

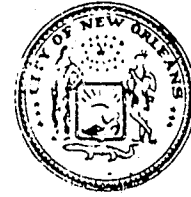


It is my privilege to submit the 1974 Annual Report of the New Orleans Police Department.

JANUARY

In January of 1974, the NOPD experienced a 2.4% increase in crime as compared to January of 1973.

As a result of "Operation Hawk", an undercover narcotics operation, 46 persons were arrested for narcotics violations.

FEBRUARY

Crime increased 17.2% in February of '74 as compared to February 1973.

The entire Department mourned the death of Police Officer Dennis J. McInerney of the Fifth District who was fatally wounded on Mardi Gras Day by a man who had just committed a crime. His partner, Police Officer John Tobin was also shot and seriously injured.

MARCH

March statistics showed a decrease in crime of 2.2% for 1974 as compared to March 1973.

As a result of the 17.2% increase in crime in February, police officers assigned to administrative duties were detailed to weekend field duties to combat this increase.

APRIL

The NOPD was pleased to report that crime statistics for the month of April 1974 as compared to April 1973 showed a decrease of 9.8%.

A major narcotics dealer was arrested by members of the Narcotics and Drug Abuse Section with more than \$50,000 of illegal narcotics seized.

MAY

Crime statistics for May 1974 as compared to May 1973 increased 13.6%.

The Urban Squad expanded its operations to cover the Fischer and St. Thomas Projects.

JUNE

In June of 1974, crime increased as compared to June 1973 statistics by 2.9%.

The coming of summer saw the formation of the "Rape Squad", men and women specially trained to investigate rapes.

JULY

In July 1974, the NOPD experienced an increase of 24.1% as compared to statistics in July of '73.

"Operation Checkmate", another narcotics undercover operation netted over 100 persons arrested for narcotics violations.

AUGUST

For the month of August 1974, an increase of 23.3% was reported as compared to August 1973.

A specially organized police strike force invaded the Vieux Carre and arrested 19 women for prostitution.

SEPTEMBER

September statistics shows a decrease of .4% as compared to those statistics reported in September 1973.

Five lieutenants were promoted to the rank of Captain. Also, a sergeant was the recipient of the Medal of Valor, the highest award given by the NOPD.

OCTOBER

Crime statistics for October of '74 as compared to October of '73 showed an increase of 36.2%.

Sixteen police officers were promoted to the rank of Sergeant.

NOVEMBER

November 1974 statistics showed an increase of 4.3% as compared to statistics for November 1973.

The NOPD's FAS members were assigned to the French Quarter area to combat the rise in panhandling by young people on the street.

