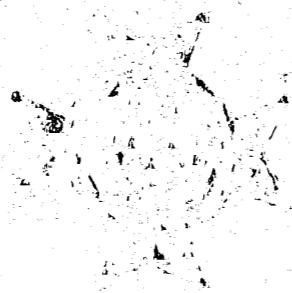

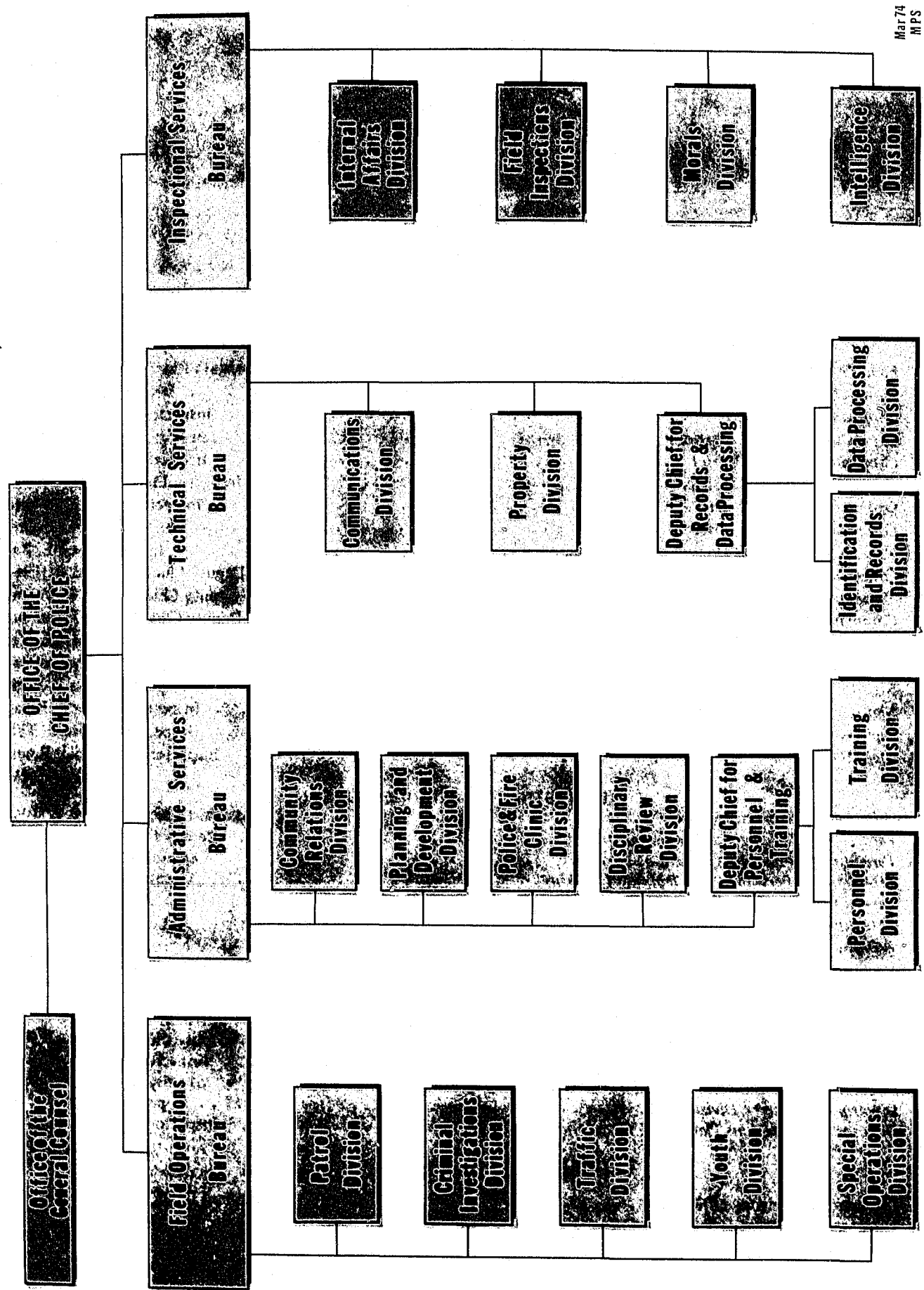

CONDENSATION OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA POLICE SALARY ACT OF 1958

