposing of the 830 appeals with per curiam opinions numbering 599. Three opinions disposed of two appeals each and three opinions were written by judges specially assigned to the Court. Three dissenting opinions, three concurring opinions, and one opinion dissenting in part and concurring in part were also filed. Reported opinions numbered 228.

Appeals averaged 10.8 months from their original filing below to disposition below and another 3.2 months for filing of the record in the Court of Special Appeals. Once an appeal was docketed in the Court, it was heard in an average time of four months and a decision was rendered within 1.6 months. Despite the increase in caseload, and the fact that the two additional judges authorized for the

Court by the 1974 General Assembly did not qualify until December of that year, the Court has reduced the delay from docketing to argument. The average time from argument to decision has increased only fractionally. These figures again attest to the hard work performed by the judges and staff of the Court.

The Court also considered 153 applications for leave to appeal in post conviction and defective delinquent cases during Fiscal 1973-74. Ten applications were granted, five were dismissed, and 138 were denied.

Five circuit court judges have qualified for office since the last publication of this report.

On July 2, 1974, Judge John R. Hargrove was elevated to the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City (Eighth Judicial Circuit) from the District Court of Maryland. He filled a vacancy which was created by the previous elevation of Judge William J. O'Donnell to the Court of Appeals of Maryland.

A third judgeship created by the 1973 General Assembly for the Circuit Court for Harford County, but not effective until July 1, 1974, was filled on September 16, 1974 when Judge Edward D. Higinbothom took the oath of office. A few days later on September 20, 1974, Judge Mary Arabian was sworn in as a member of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, having been elevated from the District Court. She replaced Judge Joseph L. Carter, who was the jurist senior in service in the entire State, having served in office from February 29, 1952 until his constitutional retirement on July 20, 1974.

Judge Richard B. Latham became a member of the Circuit Court for Montgomery County on January 3, 1975, being elevated from the District Court. He succeeded Judge Walter H. Moorman, who reached the age of constitutional retirement on October 11, 1974. Judge Moorman had served on the bench since December 17, 1962.

Judge Morris Turk took the oath of office as a member of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County on January 9, 1975. He filled a vacancy created by the constitutional retirement of Judge George Sachse on November 24, 1974. Judge Sachse had served on the bench since June 27, 1962.

Clerks of Court who have qualified for office since the last published report of the Administrative Office are Raymond W. Walker of Allegany County,

Charles C. Keller of Frederick County, Charles E. Callow of Prince George's County, and Lawrence A. Murphy of Baltimore City. New Chief Deputies include Ola Leap of Dorchester County, Betty P. Smith of Wicomico County, Bessie B. Smith of Worcester County, Nelson D. Stubbs of Cecil County and James L. Vogelsang and Gerald J. Flanigan of Baltimore City.


For the first time since these reports have been published, statistics for the current report were tabulated on a fiscal year basis and cover the period of July 1, 1973 through June 30, 1974. This statistical year will be referred to in this section of the report as simply "1973-74." Earlier years cover a reporting period of September 1 through August 31 with the year September 1, 1972 through August 31, 1973 being referred to as "1972-73."

During year 1973-74, 78, 519 civil and criminal actions were filed in the trial courts of general jurisdiction. That figure represented an increase of 4,837 filings (6.5 percent) over the corresponding figure reported for 1972-73 (73,682). Terminations for 1973-74 numbered 78,621 and exceeded filings for the year by 102. They exceeded the corresponding figure for 1972-73 by 8.6 percent (6,262). Thus, the courts in general are keeping abreast of the caseload, although by only a slim margin. Equity proceedings accounted for 46.4 percent

of the caseload, followed by criminal cases with 31.3 percent and law cases with 22.3 percent.