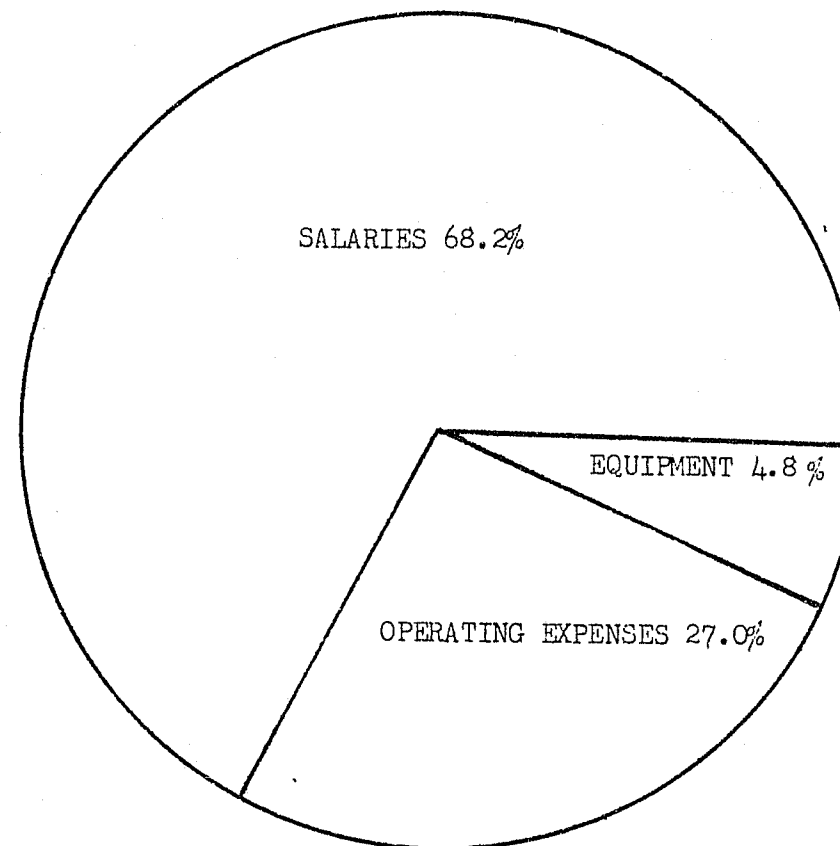
DECEMBER

A comparison report of offenses for December '74 and December '73 showed an increase of 25%.

The completed K-9 Compound was formally dedicated and named THE SERGEANT EDWIN C. HOSLI COMPOUND in memory of the slain sergeant, killed in 1973.

