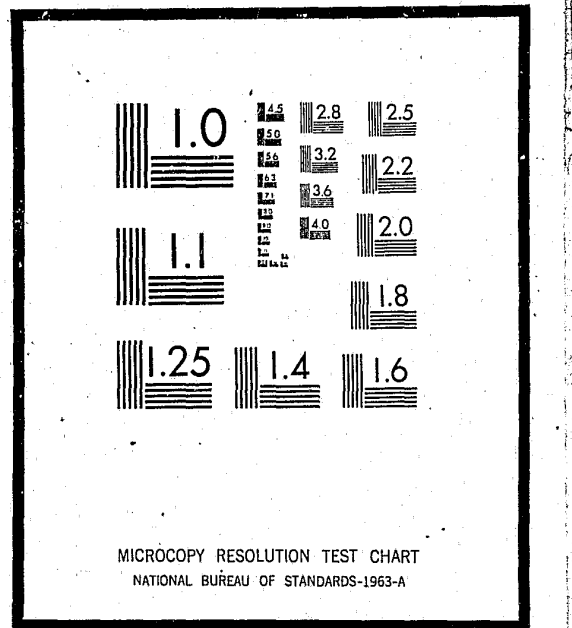


Gentlemen:

## ABSTRACT

This document has been prepared in accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 15:577 (12) and is hereby presented to the Governor, Members of the Legislature, and all interested individuals or agencies.

Three general categories of information are presented herein: (1) Offenses Reported,<sup>1</sup> (2) Crimes Charged,<sup>2</sup> and (3) Annual Case Disposition Data from all the state district attorneys. Presentation of this information is divided into two sections: (I) Data Analysis and (II) Annual Reports of the District Attorneys. Section I begins with a detailed description of the data base followed by several analyses presentations, both tabular and graphic. Included are statistical summarizations of Total Offenses Reported, Total Crimes Charged, Violent and Property Crime Indexes, and rankings of Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) according to Total Offenses Reported and Crimes Charged. Graphic devices are used to present data on the daily occurrence rates of Violent and Property Crimes Reported and Charged, plus their yearly rate of occurrence by parish. Concluding Section I is a brief look at crime in Louisiana as measured by three measurement criteria called Crime Rate, Crime Seriousness and Crime Level.

In addition, a summation of Offenses Reported and Crimes Charged for each parish is included.

I. DATA ANALYSIS

A. The Data Base

Comprising the data base are the two general information categories of OFFENSES REPORTED and CRIMES CHARGED, both pertaining to offenses under the Louisiana Criminal Code and the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law (R.S. Title 40, Chapter 4, Part X). OFFENSES REPORTED are simply the list of crimes that are made known to the local law enforcement agencies, the district attorneys, the State Police, and the Enforcement Division of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. Each offense is reported even though, upon investigation, it is determined that there has been no crime committed. For example, the local police receive a telephone call stating that someone was entering the neighboring house through a rear window. Upon investigating the incident, the patrol officer discovers the son of the houseowner had forgotten his house key and his parents are still out for the evening. A Simple Burglary would be recorded as an Offense Reported, but not as a Crimes Charged entry. CRIMES CHARGED refer to the issuance of bookings, citations, notifications, or other summons charging one with a crime under the above statutes. To help in differentiating between Crimes Charged and Offenses Reported, remember that Offenses Reported are acts of incidents of crimes, whereas, in Crimes Charged, the total number of people involved in crimes are recorded. Therefore, it is unlikely that

the two sets would agree. For example, if a man died as a result of a beating inflicted by five other men who were subsequently arrested, one offense of Manslaughter would be reported, but five offenders would be recorded as Crimes Charged.

A majority of the analysis section involves those offenses considered to be serious as defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation's 1974 Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook. These offenses were selected because, collectively, they comprise the greatest local crime problem. The "serious" label was determined by the offenses' very nature or frequency of occurrence. Defined as Crime Index Offenses by the F.B.I., these crimes are listed as follows (NOTE: This list is defined in terms of the Louisiana Criminal Code's interpretation of the F.B.I. Crime Index):

Homicide, Rape, Robbery and Assault are further classified as VIOLENT CRIMES while Burglary and Theft are categorized as PROPERTY CRIMES.