As Amended - Effective August 29, 1972

SALARY SCHEDULE

The annual rates of basic compensation of the officers and members of the Metropolitan Police force of the District of Columbia shall be fixed in accordance with the following schedule of rates:

METHOD OF APPOINTMENT, ADVANCEMENT, PROMOTION AND DEMOTION

All original appointments of Police privates shall be made at the minimum rate set forth in the foregoing schedule and the first year of service shall be probationary.

The Commissioner of the District of Columbia is hereby authorized to establish and determine, from time to time, the positions to be included as Technicians in Class 1 of the foregoing schedule.

Each officer and member in service step 1, 2, or 3 of salary class 1, shall be advanced in compensation successively to the next higher service step at the beginning of the first pay period immediately subsequent to the completion of fifty-two calendar weeks of active service in his service step.

Each officer and member in service step 4 or 5 of salary class I shall be advanced in compensation successively to the next higher service step at the beginning of the first pay period immediately subsequent to the completion of one-hundred and four calendar weeks of active service in his service step.

Each officer and member in service step 6, 7, or 8 of salary class 1 shall be advanced in compensation successively to the next higher service step at the beginning of the first pay period immediately subsequent to the completion of one-hundred and fifty-six weeks of active service in his service step.

Each officer and member in salary classes 2 through 11 who has not attained the maximum service step rate of compensation for the rank or title in which he is placed shall be advanced in compensation successively to the next higher service step rate for such rank or title at the beginning of the first pay period immediately subsequent to the completion of one-hundred and four calendar weeks of active service in his service step, except that in the case of an officer or member in service step 4, 5 or 6 of salary class 2 or 3, service step 4 or 5 of salary class 4, and service step 4 of salary class 5, such officer or member shall be advanced successively to the next higher service step at the beginning of the first pay period immediately subsequent to the completion of one-hundred and fifty-six calendar weeks of active service in his service step.

Except as otherwise provided in the following paragraph, any officer or member who is promoted or transferred to a higher salary class shall receive basic compensation at the lowest scheduled rate of such higher salary class which exceeds his existing scheduled rate of basic compensation by not less than one step increase of the next higher step of the salary class from which he is promoted or transferred.

Any officer or member receiving additional compensation who is promoted or transferred to a higher salary classes all receive basic compensation at the lowest scheduled rate of such higher class which exceeds his existing scheduled rate of basic compensation by at least the sum of one step increase of the next step of the salary class from which he is promoted or transferred and the amount of such additional compensation.

In recognition of long and faithful service, each officer and member in the active service shall receive per annum, in addition to the rate of basic compensation prescribed in the salary schedule, an amount computed in accordance with the following table:

COMPLETED	HE SHALL RECEIVE PER ANNUM
15 continuous years	5 per centum of the rate of basic compensation prescribed for service step 1 of the salary schedule which he occupies.
20 years continuous service	10 per centum of such compensation
25 years continuous service	15 per centum of such compensation
30 years continuous service	20 per centum of such compensation

