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This monograph contains data collected by the Metropolitan Criminal Justice Center from the Juvenile Court of Polk County on official delinquency cases in 1971. During the summer and fall of 1972, officials of the Juvenile Court permitted us access to their files in order to select a 50% systematic sample of Juvenile Court cases upon whom a delinquency petition had been filed in 1971.

These data were collected in order to obtain a more thorough grasp of delinquency in Polk County. Although the data herein are of limited utility, they do provide information on delinquency which has previously not been available in grouped form on delinquency in Polk County, and is rarely available in other jurisdictions.

Obviously there has been a delay in publishing this information. During the initial stages of this research we had hoped to develop a more sophisticated statistical analysis. When some problems arose in this analysis (cross tabulations and correlation didn't appear to yield anything meaningful), we enlisted the assistance of the Drake University Sociology Department. Ultimately the professor and student working with the data both left the University, and with them the computer print-out from which the data here were taken. At that point we abandoned all hope of a monograph such as this one; later perusal of data in our files, however, resulted in the discovery of the information which forms the core of this monograph. Other data were developed from the information found at that time.

As noted above, limitations exist in these data. Ideally, cross tabulations and correlations would be included here. This is not the case, however, because of the disappearance of the original computer print-out. Further, in collecting these data, data collectors were frequently unable to find specific information in a case file, resulting in numerous cases being classed in the "unknown" category.

Where this occurs in tables below, percentages are computed both with and without the unknown cases included. Inadequacies in these data resulting from inadequacies in juvenile court records leads us to reiterate our plea for an upgrading of records maintained within the juvenile justice system.

Even with these limitations, we are presenting this information here because we maintain a belief that it can contribute to a greater understanding of the nature of delinquency, and that the information can be used in the future by planners and grant writers. During the last three years, when outside agencies wished statistical information in preparing grant applications, they frequently came to this office. Because our termination is imminent, only through monographs such as this can we hope to continue assisting in the planning and grant writing processes. Information such as this pertaining to Polk County is typically unavailable in other offices.

The final tables contained here relate to delinquency rates within census tracts of Des Moines and Polk County. Because the information contained here is based on a <u>sample</u> of 1971 official delinquency (252 of 579, or 43.5%) these rates only approximate the actual delinquency rates within a given census tract. Although we considered doubling the rates presented within the appropriate table to account for those cases upon which we did not have data, we finally came to the conclusion that this would be unwarranted. Although the presence of "N" delinquencies in a given census tract within our sample suggests the presence of approximately 2N delinquencies in the total population of delinquencies, we do not feel comfortable basing delinquency rates on the 56.5% of the population which we did not study. Thus, the delinquency rates noted below are based only on the sample which we analyzed.



POLK COUNTY DELINQUENCY RATES PER 1000 YOUTHS







TABLE XXVII
