



The Ohio Judicial Conference sends from 50 to 65 judges each year to programs sponsored by the National College, the American Academy, and an occassional law school graduate program. We pay tuition and round trip coach airfare only to each judge. Some get local reimbursement on balance - a few cannot. We send only judges - no administrators, referees, probation people, only Judges.

Each judge can select his own program, we do limit any judge to <u>one</u> trip per year -- and insist that the program deal at least in part with a criminal justice related subject -- this rules out probate practice, family law, and even opinion writing (by our criteria). This is handled by an LEAA education grant - renewed each year - so far we have been able to send every judge requesting help.



The survey consists of three separate parts. Part I includes an instrument which is designed to elicit descriptive information on individual educational programs. Part II focuses on utilization of national programs. The third part deals with program recommendations for other states.

The Instruction Sheet contains information on each part of the survey to be completed. If you find that parts of the survey are not applicable to your situation, please indicate this by using the letters N/A. Read the entire Instruction Sheet before completing any part of the survey.

In Part I, please use one survey sheet per program presented.

It would be most helpful to us if you could photocopy one of the enclosed survey instruments so that you would have an adequate supply to meet your particular needs.

PLEASE NOTE: This survey should contain information relative only to the past three years of educational programming (1974-76).

Part I: Program Descriptions

This part of the survey should be completed by utilizing the enclosed instrument for concise and consistent documentation.

Each program presented over the past three years should be documented individually unless an identical program was held more than one time during one year. The various sections for the instrument are defined as follows:

- l. Category Numbers: Judicial education programs (which also include programs for court support staff) have been divided into categories with numerous subcategories. A list which defines these categories and subcategories is attached. Each program has a category and subcategory identification number which should be placed on the survey document. If a program could be included in more than one category, please list all pertinent category numbers.
 - 2. State: Name of State
- 3. Program Title and Date: Please list the title given to the program and the date it took place.
