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This report is one of a series to make data available on the population in New York State Department of Correctional Services Institutions. The data in this report cover characteristics of sane inmates discharged and include summary data on types of services received while under custody. Data on discharges from Matteawan State Hospital, an institution for the mentally ill, are not included in this report. The following selected items are covered in this release: Type of Release, Time Served Since Last Admission, Employability, Medical Services, Hours of Education, Grade Achievement on Release, Principal Type of Organized Vocational Training, Correction Industry Experience, Minor Discipline Reports, Major Discipline Reports, Inmates Attitude Toward Authority and Other Inmates, Psychological and Psychiatric Services and Contacts, and Service Unit Contacts. In addition, summary figures are shown for the General Confinement Facilities, Camp Adirondack, and Specialized Facilities, for these three groups combined, and for both sexes.

H I G H L I G H T S

1. 88.5% of male inmates were released to parole supervision, 8.7% were discharged after expiration of their maximum sentence and only 2.8% were released for other reasons while 93.3% of female inmates were released to parole supervision, 3.8% were discharged by maximum expiration and 2.9% were released for other reasons.
2. 74.5% of male inmates released were under custody less than two years since last admission and 94.6% less than five years while 86.2% of female inmates released were under custody less than two years and 98.7% less than five years.
3. 9.2% of male inmates released had limited employability or were unable to work because of physical or other handicap, while only 6.3% of female inmates released were in this category.
4. Among male inmates participating in education programs, the median number of hours of education completed was 707 hours. Among female inmates, the median number of education hours completed was 330.
5. Among male inmates tested, the median scholastic grade achievement on release fell near the beginning of the eight grade. Among female inmates tested, the grade achievement level fell at the beginning of the sixth grade.
6. In addition to routine medical services, 61.6% of male inmates received special medical services, while 47.7% of female inmates received special medical services.
7. 66.5% of male inmates received some psychological services, while 70.3% of female inmates received some psychological services while under custody.
8. 54.3% of male inmates received some psychiatric service while under custody and 46.9% of female inmates received some psychiatric service.