Additionally, our data base will include 1970 Louisiana census figures extracted from the U.S. Bureau of the Census records and the "Statistical Abstract of Louisiana - 1971" published by the College of Business of Administration, Division of Business and Economic Research, Louisiana State University at New Orleans.

Statistical information was received by the Attorney General's Office from all parishes except one, Bienville. This qualifying factor must be considered when referring to all sections of this report.

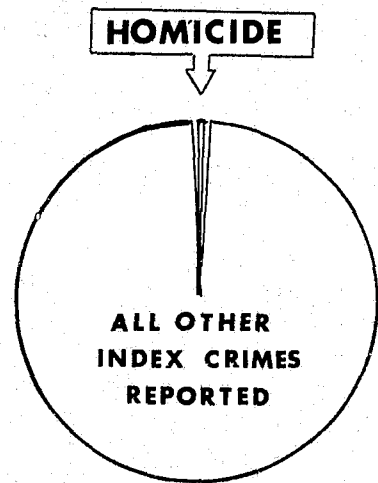

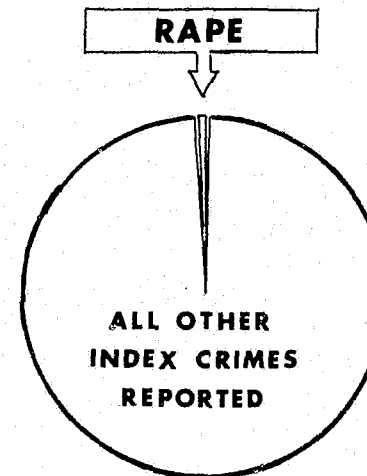

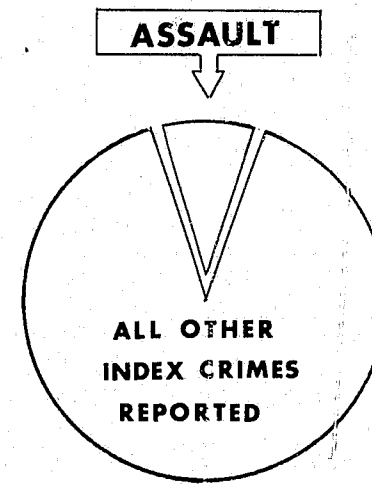

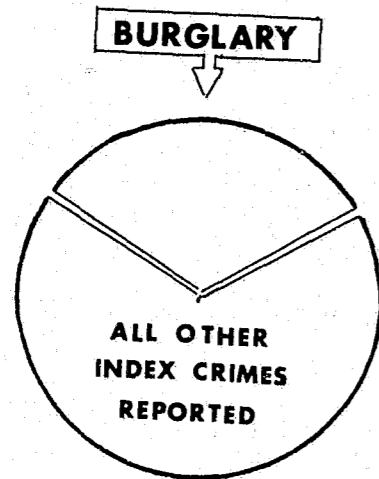

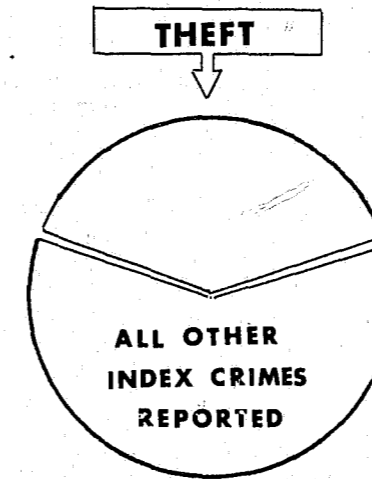

