## UNIFORM CRIME REPORT FORMAT CHANGE

The Federal Bureau of Investigation changed their classification format and categories for Part I and Part II Offenses, effective January, 1974. As a result of these changes, the data that was collected in 1974 was not always comparable to the data collected in previous years. The reader should be aware of the following:

(1) SIMPLE ASSAULTS

Simple Assaults are no longer classified as Part I Offenses. They are now Part II Offenses. Consequently, 1974 Part I Assaults are not comparable to Part I Assaults for previous years.

(2) LARCENY

The two Larceny categories (under \$50 and over \$50) have been changed to three categories (under \$50, \$50-\$200, and over \$200). The \$50-\$200 category is presently being used for all Larcenies over \$50. At a later date a new Departmental Final Classification Reporting Code will be used to collect Larceny statistics in all three categories.

(3) DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED

Driving While Intoxicated is now classified as a Part II Offense. An increased settlement rate for Part II Offenses will be reflected because DWI cases are reported and settled by the single act of apprehension.

(4) RUNAWAY JUVENILES

Runaway Juveniles are no longer counted as Part II Offenses. Total Part II Offenses should decrease significantly as a consequence of this change.

(5) JAIL BOOKINGS

The Jail Booking Report (Page 11) was formerly tabulated by counting the number of charges recorded. This page now reflects the number of people booked by the Department of Public Safety and does not reflect multiple charges.