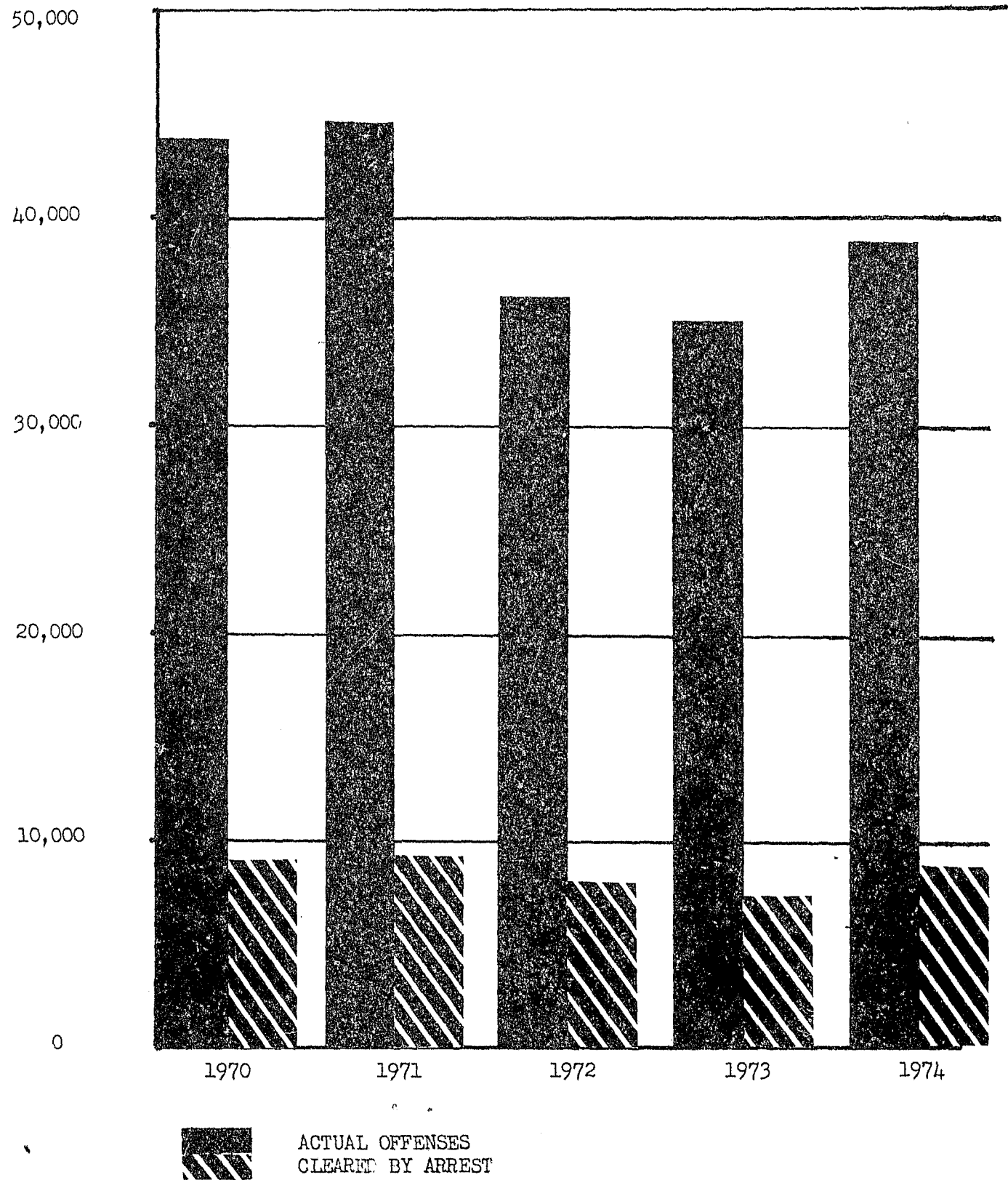

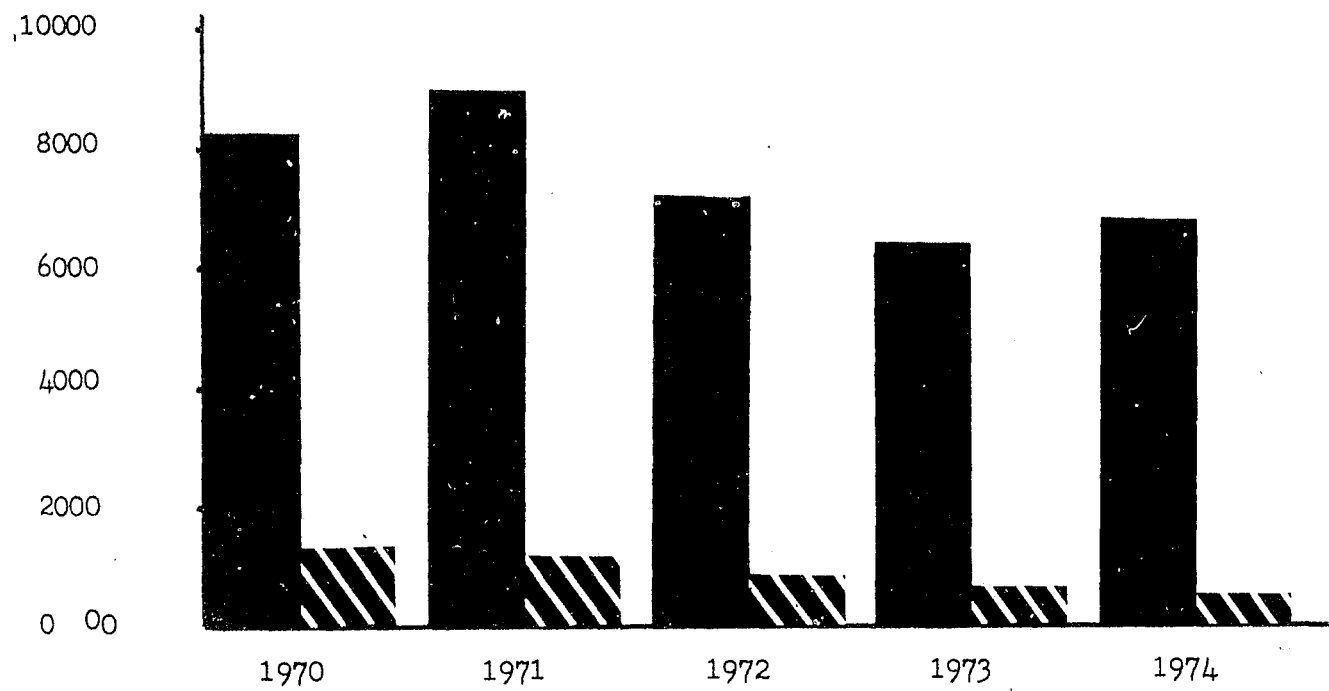






ACTUAL OFFENSES

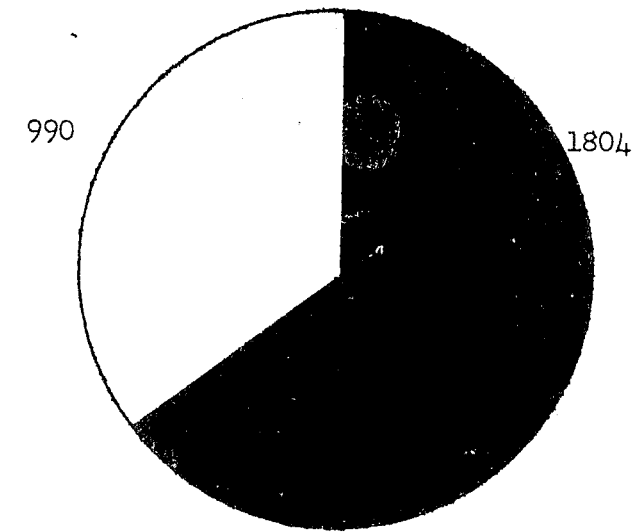