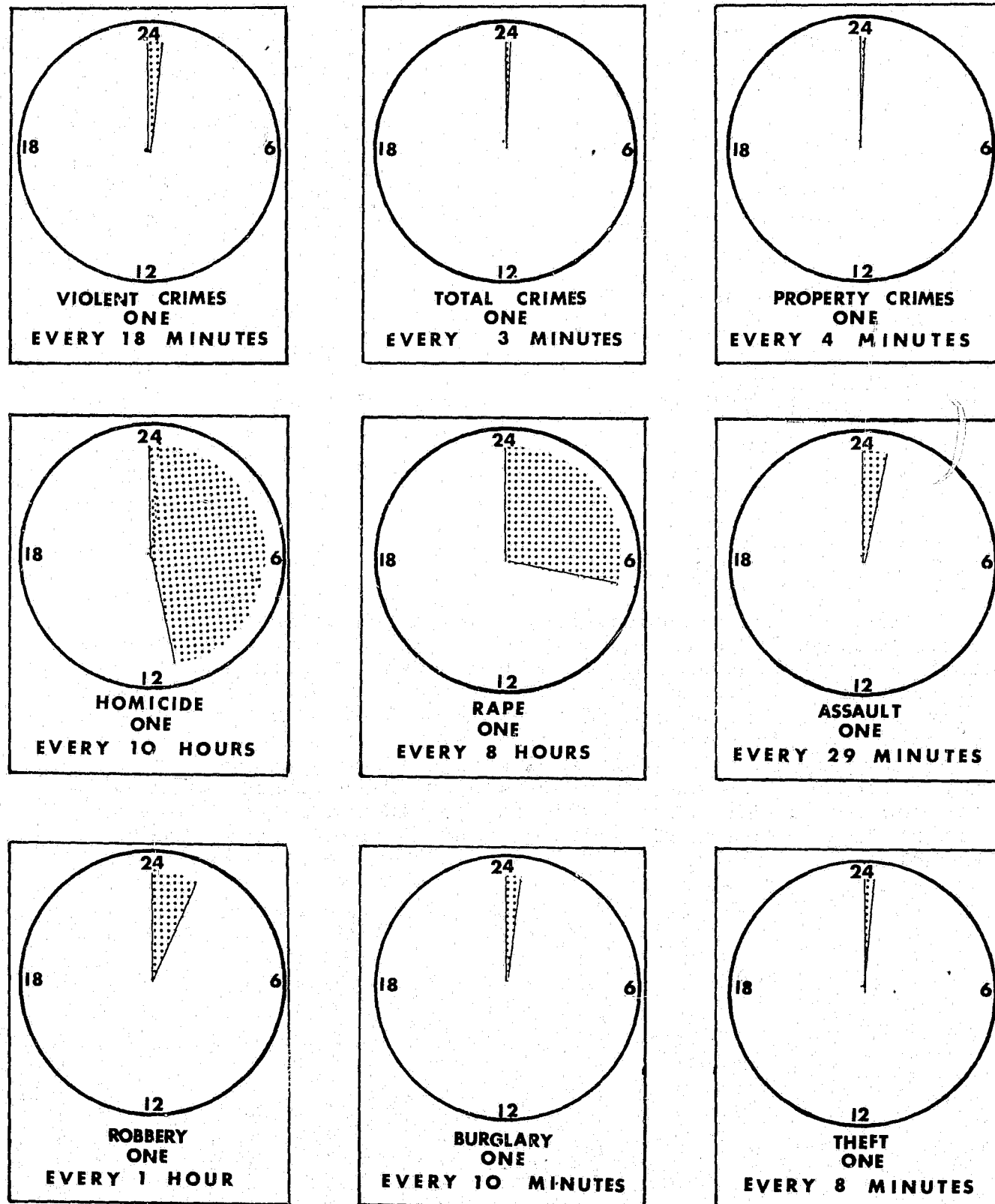

Please note that this definition does not refer to the requirement that a theft must involve an intent to deprive the other person permanently of whatever may be the subject of the misappropriation. This exclusion was necessitated because, for reporting purposes, Unauthorized Use of Movables offenses are included under Theft. Offenses considered in this category are a) Theft (Auto Theft included) and b) Unauthorized Use of Movables.

6. Population, Violent Crime Rate, and Property Crime Rates - Louisiana Parishes - 1973.

Louisiana parishes were ranked in order from highest to lowest in terms of the 1970 population, Violent Crime rate<sup>6</sup> and Property Crime rate, and then grouped into quartiles (Figure 2).