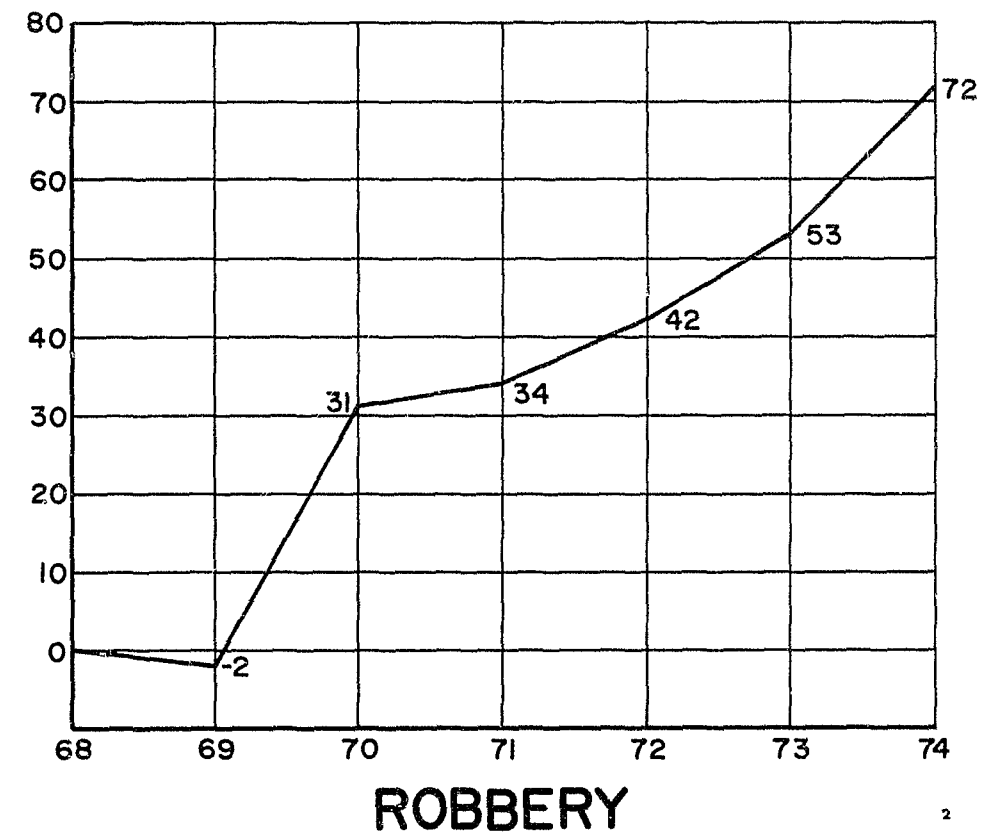

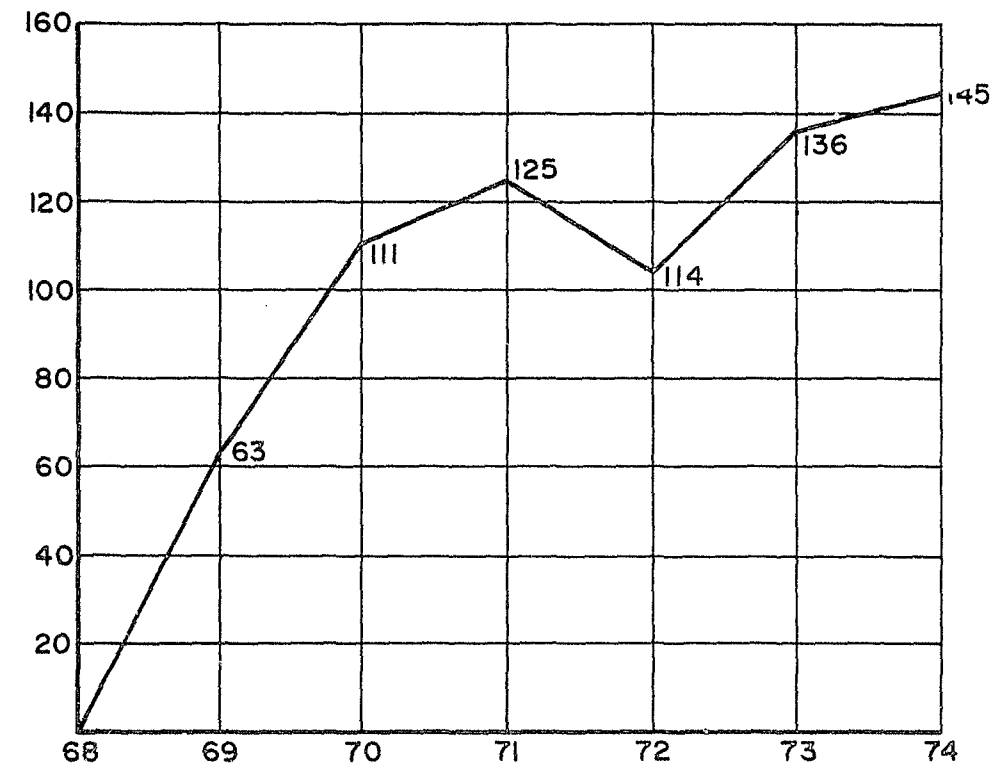