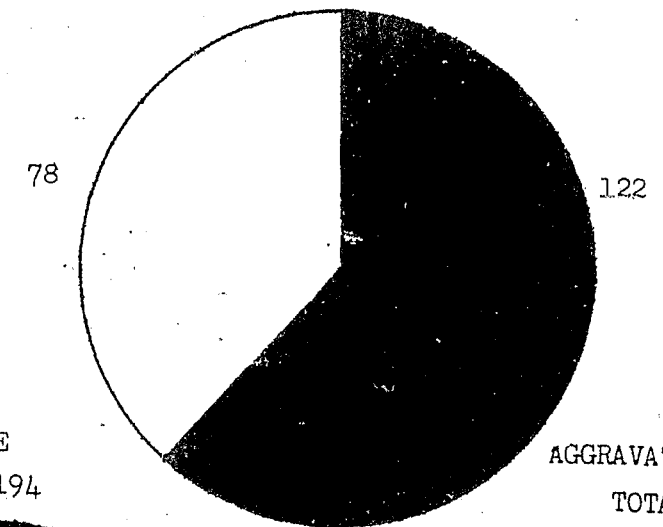

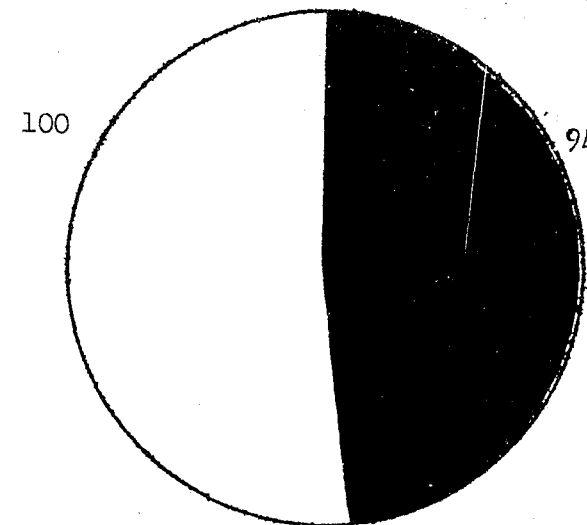
OFFENSES AFFECTING PERSONS