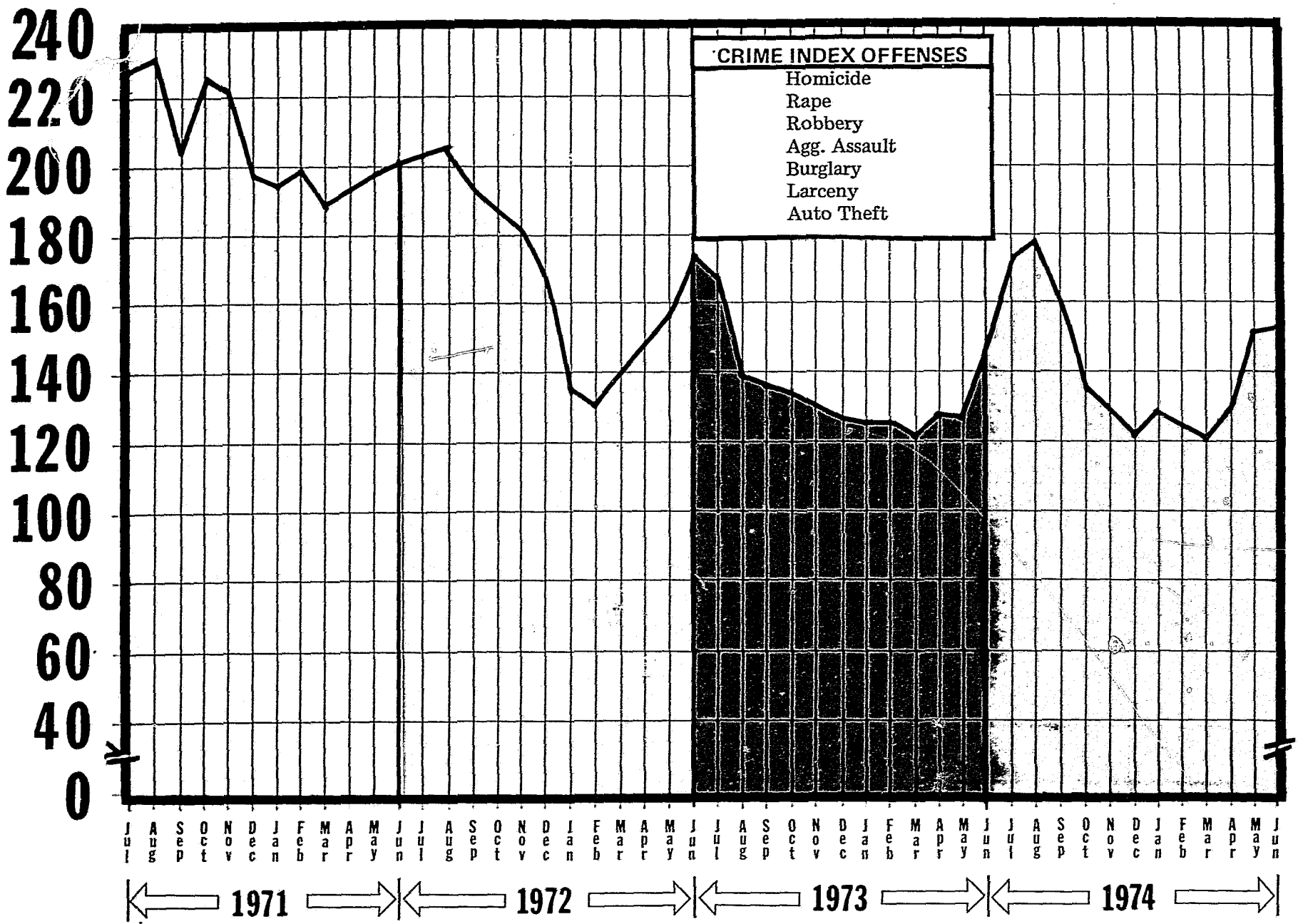

### JULY 1970 THRU CURRENT MONTH