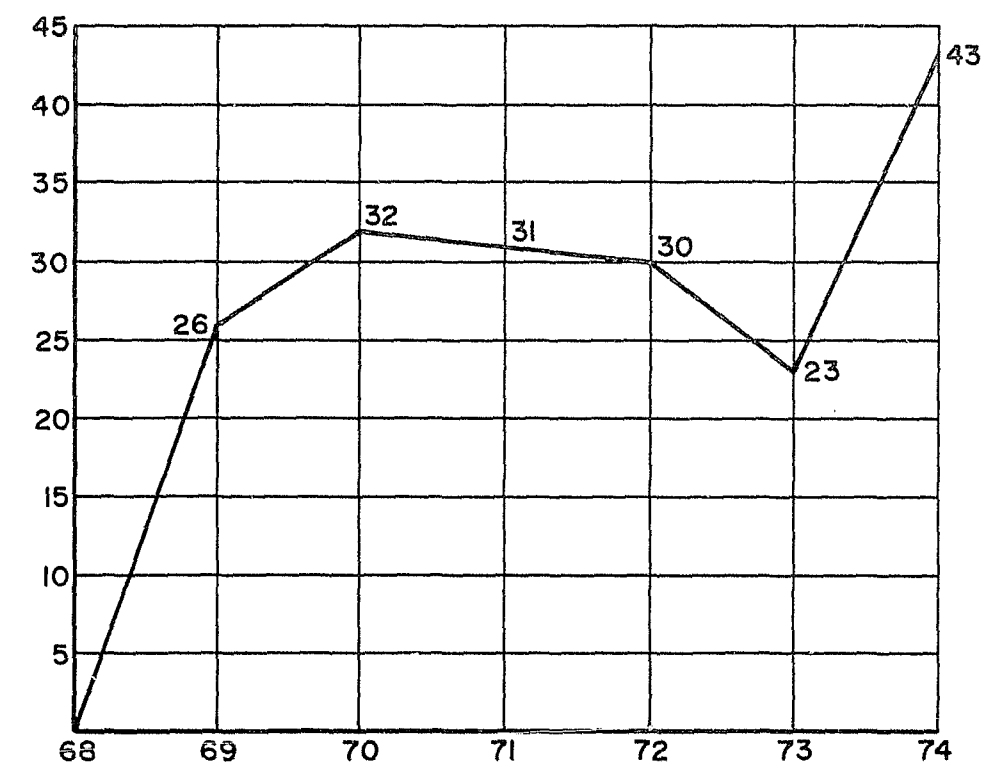
## PERCENT CHANGE (USING 1968 AS A BASE)