One trend that has become apparent since the establishment of the District Court of Maryland in 1971 has been the decline in law cases filed at the circuit court level. This has been due to their filing and disposition in the District Court. Since 1971-72 the circuit courts have terminated several thousand more law cases each year than were filed in them.

increased by 16.7 percent over 1972-73 and numbered 24, 603 as compared to 21, 081 in that year. The drop in criminal filings of a few years ago, due to the creation of the District Court and disposition of a number of criminal matters there, has evidently been reversed. An encouraging note is that terminations in the

criminal area exceeded filings by nearly 2,000 as 26,567 were recorded and represented a 29.4 percent increase over 1972-73.

MOTOR TORT cases represented 37.3 percent of the law caseload in 1973-74 as 6,523 such actions were filed, a decrease of 9.8 percent from the 7,233 filed in 1972-73. Baltimore City recorded 2,935 motor tort filings as compared to 3,311 in 1972-73. The four largest counties also reflected decreases in motor

Baltimore County reported the largest number filed, 930, closely followed by Prince George's with 910. Montgomery and Anne Arundel reported 613 and 339, respectively. The combined metropolitan jurisdictions registered 87.8 percent of the caseload in motor torts, a slight decrease from 1972-73 when they registered 88.7 percent.

APPEALS from the District Court and administrative agencies, as reported by the Clerks of the Circuit Courts, totalled 7, 206 statewide. The ratio of appeals from the District Court, as compared to the caseload of that Court, remained at 0.6 percent, the same figure tallied for each year since the Court began operations. This very low rate of appeals has been a decided influence in keeping down the caseload of the circuit courts. A tabulation showing the historical number of appeals from administrative agencies is included in this report. A study of those figures will reveal that appeals from those agencies

have been rather stable in number over the years, and have in fact declined, both statewide and in Baltimore City, for the past two years.

LAW cases terminated by trial numbered 3, 678 in 1973-74 and accounted for 17.8 percent of all law dispositions statewide. The disposition rate by trial for law cases in Baltimore City was 12.4 percent. Trials were held before a jury in 34.3 percent of the cases (1, 261) and were held before a court sitting without a jury in 65.7 percent (2, 417). Baltimore City accounted for 31.4 percent of all law cases tried as it reported 1, 154. Prince George's County reported more law cases tried

than any other county, 760, followed by Baltimore County with 587.

Law cases averaged 15.3 months statewide from initial filing to trial in 1973-74, an increase of 1.3 months over 1972-73. Generally speaking, jury cases took longer to reach trial, with those in Baltimore City consuming more time than in the counties. Law cases on the average, reached trial slightly faster in the four larger counties than in the nineteen smaller ones. The delay from filing to trial in motor torts is greater than in any other type of case.

Of all law cases tried, 54.1 percent reached the trial stage in less than one year. The corresponding figure for 1972-73 was 62.6 percent.

In the EQUITY area, proceedings in divorce matters constituted 57.4 percent of the statewide caseload as 20,890 were filed compared to 36,411 total equity cases. Reported equity hearings before a judge in open court totalled 6,473. For the first time a tabulation of the time lapse in equity hearings was computed for this report.

CRIMINAL, filings increased significantly in 1973-74 compared to the prior year. Baltimore City and Prince George's County both showed sizable rises while Anne Arundel and Montgomery Counties showed moderate increases. Baltimore County, on the other hand, showed a slight decrease. Baltimore City accounted for 56.2 percent of the total criminal caseload as it recorded 13,830 filings. It also reported 54.0 percent of the total cases tried. A total of 1,734 criminal cases were tried before a jury while 16, 179 were tried by a court sitting without a jury statewide. Criminal cases tried reflected a 31.8 percent increase over 1972-73. Time lapses computed for all criminal cases showed a 5. 4 month span from filing to trial, a slight increase from 1972-73 when a time of 4.9 months was computed.