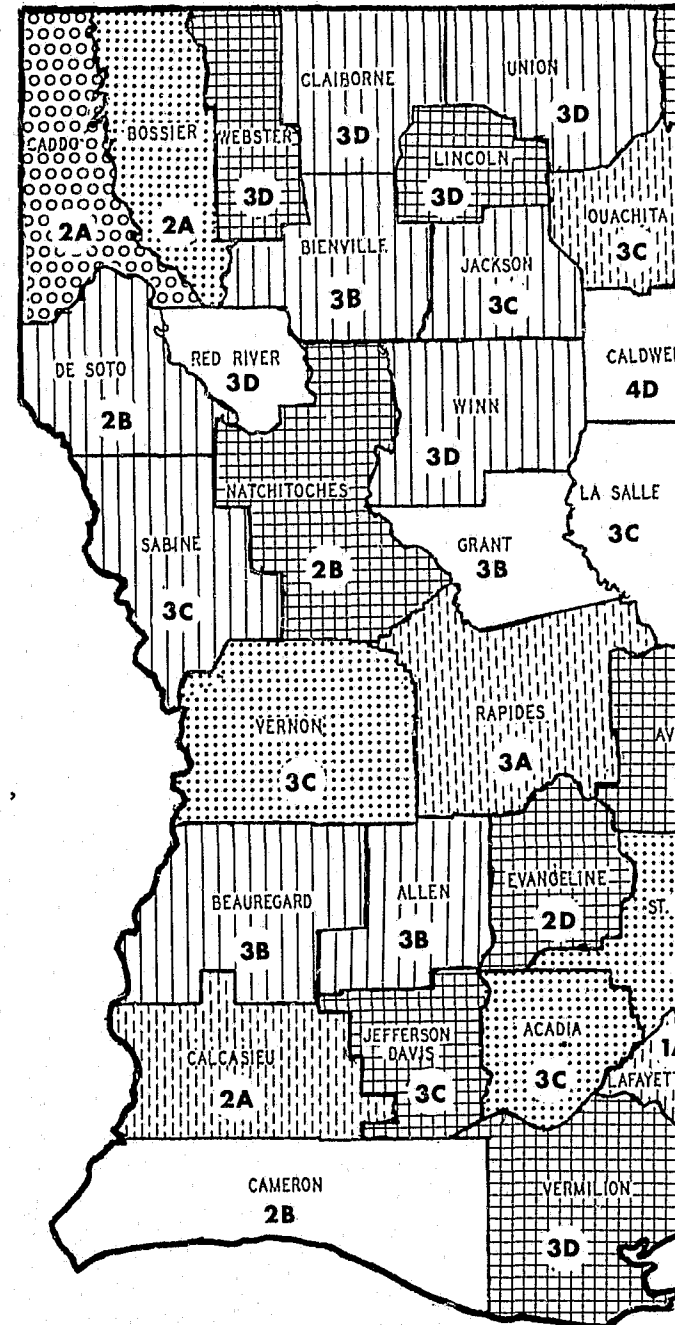
Several of the least populated parishes ranked in the next to highest quartiles based on crime rate. Cameron, East Carroll and Madison with populations under 15,000 all ranked in a high violent and property crime quartile.

Only one parish, Caldwell, ranked in the lowest quartile for both violent and property crime rates. Ouachita, although possessing a population in the 50,000 to 100,000 range, also had a low ranking in both the violent and property crime rate quartiles.

Bienville does not indicate a ranking in either quartile due to non-receipt of any 1973 crime statistics by the Office of the Attorney General.