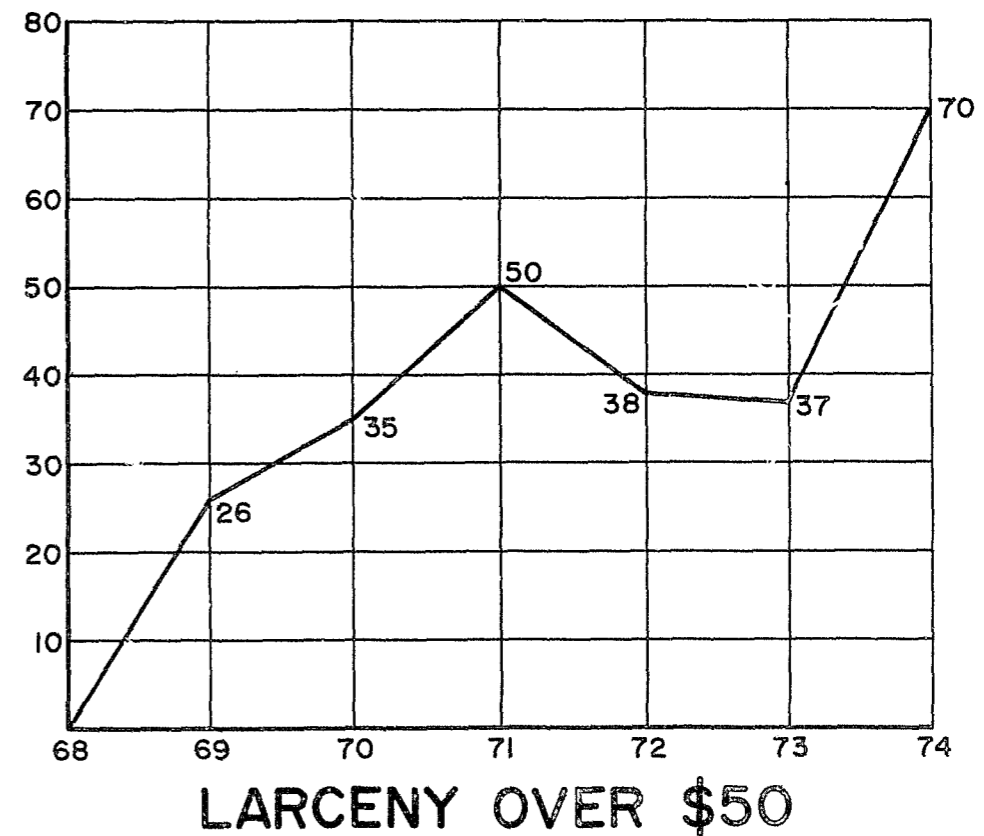


RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

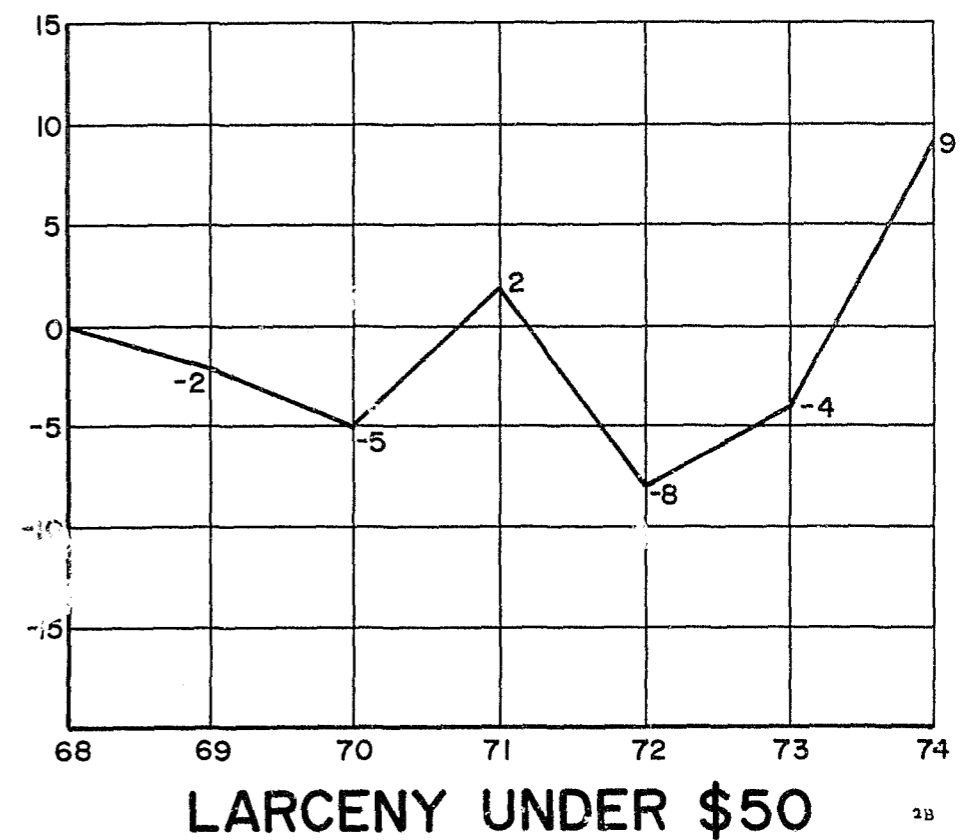
**PERCENT CHANGE  
(USING 1968 AS A BASE)**