APPLICATIONS FOR REVIEW OF CRIMINAL SENTENCES numbered 341 for 1973-74, a decrease of 20 from the 361 reported for 1972-73. During 1973-74, 382 such applications were disposed of, 18 of which were withdrawn. The original sentence was unchanged in 335 instances and decreased in 29. A significant fact worth noting is that no sentence was increased. Since the establishment of the procedure on July 1, 1966, a total of 1, 953 applications have been filed as of June 30, 1974. During the same period 138 sentences have been reduced.

Petitions filed for writs of HABEAS CORPUS AND POST CONVICTION relief totalled 527 and 448, respectively, for 1973-74. The figures for 1972-73 were 806 and 351. A trend over the last few years has surfaced to reflect a sizable

decline in habeas corpus petitions with a corresponding gradual rise in post conviction petitions. As in past years, the majority of both types of petitions were filed in Baltimore City.

The Circuit Court for Montgomery County, which exercises jurisdiction formerly held by an orphans' court, reported that it held 45 hearings and signed 2,740 orders during 1973-74. The Circuit Court for Harford County also assumed such jurisdiction on November 5, 1974 as the result of the ratification of a constitutional amendment in the November 1972 General Election.

JUVENILE CAUSES filed in 1973-74 numbered 24, 527 and reflected a 7.2 percent increase over 1972-73. Delinquency cases totalled 20, 107 and accounted for 80.0 percent of the juvenile workload. Terminations in juvenile causes numbered 22, 784 for 1973-74. All juvenile matters are within the exclusive jurisdiction of the circuit courts except in Montgomery County where jurisdiction is exercised by the Juvenile Division of the District Court.

Five members of the District Court of Maryland have qualified for office since the last publication of this report, four of whom are from Baltimore City. The fifth, Judge Charles W. Woodward, Jr., filled a vacancy created by the 1974 General Assembly for Montgomery County (District Six). He qualified on September 13, 1974. All of the Baltimore City judges filled existing vacancies rather than new positions. Judge James L. Bundy was sworn in on August 16, 1974. He replaced Judge Benjamin L. Brown who had resigned to accept the position of Solicitor for Baltimore City. Shortly thereafter on August 20, 1974 Judge Alan M. Resnick took the oath, succeeding Judge E. Paul Mason, Jr. who had died in office. Judge James J. Welsh, Jr. filled a vacancy created by the elevation of District Administrative Judge John R. Hargrove to the Circuit Court and qualified on October 18, 1974. Judge Edward F. Borgerding was named to succeed Judge Hargrove as Administrative Judge. The fourth new member of the District Court for Baltimore City is Judge Robert M. Bell who qualified on January 2, 1975. He replaced Judge Mary Arabian who had been elevated to the Circuit Court.

The caseload of the District Court continues to expand at a high rate as 291, 337 civil, 506, 650 motor vehicle, and 117, 972 criminal cases were processed from July 1, 1973 through June 30, 1974. These figures represented increases of 18.5 percent, 10.4 percent and 8.4 percent, respectively, over those compiled for Fiscal Year 1972-73. Of the 291, 337 civil filings, 204, 527 (70.2 percent) were matters involving landlord and tenant disputes. Baltimore City recorded 167, 230 civil filings of which 79.1 percent (132, 322) were landlord and tenant cases. In the counties, Prince George's tallied 48, 562 civil filings, followed by

Baltimore with 28, 863, Montgomery with 16, 431 and Anne Arundel with 10, 870. The metropolitan area of Baltimore City and the four largest counties accounted for 93.3 percent of the total civil filings. Statewide, 19, 315 civil cases were contested with Baltimore City registering 10, 586.

Of the 506, 650 motor vehicle cases processed during 1973-74, 167, 481 were disposed of by trial. Baltimore City accounted for 34.8 percent of these trials (58, 346) followed by Baltimore County with 21.6 percent (36, 263). The metropolitan area accounted for 81.7 percent of the motor vehicle trials and 72.1 percent of the total motor vehicle caseload.