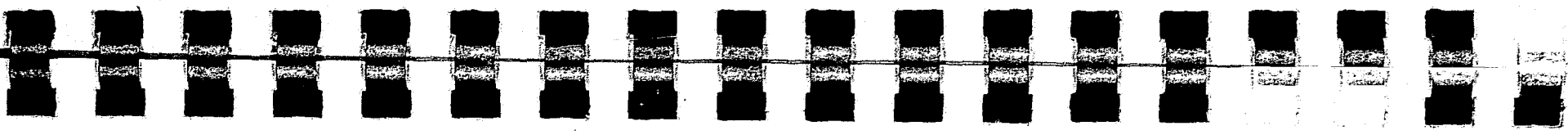

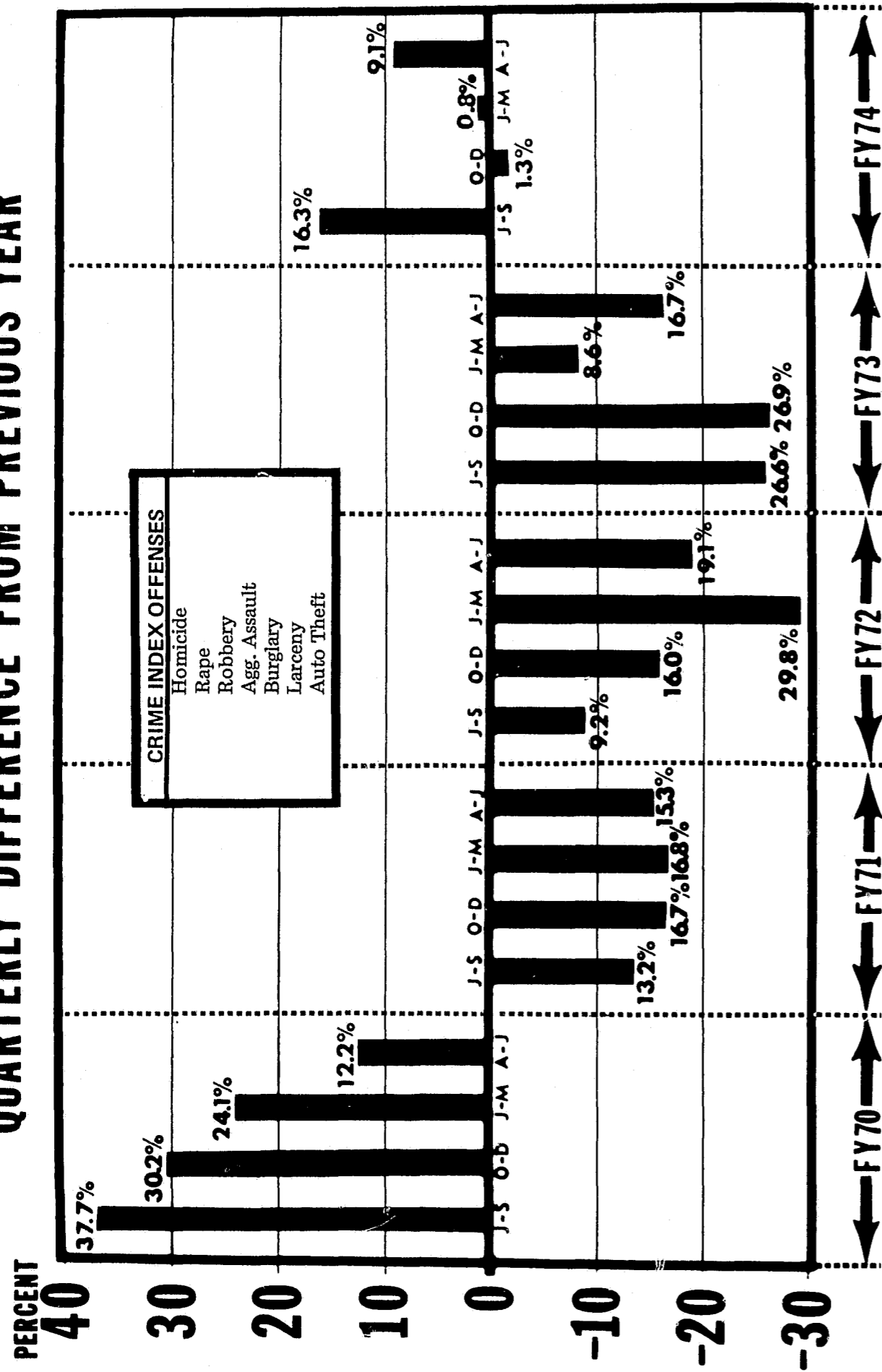