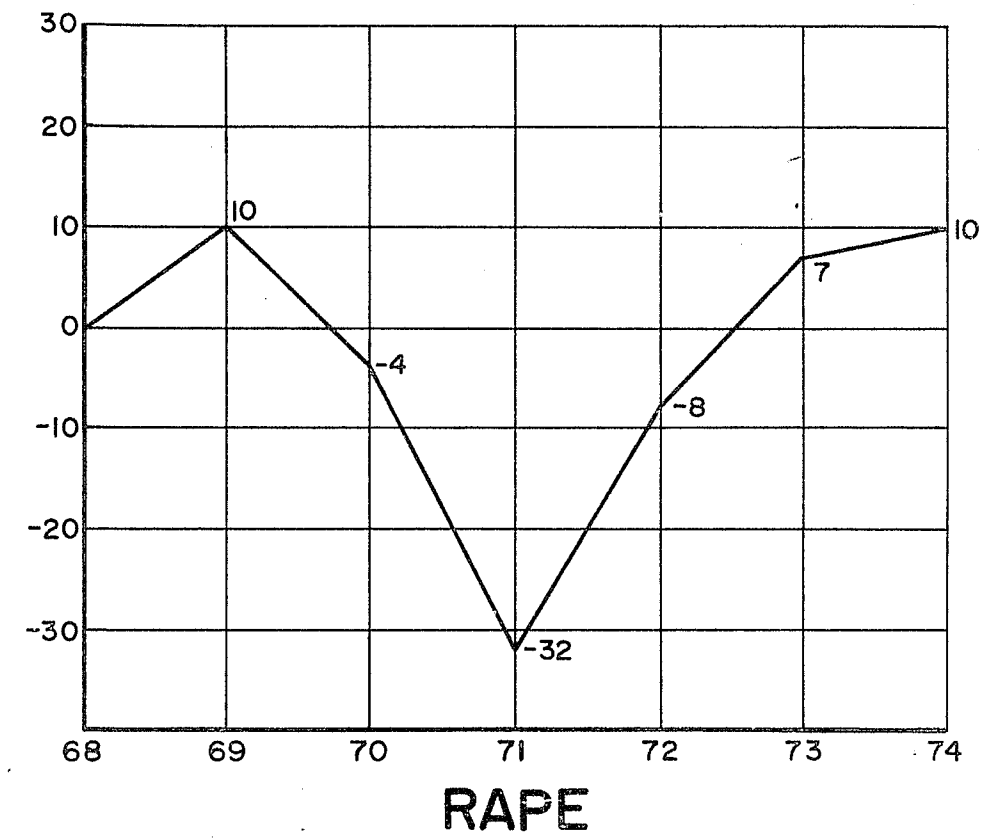


COMMERCIAL BURGLARY

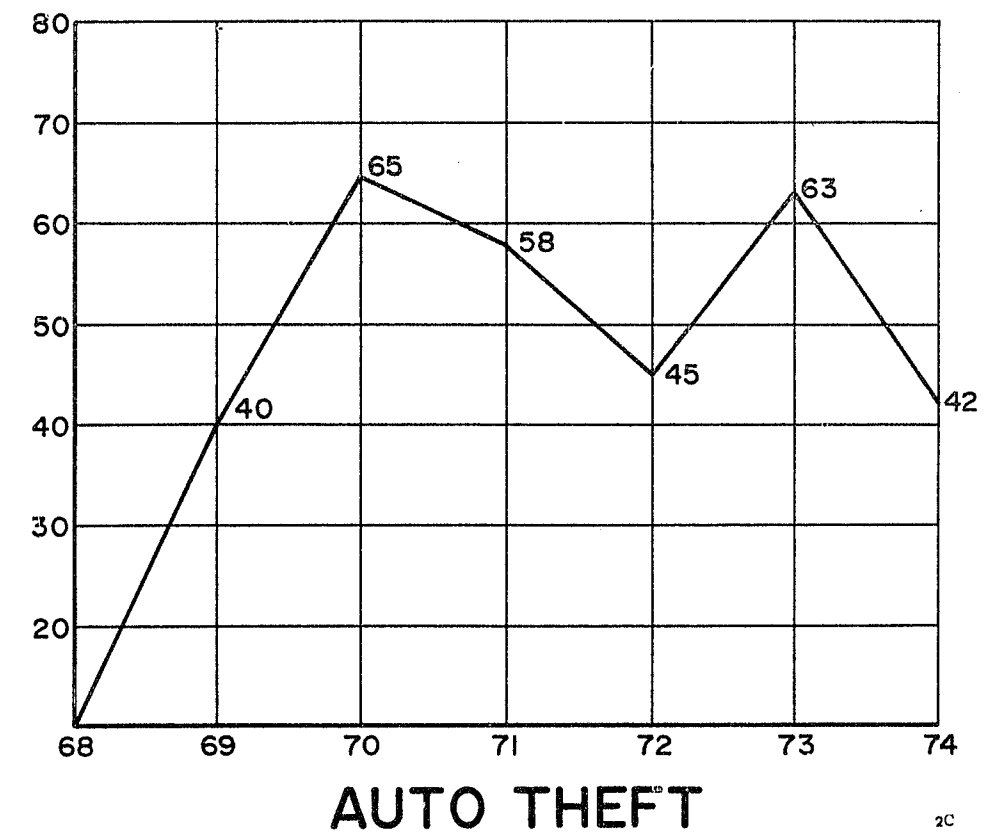


