

No segment of the business community is more susceptible to or provides more opportunities for thievery, fraud and other crimes than retail stores, where estimated losses this year are expected to exceed \$8 billion.

Because of upsurging crime and violence, adequate safeguards have become a matter of growing concern of shopping center management.

Burns Security Institute, a crime research unit devoted to studies in the private, commercial and institutional areas, conducted a nationwide survey to determine the extent of mall protection problems and their possible solution.

The Institute is most grateful for the cooperation of the 263 shopping center officials who participated. The resulting report puts a timely focus on existing security conditions and what can be done to improve them.

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#### OVERVIEW

Mushrooming offenses against persons and property are impelling shopping centers to seek better answers to their day-to-day security problems. This quest for protection improvement is reflected in the response by 263 centers to a 74-point questionnaire seeking information on physical security matters.

Responding centers range in size from under 100,000 to 1,000,000 square feet and occupy a total of more than 103,869,000 square feet.

Some 12,760 retailers, including 735 department stores, are tenants.

Crime deterrents are widely applied. All but a relatively few centers employ guards either full or part time and most have electronic anti-intrusion and fire alarm systems.

Two hundred thirty eight respondents cite 13 dominant security problem areas. Somewhat fewer, 209, believe they have solutions, more than half of which revolve around upgrading security personnel.

Statistical sections of this report are arranged by shopping center size, enabling comparison of individual mall safeguards with the profiles for others of approximately the same square footage.

Per centage figures for statistical sections reflect only actual responses. Unanswered questions, or segments of questions that are unanswered, are not weighted.

#### SECURITY SUPERVISION

Although all but a few malls employ uniformed guards or off duty police, the survey indicates a big gap in responsible supervision. Three of ten malls have full time security directors; two of ten operations managers devoting more than half time to overseeing protection. The rest must rely in good measure on the judgment and efficiency of security personnel, and their ability to react to changing situations on their own.

Of 88 full time security directors, 74 are employed by centers 300,000 square feet and larger.

#### GUARD FORCES

More than half the reporting centers employ in-house guards; nearly four of ten use contract security services, and three of ten hire off duty police. Some eight of ten have both full and part time guards.

In-house guards dominate at complexes 300,000 square feet and larger while contract guards are in majority at smaller centers. About half the guards are armed.

All centers employ male guards; one of three females, as well.

More than eight of ten centers prefer conventional uniforms for their crime deterrent value while the others garb security personnel in soft-look blazers.

Eight of ten have foot patrols, seven of ten motorized patrols. There are somewhat more night patrols than day ones.

## ELECTRONIC SAFEGUARDS

Regardless of size, most centers include electronic protection as an integral part of operations. Eight of ten have anti-intrusion and fire alarm proprietary systems --those monitored on mall premises. About four of ten have backup monitoring at central station alarm facilities; three of ten at fire stations, and two of ten at police stations. In addition, seven of ten centers connect tenant stores to their alarm systems.

Seventy seven centers 400,000 square feet and larger augment their alarm systems with two way radios or public address systems, or both. Only four smaller malls have these electronic aids.

#### CONTINGENCY PLANS

One hundred thirty seven centers, or six of ten, have contingency plans -- written programs that define courses of action in responding to emergencies, accidents and crimes. However, 90

of the 137 programs, or eight of ten, are for larger malls -- those in excess of 400,000 square feet, where professionals often are in charge of security.

# BACKGROUND CHECKS

The nature of the work entrusted to security guards makes mandatory thorough checking of their employment histories and reliability.

Somewhat more than half the reporting centers, roughly equivalent to the per centage of those having in-house guards, follow this practice.

Such background investigation is not required of off duty police or contract guard services, which screen their own employees.

#### MALL CRIMES

More than half the reporting centers indicate they maintain strict records of all mall crimes. Yet, in contrast, many do not disclose requested full year crime statistics in various categories, presumably because they regard this information as highly confidential.

#### RELATIONS WITH POLICE

Maintaining rapport with police, who respond to actual arrest situations and provide motorized parking lot patrols for most centers, evidently gets high priority. Seven of ten malls rate this rapport as excellent. All but a few of the others see it as good.

# CRIME PREVENTION ACTIVITIES

Some four of ten malls take active roles in tenant crime prevention education; two of ten in providing special investigation services. Seven of ten disseminate information to retailers inside and outside malls on known shoplifters, bad check passers and other swindlers.

# SECURITY IMPROVEMENT

Shopping centers are involved in a see-saw contest against mall crimes, but there are more winners than losers, the survey shows. About half the cooperating malls report their security problems are about the same as they were five years ago. Of the remainder, three of ten see these problems as decreased and two of ten as increased.

Larger malls, the 400,000 square feet-plus ones which have most of the well-administered protection programs, show significant advances. Thirty one have decreased problems compared to ten with increased problems.

Smaller size malls reverse the trend with 28 having increased problems as opposed to only 14 with abated problems.

Despite overall improvement, six of ten larger malls are not content with their security and believe it can be further improved. On the other hand, only four of ten smaller centers with spottier records, are convinced their security can be improved.

SECURITY PROBLEMS Shopping centers, responsible for safeguarding common areas, list Shoplifting, over which they have little direct control, as their Number One security problem. This is possibly because of detention and arrest complexities and pressures from tenant retailers who suffer the losses.

Others in descending order of double-digit mentions include Loitering/Drinking, Vandalism, Parking Lot Thefts, Too Few Parking Spaces and Unqualified Guards.

# SUGGESTED SOLUTIONS

By a wide margin, mall management ranks Better Guards -- better trained, better paid and more of them -- as the prime answer to protection weaknesses. Next ranking solutions include Better Tenant Cooperation, Better Police Cooperation, More/Better Lighting and More Walkie-Talkies.

#### CONCLUSIONS

At nearly seven of ten shopping centers, security gets part-time attention from executives who have other primary duties. Many officials lack the expertise, as well as the time, to give security the direction it demands.

Public safety and tenant protection require that steps be taken to formalize security as a professional function. Without proper guidance, even the best-trained guard forces are apt to fall short on performance. If at all possible, the security responsibility should be placed in the hands of an experienced full-time security director. Efficient operations bring economies and declining protection problems that could well save more than the cost of directors' salaries.

Centers that cannot budget for security directors should attempt to enlist the aid of local, county or state police in training their in-house guards on crowd control and foot and vehicle patrol procedures and should utilize the local Red Cross on first aid instruction.

Junior colleges and others give evening courses for security guards covering these and other matters, such as basic instruction on laws of arrest, search and seizure and evidence, essential tutoring for security personnel. Underwriting of instruction costs is well worth while since it results in upgraded guard forces.


When outside security services are retained, mall management should make certain that contractors understand the problems peculiar to shopping center operations and that they properly train, screen and supervise guards assigned.

In connection with guard assignments, malls should ask police or qualified security specialists to survey and custom-tailor programs blueprinting proper levels of security and designating specific guard posts.


Benefits of a well-administered security program, politely but firmly enforced by responsible guard personnel, are quite evident. Orderly malls enjoy a growing reputation with families who shop in confidence there and tenant stores that enjoy increased traffic.

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
# **5 YEAR SECURITY PROBLEMS**




## **SECURITY CONTROLS**


