

This report is one of a series to make data available on the population in New York State Department of Correctional Services Institutions. The data in this report cover characteristics of same inmates discharged and include summary data on types of services received while under custody. Data on discharges from Matteawan State Hospital, an institution for the mentally ill, are not included in this report. The following selected items are covered in this release: Type of Release, Time Served Since Last Admission, Employability, Medical Services, Hours of Education, Grade Achievement on Release, Principal Type of Organized Vocational Training, Correction Industry Experience, Minor Discipline Reports, Major Discipline Reports, Inmates Attitude Toward Authority and Other Inmates, Psychological and Psychiatric Services and Contacts, and Service Unit Contacts. In addition, summary figures are shown for the General Confinement Facilities, Camp Adirondack, and Specialized Facilities, for these three groups combined, and for both sexes.