**PERCENT CHANGE  
(USING 1968 AS A BASE)**



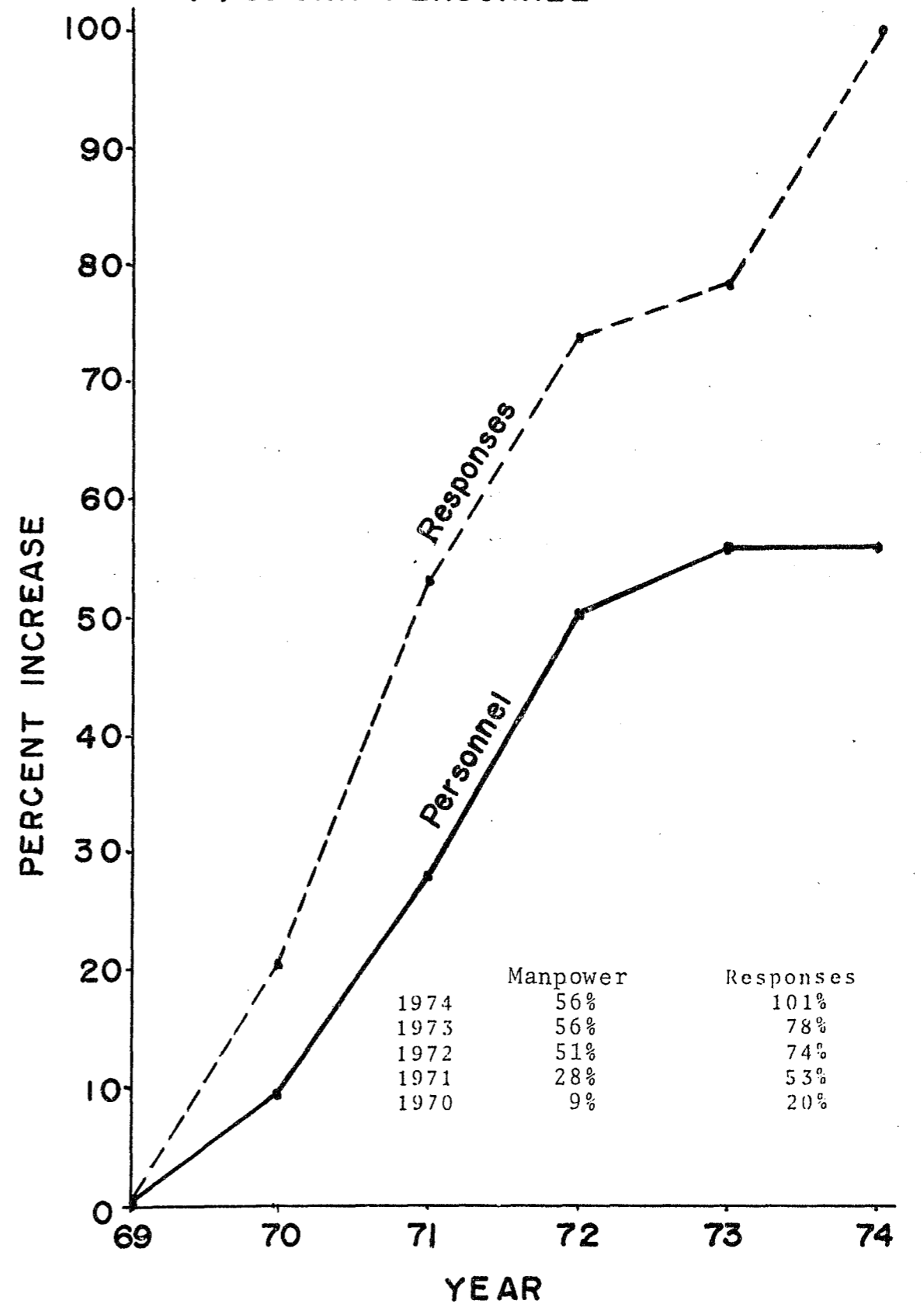


