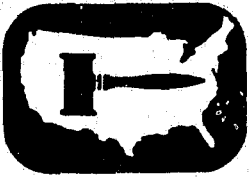

The Ohio Judicial Conference sends from 50 to 65 judges each year to programs sponsored by the National College, the American Academy, and an occasional law school graduate program. We pay tuition and round trip coach airfare only to each judge. Some get local reimbursement on balance - a few cannot. We send only judges - no administrators, referees, probation people, only Judges.

Each judge can select his own program, we do limit any judge to one trip per year -- and insist that the program deal at least in part with a criminal justice related subject -- this rules out probate practice, family law, and even opinion writing (by our criteria). This is handled by an LEAA education grant - renewed each year - so far we have been able to send every judge requesting help.

APPENDIX B

## INSTRUCTION SHEET

The enclosed survey should be completed with brief, yet explicit, information for documentation of your state's judicial education programs. The questionnaire should be completed in accordance with the guidelines below to provide consistency in our data collection. The Instruction Sheet provides guidance for completion of the survey.

The survey consists of three separate parts. Part I includes an instrument which is designed to elicit descriptive information on individual educational programs. Part II focuses on utilization of national programs. The third part deals with program recommendations for other states.

The Instruction Sheet contains information on each part of the survey to be completed. If you find that parts of the survey are not applicable to your situation, please indicate this by using the letters N/A. Read the entire Instruction Sheet before completing any part of the survey.

In Part I, please use one survey sheet per program presented. It would be most helpful to us if you could photocopy one of the enclosed survey instruments so that you would have an adequate supply to meet your particular needs.

PLEASE NOTE: This survey should contain information relative only to the past three years of educational programming (1974-76).

Part I: Program Descriptions

This part of the survey should be completed by utilizing the enclosed instrument for concise and consistent documentation. Each program presented over the past three years should be documented individually unless an identical program was held more than one time during one year. The various sections for the instrument are defined as follows:

1. Category Numbers: Judicial education programs (which also include programs for court support staff) have been divided into categories with numerous subcategories. A list which defines these categories and subcategories is attached. Each program has a category and subcategory identification number which should be placed on the survey document. If a program could be included in more than one category, please list all pertinent category numbers.
2. State: Name of State
3. Program Title and Date: Please list the title given to the program and the date it took place.
4. Target Group: Indicate the group of court personnel for which the program was structured. If there was more than one group, list each. For example, the audience might have consisted of only judges, or both judges and probation officers, or judges and corrections officers, etc. Include attendance figures for the program consisting of the number of persons invited to attend and the number who actually attended.

6. Cooperation: If the program was a cooperative presentation with a national organization, in-state agency, or other organization, please list the name of that organization or agency.
7. Program Purpose: In two or three sentences, describe what purpose was to be accomplished by presenting this program. For example, if the program was structured so as to provide information only, you would indicate that it was an informational program on new laws, procedures, regulations, etc. Another purpose could be the interchange of ideas and opinions through small group discussions or problem solving sessions. There are many others.

8. Program Format: List all formats utilized within the program, such as lectures, small group workshops, seminars, etc.

9. Evaluation Format: Check the appropriate formal or informal format used for evaluation. If "other" is checked, please describe it in one or two words.

10. Facility: Please describe the facility used for the program in one or two words such as "hotel," "university," or "conference facility."

11. Cost: Indicate the estimated or actual cost of the program, exclusive of staff costs or other such overhead or indirect items.

12. Funding Source: Please indicate the funding source of the program or a combination of sources, if applicable. If a combination of sources was used, please indicate the percentage contribution of each.

13. Number of Times Presented: If an identical program was presented more than one time during a given year, indicate how many times the program was present. Please adjust all figures to show total attendance, cost, facilities used, dates, etc.

14. Rating: Rate the program using the criteria listed under Part III for Program Recommendations.
