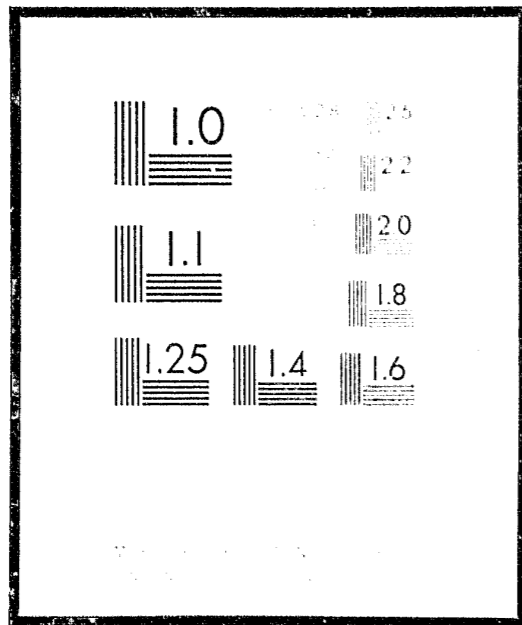

This bulletin contains descriptive information pertaining to juveniles admitted to Wisconsin's juvenile correctional institutions during calendar year 1975.

New admissions for girls decreased 37 percent in 1975 as compared with 1974. This decline, which started in 1971 when girls were no longer institutionalized for truancy and running away, weighed heavily in the decision to close the Wisconsin School for Girls at Oregon.

New admissions for juvenile male state probation violators increased 57 percent in 1975 over 1974. Female admission declined slightly in 1975. The "apparent" increase in the male rate of admission must be viewed with caution. The three-year period this information has been available is not deemed long enough to draw conclusive assumptions.