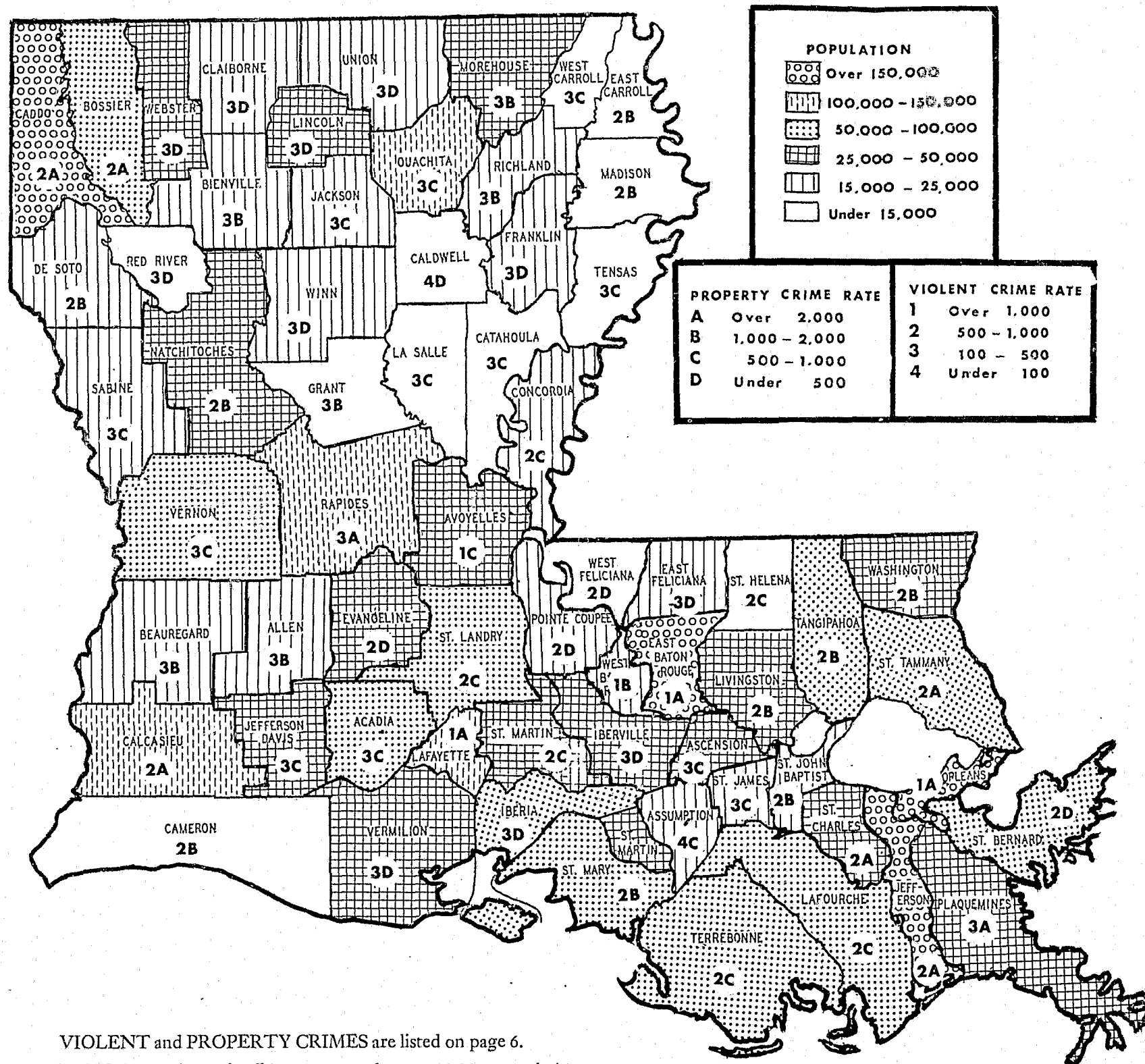

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### C. Crime Rate, Seriousness and Level

#### 1. Introduction<sup>8</sup>

The most widely used method of measuring the level of criminal activity in a given jurisdiction has been the "crime rate". This measure is defined as the number of serious crimes<sup>9</sup> committed for each certain population unit, usually 100,000 people. Crime rates are usually computed for various geographic areas, and for the several categories of offense and population, age, sex and race groups. This measure, while useful for several purposes, has a major fault. The offenses that make up the crime rate are rated as being of equal seriousness, that is, homicide or rape are considered equal in gravity with burglary, theft, or armed robbery. A crime measure which would take into account the different degrees of seriousness for each offense that makes up the crime rate would obviously be instructive. However, the problem with this measure would be to accurately assign seriousness weights to these offenses. Fortunately, research has been done in this area<sup>10</sup> and the following weights can be utilized: Homicide, 26; Rape, 11; Robbery, 5; Assault, 4; Burglary, 3; and Theft, 2.

Being able to measure crime seriousness also permits us to define another new index which would include both the crime rate and crime seriousness in one measurement. This is called the Crime Level and is calculated by multiplying the rate of each offense by its seriousness weight. The formulas for obtaining the rate, seriousness, and level are as follows:

$$\text{Crime Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Serious Crimes Reported} \times 100,000}{\text{Total Population (State or Parish)}}$$

$$\text{Crime Seriousness}^{11} = \frac{(2 \times \# \text{ Thefts}) + (3 \times \# \text{ Burglaries}) + (4 \times \# \text{ Assaults}) + (5 \times \# \text{ Robberies}) + (11 \times \# \text{ Rapes}) + (26 \times \# \text{ Homicides})}{\text{Total Number of Serious Crimes Reported}}$$

$$\text{Crime Level} = (\text{Crime Rate}) \times (\text{Crime Seriousness})$$

The following section provides a statistical summary of the above crime measurements as applied to the serious crimes reported in Louisiana during 1973.