A total of 90, 968 persons were charged with 117, 972 criminal acts in the District Court during 1973-74. The Court held 8939 defendants for action by the grand jury while 2863 elected trial by jury in the Circuit Courts. Baltimore City accounted for 38, 940 defendants and 53, 428 charges. Prince George's and Baltimore Counties recorded nearly the same number of criminal charges as they registered 12, 592 and 12, 394, respectively.

In addition to handling the heavy caseload thrust upon it, the District Court has continued to provide ample assistance to the trial courts of general jurisdiction in the form of judicial manpower as the needs of those courts require and has particularly been valuable in coping with the heavy criminal caseload at the circuit court level in Baltimore City. For example, at least two and sometimes three District Court judges were designated to sit in the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City regularly during Fiscal 1973-74. Some

The District Court has also had a substantial impact during the several years of its operation in reducing the civil law caseload of the circuit courts as well as reducing the number of appeals taken to those courts.

During the Fiscal Year 1973-74 a total of \$17,088,095.42 in revenues was received by the District Court, of which a sum of \$14,580,149.82 was paid into the state general fund. Expenses for operation of the Court, including salaries of judicial and supporting personnel, totalled \$11,426,107, creating a surplus of \$3,154,042.82 and rendering the Court completely self-sustaining.

APPENDIX

### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES OF THE JUDICIARY

Brief biographies of recently-appointed members of the judiciary follow.

### THE COURT OF SPECIAL APPEALS

Judge David T. Mason

Judge Mason was born December 6, 1914. He graduated from the University of Maryland School of Law and passed the Summer 1951 bar examination. He has served in the Attorney General's Office as Chief of the Criminal Division and as Chairman of the State Parole Board. He also served as a member of the Baltimore City Jail Board.

At the time of his appointment to the bench, Judge Mason was serving as Secretary of Employment and Social Services for Maryland. He took the oath of office as an Associate Judge of the Court of Special Appeals on December 2, 1974.

Judge Ridgely P. Melvin, Jr.

Judge Melvin was born September 26, 1917. He received the AB degree from Princeton University in 1940 and the LLB degree from the University of Maryland School of Law in 1947, being admitted to the Maryland Bar that same year.

From 1954-62 the Judge served as a member of the House of Delegates in the General Assembly. He also served as Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee and Chairman of the Anne Arundel County Delegation from 1958-62. Judge Melvin has been a member of the Charter Board for Anne Arundel County and a member of the Maryland Constitutional Convention Commission as well as a member of the Court of Appeals Standing Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure.

At the time of his appointment to the Court of Special Appeals Judge Melvin was a member of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County. He is a member of the American, Maryland State and Anne Arundel County Bar Associations and has served as President of the latter organization. The Judge is also a member of the American Judicature Society.

### THE CIRCUIT COURTS

Judge Mary Arabian

Judge Arabian was born December 5, 1920. She received her early education in the public schools of Baltimore City, attended the University of Maryland at College Park, graduated from the University of Maryland School of Law and was admitted to the Maryland Bar in 1945.

Judge Arabian has served as an Assistant City Solicitor for Baltimore City and as an Assistant Attorney General of Maryland. She served on the former Municipal Court of Baltimore City as one of its original members and at the time of her appointment to the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City (Eighth Judicial Circuit) was serving on the District Court of Maryland for Baltimore City.

Judge Arabian served as President of the Women's Bar Association of Baltimore City in 1952 and is a member of the American, Maryland State and Baltimore City Bar Associations.

Judge John R. Hargrove

Judge Hargrove was born October 25, 1923 at Atlantic City, New Jersey. He received his early education at St. Catherine's Academy and Frederick Douglass High School in Baltimore. Following military service in the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers from 1943 - 46 he completed his undergraduate schooling at Howard University, receiving the AB degree in 1947. In 1950 he received the LLB degree from the University of Maryland School of Law and was admitted to the Maryland Bar that same year.

