## PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to present to County Correctional Administrators summary data on all county prisons and jails currently in operation within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. These data may be used to compare one county prison with another county prison or prisons within the same county classification. These data may also be used to compare correctional statistics of your county with correctional statistics of surrounding counties or with the State as a whole. Several tables on population counts and movements cover a five year period that may be used for trend analysis.

## SOURCES OF DATA

The summary data presented in this report were compiled from the following report forms: (1) JBC-124, Inspection Evaluation Report, in the Special Services Division of the Bureau of Correction, and (2) JCJS-526, JCJS-527, and JCJS-528, County Prison Statistics Reports, in the Bureau of Criminal Justice Statistics of the Governor's Justice Commission. The accuracy of the data presented in this report is depended upon the accuracy of the data submitted by each County prison and jail. Data for the Allegheny County Workhouse (deactivated during March, 1971) and the Westmoreland County Prison (absorbed by the Bureau of Correction on April 21, 1969) are not presented in the entire report. This report concerns itself with only the 68 county prisons and jails currently in operation.
