
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

PREFACE

This report reflects the correctional system for the Commonwealth of Virginia under the administration of the Department of Welfare and Institutions before the Departmental break on July 1, 1974, at which time the Department of Corrections came into existence and assumed administration of the correctional system.

Information in this report was compiled into the following annual statistical report by the Department of Corrections, Bureau of Management Information and all questions, remarks or requests relating to the statistics should be referred to this agency.

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REPORT OF ESCAPES DURING THE PYSCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1974

NUMBER OF ESCAPES: During the figure year ended June 30, 1974, there were 513 escapes among felons in the Virginia Penal System; this was 141 more than in the previous year, an increase of 38 percent. The average number of escapes per year in the past ten years is 216.

RACE AND SEX:

Of the escapees, 57.9 percent were white males and 40.5 percent were non-white males. Three white females and five non-white females escaped during the year. Of the total felon population, 40.8 percent are white males; 56.4 percent are non-white males; .9 percent are white females and 1.9 percent are non-white females. The proportion of white males to all escapees has decreased markedly from the past two years' percentages of 62.8 percent for 1972 and 68 percent for 1973.

TIME OF DAY ESCAPED

AND ASSIGNMENT:

Escapes occurring between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. accounted for 37.3 percent or 191 of the 513 total escapes. 33.7 percent of the escapes were from inside a camp or an institution and 14.6 percent were from highway work gangs.

PAROLE STATUS:

41.7 percent of the escapees had not become eligible for parole at the time of escape; 44 or 8.5 percent had been denied parole less than three months prior to their escape.

LENGTH OF SENTENCE: 14.6 percent or 75 escapees were serving sentences of twenty years or more as compared to 25.8 percent of the total felon population.

TIME SERVED PRIOR TO ESCAPE:

Of the escapes 20.1 percent occurred within the first year of the prisoner's confinement, and 52.8 percent within the first two years.

TIME LEFT TO SERVE AT TIME OF ESCAPE:

At the time of escape, 246 or 48 percent of the escapees had less than three years to serve. Of these 67 had less than one year to serve and 163 had less than two years. Sixty of the escapees had detainers or were to be tried for other offenses.

AGE OF ESCAPEES:

The median age of escapees was 26.5 years. One hundred ninety seven or 38.4 percent of the escapees were under 25 and 67.3 percent under thirty years of age.

PREVIOUS RECORD:

Prior felon sentences had been served by 63.5 percent of the 513 escapees, 23.9 percent had an adult record, but had not served a sentence in a state penal institution. 57.3 percent had a juvenile record; 52 or 10.1 percent had no previous record.

PRIOR ESCAPES:

One hundred fifty-one or 29.4 percent of the prisoners had escaped one or more times previously,

CUSTODY STATUS:

Trusty status had been given to 69 percent of the escapees.

EDUCATION AND INTELLIGENCE:

An education level of the fifth grade or higher was reported for 344 or 67.1 percent of the escapees to whom an education test was given. An I.Q. of ninety (Normal) or above was reported for 61.2 percent of those who escaped as compared to 59.3 percent of the total felon population.

INSTITUTION:

Escapees assigned to Correctional Field Units at the time of escape accounted for 82.8 percent of the escapes.

TIME ESCAPEE REMAINED FREE:

Within 24 hours, 181 or 35.3 percent of those who escaped were recaptured or surrendered; 67.1 percent remained free less than thirty days. One hundred twenty-five or 24.4 percent of those who escaped during fiscal year 1974 remained at large on June 30, 1974.