Judge Hargrove has served as Deputy United States Attorney for the District of Maryland from 1957-62, Judge of the former People's Court of Baltimore City and Judge of the former Municipal Court of Baltimore City. He also has been a member of the Maryland State, Baltimore City, Monumental City, and National Bar Associations and delegate to the Maryland Constitutional Convention.

At the time of his appointment to the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City (Eighth Judicial Circuit) Judge Hargrove was serving on the District Court of Maryland as Administrative Judge for Baltimore City.

Judge Edward D. Higinbothom

Judge Higinbothom was born February 28, 1914. He graduated in 1934 from Loyola College in Baltimore and received the AB degree. In 1938 he received the LLB degree from the University of Maryland School of Law and was admitted to the Maryland Bar that same year.

Judge Higinbothom has served as Counsel to the Supervisor of Elections for Harford County and as Counsel to the Harford County Metropolitan Commission. He holds memberships in the Order of the Coif and American, Maryland State and Harford County Bar Associations.

Judge Richard B. Latham

Judge Latham was born June 12, 1926. He received his undergraduate schooling at the University of Maryland and his JD degree from its School of Law in 1952. He was admitted to the Maryland Bar that same year.

Judge Latham has served as a Judge of the former People's Court of Montgomery County and at the time of his appointment to the Circuit Court for Montgomery County was serving as a member of the District Court of Maryland for Montgomery County. He is a Fellow of the Maryland Bar Foundation and is a member of the American Judicature Society and American Judges Association.

The Judge has served on the Board of Governors of the Maryland State Bar Association and as President of the Montgomery County Bar Association. He is also a member of the American Bar Association.

Judge Morris Turk

Judge Turk was born April 14, 1921. He is a graduate of the University of Baltimore School of Law and passed the Winter 1951 bar examination. In addition to being engaged in the general practice of law prior to his being named to the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County, he has been Chairman of the State Appeal Board.

Judge Turk is a past President of the Anne Arundel County Bar Association and is a member of the Maryland State Bar Association. He has been Counsel to

both the Anne Arundel County School and Elections Boards. The Judge took the oath of office on January 9, 1975 as an Associate Judge of

the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County.

### THE DISTRICT COURT

Judge Robert M. Bell

Judge Bell was born July 6, 1943. He is a graduate of Morgan State College, receiving the AB degree in 1966, and the Harvard University School of Law, receiving the JD degree in 1969. He was admitted to the Maryland Bar that same

year.

Prior to his appointment to the bench Judge Bell was an Assistant to the State Board of Law Examiners. He has served on the Board of the Legal Aid Bureau and has been active in committee work of the Baltimore City and Junior Bar Associations. Judge Bell is also a member of the American and Maryland State Bar Associations. He took the oath of office as an Associate Judge of the District Court of Maryland for Baltimore City on January 2, 1975.

Judge James L. Bundy

Judge Bundy was born March 6, 1920 at Bluefield, West Virginia. He graduated from Bluefield State College in 1942, receiving the BS degree, and from the University of Maryland School of Law in 1949, receiving the JD degree. He was admitted to the Maryland Bar that same year.

Judge Bundy has served as an Assistant City Solicitor for Baltimore City and at the time of his appointment to the bench was an Assistant Attorney General of Maryland. He is a member of the National, Maryland State, Baltimore City and

Monumental City Bar Associations. Judge Bundy took the oath of office as a member of the District Court of

Maryland for Baltimore City on August 16, 1974.

Judge Alan M. Resnick

Judge Resnick was born May 14, 1928. He received the AB degree from the University of Maryland in 1950 and the LLB degree from its School of Law in 1952. He was admitted to the Maryland Bar in that same year.

At the time of his appointment to the bench Judge Resnick was a member of the House of Delegates of Maryland and was serving as Chairman of its Subcommittee on Insurance. He is a member of the American Judicature Society and American, Maryland State and Baltimore City Bar Associations.

Judge Resnick qualified as a member of the District Court of Maryland for Baltimore City on August 20, 1974.