**PERCENT CHANGE

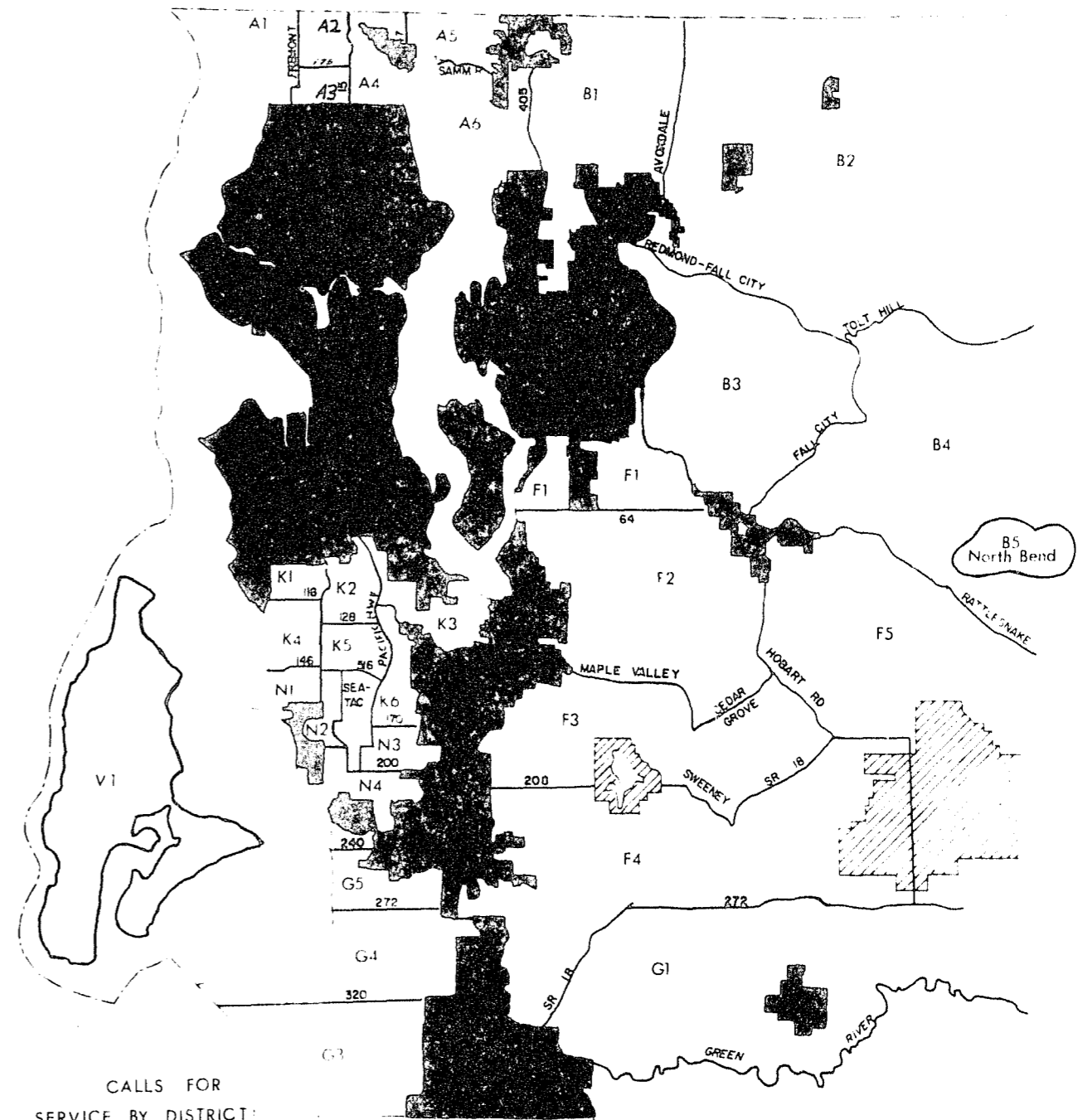

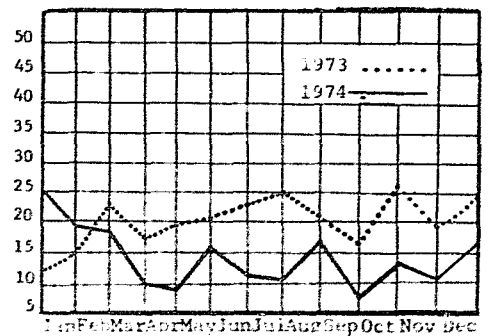