**CRIME INDEX OFFENSES SIX MONTH TOTALS**

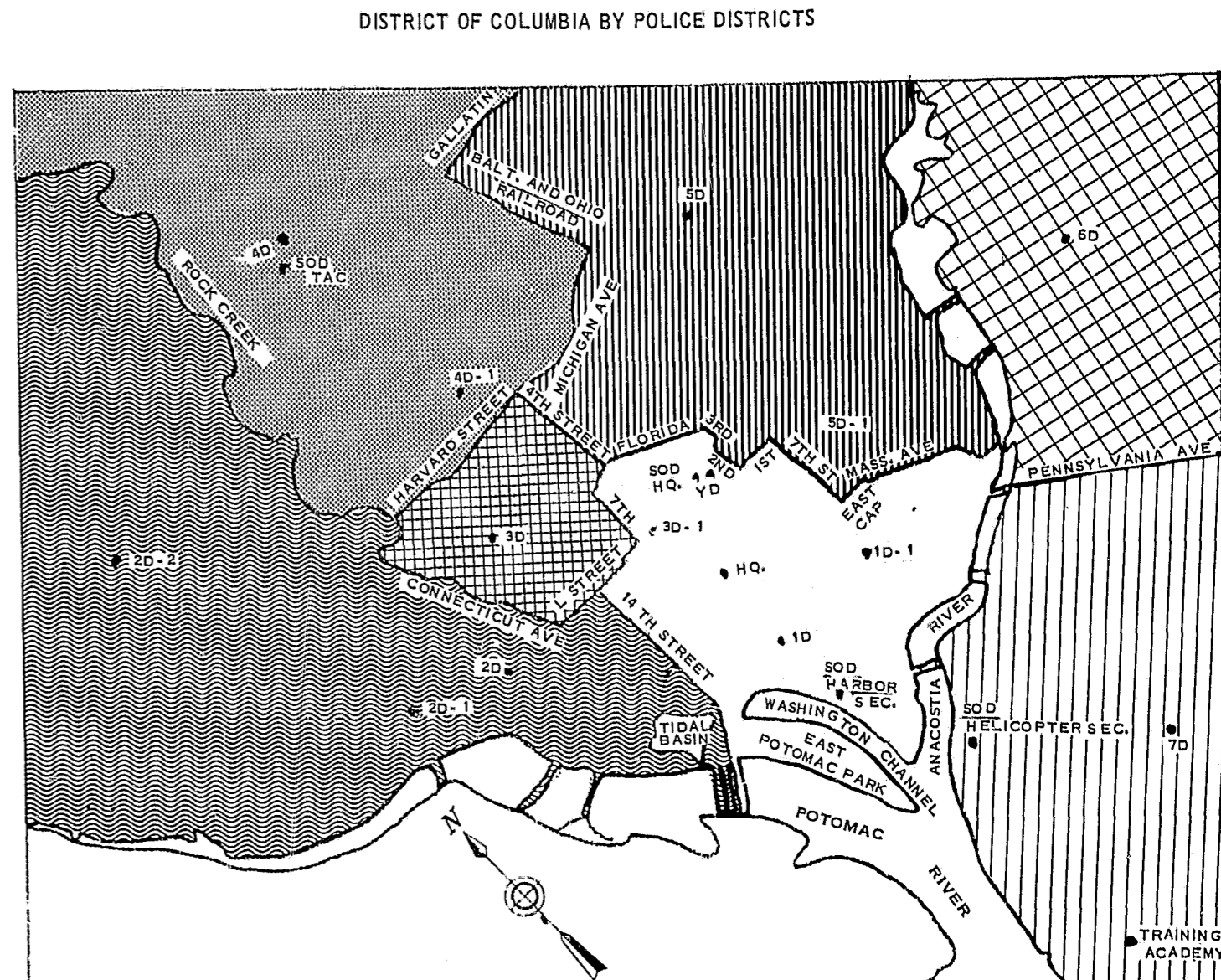