Judge James J. Welsh, Jr.

Judge Welsh was born January 20, 1927 at Baltimore. He received his undergraduate schooling at the University of Baltimore and the LLB degree from its School of Law in 1960. He was admitted to the Maryland Bar that same year.

Judge Welsh has served as a member of the House of Delegates of Maryland and also as a member of the City Council of Baltimore City. At the time of his appointment to the bench he was serving in the State's Attorney's Office of Baltimore City as Chief of the District Court Division.

Judge Welsh has held memberships in the National District Attorneys and Maryland State's Attorneys Associations as well as the Plaintiffs' Trial Lawyers Association. He is also a member of the Maryland State and Baltimore City Bar Associations. On October 18, 1974 he took the oath of office as a member of the District Court of Maryland for Baltimore City.

Judge Charles W. Woodward, Jr.

Judge Woodward was born February 28, 1919 at Poolesville, Maryland. He received the AB degree from the University of Maryland in 1941 and, following military service with the U. S. Army, the LLB degree from the University of Maryland School of Law in 1948.

Judge Woodward has served in the House of Delegates of Maryland, as a member of the Governor's Judicial Salary and Pension Review Board, as well as a member of the Governor's Commission to Revise the Annotated Code of Maryland. He has been active in committee work of the Maryland State and Montgomery County Bar Associations and has served as President of the latter organization. Judge Woodward has also served as a Trustee of the Clients' Security Trust Fund of the Bar of Maryland. He qualified on September 13, 1974 as a member of the District Court of Maryland for Montgomery County.

### COMMISSIONS ON JUDICIAL SELECTION

By issue of the appropriate Executive Orders the Governor of Maryland has created a Commission on Appellate Judicial Selection and eight Commissions on Trial Court Judicial Selection. Those Executive Orders directed that the Commissions be composed of attorneys elected by their fellow members of the bar and laymen appointed by the Governor from the general public. In addition, the Chairman of each Commission is appointed by the Governor and may be either a lawyer or a layman. The Administrative Office of the Courts conducts the election of the lawyer members of the Commissions pursuant to rules promulgated by the Court of Appeals at the direction of the Executive Orders.

The Commissions consider and pass upon the qualifications of candidates seeking judicial office and submit a list of recommended candidates to the Governor from which he is bound to make an appointment. Recommendations for appointment to the Court of Appeals and Court of Special Appeals are made by the Appellate Judicial Selection Commission while the Trial Court Judicial Selection Commissions make recommendations as to the Circuit Courts, including the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, and the District Court.

By Executive Order of December 18, 1974 the Governor restructured the Commissions on Judicial Selection. A copy of that Executive Order and the Rules of the Court of Appeals pertaining thereto will be found in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a> of January 13, 1975 and <a href="The Maryland Register">The Maryland Register</a>.

### THE COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL DISABILITIES


The Maryland Commission on Judicial Disabilities reported that it opened 16 investigative files during the period of July 1, 1973 - June 30, 1974. In addition, it received numerous telephone calls and letters seeking advice on how to file a complaint. No separate tabulation is made of inquiries which do not ripen into formal complaints. All letter writers and those telephone callers who desire it are sent a statement of the Commission's purpose and jurisdiction with instructions on how to file a complaint.

As has been the experience in the past, most of the complaints were dismissed after a minimum of investigation because it was clear that there was no wrongdoing or misconduct. During Fiscal Year 1973-74 the Commission held one formal hearing resulting in a recommendation that a censure be imposed by the Court of Appeals. That recommendation was accepted. In addition, a formal preliminary investigation was held in another case.


The most prevalent complaint continues to be dissatisfaction with the outcome of litigation usually arising out of either domestic relations cases or minor criminal cases where a complainant has sworn out a warrant against a neighbor and the judge has found the neighbor not guilty.


The Commission meets irregularly depending upon the press of business. Discounting formal hearings, it met three times during Fiscal 1973-74.
