

PREFACE

This report reflects the correctional system for the Commonwealth of Virginia under the administration of the Department of Welfare and Institutions before the Departmental break on July 1, 1974. At which time the Department of Corrections came into existence and assumed administration of the correctional system.

Information in this report was compiled into the following annual statistical report by the Department of Corrections, Bureau of Management Information and all questions, remarks or requests relating to the statistics should be referred to this agency.

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PERSONS RELEASED FROM PAROLE BY DISCHARGE OR VIOLATION FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1974

There are twenty-one Probation and Parole districts used by the Commonwealth of Virginia: each has the responsibility of supervising those parolees who are under its jurisdiction.

The information in this report is separated into two categories: 1. parolees discharged from parcle 2. parolees who violated parole. The data on the parolees were submitted to this Bureau by the parole officers in charge of each respective case.

Parole Violators

Violators of parole (326) accounted for 27.3 percent of the total persons discharged from or violating parole in this fiscal year. The highest number of violations (80) occurred in District One, while districts Four, Eight, and Eighteen reported no violators. Of all violators reported, 40.2 percent committed felonies; 31.9 percent absconded; 15.9 percent broke regulation and 12.0 percent committed misdemeanors. When comparing by district the type of violations that were committed, district One had the highest number committing felonies (35) and the highest number who absconded (34). District One equaled District Fourteen in number of persons committing acts of misdemeanant nature (5). The district having the greatest number of broken regulations was the Third, with nine cases.

Twelve persons who violated parole were female and 314 were male. The violators were 62.3 percent non-white and 37.7 percent white. Commitments for non-white by type ranged from 92 or 45.3 percent on felony offenses to 23 or 11.3 percent on misdemeanor charges. The white population varied from a high of 49 or 39.8 percent in abscondings, to a low of 16 or 13 percent for misdemeanors.

Married persons violating parole numbered 38 as compared to the 198 single violators. Statistically the single persons were 60.7 percent of the violators, while those married, living with their spouse, were only 11.7 percent. Evaluation of the marital status Table XII and its relation to parole violators shows that 88 percent or 287 of those violating parole were not married living together (i.e. single, separated, divorced, widow(er)).

The median length of sentence for parole violators at the time of parole, including any additional sentence received after commitment, was five years. The most frequent length of sentence was four years with 50 persons carrying this sentence, while the five year sentence was very close with 49 occurrences.

Parolees Discharged

Virginia discharged 866 persons from the supervision of the Division of Probation and Parole Services. There were an additional 261 persons on parole from the Virginia Penal System who resided in other states at the time of their discharge or at the time they were deceased. This report does not reflect those persons who had established residence outside Virginia, since these parolees report to parole offices in other localities.

The breakdown by race and sex for those discharged within the state showed that 94.5 percent were male, with 5.5 being female. The non-white population accounted for 57.5 percent of the total, while the white race represented 42.5 percent.

For the parolees discharged, the mean for the educational achievement test score was 6.7 or very close to a seventh grade level. The median for this group was also the seventh grade, with the mode of 111 individuals also falling within this level. The educational test level is representative of the inital test given these persons at time of commitment to the system.

At the time of their last conviction in the Commonwealth 24 percent of the parolees discharged were serving a sentence for Burglary, or Breaking and Entering, while sixteen percent had convictions on Violation of Narcotic Laws and fifteen percent had a sentence for Robbery or Attempted Robbery. Together these three categories of offenses accounted for more than fifty percent of the parolees discharged.

At the time of parole 169 parolees who were later discharged had a total sentence of three years. They constituted 19.5 percent of all discharges from parole in this fiscal year. Those serving a total sentence of five years numbered 137, or 15.8 percent of all discharges. When observing discharged parolees on a whole, 592 or 68.4 percent of them were serving a sentence of five years or less. It is interesting to note that 16 or 1.8 percent of the 866 persons discharged from parole had been committed to the system on a life sentence.

Prior to being paroled 82 percent of the parolees discharged had served less than five years of their sentence. At time of parole the remaining sentence to be served was less than five years for 82.7 percent of all parolees discharged. In both prison time served prior to parole and time remaining when paroled, the "over one year, less than 3 years" category accounted for 40.7 percent and 44.5 percent of the parolees, respectively. The median length of time for parole supervision for those discharged was 13 to 18 months.

Single parolees represent 51.7 percent of all parolee discharges, while the married person comprises only 20.3 percent. The discharges show a strong contrast to parole violators in the field of marital status. The unmarried parolees (single, separated, divorced, widow(er)) accounted for 79.3 percent of all discharges. For the intelligence of the parolees discharged the mode is in the 90 to 109 or normal range. These persons (33) combined with the bright normal (100) and superior (26) make up 53 percent of all parolees discharged in Fiscal Year 73-74.
