

<u>HIGHLIGHTS</u>

ACQUISITIONS

- 1. Admissions to state supervised adult probation decreased slightly from 8,343 in 1975 to 8,124 in 1976. (See Table 1.)
- All Wisconsin counties placed adults under Division of Corrections probation supervision in 1976. Usage ranged from Milwaukee County (2,796 cases) to Pepin County (5 cases). (See Table 2.)
- 3. Slightly more than one-fifth (22 percent) of the adults placed on probation had been convicted of drug law violations. (See Table 3.)
- 4. One-half of the men and women placed under supervision received sentences of less than two years. (See Table 5.)
- Six out of 10 persons placed under supervision were under 25 years of age. (See Table 6.)
- 6. About four-fifths of the men and three-fifths of the women receiving probation sentences in 1976 were white. (See Table 7.)
- 7. Six out of 10 men and five out of 10 women were reported as being single at the time of placement on probation. (See Table 8.)
- About two-fifths (41 percent) of the men and three-fifths of the women placed under supervision were reported to be unemployed. (See Table 9.)
- About 10 percent of the men and women were reported to be earning under \$200.00 per month at time of placement on probation. (See Table 10.)

Wisconsin's judges may elect to sentence persons convicted of felonies (including murder) and misdemeanors to probation under the supervision of the State Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Corrections. Convicted felons may be placed on probation for not less than one year nor for more than the statutory maximum term of imprisonment for the crime, or for three years, whichever is greater. Misdemeanants may be placed on probation for not more than two years.

Adults from all of Wisconsin's 72 counties were placed under Division of Corrections probation supervision in calendar year 1976. Nine counties (Barron, Calument, Iowa, Iron, Langlade, Oconto, Pepin, Price, and Waushara) did not place any women under supervision in 1976. Five counties (Milwaukee, 2,796 cases; Waukesha, 440 cases; Dane, 371 cases; Rock, 352 cases; and Racine, 341 cases) accounted for slightly more than one-half (53 percent) of all admissions.

Eight of 10 persons placed on probation were men.

Offenses for which persons were placed on probation in 1976 have been grouped into five major categories: offenses against persons, property offenses, drug offenses, sex offenses, and all other offenses. Tables 4 through 11 are arranged so that comparisons may be made among persons in the five major categories in terms of characteristics such as length of sentence, marital status, etc.

Type of Disposition

There are three types of disposition possible in a probation case: an imposed and stayed sentence, a withheld sentence, and probation without conviction. An imposed and stayed sentence is one in which the court sentences the individual to a specified period of time in a correctional institution, stays the sentence, and places the individual on probation. If an alleged probation violation then occurs and revocation is recommended by the probation and parole agent, the person has the right to request an administrative hearing. If, as a result of this hearing the decision to request revocation is upheld, a recommendation for revocation is made to the Secretary of the Department of Health and Social Services. If the Secretary concurs with the recommendation, the revocation becomes effective and the individual may be sent to a correctional institution to serve the sentence originally imposed. If it is the decision of either the administrative hearing or the Department Secretary that revocation is unwarranted, the person may be reinstated on probation supervision. If a person chooses not to exercise his or her right to an administrative hearing, he or she may be sent to a correctional institution to serve the sentence originally imposed by the court. Three-tenths of the men and slightly more than onefifth (22 percent) of the women placed on probation in 1976 received sentences of this type.

A person who receives a withheld sentence and who is found to have violated the terms of probation must be returned to the committing court for sentencing. Slightly more than one-half (54 percent) of the men and over two-thirds (68 percent) of the women received sentences of this type.

Probation without conviction is a disposition used in cases where individuals have pleaded guilty to or have been found guilty of violating certain provisions of the Uniform Controlled Substances Act. If the individual has not previously been convicted of any offense covered by the provisions of this Act and has not been convicted on drug charges in other states or under Federal statutes, the court may choose to use this type of disposition. If that is the case, the court, without entering a judgement of guilt and with the consent of the individual, defers proceedings and places the person under probation with terms and conditions. If terms and conditions are fulfilled, the court discharges the individual and dismisses proceedings. If terms and conditions are violated, the court may enter a judgement of guilty and proceed to sentence under other provisions of the Act. A specific individual may be handled in this manner only one time. In calendar year 1976, 16 percent of the men and 10 percent of the women placed on probation received dispositions of this type.

Period of Probation

Sentences of less than two years were received by one-half of the men placed under probation supervision in 1976. Four out of 10 men convicted of crimes against persons or property, five out of 10 convicted of sex

offenses, and eight out of 10 convicted of drug offenses received sentences of less than two years. Slightly more than one-half (54 percent) of the women placed on probation received sentences of less than two years. Less than four percent of the men and women placed on probation received sentences of more than five years. (See Table 5.)

Age on Admission to Probation

Almost two-thirds (65 percent of the men, 62 percent of the women) placed under supervision were less than 25 years of age. Men in this age bracket accounted for almost one-half (48 percent) of the offenses against persons, 71 percent of the property crimes, 80 percent of the drug offenses, and slightly more than one-half (52 percent) of the sex offenses. Women under the age of 25 were convicted of four out of 10 crimes against persons, six out of 10 property offenses, and eight out of 10 drug and sex offenses. Only three percent of the men and women placed on probation were 50 years of age or older. (See Table 6.)

Time Employed

Four out of 10 men and six out of 10 women placed under probation supervision in 1976 were reported to be unemployed. About two-fifths (39 percent) of the men and one-fifth of the women were reported as employed full-time. (See Table 9.)

Average Income

Slightly more than one-fourth (28 percent) of the men and almost one-third (32 percent) of the women were reported as having no income at the time of placement. Earnings of less than \$400.00 per month were reported by one-fourth of the men and slightly more than one-third of the women. (See Table 10.)
